ABSTRACT

Data are presented from the 1986 Fall Enrollment survey, a component of the new Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS), which supercedes the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS). Data are included for responding postsecondary institutions, including a universe survey of 5,901 4-year, 2-year, and less than 2-year (public), institutions and a sample survey of 1,001 less than 2-year (private) institutions. The overall response rate was 78.7 percent. Three fall enrollment survey forms were used for data collection. Data were collected from all four- and two-year schools by attendance status, level of enrollment, and race/ethnicity and sex of student. In addition, the 4-year schools were requested to provide enrollment by selected fields of study. Information is included on status of data, response rates, imputation, data editing, sample design, sampling errors, non-sampling errors, and students included and excluded from the report. A glossary of key terms is provided. Table categories are as follows: all postsecondary institutions, fall 1986; all postsecondary institutions by race/ethnicity, fall 1986; all institutions of higher education, fall 1986; all institutions of higher education by race/ethnicity, fall 1986; and response rates. Highlights

This report presents data from the 1986 Fall Enrollment survey, a component of the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS). Data are presented for all postsecondary institutions and for a subset of these schools, the institutions of higher education. These higher education institutions are accredited at the college level by an agency that has been listed as nationally recognized by the Secretary of Education and were previously surveyed under the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS).

Postsecondary education institutions

- Over 13.9 million students enrolled in fall 1986.
- Women accounted for 53 percent of all students enrolled.
- Over 1 million students enrolled in less-than-2-year institutions—over 700,000 in private, for-profit institutions.
- Racial/ethnic minorities accounted for 18 percent and non-resident aliens for 3 percent of the total enrollment in 4- and 2-year institutions in fall 1986.

Institutions of higher education

- Over 12.5 million students enrolled in fall 1986—270,000 more than in fall 1985.
- While overall enrollment rose 2.2 percent between fall 1985 and 1985, enrollment of first-time freshmen continued to decline, dropping 3.9 percent from 1985.
- Enrollment of part-time students grew by 4.2 percent and accounted for 43 percent of total enrollment in fall 1986.

Postsecondary Fall Enrollment, 1986

<u>Methodology</u>

This report presents data from the survey "Fall Enrollment" 1986, conducted by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). This survey was conducted as part of the new Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) and makes available enrollment data for all postsecondary education institutions. It also presents data on a subset of these schools, the institutions of higher education that are accredited at the college level by an agency that has been listed as nationally recognized by the Secretary of Education. These institutions were previously surveyed under the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS), which IPEDS supercedes.

Type of Data Collected

Three fall enrollment survey forms were used for data collection. The most extensive form was used for postsecondary education institutions that grant baccalaureate and higher degrees, while questionnaires for 2-year and less-than-2-year institutions requested less-detailed data. Data were collected from all 4- and 2-year schools by attendance status, level of enrollment, and race/ethnicity and sex of student. In addition, the 4-year schools were requested to provide enrollment by selected fields of study. For the less-than-2-year schools, race/ethnicity and gender data were collected for total enrollment.

Status of Data

The Fall Enrollment survey was mailed during September 1986 to 7,669 institutions. After the deletion of institutions that had closed, did not offer postsecondary programs, or were duplicates on the file, the survey consisted of (1) 5,901 4-year, 2-year and public less-than-2-year institutions; and (2) a sample of 1,001 private less-than-2-year institutions that represents the 6,371 such institutions in the IPEDS survey (see table A). Therefore, the enrollment data in this report represent 12,272 postsecondary education institutions.

Response Rates

The overall response rate of 78.7 percent was based on the ratio of the number of completed questionnaires divided by the number of schools remaining in the survey; i.e., the number mailed minus the number determined to be out-of-scope. More detailed response rates by State and higher education status are shown in table 18. The institutional response rate for HEGIS schools is much higher (93 percent) than that of non-HEGIS schools (63 percent). Of institutions responding, 55 percent were 4-year institutions and 38 percent were 2-year institutions. Table 19 is included to show the percentage of enrollment represented by the responding institutions. These institutions actually account for a much higher percentage of total enrollment: 97 percent of students in all postsecondary education institutions, and 98 and 85 percent respectively for HEGIS and non-HEGIS schools.



Imputation

Imputation for nonsampled components was approached in several ways for institutions that did not respond or only provided a partial response to the survey. Because racial/ethnic data were collected in 1984, but not in 1985, data for both years were used in the imputation process. For institutions with valid reports to the HEGIS survey in 1984 but not in 1985, imputations for form and item nonresponse were based on those institutions' 1984 response. For institutions with valid reports to both HEGIS surveys in 1984 and 1985, 1984 item responses were prorated to their 1985 total enrollment. For institutions with valid reports to HEGIS in 1985 but not in 1984, imputation for total enrollment by sex was based on the institution's 1985 report, while racial/ethnic imputations were based on hot deck matching. Hot deck imputation involves substituting individual values drawn from similar responding units. Imputations for schools with no previous HEGIS response were based on hot deck matching to similar institutions that provided valid reports. These matches were selected from stratifications based on sector and State. Sector is based on an institution's control (public, private nonprofit, private for profit) and highest level of offering (4-year, 2-year, less-than-2-year). Further explanation on the imputation process can be found in the documentation.

