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ABSTRACT

This fact book provides tables and charts showing fiscal year 1988 and longitudinal data on Catonsville Community College (CCC). 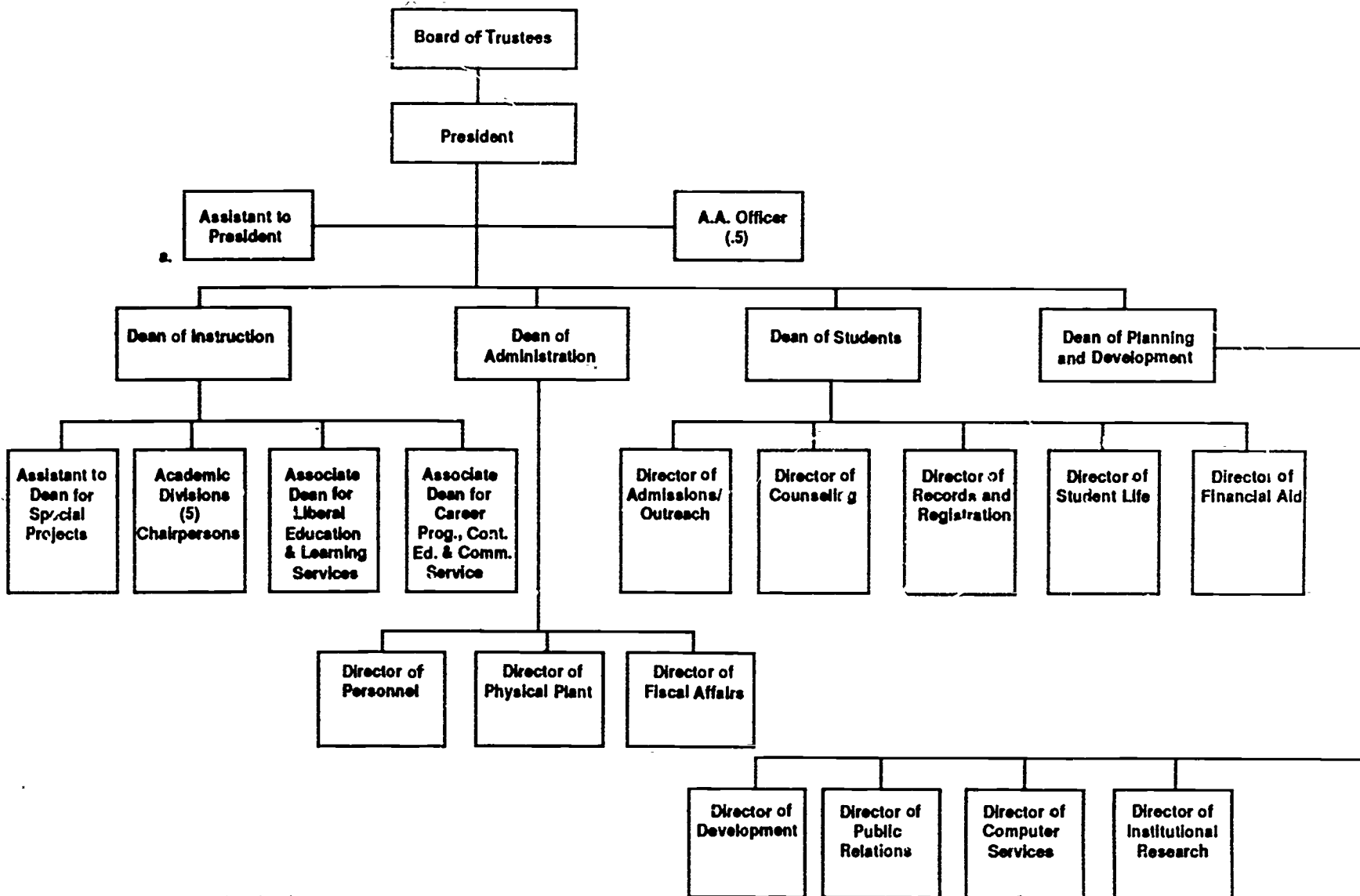
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College Objectives

Below are listed the major objectives for CCC as presented to the Board of Trustees in September, 1988.

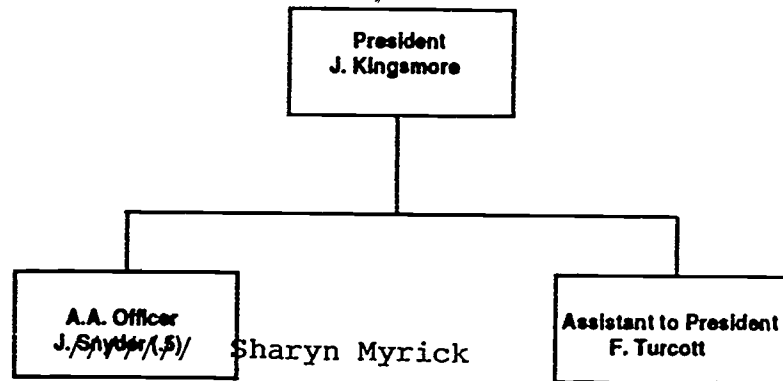
1. Maintain the excellent morale and sense of commitment of the professional and classified staffs.
2. Continue to monitor the land development adjacent to the College and make necessary recommendations to the Board of Trustees.
3. Oversee renovations and facilities made vacant by the addition to the Student Services Building and make sure they are effectively used by students.
4. Prepare a follow-up report of the College's response to literacy issues to assess the level of adult literacy activity and its success.
5. Extend enrollment of faculty beyond registration advisement into a regular system of student-faculty connections, especially in the liberal arts areas.
6. Assess whether designated staff should be assigned to the growing minority populations on campus.
7. Monitor closely the effects of the new assessment policy for fairness, validity, impact on service, enrollment, and student success.
8. Prepare a follow-up report on reading and writing across the curriculum efforts.
9. Examine funding provisions and alternatives for services to the handicapped with special attention to the levels of funding for readers, interpreters, and tutors.
10. Examine and support policy initiatives which foster minority student outreach and retention.
11. Continue to develop partnerships with Baltimore County and Carroll County Public Schools.
12. Create a plan for the development of technical studies curricula at Carroll Community College.
13. Develop a business and industry outreach initiative at Carroll.
14. Produce a plan for measuring institutional effectiveness which will be consistent with SBHE guidelines.
15. Improve quality and productivity of print shop services.
16. Increase level of funding from outside sources.
17. Update and revise Staff Benefits Handbook.
18. Initiate and support the Center for Teaching Excellence.

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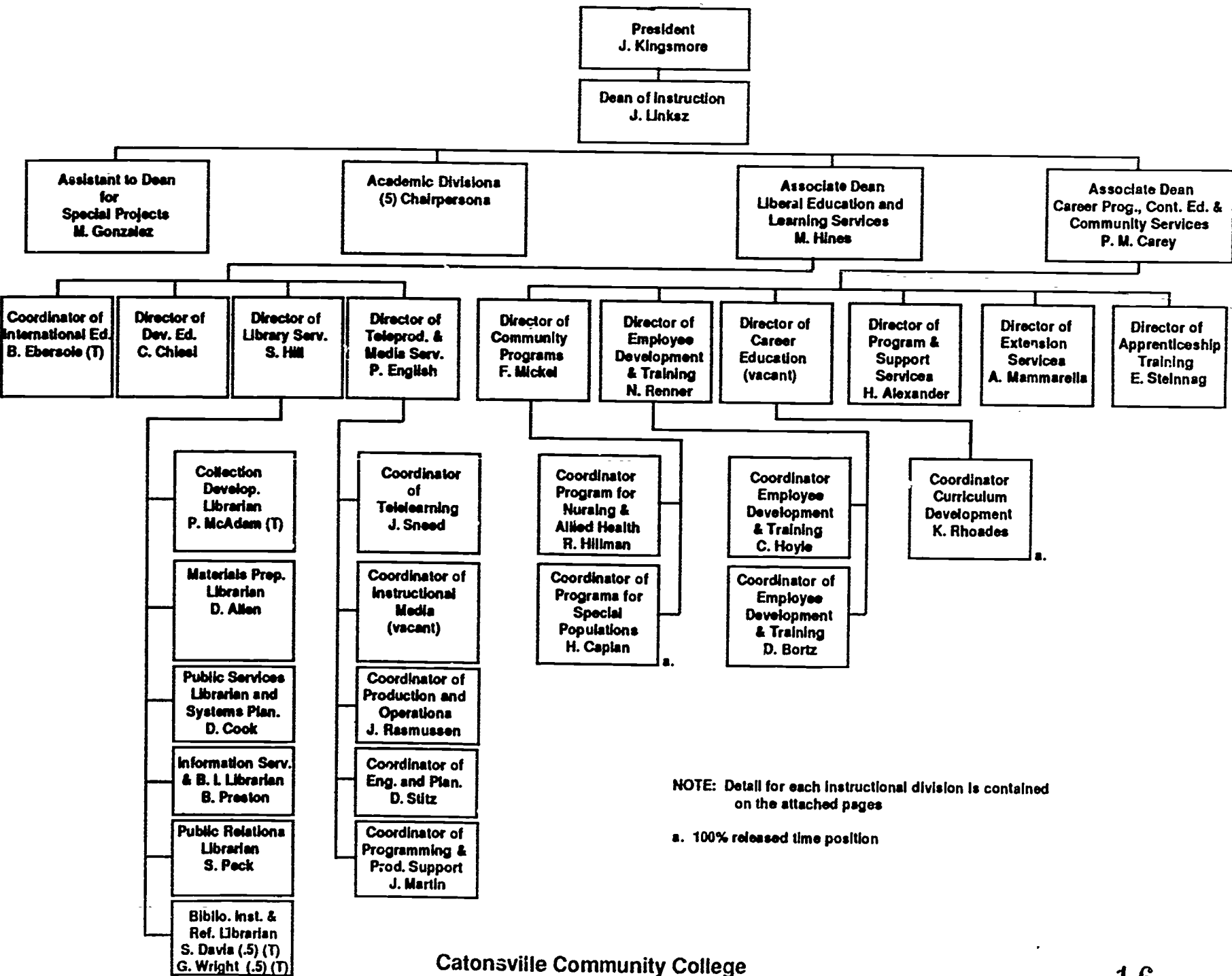

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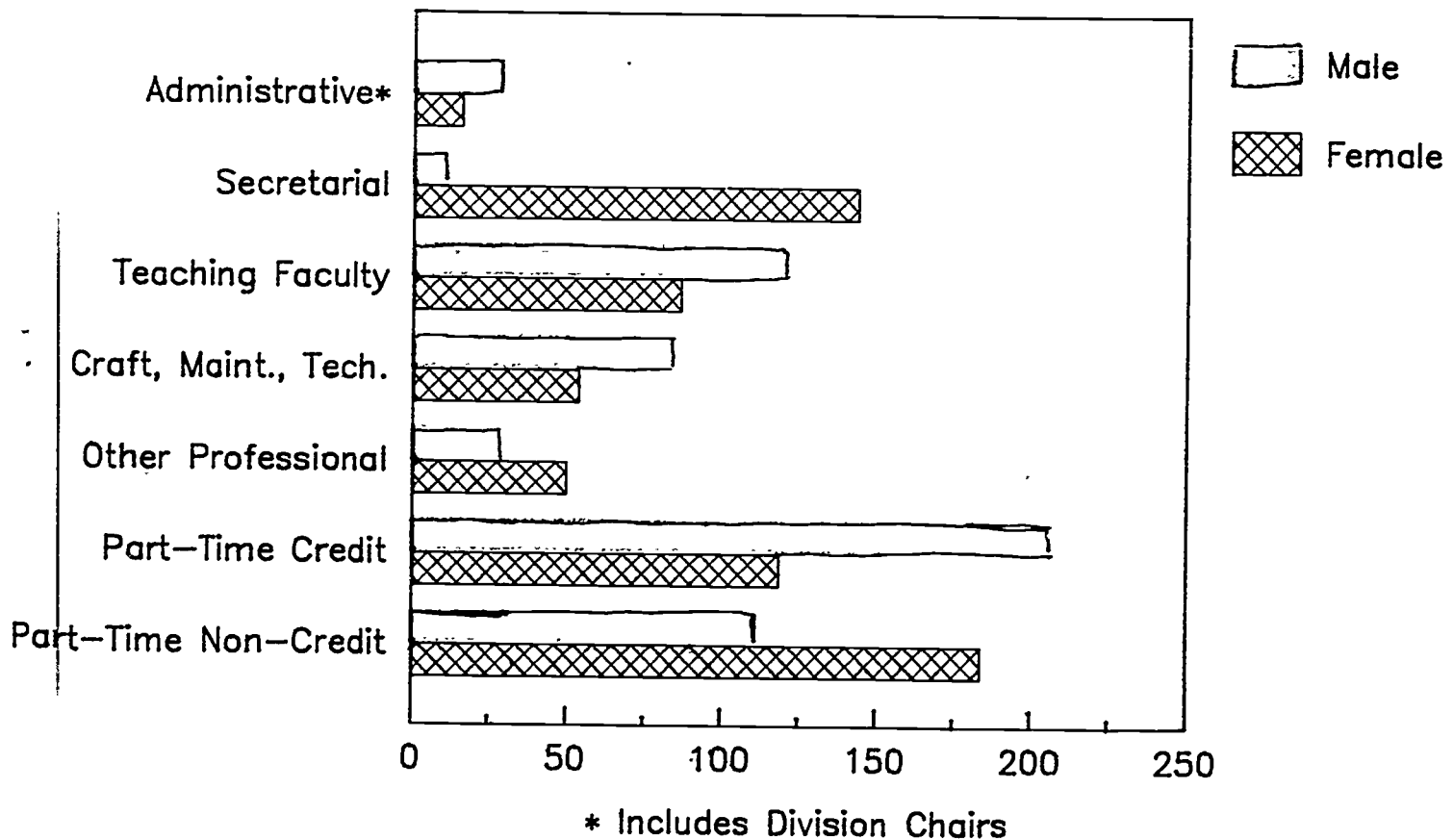

