ABSTRACT

The data presented in this report are from the 1986-87 school year public education agency universe survey of the Common Core of Data conducted annually by the Center for Education Statistics. Data for this report were provided by state education agencies from their administrative records. Six tables show the number and percentage of public elementary/secondary education agencies and school districts by state, type and size of agency, membership size, and grade span. Among the highlights are the following: (1) about 92 percent of all public education agencies are regular elementary and/or secondary school districts, as opposed to special purpose education agencies; (2) the median size of an education agency ranges from a low of 28 students in Nebraska to a high of 11,896 in Maryland; and (3) the largest 173 regular school districts served 27.9 percent of the national total number of students, while the 4,071 smallest school districts served 1.4 percent of all students. Public Education Agency Universe, 1986-87: **Final Tabulations**

This issuance is based on information from the 1986-87 school year public education agency universe survey of the Common Core of Data (CCD) series conducted annually by the U.S. Department of Education's Center for Education Statistics. The tables summarize statistical information for each education agency as supplied to the Center by State education agency officials. Among the highlights:

- About 92 percent of all public education agencies reporting to CES are regular elementary and/or secondary school districts, as opposed to special purpose education agencies.
- The median size of an education agency (number of students served) by State ranges from a low of 28 students in Nebraska to a high of 11,896 in Maryland (excluding one-agency States).
- The largest 173 regular school districts (representing 1.1 percent of the total) served 10,821,351 students (27.9 percent of the national total number of students), while the 4,071 smallest school districts (25.9 percent of the total) served 521,546 (1.4 percent of all students).

Methodology

Data for this report were provided by State education agencies from their administrative records. The Center for Education Statistics and the State education agencies work cooperatively to assure comparability between data elements requested and reported. According to preference, each State's CCD Coordinator was sent a CES computer printout or data tape. In turn, the CCD Coordinator updated the CES data with current information when it was available.

The source of data for this report is the Public Education Agency Universe Survey of the Common Core of Data series. Responses to this survey were due from State education agencies to CES on August 15, 1987. The data used here represent information which had been incorporated into the file as of October 15, 1987.

A data tape of the 1986-87 Education Agency Universe will be available shortly.

Related Information

Other reports from the Common Core of Data recently released by the Center for Education Statistics include: the Directory of Public Elementary and Secondary Education Agencies, Fall 1987 (listing all education agencies in the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and outlying areas, with addresses and basic organizational information); and Public School Enrollment and Staff, 1986-87 (which contains statistics pertaining to the distribution of teachers and students in the Nation's public schools).

Response Rates

Although education officials in all States responded positively to the Center's request for data, technical problems encountered in the processing of the Massachusetts data could not be resolved prior to the publication of this report. Hence, no information on grade span or student counts in Massachusetts is reported in the tables. Also, data supplied by education officials in the outlying areas are included in the tables, but are not added into the United States totals.

Definitions and Abbreviations

PK--prekindergarten

K--kindergarten

Regular school districts--agencies responsible for providing free public elementary and/or secondary education for school-age children residing within their jurisdiction. These agencies sometimes include special and vocational education in a comprehensive educational setting. In other cases, these education agence 3 contract with other agencies to provide services rather than operating schools themselves. In these cases, no student membership is attributed to the agency.

Supervisory union administrative centers—agencies which provide administrative services for a group of small school districts. Student membership is not generally attributed to these agencies.

Regional educational service agencies (RESA)-agencies which provide special services to other public elementary and secondary education agencies. In most cases, student membership is not attributed to these agencies since the students served by these agencies are accounted for by the sending district.

State-operated agencies--those which operate elementary and secondary education programs (such as State schools for the blind or deaf) and are included if reported by CCD Coordinators.

Federally operated agencies--those which operate elementary and secondary education programs (such as the Bureau of Indian Affairs) and are included if reported by CCD Coordinators.

Other agencies—those which operate elementary and secondary education programs and are so designated by State CCD Coordinators if no other type code is appropriate. In this report, these are grouped with Federally operated agencies.
