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ABSTRACT

This report describes and presents the 1984-85 results of the norm-referenced and criterion-referenced testing programs used in the Los Angeles Unified School District (California) to evaluate student progress and to identify instructional areas needing remediation. The norm-referenced Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills (CTBS), Form U, is used to determine the reading and mathematics achievement of English-speaking students in grades 4, 7, and 11. The CTBS/Espanol is administered to all Spanish-speaking, limited English proficient students in bilingual classrooms in grades 1-6 who do not meet English testing criteria. Regional results as well as school by school results are given as the percentages of students scoring in the lower quarter, middle half, and upper quarter of the national score distribution. The competency testing program uses criterion referenced tests based on the district's instructional objectives in reading, mathematics, and composition. During 1984-85, 200,346 elementary students were tested with the Survey of Essential Skills. At the junior high level, the CTBS/U, level H was administered to all seventh graders. The percentage of students passing at each school are presented. At the senior high level, students must demonstrate competency on the Senior High Assessment of Reading Performance, the Test of Performance in Computational Skills, and WRITE: Sr in order to receive high school diplomas. Results are presented in tables and figures, including the percentages of students passing each test at each school for the 1985 through 1988 graduating classes. (BS)

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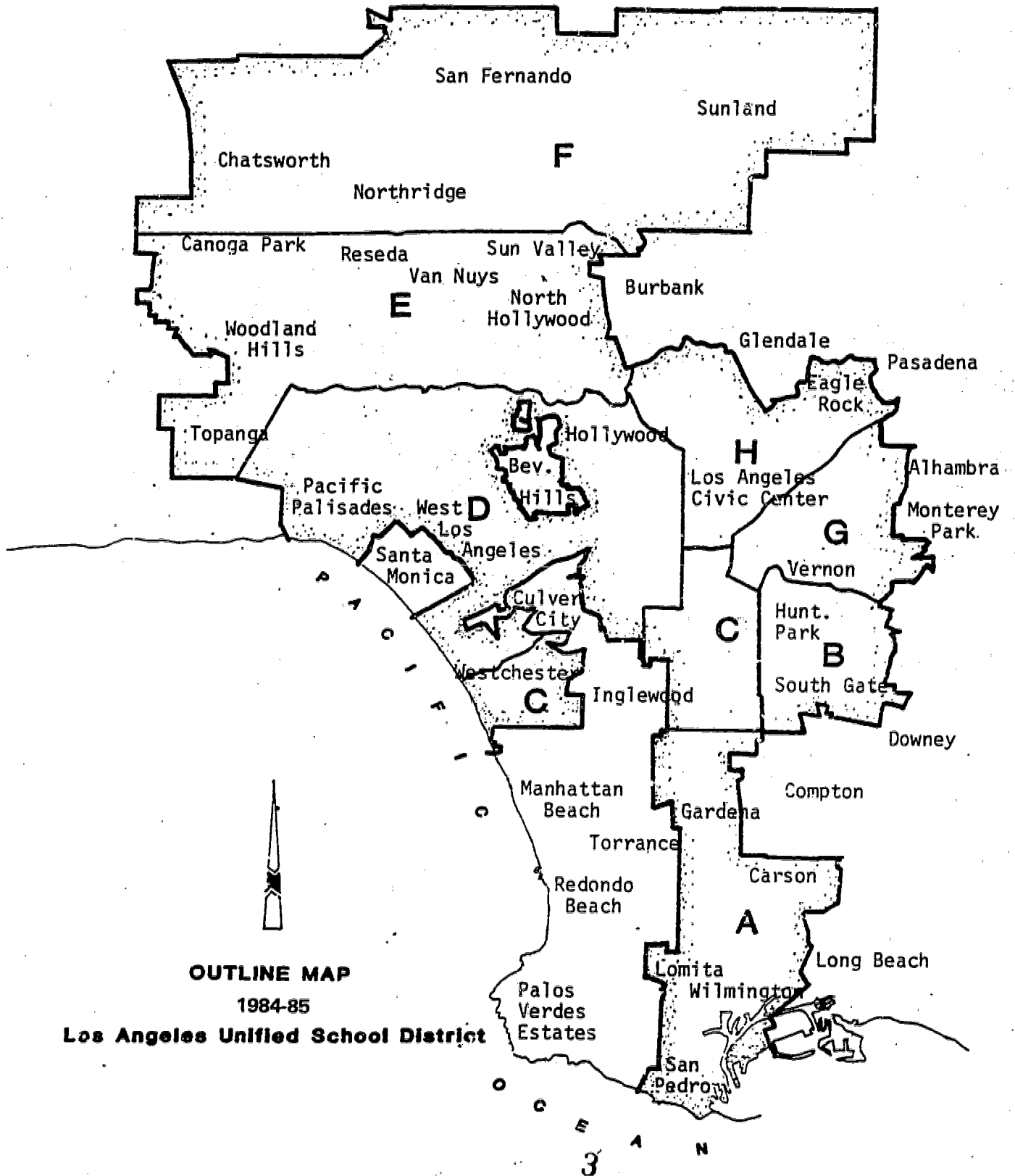

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ABSTRACT

INTRODUCTION

An important part of the district's evaluation process is the administration of various tests and the interpretation of the test scores to district staff. These scores are used by staff to evaluate student progress and to identify instructional areas in need of remediation.

RESULTS OF THE NORM-REFERENCED TESTING PROGRAM

The district uses the Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills (CTBS), Form U, to determine the reading and mathematics achievement of English-speaking students at grades 4, 7, and 11. The CTBS is a norm-referenced test, and it is used to determine whether the performance of district students is high, average, or low in comparison to the scores of students across the nation.

The CTBS/Español is administered to all Spanish-speaking LEP students who are enrolled in bilingual classrooms, if the students did not meet the criteria for testing in English. CTBS/Español has been administered in LAUSD since 1980.

