ABSTRACT

Information provided by the Maryland State Board for Higher Education permitted Prince George's Community College (PGCC) to determine the proportion of Prince George's County residents attending various colleges and universities in the state and to analyze trends in PGCC's market shares from 1982 to 1987. Findings regarding full- and part-time undergraduates, new full-time freshmen, and black new full-time freshmen indicate that: (1) 26,400 residents of Prince George's County were attending Maryland community colleges and universities as undergraduates in fall 1986, representing a 2.7% decrease from the 27,142 residents enrolled in fall 1985; (2) 11,923 county residents were attending college full-time, and 14,477 were enrolled part-time; (3) statewide, the community colleges' share of full-time undergraduate enrollments was 25%, while their share of part-time enrollments was 67%; (4) 44% of the 1986 students were enrolled at PGCC; (5) PGCC enrolled three of every five county residents attending a Maryland college part-time for credit; (6) nearly 42% of all beginning full-time students in the county started their education at PGCC; and (7) of the 8,664 black county residents attending college, 4,683 (54%) were attending PGCC. Introduction

This report is one in a series that will comprise an updated environmental scan, or review of external factors affecting the college. A key component of a comprehensive environmental scan is the identification and assessment of organizations and activities competing for your clientele's time and dollars. This market share analysis reports the proportion of Prince George's County residents attending various colleges and universities in Maryland in fall 1986. Trends in market shares since 1982 are also analyzed. Four student categories are examined: full-time undergraduates, part-time undergraduates, new full-time freshmen, and black new full-time freshmen.

Information Sources

Information provided by the State Board for Higher Education permitted calculation of the precise share of county residents attending each state college or university. Residents attending colleges outside of Maryland were excluded from the analysis; the market shares are of those residents attending a Maryland school. The SBHE reported fall 1986 enrollment of residents at all but two colleges in Maryland (St. Mary's Seminary and Washington Theological Union had not submitted residence data by the time of report preparation). The sources of enrollment by residence data were fall Enrollment Information System tape submissions or SBHE Form S-4, "Residence by County of Origin." In all cases the place of residence was defined as the permanent residence at the time of application to the campus.

Full-time Undergraduates

The number of Prince George's County residents attending a Maryland college or university full-time at the undergraduate level in fall 1986 was 11,923, a slight decline from the year before. Nearly 41 percent were enrolled at the University of Maryland College Park. (These data include all levels of undergraduates, freshmen through seniors.) Prince George's was second most popular for full-time study, enrolling over 26 percent of the county residents attending full-time. PGCC's share was up slightly from 1985, halting a three-year downward trend. Bowie State was third, with a 4.9 percent share. Towson State and UMBC had small but growing market shares:

Statewide, the community college share of full-time undergraduates remained at 25 percent. (Tables of fall enrollment by institutional segment and political subdivision are included in the appendix.) Thus PGCC was slightly above the state average, as it has been throughout the 1982-86 period. Both the statewide community college share and PGCC's county share of full-timers have declined over the 1982-86 period. The University of Maryland system (all campuses) increased its statewide share of full-time undergraduates from 32 to 36 percent over the 4-year period.

Part-time Undergraduates

A total of 14,477 residents of Prince George's County attended state colleges and universities part-time in fall 1986. This was a decline of 558 students (or 3.7 percent) from 1985. PGCC has dominated the part-time student market in recent years, enrolling nearly six out of every ten county residents attending a state college part-time. However, the community college's share has declined since the early 1980's, while UMCP and Bowie State have made slight gains:

Statewide, the community college share of the part-time undergraduate market has slipped slightly but is still strong at 67 percent. PGCC's relatively lower share of its market probably reflects the presence of two campuses of the University (UMCP and UMUC) in its service area. The University system's share of the statewide part-time student market was 17 percent in 1986.

New Full-time Freshmen

A total of 2,875 residents of Prince George's County enrolled in college for the first time in fall 1986, as full-time students (other first-time students enrolled on a part-time basis). Market shares for these first-time, full-time freshmen are one measure of recruiting effectiveness. After declining in 1985, PGCC's share increased in 1986. Nearly 42 percent of all county residents beginning college on a full-time basis in fall 1986 enrolled at the community college. UMCP was second most popular, enrolling one-fourth of the new full-timers:

Statewide, the community college share of new full-time students was 39 percent in 1986, up a point from 1985 but down from 43 percent in 1982. PGCC's share of this market has consistently exceeded the statewide average. Perhaps the most notable finding concerning this market is its overall decline: the number of Prince George's County residents starting college full-time declined 14 percent in four years.

Black First-time Full-time Freshmen

A total of 8,664 black residents of Prince George's County were enrolled as undergraduates in fall 1986 at a Maryland college or university. Fifty-four percent (4,683 students) were attending Prince George's Community College. The community college has historically enrolled more black residents of the county than any other institution. However, its share of blacks enrolling as first-time, full-time students declined by over 10 percentage points in fall 1985. PGCC's market share of this group increased slightly in fall 1986, to 43.5 percent. The second most popular choice of county blacks for beginning study full-time was the University of Maryland at College Park, which enrolled 15 percent. This was down slightly from the year before. Bowie State increased its share of the county's new full-time black undergraduates in fall 1986, to 12.5 percent, improving its market share for the second straight year. Five-year trends in black new full-time freshman market shares for the top five institutions for this cohort of students are shown in a table at the top of the next page.

