ABSTRACT

This guide is designed to assist media specialists in building resource collections and teachers in meeting state requirements for the study of Georgia; it will provide support to other curricular areas, as well. It is limited to print and non-print materials about Georgia, and is divided into sections on art, music, language arts, science, physical education, and social studies. Special sections are devoted to biographies of Georgians and to instructional television series relating to Georgia. A section listing professional resources and auxiliary agencies offering free and inexpensive materials is included. Entries are in alphabetical order by author's name and are arranged under the appropriate subject heading. Native-born Georgian authors are indicated by an asterisk. Citations include author, title, publisher/producer, copyright date, format, grade level, and publisher's/producer's annotation. All entries are commercially available. The supplement updates the earlier guide, adds a list of Georgia periodicals, and expands the list of state agencies offering free or inexpensive materials related to Georgia. (APG)



HOW TO USE THE GEORGIA MEDIAGRAPHY

Entries are in alphabetical order under subject headings, by authors' names and are congruent with subject headings used in Essential Skills for Georgia Schools. Citations include author, title, publisher/producer, copyright date, format, grade level, publisher's/producer's annotation. Criteria for selection of sources were:

- appropriate for K-12 students
- commercially available
- located during the project's research period

Every effort was made to locate useful publications. Users are not restricted to items included in this listing nor is it a required list for selection.

At the time of compilation all items were available commercially. However, this availability changes constantly. YOU SHOULD CHECK AVAILABILITY OF PRINT ITEMS IN BIP (BOOKS IN PRINT) AND NONPRINT IN NICEM (NATIONAL INFORMATION CENTER FOR EDUCATIONAL MEDIA) BEFORE ORDERING. If you are unable to locate certain publishers in NICEM or BIP, contact this office at the address or telephone number listed below. Using other professional selection tools and attending exhibits to examine resources also will provide information on current, related materials.

INTRODUCTION

This first supplement updates the Georgia Mediagraphy, published in 1982. The original document and this supplement act as a guides to print and nonprint materials about Georgia and Georgians. The information was provided by Georgia educators, and national and local publishers. Entries are arranged under the subject headings used in Essential Skills for Georgia Schools. Criteria for inclusion were appropriateness for K-1 students and commercial availability during the project's research period. Most entries have recent copyright dates, yet some entries with older copyright dates were included when the title had not been listed in the earlier publication.

Included in the supplement, but not in the 1982 publication, is a list of Georgia-related periodicals. Expanded in this issue is a list of state agencies that offer free or inexpensive materials related to Georgia. Professional resources, instructional television programs and physical education resources have not been listed in the Supplement because there were no new entries. Media specialists are reminded to consult both the Instructional Television Schedule Book and Videotape Duplication Catalog for related productions.

Every effort was made to locate currently available publications. However, before ordering, check the availability of print items in a recent copy of Books in Print and of nonprint items in one of the National Information Center for Educational Media (NICEM) indices. A list of publishers and their addresses has been included at the back of the Supplement to assist you in ordering.

The Georgia Department of Education is grateful to the many publishers and distributors who assisted us by providing information for this supplement. This supplement can be a useful and valuable tool for media specialists and teachers in planning meaningful multimedia approaches to learning.