A norm-referenced test, such as the CTBS, is administered nationwide to a sample of students selected to represent all students in the country who might have been tested. Norms are then established summarizing how students in the standardization group performed on the test. Percentile scores, which are used for district reports, tell what percentage of students in the norm group scored at or below a particular score. For example, 50 percent of the fourth graders in the norm group obtained a total scale score (SS) of 672 or less on the CTBS reading test. Therefore, a fourth grader with a reading scale score of 672 has a percentile of 50. The 50th percentile is also referred to as the norm, average, or median. It is the middle score for the norm group--half of the students scored below it, and half scored above it.

A norm-referenced test contains items that assess skills both above and below the grade level of the students being tested. An average student working at grade level will score between the 40th and 60th percentiles.

All district norm-referenced test results for students tested in English are reported for a combined group of limited English proficient (LEP) and fluent English proficient (FEP) students (this group also includes English only students). LEP students have had at least one year of formal English reading instruction before being tested in English. All students in the district have been identified as English only, FEP, or LEP since 1981.

When comparing the CTBS, Form U results between 1984 and 1985, we see that the grade 4 median reading score for all students increased two percentile points from 33 to 35. This reflects improved scores for both the fluent English proficient students (36 to 38) and the limited English proficient students (17 to 20). The 1985 grade 4 median mathematics score for all students declined from 48 to 47. The median scores for the fluent English and limited English proficient groups remained unchanged.

Grade 7 was tested districtwide for the first time during 1984-85. The median percentile for reading was 34; for mathematics it was 46; for language it was 39. The CTBS/U at grade 7 is being used for both norm-referenced test information and for competency test information. Therefore, grade 7 students took the language tests in addition to reading and mathematics.

For grade 11 the median percentile reading score for the combined group increased from 30 to 33, and the mathematics median percentile increased from 41 to 45. For the fluent English proficient students the reading median score increased from 33 to 36, and the mathematics median score increased from 43 to 47. The reading and mathematics median scores for the limited English proficient students remained unchanged.

When examining the 1985 scores for CTBS/Español at grades 1-6, one sees that all grades except six, which remained unchanged, improved in reading. In mathematics grades 3 and 5 improved while the remaining grades were unchanged.

RESULTS OF THE CRITERION-REFERENCED TESTING PROGRAM

Elementary

The competency testing program is based on the district's instructional objectives. Students are tested in grades 1 through 6 at the elementary school level. During 1984-85, 200,346 elementary students were tested with the Survey of Essential Skills (SES). This test assesses the students' knowledge of the reading, mathematics, and composition skills outlined in the district's elementary curriculum guide.

Between May 1984 and May 1985 reading scores improved at grades 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6; mathematics scores also improved at grades 3, 5, and 6; and composition scores improved at grades 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6. The 1984 (Olympic) Edition of SES was used in 1984 and 1985.

Students in grades 3 and 6 also produce a writing sample. In 1985, 86% of the grade 3 students had "average to good" writing samples, and 91% of the grade 6 students had "average to good" writing samples. At both grade levels the percentage of students who scored in the "average to good" range increased by one percent in 1985.

Junior High School

Competency-based testing and instruction are mandated for junior high school students by the Los Angeles Unified School District Board policies adopted between January 1976 and October 1977 and by the enactment into law of AB 65, effective September 1978. The intent of the legislation is to measure student progress in basic skills rather than to compare the student's performance in relation to his/her classmates.

Junior high schools used the Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills, Form U, level H, (CTBS/U) as their grade 7 competency tests during the 1984-85 school year. The CTBS/U is designed to measure achievement in the basic skills commonly found in state and district curricula. The reading, language, and mathematics tests of the CTBS were administered to seventh grade students. The district's instructional specialists matched mathematics, reading, and writing items on the CTBS/U to the district curriculum and placed these items into objective categories. Only these selected items were scored for the competency test.

Remedial instructional programs must be provided for students who fail to demonstrate satisfactory performance on any of the competency tests. Retesting may occur at the junior high school level subsequent to the remediation program as determined by the instructional staff at each school.

Students who do not pass the minimum competency standards must be conferenced before exiting grade 8. In addition, schools inform parents by letter of the test results and must hold parent conferences for those students not passing.

The school year 1984-85 was the first districtwide use of subsets of items from the CTBS/U as the competency tests: 70% of the students tested passed mathematics competency; 71% passed the writing competency test; and 55% passed the reading competency test.

Senior High School

Competency-based testing and instruction are mandated by Los Angeles Unified School District policies adopted between January 1976 and October 1977 and by the enactment into law of AB 65, effective in 1978.

Beginning with the graduating class of 1981, all students receiving high school diplomas must have demonstrated competency in the reading skills assessed by the Senior High Assessment of Reading Performance (SHARP), in the mathematics skills assessed by the Test of Performance in Computational Skills (TOPICS), and in the written language skills assessed by WRITE: Sr. Remedial instructional materials are provided for students who do not meet district competency standards. Each student has the opportunity to be retested many times.

For the Class of 1985, 98.1% of those enrolled passed SHARP, 97% passed TOPICS, and 97.2% passed WRITE: Sr. At the first test administration at grade 10, 81.7% of the Class of 1985 passed SHARP, 60.5% passed TOPICS, and 82% passed WRITE: Sr. Students must pass the three tests to qualify for a high school diploma.

For the graduating class of 1986, 84.1% passed SHARP, 55.9% passed TOPICS, and 79% passed WRITE: Sr on the first test administration at grade 10. The Class of 1986 still has one year of remediation and retesting before graduation.

Beginning with the 1983-84 school year, SHARP, TOPICS, and WRITE: Sr were administered to grade 9 students in all schools. For this group, 70% passed SHARP, 45.2% passed TOPICS, and 77% passed WRITE: Sr.

NORM-REFERENCED TESTING PROGRAM

REPORT ON THE DISTRICT TESTING PROGRAM

I. INTRODUCTION

An important part of the district's evaluation process is the administration of various tests and the interpretation of the test scores to district staff. These scores are used by staff to determine student progress and instructional areas needing remediation. The tests administered in the district generally fall into two categories: standardized, norm-referenced tests and criterion-referenced tests (also called proficiency or competency tests).