Statewide, public two-year colleges enrolled 48.7 percent of the black students starting college on a full-time basis in fall 1986. Private schools enrolled 3 percent, with the balance (48.3 percent) attending public four-year schools.

Summary

A total of 26,400 residents of Prince George's County were attending Maryland colleges and universities as undergraduates in fall 1986. This was a decrease of 2.7 percent from the 27,142 residents enrolled in fall 1985. Forty-four percent of the 1986 students were enrolled at PGCC, the same proportion as in 1985. Considering that the community college offers only freshman and sophomore level classes, this is a substantial share of the total undergraduate market.

PGCC is particularly strong in the part-time undergraduate market, enrolling three of every five county residents attending a Maryland college part-time for credit. But it is also the number one choice of county residents beginning their college studies on a full-time basis. Nearly 42 percent of all beginning full-timers start at PGCC; UMCP is the second most popular place to start, enrolling 25 percent of the new full-time undergraduates.

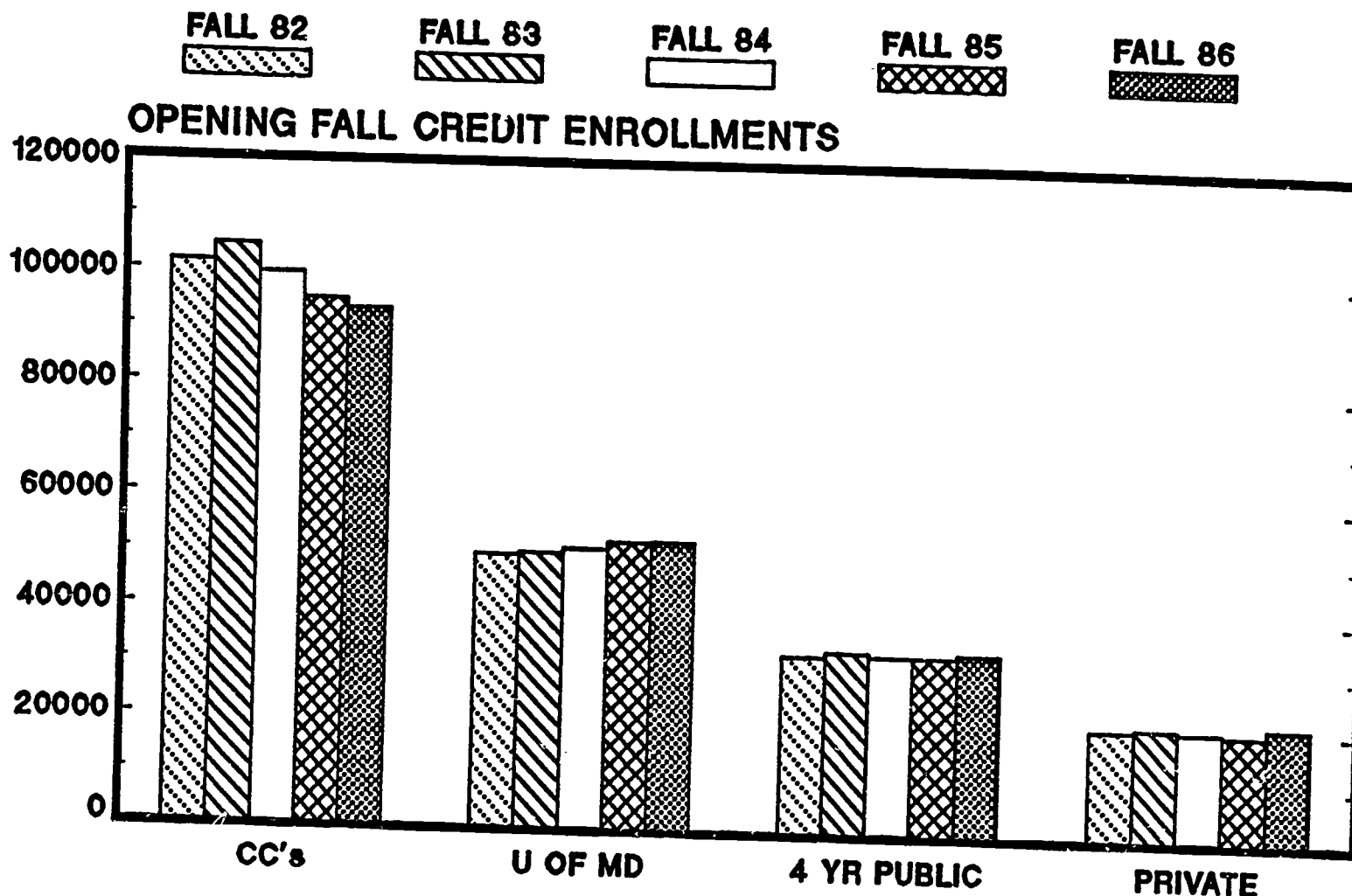

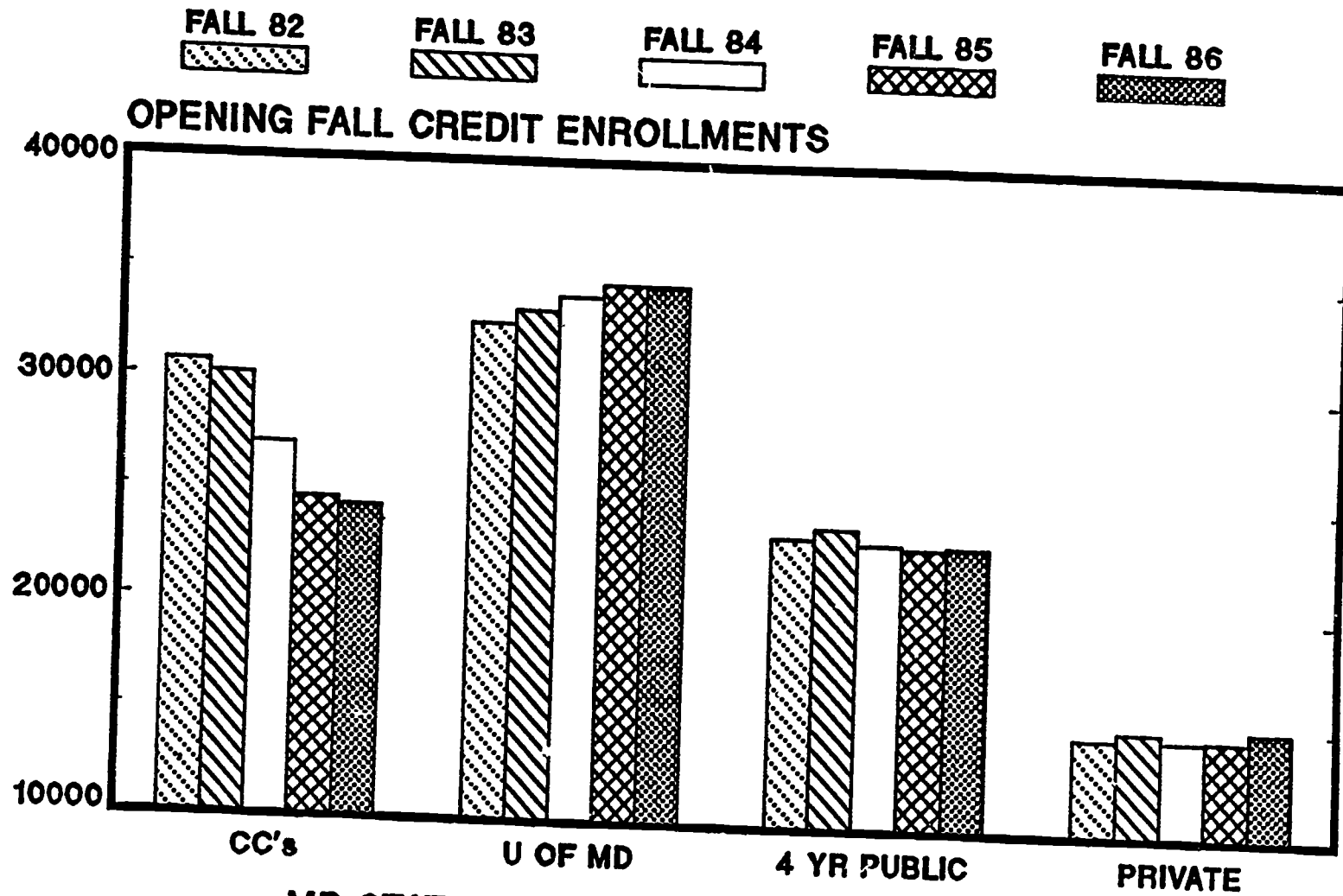
TRENDS IN TOTAL UNDERGRADUATES BY SEGMENTS

