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ABSTRACT

The four reports contained in this document summarize enrollment trends and the academic and personal characteristics of students enrolled in credit programs at six University of Hawaii community colleges for the years 1983 through 1986. The reports focus on headcount by college, changes in headcount and full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments, selected characteristics (i.e., sex, educational objective, major program area, attendance status, course load, educational level, residence, tuition status, age, registration status, and ethnicity) of regular credit students, and distribution of majors by program and campus. Highlighted findings include the following: (1) fall 1983's enrollment of 21,237 regular students represented a decline of 4% from fall 1982, the first decline in 4 years; (2) in fall 1984, there was a 16% decline in the number of incoming students, with the sharpest decline (-20%) among first-time students; (3) between fall 1984 and fall 1985, the proportion of women and part-time students increased, while the average number of semester hours carried decreased; and (4) in 1986, a 1% decrease in the number of classified students was offset by a 5% increase in the number of unclassified students. This is a brief report summarizing data on students at Honolulu, Kapiolani, Kauai, Leeward, Maui and Windward Community Colleges under the Office of the Chancellor for Community Colleges*. Included are data on enrollment trends and selected personal and academic characteristics of students.

The primary emphasis of this report is on regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs. Data on other students served, largely in non-credit programs such as Apprenticeship programs, Senior Citizens centers, etc., are limited to registration counts.

Sources of Data

Except for Table 1, the information cited in this report was extracted from the Student Enrollment Reports (SER). The basic data are derived from student applications, personal history forms, and student class registrations.

Highlights

- A. Registrations in various community college offerings number 26,420 this fall (Table 1). Of these:
1. 21,237, 80%, are regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs of the community colleges.
 2. 73, about 0.3%, are early admittees, or concurrent registrants, enrolled in credit programs.
 3. 1,127, 4%, are registered in non-credit apprenticeship/journeyworker programs.
 4. 3,983, about 15%, registered in special offerings such as those presented at community services programs, the Job Experience program, Ho'omana School, and the Employment Training Office.
- B. Data on the 21,237 regular (classified and unclassified) students (Tables 2, 3, 4) in the credit programs show the following:
1. This fall's enrollment of 21,237 students is the second highest recorded for the community colleges, and is a 4% decrease from last fall's record high enrollment of 22,176.

*This report excludes data for Hawaii Community College which will be reported with, and as an organizational component of, the University of Hawaii at Hilo.

2. The enrollment is a decrease of 939 students from last fall. Enrollment decreased at all campuses, decreases ranging from 3% to 7%.
3. All trends in terms of student characteristics either stabilized or reversed this fall.
 - ...The number and proportion of women attending the UH Community Colleges has risen steadily each fall since 1977. However, for the first time since then, the number and proportion decreased from 11,449 to 10,881 this fall (from 52% to 51% of the student population).
 - ...The number and proportion of part-time students has risen steadily since 1973. However, for the first time this fall, the number of part-time students has decreased (from 12,284 to 11,771). The proportion has remained stable at 55%.
 - ...The FTE:HEADCOUNT ratio has remained stable this fall, after declining steadily since 1978.
 - ...The average semester hours carried by all students (full- and part-time students) this fall has remained stable at 9.4, after declining steadily since 1974.
 - ...The mean age of students decreased for the first time since 1978, from 25.3 years last fall to 25.1 years this fall. The median age has remained stable at 22.1 for the past three years.
4. There appears to be little change in the proportion of students with Hawaii permanent home address (97%) and Hawaii resident tuition status (92%).
5. The proportion of U.S. citizens appears to be declining slightly, from 92% in Fall 1979 to 90% this fall.
6. A brief analysis of the distribution of students, by majors, shows that:
 - ...Liberal Arts majors comprise 41% of the enrollment this fall, compared with 39% last fall. There are 82 (1%) more liberal arts majors this fall.
 - ...Vocational education majors comprise 46% of the enrollment this fall, compared with 47% last fall. There are 591 (6%) fewer vocational education majors throughout the community colleges.
 - ...Unclassified students comprise 13% of the enrollment this fall, compared with 14% last fall. There are 410 (13%) fewer unclassified students throughout the community colleges.

