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#### ABSTRACT

Information on the 1987 salaries and benefits of faculty, staff, and administrators employed in the Illnois public community college system is presented in this report. After introductory material provides a summary overview of the report, statewide and institutional data are given on fiscal year (FY) 1988 contractual base salaries for 9- and 12-month full-time faculty; FY88 part-time faculty salary rates per course credit hour and full-time faculty overload and summer term salary rates; FY88 schedule-based salaries for full-time faculty members with a master's degree; institutional policies related to faculty salaries and contracts; FY88 contractual base salaries for 9- and 12-month non-teaching professional staff; FY88 contractual base salaries for administrative staff; salaries paid to selected administrators; mo thly classified staff salaries; low, high, and average monthly salaries for specified classified staff; comparison of monthly FY87 salaries of community college classified personnel with university civil service salaries; FY87 fringe benefits for full-time employees; and FY88 weighted mean percentage salary increases. Selected findings include the following: (1) the median FY88 contractual base salary for faculty with 9-month contracts was \$32,008, while that for faculty with 12-month contracts was \$28,898; (2) part-time faculty salary rates averaged \$292 per course semester hour; and (3) the average salary for district chief executive officers was \$70,570. 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#### INTRODUCTION

For a number of years, community colleges have submitted salary data to the Illinois Community College Board, the Illinois Board of Higher Education, and the Integrated Postsecondary Education System (formerly HEGIS). The Fall 1987 Salary Survey combined data items from these three instruments into one comprehensive survey. The IBHE's and the IPEDS' surveys will be completed by the ICCB without further data submissions from the colleges.

This report contains faculty salary data which are based on actual contracts, salaries from faculty salary schedules, part-time faculty salary rates, overload faculty salary rates, administrative salaries, other (non-teaching) professional salaries, average faculty load information, salaries for positions similar to Universities Civil Service classifications, and salaries of select administrators.

#### Section T

# FISCAL YEAR 1988 CONTRACTUAL BASE SALARIES FOR FULL-TIME FACULTY AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNTITY COLLEGES

Table 1 summarizes the ranges of salaries for full-time faculty on 9-month contracts for fiscal year 1988.

Table 2 identifies the lowest, average, highest, and median academic year contractual base salaries of full-time faculty with 9-month contracts at each community college in Illinois. Table 3 provides the same information for full-time faculty with 12-month contracts. Zeros are used for colleges that do not have faculty with 12-month contracts.

The low salaries represent the lowest contractual base salary actually paid to a full-time faculty member at each of the community college districts and may be different from salary schedule salaries which are reported in Tables 7 and 8.

The high salaries represent the highest contractual base salary actually paid to full-time teaching faculty members for an academic year at each of the colleges. The mean salaries represent the weighted average of all full-time teaching faculty salaries at each community college district. Statewide average salary data reported throughout this report are weighted average salary data. The median salaries reported are those which are the middle salary at each college. The median salary is the most appropriate measure of central tendencies for salary data within a given college since it is not affected by extreme high or low salaries; however, it is not as meaningful when reporting statewide composite median salary data.

### Section II

FISCAL YEAR 1988 PART-TIME FACULTY SALARY RATES AND FULL-TIME FACULTY OVERLOAD AND SUMMER TERM RATES AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 4 summarizes part-time faculty and full-time faculty overload and summer term salary rates in Illinois public community colleges during fiscal year 1988.

Table 5 presents the average part-time faculty salary rates per semester credit hour and full-time faculty overload rates by each community college district. The first column shows the part-time faculty rate per course credit hour. This rate is the amount paid to part-time teachers who might, for example, teach a night class at an extension center. The second column shows the overload rate for full-time faculty for the academic year. This rate represents the amount paid to full-time faculty for teaching courses above the full-time load during the academic year. Often this is compersation for teaching an extra night class or for teaching an additional class in the daytime. The third column reflects the amount received by full-time faculty members for teaching a class during the summer term. Community colleges have many different bases for determining part-time faculty rates as well as overload rates. Some colleges pay a flat rate per course or a flat rate per term, while other colleges base their rates on contact hours or credit hours; still others pay an hourly rate. In addition, many of the colleges' overload rates for full-time faculty are based on a percentage of that faculty member's actual salary.

Table 7 provides the fiscal year 1988 salary schedule salaries at each community college in Illinois. These salaries are based on the <u>salary schedules</u> at the colleges and not on the actual salaries paid.

#### Section IV

# INSTITUTIONAL POLICIES RELATED TO FACULTY SALARIES AND FACULTY CONTRACTS AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 8 summarizes the institutional policies related to faculty salaries and faculty contracts at each public community college district in Illinois. These policies often have a considerable impact on the salaries presented elsewhere in this report. The average number of weekly class contact hours per full-time instructional faculty, for example, has a bearing on the number of faculty that an institution must have to meet its needs. The length of a full-time academic year contract also has a bearing on academic year salary for full-time faculty.

