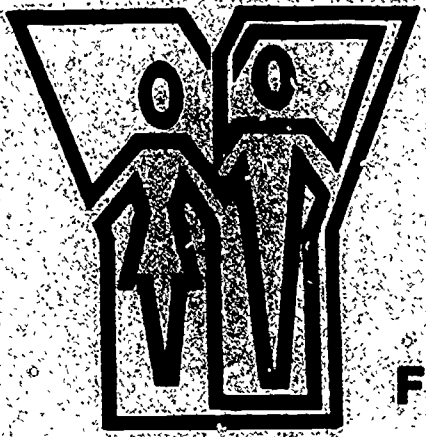
**ABSTRACT**

This report presents data on the social, legal, and demographic characteristics of youth admitted to the residential programs of the New York State Division for Youth (DFY) during 1984. These programs offer services for youth referred by the courts, social services, and other agencies. The report is divided into seven sections. Section 1 outlines characteristics of youths admitted during 1984 and provides a table describing major changes in the composition of the client population between 1983 and 1984. Section 2 presents seven tables on the characteristics of three types of admission (first time, readmittance during aftercare placement, and readmittance after leaving the program completely). Section 3 presents 12 tables on characteristics of all admissions to DFY residential programs according to region and district of referral. Section 4 provides eight tables which detail the social and demographic characteristics of all DFY admissions according to level of placement. Section 5 contains 11 tables which explore more intensively the social and demographic characteristics of all DFY admissions. Section 6 presents six tables which detail similar social and demographic information on all DFY programs by responsible county. Finally, Section 7 provides four tables of statistics on service termination. (KH)

To the Governor and People of New York State:

During each year, staff at the Division for Youth collect and store data pertaining to our 2,000+ residential admissions annually and present summary information about the youth admitted to our care in the Program Operations Annual Statistical Report. The report has been produced in substantially the same format in which it first appeared in 1979 -- which is not to say that it has not been subject to improvements over the past six years. While undergoing continual refinement, the report has retained its basic format, facilitating the comparison of information across years and the identification of trends in DFY clientele characteristics as well as in their placement configurations.

This report provides a summary of the patterns in individual and regional placements experienced by the Division for Youth during calendar year 1984; the information contained herein functions as base line data for the Division's planning effort during 1985 and beyond. Additionally, this report should prove to be a valuable source of information for state and local government officials who are interested in the welfare of the young citizens of New York State, and in particular, in those youth involved with the juvenile justice system.

I am pleased to report that for the second year running, admissions to our secure facilities have decreased, continuing a trend first noted in last year's summary. We at the Division hope that this trend is at least partially the result of the increasing effectiveness of DFY-sponsored preventive programs across the State. In partnership with concerned local communities, I pray that at some time in the not too distant future, we will be able to reduce juvenile delinquency to the point where a report such as this will no longer be necessary.

## PREFACE

The New York State Division for Youth has two basic responsibilities. It provides state aid to localities for the operation of Youth Development and Special Delinquency Prevention, Detention and Voluntary Agency programs, and it directly offers residential and non-residential services for youth referred to it by the courts, Social Services and other agencies. The information contained within this volume is concerned exclusively with the description of the social, legal, and demographic characteristics of youth admitted to the Division's residential programs during calendar year 1984.

To maximize comparability across years, the format of the 1985 report follows very closely that of 1984. Although it is hoped that the report will undergo continual refinement, continuity in the presentation of yearly admission information has been identified as an important Annual Statistical Report objective.

### Structure of the Report

In order to provide a comprehensive overview of the characteristics of the client population served within the Division's residential programs during the 1984 calendar year, the following strategy of presentation is employed:

#### A. Admissions

- The "Summary and Highlights" overview (Part A, pages iv-v) identifies particularly noteworthy characteristics of youth admitted during the 1984 calendar year.
- Section I (Table 1) describes major changes in the composition of the Division client population between calendar years 1983 and 1984.
- Section II (Tables 2-8) presents information for comparative purposes on the characteristics of three distinct types of admissions to Division residential programs in calendar year 1984: (a) youth admitted to a Division residential program for the first time; (b) youth readmitted to a residential program from aftercare while still on their initial placement with the Division; and (c) youth whose prior legal placement may have expired, but whose conduct has resulted in their subsequent placement with the Division on a new placement order.
- Section III (Tables 9-20) presents information on the characteristics of all admissions to DFY residential programs according to their region and district of referral. These tables provide a basis for examining the differences in youth populations referred from different regions and districts. The final table in this particular section (Table 20) also permits an examination of Division policy regarding placement of youth as close to their home communities as possible.

- Section IV (Tables 21-28) presents in more detail the social and demographic characteristics of all DFY admissions according to their level of placement. Since the Division's residential programs are structured according to level of security and community basedness, these tables provide a source of base line information regarding the extent to which youth populations differ among secure, non-community based, and community based programs.
- Section V (Tables 29-39) explores more intensively the social and demographic characteristics of all DFY admissions.
- Section VI (Tables 40-45) presents similar social and demographic information on all DFY admissions by responsible county. These tables should prove of greatest interest to local social service districts, county level youth bureaus, and county youth service administrators and agency personnel.

Before proceeding to an examination of the tables, a few notes are in order. First, admissions from aftercare immediately preceded by a discharge of six days or less are not counted as a distinct admission.

Secondly, Section IV presents information pertaining to youth's Level of Placement. The tables in this section refer to Levels numerically (i.e., I through VIII). These Level numbers are to be interpreted as follows: Level I, secure; Level II, limited secure; Level III, special residential; Level IV, rural, non-secure, limited access; Level V, community based limited access; Level VI, community based open programs; Level VII, foster care/independent living; and Level VIII, cooperative, voluntary and alternative agencies.

Thirdly, the percentages which appear in subsequent tables refer to the proportions based on known responses. Hence, they are computed on the total number of cases (for a given table) less the number of unknown values for each variable. To enhance readability, the row percentage totals (100.0%) have been eliminated in most tables.

Every effort has been made to minimize the amount of missing data for each variable included in the report. A comparison of the current levels of unknown information with those of 1982 illustrates the extent to which that goal has been achieved. As a result of this effort, however, there are two distinct sources of variation in measures of yearly change. The first is the actual change experienced between time periods. The second results from a reduction in the effects of systematic bias in the reporting of information. Although this does not render yearly comparisons meaningless, the latter influence should be considered in interpreting levels of change.

#### B. Service Terminations

- The "Summary and Highlights" section (Part B, pages vi-vii) identifies information on client length of stay for youth whose stays with the Division terminated during calendar year 1984.
- Section VII (Tables 46-49) provides a comprehensive description of the total residential length of stay for youth served by the

Division. The present report summarizes this LOS information for stays terminating in 1984 either through release to aftercare or discharge directly from facility. Two main types of information are presented; (1) average LOS for clients with various background and legal characteristics, and (2) numbers and percentages of service terminations falling within a range of seven six-month intervals.

