ABSTRACT

Asian and Pacific Islander families in the United States were more likely than all U.S. families in 1980 to have multiple workers. About 63 percent of Asian and Pacific Islander families had two or more workers, compared with about 54 percent of all families. This information from the Commerce Department's Census Bureau was the first to provide disaggregated data on the social and economic characteristics of the following groups: (1) Cambodian; (2) Hmong; (3) Indonesian; (4) Laotian, (5) Pakistani; (6) Thai; (7) Polynesian; (8) Micronesian; and (9) Melanesian. Data are given for the nation, selected states, and selected metropolitan areas for these and other larger Asian and Pacific ethnic groups. Comparisons are made with the United States population in general on the following variables: (1) nativity; (2) citizenship; (3) education; (4) labor force; (5) income and poverty; (6) age; (7) household relationships; (8) marital status; (9) language; (10) year of immigration; (11) residence; and (12) occupation. Tables and graphs illustrate the information in the text. (VM)

## MORE OF ASIAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER FAMILIES HAVE AT LEAST TWO WORKERS THAN DO OTHER U.S. FAMILIES, CENSUS BUREAU SAYS

Asian and Pacific Islander families in the United States were more likely than all U.S. families in 1980 to have multiple workers, according to census data released today by the Commerce Department's Census Bureau.

About 63 percent of Asian and Pacific Islander families had two or more workers compared with 54 percent of all families.

The proportion of Asian families with two or more workers ranged from 71 percent for Filipino to 26 percent for Laotians and 21 percent for Hmongs (recent immigrant Asian groups primarily from Laos). Among Pacific Islanders the range was from 72 percent for Tongans (inhabitants of islands southwest of Hawaii) to 51 percent for Samoans.

This is the first census report that provides data on the social and economic characteristics of six Asian groups--Cambodian, Hmong, Indonesian, Laotian, Pakistani, and Thai. Pacific Island data are shown for Polynesian, Micronesian, and Melanesian (inhabitants of islands Northeast of Australia).

Information on the six largest Asian groups (Asian Indian, Chinese, Filipino, Japanese, Korean, and Vietnamese) and the three largest Pacific Islander groups (Guamanian, Hawaiian, and Samoan) was published in the standard 1980 Census of Population reports in 1982 and 1983. This report provides additional statistics cross-tabulated by various characteristics.

The report covers nativity and citizenship, education, labor force, income and poverty, age, household relationship, marital status, language, year of immigration, residence, and occupation. Data are for the nation, selected states, and selected metropolitan areas.

Here are other highlights from the 1980 census report:

- o Six percent of Asians and Pacific Islanders were self employed in 1980, compared with 7 percent for the nation. The self-employed proportion among Asian groups ranged from 12 percent for Koreans to less than 2 percent for Hmongs and Laotians. The Pacific Islander range was from 7 percent for Tongans to 2 percent for Samoans and Guamanians.
- o About 60 percent of Asians and Pacific Islanders were born in foreign countries compared with only 6 percent for the nation. Among Asians, the percent varied from 94 percent for Cambodians and Laotians to 28 percent for Japanese. For Pacific Islanders, the range was from 75 percent for Tongans to 2 percent for Hawaiians.
- o About 60 percent of Asians and Pacific Islanders aged 15 and over were U.S. citizens compared with 97 percent of the U.S. population. Eighty percent of the Japanese population were citizens, the highest proportion among Asians. Cambodians and Laotians, two of the more recent immigrant groups, had the lowest at about 6 percent. The range among Pacific Islanders was from 99 percent for Hawaiians to 34 percent for Tongans.

- o Seventy-five percent of Asians and Pacific Islanders aged 25 and over were high school graduates versus 66 percent of the U.S. population. The Asian proportions varied from 90 percent for Indonesians to 22 percent for Hmongs. For Pacific Islanders, the range was from 68 percent for Hawaiians and Guamanians to 61 percent for Samoans.
- o Thirty-three percent of Asians and Pacific Islanders aged 25 and over were college graduates compared with 16 percent for the nation. The Asian proportion varied from 58 percent for Pakistanis to 3 percent for Hmongs. For Pacific Islanders, the range was from 13 percent for Tongans to about 8 percent for Samoans and Guamanians.
- o Two out of every three Asians and Pacific Islanders aged 5 and over spoke a language other than English at home compared with about one of every 10 for the nation. Among Asians, the proportion was highest for Laotians, Cambodians, and Hmongs at about 95 percent and lowest for Japanese at 44 percent. For Pacific Islanders, the range was from 88 percent for Tongans to 10 percent for Hawaiians.
- o The 1979 median money income for Asian and Pacific Islander families was \$22,700 compared with the national median of \$19,900. Among Asians, Japanese and Asian Indian families had the highest at \$27,400 and \$25,000, respectively. Laotians and Hmongs had the lowest incomes at about \$5,000. Among Pacific Islanders, the median ranged from \$19,200 for Hawaiians to \$14,200 for Samoans.
- o Twelve percent of Asian and Pacific Islander persons aged 15 and over were below the poverty level in 1979, the same percent as the U.S. population. Among Asians, the rate ranged from about 66 percent for Laotians and Hmongs to 7 percent for Filipinos and Japanese. Among

Pacific Islanders, the rate ranged from 26 percent for Samoans and Tongans to 14 percent for Hawaiians and Guamanians.

- o About 84 percent of Asian and Pacific Islander families were married couples, compared with 83 percent for the national population. Among Asians, the Asian Indians and Pakistanis had the highest proportion at about 90 percent and Vietnamese the lowest at 73 percent. Tongans and Hawaiians had the highest and lowest proportions among Pacific Islanders at 95 percent and 73 percent.

