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ABSTRACT

This report provides information on how 1985 high school graduates in the Los Angeles Unified School District plan to use their high school education and how they perceive the effectiveness of their high school programs. The data were gathered from 18,598 seniors in their last two weeks of high school (a response rate of 63%). Survey forms were filled out at school under staff supervision. Questions were divided into three general categories: background information on the student; plans for college or work after graduation; and opinions of courses, activities, and quality of instruction. Findings showed that, on the whole, pupils liked high school and a good number were pleased with the quality of teachers and instruction. They felt school spirit and school appearance needed improvement. They were dissatisfied with course offerings, counseling services, and school rules. Many were also dissatisfied with the quality of teachers and/or instruction. The report consists of charts and statistics of survey findings. It is divided into sections which provide the following: (1) districtwide findings; (2) summary by male and female; (3) summary by ethnic group; (4) continuation high schools summary; (5) opportunity schools summary; (6) schools of choice summary; (7) special education schools summary; (8) regular high schools summary; and (9) a copy of the questionnaire. 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FOREWORD

This report provides the district with information on how its graduates plan to use their high school education and how they perceive the effectiveness of their high school programs. The 12th graders surveyed attended regular high schools, continuation high schools, schools of choice, schools for handicapped students, and opportunity high schools. Students from adult division schools were not included.

By definition, a high school graduate is an individual who has completed high school requirements and has been granted a diploma. When the data were gathered for this study, seniors were in their last 2 weeks of high school.

Having completed the required course of study and passed required proficiency tests, most students were eligible for diplomas. In some cases, letters of recommendation were issued (a) to students with exceptional needs who had met all graduation requirements except for passing the proficiency tests, and (b) to students who had the approval of the principal.

Still other students had passed the California High School Proficiency Test, received the Certificate of Proficiency issued by the State Board of Education, and subsequently left school as early graduates.

Introduction

Plans of the Graduates is one in a series of annual studies of high school students in Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD). This study surveyed senior high graduates for their postgraduation plans and their opinions about the education they had just completed.

This study's respondents were from the 49 regular high schools, 40 continuation high schools, 25 schools of choice, 2 special education schools, and 4 opportunity schools. Students in adult division diploma programs were not included.

The data for this study were collected 2 weeks before the June 1985 graduation. The data gathering process involved sending survey forms to schools, having school staffs direct students to complete the forms, and returning the forms to Research & Evaluation Branch for analysis. The quantities of forms sent to schools were based on the 12th grade enrollment reported for the 1984 fall survey, totaling 29,433. Of this population, 25,039 (85%) students qualified for diplomas or letters of recommendation and became the target population for this survey.

Survey Instrument

A three-part, 58-item questionnaire called the Survey of Graduates, designed by the Research and Evaluation staff, gathered the data for this report. Administrators in the office of instruction and the senior high division office contributed items and other suggestions for the form.

Part I of the questionnaire, Background Information, requested student name, sex, ethnicity, and birthdate. This section also asked questions about high school experiences. The questions were grouped by theme for ease of analyzing the data and reporting the findings.

Part II, Plans, consisted of six questions about plans for college or work after graduation. Specific questions asked seniors to name the vocational/technical school they planned to attend, and their anticipated future job or occupation.

Part III, Opinions, consisted of 24 items. Of these items, 20 were the Likert-scaled type which asked questions about a wide range of topics such as courses, activities and quality of instruction provided. Also, in this section students identified problems facing their schools and gave their high school an overall rating. The final item in this section asked students for comments about their high school experiences.

Analysis Procedures

The data were analyzed by computer, using frequencies, percentages, and mean ratings of student responses. The findings are presented in summaries arranged in this order: total group (all district graduates), student groups (male/female and ethnic categories), and school summaries. School findings are reported by: nonregular high school summaries (continuation high schools, opportunity high schools, schools of choice, and schools for the handicapped) and individual regular high

schools. Data for nonregular schools are reported as group summaries because of the small number of students surveyed in such schools.

Student responses to the open-ended question about additional information were categorized and are presented in Table 2. Their statements are reported with findings rather than with subgroup data summaries.