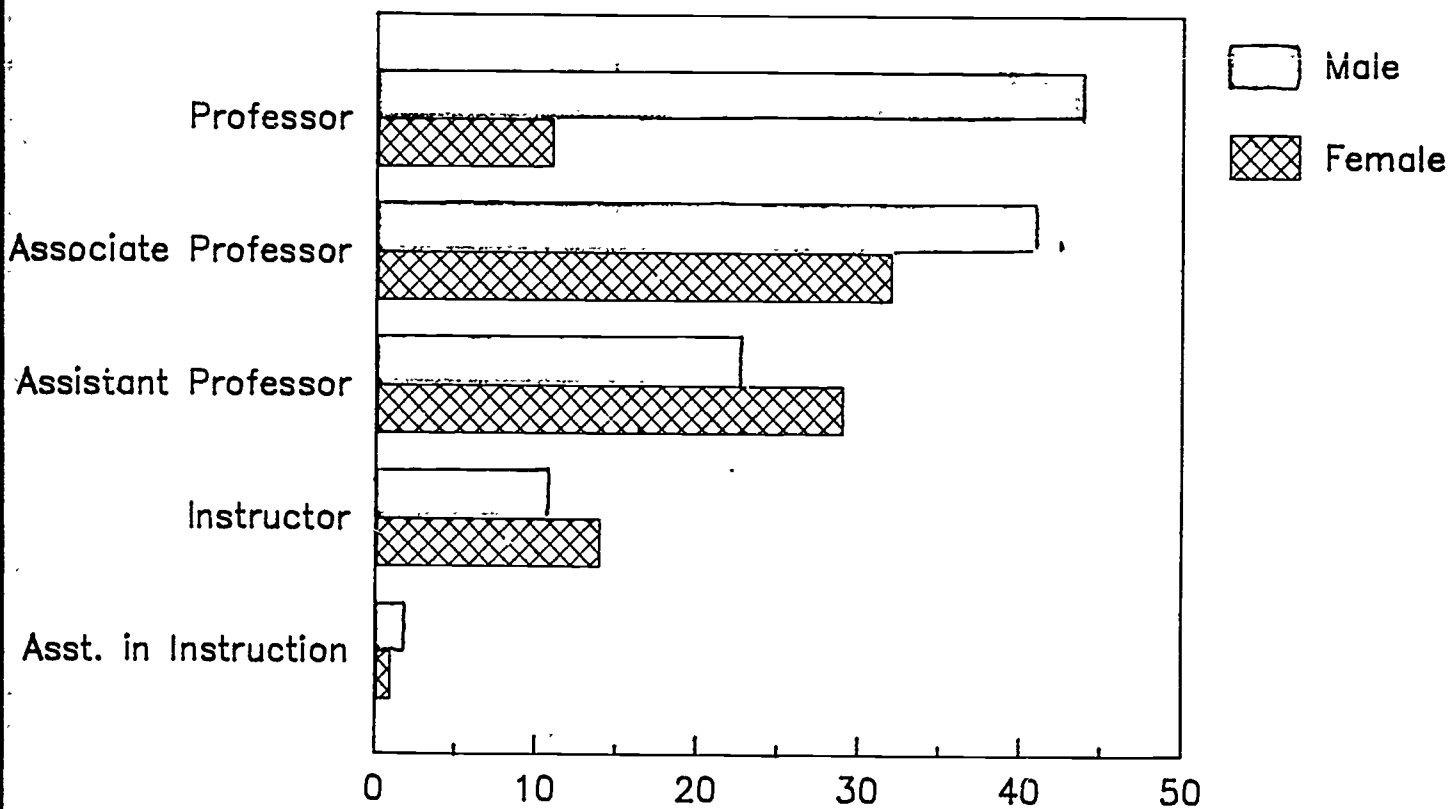

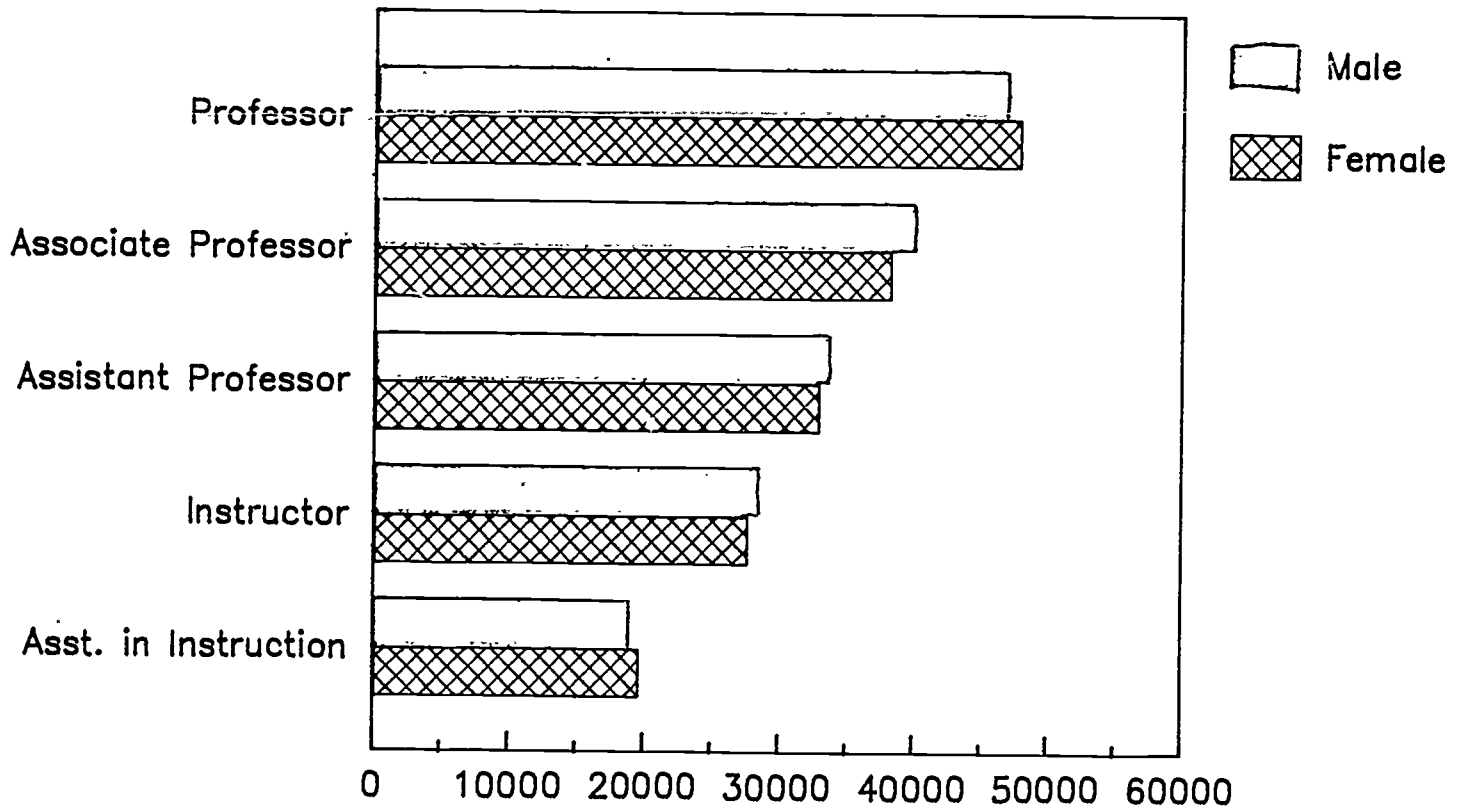

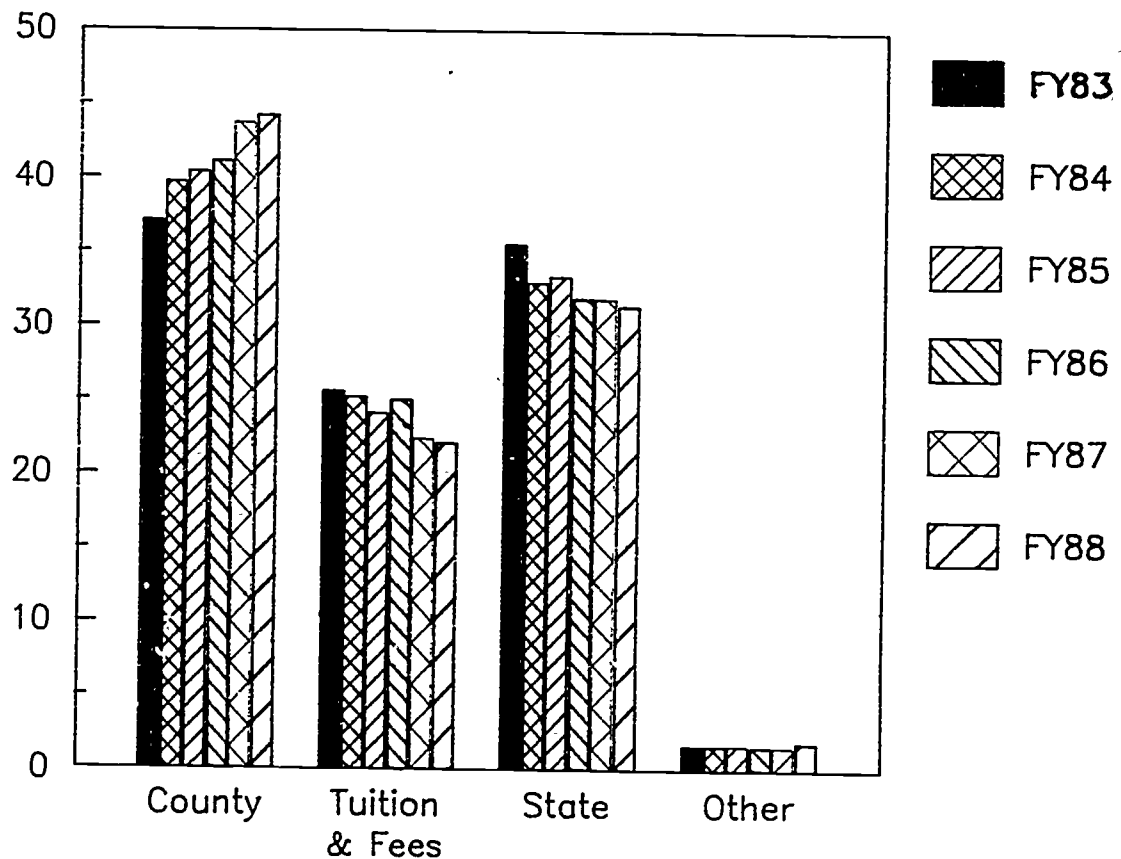
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Budget History – Revenue Source Catonsville Community College