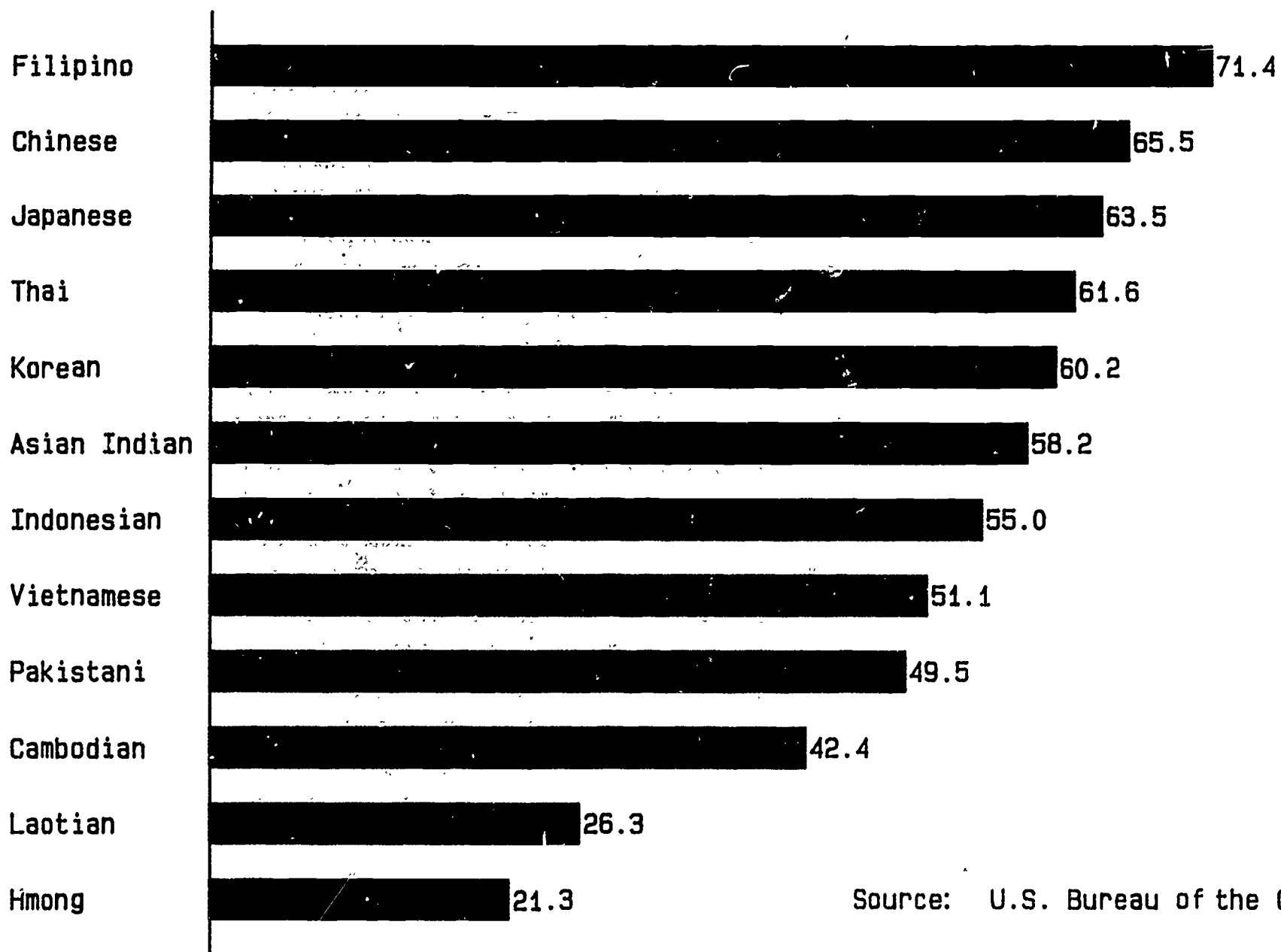

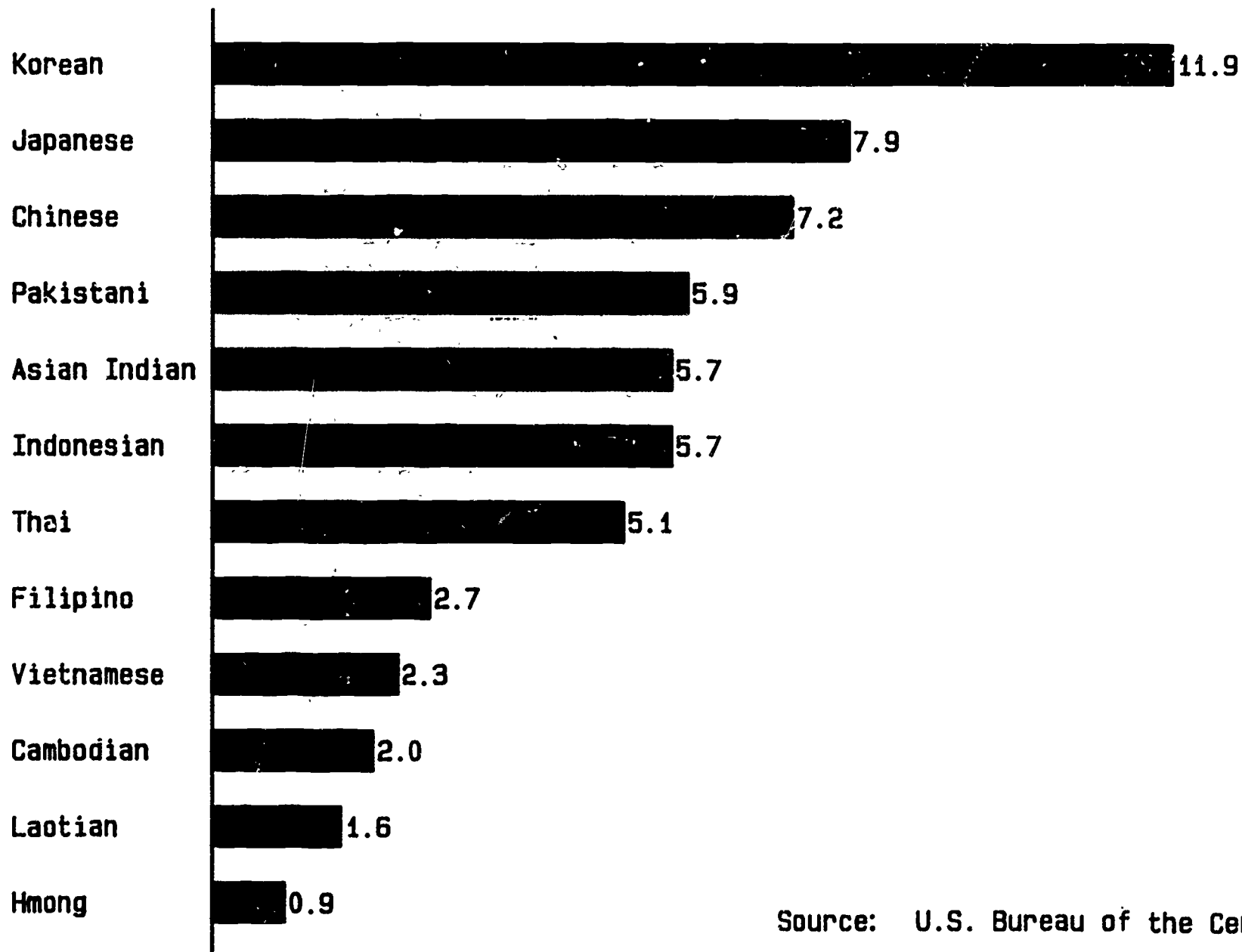

# Percent Asian Families