Table 9 shows these institutional policies for each college. Of the 39 community college districts in Illinois, twelve have professional rank, although not all of these use rank as a criteria for salary determinations. Thirty-five public community college districts reported that they have master contracts with the faculty.

In addition to the class contact hours, office hours, and academic advising hours, faculty members spend much time in grading papers, preparing class presentations, working on curriculum development, and serving on college committees. Accordingly, although the state average number of required weekly hours for the faculty does not total 40 hours, most faculty members spend over 40 hours per week on their full-time assignments.

# FISCAL YEAR 1988 CONTRACTUAL BASE SALARIES FOR OTHER (NON-TEACHING) PROFESSIONAL STAFF AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 10 summarizes the range of fiscal year 1988 salaries for other professional staff in Illinois public community colleges.

Tables 11 and 12 identify the number of staff and the lowest, average, highest, and median contractual base salaries paid to full-time other (non-teaching) professionals (9-month and 12-month) at each community college in Illinois. Other professional staff include counselors, librarians, and instructional support staff such as curriculum coordinators. Even though some colleges may classify some of these personnel types as non-teaching faculty, they were asked to report them in this category. Zeros are used for colleges that do not have other (non-teaching) professionals with 9-r th or 12-month contracts.

The lowest and highest salaries represent the lowest and highest base salaries actually paid to full-time other (non-teaching) professionals at each of the community colleges. The average salaries represent the weighted average of all full-time other (non-teaching) professional salaries at each college. The median salaries represent the salary received by the person in the middle of the range at each college. The weighted state average salary of other (non-teaching) professional staff with 9-month contracts was \$33,726. For other (non-teaching) professional staff with 12-month contracts, the weighted state average salary was \$24,604.

### Section VI

# FISCAL YEAR 1988 CONTRACTUAL BASE SALARIES FOR ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 13 summarizes the range of administrative staff contractual salaries for fiscal year 1988. The weighted average administrative staff salary ranged from a low of \$27,320 to a high of \$56,399.

Table 14 provides the number of administrative staff; lowest, average, and highest fiscal year 1988 salaries; and the median fiscal year 1988 salaries of administrative staff for each district reporting data. Administrative staff includes positions similar to those shown in Table 5.

Come colleges may classify some of these administrative positions as faculty or other (non-teaching) professional staff. However, for the sake of comparison, they were asked to report them as administrative staff regardless of how they were classified at the college.

The statewide weighted average administrative salary for fiscal year 1988 was \$39,776. The lowest reported administrative salary was \$14,427, and the highest was \$92,000. Administrative salaries are based on 12 months.

#### Section VII

# SALARIES PAID TO SELECT ADMINISTRATORS AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES DURING FISCAL YEAR 1988

A summary of the fiscal year 1988 contractual base salaries paid to select administrators in Illinois public community colleges appears in Table 15.

Table 16 indicates the contractual base salaries paid to select administrators in each of the public community colleges in Illinois during fiscal year 1988. The chief executive officer of the district is either a chancellor or a president and has overall administrative responsibilities for the district. The chief campus administrator reports directly to the chief executive officer of the district and has overall administrative responsibility for the college. Examples of chief campus administrators are the presidents or provosts at multi-campus institutions and executive vice presidents for internal affairs at single campus colleges. Due to the various administrative organizations which exist at the colleges, a particular position may not exist. An analysis of the entire administrative structure must be made before making comparisons between similar positions at two different colleges. Another item for consideration when making comparisons between colleges is the number of years an administrator has been in the position.

#### Section VIII

# SUMMARY OF FISCAL YEAR 1988 MONTHLY CLASSIFIED STAFF SALARIES AT ILLINOIS PUBLIC COMMUNITY COLLEGES

Table 17 summarizes Illinois community college earnings for specific classified staff titles. The number of employees in Column 1 is the total of all employees for the respective position titles which were reported by Illinois community colleges. The average fiscal year 1988 salary in Column 3 is the weighted average of all monthly salaries reported for each classification. The high and low salaries are those reported by the colleges for each specific type of classification.

Table 18 compares monthly mean salaries of comparable university civil service positions and classified community college positions. A comparison between community college classified staff salaries and classified salaries at universities revealed that for 16 positions community college classified salaries were higher and for 10 positions community college classified salaries were lower. However, many variables, such exact job responsibilities, are unknown, which makes valid comparisons difficult.

Table 21 presents the total and average cost per employee of fringe benefits at each college for faculty, other professionals, administrative, and classified staff.

The salaries shown throughout this report do not include these fringe benefits. Fringe benefits ar defined as payments other than wages and salary, such as vacation, retirement, insurance, worker's compensation, and unemployment insurance.
