ABSTRACT

The information reported in this document characterizes libraries in California through statistical tables, profiling each library within the appropriate library type (public, academic, special, state agency, and county law). The data were gathered through the annual report forms for fiscal year 1985-1986 that were returned by 967 libraries of an estimated total of 1,200 California libraries (not counting school libraries). Presented in the statistical tables are data on activities (interlibrary loans borrowed and lent, circulation, total volumes, etc.), income, expenditures, staffing, and collections. These data are organized by library type and area population. Also provided is a state summary of library statistics for the current year, plus two preceding years, and figures from 1977-78--the watershed year before Proposition 13--which include total operating expenditures and salaries; library materials; full-time staff equivalents; total volumes; circulation; interlibrary loan borrowing and lending; and total number of reference questions answered during the year. A list of the libraries represented concludes this report. (CGD)

State Summar, of Library Statistics

Each year the State Library sends annual report forms to California's academic, public, special, state agency and county law libraries. Statistical data from those reports are tabulated in this publication, with directory listings published in the companion volume, California Library Directory. Although the statistics program and these publications are promoted as widely as we can, participation for most is voluntary (public libraries are required by the Education Code to report annually to the State Librarian) and some choose not to do so. This makes the state summary less than complete. Libraries failing to return the report form two years in a row are dropped from the free publications distribution list. Beginning in 1986, California is cooperating with the Center for Education Statistics and the American Library Association Office for Research in the nationwide collection of uniform library statistical data. The California Public Library Report, and this statistics compilation, have been modified accordingly.

For fiscal year 1985-1986 we have reports from 967 libraries. We estimate there are at least 1,200 libraries in operation in California, exclusive of school libraries, so data in these publications are about 80% complete. By type of library, the number reporting are:

169 public libraries with 2,989 public service outlets. By jurisdictions, there are 43 county, 106 city, eight combined city-county, and 12 district public libraries. By level of service, there are:

163 main libraries. Administrative headquarters are not included, and some county or district libraries have no main library.

575 branch libraries. A branch is an extension library open some part of each of five days a week, has at least 1,400 square feet of floor space, a general book collection of at least 7,000 volumes, and is staffed with the equivalent of at least one librarian and one clerical employee during hours open for service.

382 library stations. A station is a library structure smaller than a branch, providing a lower level of service.

1,869 mobile library stops. A mobile library stop is a location visited by a bookmobile or other traveling library. There are 80 mobile libraries in operation this year.

Combining main, branch and station figures, there are 1,120 fixed public library outlets.

Emeryville and Piedmont are included with Oakland.
Glenn County is served by Orland and Willows city libraries.
Hillsborough is served by Burlingame and San Mateo city libraries.
Mariposa Co. is included with Tuolumne Co.
Santa Barbara Co. is served by the three city libraries of Lompoc,
Santa Barbara and Santa Maria.
Sierra Co. is included with Plumas Co.

In the State Summary table that follows, the current year plus the two preceding years are shown as usual. The State Library continues to receive requests for information about the effects on libraries of Proposition 13, the tax limitation Constitutional amendment of 1978. Rather than show one additional year preceding the present, we republish instead the figures for 1977-78, the watershed year before Proposition 13.

Total operating expend. Total operating expenditure, in thousands of dollars. Includes materials, salaries, operations, contract services, transfers and payments. Excludes capital outlay.

Salaries. Expenditure for staff salaries and benefits, in thousands of dollars. A subtotal of total operating expenditure above.

Library materials. Expenditure for all library materials: books, periodicals, microforms, audiovisual materials, in thousands of dollars. Excludes supplies, binding and materials leased on contract. A subtotal of total operating expenditure above.

Staff FTE. Total number of persons employed, professional and support, expressed in full-time equivalent (FTE). Full-time is normally 40 hours per week, but not less than 36.

Total volumes. Total count of volumes held at end of fiscal year, June 30, in thousands.

Circulation. Total annual out-of-building circulation, all materials, all units, in thousands.

ILL borrow. Number of items borrowed by reporting library on inter-library loan from other libraries, in thousands. Includes photocopies sent in lieu of ILL.

ILL lent. Number of items lent by reporting library on interlibrary loan to other libraries, in thousands. Includes photocopies sent in lieu of ILL.

Reference. Annual total of questions answered by reporting library, in thousands: questions, readers assistance, bibliographies, research projects, data base searches. Includes activities requiring use of library collections and services and/or training and experience of staff, but not simple directional questions.

