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ABSTRACT

A study was conducted by the Iowa State Department of Education to gather follow-up data on former students who completed employment-preparation programs at one of the 15 community colleges in Iowa during 1984-85. Study findings, based on college data and responses from 1,091 of a sample of 3,676 program completers and 444 of 583 employers of former students, included the following: (1) the total number of completers of vocational programs statewide for the participating community colleges was 10,122; (2) 5,404 or 54.4% of the total were reported as currently employed; (3) of the currently employed completers, 4,879 (90.3%) were employed in an occupation related to their program of instruction, while only 525 (9.7%) were employed in an unrelated area; (4) 4,356 (81.6%) of the employed completers were currently employed in Iowa, while 18.4% were employed out of state; (5) the average weekly wage for completers employed in a field related to their program of instruction was \$220.84 (\$5.52 per hour); (6) 5.2% of the former students were pursuing additional education; 6.7% were not employed, but were actively seeking employment; and 1.6% were not in the labor market; (7) 74% of the respondents indicated that the vocational instruction they had received was of "some" to "major" importance in obtaining employment; and (8) over 80% of the employers of the program completers rated them as "good" or "very good" in terms of technical knowledge, work attitudes, and work quality. The bulk of the report consists of detailed data tables. Appendices include information on Iowa's Common Data System and sample survey instruments. (EJV)

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INTRODUCTION

The need for information about employment success after students have completed or left educational programs designed to prepare them for employment has been recognized for some time. Follow-up studies of these former students and their employers provide data that enable the determination of whether or not former students are employed in the occupation for which they were trained as well as salary information and also enable the assessment of the adequacy of job preparation training programs in providing employees to meet employer needs.

The Federal monies for follow-up activities has been specified in Section 112 (b)(1)(B) of Public Law 94-482 and is continued in the Carl D. Perkins Vocational Education Act, Part C (Section 421, Section 423), that calls for an evaluation by using data collected, by statistical valid sampling procedures, of each state program according to the extent to which program completers and leavers find employment in occupations related to their training.

The National Center for Education Statistics has included student follow-up reporting as a component in the annual Vocational Education Data System (VEDS). VEDS reporting has been discontinued for the current fiscal year, however, these data are required in Federal accountability reporting.

The 1985-86 student follow-up detailed survey involved a sample of approximately 20% of the local education agencies offering programs to prepare students for employment. The sampling plan was developed according to NCES parameters in a manner to maximize representation in terms of students, variety and number of programs, and geographic location of LEA's over a five year period.

In an effort to improve student vocational follow-up at both the secondary and community college level, a Statewide Student Follow-up Committee composed of representatives of secondary schools, AEA's, and community colleges met during 1983-84 to develop recommendations for improvement. A second committee with similar composition met the following year to develop recommendations for implementing the changes suggested by the previous committee.

As a result of these group efforts, the following changes have been made:

- o Questions on the sample survey questionnaire were modified to better meet local, state, legislative, and federal reporting needs.
- o A "common data" instrument was developed by community colleges which would gather more complete base educational and employment follow-up data by instructional program for each community college to be used to provide annual statewide follow-up data.

The community colleges desired to coordinate the mailing of the sample survey questionnaires while the Iowa Department of Education agreed to process this information.

The Iowa Department of Education further agreed to develop the means to process and summarize the common data which the community colleges would provide on an annual basis.

Further developments include the development of IBM MS DOS/PC DOS microcomputer based systems to collect and report both the sample survey data and the Common Data for area community colleges.

These developments have speeded up the follow-up process, reduced paper flow and enabled the community colleges to generate their own reports.

METHOD

Subjects. The subjects of the common data system consisted of former students who completed educational programs that prepare students for employment during the 1984-85 school year in all 15 community colleges in Iowa.

Materials. The materials consisted of an aggregate preprinted program based common data form and the microcomputer management system, an IBM MS DOS microcomputer system, which contained information identical to the preprinted common data forms and instructions for completing either mechanism.

Procedure. Information identifying the number of completers reported by each community college for each instructional program and community college during FY 85 reimbursement was downloaded from the Department of Education's (Vocational) Information System. The Common Data reporting form was IBM microcomputer generated using the downloaded information which had been reported in the CE-4 reimbursement document for FY 85.

In addition, an IBM microcomputer compatible data base file to be used with the Vocational Student Follow-up Microcomputer Management System was developed from the downloaded completers by program data which exactly corresponded to the common data student follow-up form.

The community colleges were provided with the option of reporting the education/employment status information for FY 85 completers either on the Common Data Student Follow-up Form or on floppy disk through the Iowa Vocational Student Follow-up Microcomputer Management System.

Initial common data materials were sent to the community colleges March 13, 1986. Responses on either the microcomputer system or preprinted form from fourteen of the fifteen community colleges were received by December 1986.