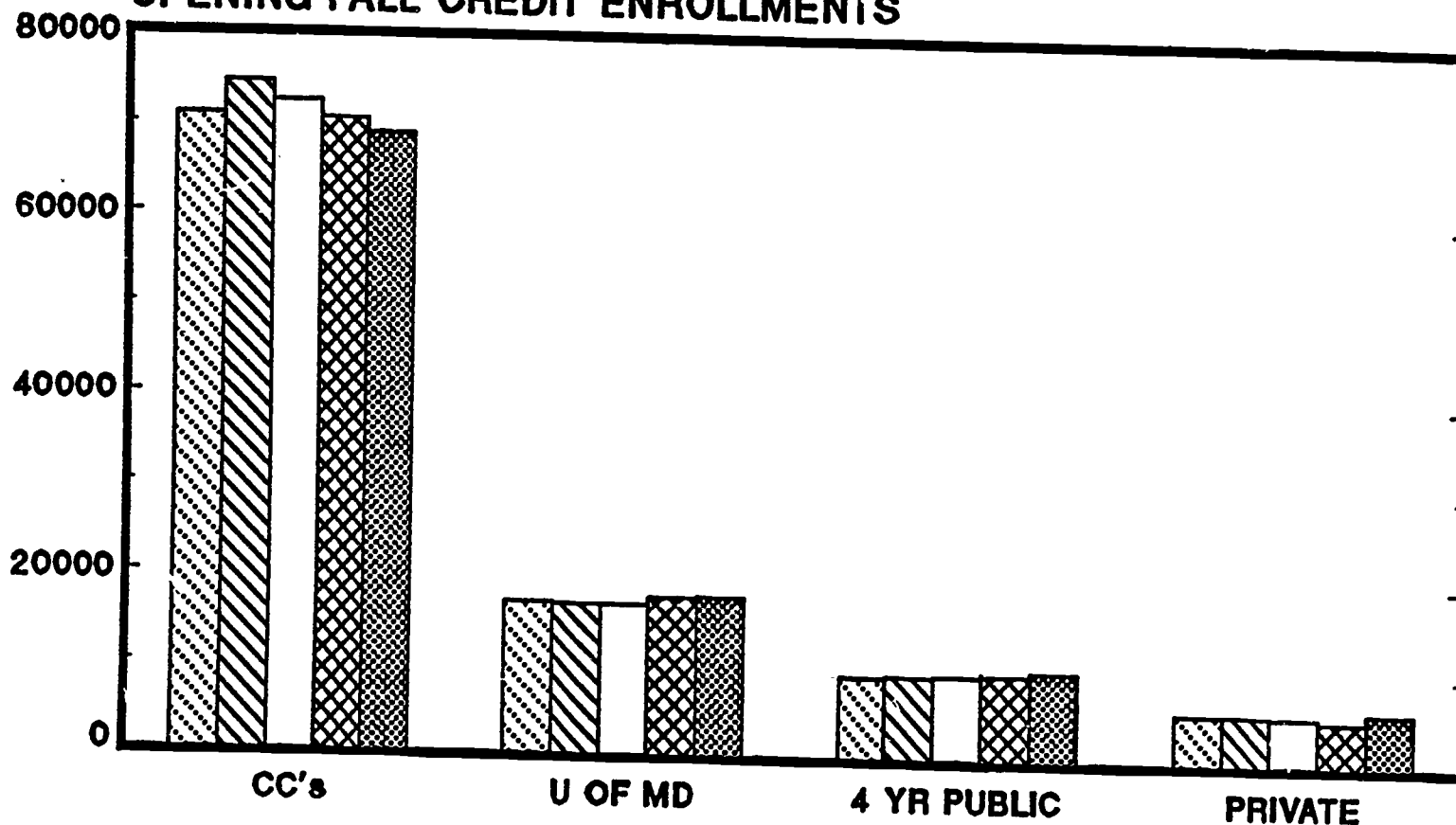

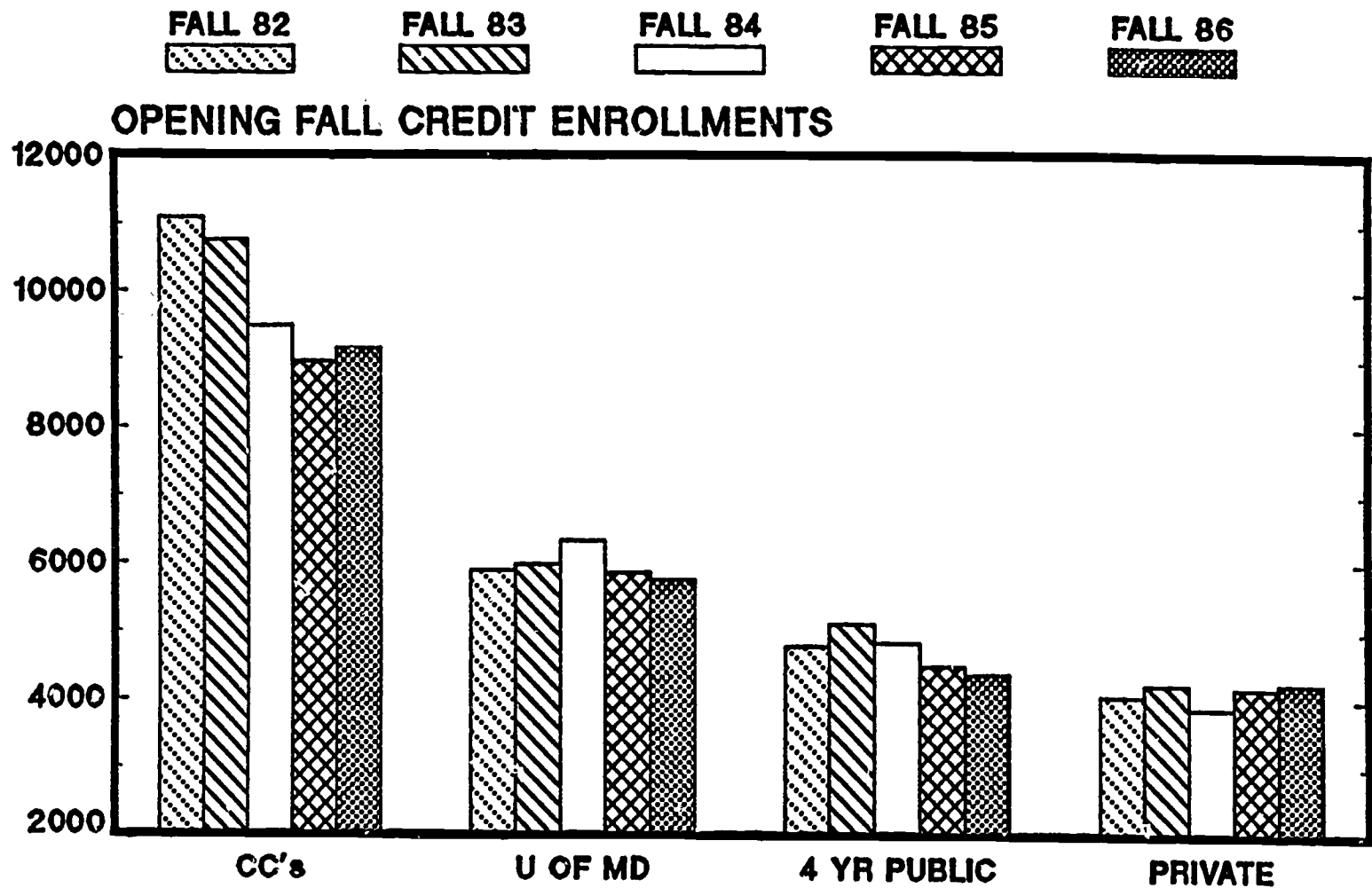
OPENING FALL