Public Library Systems

California's 15 cooperative public library systems are organized under the California Library Services Act (CLSA), most as joint powers agencies. They are governed by Administrative Councils made up of the directors of the member public libraries, aided by System Advisory Boards representing the public served. Most systems employ a Coordinator/-Director and support staff. They maintain a communications system of telephone and, typically, electronic mail, direct distance dial units, or TWX. Either through system vans or by contract with member libraries, they provide regular delivery service or exchange of materials. One or more system reference centers, housed in the larger libraries, are supported for second level referral of questions individual libraries are unable to answer. Systems are supported by a combination of local membership fees and reimbursements, state CLSA program grants, and project awards of federal Library Services and Construction Act (LSCA) funds. Most systems have associated intertype library networks or affiliated academic and special library members.

Systems: members. Short name of system and number of public library members.

Population. Combined population estimate for January 1, reporting year of system member public libraries.

Area sq. mi. Combined service area in square miles of system member public libraries.

Reference questions. Questions handled by system level reference centers. As referrals, the count duplicates a portion of the reference count of member libraries.

Messages sent. Number of messages sent by system telecommunications.

Items delivered. Count of items exchanged through system delivery services.

Miles driven. Number of miles driven by system delivery vehicles.

Reference expenditure. CLSA allowance for provision of system reference services. Includes staff, materials and operations.

C & D expenditure. CLSA allowance for system telecommunications and for maintenance of system delivery service.

SAB expenditure. CLSA allowance to support the System Advisory Board (SAB), typically including travel, postage and office supplies.

CLSA Program allowances. Total state award to the system under the CLSA funded programs listed.

LSCA Program grants. System administration is a CLSA component not presently funded under the Act. To aid systems in a demonstration of the costs of planning, coordinating and evaluating the CLSA programs, awards of federal LSCA funds have been made.

Total system programs. Expenditure for reporting year from CLSA, LSCA, local and other funds for all programs of the system. Estimates for current year from system budgets.

Public Libraries

California's 169 public libraries are departments of local government: city, county and special district. They vary widely in size and strength, from the City of Vernon with 90 residents to Los Angeles with more than 3 million, and cover the state with a network of branch libraries, bookmobiles and other extension services. Most participate in cooperative library systems comprising all the public libraries in a county, or several adjacent counties, offering equal access and sharing of resources among all residents. Address listings may be found in the companion volume, California Library Directory.

Public libraries are grouped into six categories by size of population served:

Group 1	over 500,000 population
Group 2	100,000 to 500,000 population
Group 3	50,000 to 100,000 population
Group 4	25,000 to 50,000 population
Group 5	12,500 to 25,000 population
Group 6	under 12,500 population

Population. Population served by the library jurisdiction, estimate for January 1, 1986, certified by the State Library. Figures are drawn from the Population Research Unit of the State Department of Finance and are intended to represent as accurately as possible the actual number of persons served and taxed for service, with no persons counted twice or credited to more than one library. Many county libraries are not credited with the entire county population, for their boundaries contain cities or districts independently supplying service. District libraries typically serve an unincorporated area larger than their central city. A few municipal libraries serve unincorporated county areas under contract with the county.

Borrowers. Number of persons registered with the library for circulation and other services. May exceed the certified population of the library jurisdiction, in which case the larger borrowers figure is used in computing per capita.

Building outlets. Number of fixed building outlets providing public library service. This includes a main library, branch libraries, and library stations but not an administrative headquarters providing no public service.

Branch is an extension library open some part of each of five days a week, has at least 1,400 sq. ft. of floor space, a general book collection of at least 7,000 volumes, and is staffed with the equivalent of at least one librarian and one clerical employee during the hours open for service.

Station is a library structure smaller than a branch, providing a lower level of service.

Total outlets. Total of fixed building outlets plus the number of stops by any mobile library (bookmobile, trailer, van, etc.) operated by the library.

Area sq. mi. Area of jurisdiction served by library in square miles.

Expenditure per capita. Total operating expenditure expressed as per capita. Annual report line, "Total Operating Expenditure", for the reporting year is added to line, "Estimate of services ... not charged to library budget". This sum is divided by the population served.

Circulation per capita. Total circulation of all materials is divided by the population served.

Reference per capita. Total reference transactions is divided by the population served.

Table 2, "Income"

Operating income. Total income available for operating expenses (not capital outlay), the sum of local, state and federal sources and transfer from reserves or beginning balance.

Capital outlay. Income for capital outlay items, including sites, buildings, vehicles and equipment over \$200.

Special District. Amount from Special District Augmentation funds available to counties and special districts.

Not charged. Estimate of services and supplies benefiting library for reporting year expended by another city or county unit, not charged to library budget. Amount is included for facility maintenance and administration allowed in PLF Certification if not in library budget.

Total income. Total income available for operating expenses and capital outlay.