...An examination of the data on majors (Appendix A) shows substantial changes ($\pm 15\%$ with at least a difference of 10 students) in the several programs.

Programs showing substantial increases: Agriculture, Applied Trades, Graphic Arts.

Programs showing substantial decreases: Building Maintenance, Cosmetology, Finance, Fire Science, Marine Technology, Occupational Safety & Health, and Secretarial Science.

SUMMARY

This fall's enrollment of 21,237 regular students is the second highest recorded for the community colleges, and is a 4% decrease from last fall's record high enrollment of 22,176. This decline is the first in four years.

All trends in terms of student characteristics either stabilized or reversed this fall. In a reversal of trends, the proportion and number of women, the number of part-time students, and the average age of students all decreased this fall. FTE:HEADCOUNT ratios and average semester hours carried stabilized this fall, after steady declines since 1978 and 1974 respectively.

This is a brief report summarizing data on students at Honolulu, Kapiolani, Kauai, Leeward, Maui and Windward Community Colleges under the Office of the Chancellor for Community Colleges*. Included are data on enrollment trends and selected personal and academic characteristics of students.

The primary emphasis of this report is on regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs. Data on other students served, largely in non-credit programs such as Apprenticeship programs, Senior Citizens centers, etc., are limited to registration counts.

Sources of Data

Except for Table 1, the information cited in this report was extracted from the Student Enrollment Reports (SER). The basic data are derived from student applications, personal history forms, and student class registrations.

Highlights

- A. Registrations in various community college offerings number 26,370 this fall (Table 1). Of these:
1. 20,175, 77%, are regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs of the community colleges.
 2. 100, less than 1%, are special students (early admittees or concurrent registrants) enrolled in credit programs.
 3. 1,105, 4%, are registered in non-credit apprenticeship/journeyworker programs.
 4. 4,990, 19%, are registered in special offerings such as those presented at community services programs, the Job Experience program, Ho'omana School, and the Employment Training Office.
- B. Data on the 20,175 regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs show the following:
1. This fall's enrollment of 20,175 students is the fourth highest recorded for the community colleges, but is a 5% decrease from last fall's enrollment of 21,237. Enrollment peaked at 22,176 in 1982, and now seems to be dropping off somewhat.

*This report excludes data for Hawaii Community College which is reported with, and as an organizational component of, the University of Hawaii at Hilo.

2. The enrollment is a decrease of 1,062 students from last fall. Enrollment decreased at all campuses, with decreases ranging from less than 1 percent to 11%.

...There was a sharp decline in the number of incoming students (first-time, returning, transfers), which dropped 16% or 1,791 students.

...Of these incoming students, the sharpest decline came in the number of first-time students, down 20% or 1,273 students. There was also a sharp decline in the proportion of first-time students, which dropped to 24%, after a relatively stable 5 year period ranging between 27% and 29%.

...The number of returning students dropped 13% (255 students) and the number of transfer students dropped 9% (263 students).

3. Certain trends in terms of student characteristics have resumed after either stabilizing or reversing last fall.

...The number and proportion of women attending the UH Community Colleges has risen steadily each fall since 1977. After decreasing to 51% for the first time last fall, the proportion rose this fall to its 1982 level of 52%.

...The number and proportion of part-time students has risen steadily since 1973. For the first time last fall, the proportion stabilized at 55%. This fall, however, the proportion increased to 57%, the highest ever.

...Last fall the average semester hours carried by all students (full- and part-time students) remained stable at 9.4, after declining steadily since 1974. This fall it resumes its downward trend, now at 9.2 semester hours carried.

...Last fall the mean age of students decreased for the first time since 1978. This fall it resumes its upward trend and is now at 25.5 years, the highest ever. The median age increased also, to 22.3 years after remaining stable for the past three years.

...The FTE:HEADCOUNT ratio has resumed its downward trend, standing now at .62, down from .63 last fall. It has declined steadily since 1973, though it stabilized briefly in 1979 and again last fall.

4. There appears to be little change in the following characteristics.

...The proportion of students with Hawaii permanent home address remains constant at 97%.

...The distribution of students by local address is relatively constant, with 48% from the Honolulu area, 37% from the Leeward area, and 15% from the Windward area.