A norm-referenced test contains items that assess skills both above and below the grade level of the students being tested. The district uses the Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills (CTBS), Form U, to determine the reading and mathematics achievement of students in grades 4, 7, and 11; and also language achievement at grade 7. The CTBS is a norm-referenced test, and it is used to determine whether the performance of district students is high, average, or low in comparison to the scores of students across the nation. Spanish-speaking students who are not tested in English are tested with CTBS/Español at grades 1-6 if they are participating in bilingual classroom programs.

A norm-referenced test, such as the CTBS, is administered nationwide to a sample of students selected to represent all students in the country who might have been tested. Norms are then established summarizing how students in the standardization group performed on the test. Percentile scores, which are used for district reports, indicate what percentage of students in the norm group scored at or below a particular score. For example, 50 percent of the fourth graders in the norm group obtained a total scale score (SS) of 672 or less on the CTBS reading test. Therefore, a fourth grader with a reading scale score of 672 has a percentile of 50. The 50th percentile is also referred to as the norm, average, or median. It is the middle score for the norm group--half of the students scored below it and half scored above it.

Competency testing in the district is a criterion-referenced program based on the district's instructional objectives. Criterion-referenced tests have the following characteristics: 1) they are designed to measure the results of instruction; 2) they assess specific instructional objectives; and 3) the scores are judged by a specific standard. Tests of this type have the advantage of being directly applicable to classroom instruction. Each student's test results provide precise information on what the student can and cannot do, and the test results are used by staff to plan instruction to meet the needs of each student.

A criterion-referenced test, such as the Survey of Essential Skills (SES), measures the essential basic skills required at a specific grade level. All students are expected to master the grade level skills and to score well on this type of test.

II. NORM-REFERENCED TESTING PROGRAM: Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills (CTBS)

A. Background

1. Origin of the District Testing Program

Upon the recommendations of the Research and Evaluation Branch, the Board of Education in 1974 designated the tests to be used in the norm-referenced testing program. Extensive analysis and tryout of tests submitted by major test publishers preceded the recommendations made to the Board of Education. A city-wide committee analyzed the tests submitted and conducted tryouts at all three educational levels--elementary, junior high, and senior high. The board selected appropriate levels of the Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills (CTBS), Form S, as the district's testing instrument. Board Rule 2229 "State-Required and District-Approved Evaluation Program" sets forth the guidelines and requirements for this program. In 1984, CTBS - Form U was added to the district program at grades 4 and 11 in addition to the CTBS - Form S at grades 3, 5, and 8. The CTBS, Form U, like CTBS, Form S, went through extensive district review before it was recommended to and adopted by the Board of Education. In 1985, CTBS/U was administered districtwide at grades 4, 7, and 11 and CTBS/S testing was discontinued.

For limited-English speaking students in Spanish bilingual classrooms, CTBS/Espanol is administered if a student does not meet the criteria for being tested in English. The CTBS/Espanol program has been administered in the district since 1980.

2. Goals of the Testing Program

The testing program serves several functions. It provides norm-referenced, individual student scores which are not available from the California Assessment Program. These individual student scores enable teachers and administrators to plan programs and to screen children for instructional programs. District test results are also used to evaluate instructional programs and to determine local school needs. Some typical ways school personnel utilize test results are:

- a. To screen students for Gifted/Talented programs.
- b. To plan power reading, basic reading, algebra, geometry, foreign language, etc., classes.
- c. To counsel with parents and students regarding achievement or lack of achievement.
- d. To assist with student program planning.
- e. To plan for meeting individual differences in the classroom.
- f. To assist in a school needs assessment.

3. Characteristics of the Los Angeles Unified School District

The Los Angeles Unified School District is the second largest school district in the United States with 560,264* students enrolled in 733 schools (this number does not include 90 Children's Centers). The district covers an area of 710 square miles. Diversity is one of the major characteristics of this district, for the percentage of racial-ethnic groups ranges from .2% American Indian, 7.7% Asian, 20.1% Black, 19.7% White, to 52.2% Hispanic students, according to a survey based on the federal Office for Civil Rights Guidelines. These students come from diverse cultures and backgrounds and homes where 79 different languages are spoken according to the Bilingual Program Survey of Spring 1985. These students attend 410 elementary, 73 junior high, and 49 regular senior high schools. Other types of schools in the district include continuation high schools, community adult schools, opportunity schools, and schools for the handicapped, as well as 81 magnet schools and centers designed to implement court-ordered integration. In addition, the district operates occupational centers and Children's Centers whose students are not included in the above enrollment. The communities where these 733 schools are located also differ widely: from family income areas of poverty to affluence, and from crowded inner-city sites and industrial complexes to suburban, single family dwellings.

B. Description of the 1984-85 Norm-Referenced Testing Program

The norm-referenced English testing program of the Los Angeles Unified School District for the 1984-85 school year included the testing of all students in grades 4, 7, and 11 (except for mentally retarded, educationally handicapped, some physically handicapped, and non-English speaking students) in reading and mathematics with CTBS, Form U. Additionally, the language tests were administered at grade 7.

The norm-referenced Spanish testing program included testing Spanish speaking LEP students in grades 1-6 with CTBS/Español. Students in bilingual classroom programs were tested in Spanish, if they did not meet the English testing criteria.

1. Test Administration

- a. The testing calendar for 1984-85 scheduled administration of the CTBS, Form U, and CTBS/Español during the spring.
- b. Each grade level tested was administered the appropriate level of CTBS, Form U (See Table 1 on page 5). Grades 4, 7, and 11, took the test on machine-scorable answer sheets.
- c. CTBS/Español was administered to students in grades 1-6. Students in grades 1-3 used machine-scorable booklets; students in grades 4-6 used machine-scorable answer sheets.