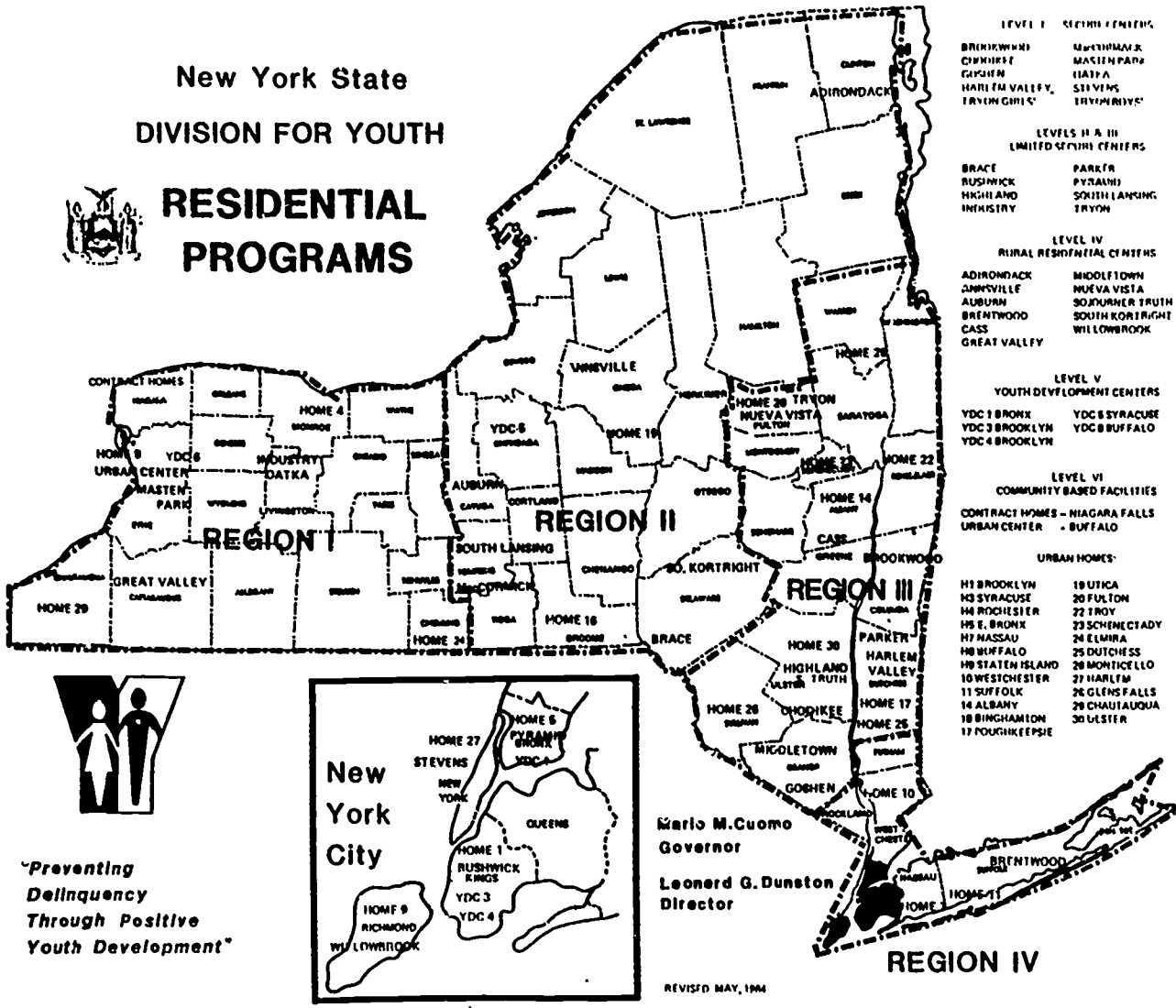
It is important to note that LOS as reported here is not facility or level specific, but is defined as the total residential length of stay. This means that the length of time that a client remains in each facility during a particular term of placement is essentially added together to produce an overall LOS.

It is also important to note that the counts that appear in the tables refer to service terminations and not to individuals. Thus, a client whose service was terminated twice in 1984 would be assigned two length of stay figures.

## SUMMARY AND HIGHLIGHTS

### A. Admissions

1. A total of 2,256 youth were admitted to DFY in 1984; 1,839 (81.5%) new admissions, 286 (12.7%) readmissions from aftercare and 131 (5.8%) new admissions with prior service (see Table 1).
2. The 1984 admission rate revealed a slight decline in the number of youth admitted to the Division. Admissions for 1983 exceeded those for 1984 by 139 youth, a decline of 5.8% from 1983. This is a significant change from the 3.1% growth rate experienced between 1981 and 1982.
3. The age distribution for youth admitted during 1984 remained virtually constant in comparison with youth admitted during the preceding year; the mean age for youth at admission during 1984 remained unchanged from 1983, 15.5 years.
4. The decrease in readmissions from aftercare reported in 1983 reversed itself during 1984. Admissions to DFY from aftercare increased 17.7%. Admissions with prior service decreased 38.8% from 1983 levels, a reversal of the 1982-83 pattern.
5. Youth adjudicated as Juvenile Offender, Restrictive Juvenile Delinquent or Juvenile Delinquent comprised 80.4% of all 1984 admissions, an increase of 2.8% from 1983. Compared to 1983, the number of youth admitted for Class A felonies increased 11.8%, while those admitted for Class B felonies decreased 6.1%, and those admitted for Class C felonies increased 4.1%.
6. Of the 1,839 youth newly admitted to the Division, Blacks accounted for 45.2%, Whites 37.0% and Hispanics 17.0%. The pattern of Whites constituting the majority of readmissions from aftercare was broken in 1984; Blacks constituted the majority of readmissions from aftercare in 1984 (44.4%), followed by Whites (41.3%) (see Table 2).
7. Admissions to secure facilities decreased 11.1% from 1983, the second such decrease since the enactment of the Juvenile Offender legislation in September 1978 (see Table 1).
8. Among all DFY admissions, 44.4% were placed in Region III. Again, this can be attributed to the number of Division beds located in Region III, which accounts for more than 40% of all Division beds statewide.
9. A comparison of admissions by region of referral shows an increase in Regions II and III, while Regions I and IV decreased. Region II showed the largest increase in placements (9.0%), while Region I experienced the greatest decrease (20.7%).
10. The marked difference in Region IV and non-Region IV youth admitted to secure programs continued in 1984. The proportion of Region IV youth placed in Level I was 21%, while youth admitted to secure

programs in 1984 from the remaining three regions accounted for only 2.7% of their total admissions. Region IV accounted for 90.6% of all admissions to secure facilities during 1984 (see Table 15).