With 2 or More Workers: 1980



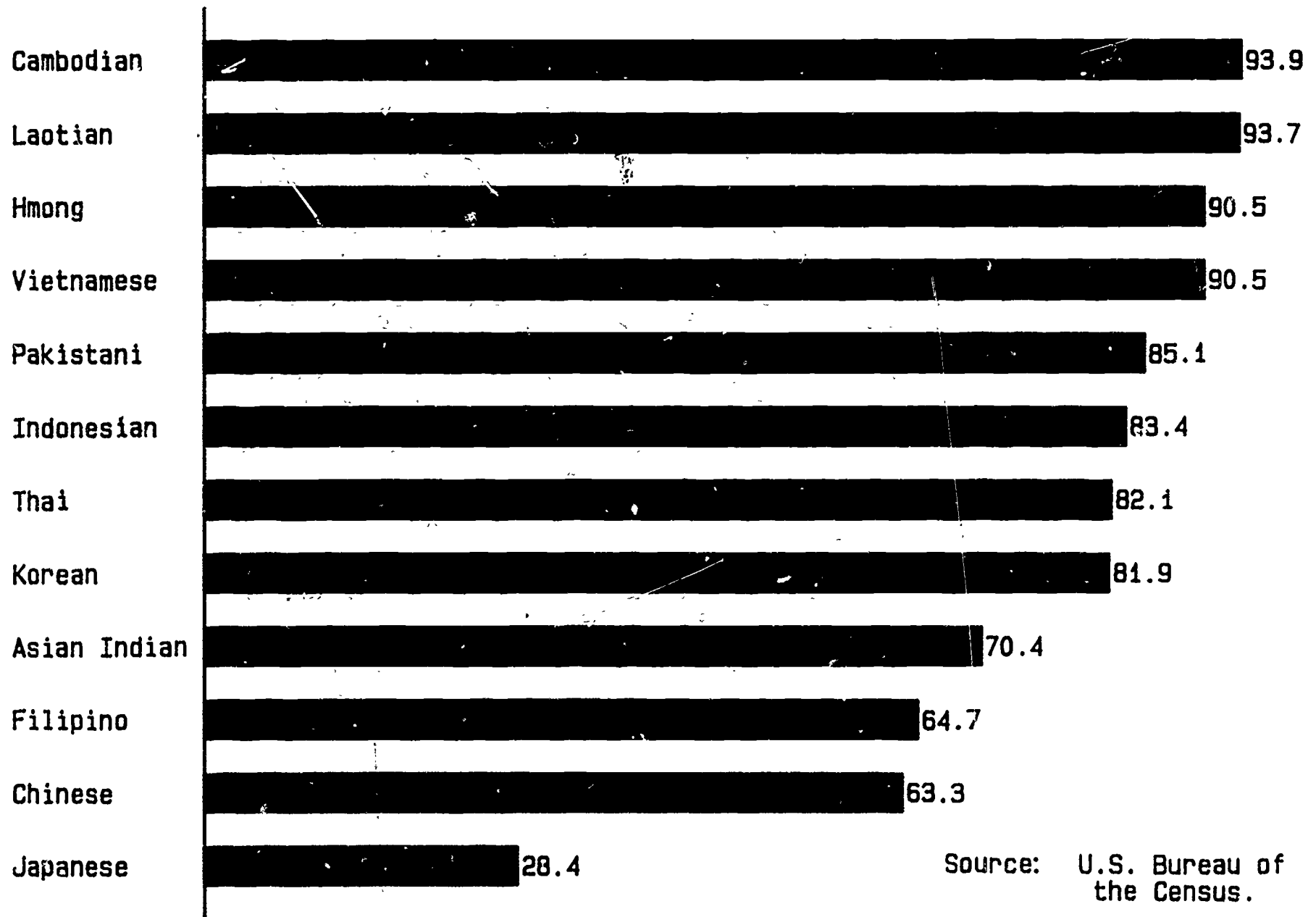

# Percent Self-employed Asian