Percentage of Revenue



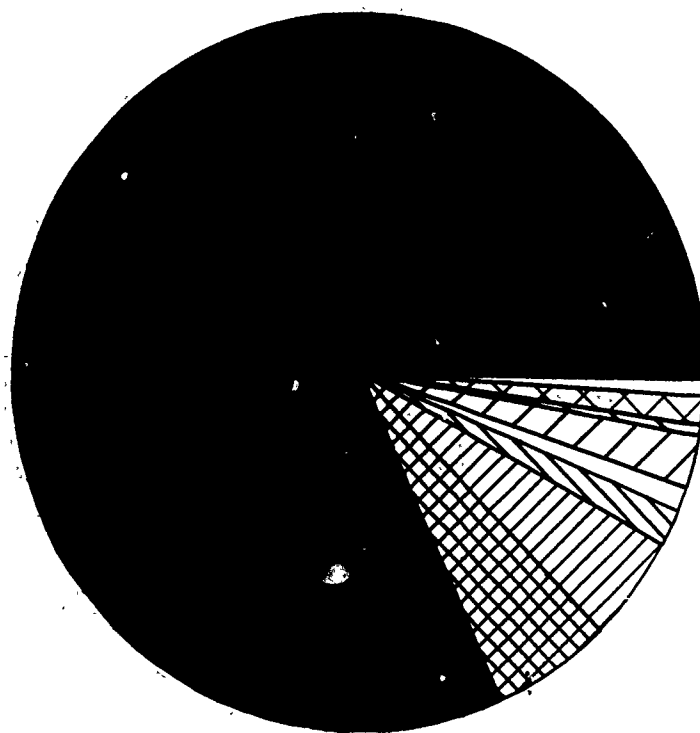

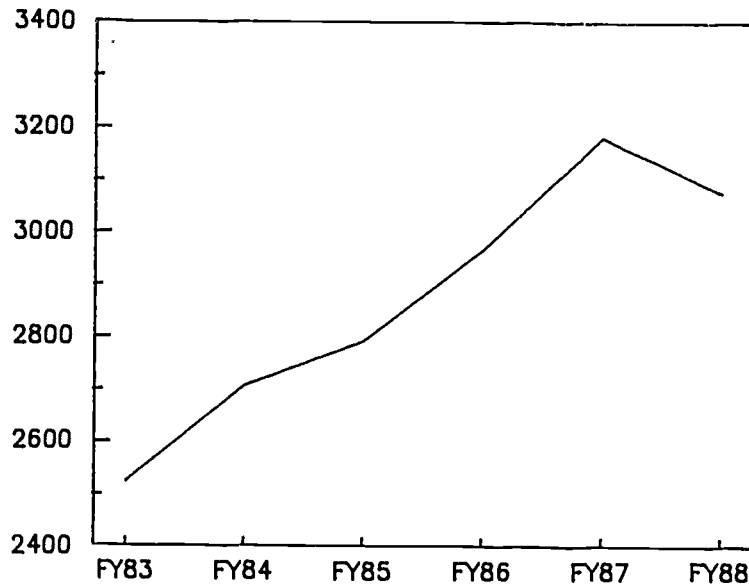

Budget Expenditures by Function – FY88

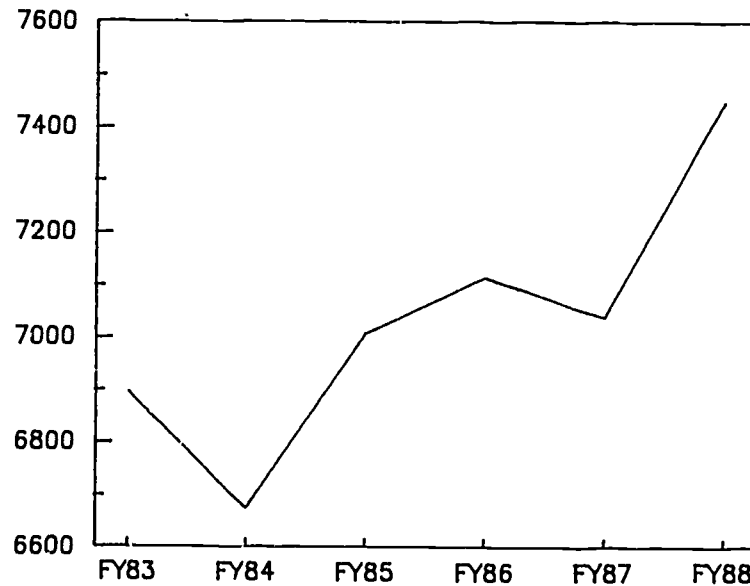

Enrollment is 9533 -- a 7.5% increase from last fall's 8871 students. FTE is 2118, which is an 8.4% increase over the fall of 1987.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

Women students comprise 52% of the student body. Minority students decreased in percentage to 20.1% from 22.0% of the student body last year, but increased in headcount, with the percent of black students decreasing to 16.5%.

Baltimore County residents comprise 69.3% of the students while the percent of students from Anne Arundel declined and from Howard increased.

The average age increased slightly from 29.4 to 29.9. About a third (33.6%) of the students are over 30 -- 36.7% of the women and 30.4% of the men. The number of seniors increased from 466 last year to 512 this fall and comprises 5.7% of the students.

More than half (56.7%) of our new students (new to college) who responded indicate their educational goal is an A.A. degree, 17.8% are pursuing a certificate, and 25.5% plan to take courses without working toward a degree or certificate.

Over two-fifths of the new students indicated their reason for attending CCC was to prepare for transfer (43.8%), and 16.2% were preparing for immediate entry into a career (down from 17.1% last fall),

ENROLLMENT CHARACTERISTICS

Numbers of new and transfer students increased slightly -- to 33.8% of the student body -- up from 33.2% last fall.

Average credit hours rose slightly to 6.7 per student. Full-time students average 13.4 and part-time students average 4.8.

The number of full-time enrollments rose from 1945 to 2146 -- a 10.3% increase.

Students taking only night classes outnumber students taking only day classes -- 43% to 41%; 17% of our students take classes both day and evening. The number of day student enrollments increased more than evening student enrollments; in terms of percents, night only enrollment has decreased to 42.8%.

PROGRAM CHARACTERISTICS

Enrollment in career programs decreased slightly to 45%; students majoring in General Studies comprise 40% of the total population; and 16% are enrolled in the other five state authorized transfer programs (Arts and Sciences, Engineering, Business Administration, Teacher Education, Computer Science).