Respondents

At the time of this survey, 25,039 seniors qualified for diplomas or letters of recommendation. Of this population, 18,598 completed surveys. The sample comprised 9,698 (52%) females, 8,667 (47%) males, and 233 (1%) students not identified by sex. (See item 3.) This response rate (63%) is 4 percentage points higher than the response rate (59%) for 1983, the last time this survey was conducted. Most of the respondents (95%), however, were eligible for diplomas. Only 1% expected to be awarded letters of recommendation instead of diplomas; 4% failed to respond to the diploma question. (See item 28.)

The respondents represented all ethnic groups in proportions that closely paralleled the 12th grade ethnic make-up in senior high schools, with minor differences. (See item 4.)

Findings

The findings are presented in summary format with the information following the same order as the items on the survey form, beginning with item 3. Items 30 and 33, follow (out of order) each data summary. The summaries are divided into three general categories: background information, plans, and opinions.

Part I: Background Information

Grades Attended in LAUSD. The grades 1985 graduates completed in LAUSD schools varied markedly. Only 11% had completed preschool through the 12th grade in district schools; 32% had completed kindergarten through the 12th grade. Slightly more than three-fourths (77%) completed grades 10-12 in district schools. (See item 6.)

The number of grades seniors completed in high schools from which they graduated also varied. The grades a student could complete in a school, however, depended on whether the school was regular or nonregular. Some district nonregular schools have grades 4-12, whereas regular high schools have grades 9-12 or 10-12. The findings on grades completed, therefore, reflect differences in schools' grade configurations as well as transiency rates.

Most respondents answered the question about the grades they had completed in high schools they were then attending. (See item 7.) A majority (77%) had been in attendance since the 10th grade. Others (0.4%) reported having been in attendance since the 4th grade. Each grade thereafter accounted for a progressively higher number of students who entered and remained until graduation.

Dropout Issues. The dropout issue is of paramount concern in the district. Graduating seniors were therefore considered to be an excellent source of information on reasons why students think of dropping out and why they remain in school. Three survey questions gathered this

information. (See items 22-24.) The first question asked seniors if they ever considered dropping out of school. In response, 83% said no. Nearly all of the remaining respondents (15%) said yes.

In a second question, seniors who considered dropping were asked to give reasons for having decided to do so. The one noted most was family reasons. Other reasons mentioned frequently were poor marks, teacher problems, work responsibilities, financial difficulties, and students at school. The reason noted less frequently was age, when a student was 18 or older.

Finally, those who contemplated dropping out (2,702) were asked to identify factors that caused them to change their minds and remain in school. Most of them (1,955) changed their minds because they believed it was important to graduate. Others (887) said their parents had encouraged them to stay in school; 628 credited their peers for the same encouragement. A group of 424 gave their counselors the credit.

Writing assignments. Writing is an essential part of LAUSD high school English instruction. This generalization was substantiated by the fact that an overwhelming majority of graduates (97%) said they had writing assignments in English each week. Taking into consideration variations in the number of assignments students had, the largest group (5,637) averaged three each week, whereas another (3,825) averaged as many as five or more. (See item 25.)

Writing is not limited to English classes but is an intricate part of the high school curriculum. Most respondents (97%) had writing assignments in other classes (not English), with the largest group (5,637) averaging three assignments. A group of 1,356 averaged one writing assignment each week outside of English. (See item 26.)

Part II: Plans of the 1985 Graduates

Plans for Further Schooling. The 1985 graduates' plans for further schooling varied slightly from the plans of the 1983 graduates. (See item 29.) About 31% of this year's graduates planned to attend 4-year colleges full-time compared to 34% in 1983. Full-time attendance in 2-year colleges was the goal of 19% of the sample, compared to 21% in 1983. The percentage of graduates (49%) who planned to attend a 4-year or community college full-time differed by 18 percentage points from those (67%) who had completed college preparatory courses. Almost identical percentages were reported for 1983 graduates. The percentage (41%) of this year's graduates who reported having A or B grade point averages (see item 19) differed by 8 percentage points from the percentage (49%) who planned to attend college full-time. In 1983 these percentages only varied by 2 points.