11. The proportion of all youth placed in the region of referral dropped from 49% in 1983 to 48% in 1984, a trend of slowly but steadily declining "same region" placements first noted during 1980 (see Table 20).
12. Placement in the same region as referral is largely dependent on the types of programs and facilities available in each region. Overall, Juvenile Offenders were placed in the region of referral 18.8% of the time. Restrictive JDs were similarly placed in 14.3% of the cases, while 43.9% of the JDs were placed in the region of referral.
13. There was a pronounced association between region of referral and offense. Region IV, while accounting for 51% of all admissions, accounted for 94% of homicides (n=34), 96% of controlled substance offenses (n=26), 89% of robberies (n=397), 77% of dangerous weapons charges, (n=39) and 75% of all probation violations (n=16) (see Table 18).
14. The strong association of ethnicity and region of referral continued for 1984. While only 21% of White admissions were referred from Region IV, 72% of Blacks and 93% of Hispanics were referred from these same counties (see Table 11).
15. The relationship between ethnicity and level of placement reported in past years continued in 1984. In the Division's secure programs, for example, approximately 65% were Black, 27% were Hispanic and 8% were White. Among those admitted to community based facilities, 51% were White, 42% were Black and 7% Hispanic (see Table 21).
16. An examination of ethnic differences in the type of charge (an important determinant of initial placement) revealed that 14% of White (JO, RJD or JD) admissions involved the commission of a Class A, B or C felony. The comparison figure for Black youth was 39% and 35% for Hispanics (see Table 35).
17. The tendency to find differential distributions of offense among ethnic groups is consistent with preceding years. Whites, while comprising 31% of all JOs, Restrictive JDs and JDs, accounted for 53% of arson charges, 47% of criminal mischief charges, 46% of burglary charges and 42% of other theft charges. Blacks (48%) were charged with 52% of all assault charges and 71% of all robberies. Hispanics, while accounting for 20% of all JOs, RJDs and JDs, were disproportionately represented in charges of homicide (32%), criminal mischief (28%) and controlled substance charges (46%).
18. Among the 1,457 newly admitted Juvenile Offenders, Restrictive Juvenile Delinquents and Juvenile Delinquents, the top five offenses were: larceny (22%), robbery (20%), burglary (17%), other theft (12%), and assault (9%) (see Table 8).

19. Females (representing 10% of the JO, RJD and JD admissions), accounted for 19% of admissions involving an assault charge, 19% of the violation of probation charges and roughly 16% of larceny charges (see Table 32).

B. Service Terminations

1. Average length of stay (LOS) for youth whose stays were terminated in 1984 was 13.7 months, with 76% staying 18 months or less. These figures are based on a total of 2,306 service terminations.
2. An examination of admission type (Table 46) shows the majority of youth to be new admissions with an average LOS of 14.5 months. Admissions with prior service and readmissions from aftercare had average stays of 13.1 and 8.9 months, respectively.
3. Table 46 also shows a general trend toward shorter average lengths of stay for older youth. The youngest group, the 10 to 12 year olds, had the longest average LOS of 19.1 months. LOS gradually decreases to 7.0 months for the 18 and over age group.
4. On average, males had longer lengths of stay than females (14.2 and 11.4 months, respectively). However, these figures reflect a greater representation of males than females in more serious (JO and RJD) adjudication categories (see Table 31).
5. Breakdowns of LOS by ethnicity show variations in LOS for Whites (12.3 months), Blacks (14.6 months), and Hispanics (14.6 months). However, these differences in LOS appear to be a function of ethnic group differences in type of charge, and should be interpreted together with offense data (see Table 35).
6. Regional differences in average LOS (Table 47) also were observed. Youth placed from Region III had the shortest average LOS at 11.8 months. Youth placed from Regions I and II had approximately equal average lengths of stay at 13.7 and 13.1 months, respectively. Youth from Region IV had the longest average LOS at 14.8 months, as would be expected on the basis of its large numbers of serious offenders.  
  
Districts within Regions I and II differed slightly in average LOS (11.7 months and 12.1 months for Districts 1 and 2 in Region I, and 13.7 months and 12.2 months for Districts 1 and 2 in Region II). District differences were somewhat larger in Regions III and IV. In Region III, District 1 had an average LOS of 13.2 months while District 2 had average stays of 9.8 months. In Region IV, District 1 had a slightly longer average LOS at 15.3 months, than Districts 2 and 3 which had average lengths of stay of 14.7 and 14.4 months, respectively.
7. Length of stay varied with adjudication from a high of 29.5 months for Restrictive Juvenile Delinquents to a low of 0.8 months for youth in the "Other Adjudication" category. Juvenile Offenders

stayed an average of 16.1 months, Juvenile Delinquents, 13.8 months, and PINS, 11.5 months. While the length of stay for JOs appears to be unexpectedly short, this may be accounted for by several factors. First, youth whose stays have terminated in 1984 may have served substantial portions of their sentences in secure detention, since some were likely to have been placed with the Division prior to compliance with the Crespo decision. Secondly, since these figures are based on stays rather than individuals, very short lengths of stay may represent second stays for an individual (for example, in cases of parole violators). Finally, due to the recent nature of JO legislation, the increasing number of JO placements and the relatively long sentences typically awarded, youth with comparatively brief lengths of stay tend to be overrepresented in a service termination group. Due to these factors, the LOS identified here does not represent the length of time JOs admitted during a given time period will remain in program. A better estimate of JO LOS was found to be 25 months (see Population Growth in DFY Level I Programs, September 16, 1982).

8. Differences in average LOS with legal status of placement are shown in Table 48. The majority of placements fell in the category "Court to DFY," which had an average LOS of 14.1 months; representing the longest average LOS for youth whose service was terminated during 1984 were placements in the "Court to DFY to Voluntary Agency." Relatively short average stays occurred for youth in the categories "Court to DSS" and "Condition of Probation" (7.3 months, and 8.2 months respectively). Voluntary admissions stayed an average of 10.0 months.
9. Table 49 shows longer average stays to be associated with more serious crimes. For example, the average LOS for homicide was 28.5 months, as compared with an overall average stay of 14.4 months for the 1,874 JOs, RJDS and JDS terminating service in 1984. The majority of offenses fell in the categories of assault, burglary, larceny, robbery and other theft. LOS associated with these categories ranged from 14.6 months for other theft, to 13.0 months for larceny. Shortest average stays (11.3 months) were noted in the category "kidnapping."
10. More serious charge types, like offense types, were associated with somewhat longer average stays. For example, average LOS for felonies was 15.0 months, while average LOS for misdemeanors was 13.8 months. Class A felonies showed a markedly longer average LOS of 35.2 months. As would be expected, the less serious category "Violations," had a shorter average LOS (10.8 months).