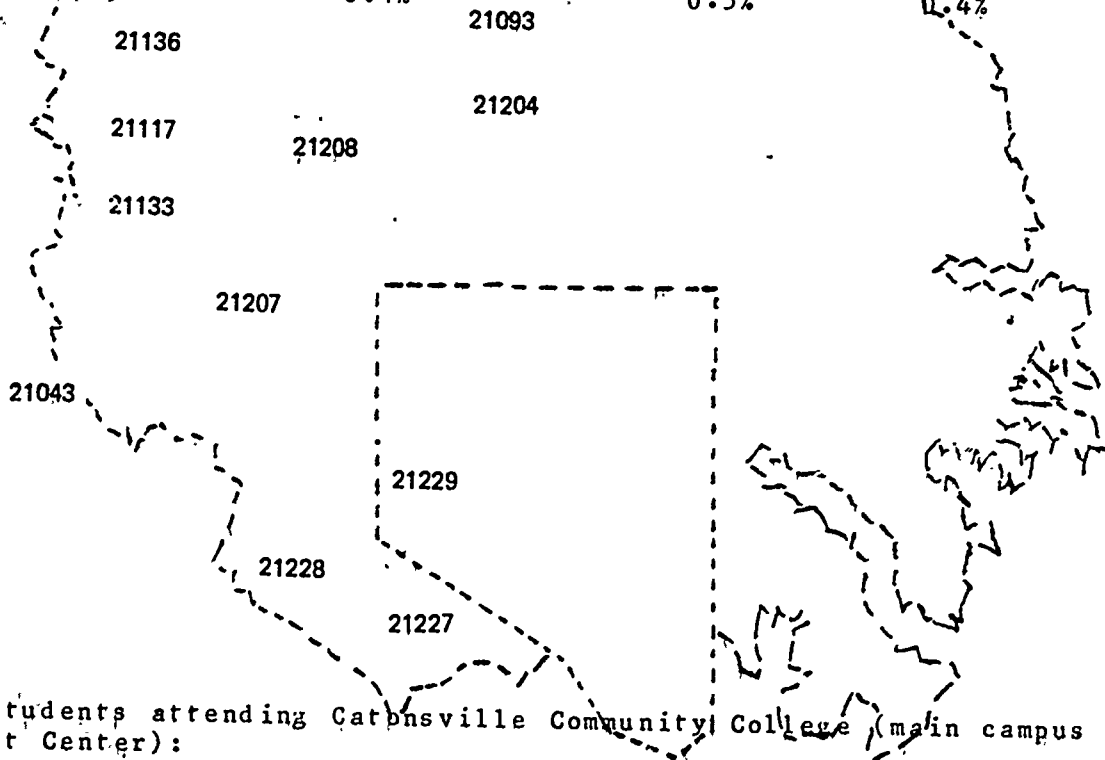

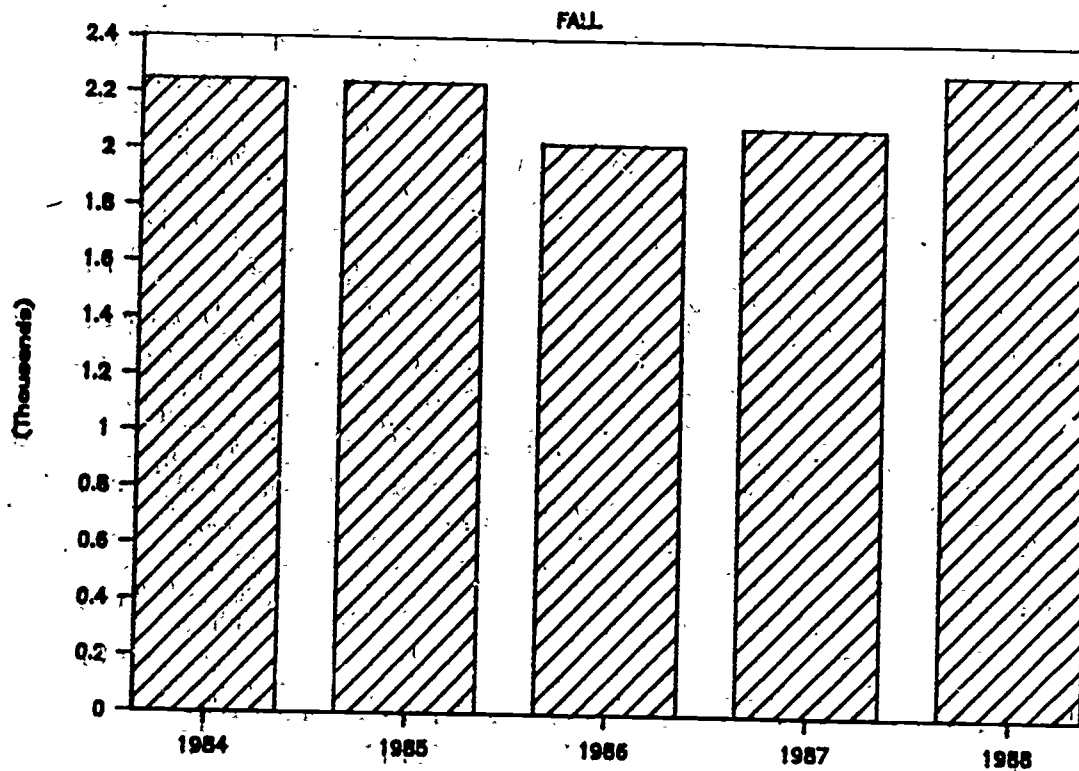

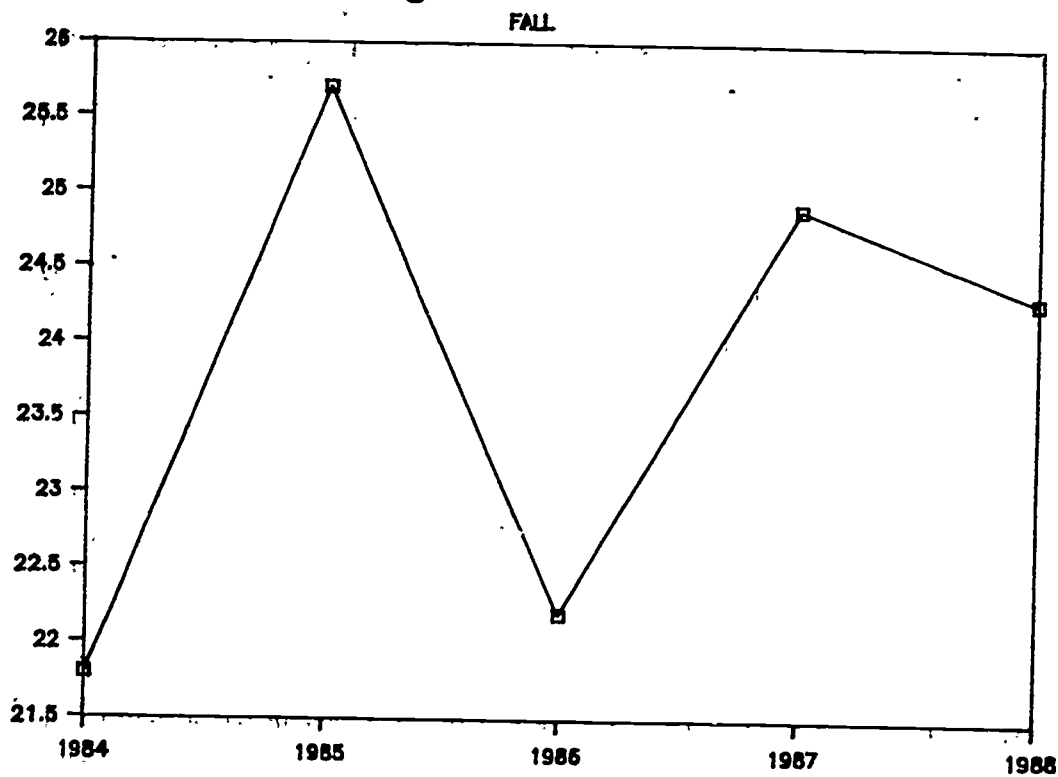

Mean Age - New Students





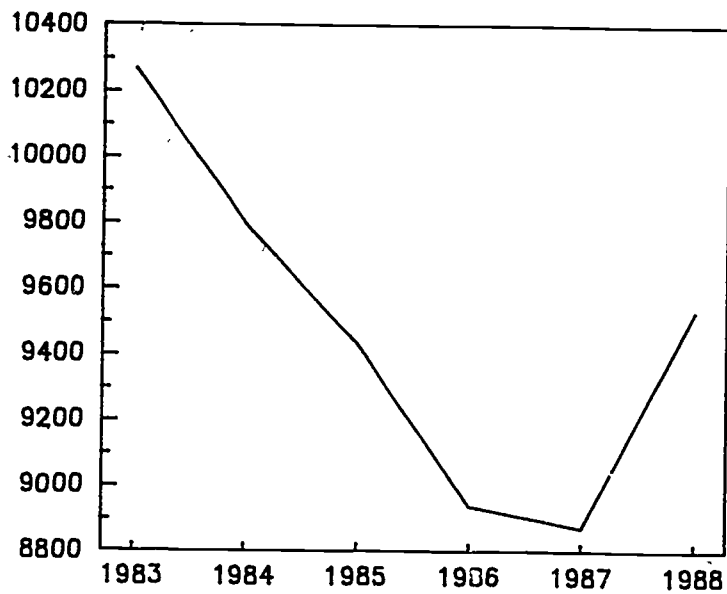

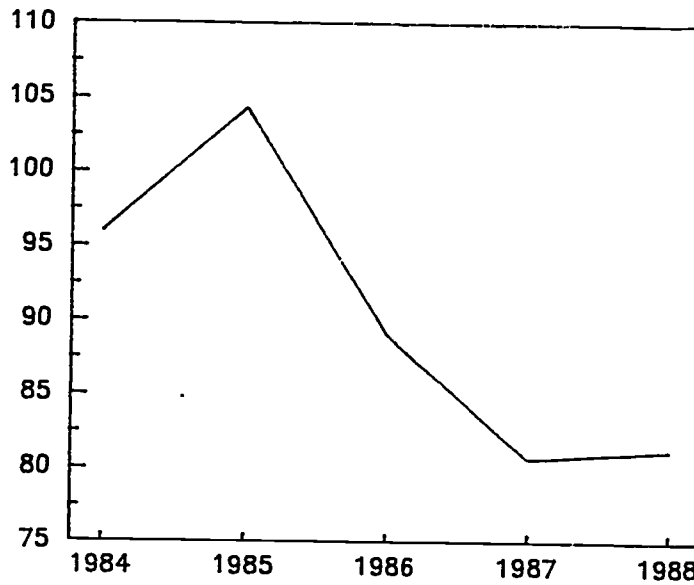

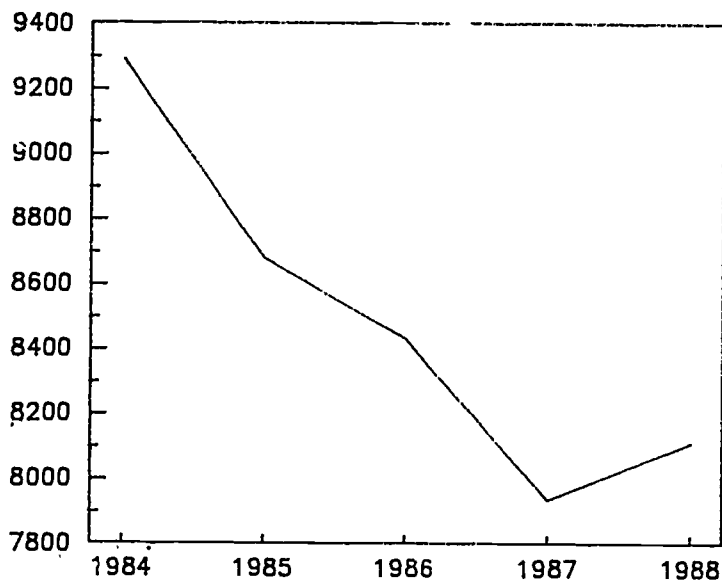

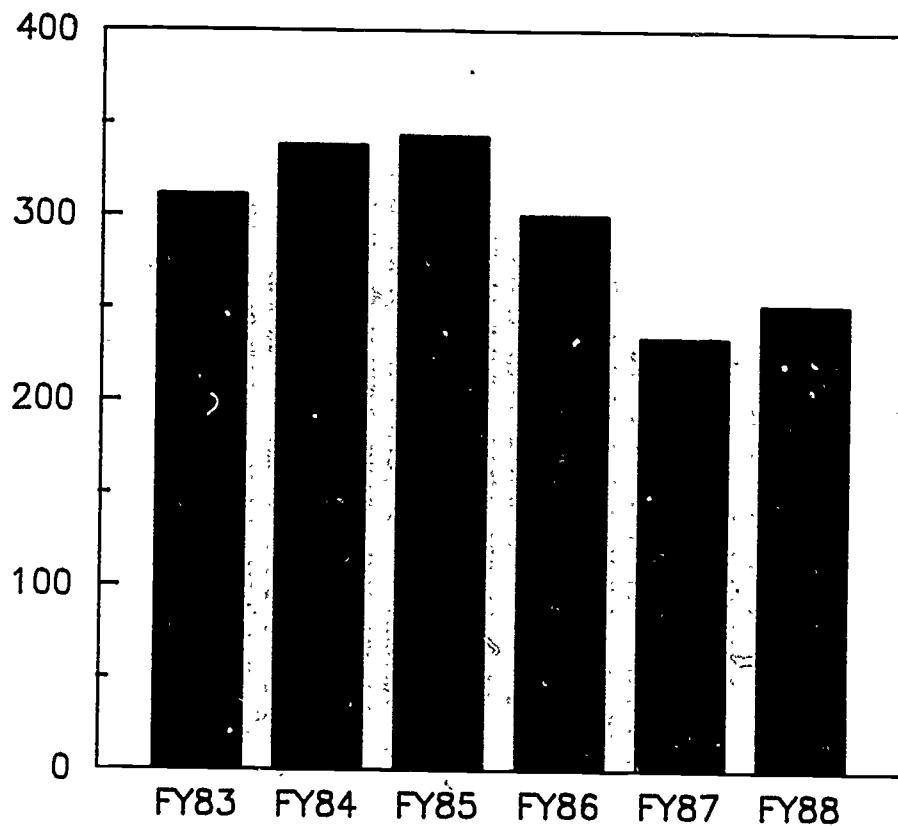

