#### **ABSTRACT**

This preliminary report provides an early preview of data from the Public School Universe portion of the Center for Education Statistics' annual survey, the "Common Core of Data." The report includes data for the 1986-87 school year on public schools, teachers, and students, by state, grade, instructional level, and type of school. Forty states and the District of Columbia submitted usable data in time to be included in this report. The data were provided by state education agencies from their administrative records. Regular Public Elementary and Secondary Schools, 1986-87: Institutional Characteristics, Students, and Teachers A Preliminary Report

This preliminary report provides an early preview of data received from forty States and the District of Columbia on the numbers and organizational characteristics of regular public elementary and secondary schools, the number of students enrolled in these schools, and the number of teachers who teach in them. The data come from the Public School Universe portion of the Center for Education Statistics' annual survey, the "Common Core of Data."

By "regular public schools" we mean those which offer traditional academic or comprehensive educational programs to the general student population rather than schools which offer only specialized programs to a limited target population. Of all public schools in the country, approximately 95 percent are classified as regular. Other classifications include special education schools, vocational education schools, and alternative/other schools.

## Methciology

Data for this report were provided by State education agencies from administrative records in their offices. The Center for Education Statistics and the State education agencies work cooperatively to assure comparability between data elements requested and reported. In an effort to make the data available as quickly as possible, the usual extensive record-by-record editing was not performed by the Center. About half of the respondents submitted data by computer tape and half by making handwritten entries and corrections on computer printouts.

#### Related Information

Two companion reports from other components of the Common Core of Data have been released by the Center for Education Statistics. They are the <u>Directory of Public Elementary and Secondary Education Agencies</u> (listing all education agencies in the fifty States, the District of Columbia, and the outlying areas, with addresses and basic organizational information), and <u>Public School Enrollment and Staff. 1986-87</u> (which provides student enrollment and number of teachers by grade level for all school types for all responding States). These reports also contain proliminary, unedited data and will be followed by final reports and a final data tape. Because of the preliminary nature of these reports, and because some States use different staff and student accounting procedures at different levels of organization, there may be slight variations in the State totals presented in the three.

#### Response Rates

Survey responses were received from all but four States prior to the June 15 deadline for inclusion in this report. However, due to various problems with the data or the reporting medium, data were usable for only forty of the responding States at this time.