Local revenue appropriated. Local revenue appropriated for the year by the jurisdiction, as reported on the Public Library Fund Certification, on October 31. Possible later changes in appropriation are not considered. This figure is not derived from the Public Library Report. (Note that through inclusion on the PLF Certification of amount for facility maintenance and administration, even though not included in library budget, the figure for Local Revenue Appropriated may in some cases be larger than that for Total Operating Income.)

State allocations: CLSA. State funds allocated to the jurisdiction under the California Library Services Act for transaction based reimbursements.

State allocations: PLF. State funds allocated to the jurisdiction under the Public Library Fund.

Table 3, "Expenditure"

Library materials. Expenditure for all library materials: books, periodicals, microforms, audiovisual materials. Excludes supplies, binding and materials leased on contract.

Salaries, benefits. Expenditure for staff salaries and benefits of administration and library service personnel. Excludes maintenance staff paid from budget.

Total operating. Materials, salaries, operations, contract services, transfers, payments. Excludes capital outlay and transfer to reserves.

Capital outlay. Expenditure for capital outlay items: equipment over \$200, sites, buildings, remodeling, vehicles, etc.

Grand total expenditure. Operating expenditure plus capital outlay and allocation to reserve.

Table 4, "Staffing"

Staff count. Total count of persons employed full-time and part-time, paid from library budget, as of June 30, reporting year. Number cannot be a fraction.

Librarian FTE. Number of persons working as Librarian, with MLS degree or equivalent, expressed in full-time equivalent (FTE). Full-time is normally 40 hours per week, but not less than 36. Includes library director.

Support FTE. Number of persons working in support staff positions, ie, library technical assistant, clerk-typist, etc., expressed in full-time equivalent (FTE). Includes student pages and all part-time help. Does not include staff provided by contract or local government, or maintenance and security staff.

Total FTE. Total full-time equivalent of all persons paid from library budget, excluding contract, maintenance and security staff..

Volunteer FTE. Full-time weekly equivalent of persons volunteering unpaid service in library.

Salary ranges. Monthly salary ranges, beginning step - final step, of positions surveyed, as of September 30, current year.

Table 5, "Collections"

Volumes added. Unit count of volumes added during the fiscal year, gross number not adjusted for discards. Includes bound serials and continuations.

Titles added. Count of individual new titles added during the fiscal year.

Volumes held. Unit count of all volumes held at end of fiscal year, June 30.

Documents. Unit count of documents, if counted as separate collection. Documents included in the volume total are not counted twice.

Microforms. Unit count of microfilm reels, microfiche sheets, microcards.

Audio. Count of audiorecord titles held, including cassettes, phonorecords, talking books and other sound recordings.

Film. Count of motion picture titles held, all formats.

Video. Count of videorecord titles held, including tapes and discs.

Periodicals. Number of periodical titles currently received. Includes magazines, newspapers, loose leaf services. Excludes bound serials and continuations treated as books.

Hours annual. Total number of public service hours annually, all units

Total circulation. Total annual out of building circulation, all materials, all units.

Library programs. Number of library sponsored information and cultural programs for the public.

Reference. Annual total of questions handled by reporting library. Includes activities requiring use of library collections and/or training and experience of staff, but not simple directional questions. Counts negative response that is satisfactory to patron as an answered question.

ILL lent. Number of items lent by reporting library on interlibrary loan to other libraries. Includes photocopies sent in lieu of ILL.

ILL borrow. Number of items borrowed by reporting library on interlibrary loan from other libraries. Includes photocopies sent in lieu of ILL.

ILR answer. Number of information requests answered for other libraries.

ILR sent. Number of information requests sent to other libraries.

ILL borrow. Number of items borrowed by reporting library on inter-library loan from other libraries. Includes photocopies sent in lieu of ILL.

ILL lent. Number of items lent by reporting library on interlibrary loan to other libraries. Includes photocopies sent in lieu of ILL.

Reference. Annual total of questions answered by reporting library. Includes activities requiring use of library collections and/or training and experience of staff, but not simple directional questions. Counts negative response that is satisfactory to patron as an answered question.

Volumes added. Unit count of volumes added during the fiscal year, gross number not adjusted for discards. Includes bound serials and continuations.

Volumes held. Unit count of all volumes held at end of fiscal year, June 30.

Documents, pamphlets. Unit count of documents (separate from books), items in pamphlet or information file. Documents included in the volume total are not counted twice.

Microforms. Unit count of microfilm reels, microfiche sheets, micro-cards.

Periodicals. Number of periodical titles currently received. Includes magazines, newspapers, loose leaf services. Excludes bound serials and continuations treated as books.

Maps. Unit count of maps and charts.

Films. Title count of moving pictures, all speeds and reel sizes.

Video. Title count of videorecordings, all speeds and formats.

Audio. Title count of audiorecordings, disc and tape, all speeds and formats.