The community colleges participating in the more detailed 20% one-in-five year survey, formerly known as VEDS, provided only the detailed survey information which was then reformatted to meet the constraints of the common data collection in an effort to reduce duplication and paperwork.

Information from all responding community colleges was combined and included in the microcomputer management system and returned to all community colleges.

The Iowa Vocational Student Follow-up Microcomputer Management System has the capability of generating reports for each community college along with a state profile by instructional program and overall.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Common Data

Table 1, page 6 show the overall results of the common data collection for each participating community college as well as the state profile.

The total number of completers of vocational programs statewide for the participating community colleges was 10,122. There were 5,404 or 53.4% of the total who were reported as currently employed. Of those completers currently employed, 4,879 or 90.3% were employed in an occupation related to their program of instruction while only 525 or 9.7% were employed in an unrelated area. There were 4,356 or 81.6% of those completers employed who were currently employed in Iowa while 18.4% were reported as employed out of state.

The average weekly wage (based upon 40 hours) for completers employed in a field related to their program of instruction was \$220.84 or an hourly wage of \$5.52.

Approximately fifteen percent (14.6%) or 1,479 of these former student were not employed with 523 or 5.2% pursuing additional education; 676 or 6.7% not employed, but actively seeking employment; 161 or 1.6% not in the labor market; and 119 or 1.2% listed as other (military is included in this category).

Student follow-up data was not reported for 3,035 or 30.0% of the 10,122 former students. A program by program breakdown of student follow-up reported through the common data system is available through the Iowa Vocational Student Follow-up Microcomputer Management System for IBM MS DOS/PC DOS compatible microcomputers from the Iowa Department of Education.

DETAILED ANALYSIS OF PROGRAM
COMPLETERS AND LEAVERS

METHOD

Subjects. The subjects of Phase 1, the base data survey, consisted of a 20% sample of three of 15 merged area school administrators who had students who had completed or left educational programs that prepare students for employment during the 1984-85 school year (see Appendix B-1). The subjects for Phase 2, the student follow-up, consisted of students reported in the base data survey as completing or leaving the educational programs.

Materials. The materials for Phase 1 consisted of a base data collection form for merged area schools/community colleges (CE-4S), instructions, and cover letters (see Appendix B-2). Phase 2 materials consisted of cover letters to students and the student follow-up survey instrument (see Appendix B-3).

Procedure. Phase 1, base data survey, consisted of developing a roster of 1984-85 completers and leavers of educational programs that prepare students for employment, involved orienting the administrator and conducting the base data survey within the designated local education agencies to obtain students' names, addresses, and characteristics (completion status, sex, race/ethnic, handicapped, limited English proficiency, disadvantaged, and JTPA) according to program C.I.P. number and program title.

During the vocational education reimbursement cycle for FY 85 (between April and October 1985), the base data summary package was mailed to each selected merged area school administrator. Each contact person was requested to provide information regarding former students who completed or left educational programs that prepared them for employment. This information was requested by specific C.I.P. number, name and mailing address of each former student, program completion status, sex, racial/ethnic characteristics, handicapped, limited English proficiency, disadvantaged, JTPA, and type of award (postsecondary only). Responses were received from 3 postsecondary schools who had programs operating in FY 85. The forms were screened by the Department of Education personnel in order to edit the data. By the conclusion of Phase 1, information was obtained from 3,864 former students, of which some were duplicates.

Phase 2 involved surveying the students identified in Phase 1. Phase 2 was conducted between April 2, 1986 and August 30, 1986.

Survey forms sent to the community colleges were mailed to the former students identified in Phase 1 with instructions to complete the mailer (survey) and return it. One initial mailing and two follow-up mailings to nonresponders were made in order to boost the number of responders. No telephone follow-up was made. Duplicate names were identified by editing the file and the returns, and as a result, the final unduplicated file consisted of 3,676 students.

The employers of the respondents from Phase 2 who indicated they were employed in a field related to their training were selected to participate in Phase 3 (the employer follow-up).

On July 18, 1986 employer survey questionnaires were sent to 583 employers whose names and addresses were provided by the students participating in Phase 2 (see Appendix B-4). Two follow-up mailings to nonresponders were conducted on August 19, 1986 and September 11, 1986.

Phases 2 and 3 were completed by August 30, 1986.

Editing and file clean-up was completed in October 1986. By the completion of the survey, student responses were received from 1,091 of the 3,676 students and 444 of the 583 employers.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

STUDENT FOLLOW-UP

A total of 1,091 or 29.7% of the survey questionnaires pertaining to the final 3,676 unduplicated list of 1984-85 student completers and leavers were returned with a response to at least one item on the Student Follow-up Survey form. The first mailing resulted in the 20.9% responses. The second mailing yielded an additional 5.2% response, and the third mailing resulted in 2.4% response.