CREDIT ENROLLMENTS

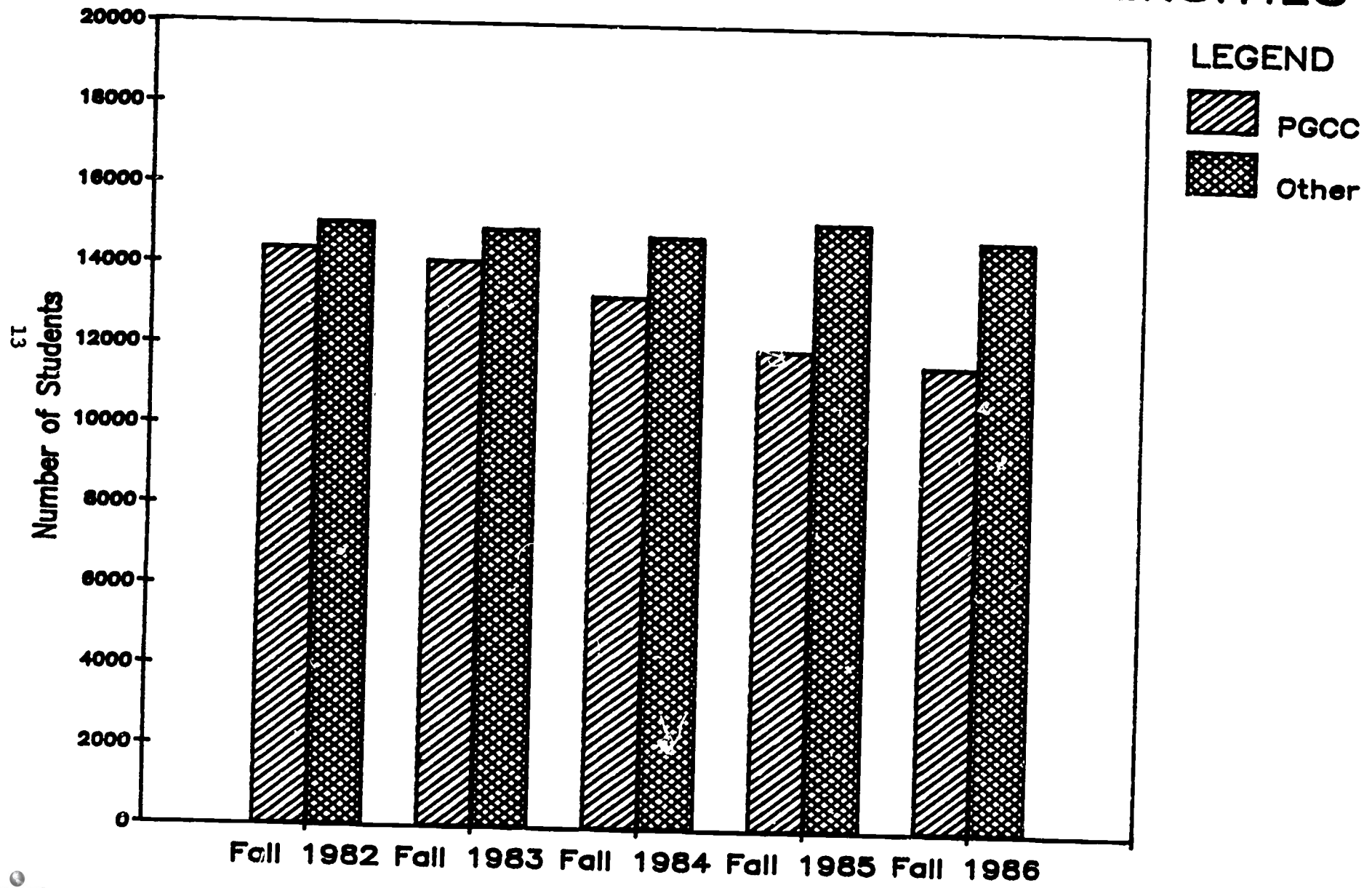
TRENDS IN FULL TIME FRESHMEN BY SEGMENTS