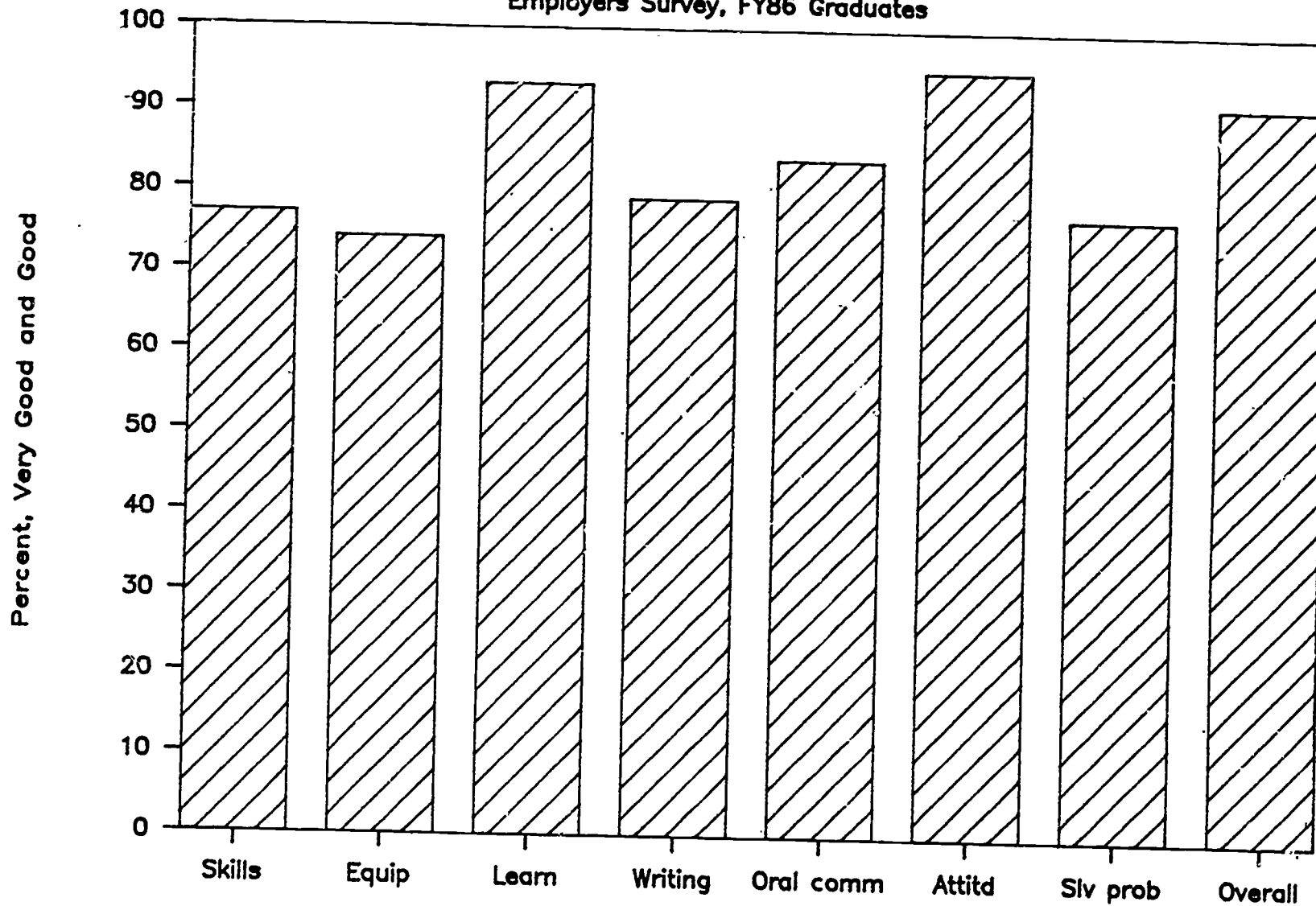


Satisfaction with Job Preparation

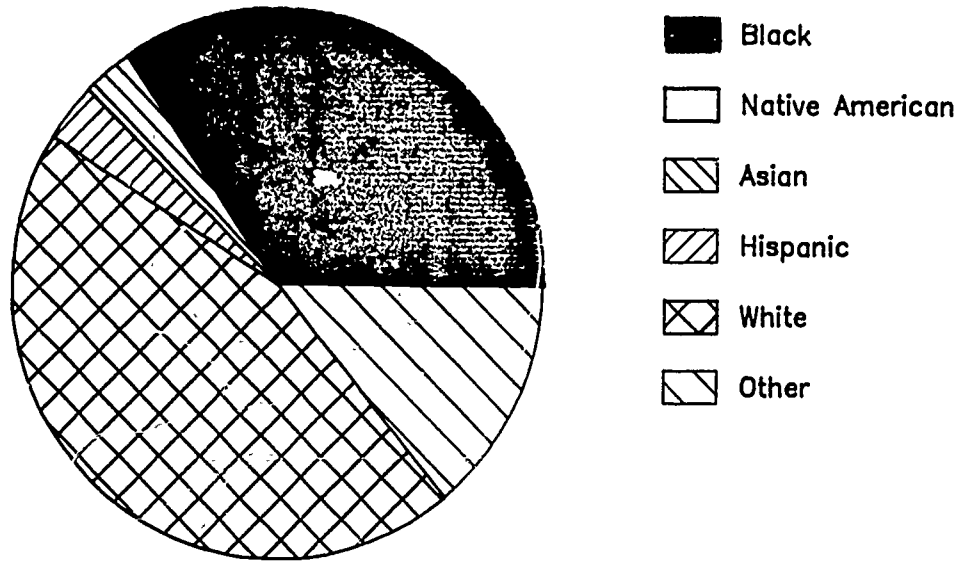

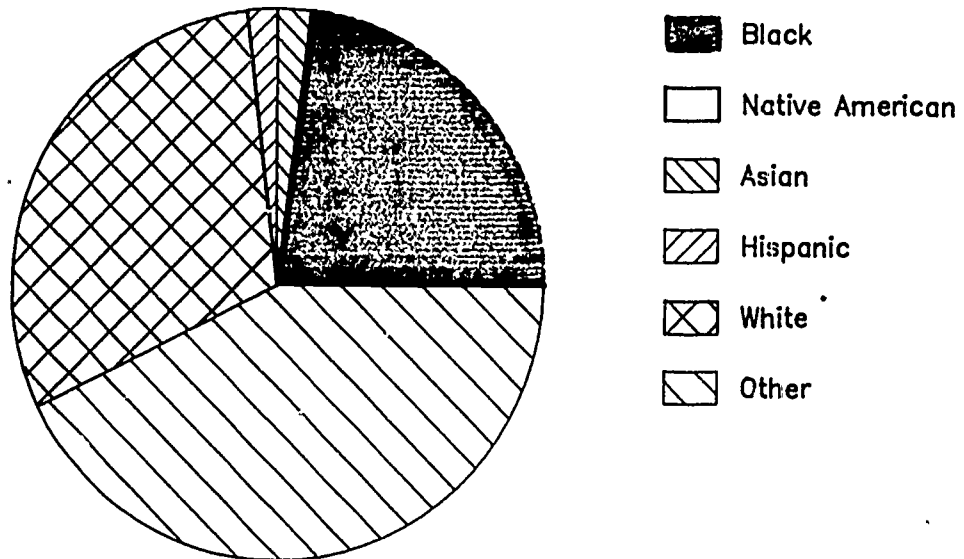

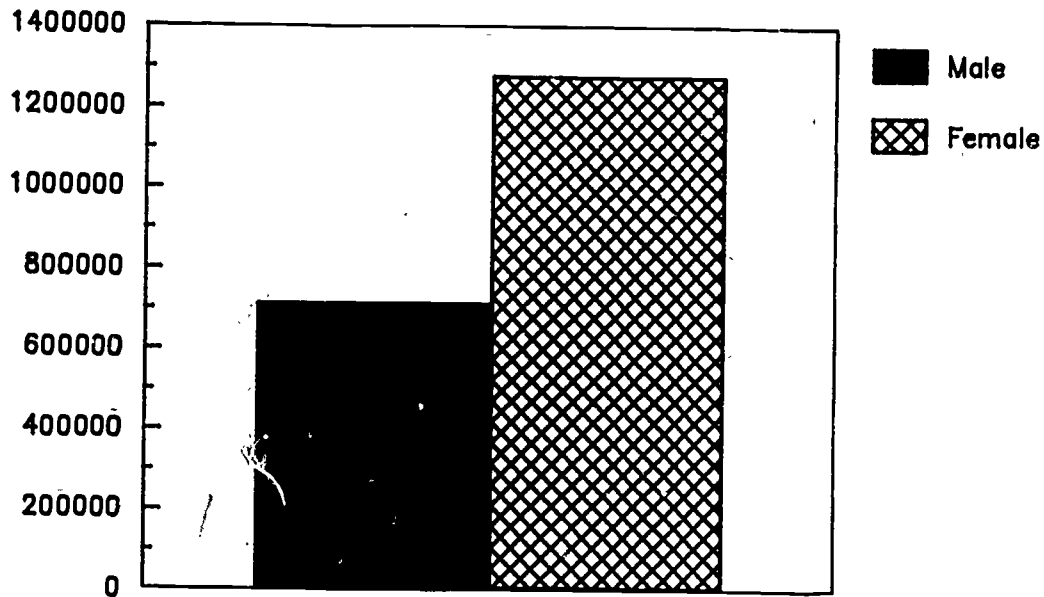
**Total Dollars of Financial Aid – FY88

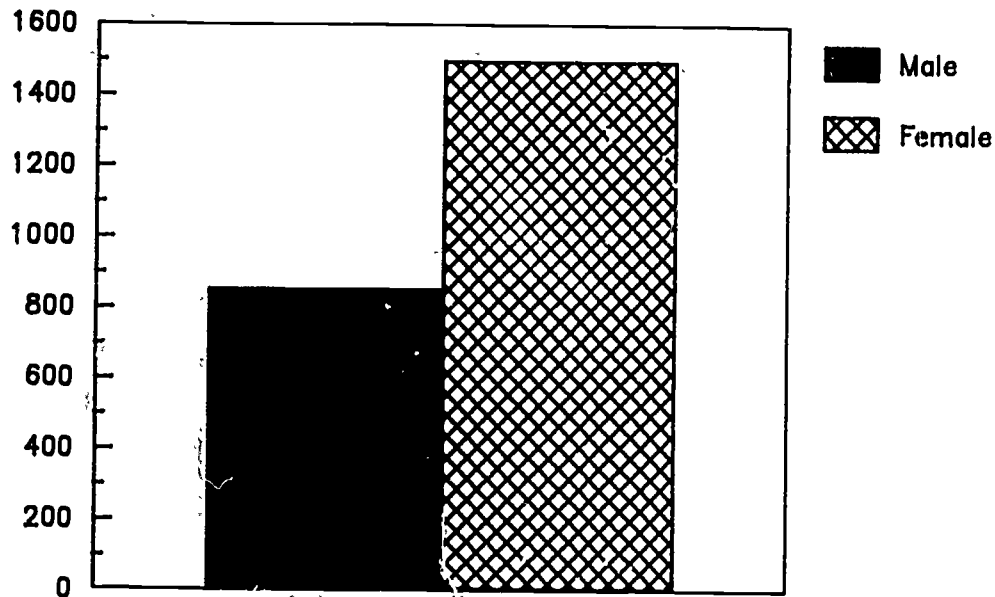
**Total Number of Recipients of All Types