Age Composition of DFY Admissions, 1984

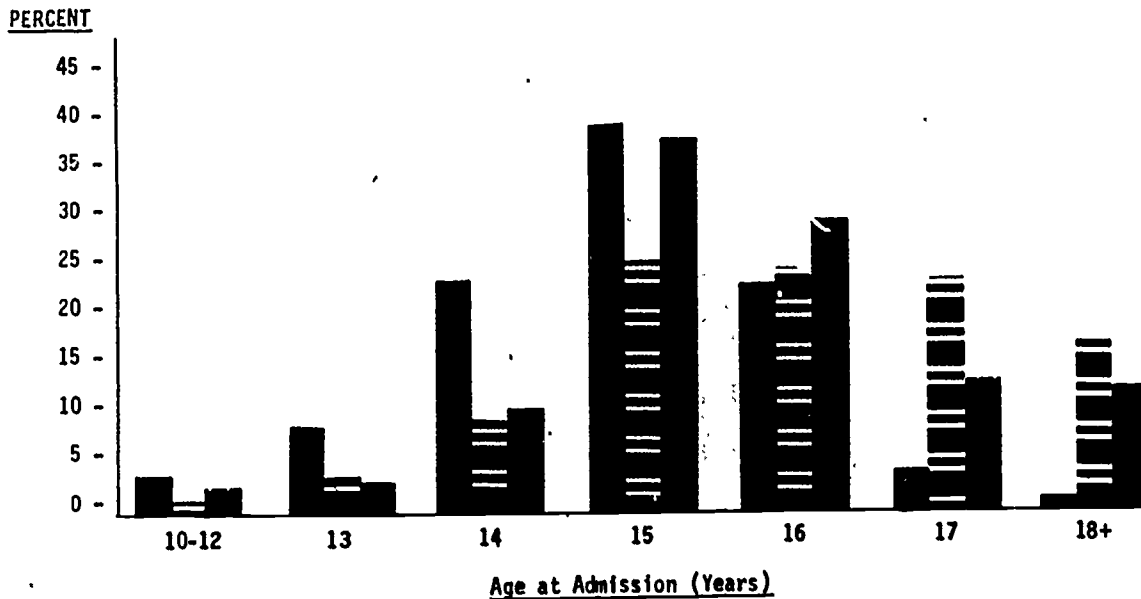
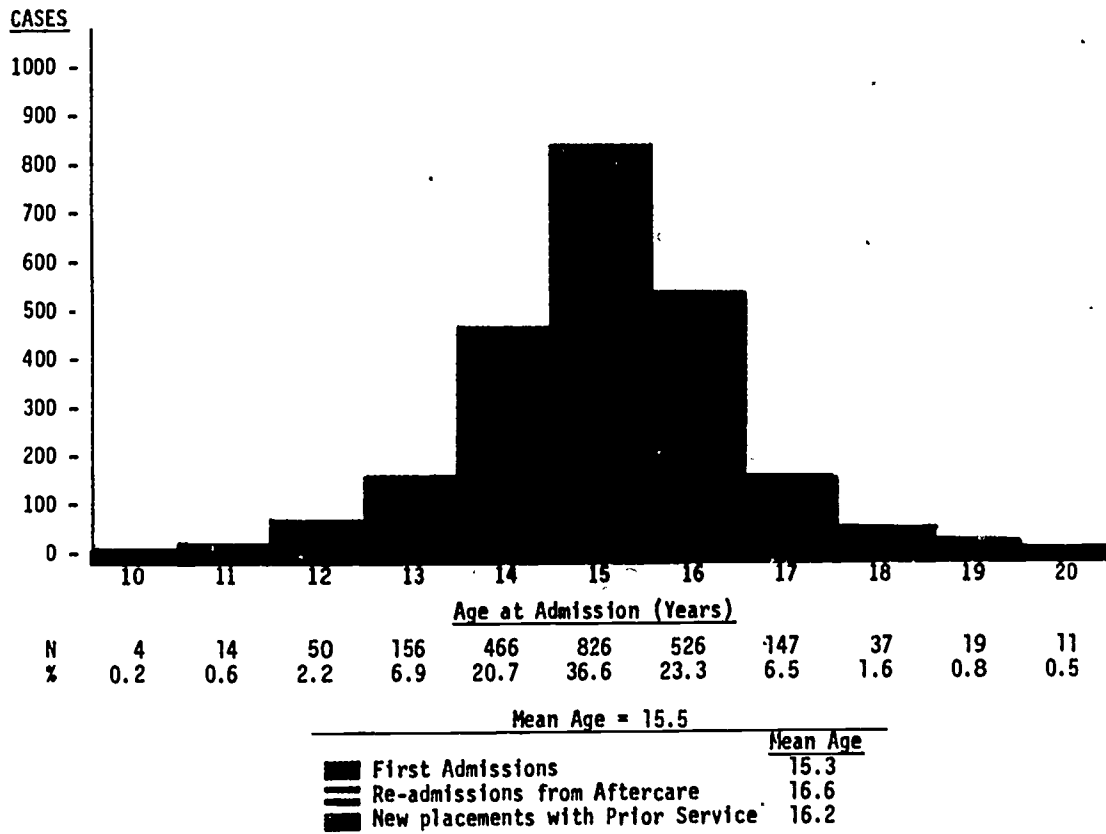