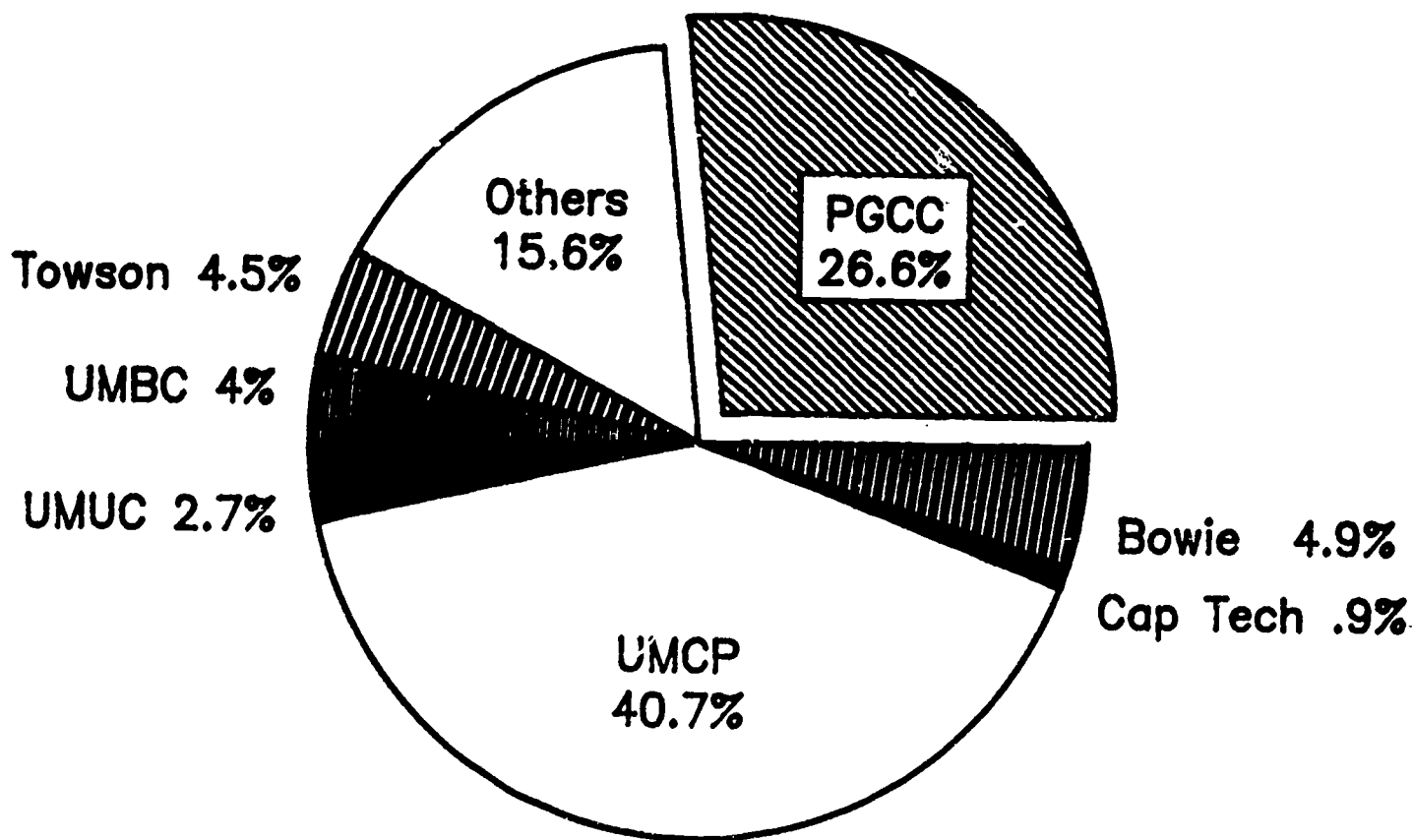
ENROLLMENT OF P.G. COUNTY RESIDENTS AT MARYLAND COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