- ...The proportion of students with Hawaii resident tuition status remains relatively stable at 93%.
 - ...The proportion of U.S. citizens appears stable at 90% after slowly declining in previous years.
5. A brief analysis of the distribution of students, by majors, shows that:
- ...Unclassified enrollment has remained relatively stable over a 5 year period, ranging from 13% to 14% of total enrollment. Enrollment in vocational education has increased proportionately (though there have been slight fluctuations), while Liberal Arts enrollment has declined.
 - ...An examination of the data on majors (Appendix A) shows substantial changes ($\pm 15\%$ with at least a difference of 10 students) in the several programs.

Noteworthy is that there are no programs showing substantial increases: The largest percentage increases came in Legal Assisting (up 13%), Commercial Baking (up 12%), and Computer Sciences & Data Processing (up 11%).

A number of programs show substantial decreases: Agriculture, Applied Trades, Associate Degree Nursing, Auto Body Repair & Painting, Graphic Art, Industrial Education, Machine Shop, Marine Pipefitting, Marine Technology, Medical Assisting, Occupational Safety & Health, Refrigeration & Air Conditioning, Welding Technology.

SUMMARY

This fall's enrollment of 20,175 regular students is the fourth highest recorded for the community colleges, but is a 5% decrease from last fall's record high enrollment of 21,237. Enrollment peaked in 1982, and is now declining somewhat.

There is a 16% decline in the number of incoming (first-time, returning, transfer) students. The sharpest decline in incoming students is in the number of first-time students, down 20% or 1,273 students. Returning and transfer students are down 13% (255 students) and 9% (263 students) respectively.

Certain trends have resumed after stabilizing or reversing last fall. The proportion of women and part-time students, and the mean age of students all have resumed their upward trends. The average semester hours carried and the FTE:HEADCOUNT ratios continue downward.

There appears to be little change in distributions of these student characteristics: permanent home addresses, local addresses, tuition status, citizenship status, and general program area (though individual curricula fluctuate, with 13 showing substantial decreases).

This is a brief report summarizing data on students at Honolulu, Kapiolani, Kauai, Leeward, Maui and Windward Community Colleges under the Office of the Chancellor for Community Colleges*. Except for Table 1, the information cited in this report was extracted from the Student Enrollment Reports (SER) as of October 15, 1985. Included are data on enrollment trends and selected personal and academic characteristics of students.

The primary emphasis of this report is on regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs. Data on other students served, largely in non-credit programs such as Apprenticeship programs, Senior Citizens centers, etc., are limited to registration counts.

Highlights

- A. Registrations in various community college offerings number 26,267 this fall (Table 1). Of these:
1. 20,003, 76 %, are regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs of the community colleges.
 2. 57, less than 1%, are special students (early admittees or concurrent registrants) enrolled in credit programs.
 3. 967, 4%, are registered in non-credit apprenticeship/journeyworker programs.
 4. 5,240, 20%, are registered in special offerings such as those presented at community services programs, the Job Experience program, Ho'omana School, and the Employment Training Office.
- B. Data on the 20,003 regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs show the following:
1. This fall's enrollment of 20,003 students is a 1% decrease from last fall's enrollment of 20,175. Enrollment peaked at 22,176 in 1982, and now seems to be dropping off somewhat, with decreases of 4%, 5%, and 1% since then.

*This report excludes data for Hawaii Community College which is reported with, and as an organizational component of, the University of Hawaii at Hilo.

2. The enrollment is a decrease of 172 students from last fall, a very modest decline in comparison to declines of about 1,000 students each year for the past two years. Enrollment decreased slightly at four campuses, with decreases ranging from less than 1 percent to 4%. In contrast, enrollment at Windward and Kauai Community Colleges increased by 13% and 1% respectively.

...This fall the largest declines are in the number of continuing students, down 3% or 321 students, and first-time students, down 3% or 135 students. Of interest is that this fall's small 3% decrease in first-time students comes after a sharp decline of 20% last fall. The proportion of first-time students remains at 27% this fall, after a relatively stable five-year period ranging between 27% and 29%.

...The number of returning students increased 7% to 1,832 after dropping 13% last fall, and the number of transfer students increased 6% to 2,848 after dropping 9% last fall.