Workers: 1980



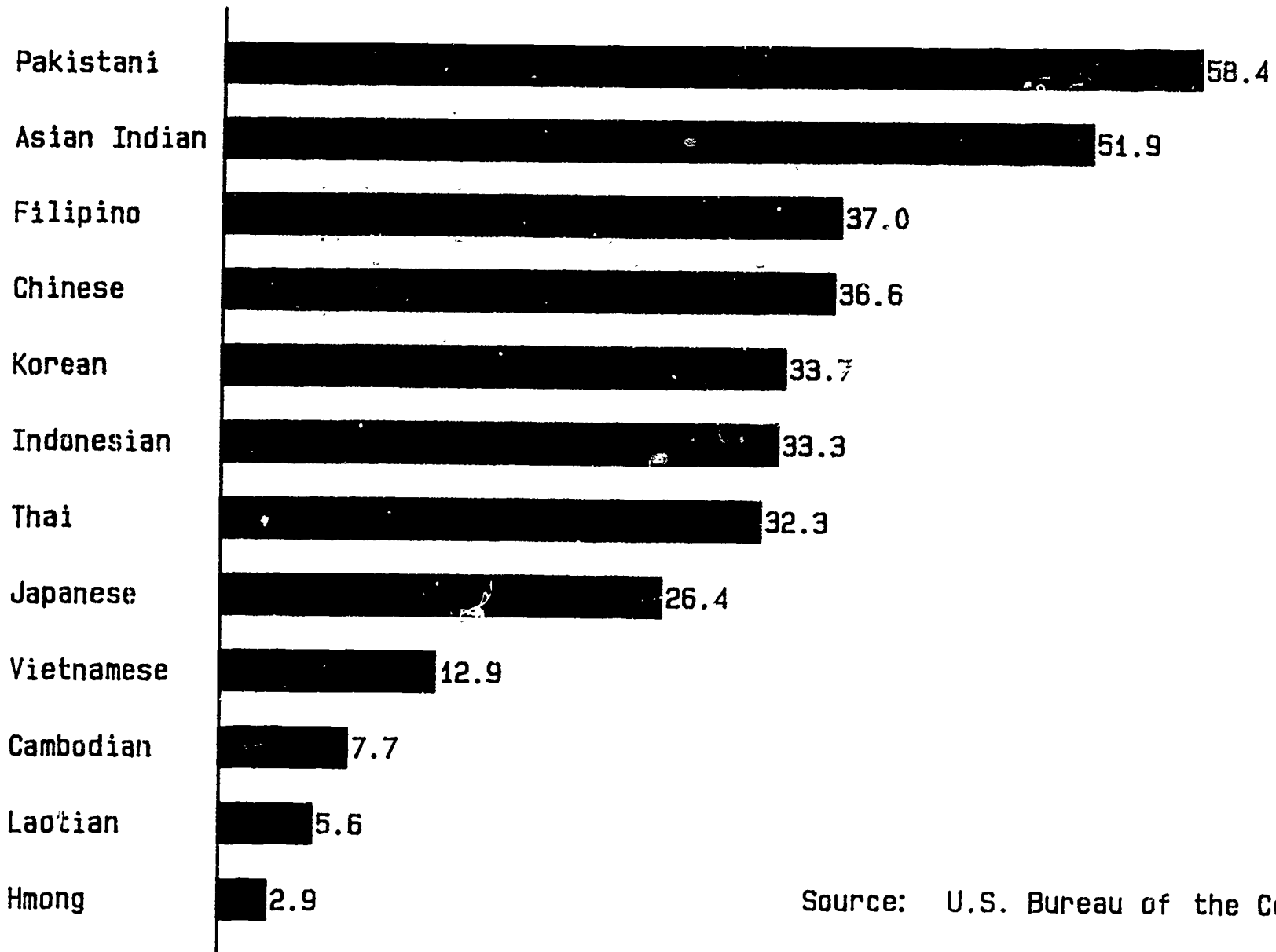

Percent Asian Persons Foreign Born: 1980