2. Instruments Used

The Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills, Form U, is a series of test batteries comprised of overlapping levels for use in kindergarten through grade 12. The CTBS/Español is designed for use in grades 1-6. Reading and mathematics are the skill areas that were tested in the district with the various levels of the tests. At grade 7, language was also administered.

According to the Test Coordinator's Handbook, the emphasis in the test series is on the measurement of the grasp of broad concepts and abstractions as developed by all curricula and on facility in the skills that are required in the effective use of language and mathematics such as classifying, manipulating, translating, and interpreting.

In the development of the CTBS tests, attention was given to long-term trends in curriculum such as contemporary mathematics programs and the linguistic approach to the teaching of language arts. The classification scheme is hierarchical in nature; as the test level increases, more complex cognitive processes are used with greater frequency than simpler cognitive processes.

a. Reading

The Vocabulary Test contains items that measure same-meaning words, multimeaning words, unfamiliar words in context, and the meaning of affixes.

The Reading Comprehension Test contains items that measure comprehension of reading passages. Items test the student's ability to extract details, analyze characters, identify main ideas, and draw conclusions from passages. Items also test the ability to differentiate between writing techniques and between forms of writing.

b. Mathematics

The Mathematics Computation Test contains items that measure the operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Depending on the level of the test, content includes whole numbers, decimals, fractions, integers, algebraic expressions, exponents, and percents.

The Mathematics Concepts and Applications Test contains items that measure understanding of mathematics concepts. Specific skills include numeration, number sentences, number theory, problem solving, measurement, and geometry.

- c. The Language Mechanics Test contains items that measure skills in the mechanics of capitalization and punctuation. Editing skills are measured in the context of passages presented in various formats.

The Language Expression Test contains items that measure skills in language usage and sentence structure. The items measure skills in the use of various parts of speech, formation and organization of sentences and paragraphs, writing for clarity, and the appropriate use of various writing styles. All items in the test are based on rules of written standard English.

- d. Other content areas that are part of the complete battery are: spelling, reference skills, science and social studies. Schools have the option of administering any or all of these tests.

The CTBS/Espanol assesses reading vocabulary, comprehension, mathematics computation, and mathematics concepts and applications.

3. Students Tested

The appropriate levels of CTBS/U were administered to all students, except for mentally retarded, educationally handicapped, some physically handicapped, and non-English speaking students, in grades 4, 7, and 11 as shown in Table 1.

The CTBS/Espanol test levels used were: Grade 1 level B, Grade 2 level C, Grades 3 and 4 level 1, and grade 5 and 6 level 2.

C. Interpretation of Test Scores

1. Median and Quartiles

Test scores for CTBS are reported by quartiles and median percentile for each school. When the scores for a group of students, such as all grade 4 students in a school, are examined, the score value reported is that which falls exactly in the middle of the distribution--that score above and below which an equal number of student scores fall. This score is identified as the median (Md) percentile.

To determine how the remaining scores are arranged about the median percentile, other representative values called Q1 and Q3 are used. The letter Q indicates quartile. Counting up from the lowest score in a distribution to the point which includes one-quarter of all the scores, we reach a point called the first quartile (Q1). This is the point below which are found one-fourth (25%) of all scores and above which remain three-fourths (75%) of all scores.

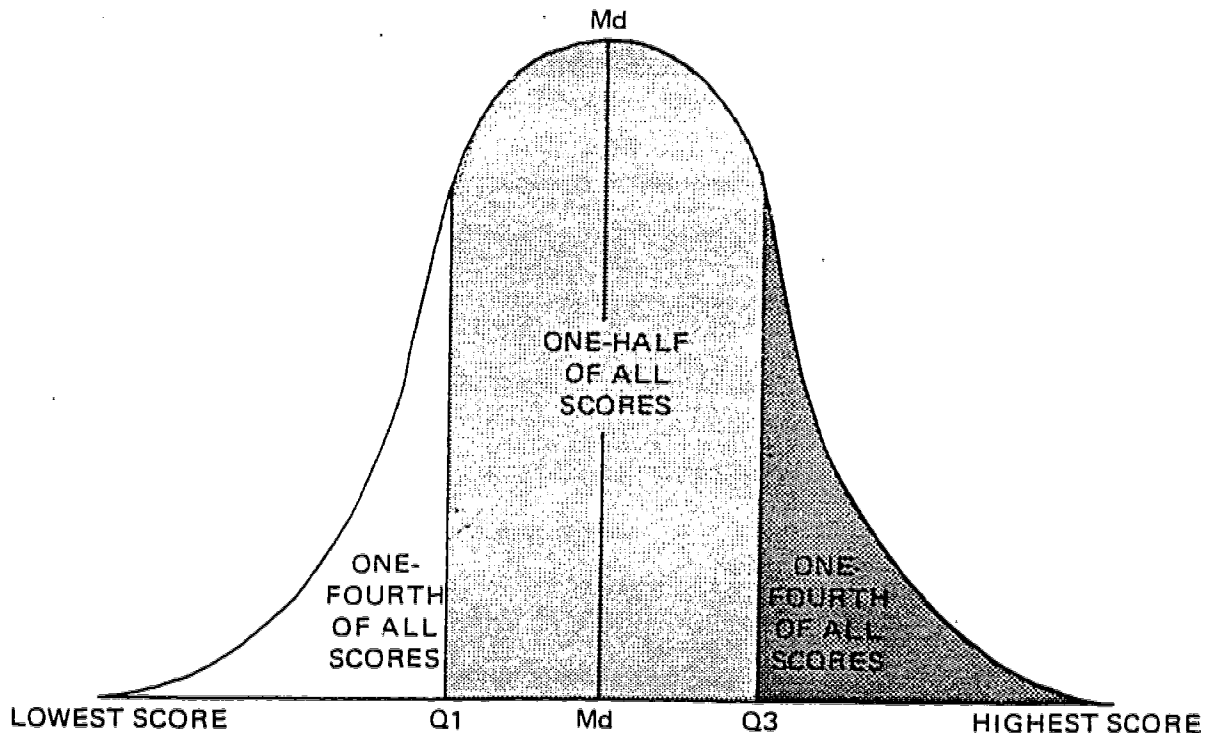


Figure 1. Median and Quartiles

Continuing to count upward until 50% of all scores are included, we reach the median percentile. When we account for three-quarters of the scores, we reach the third quartile (Q3). This is the point below which are found three-fourths of all scores (75%) and above which remain one-fourth (25%). Between Q1 and Q3 are exactly half the scores. The remaining half lies equally below Q1 and above Q3. Figure 1 illustrates this arrangement.