3. A brief analysis of the distribution of students, by majors, shows that:

...Unclassified enrollment is at a peak this fall, both numerically (at 3,070 students) and proportionately (at 15% of total enrollment). The unclassified student enrollment is a 12 percent or 319 student increase, coming after two years of relative stability. This increase helped offset the continuing decline in classified student enrollment.

...Classified enrollment decreased for the third straight year this fall. Total classified student enrollment is 16,897, a 3% decline. The bulk of the decline is in vocational education, with 8,745 students this fall, a decrease of 4% or 402. Liberal Arts enrollment decreased only slightly to 8,152, a decrease of 1% (43 students).

...An examination of the data on majors (Appendix A) shows substantial changes ($\pm 15\%$ with at least a difference of 10 students) in the several programs.

Programs showing substantial increases: Agriculture (+83%), Sales & Management (+16%), Commercial Arts (+15%).

A number of programs show substantial decreases: Applied Trades (-95%), Occupational Safety & Health (-33%), Recreational Instructor Program (-31%), Machine Shop Technology (-29%), Clerical (-18%), Practical Nursing (-16%).

4. Certain trends continue in terms of student characteristics:

...The number and proportion of women attending the UH Community Colleges has risen steadily each fall since 1977, except for a slight dip in 1983. The proportion continues to increase, now at 53% this fall, the highest ever.

- ...The number and proportion of part-time students has risen steadily since 1973. This fall, the proportion increased to 58%, the highest ever.
 - ...The average semester hours carried by all students (full- and part-time students) continues a downward trend that began in 1974, now at 9.1 semester hours carried.
 - ...The mean age of students continues its upward trend that began in 1978 (except for a brief decline in 1983), and is now at 26.0 years, the highest and largest increase ever. The median age increased for the second consecutive year, to 22.6 years after remaining stable for three years.
 - ...The FTE:HEADCOUNT ratio continues its downward trend, and is now at .61, down from .62 last fall. It has declined steadily since 1973, though it stabilized briefly in 1979 and again in 1983.
5. There appears to be little change in the following characteristics:
- ...The proportion of students with Hawaii permanent home address remains constant at 97% as it has for the past three years.
 - ...The distribution of students by local address is relatively constant, with 48% from the Honolulu area, 36% from the Leeward area, and 15% from the Windward area.
 - ...The proportion of students with Hawaii resident tuition status remains relatively stable at 92%.
 - ...The proportion of U.S. citizens remains stable at 90% as it has for the past three years.

SUMMARY

This fall's enrollment of 20,003 regular students is a marginal 1% decrease from last fall's enrollment of 20,175. Enrollment peaked in 1982, and is now declining, though this year the decline is very small (172 students) compared with decreases of 4% and 5% and totaling 2,001 students over the past two years.

The decreases are in the number of first-time and continuing students, and in the number of classified students.

The number of first-time students is 4,804, down by 3% or 135 students. This small decline comes after a 20% drop last fall. The proportion of first-time students leveled off at 24%. Continuing students number 10,518, down 3% or 321 students, coming after a 7% increase last fall. The number of returning and transfer students increased 6% and 7% respectively, coming after declines of 13% and 9% last year.

Unclassified student enrollment, at 3,070 students, increased 12% and helped to offset the 3% decline in classified students enrollment, down for the third straight year.

Certain trends continue. The proportion of women and part-time students, and the mean age of students all continue their upward trends. The average semester hours carried and the FTE:HEADCOUNT ratio continue downward.

Again as in last fall, there appears to be little change in distributions of these student characteristics: permanent home addresses, local addresses, tuition status, and citizenship status.