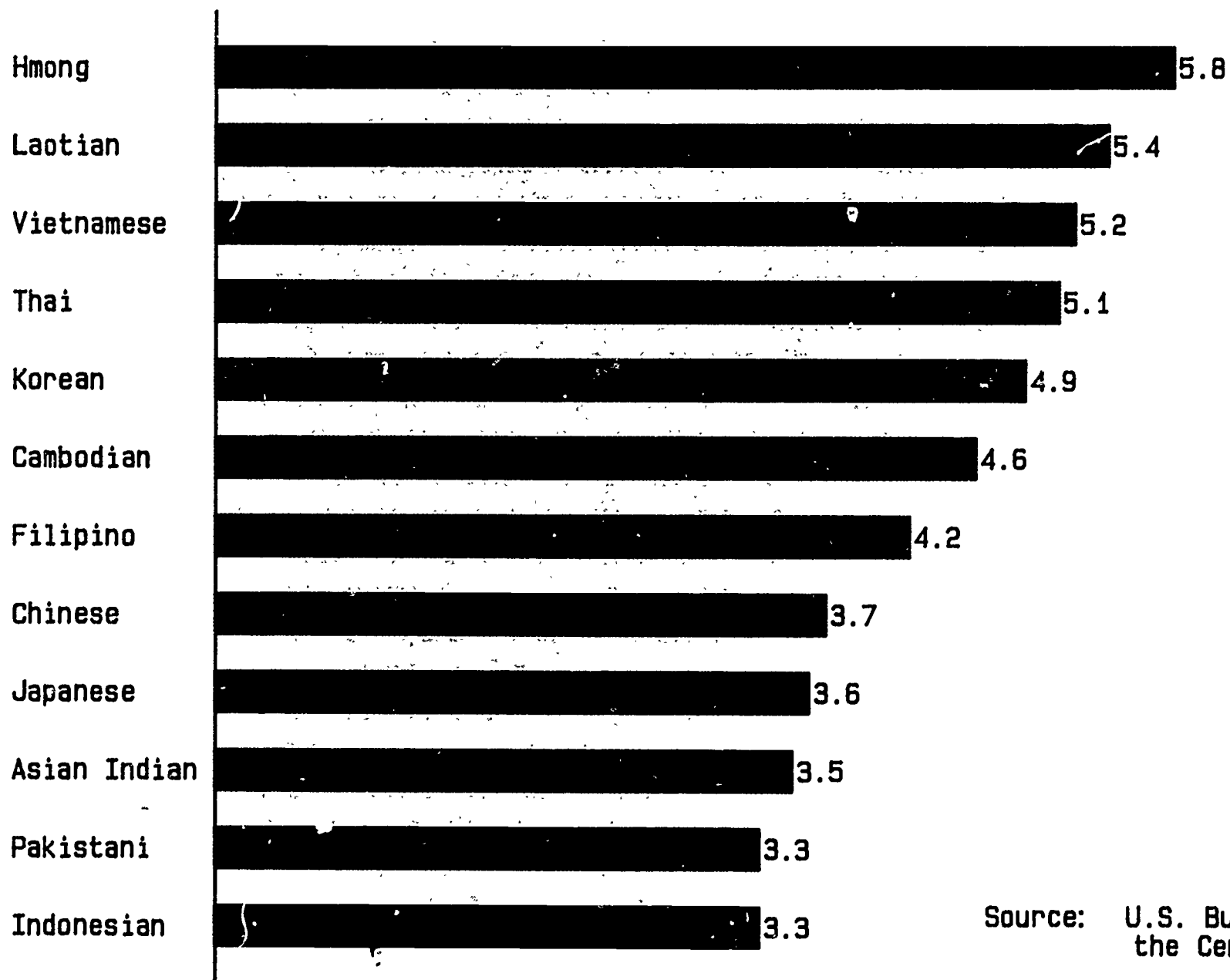

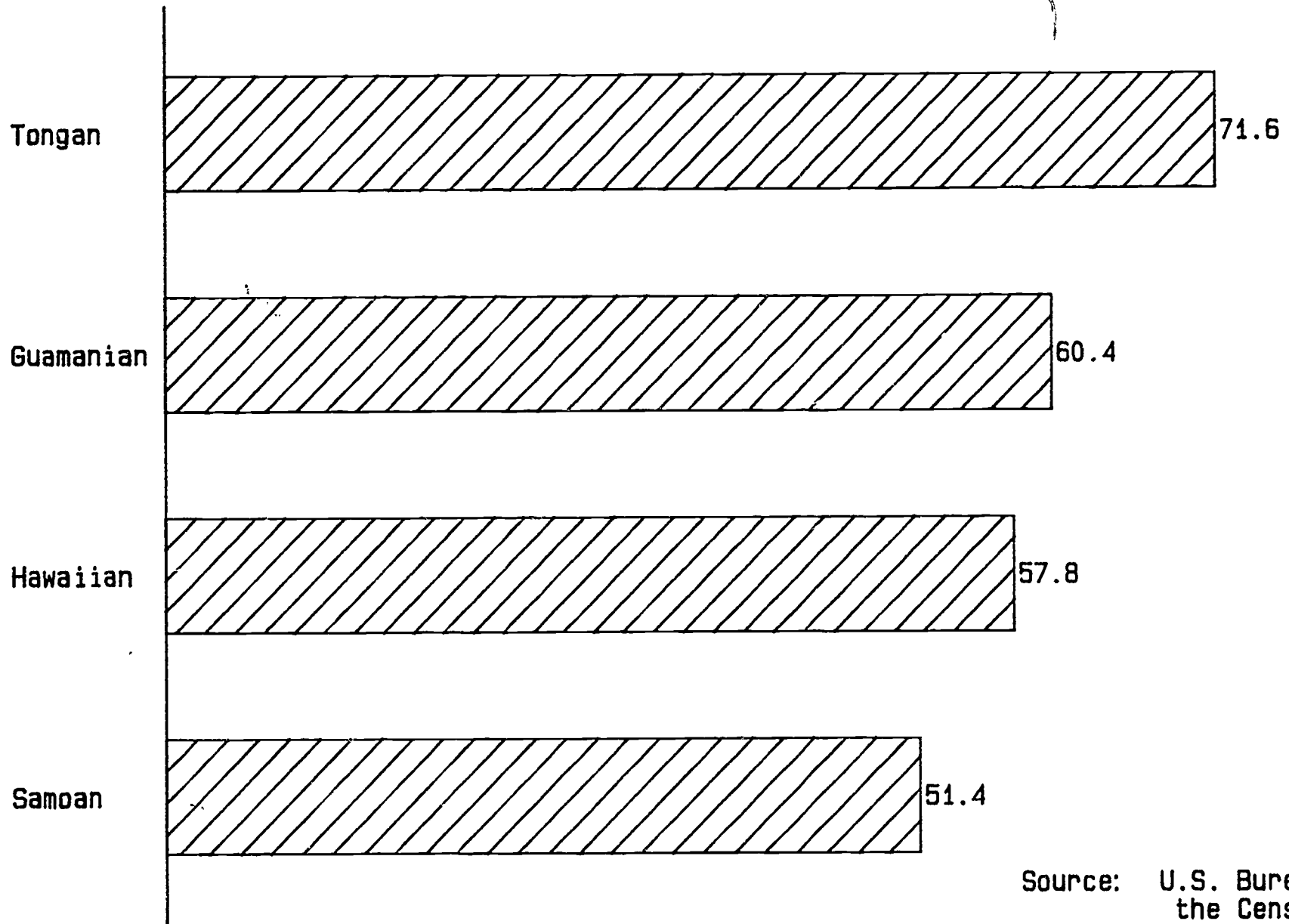
# Persons Per Asian Family: 