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ABSTRACT

Data on 102 historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) collected through three annual surveys of academic science and engineering (S/E) resources are presented. Twenty-three tables are derived from: the Survey of Scientific and Engineering Expenditures at Universities and Colleges (tables 1-4); the Survey of Federal Support to Universities, Colleges, and Nonprofit Institutions (tables 5-10); and the Survey of Graduate Science and Engineering Students and Postdoctorates (tables 11-23). The tables include the following: total and federally financed research and development expenditures at HBCUs fiscal years 1984-87; federal obligations to HBCUs ranked in descending order of total amount received fiscal year 1987; S/E graduate students in HBCUs by field, type of control, and enrollment status 1987; full-time S/E graduate students in HBCUs by field type and major support 1987; male and female S/E graduate students in HBCUs by field 1980-87; graduate S/E enrollment in HBCUs by field 1987; full- and part-time S/E graduate students in HBCUs by field 1980-87; and summary of responses from all departments at all HBCUs fall 1987. GENERAL NOTES

This report presents data on 102 historically black colleges and universities (HBCU's). These data were collected and published by the National Science Foundation's Division of Science Resources Studies through three annual surveys of academic science and engineering (S/E) resources.

Tables 1 through 4 are derived from the **Survey of Scientific and Engineering Expenditures at Universities and Colleges**. This survey is conducted annually and covers a sample of 403 institutions of higher education that grant a graduate science or engineering degree and/or perform at least \$50,000 in separately-budgeted research and development expenditures. Tables 1 through 4 include the 30 historically black colleges and universities that fall within these requirements, whether the institution had R&D expenditures or not.

The term "separately budgeted research and development expenditures" refers to current fund expenditures designed to achieve specific research goals that are sponsored either by an external agency to an institution or are separately budgeted by an internal unit within an institution. The term "expenditures" differs from the Federal accounting term "obligations" in that expenditures are monies actually spent by an institution during its own fiscal year; obligations are funds awarded by Federal agencies to the institution during the Federal fiscal year, regardless of when the recipient academic institution spends the funds.

Tables 5 through 10 are derived from the **Survey of Federal Support to Universities, Colleges and Nonprofit Institutions**. This survey is conducted annually and collects data on Federal obligations to universities and colleges from 15 agencies that provide direct support in both S/E and non S/E activities to higher education institutions. There are 102 HBCU's listed in tables 5 through 10.

The **Survey of Federal Support to Universities, Colleges and Nonprofit Institutions** describes academic S/E activities which are defined as follows:

1. Research and development includes all research activities, both basic and applied, and all development activities that are supported at academic institutions. "Research" is systematic study directed toward fuller scientific knowledge of the subject studied. "Development" is the systematic use of knowledge and understanding gained from research directed toward the production of useful materials, devices, systems, or methods, including design and development of prototypes and processes.

2. R&D plant includes all costs -- direct, indirect, and related -- of all projects whose main objective is to provide support for the construction, acquisition, renovation, modification, repair, or rental of facilities, land, works, or equipment for use in S/E research and development. A facility is interpreted broadly to be any physical resource important to the conduct of research and development.

3. Facilities and equipment for instruction in the sciences/engineering includes all programs whose main purpose is to provide support for the construction, acquisition, renovation, modification, repair, or rental of facilities, land, works, or equipment for use in instruction in science and engineering.

4. Fellowships, traineeships, and training grants includes graduate programs in support of the development and maintenance of S/E personnel resources.

5. General support for science/engineering includes programs that support nonspecific or generalized purposes related to scientific research and education.

6. Other S/E activities includes all other obligations excluded from the six categories defined above but which represents direct funding (excluding loans) from a Federal agency to an academic institution for activities or purposes not specifically related to science and engineering.

Tables 11 through 23 are derived from the **Survey of Graduate Science and Engineering Students and Postdoctorates**. This survey is conducted annually and collects data from 618 graduate institutions offering courses of study at the post-baccalaureate level in any science or engineering field. There are 22 historically black colleges and universities included in this survey.