FALL 1975 TO FALL 1985

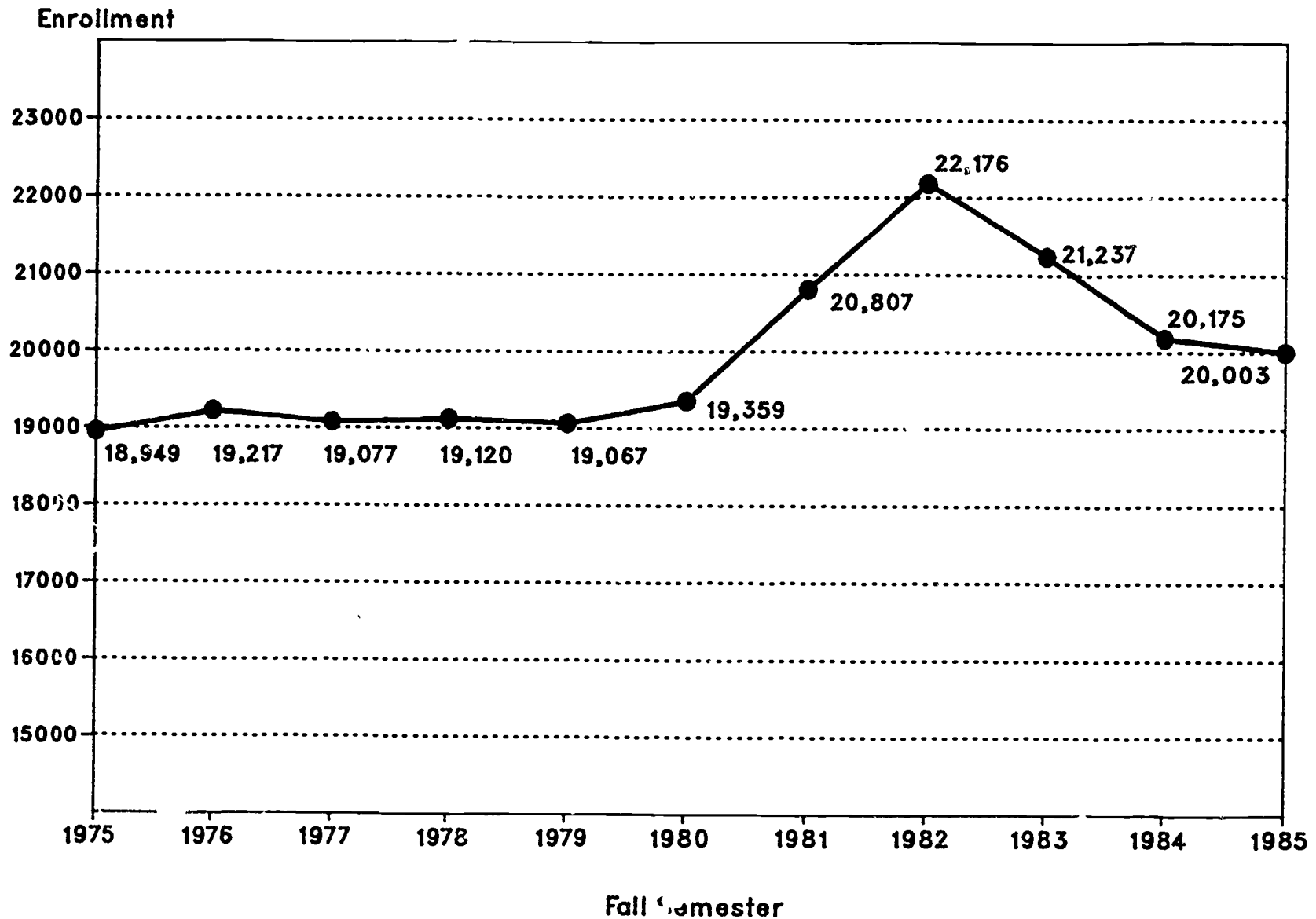

This brief report summarizes data on students at Honolulu, Kapiolani, Kauai, Leeward, Maui and Windward Community Colleges under the Office of the Chancellor for Community Colleges*. Except for Table 1, the information cited in this report was extracted from the Student Enrollment Reports (SER) as of November 7, 1986. Included are data on enrollment trends and characteristics of students.

The primary emphasis of this report is on regular (classified and unclassified) students in the credit programs. Data on other students served, largely in non-credit programs such as Apprenticeship programs, Senior Citizens centers, etc., are limited to registration counts.