P.G. COUNTY FULL-TIME UNDERGRADS

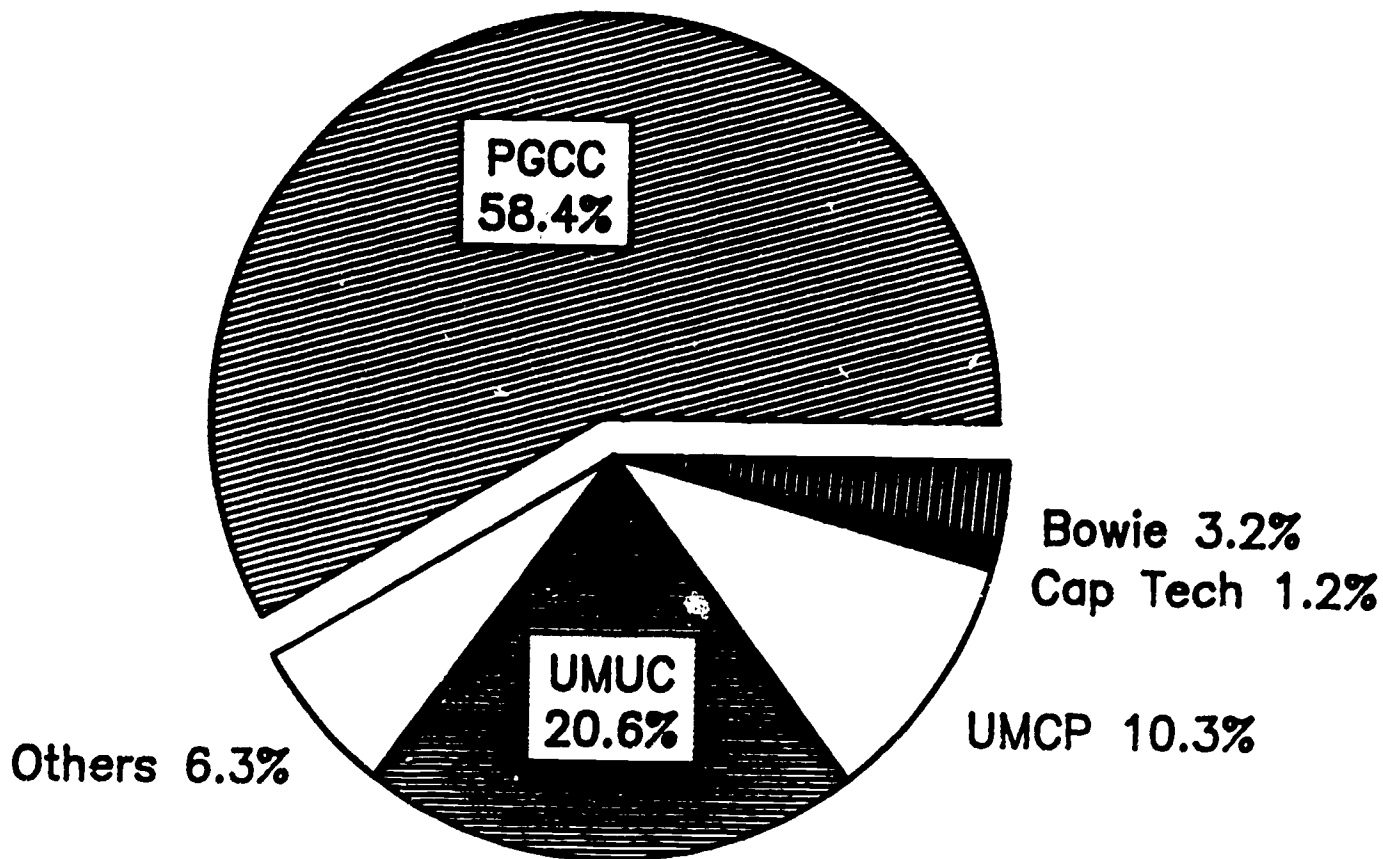
Attending Maryland Colleges, Fall 1986

P.G. COUNTY PART-TIME UNDERGRADS

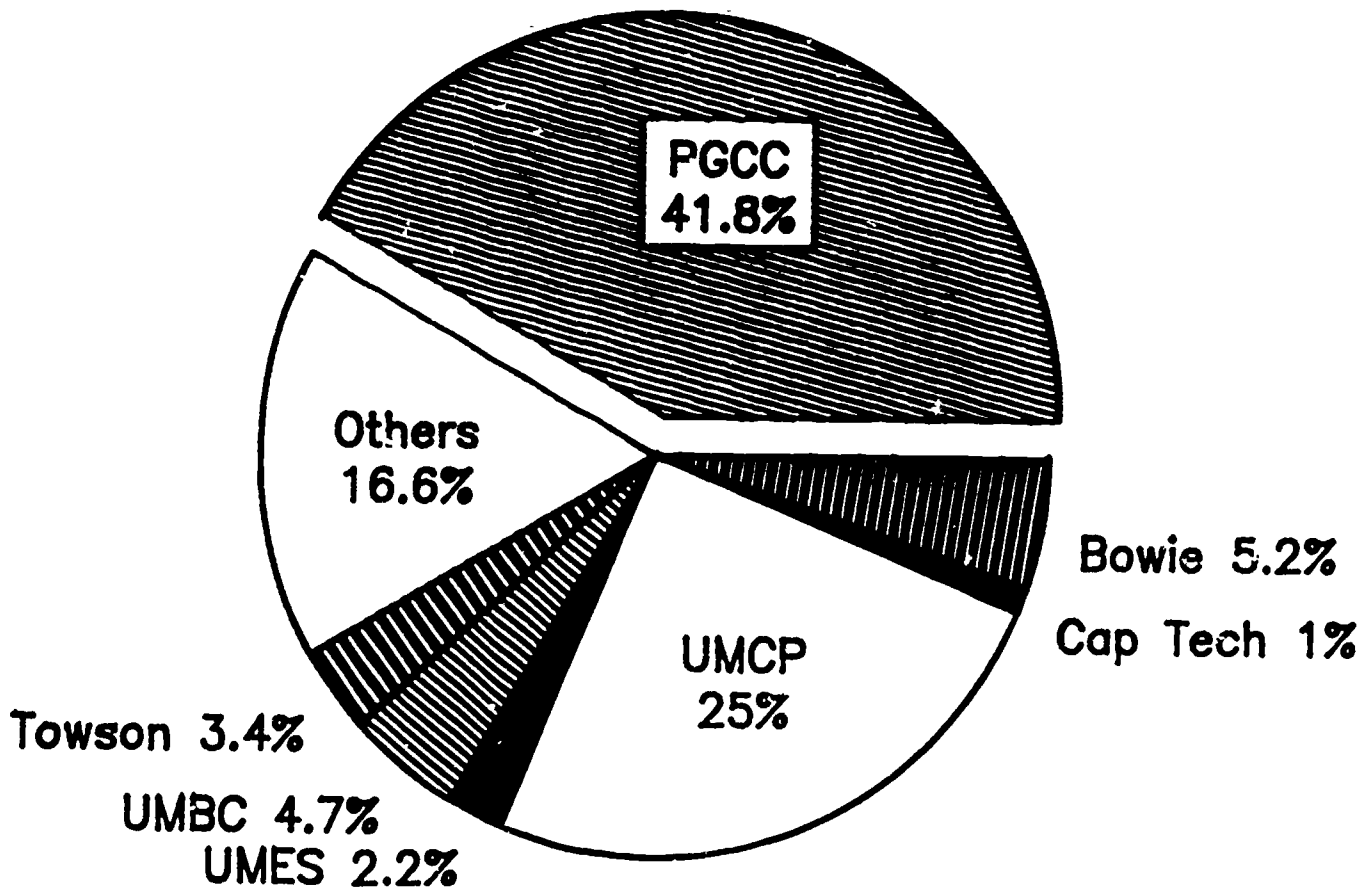