The following data summarize the responses and non-responses to the survey according to relevant factors:

The data below summarize the status of the 3,676 students who were surveyed in the Student Follow-up. It is quite evident from the table that for program completers 61.4% of the respondents were employed in an occupation related to their training as opposed to 34.8% for program leavers. Completers employed in an occupation unrelated to their training were 7.8% of the respondents compared to 22.2% for leavers. Overall, 76.2% of the completers compared to 57.0% of the leavers were employed in some occupation. The employment percentage increases to 76.9% for completers and 59.4% for leavers if military employment for 0.6% of respondent completers and 2.1% of respondent leavers is included in overall employment. Continuing education was pursued by 8.7% of the completer respondents and 19.8% of the leaver respondents. There were 10.0% of the completer respondents unemployed with 4.9% seeking employment, while 5.1% were not seeking employment. These percentages compare with 20.8% unemployment for leavers; of which 12.6% were seeking employment and 8.2% were not seeking employment.

Tables 2, 3, and 4 show the employment status and hourly wage information of students who completed or left education designed to prepare them for employment. These tables are labeled part 1 and part 2 to indicate that each table consists of two pages.

Table 2 breaks this information down by the following occupational areas: agriculture, distributive education, health occupations, occupational home economics, office occupations, technical, trade and industrial, and multi-occupational by sex of student.

Table 3 shows the employment and educational data by program title and C.I.P. number.

Table 4 breaks this information down for each merged area school summarized by occupational area.