Data Editing

Survey data were edited for addition errors. Also, data for institutions of higher education were edited for consistency with their previous year's response. When racial/ethnic data did not add to total *nrollment, balance columns were created to represent "race unknown" for each sex. Total lines were computer-generated and compared to the reported totals. If generated totals were more than reported totals and the difference was ±5 percent of the reported total, the generated total replaced the reported total (imputation code = 1); otherwise, institutions were contacted to resolve these discrepancies.



Sample Design

At the time of mailout (September 1986), 7,458 private less-than-2-year institutions constituted the sampling frame. The sampling frame was divided into three strata: (1) institutions that had responded to the 1985-86 IPEDS Institutional Characteristics (IC) Survey; (2) institutions that had not responded; and (3) six institutions of higher education.

The six institutions in stratum 3 were sampled with certainty because they are institutions of higher education and are in the universe of institutions formerly surveyed under the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS). The other two strata were sampled with probability proportionate to the square root of enrollment after adjustments were made for expected response rates.

Sampling Errors

The sampling standard errors for the private less-than-2-year institutions major enrollment statistics for 1986 have been estimated by a procedure called balanced repeated replication. This procedure takes into account the complexities of the sample design and the weighting of institutions. These standard errors enable one to construct confidence intervals. For example, if all possible samples were selected, each being chosen under the same conditions as the current sample, then 95 percent of the intervals from 1.96 standard errors less than the estimate to 1.96 standard errors more than the estimate would include the average result of all possible samples (table B).

Non-sampling Errors

Sample weights for the responding non-HEGIS institutions are produced by adjusting the base weights to account for nonresponse by other institutions in the sector and stratum. The weighting adjustment was used to partially correct for any bias due to nonresponse error. (Bias is the difference, averaged over all possible samples, between the estimated and true value of a quantity.) However, biases will persist to the degree that the responding institutions in a sector and stratum are not representative of the nonresponding institutions. For example, it may be that institutions with large enrollments are more likely to respond than those with small enrollments.

In addition to nonresponse, there are many other potential sources of nonsampling error. These include definitional difficulties, differences in the interpretation of questions, errors by the institutions providing the data, and errors made in recording the data. No measure of the nonsampling error from such sources is currently available.



Students Included in This Report

Included in the report are students enrolled in courses creditable toward a degree or other formal award. Students were included that enrolled in courses that were part of a vocational or occupational program, including those enrolled in off-campus centers. High school students taking regular college courses for credit were also included.

Students Excluded from This Report

- o Students enrolled exclusively in courses not creditable toward a formal award:
- o Students exclusively auditing classes;
- o Students studying abroad (e.g., at a foreign university) if their enrollment at this institution is only an administrative record and the fee is only nominal; and
- o Students in any branch campus located in a foreign country.

Glossary of Key Terms

Level of institution

- (1) <u>Four-year-and-above institution</u>. Institutions with a primary purpose of providing postsecondary education and award at least a baccalaureate or higher degree in one or more programs.
- (2) Two-but-less-than-4-year institution. Institutions with a primary purpose of providing postsecondary education and confer at least a 2-year formal award (certificate or associate degree), or have a 2-year program that is creditable toward a baccalaureate or higher degree in one or more programs, but do not award a baccalaureate degree.
- (3) <u>Less-than-2-year institution</u>. Institutions with a primary purpose of providing postsecondary education, and its programs are less than 2 years in duration and result in a terminal occupational award, or are creditable toward a formal 2-year or higher award.



<u>Degree-seeking students</u>. Students enrolled in courses for credit who are recognized by the institution as seeking a degree or formal award. At the undergraduate level, this is intended to include students enrolled in vocational or occupational programs.

Non-degree-seeking students. Students enrolled in courses for credit who are not recognized by the institution as seeking a degree or formal award.

<u>Postsecondary education</u>. Formal instructional programs with a curriculum designed primarily for students who have completed the requirements for a high school diploma or equivalent. This includes programs of an academic, vocational and continuing professional education purpose, and excludes avocational and adult basic education programs.

Cautionary Notes

The definitions and instructions for compiling IPEDS data have been designed to minimize comparability problems. However, postsecondary institutions differ widely among themselves. As a result of these differences, comparisons of data provided by individual institutions may be misleading.

U.S. Service Schools enrollments are included in State totals, except in table 7.

Students whose race/ethnicity was unknown or unreported are shown only in the total columns. Therefore, detail will not add to the totals shown.