1980

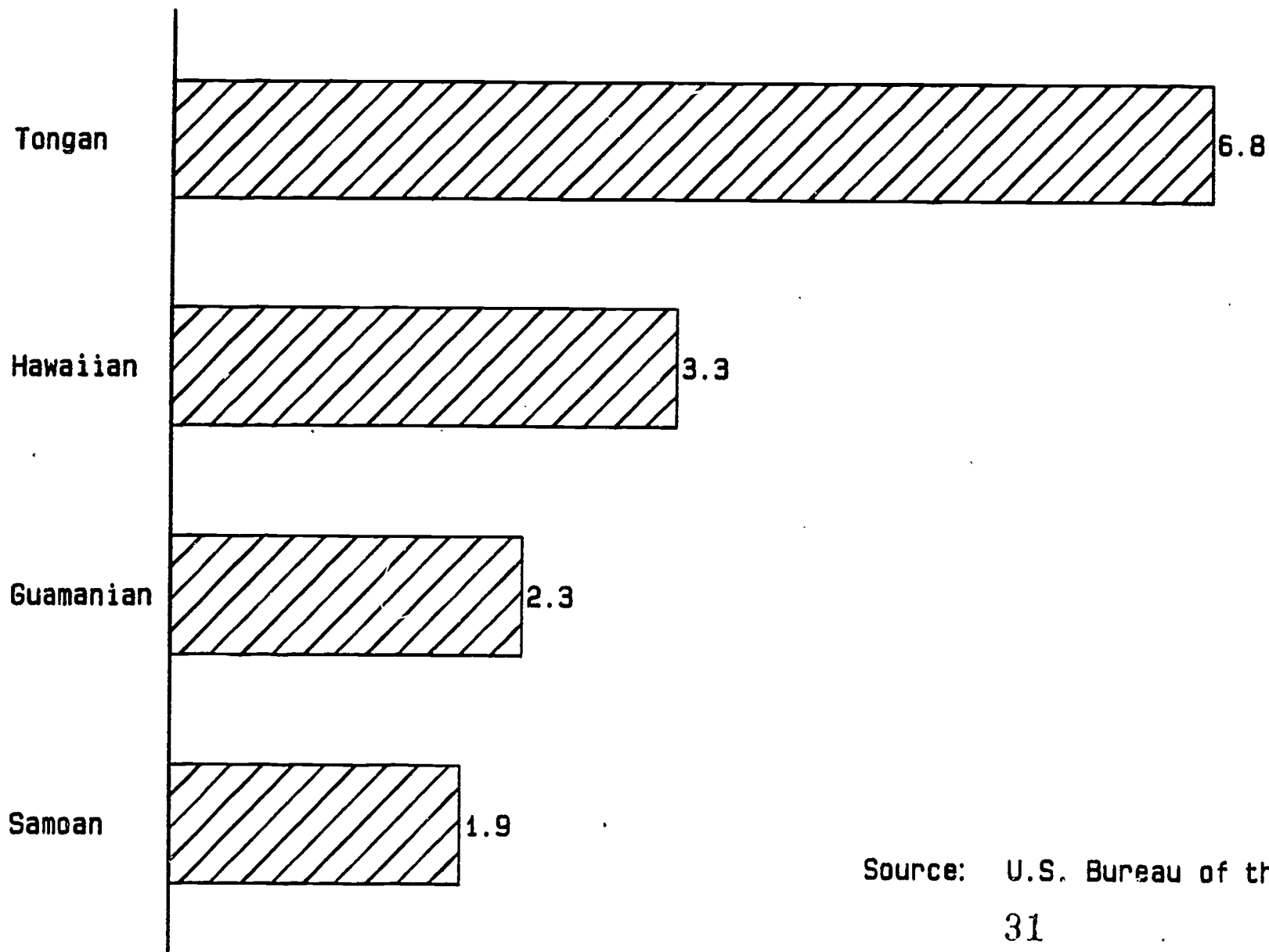


Percent Pacific Islander Families With 2 or More Workers: 1980