 Employment Status of Post Secondary Completers/Leavers

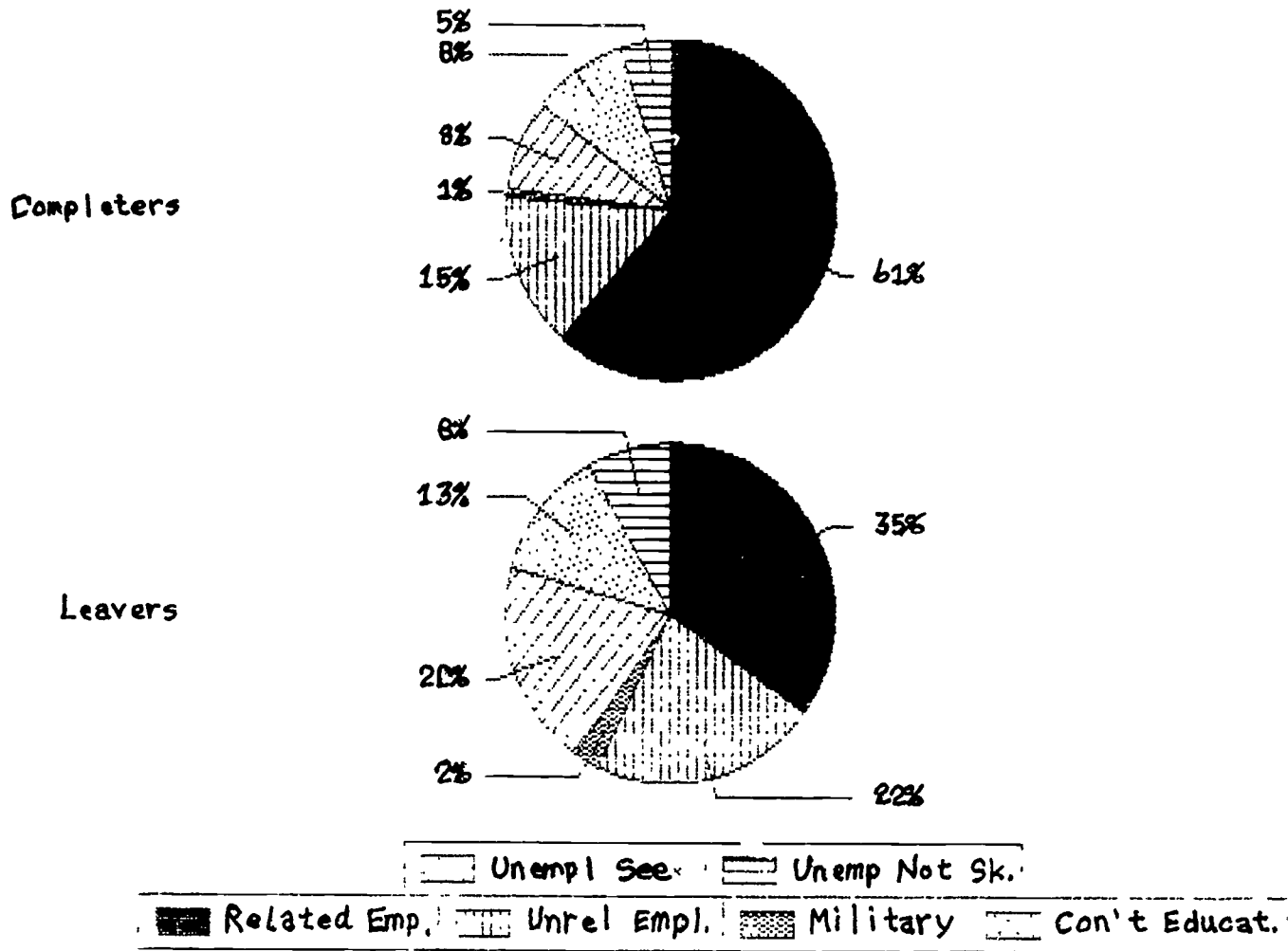

STUDENT PERCEPTIONS

Table 5 shows vocational education perceptions of former students who completed or left vocational instruction during 1984-85. Specific perceptions were requested concerning "instruction are expectations", "importance of instruction in obtaining employment", "instructional preparation in employment performance", "difficulty in finding employment", "length of time to find employment", "primary purpose in enrolling in vocational program", and "whether or not objective was met".

There were 87.0% of the respondents who indicated that their vocational instruction met or exceeded their expectations. For completers, 91.0% felt that their vocational instruction met or exceeded their expectations compared to 69.7% for program leavers. Only 13.1% felt that their instruction fell short of expectations with 2.4% indicating it was totally unsatisfactory. For completers, 9.0% indicated instruction fell short of expectations and 1.3% of that group felt that their instruction was unsatisfactory. For leavers, 30.2% of the respondents indicated that their instruction fell short of expectations, and 6.9% of that group felt that their instruction was unsatisfactory. As would be expected, leavers were less satisfied with their instruction than were completers.

Similarly, the "importance of vocational instruction in obtaining employment" was rated of some to major importance by 74.0% of the respondents while only 15.3% felt it was of little to no importance. For completers, 11.7% viewed it as of little to no importance compared to 32.5% for leavers.

"Preparation of vocational instruction for employment performance" was judged to be "reasonably well" to "very well" by 72.1% of the survey respondents. Only 13.1% felt their preparation was "not well" or "of no value". The substantial difference in views of completers and leavers was maintained on this item as well.

Responses concerning "difficulty of finding employment" indicated 24.1% of the employed respondents thought it was "difficult" to "very difficult" to find employment while 53.8% found employment "somewhat easy" to "easily".

For those former students who were employed in an related area 53.3% found employment in less than 30 days. An additional 23.1% were employed within three months. Only 14.4% indicated more than six months time required to find employment. As expected, completers generally received employment more quickly than leavers.

The overwhelming reason for enrolling in a vocational program was to obtain employment (50.3%), followed by career exploratory (18.4%), and upgrading skills (17.0%). Retraining accounted for the primary purpose of instruction only 6.4% of the respondents. There was some variation in the primary purpose for completers and leavers although the major reasons were similar.

Almost two-thirds of the former students (65.1%) indicated their objective in enrolling was met. More completers indicated this result (67.8%) than leavers (52.9%).

For those respondents currently attending school, 42.6% indicated that the school location was the same (i.e. community college), 26.4% a four year college, 17.2% "other", and 13.2% another community college.

For those respondents currently attending school almost two-thirds (64.1%) felt the current education program was related to their former vocational education program.

EMPLOYER FOLLOW-UP

The following data summarize the responses and nonresponses to the survey according to relevant factors. A total of 444 or 76.2% of the 583 survey questionnaires mailed to 1984-85 vocational program completers and leavers employed in the occupation in which trained or related field were returned at project completion. The first mailing resulted in 49.2% usable returned survey forms. Second mailing yielded an additional 20.8% usable responses and the third mailing added 7.2% to the overall response rate.

Table 6 shows various demographic and descriptive characteristics about the former students and their programs for whom employers returned questionnaires. These same characteristics are summarized for employees prepared at secondary schools and merged area schools (page 70).

The following characteristics of employers were identified by the survey:

- (1) About twenty-eight (28.2%) of the responses from employers pertained to male students compared with 71.6 percent for female students.
- (2) Nearly nine out of ten (89.0%) of the former students were currently employed. The following data summarize the employment status of this group:

- (3) Almost half (46.8%) of the students found employment with small employers (25 or fewer full-time employees).
- (4) A little less than half (45.4%) of the students were employed for more than one year by the reporting employer.

Table 7 shows the student program participation by six digit C.I.P. program number and title. This table indicates how the 444 former students of the completers and leavers who responded to the survey are distributed by instructional programs. The area of Nursing had 38.7% of the students concentrated within those categories followed by Home Worker Aide with 6.5% of the employees (page 73).

Figures 2-6 and Table 8, pages 78-82, and 83 shows the percent of the postsecondary employer responses statewide to questions concerning preparation and current performance of vocationally prepared employees.