2. Ranges

Within every district school, there is a range of student scores, regardless of how high or low the median percentile is for the school. The median is the national norm percentile score that divides the school's score distribution into two equal portions. We know that half the students performed above that level and half below. For example, a school with a median percentile of 61, may have students with percentile scores ranging from 1 to 99, and we know that half of the students scored at or below the 61st percentile and half of the students scored above this point.

In examining student achievement scores for the various tests that were administered, we can make the following observations:

- a. Each of the schools, no matter how low its median percentile, has some students whose reading achievement is at or above the national median.
- b. The highest achievers did about the same in most schools, regardless of the median percentile score for the grade group as a whole.
- c. Even schools with the highest median percentile scores have students whose achievement is below the district median percentile, and an even greater number of students whose achievement is below the national median percentile.

D. **1984-85 Test Results**

1. District Test Results

Since 1981, all students in the district who are tested in English, have been identified as limited English proficient (LEP), fluent English proficient (FEP), or English only based on established district criteria. The district CTBS/U reports give scores for three groups of students: all students tested, the fluent English proficient (including English only students), and the limited English proficient students.

a. CTBS, Form U

The district administered the CTBS/U to fourth and eleventh grade students for the first time during spring 1984 and added seventh grade students in 1985. Table 2 presents the reading and mathematics scores for grades 4 and 11 by the three language fluency groups for 1984 and 1985.

Table 3 presents the reading, mathematics, and language scores for grade 7 by the three language fluency groups for 1985.

- 1) Scores are reported for three student groups: FEP, LEP, includes all students tested, FEP includes fluent-English proficient and English only speakers, and LEP includes limited-English proficient students.
 - a) Grades 4 and 11 FEP/LEP scores increased in reading. The grade 4 median in reading increased two percentile points from 33 to 35; grade 11 increased three percentile points from 30 to 33. The grade 11 mathematics median increased four percentile points from 41 to 45. The grade 4 mathematics median declined one percentile point from 48 to 47.
 - b) The median percentile reading score for FEP students in grade 4 increased two percentile points from 36 to 38; grade 11 increased three percentile points from 33 to 36. The grade 11 mathematics median increased four percentile points from 43 to 47; grade 4 remained unchanged at 49.
 - c) LEP students who had met the criteria for and had received formal English reading instruction since January 30, 1984, were tested in English. The grade 4 median in reading increased three percentile points from 17 to 20; the grade 11 median in reading remained unchanged at 7. The mathematics median at grade 4 remained unchanged at 35; grade 11 remained unchanged at 19.
- 2) Since CTBS/U was administered districtwide at grade 7 for the first time in 1985, Table 3 presents the median percentile scores for reading, mathematics, and language for the three language fluency groups. The median scores in reading, mathematics, and language are the same for the FEP/LEP group and the FEP group.

The CTBS/U at grade 7 is used for both norm-referenced test information and for competency test information; therefore, grade 7 students were required to take the language tests in addition to reading and mathematics.

b. CTBS/Español

Since 1980, CTBS/Español has been administered to all Spanish-speaking LEP students in grades 1-6 not meeting the criteria for English testing, who were enrolled in bilingual classrooms. Table 4 presents the reading and mathematics scores for students in grades 1-6 from 1980 through 1985.

The median percentile reading scores at each grade level have improved over the past six years. The greatest growth has been at grade 1 where the 1980 median percentile was 29, and the 1985 median percentile was 60, a gain of 31 percentile points.

The median percentile mathematics scores from 1980 through 1985 have also improved over the past six years. The greatest growth is again at grade 1 where the 1980 median percentile was 28, and the 1985 median percentile was 69, a gain of 41 percentile points.

2. Region Test Results

During the 1984-85 school year, the Los Angeles Unified School District was divided into eight administrative regions, each with a kindergarten through ninth grade organization. There is a separate Senior High Schools Division for the entire district. The eight regions are alphabetically designated as Region A through Region H. The map which appears on the inside front cover of this publication shows the locations of the eight regions and relates them to well-known communities in the Los Angeles area.

Table 5 presents a region-by-region summary of the results of the 1984-85 CTBS/U Testing Program for grade 4. Table 6 presents this information for grade 7. Grade 11 results are not shown on a region summary table because the senior high schools are part of the Senior High Schools Division, and they do not have a region affiliation.

Table 7 presents a region-by-region summary of the results of the 1984-85 CTBS/Español Testing Program for Grades 1-6.

Included with the region summary results and the school-by-school results (which appear later in the publication) are enrollment data which include transiency, stability, and minority figures. "Minority," as used in this report, is an all-inclusive term specifying the percent enrollment of all racial and ethnic groups except "White, not of Hispanic origin." The minority figures are derived from the Research and Evaluation Branch, Publication No. 454, Racial and Ethnic Survey, Fall 1984. "Transiency" refers to students who either entered or withdrew from a school outside the normal articulation pattern. "Stability" is a conservative estimate of the percentage of students who both started and completed the school year in that particular school. For more complete definitions of transiency and stability, refer to the Research and Evaluation Branch, Publication No. 466, Transiency and Stability in the Los Angeles Unified School District, 1983-84.