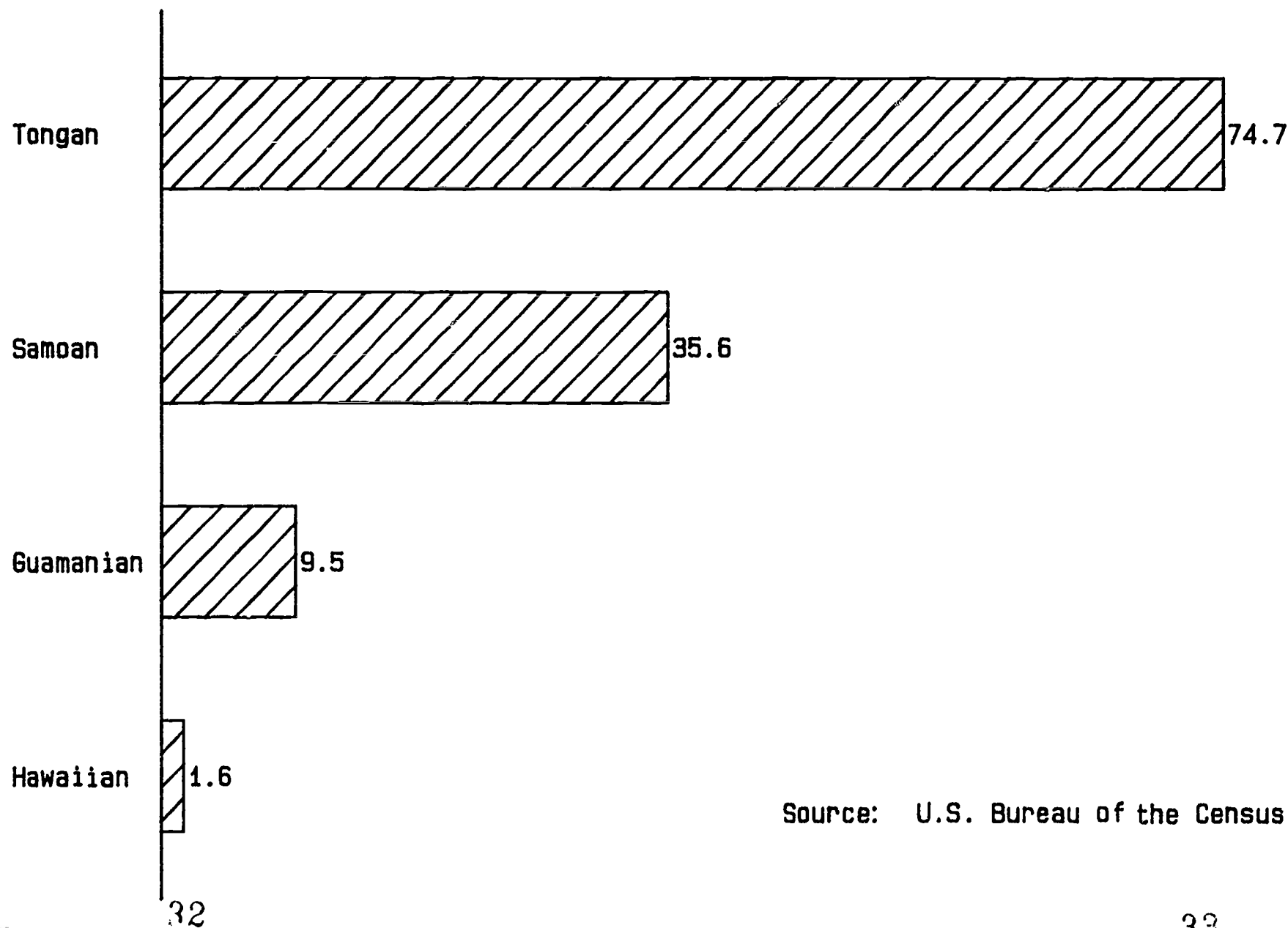
# Percent Self-employed Pacific Islander Workers: 1980