In terms of vocational training evaluation, each of three factors was rated in addition to computing an overall rating. For technical knowledge (Figure 2), 82.5% of the responses indicated a "very good" or "good" rating, while "poor" and "very poor" made up 1.8% of the responses. Responses from 84.0% of the respondent employers categorized work attitudes (Figure 3) as "very good" or "good" compared with 2.7% rating work attitudes as "poor" or "very poor." Work quality (Figure 4) was viewed as "good" to "very good" according to 84.2% of the responses compared to 2.0% responses indicating "poor" to "very poor." Overall (Figure 5), 79.7% of the responses evaluated training of workers as "good" compared to 1.1% responses rating overall training as "poor" to "very poor."

In terms of the relative preparation (Figure 6) of vocationally prepared employees with non-vocationally prepared employees in similar positions, 39.4% of the vocationally prepared employees, according to the responses, were considered to be better prepared for similar positions while 6.8% were considered to be less prepared.

In terms of current performance (Table 8) of vocationally prepared individuals relative to actual job expectations, eleven factors were considered. Vocationally prepared individuals generally were considered to be performing at or above the expected level. The percent of responses indicating the employee performed below expected or satisfactory level ranged from 3.2% for "punctuality" to 6.3% for "ability to work with minimal supervision."

Following the tables described above are more detailed presentations. Table 9, page 86 shows the merged area school vocational training evaluation by demographic and program characteristics (see Appendix B-4).

Table 10 displays the responses to the evaluation items by program C. I. P. numbers in merged area schools.