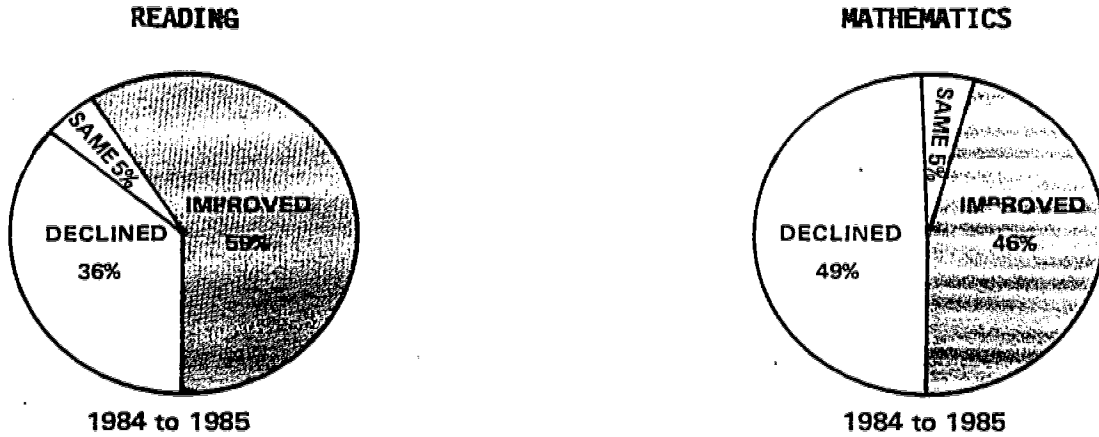


Figure 2. Percent of schools with CTBS/U, Reading and Mathematics Scores That Improved, Remained the Same, or Declined 1984 to 1985.

Figures 2 and 3 show the percent of schools with CTBS, Form U scores that improved, remained the same, or declined between spring 1984 and spring 1985. A higher percentage of schools with grade 11 had improved scores in both reading and mathematics than schools with grade 4.

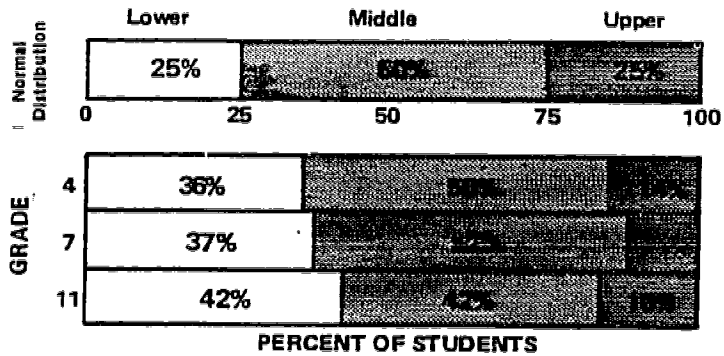


Figure 4. Percent of Students in the Lower Quarter, Middle Half, and Upper Quarter of the National Distribution for CTBS Reading--Form U, Grades 4, 7, and 11

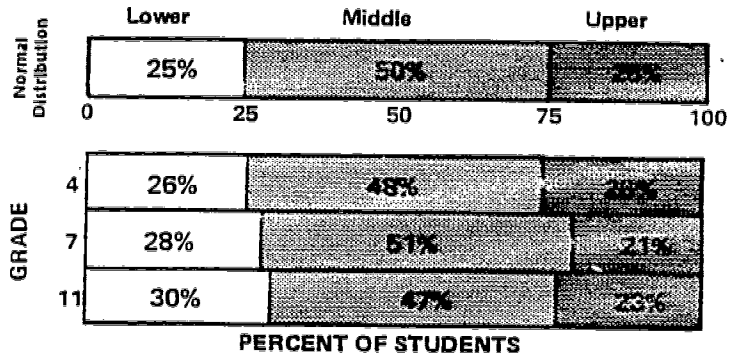


Figure 5. Percent of Students in the Lower Quarter, Middle Half, and Upper Quarter of the National Distribution for CTBS Mathematics--Form U, Grades 4, 7, and 11

Figures 4 and 5 present the percent of students that scored in the lowest quarter, middle half, and highest quarter of the national distribution on CTBS, Form U. A normal distribution would have 25% of the students in the lowest quarter, 50% in the middle half, and 25% in the highest quarter. Los Angeles had 50% of its students in the middle half in reading at grade 4 and slightly more than 50% in the middle half in both reading and mathematics at grade 7. LAUSD had more than 25% of its grade 4 students in the upper quarter in mathematics.

E. School-By-School Test Results, 1984-85

1. CTBS - Form U

a. Grade 4

Table 8 presents school-by-school test results for CTBS/U, Grade 4. Schools are arranged in alphabetical order with all numeric named schools appearing first. Each school is identified with the school location code and a letter designating the school's administrative region. These administrative region designations, which appear after the school name, may be used in conjunction with the map on the inside front cover.

Achievement test data are expressed in terms of national norm percentiles at the Q3, Md, and Q1 levels. The number (N) of students taking each of the tests is also provided. If fewer than 25 students were tested at a grade level, only the Md value has been shown.

Included with the school-by-school test results are enrollment data which include transiency, stability, and minority figures.

b. Grade 7

Table 9 presents school-by-school test results for CTBS/U, Grade 7, for each of the district's junior high schools. These results are presented in the same format as the CTBS/U for elementary schools.

c. Grade 11

Table 10 presents school-by-school test results for CTBS/U, Grade 11, for each of the district's senior high and continuation high schools. Schools are arranged in alphabetical order, but there is no region designation since senior high schools are part of a districtwide Senior High Schools Division.

2. CTBS - Español

Table 11 presents grades 1-6 school-by-school test results for each district elementary school that administered CTBS/Español to LEP students enrolled in Spanish bilingual classrooms. Schools are arranged in alphabetical order with numeric named schools appearing first.

3. Comparing Scores from Year to Year

Year-to-year comparison of scores at the district, region, and/or school levels are to be made with caution due to fluctuating patterns of student population. These changes may be attributed to: (1) shifts in the racial-ethnic composition, such as an influx of immigrants; (2) voluntary groupings for integration purposes; (3) voluntary enrollment in magnet schools and centers; (4) mainstreaming of Special Education Division students into regular school programs. Thus, test scores may show a higher or lower rate of achievement from one school year to the next as a reflection of these population shifts and not necessarily as a change in the achievement level for the same students.