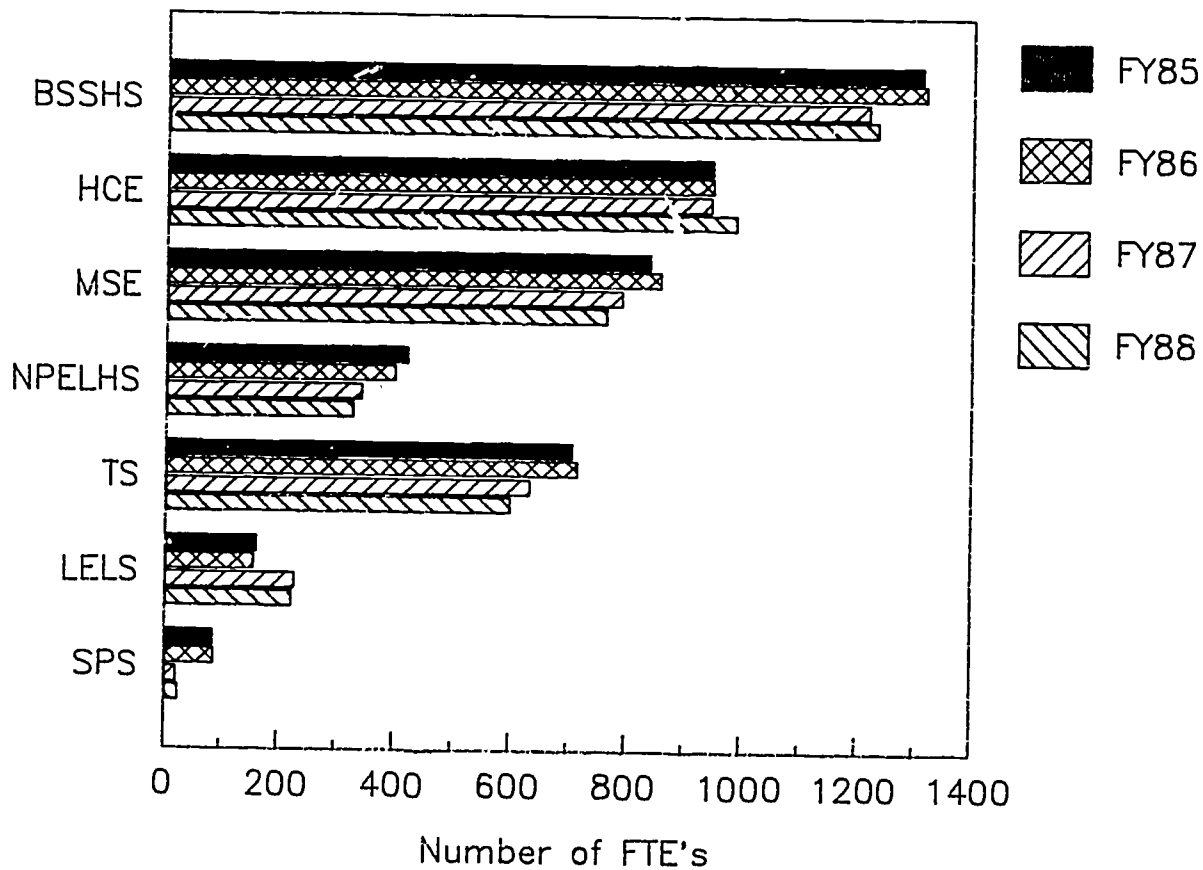

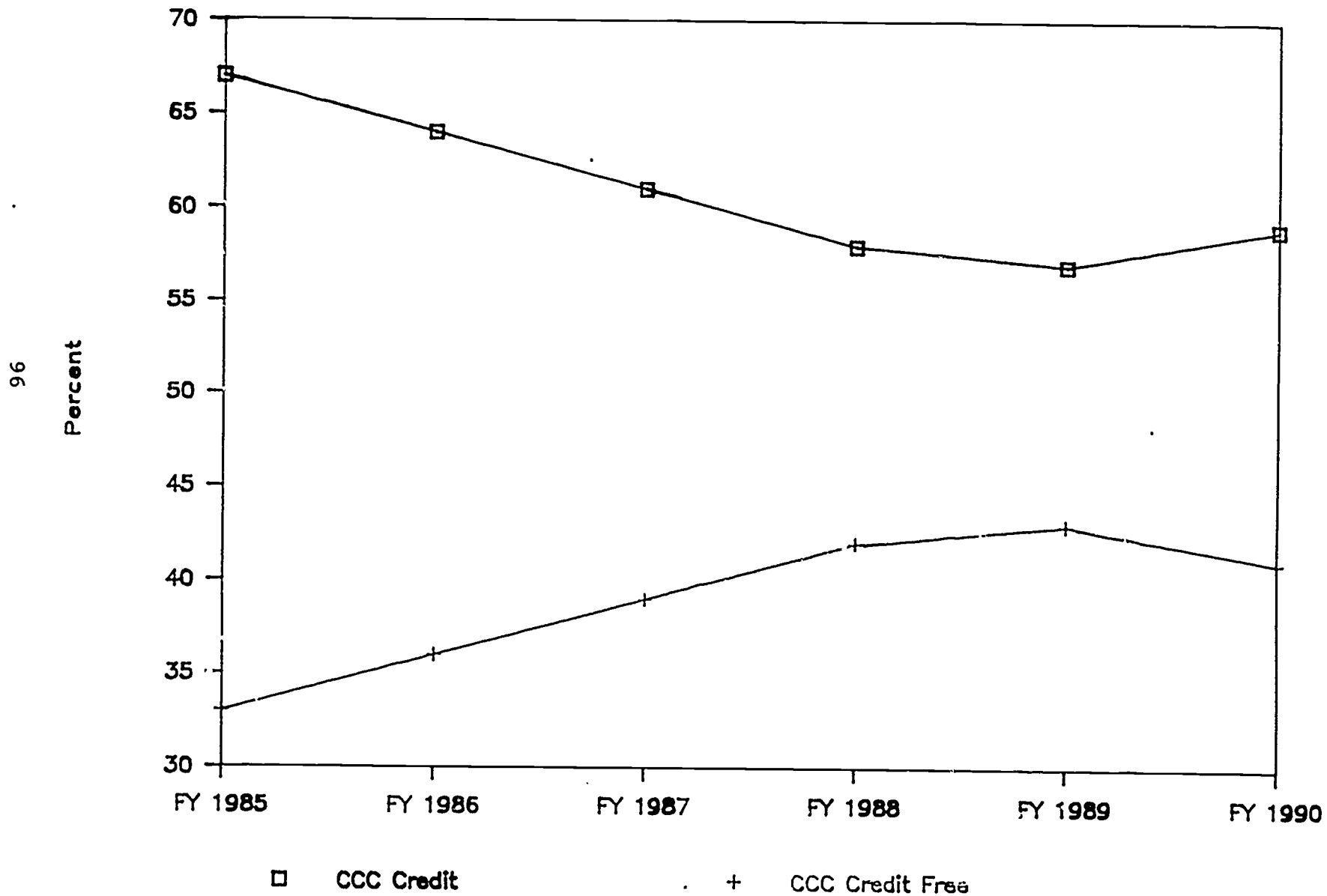

CREDIT FREE ENROLLMENT PATTERNS

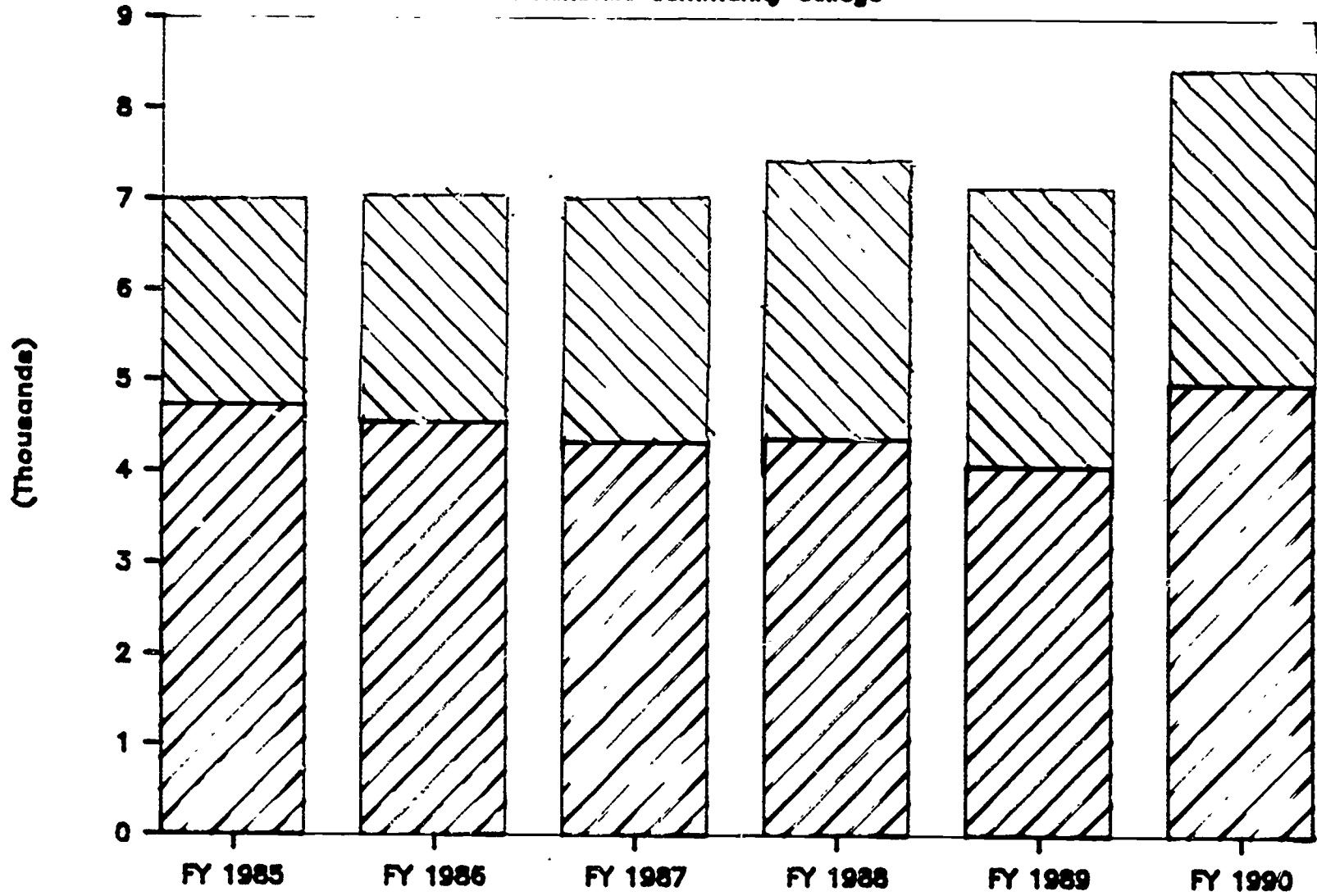

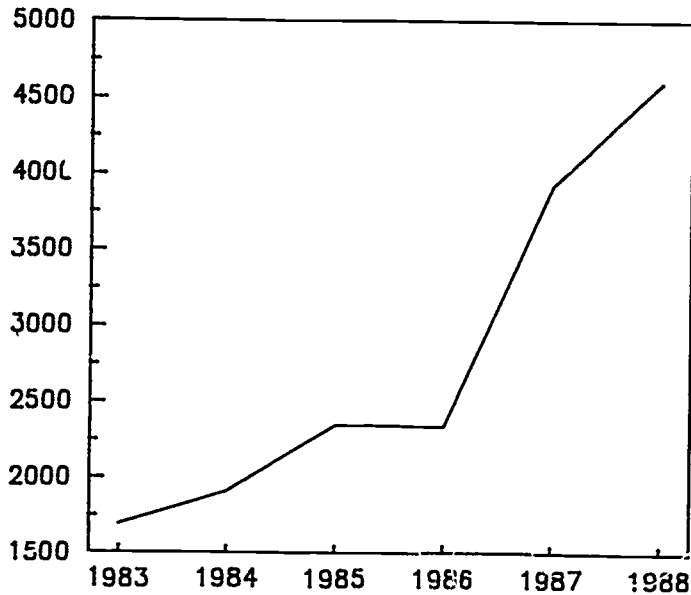

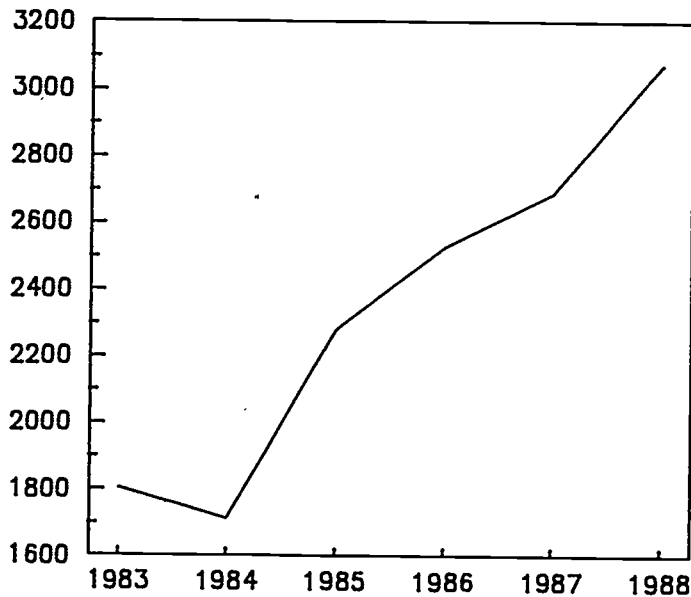

Number of Programs



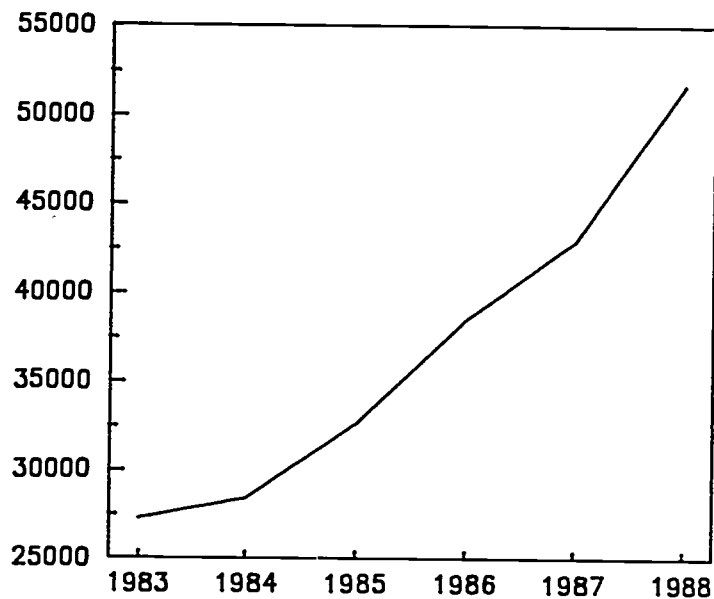

Number of Approved FTE's



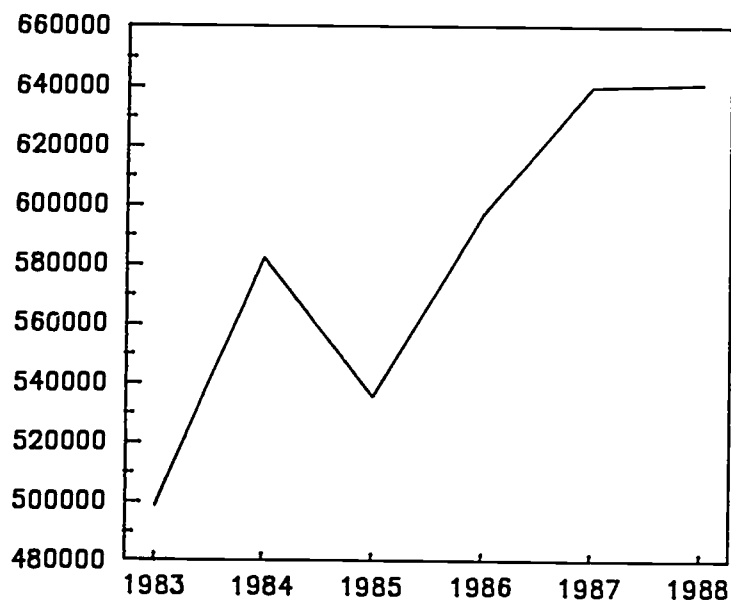
Continuing Education/Community Services Participants – Catonsville Community College

Number of Participants



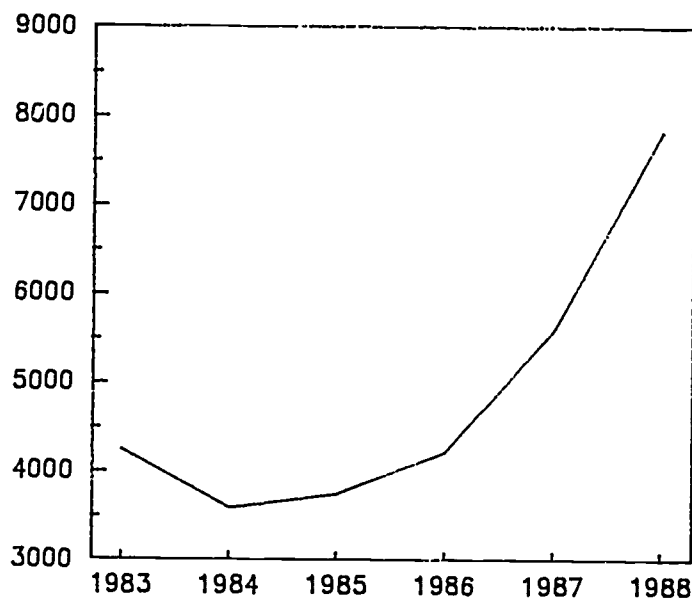
Continuing Education/Community Services Tuition – Catonsville Community College