Highlights

- A. Registrations in various community college offerings number 24,640 this fall (Table 1). Of these:
1. 19,995, 81%, are regular (classified and unclassified) students in credit programs of the community colleges.
 2. 85, less than 1%, are special students (early admittees or concurrent registrants) enrolled in credit programs.
 3. 1,345, 5%, are registered in non-credit apprenticeship/journeyworker programs.
 4. 3,215, 13%, are registered in special offerings presented through campus community services programs and the Employment Training Office.
- B. Data on the 19,995 regular (classified and unclassified) students in credit programs show the following:
1. This fall's enrollment of 19,995 students is a negligible decrease of less than 1% (8 students) from last fall's enrollment of 20,003. Enrollment peaked at 22,176 in 1982, dropped off for three years with decreases of 4% and 5% in 1983 and 1984 (about 1,000 students each year), and a modest 1% decrease last year before stabilizing this year.

*This report excludes data for Hawaii Community College which is reported with, and as an organizational component of, the University of Hawaii at Hilo.

Enrollment at Kapiolani, Kauai, Leeward and Windward Community Colleges increased by 3%, 5%, 1% and 6% respectively. Enrollment at Honolulu and Maui decreased 6% and 5% respectively.

2. A brief analysis of the distribution of students, by majors, shows that:

- ...Unclassified enrollment was at a peak this fall, both numerically (at 3,211 students) and proportionately (at 16% of total enrollment). The unclassified student enrollment is a 5% or 141 student increase over last year and helped offset the continuing decline in classified student enrollment.
- ...Classified enrollment decreased for the fourth straight year this fall. Total classified student enrollment is 16,716, a modest 1% decline. This decline was due to vocational education enrollment which declined for the fourth year in a row to 8,226 students, a decrease of 6% or 519 from last fall. Vocational education enrollment peaked in 1982 at 10,308 and has dropped off each year since then. This fall's enrollment is 20% lower than in 1982. Liberal arts enrollment actually increased this fall to 8,490, an increase of 4% (338 students), somewhat offsetting the decline in vocational enrollment.
- ...An examination of the data on majors (Appendix A) shows substantial changes ($\pm 15\%$ with at least a difference of 10 students) in the several programs.

There was only one program showing a substantial increase: Building Maintenance (+53%).

A number of programs show substantial decreases: Associate Degree Nursing (-51%), Welding (-33%), Machine Shop Technology (-32%), Agriculture (-28%), Business (-27%), Commercial Baking (-25%), Computer Science/Data Processing (-18%), Recreational Instructor Program (-17%).

3. Certain trends continue in terms of student characteristics:

- ...The number and proportion of women attending the UH Community Colleges has risen steadily each fall since 1977, except for a slight dip in 1983. The proportion continues to increase, now at 54% this fall, the highest ever.
- ...The number and proportion of part-time students has risen steadily since 1973. This fall, the proportion increased to 59%, the highest ever.
- ...The average semester hours carried by all students (full- and part-time students) continues a downward trend that began in 1974, now at 9.0 semester hours carried.

...The mean age of students continues its upward trend that began in 1978 (except for a brief decline in 1983), and is now at 26.4 years, the highest ever. The median age increased for the third consecutive year, to 22.8 years after a stable three year period.

...The FTE:HEADCOUNT ratio continues its downward trend, and is now at .60, down from .61 last fall. It has declined steadily since 1973, though it stabilized briefly in 1979 and again in 1983.

4. There appears to be little change in the following characteristics:

...The proportion of students with Hawaii permanent home address remains relatively stable at 96%, just down slightly after four years at 97%.

...The distribution of students by local address is relatively constant, with 47% from the Honolulu area, 37% from the Leeward area, and (for five consecutive years) 15% from the Windward area.

...The proportion of students with Hawaii resident tuition status remains relatively stable at 91%.

...The proportion of U.S. citizens remains at 90% over 5 consecutive years.

SUMMARY

This fall's enrollment of 19,995 regular students is a negligible, less than 1% decrease from last fall's enrollment of 20,003. Enrollment peaked in 1982 at 22,176, then declined 4%, 5% and 1% in succeeding years before stabilizing this year.

A decrease in the number of classified students (down 1% or 181 students) was offset by an increase in the number of unclassified students (up 5% or 141 students). The slight decline in classified enrollment was due to the decline in the number of vocational education students. An increase in the number of liberal arts students was not enough to offset the overall decline in classified enrollment, the fourth in a row.

Unclassified student enrollment increased 5% and is at 3,211 students or 16% of total enrollment, an all time high both numerically and proportionately.

