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ABSTRACT

During fall 1987, the Wyoming Community Callege Commission (WCCC) designed and initiated a 5-year statewide longitudinal study to identify variables affecting student progress toward personal, academic, and career objectives. An initial survey of 181 randomly selected first-time, first-year students was designed to provide a profile of community college students in the state and identify their educational and career goals. Follow-up surveys were scheduled at 6-month intervals, beginning in spring 1988, to evaluate students' progress toward their goals. Based on responses from 85% of the original sample, findings from the first follow-up study included the following: (1) 93% of the students were enrolled in the same college in which they were enrolled in fall 1987, and 77% planned to continue their studies there; (2) respondents had a mean grade point average of 3.02, and enrolled for an average of 15 credit hours; (3) 84% reported no major life changes within the last 6 months affecting their future educational or career plans; (4) 36% of the students who had left college after one semester gave academic reasons for leaving; and (5) a large majority of the respondents were either satisfied or very satisfied with the instruction, faculty/student relations, grading, variety of courses, counseling/academic advising, financial aids services, student employment services, friendship with students, and facilities and equipment at the college. First Interim Report

During the fall of 1987, the Wyoming Community College Commission designed and implemented a five-year statewide longitudinal study. The purpose of the study is to identify the variables that affect student progress toward personal, academic and career objectives. The initial survey was designed to define a profile of community college students and identify their educational and career goals. The original sample consisted of one-hundred-eighty-one (181) randomly selected first-time, first-year students attending one of the seven community colleges in Wyoming.

To evaluate students' progress in reaching their objectives, follow-up surveys are scheduled at six-month intervals during the five year study period. The first follow-up survey was completed after six months or during the spring of 1988. The survey elicited responses in four categories: Currenc Educational Status; Future Educational and Career Plans; Plans for Fall, 1988; and, Satisfaction with College Experiences. The findings recorded from the one-hundred-fifty four (154) students or eighty-five percent (85%) of the original sample are listed below.


[&]quot;Teachers should get papers back sooner and put more constructive criticism on them."

 Independent study labs need explained to first year students."




GRAPHIC SUMMARY OF KEY QUESTIONS and RELATIONSHIPS AMONG VARIABLES







REASONS FOR LEAVING COLLEGE AFTER ONE SEMESTER