 Post Secondary Rating of Technical Knowledge

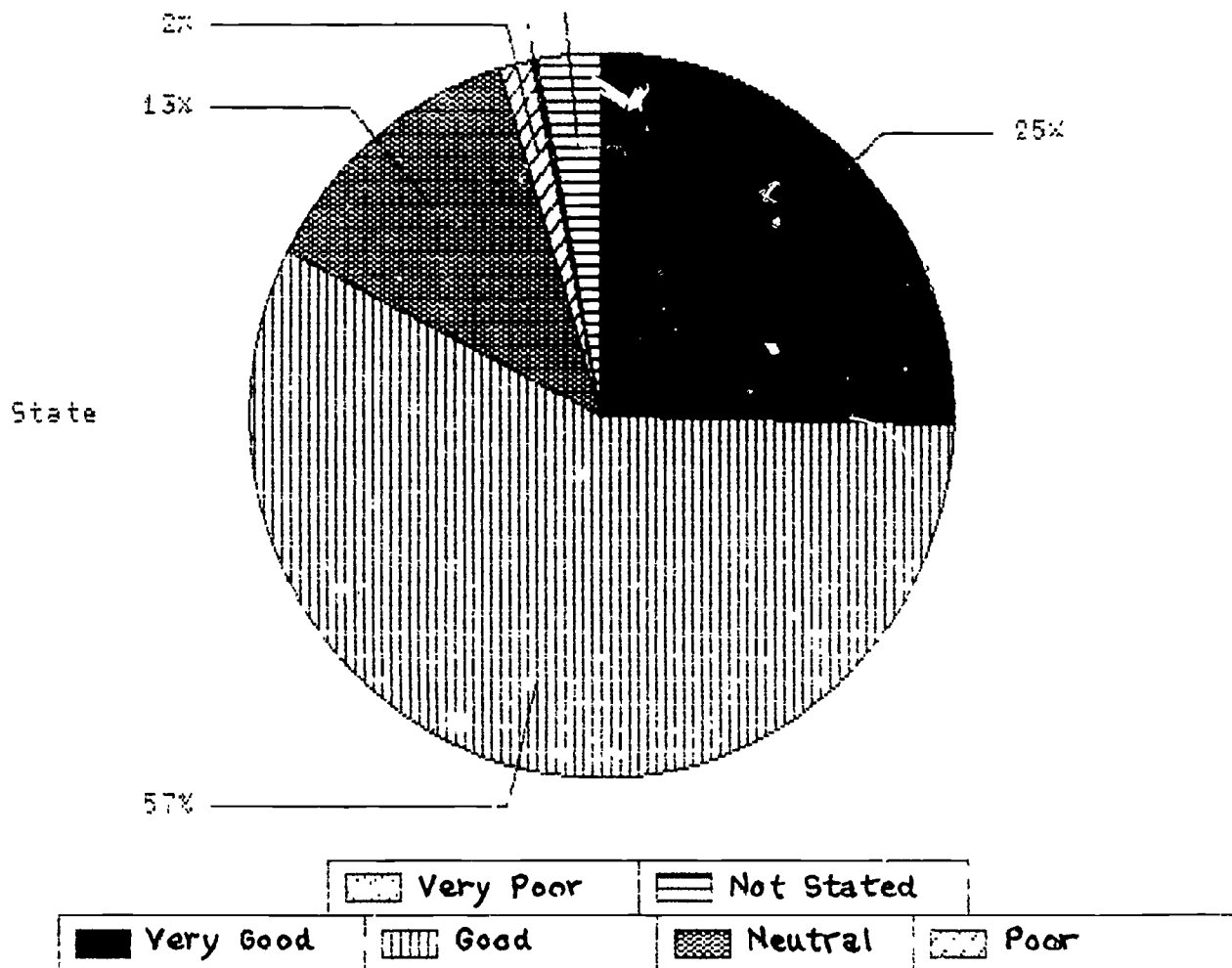

 Post Secondary Rating of Work Attitude

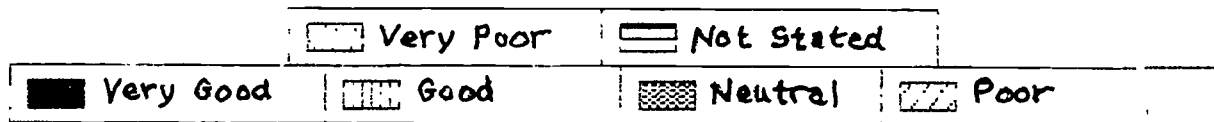
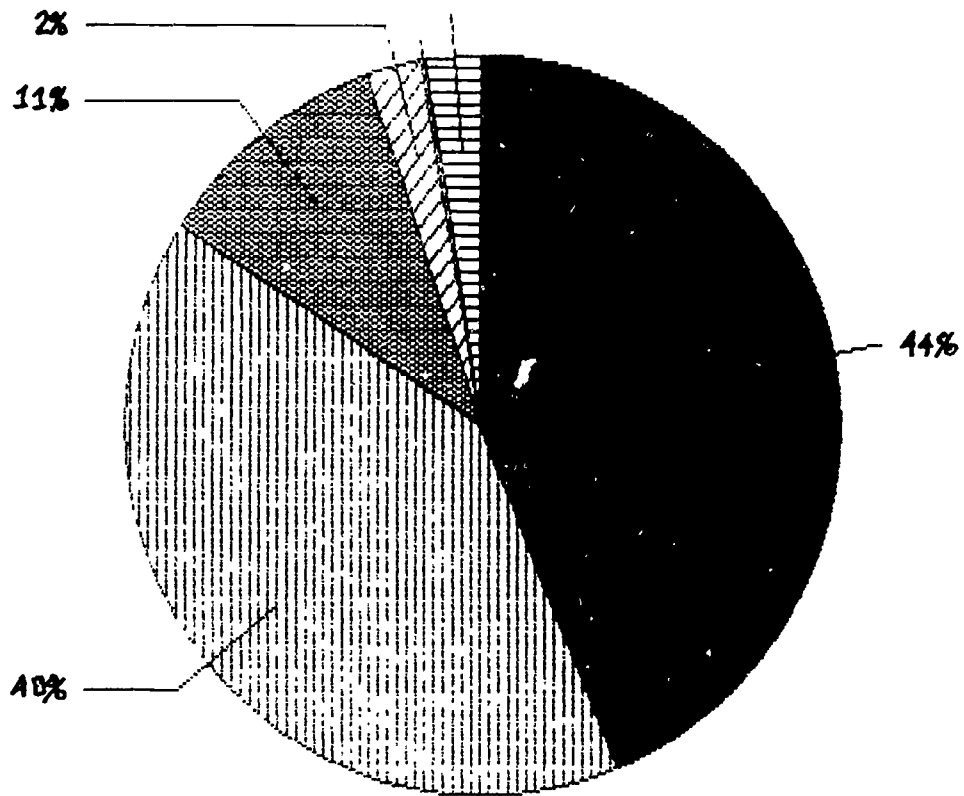