III. CRITERION-REFERENCED TESTING PROGRAM

Competency testing in the district is a criterion-referenced program based upon the district's instructional objectives. Criterion-referenced tests have the following characteristics: 1) they are designed to measure the results of instruction; 2) they assess specific instructional objectives; and 3) the scores are judged by a specific standard. Tests of this type have the advantage of being directly applicable to classroom instruction. Each student's test results provide precise information on what the student can and cannot do, and the test results are used by staff to plan instruction to meet the needs of each student.

The criterion-referenced test at the elementary level is the Survey of Essential Skills (SES). This test measures the essential basic skills required at a specific grade level. It is expected that all students will master the grade level skills and will score well on this type of test.

The district's criterion-referenced program at the junior high level was based on subsets of items from the Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills, Form U, level H, (CTBS/U). These tests require students to apply their mastery of the skills of reading, computing, and writing.

At the senior high level, the criterion-referenced tests are Senior High Assessment of Reading Performance (SHARP), Test of Performance in Computational Skills (TOPICS), and Test of Performance in Composing/Enabling Skills (WRITE:Sr). These tests present simulated real life situations in which students apply their mastery of the skills of reading, computing, and writing.

A. Elementary

The elementary school competency testing program in the Los Angeles Unified School District is based upon the requirements of California AB 65, effective September 1978, and District Board of Education Communication No. 7 (August 1978). AB 65 requires assessing individual student progress toward proficiency in basic skills (reading, mathematics, and writing) in the English language at least once during grades 4 through 6. Communication No. 7 states that the skills listed in the elementary school continua are to be used as the basis for the development of criterion-referenced assessment instruments to be administered annually in grades 1-6.

The Survey of Essential Skills (SES) was developed and first administered in the district during the 1979 spring semester and has been administered each spring since then.

During 1984-85, 200,346 elementary students were tested districtwide with the Survey of Essential Skills (SES). This test assesses the student's knowledge of the reading, mathematics, and composition skills outlined in the district publication, Elementary School Curriculum, A Balanced Program (X-107).

Table 12 presents the average SES scores (mean percent correct) for district students surveyed between 1980 and 1985. Scores are shown for grades 1-6 in the three subjects surveyed.

Between 1984 and 1985, reading scores improved at grades 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6; mathematics scores improved at grades 3, 5, and 6; and composition scores improved at grades 1, 2, 3, 5, and 6. The 1984 (Olympic) Edition of SES was used in 1985.

Students in grades 3 and 6 also produce a writing sample. In 1985, 86% of the grade 3 students had "average to good" writing samples, and 91% of the grade 6 students had "average to good" writing samples. At both grade levels the percentage of students who scored in the "average to good" range in 1985 increased 1% over the students surveyed in 1984.

B. Junior High School

Competency-based testing and instruction are mandated for junior high school students by the Los Angeles Unified School District Board policies adopted between January 1976 and October 1977 and by the enactment into law of AB 65, effective September 1978. The intent of the legislation is to measure student progress in basic skills rather than to compare the student's performance in relation to his/her classmates.

The competency tests are based on subsets of items from the Comprehensive Tests of Basic Skills, Form U, level H. The CTBS/U is designed to measure achievement in the basic skills commonly found in state and district curricula. The reading, language, and mathematics tests of the CTBS were administered to seventh grade students. District instructional specialists identified items on the CTBS/U that match the district reading, mathematics, and writing curricula. Only these items were used for the seventh grade competency tests. District staff also set the district criterion for each test: the criterion is the raw score (number correct) students must obtain to pass each test.

Remedial instructional programs must be provided for students who fail to demonstrate satisfactory performance on any of the competency tests. Retesting may occur at the junior high school level subsequent to the remediation program as determined by the instructional staff at each school.

Students who do not pass the minimum competency standards as measured by the tests must be conferenced before exiting grade 8. In addition, schools inform parents by letter of the test results and must hold parent conferences for those students not passing.

Scores are reported as "PASS" or "FAIL." The interpretation of these terms follows:

PASS - The student has acquired a wide range of the basic skills tested and is expected to be successful with regular class instruction, effort, and sufficient attendance.

FAIL - The student needs remediation and retesting. If by the end of the eighth grade, the student is still not passing, a parent conference for further individualized planning, specialized instruction, and remediation is required.

Tables 13, 14, and 15 summarize the 1984-85 results of CTBS/U competency testing for junior high schools.

C. Senior High School

Competency-based testing and instruction are mandated by Los Angeles Unified School District policies adopted between January 1976 and October 1977 and by the enactment into law of AB 65 effective September 1978.

Beginning with the graduating Class of 1981, all students receiving high school diplomas must have demonstrated competency in the reading skills assessed by the Senior High Assessment of Reading Performance (SHARP), in the mathematics skills assessed by the Test of Performance in Computational Skills (TOPICS), and in the written language skills assessed by the Test of Performance in Composing/Enabling Skills (WRITE:Sr).

SHARP, TOPICS, and WRITE:Sr have been initially administered at grade 10. Grade 9 students in four-year high schools have also been tested since 1982. Beginning with the 1983-84 school year, SHARP, TOPICS, and WRITE:Sr were administered to grade 9 students in all schools. Grade 10 students were also tested in this transition year. During the 1984-85 school year, SHARP, TOPICS, and WRITE:Sr were administered to grade 9 students in all schools. Grade 10 students were administered the test only if they did not previously pass or take the test in grade 9. Grades 11-12 students were administered the test only if they did not previously pass or take the test.

Instructional programs must be provided for students who fail to demonstrate satisfactory performance on any of the competency tests, and the instruction must be given prior to the student's next opportunity to take the test. Each student has the opportunity to be evaluated many times.