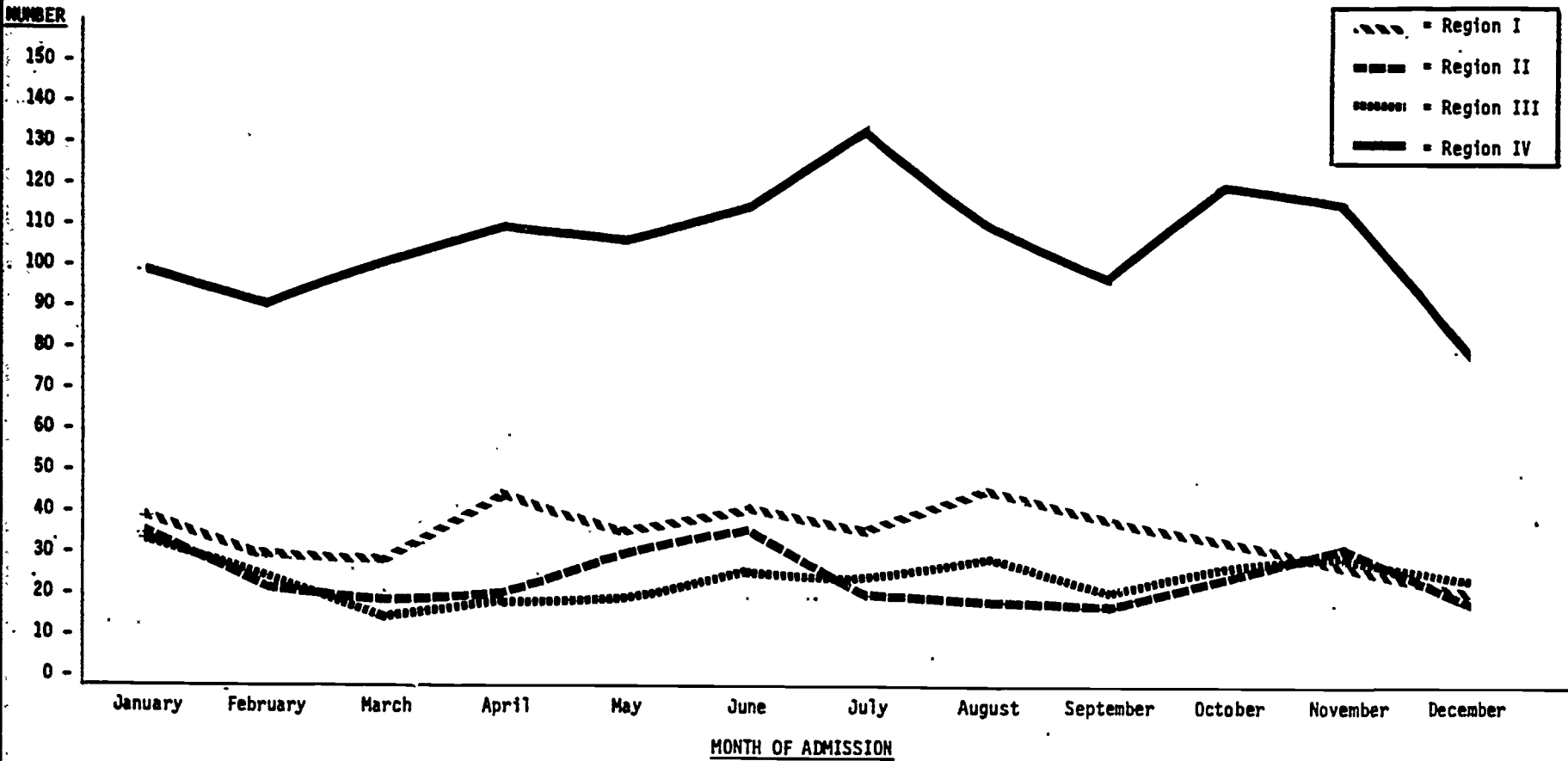

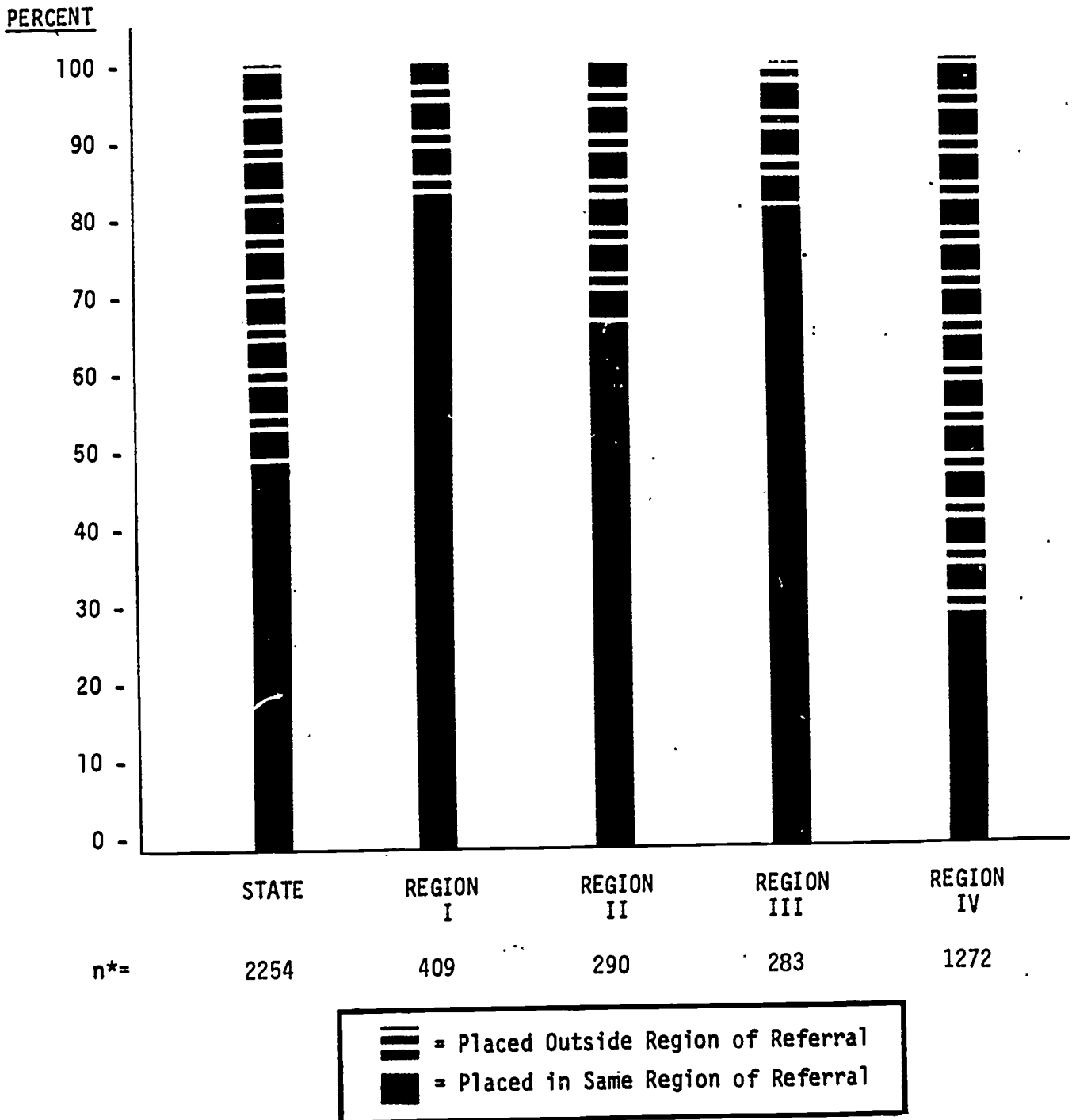

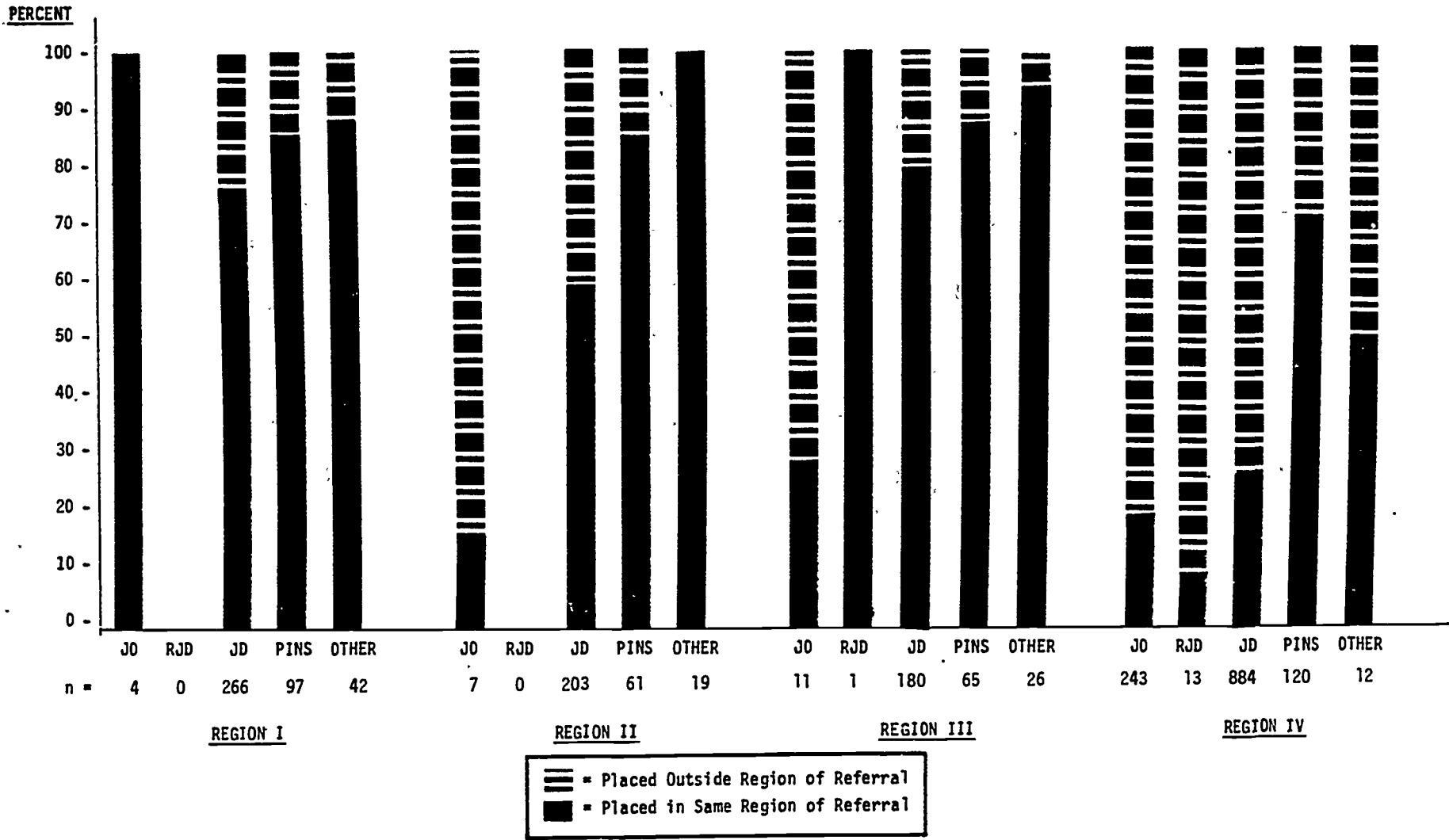