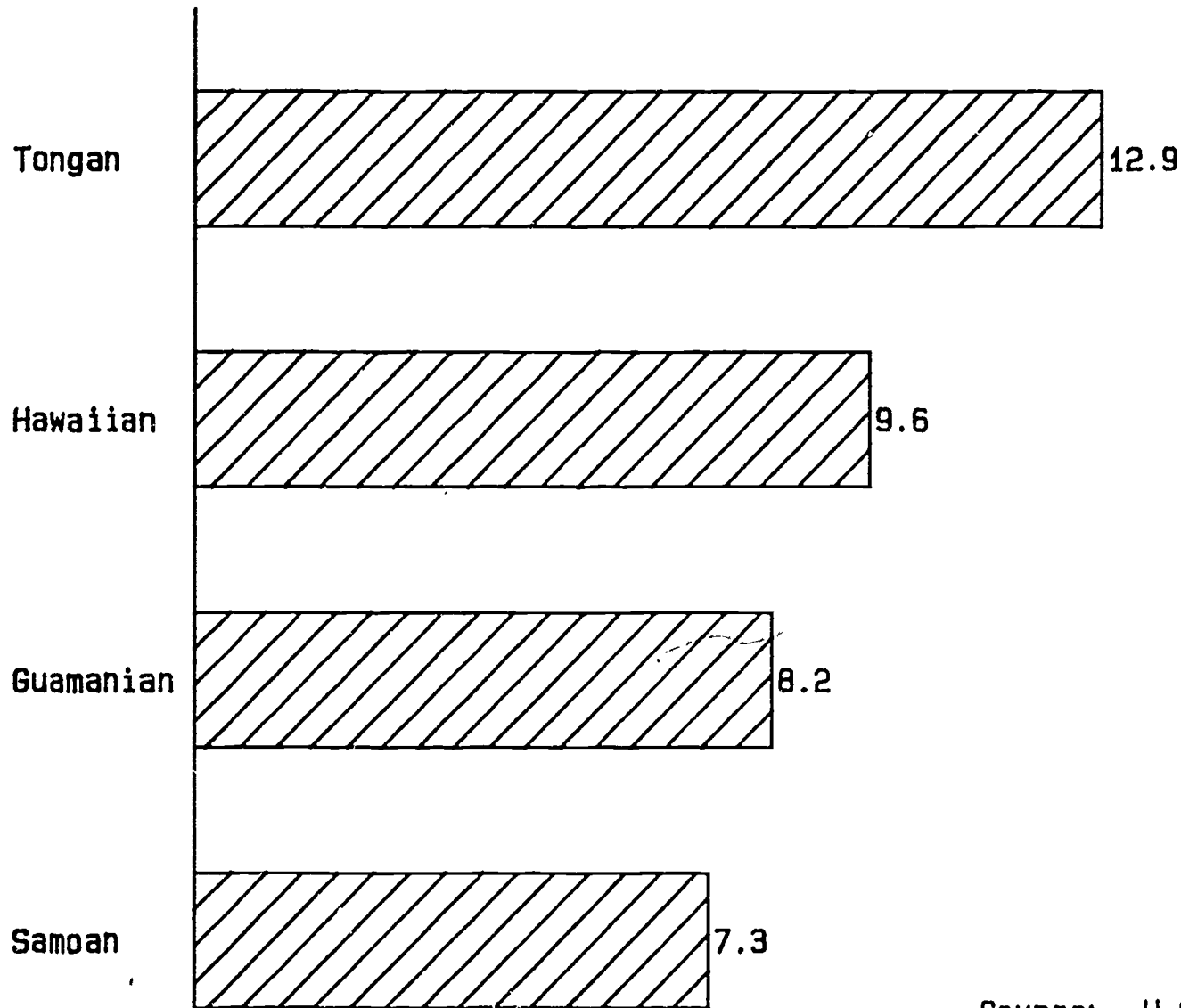

# Percent Pacific Islander Persons Foreign Born: 1980



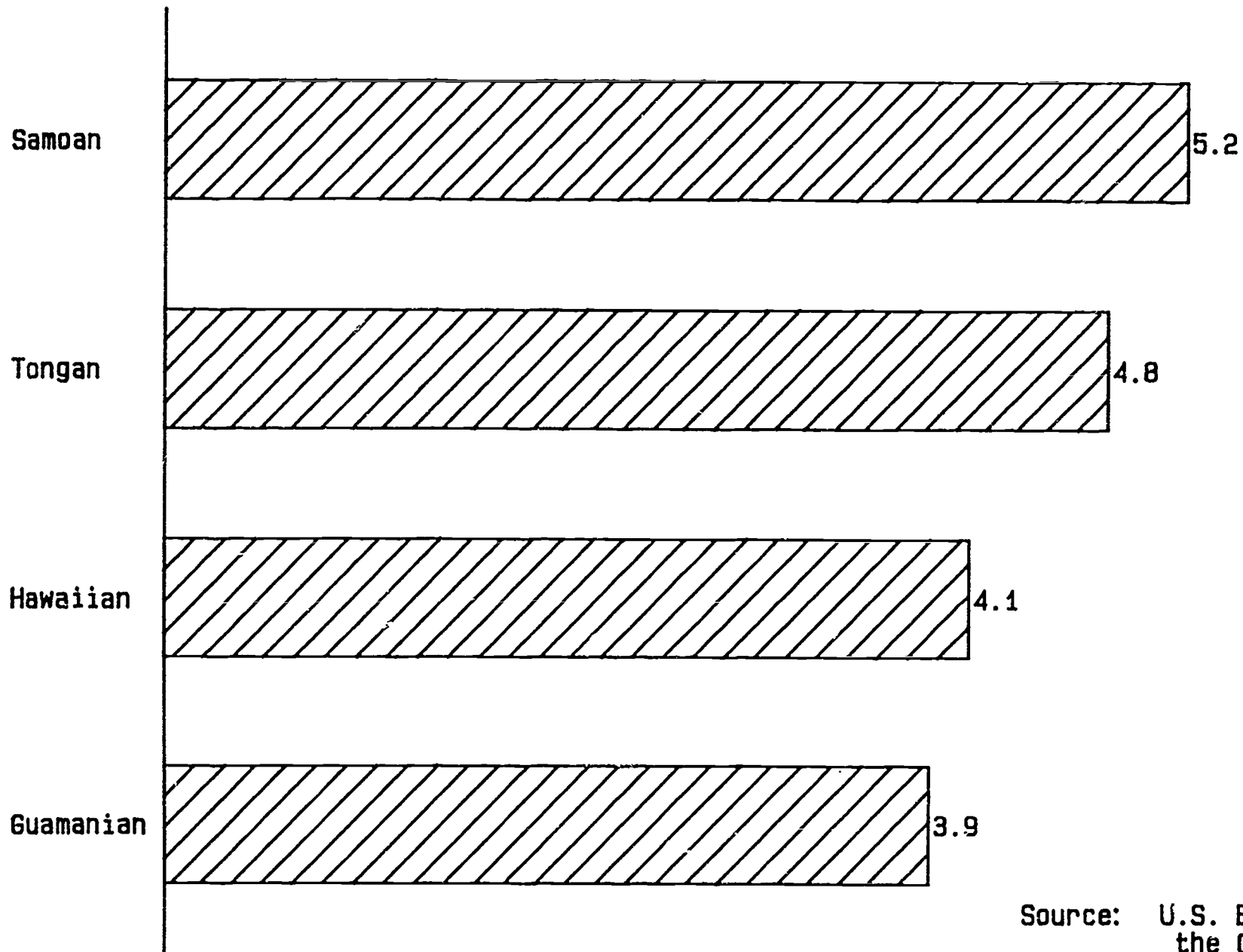