Amount of Tuition



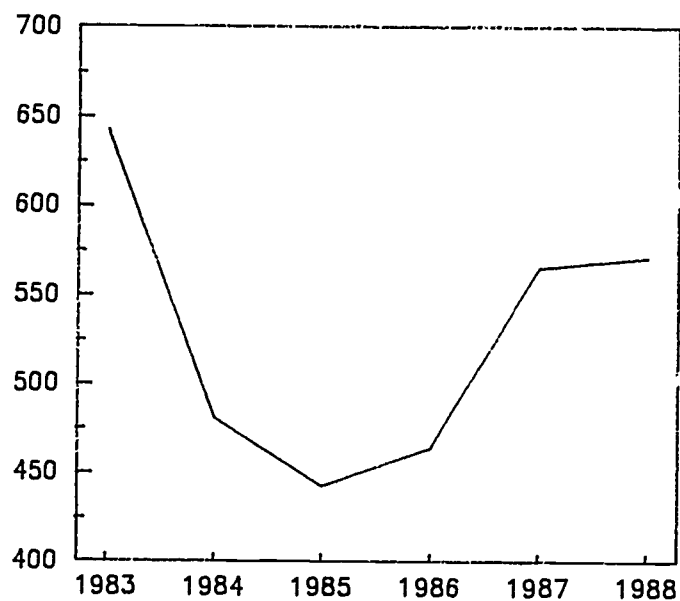

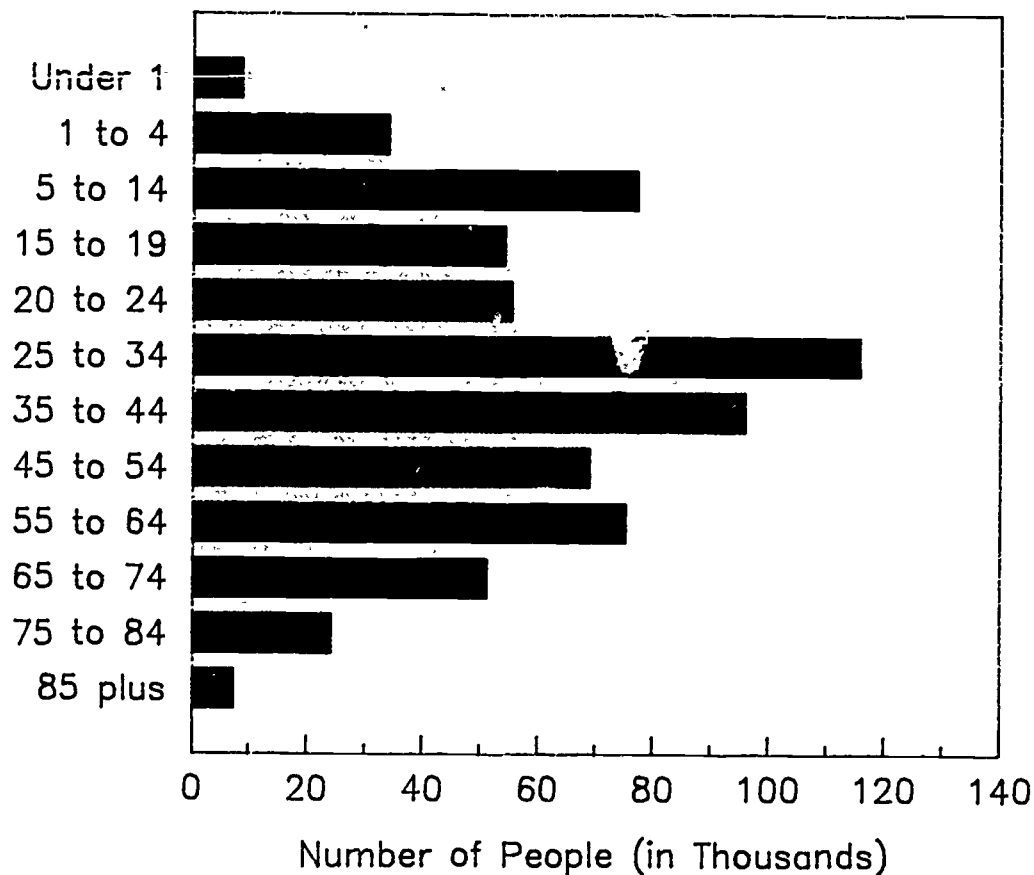

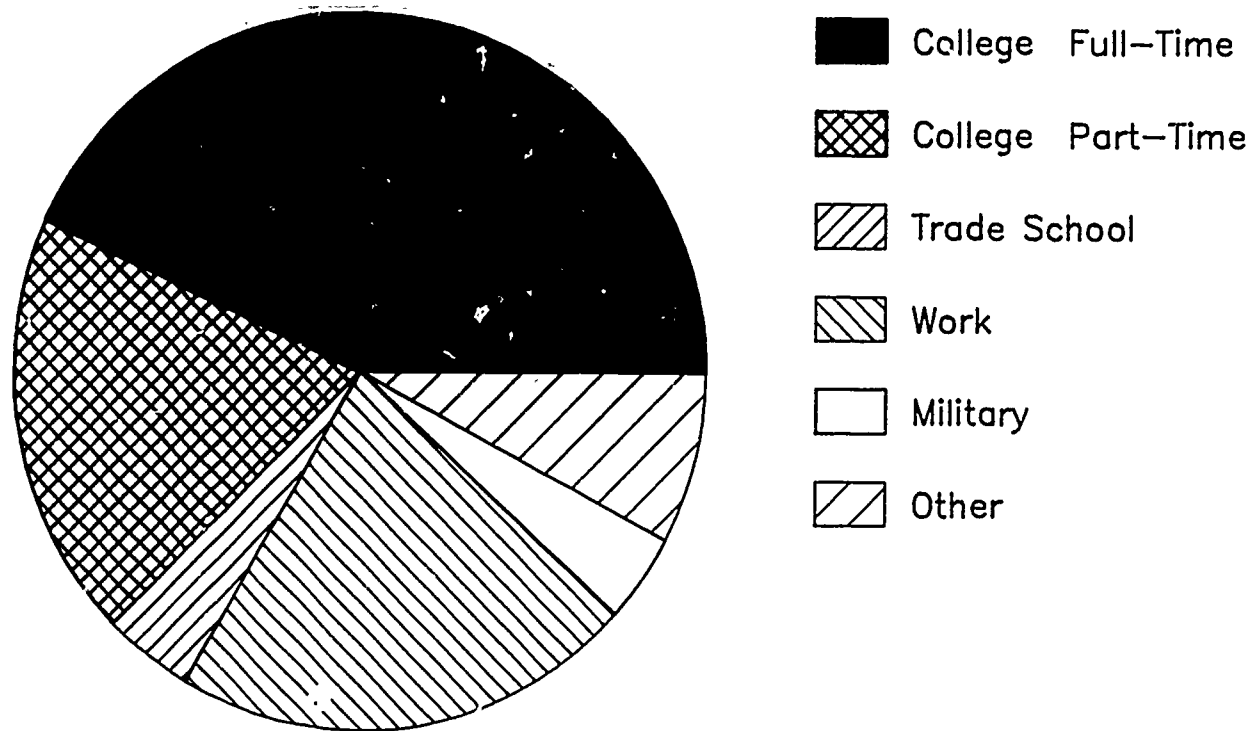
Baltimore County Public Schools Enrollment by Race - Fall 88