 Intake Month of DFY Admissions by Level of Placement, 1984

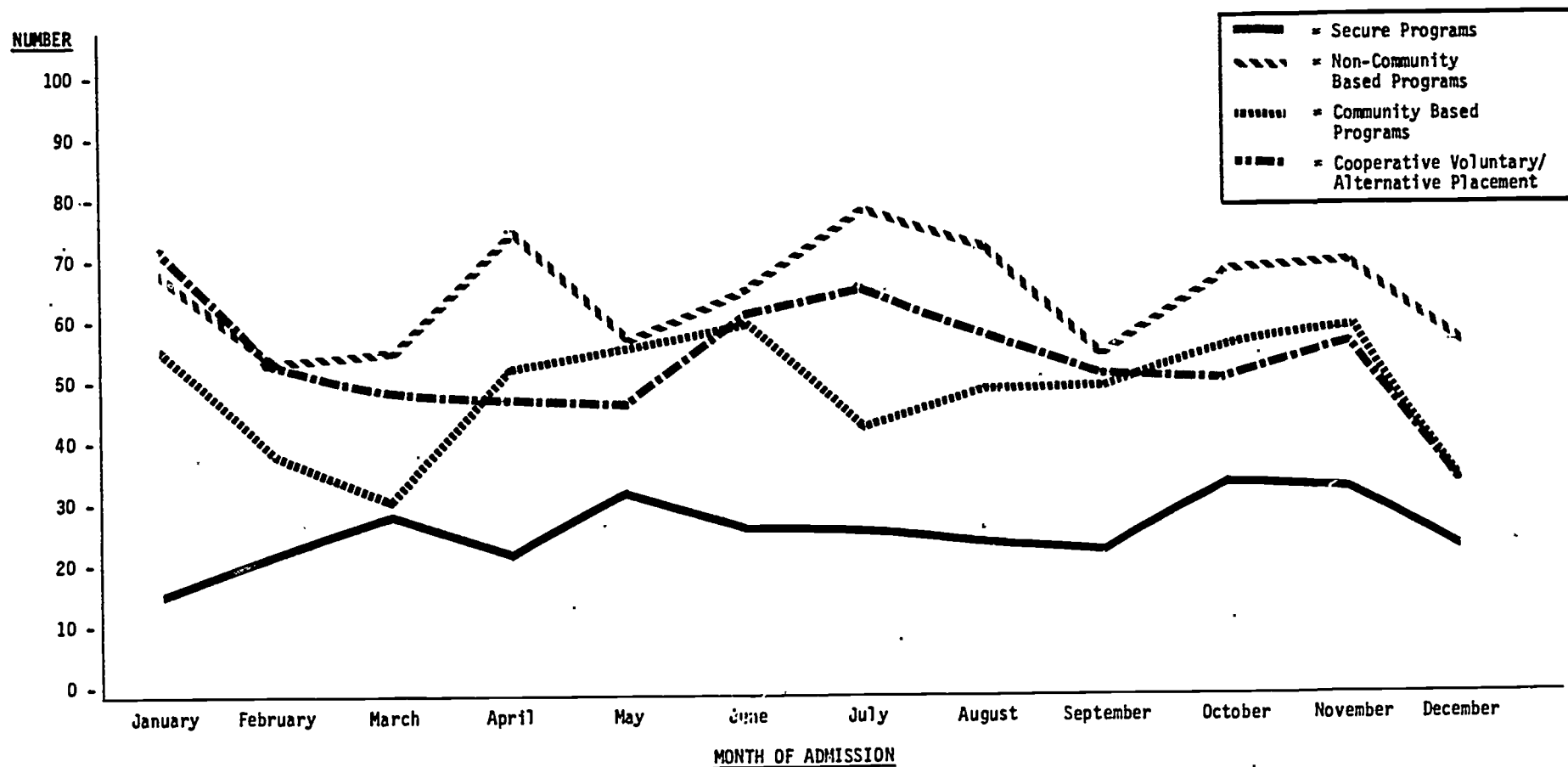

