#### **ABSTRACT**

In fall 1987, a five-year longitudinal study was initiated by the Wyoming Community College Commission, in cooperation with the community colleges, to determine the variables that affect student progress toward their personal, academic, and career objectives. The sample for the study consisted of 181 randomly selected first-time, first-year students attending one of the seven community colleges in Wyoming. An initial survey was conducted in October 1987 to develop a profile of community college students and identify their educational and career goals. Findings included the following: (1) 38% of the students were male, 100% were J.S. citizens, 88% were Wyoming residents, 96% were white non-Hispanics, and 71% had lived in Wyoming more than 10 years; (2) 70% were 18 or 19 years of age, and 75% had never been married; (3) 75% of the respondents' parents were married and 20% were divorced; 79% of the fathers and 75% of the mothers were between 40 and 60 years of age; 46% had three or more other children; 16% had an annual income of less than \$20,000; and 27% of the fathers and 23% of the mothers were college graduates; (4) 32% of the students lived with their parents or other relatives, and 41% lived in college housing; (5) 48% studied in their bedroom or dorm room; (6) 39% received financial aid; (7) 69% had taken college preparation courses in high school, while 31% had taken vocational/technical courses; and (8) 39% were attending college to prepare for entry into a career or occupation, while 25% were earning credit for transfer to a four-year college. #### nitial Survey Report

To effectively plan for today and for the future, it is essential that the Wyoming Community College System maintain a broad data base. An essential component of that base is a thorough, accurate and useful description of the variables that effect student progress toward their personal, academic and career objectives. Equally important is an evaluation of students' progress in reaching those objectives.

To provide the casential component, the Wyoming Community College Commission, in cooperation with the seven community colleges, implemented a comprehensive statewide longitudinal study in the fall of 1987. The study is slated for completion in 1991.

The sample for the study consists of one-hundred-eighty-one (181) randomly selected first-time first-year students attending one of the seven community colleges in Wyoming. Each respondent completed an initial survey questionnaire administered by the Commission Researcher during the week, October 19-23, 1987. The purpose of the initial survey was to define a profile of community college students and identify their educational and career goals. Follow-up surveys are planned for each six-month period during the five-year study.








### GRAPHIC SUMMARY OF KEY QUESTIONS






WHAT TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID DID YOU RECEIVE?





# QUESTION NO. 30 WHAT GRADES DID YOU EARN IN HIGH SCHOOL?





# HOW WELL DO YOU FEEL YOU WERE PREPARED FOR COLLEGE?





STUDENT ATTITUDES TOWARD PREPARATION

# QUESTION NO. 38 MOST IMPORTANT REASON FOR SELECTING THIS COLLEGE?















#### STUDENT COMPLETION INTENTIONS