Post Secondary Rating of Work Quality

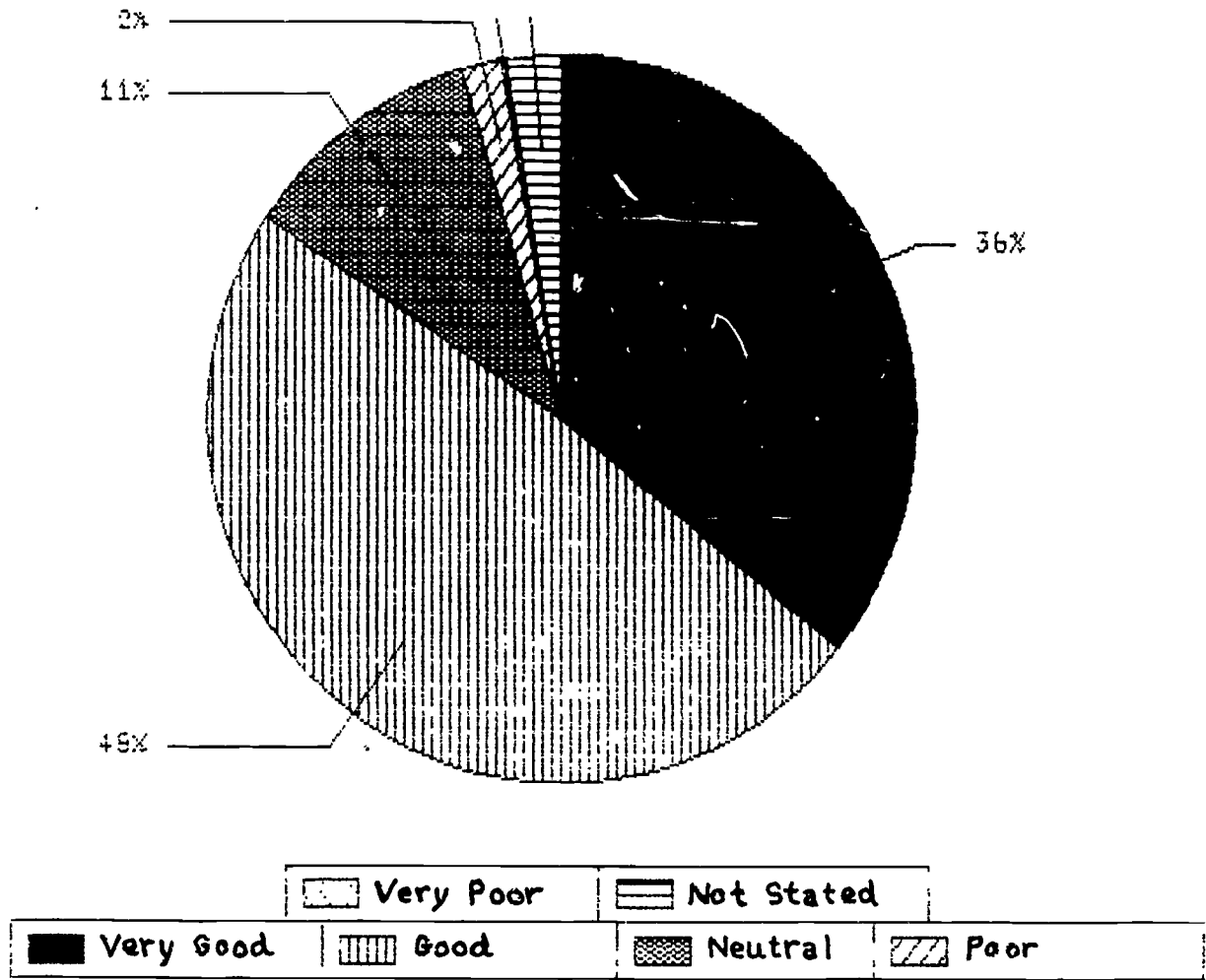

 Post Secondary Rating of Overall Rating

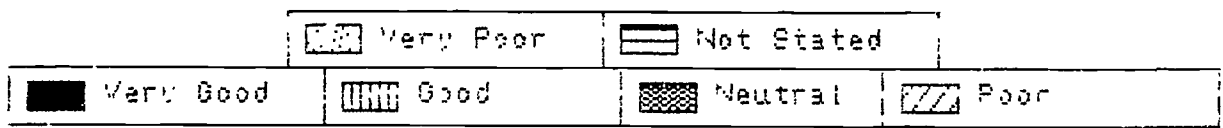
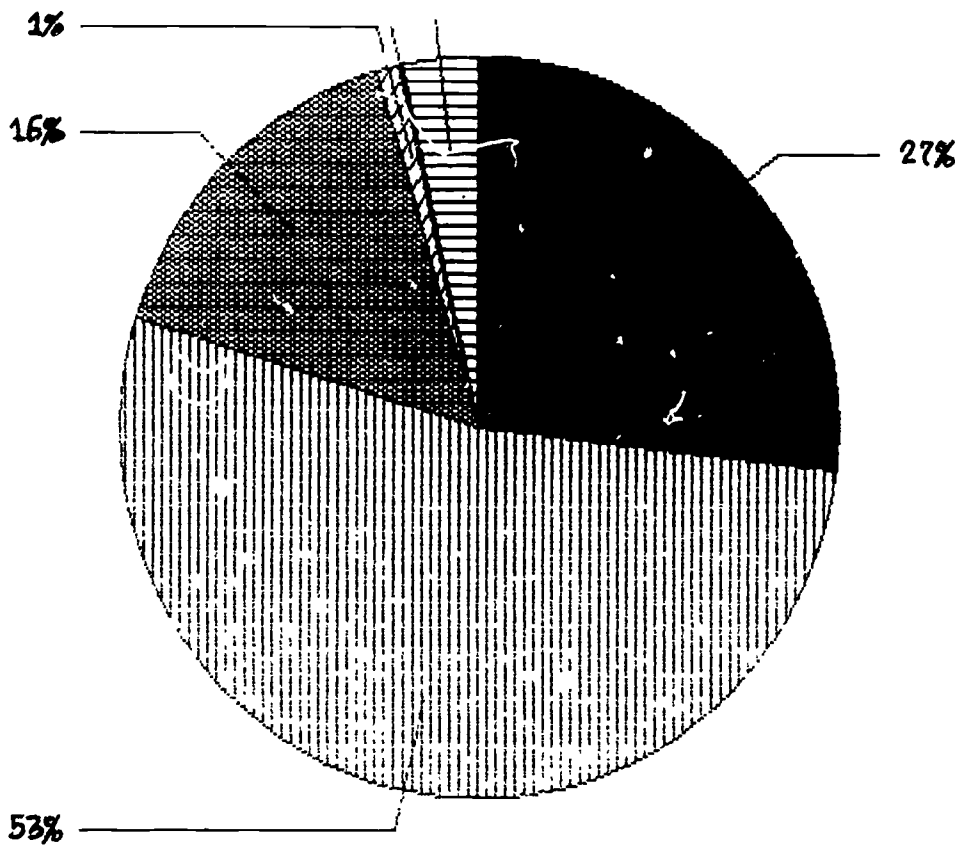