Charge Type by Sex, 1984

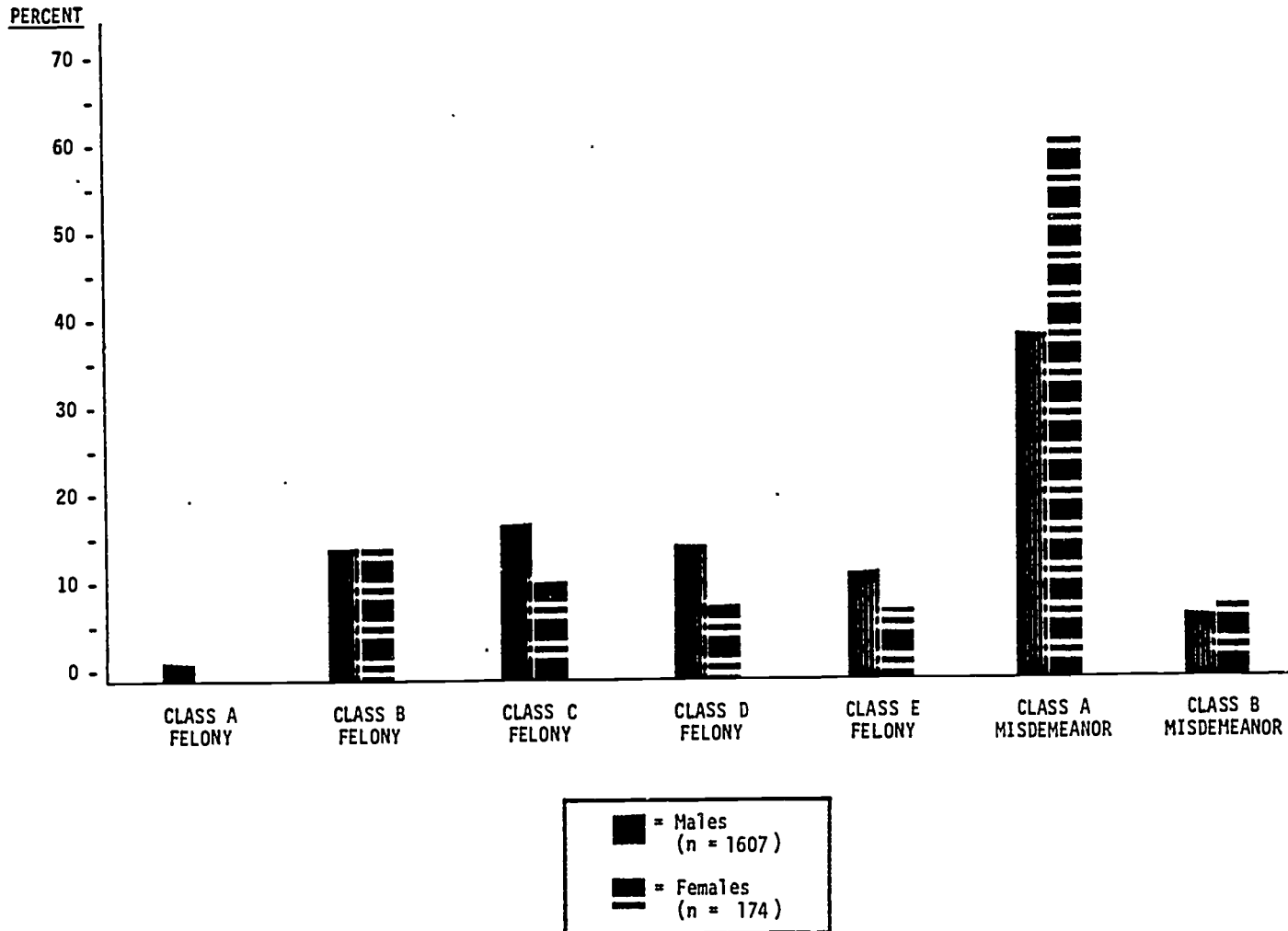
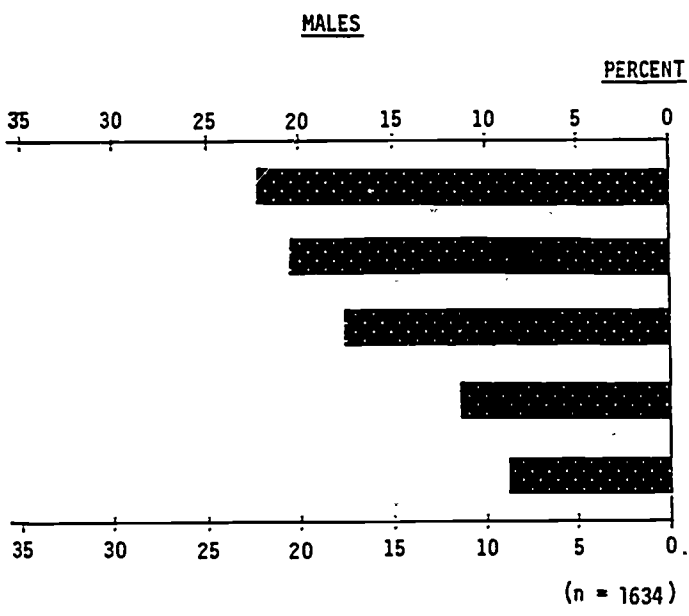