Asked to name the vocational/technical school or college they planned to attend the following fall, respondents named a total of 228 schools. These institutions ranged from local trade schools to prestigious universities in states other than California. The majority, named local community colleges or California state colleges. In 1983, graduates named only 191 schools (16% fewer than this year's). (See item 30.)

By graduation time, the time of this survey, college bound students had given some serious thought to financing their college education. As evidence, a sizable group (3,933) had been promised financial aid from sources other than parents, relatives or their own resources. (See item 32.)

Another group (3,271) almost equal in size to the previous had given thought to the matter but were uncertain whether they would succeed in getting outside financing. Finally, 7,323 students, slightly more than the previous groups put together, said they did not expect outside help. These students obviously had planned to pay for their own education.

Plans for Employment. Graduates' plans for work varied in that some (7%) anticipated working part or full-time and not attending school; others (25%) expected to be working and attending school. Only 1% anticipated becoming full-time homemakers; 4% planned to join the military. Employment plans for this year's graduates were similar to those of the 1983 graduates. (See item 29.)

The graduates named a wide range of jobs or occupations they planned to have in the future. (See item 31.) These jobs or occupations cut across the whole spectrum of employment in this country. The largest group (1,317) named business as their future endeavor. Another 1,151 planned to work in the computer field. Others expressed interest in clerical work (829), accounting (775), and engineering (756).

Part III. 1985 Graduates' Opinions

Experiences. In part III of the questionnaire (items 35-54), graduates responded to 24 questions about their opinions of their high school experiences. Twenty of the questions were Likert-scaled and were

analyzed by computing mean responses on a 4-point scale (strongly agree = 4, agree = 3, disagree = 2, and strongly disagree = 1). For the remaining four questions, frequency counts and percentages were generated.

There was very little variation in the graduates' responses on the Likert-scaled items. Most questions received a mean response of 3, indicating agreement. Salient issues respondents agreed with were the district C-Average/No Fail Policy, the importance of teachers motivating students to learn, and the need for occupation-related courses and high school computer classes. These issues received responses almost identical with those of 1983 graduates.

Out of 24 issues, graduates disagreed with only 2. They disagreed (a mean response of 2) with the notion that there is too much gang activity on high school campuses (the same response as 1983 graduates'), and with the statement: counselors helped them gain an understanding of their talents, interests and personal problems.

Positive and Negative Aspects of High School. An overwhelming majority of the graduates (90%) identified what they considered to be the single biggest problem facing their schools. They did so by selecting, from a list of 10 problems, the one of greatest magnitude. The list (see item 55) ran the gamut of problems that could be present in a high school, and the problems named by seniors spanned the scope of the list.

The problem identified by 3,898 graduates was student lack of interest. Another group (2,783) said the lack of money for schools was the biggest problem. Other groups (1,750 and 1,401) considered students dropping out and teachers' lack of interest as major problems.

Even though a large number of respondents recognized problems in their schools, others held opposing views. A group of 2,024 respondents said there were no big problems facing their schools.

On the positive side, graduates identified the best features of their schools (see item 56). Quality of education was noted by 3,471 as the best feature. Others named school location (2,985), extracurricular activities (2,254), variety of programs (2,117) and teachers (2,104) as exemplary features.

Rating High Schools. Item 58 asked graduates to rate their high school's performance on a 5-point scale (excellent to poor). Results: 13% rated their school as excellent, 43% good, and 28% satisfactory. Only 4% thought that their schools had performed poorly. This year's ratings are nearly identical to ratings in 1983.

Comments

The graduating seniors wrote 4,278 comments about their high school experiences. Of these, 28% (1,201) were positive, 65% (2,796) were negative, and 7% (281) specified school issues that needed improvement.

Although almost two-thirds of the respondents made critical comments about the district, it should be noted that open-ended formats typically yield negative results. Participants may rate many of the components of

school experience as positive but make negative open-ended remarks. It is important to remember that comments came from each of the 80 schools represented in this study.