 Post Secondary Rating of Relative Preparation

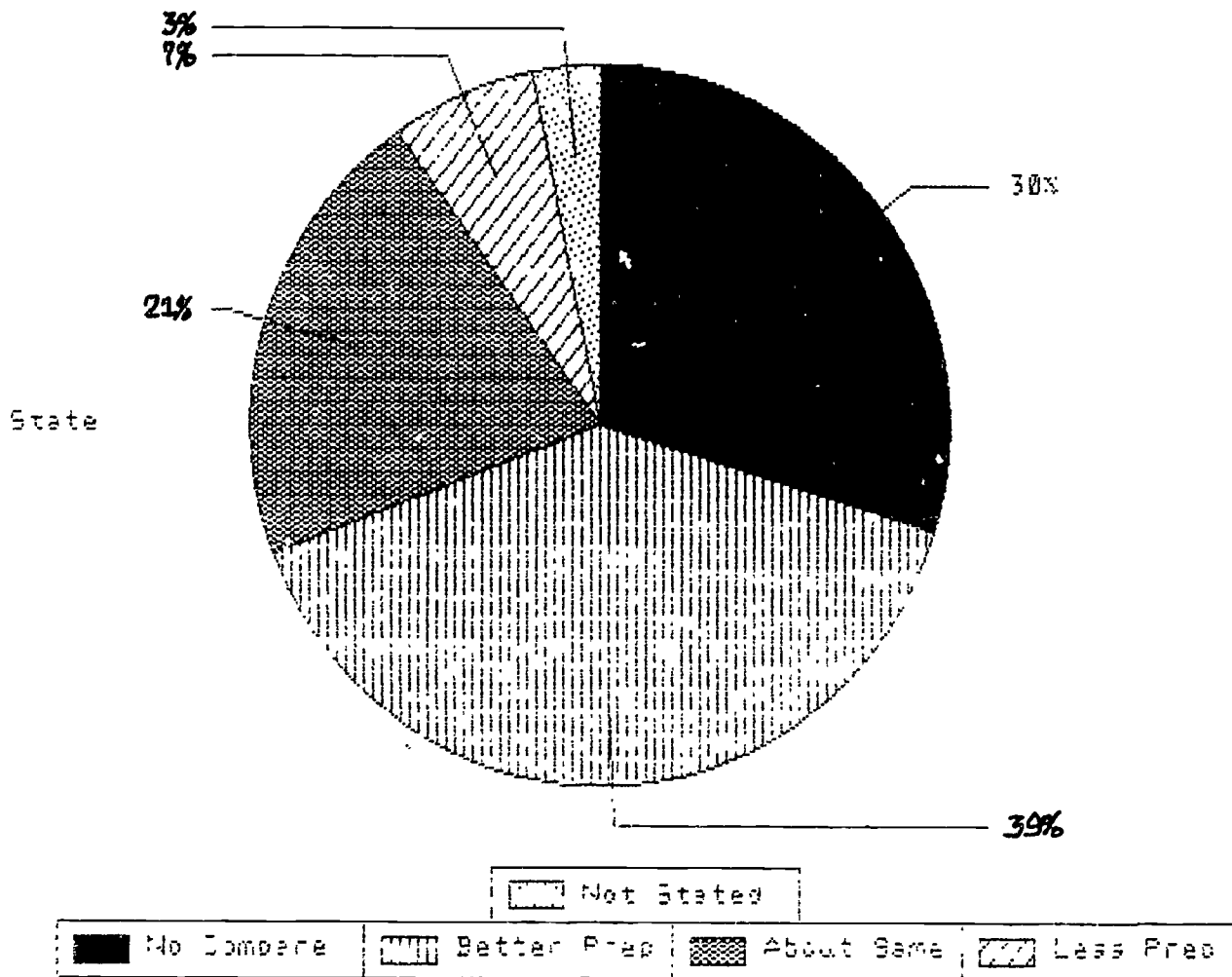