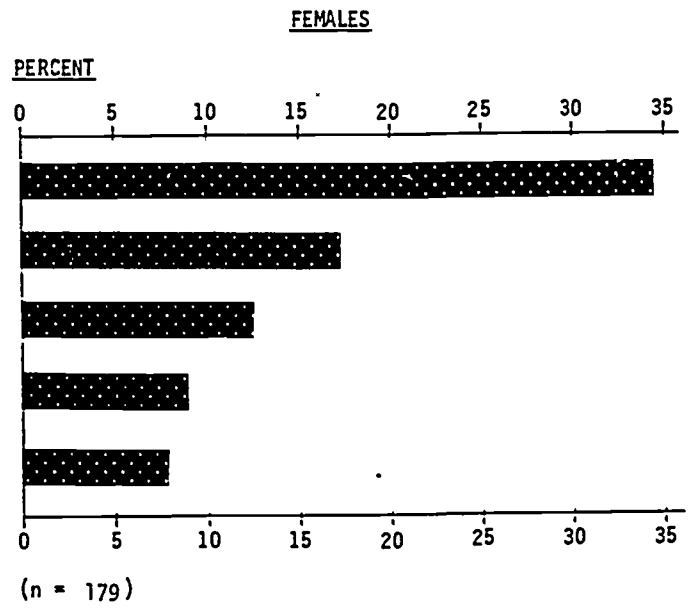

**Crime Type and Seriousness of Offense by Age, 1984**

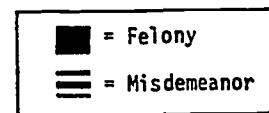
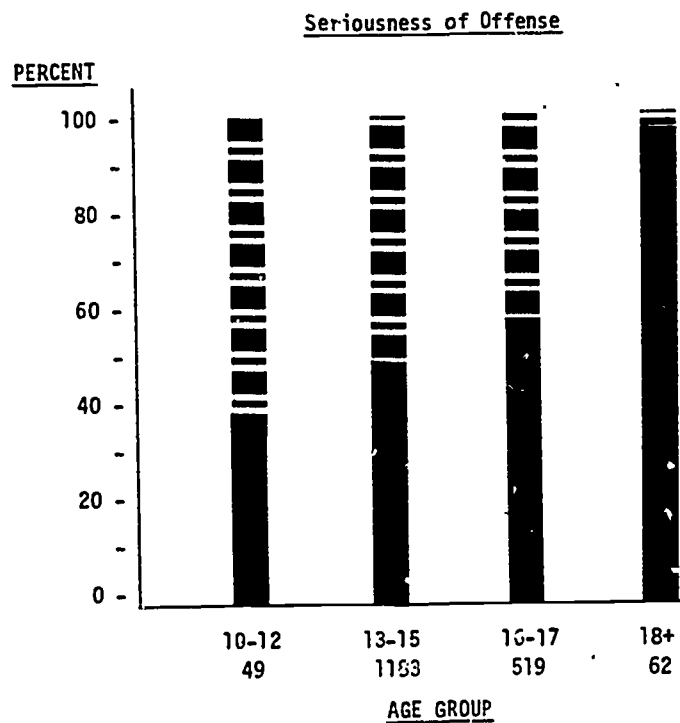
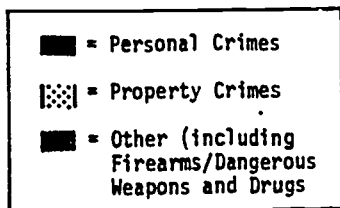
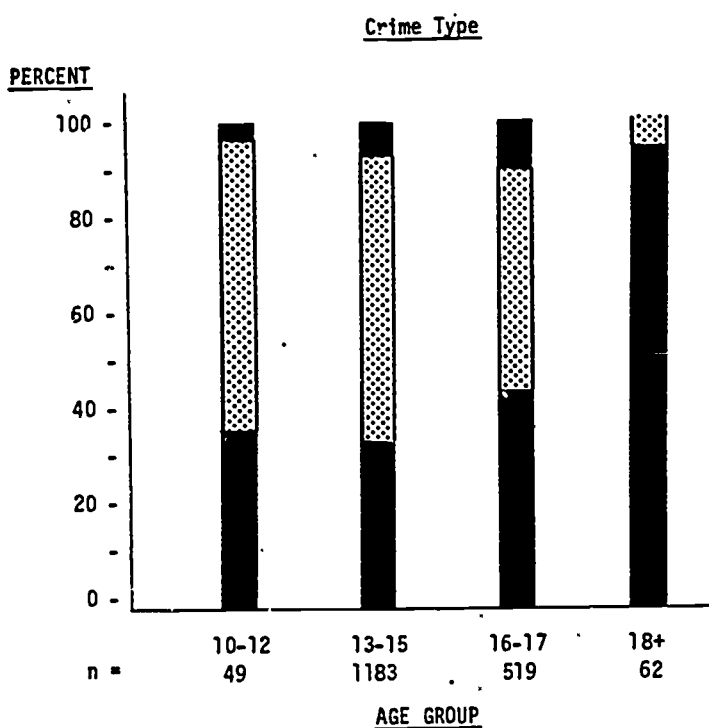
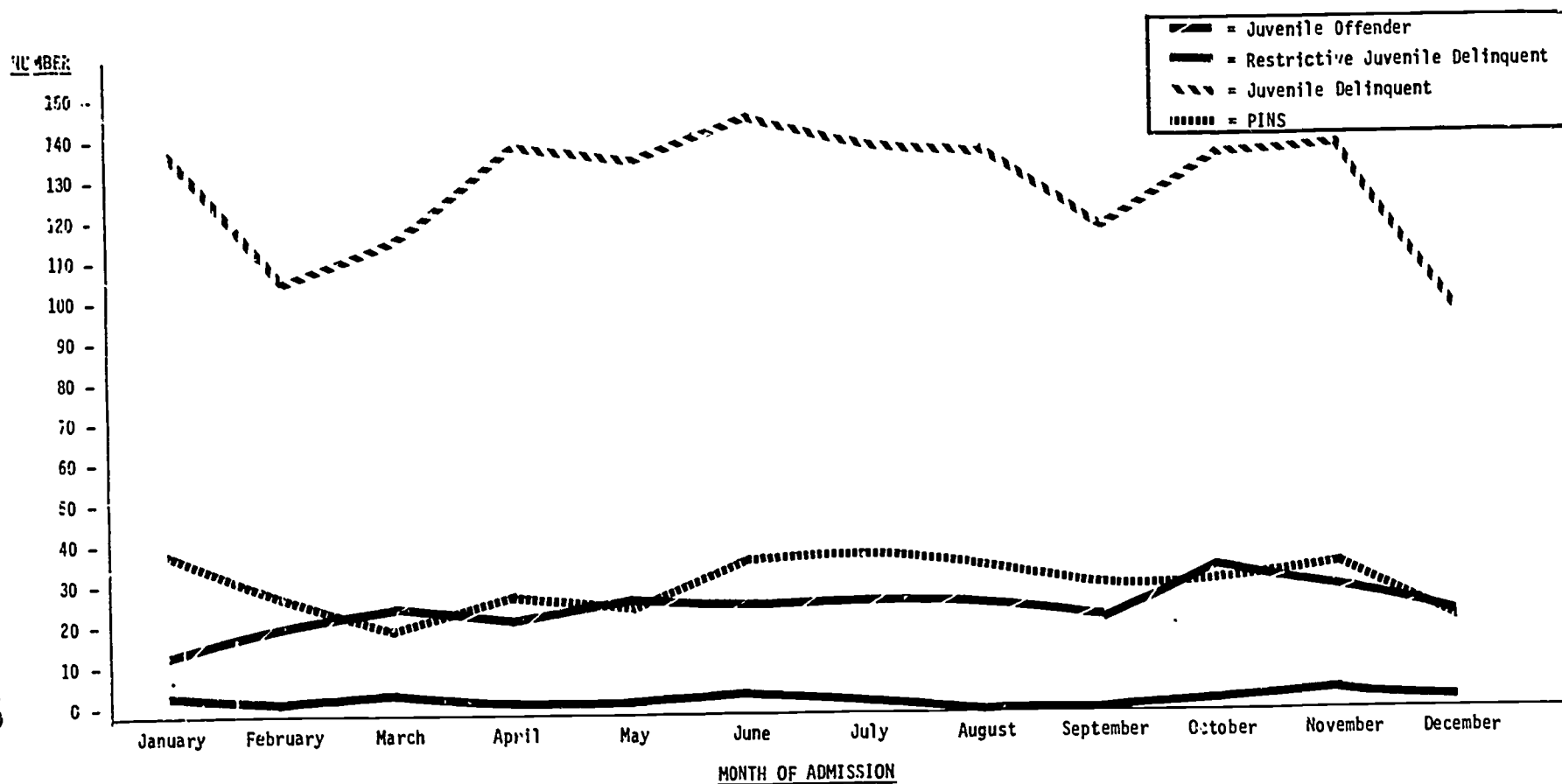