For interpretative purposes, the comments were analyzed and sorted into 21 topics, with frequencies ranging from 900 to 31. (See Table 2.)

Counseling Services

- I wish I could have had ... for a counselor. She is very caring and understanding.
- The College Advisor was good.
- The counselors did not help me at all. They didn't take time to help you get classes you need and want. Maybe it's because the school is too crowded but it's a problem that must be solved.
- Counselors should be more available to students. They should be more informed and more interested in students.
- Counselors should communicate more with students and understand the problems they are facing.

Teacher/Instruction

- We have very good teachers who really care for the education of students, but today's students just don't have enough interest in learning. Something should be done to encourage them to learn and stay in school.
- I want to thank all the teachers at for taking time to help other people learn different skills.
- Because I was in the honors classes, I was privileged (sic) to have the better teachers, books and academic programs. I think that my school should, while not ignoring honor students, pay greater attention to the needs of average and below average students.
- There are only a few teachers who really care. I am in an extracurricular activity (play production) and the teacher does not teach a thing. In fact, she does not even encourage us.
- Many of the teachers are "burned out" and should no longer be working, but there are still many valuable teachers.
- This school should have less oral assignments and maybe people will start passing their classes and stop dropping out, and probably like school more.

Discipline/Rules

- The school rules are terrible. They treat us like prisoners or juveniles. School security is unsatisfactory. The security guards think they're bunch of Clint Eastwood's. Most students can't even go out to lunch. It's like elementary school.
- School should be a place that kids look forward to coming to, not hate, especially high school ... it should be enjoyable.
- Freedom of press is nonexistent. Our school newspaper refuses to print anything negative toward the school.
- Our school needs more discipline, kids get too fresh with the teachers.
- I hate thank God I'm out of here next month. Lot's of loud mouths walking around disrupting!
- The "C" average but no-fail is an inappropriate. The "C" average should be followed. However, the no-fail should be disallowed because sometimes the fail comes because of a personal conflict with a teacher.

School Administration

- The administration really care and are really doing a good job, so are a few teachers.
- The administration is thoroughly incompetent; they give everyone the run around and they are simply concerned with saving their reputations. As long as they get their money, they really don't care.
- One large problem of this school is its administrators, who seem to spend so much time following school board policies that they get their priorities mixed up. More time is also spent by the administrators forcing their own personal values upon the students until they fail to execute the duties they are being paid for.

- It would lessen the number of students who ditch class or dropout if teachers and administrators took the time to make more fun and time to teach more. We definitely need better teachers! Don't let teachers just sit and dictate to students. They should have class discussions and let students get involved. Some teachers should be monitored.

School in General

- I think this school is an excellent school to attend. My 3 years here were the best, especially the school itself.
- ... is a wonderful school where I have learned everything I know, and where I've met my best friends. I am really going to miss this school.
- I love my high school, I will miss it, the best.
- School is very unchallenging and the atmosphere is so uneducated orientated, it's sad.

Summary of Findings

1. The number of years graduates spent in LAUSD before graduating varied markedly. Only 11% completed all of their education in the district.
2. A majority (77%) of the graduates attended the school from which they graduated since they were 10th graders.
3. Of the seniors sampled, 2,702 considered dropping out of school but changed their minds.
4. A majority of those (72%) who considered dropping out changed their minds because they believed it was important to graduate from high school.
5. About 31% of the graduates planned to attend 4-year colleges full time.
6. The graduates named 228 vocational/technical schools or colleges they planned to attend in fall 1985.
7. By graduation time, 3,933 college bound seniors had been promised financial aid from sources other than their parents or relatives or their own resources.
8. Only 7% of the sample worked part or full-time while in high school.
9. In naming future occupations, the largest group of respondents (1,317) planned to have their own business.
10. A lack of student interest was identified as the biggest problem facing high schools.
11. The quality of education was noted by 3,471 graduates as the best feature of their high schools.
12. About 13% of the graduates rated their school's performance excellent; 43% rated their schools good; 28% rated theirs satisfactory. Only 4% gave their schools a poor rating.