Attending Maryland Colleges, Fall 1986

NEW FULL-TIME FRESHMAN MARKET SHARES

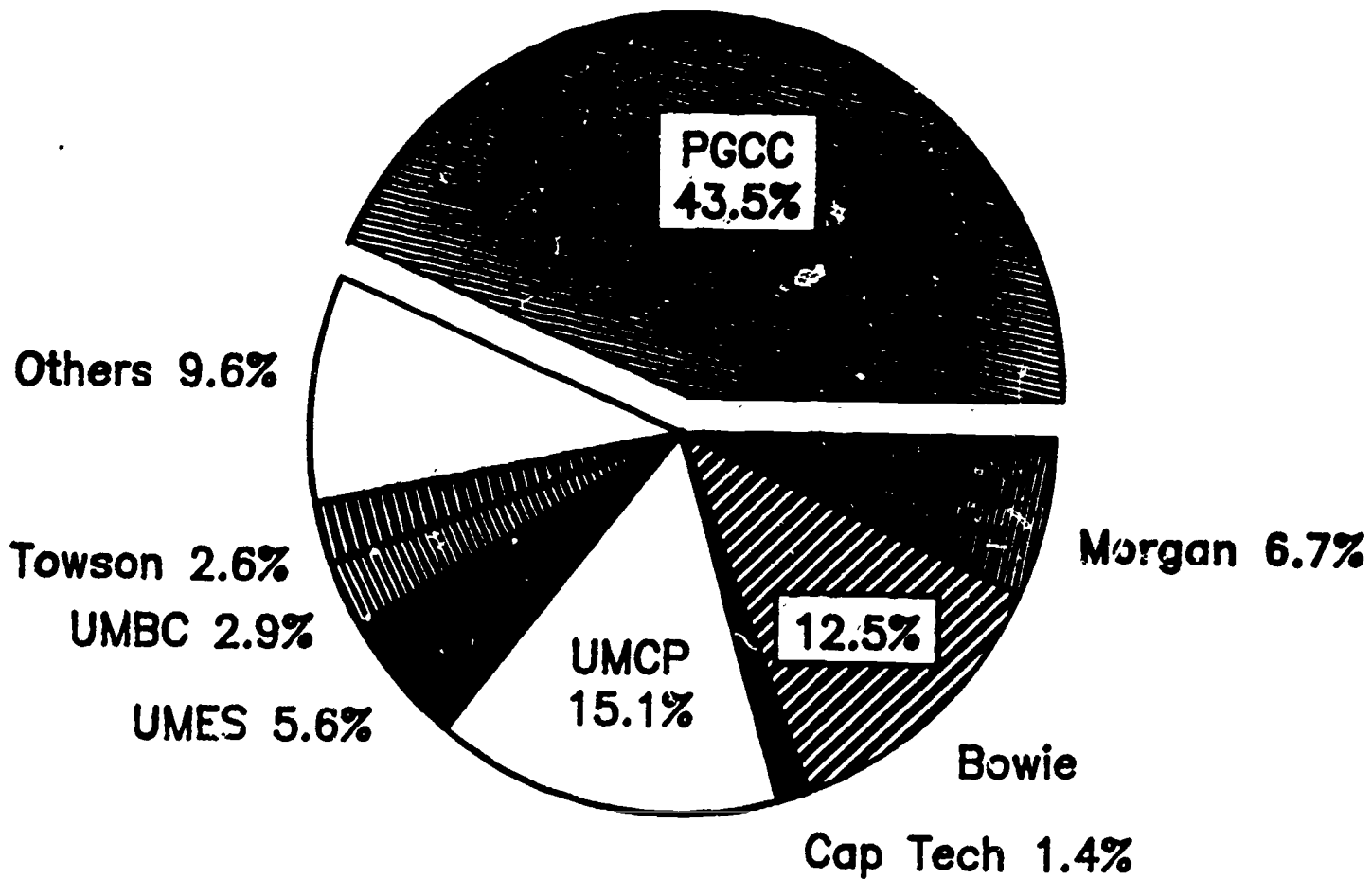
P.G. County Residents, Fall 1986
