## ABSTRACT

Descriptive statistics are presented on students in Florida's State University System (SUS) who were previously enrolled in one of the state's 28 community colleges. A series of 16 tables presents fall term data for 1984 through 1986, including information on students' sex, race, and age; SUS enrollment rate of former community college students; credits transferred; student distribution in terms of the university at which they were registered and the community college from which they transferred; grade point average (GPA); and student majors. Highlighted findings include the following: (1) in fall 1986, 49,613 former community college students were enrolled in the SUS, representing 47.4% of all SUS undergraduates; (2) between 1984 and 1986, the percentage of white students increased by 1.5%, while the percentage of black students decreased by 0.5%; (3) in 1986, 70.8% of the transfer students were in their first, second, or third year of study at the SUS, a decrease from 77.1% in 1985 and from 79.2% in 1984; (4) 79.8% of the students transferred 60 semester hours or more to the SUS; (5) 62.9% of the transfer students earned a GPA of 2.50 or higher while enrolled in the SUS; and (6) the GPA of community college transfers very closely paralleled that of native SUS students. ## ARTICULATION IN FLORIDA

Articulation is the means by which schools, colleges, and universities coordinate their programs and services to facilitate the movement of students through the educational system. Articulation is especially critical to the success of Florida's postsecondary education system which is based on the two-plus-two system. Florida is considered a leader in the nation in developing highly effective articulation at the state and local levels between and among institutions and sectors.

Thirty years ago, a report entitled "The Community Junior College in Florida's Future" was approved by the State Board of Education. The report outlined the orderly development of a statewide system of community colleges, clearly designating community colleges as the entry point for students beginning their postsecondary education. At that time, Florida had three universities and four community colleges. Articulation between the systems was formalized by the 1959 General Education Agreement. The General Education Agreement guaranteed the transfer of all general education credits from a public community college to a state university and prohibited the universities from requiring any additional general education courses if a student had completed a general education program at a community college.

During the rapid growth that followed, four universities were opened without a lower division and the other five had severe limitations placed on lower-level enrollments (hence, the two-plus-two system). During the same time, twenty-four new community colleges were opened by 1972, bringing the total to twenty-eight. This rapid expansion of the postsecondary system spurred the development of a new articulation agreement.

Promulgated in 1971, the new articulation agreement defined the associate of arts degree as the transfer degree, reconfirmed the 1959 General Education Agreement, established the common course numbering system (which further guarantees the transfer of credits through the assignment of common course numbers to courses with equivalent curriculums), and created the Articulation Coordinating Committee. This Committee, composed of three representatives each from the state university system, the public community college system and the public school system, and one member each from vocational education, the Commissioner of Education's office and a lay member, was created to adjudicate institutional or student conflicts, interpret the Agreement and generally facilitate articulation.

From this foundation, a number of other programs, systems and activities have emerged, which serve to enhance the two-plus-two articulation system. Programs such as: common college and high school transcripts, dual enrollment programs, the designation of articulation officers at both the public community college and state university levels, the College Level Academic Skills Program, computerized academic advisement systems, program reviews, placement testing and a host of other activities. All of these programs and activities reflect the commitment Florida's public educational institutions have made toward the equitable treatment of transfer students and to the success of the two-plus-two system.

## ARTICULATION REPORT

This Articulation report presents descriptive headcount (full-time and part-time) statistics for those students in Florida's State University System (SUS) who, prior to enrolling in their respective universities, were enrolled in one of Florida's twenty-eight public community colleges. In the Fall of 1986, there were 49,613 such students which represent 47.4% of all undergraduate students in the SUS. In 1985, there were 45,919 transfer students and in 1984, there were 47,217.

The Articulation Agreement, Rule 6A-10.24, Florida Administrative Code, facilitates the transfer of students from the colleges to the universities. That agreement also encourages the divisions to cooperatively conduct research. It is in this spirit that the "Articulation" report has been produced by the Division of Community Colleges since 1973. In 1974, the SUS established the Student Data Course File which contains records of all students enrolled in the universities. Since then, a stable format of that file has permitted longitudinal comparisons of students.

The reader may be interested in comparing groups of students of concern to him or her. Comparisons are not made herein, but sufficient information is provided for the reader to compare groups. Only brief comments will be made on the data contained in the various tables.

Tables 1, 2, and 3 display by gender, race, and age respectively, the frequencies of headcount enrollments of undergraduate students attending the SUS in the fall term, where college of last attendance was a Florida community college. The percentage difference between male and female student enrollments increased from 4% to 6% during the three-year period 1984-86. Female students in 1986 represented 54% of the total. The percentage of white students increased by 1.5%, while the enrollment of black students decreased slightly by 0.5%. Percentage enrollments by other races remained fairly constant.

Table 4 shows that 31.4% of the transfer students were in their first year of study in the SUS in 1986, a decrease of 4.6% since 1984. This percent decreases as the number of years in attendance increases. In 1986, 70.8% of the students were in their first, second, or third year in the SUS. In 1985, that percent was 77.1 and in 1984, it was 79.2%.

Table 5 clearly shows that the majority (79.8%) of students in 1986 transferred 60 semester hours or more upon entering the SUS. This rate is slightly less than in 1985 and 1984. Table 6 shows the total number of semester hours accumulated, including hours transferred toward a degree.

Tables 7 and 8 show the distribution of students by the university at which they were registered and the community college from which they transferred. Percents in Table 7 are for columns (universities) and in Table 8 are for rows (community colleges). No particular trends are noted over the three-year period. It is no surprise that Table 8 indicates that the largest percentage of transfers from a community college tend to enroll in the nearest university.

Table 9 shows that most transfer students earned a grade-point average (GPA) of 2.50 or higher while enrolled in the SUS. GPA is based on a 4.0 system and is calculated by dividing grade points earned by semester hours attempted. It is interesting to note that the percent of community college transfer students earning 2.50 or better has increased from 59.5% in 1984 to 62.9% in 1986.

Table 10 compares two groups of 1986 SUS students, those who transferred prior to earning 60 semester hours at the community college and those who transferred after earning 60 semester hours. Data for previous years are not shown, but are available in prior editions of Articulation.

Tables 12 and 13 present the same data as Tables 10 and 11 except that each N (enrollment) represents the total from a particular college.

Table 14 shows the number of students in each major field of study by university and by SUS. Each of these groups is divided into two subgroups, those whose GPA was higher than 2.00 and those whose GPA was lower than 2.00. Mean GPA for each group is reported in the final column.

Table 15 provides the same data as Table 14, but for the SUS only over a three-year period.

Table 16 has been added in this year's report and reflects for the full year, 1986-87 (summer, fall, and spring terms), GPA performance of community college students with an associate in arts degree versus "native" university students classified as upper division. Table 16 represents a State University System summary. As such, students are classified in slightly different major categories than in Table 14. This may make cross comparisons difficult in some cases. As can be seen in this table, community college student GPA performance very closely parallels that of "native" university students.
