Public Elementary and Secondary School Membership, Graduates, and Staff, by State, 1987-88 Preliminary Tabulations

Highlights

Public School Membership for school year 1987-88 was reported by 42 States and the number of graduates was reported by 40 States (table 1).

- Total membership for those States reporting ranged from a low of 92,755 for Vermont to a high of 3,236,787 for Texas.
- Regular diploma graduates ranged from a low of 5,692 for Alaska to a high of 168,430 for Texas.

Instructional and support staff for school year 1987-88 was reported by 41 States (table 2).

- The total number of teachers ranged from a low of 5,951 for Delaware to a high of 187,159 for Texas.
- The percentage of teachers to total staff ranged from a low of 42.6 for Hawaii to a high of 87.2 for Connecticut.

Student-teacher ratios were calculated for 41 States which reported staff and membership; these ranged from a high of 24.7 for Utah to a low of 13.3 for Connecticut (table 3).

Although Texas shows the highest numbers of students, graduates, and teachers, it is noted that this preliminary publication excludes data for California.

This report presents preliminary data on public elementary and secondary school membership, graduates, and staff for the 1987-88 school year. It includes student counts, graduates, instructional and support staff (reported in full-time equivalents), and student-teacher ratios. Forty-two States submitted data by May 16, 1988 and are included here. National totals have been imputed for most reporting categories and these values have also been included. Data in this report are preliminary and are subject to revision by the States as part of the normal verification process.

Methodology

Preliminary data are as reported by the States and edited by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCI 3). Data on membership, graduates, and staff were provided from administrative records in each State through the Common Core of Data (CCD) survey, "State Nonfiscal Report." The CCD surveys are an annual collection of basic information on the provision of free public elementary and secondary education in the United States. The "State Nonfiscal Report" survey collects information on membership, staffing, and graduates. The CCD surveys are conducted by NCES with the assistance of the State education agencies (SEAs) in the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and the outlying areas under U.S. jurisdiction. Data from outlying areas are not included here, but are available upon request.

In compiling these data from administrative record systems, each SEA obtains fall membership reports from the local education agencies (LEAs) that operate public schools While SEAs are requested to provide counts as of the closest school day to October 1, the "as of" dates for membership counts may vary slightly from State to State. Each SEA may edit or examine the individual LEA reports before computing State totals.

Imputed national totals have been calculated by dividing current-year totals for reporting States by previous-year totals for the same States to yield change ratios. Change ratios are then multiplied by corresponding national totals for the previous year to produce imputed national totals for the current year. This procedure was used for all variables except prekindergarten and ungraded class membership, and rekindergarten, kindergarten, and ungraded class teachers: the amount of missing data in these categories is too large to permit valid imputation.

Definitions

Membership data are the counts of students on the current roll minus withdrawals on the closest school day to October 1. Ungraded students are those students assigned to classes or programs which do not have standard grade designations. Prekindergarten students are those who are enrolled in a group or class that is part of a public school program taught during the year or years preceding kindergarten.

Regular diploma graduates are the individuals who received a regular diploma during the previous school year and subsequent summer school. All staff counts are in full-time equivalents, the amount of time required to perform an assignment stated as a proportion of a full-time position. Included under teacher are those who provide instruction to prekindergarten, kindergarten, grades 1 through 12, or ungraded classes. Those who teach in an environment other than a classroom setting are included. Teacher aides are those staff members assigned to assist a teacher with routine activities associated with teaching. Guidance counselors/directors are professional staff members assigned specific duties and school time to activities involving counseling with students and parents. Other support staff includes librarians, officials and administrators, school administrators, and all other support staff.