Certain trends continue. The proportion of women and part-time students, and the mean age of students all continue their upward trends. The average semester hours carried and the FTE:HEADCOUNT ratio continue downward.

Again as in last fall, there appears to be little change in distributions of these student characteristics: permanent home addresses, local addresses, tuition status, and citizenship status.

FALL 1976 TO FALL 1986

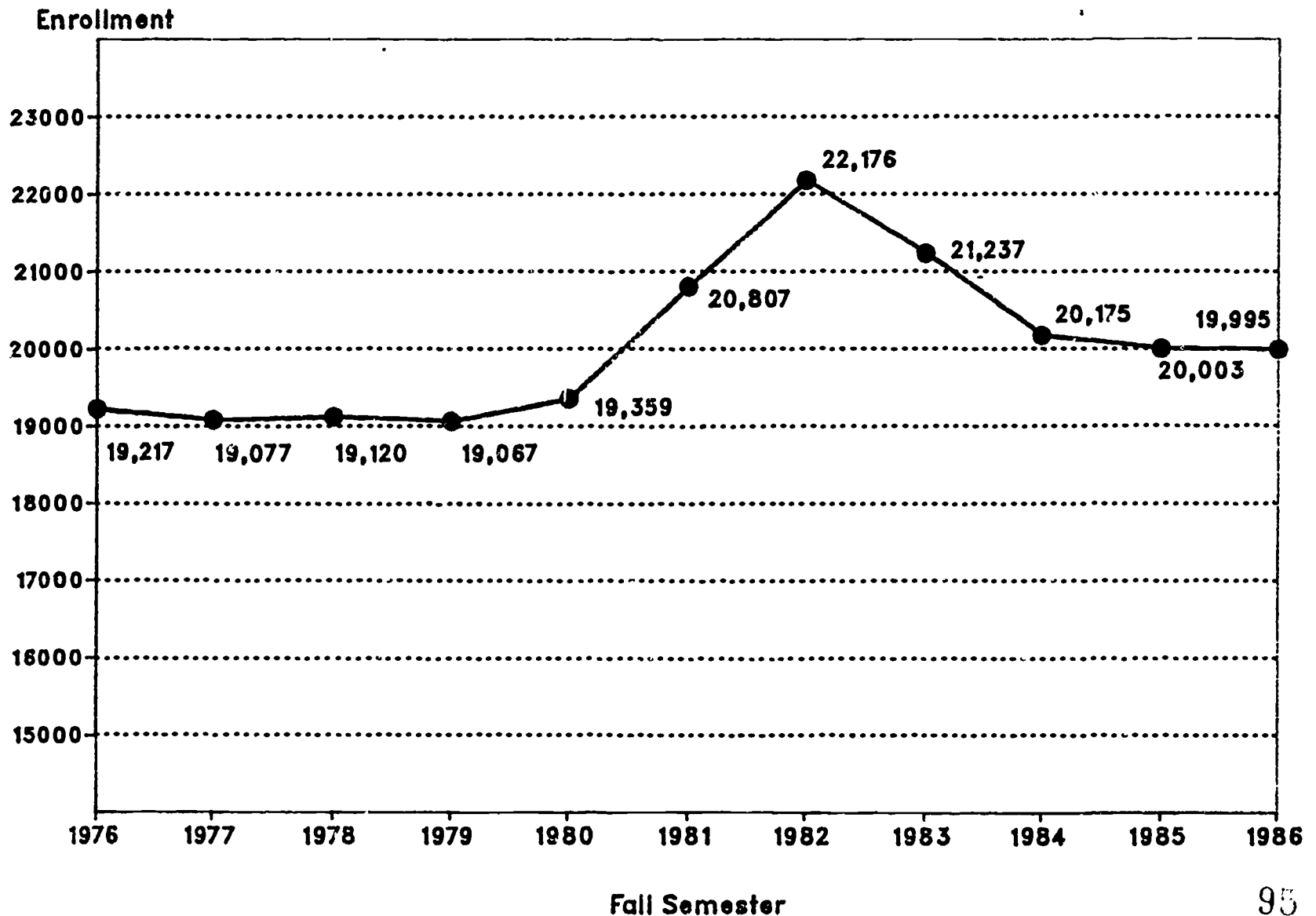