All forms of the tests are stored in a secure warehouse between testing periods. All forms of SHARP, TOPICS, and WRITE:Sr were developed by district personnel with expertise in the specific subject matter area and have been subsequently published, under contract, by CTB/McGraw-Hill. Materials used in the remedial instruction provided for students who do not meet district competency standards have been designed to provide students with activities that are directly related to both the format and content of the tests. These materials were developed and copyrighted by the Los Angeles Unified School District and are printed and distributed by EDL/McGraw-Hill Book Company.

The three tests have a common rationale and present simulated real life situations in which students apply their mastery of reading, computing, and writing skills.

Figure 6 compares the grade 10 test administrations of SHARP, TOPICS, and WRITE:Sr over the last four years. While Table 16 summarizes the data for each class cohort that has taken the district's competency-based tests. Students must pass all three tests (SHARP, TOPICS, WRITE:Sr) to qualify for the high school diploma. Between the first test administration at grade 10 and the final testing at grade 12, remediation and retesting may occur several times for students who have not yet passed.

The data presented in Table 16 show the percent of enrolled students in the classes of 1982, 1983, 1984, and 1985, who passed each competency test by June of their senior year. For each test, a higher percentage of seniors had passed in 1985 than in 1984.

Tables 17 through 28 present the competency test summary for grades 9-12 as reported in the 1984-85 school year. Tables 17 through 19 show the scores for those grade 9 students in the class of 1988. Tables 20 through 22 reflect results for grade 9 students in the class of 1987. Tables 23 through 25 have the scores for grade 10 students in the class of 1986. Tables 26 through 28 show the final report for grade 12 students in the class of 1985.

Each table reports the number enrolled as well as the number and percent tested. The inclusion of enrollment in the school month of testing allows for a computation of the percent of enrolled students who are tested. For grade 9 test results, a large number of limited English speaking students, student absenteeism, or other unknown factors may account for the differences between the number enrolled and the number tested. In addition, for grade 10 test results, students who have passed the competency tests and subsequently been reclassified (demoted) to the tenth grade because of credit deficiencies may also contribute to these differences.

The Class of 1986 has had and will continue to have opportunities for remediation and retesting. The class members were first tested as tenth graders, and their final opportunity to pass the three tests will occur during June 1986. (See Tables 23, 24, and 25.) The number of successful students during the retesting period cannot be determined until then.

Tables 26, 27, and 28 show the final results for the Class of 1985. The number of students enrolled as grade 12 students and the number and percent who passed each test are reported. This summary reflects the data contained in lists submitted by schools naming all grade 12 students and the tests each student had passed. For contrast, these three tables also show the number and percent of students in the Class of 1985 who passed each test in grade 10.

Grade 10

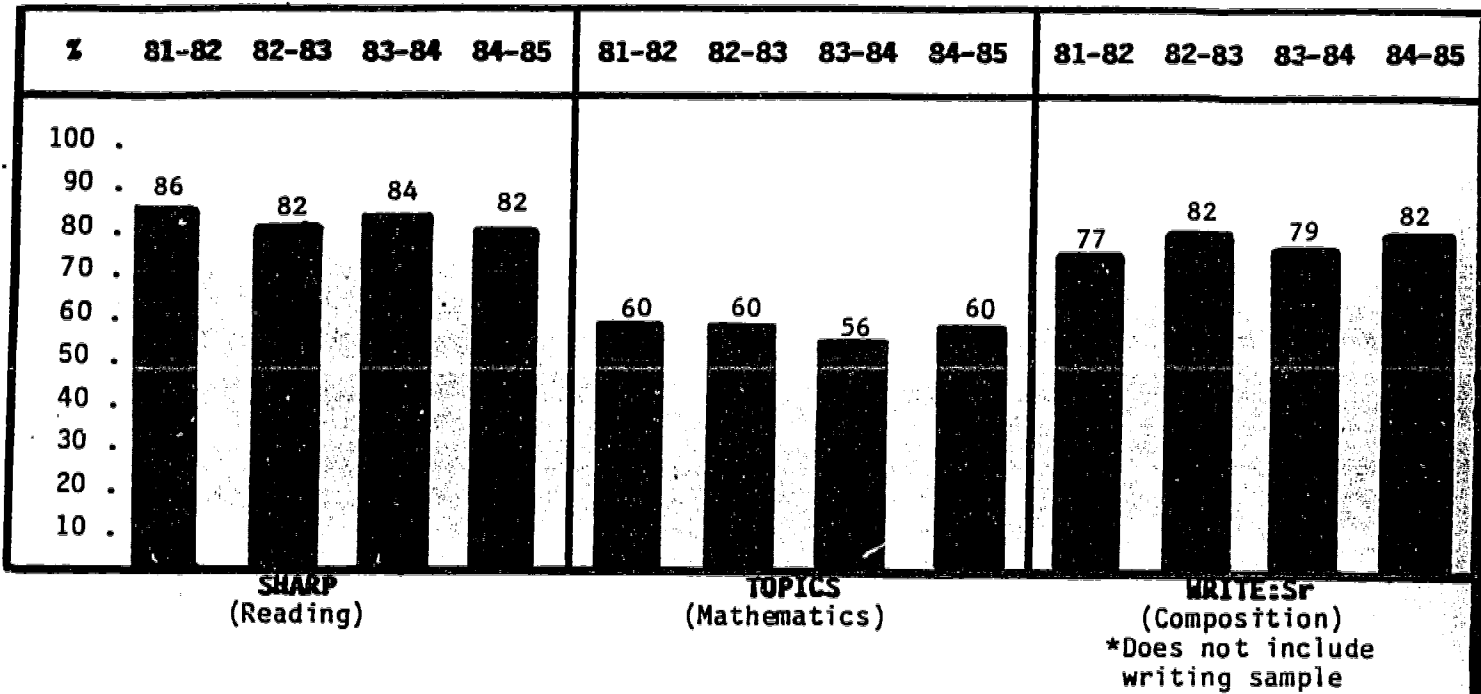