Baltimore County Public Schools Number of Graduates & Post-Graduate Plans 1987



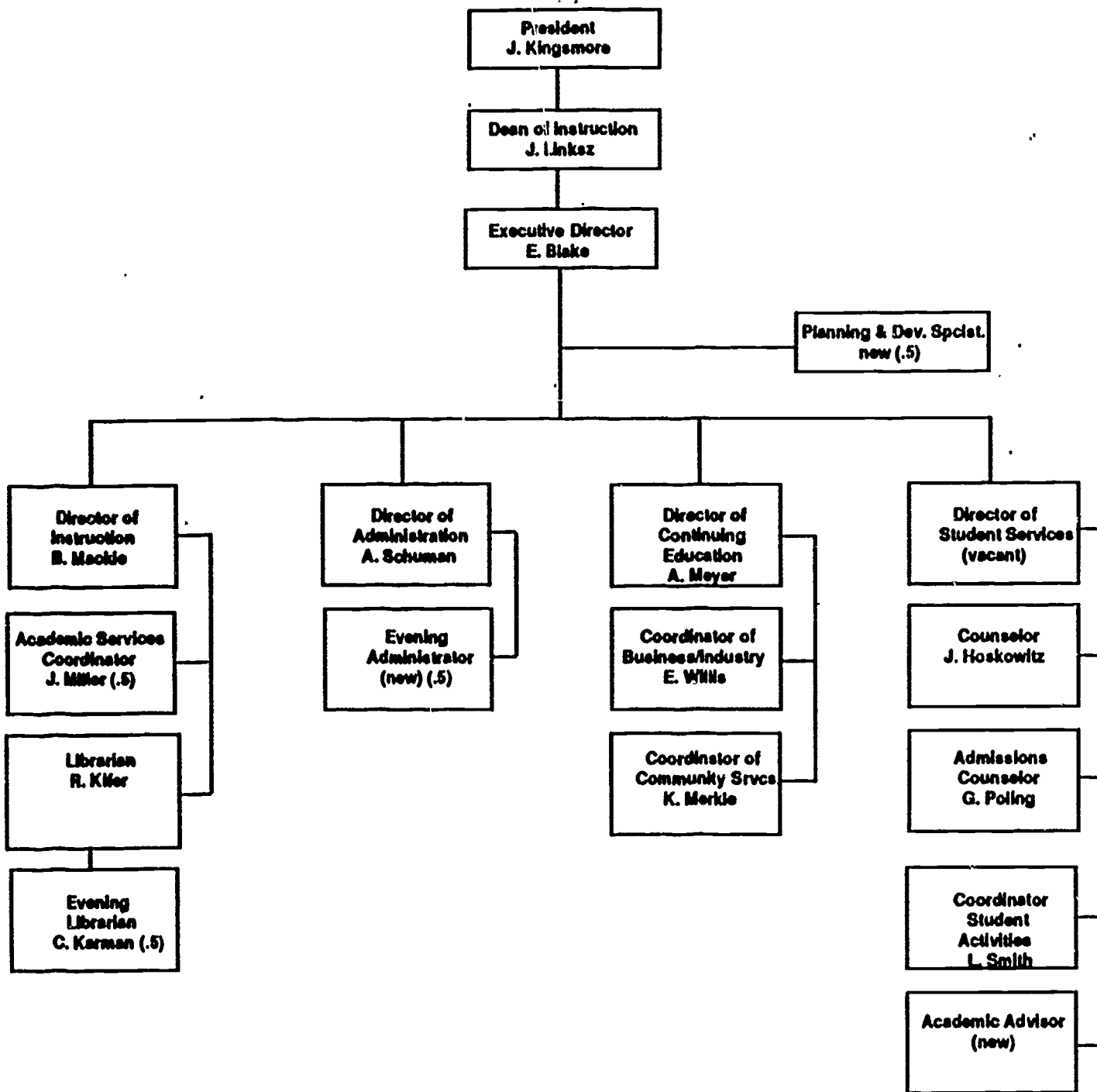

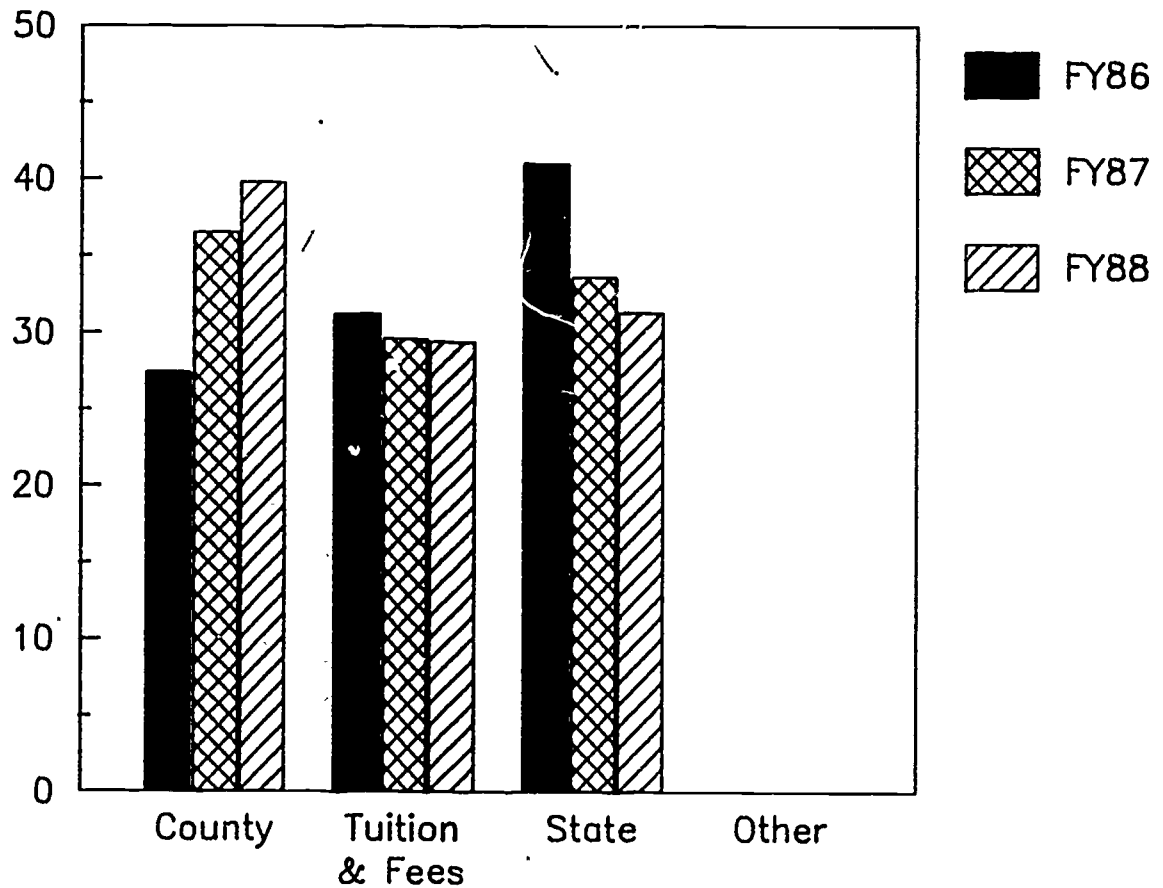

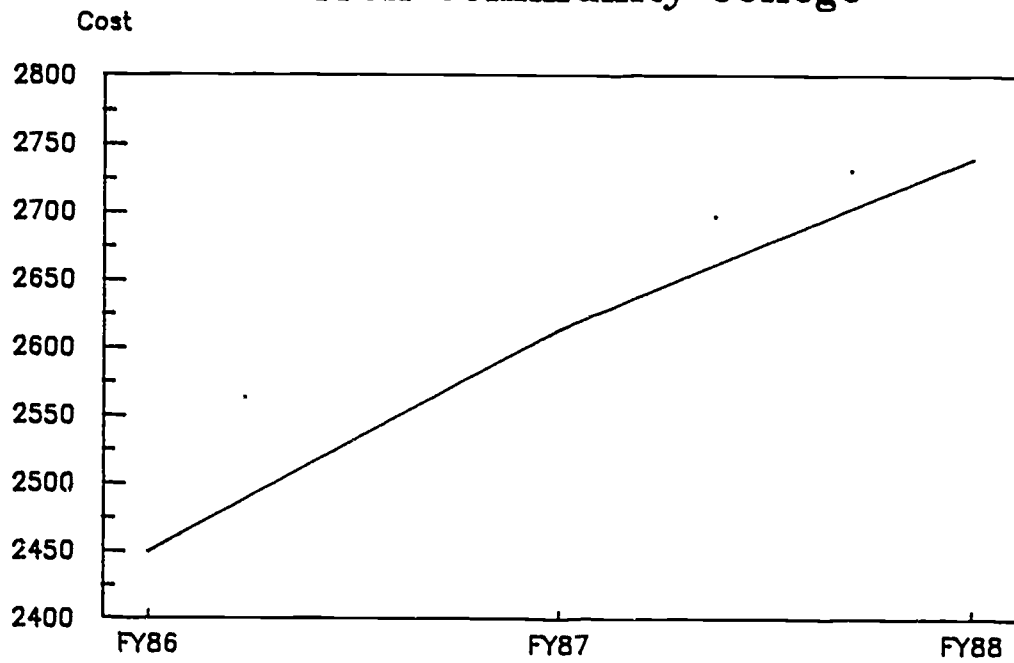

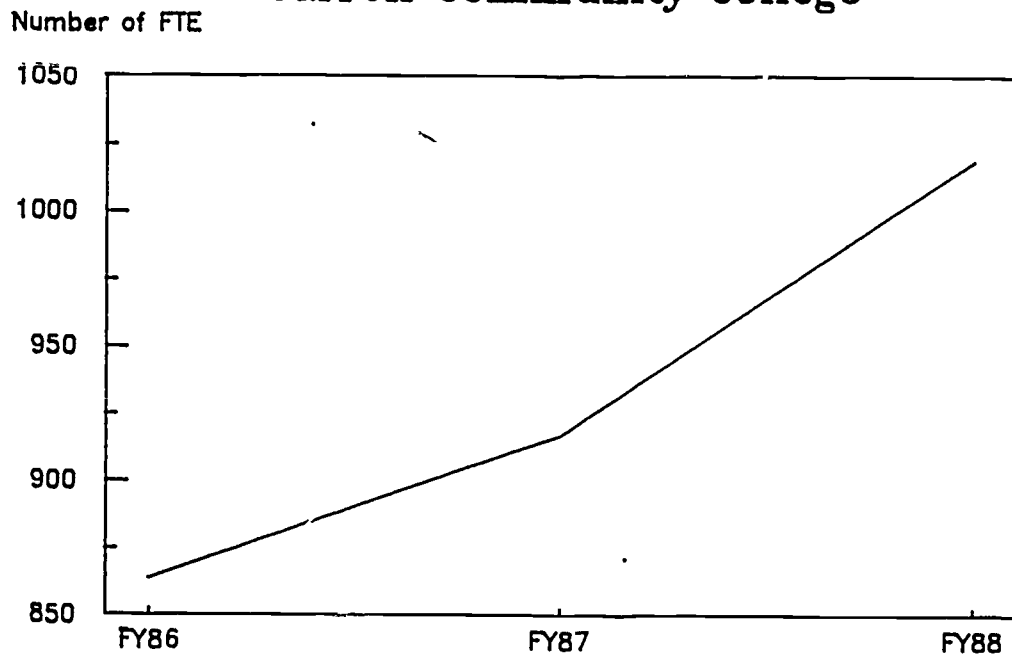
Percentage of Revenue



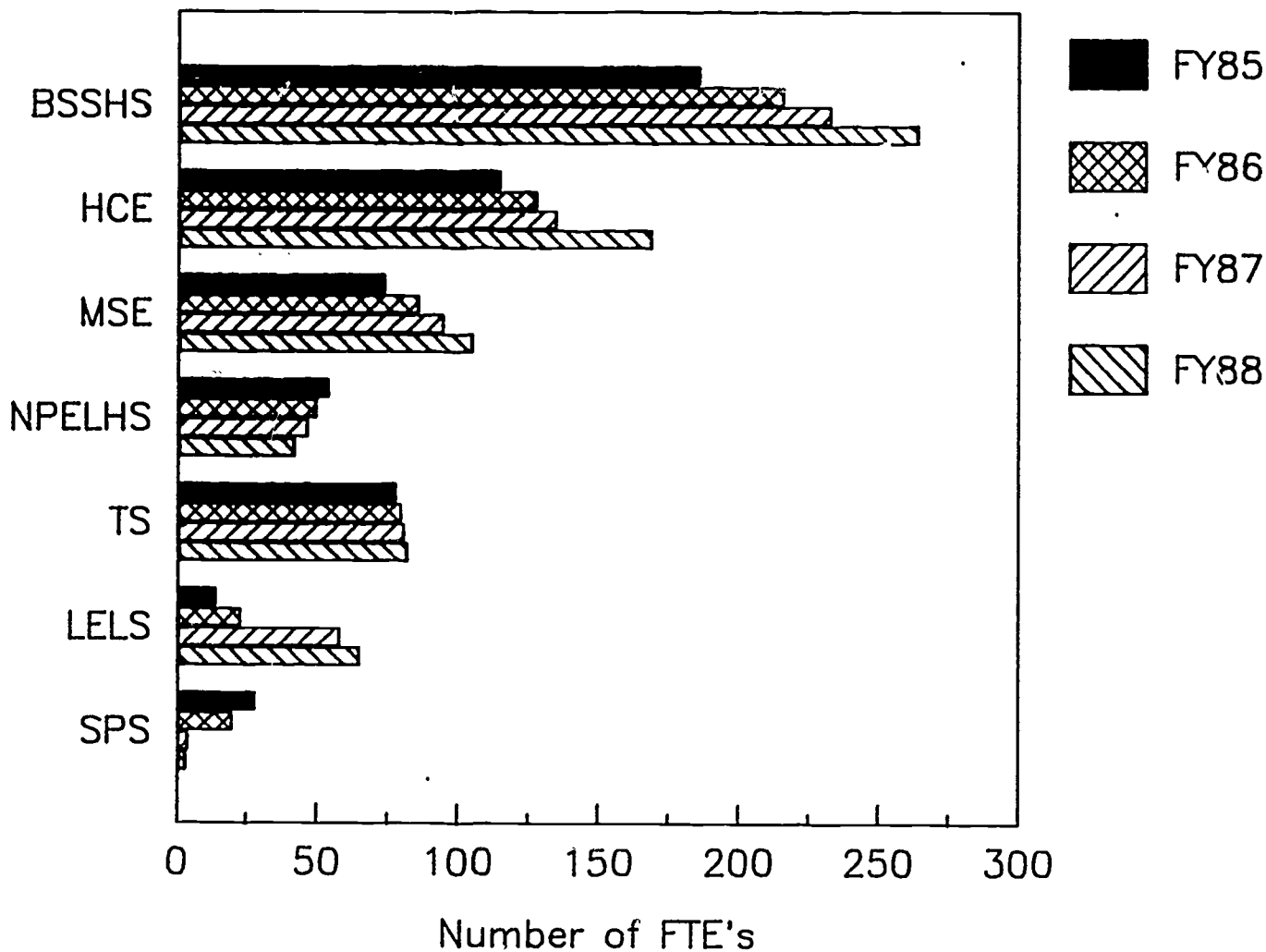
Budget History - Cost Per FTE Carroll Community College

FALL CREDIT PROFILE

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CREDIT STUDENT PROFILE FALL 1988

Enrollment is 1989, an increase of 108 students (5.7%) from last fall's 1881 students. FTE's are 379, up 20 (5.6%) from last fall.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

The proportion of women students decreased slightly to 65% this fall. The average age of students fell to 29.7. There are 30 senior citizens attending the college.

About 93% of the students live in Carroll County; 6.0% live in Baltimore County; and almost 2% come from other counties or out of state. Most (86%) of the new students attended either Westminster, South Carroll, North Carroll, Liberty, or Francis Scott Key high schools; 55% of all students attended one of these schools.

ENROLLMENT CHARACTERISTICS

Full-time enrollment (12 or more credits) increased by 30 students, 15% of the students body.

New and transfer students comprise 33% of the student body.

The proportion of evening students decreased from 53% to 47%, continuing the trend of previous years, while the proportion of day students increased to 34%; and the proportion of students taking both day and evening classes increased to 20%.

The average credit load remained the same at 5.8 hours for the fourth year; full-time students take an average of 13.2 credits, and part-time students take 4.4 credits.

PROGRAM CHARACTERISTICS

The career program enrollments decreased somewhat from Fall 1987; this fall, 33% of the students are majoring in career programs; while 47% are in General Studies; and 20% are in the other five state authorized transfer programs (Arts and Sciences, Engineering, Business Administration, Teacher Education, Computer Science).

Almost half (47%) of the new students want to "obtain the AA degree," 18% of them hope to "obtain a certificate," and about one-third (35%) plan to "take courses without working toward a degree or certificate."

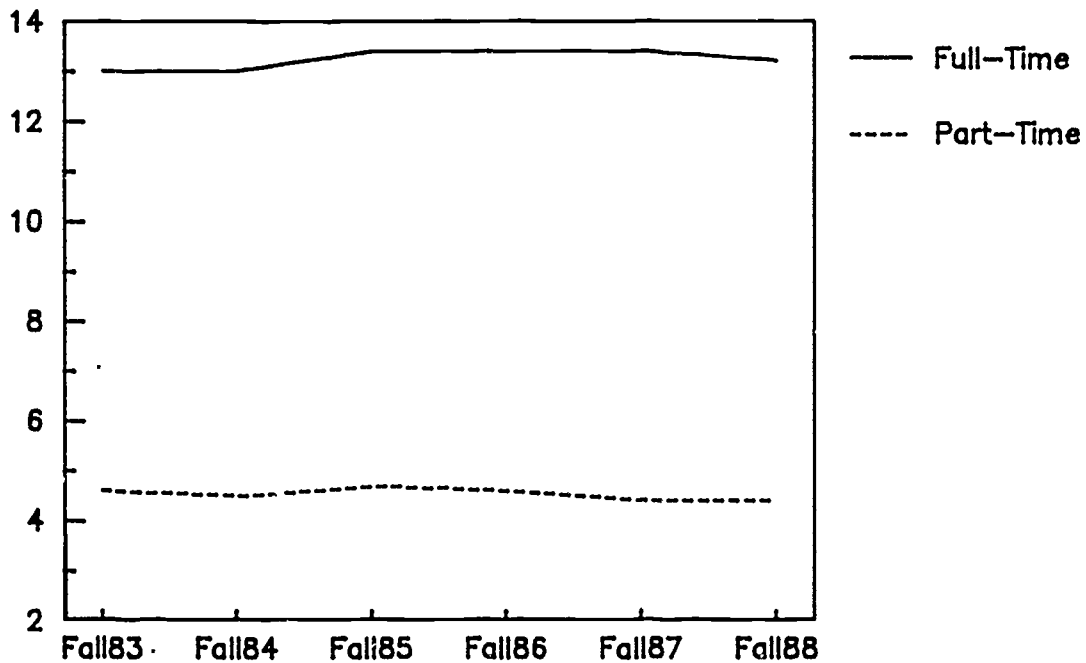
Credit FTE Carroll Community College



Overall Average Credit Hours Carried Carroll Community College

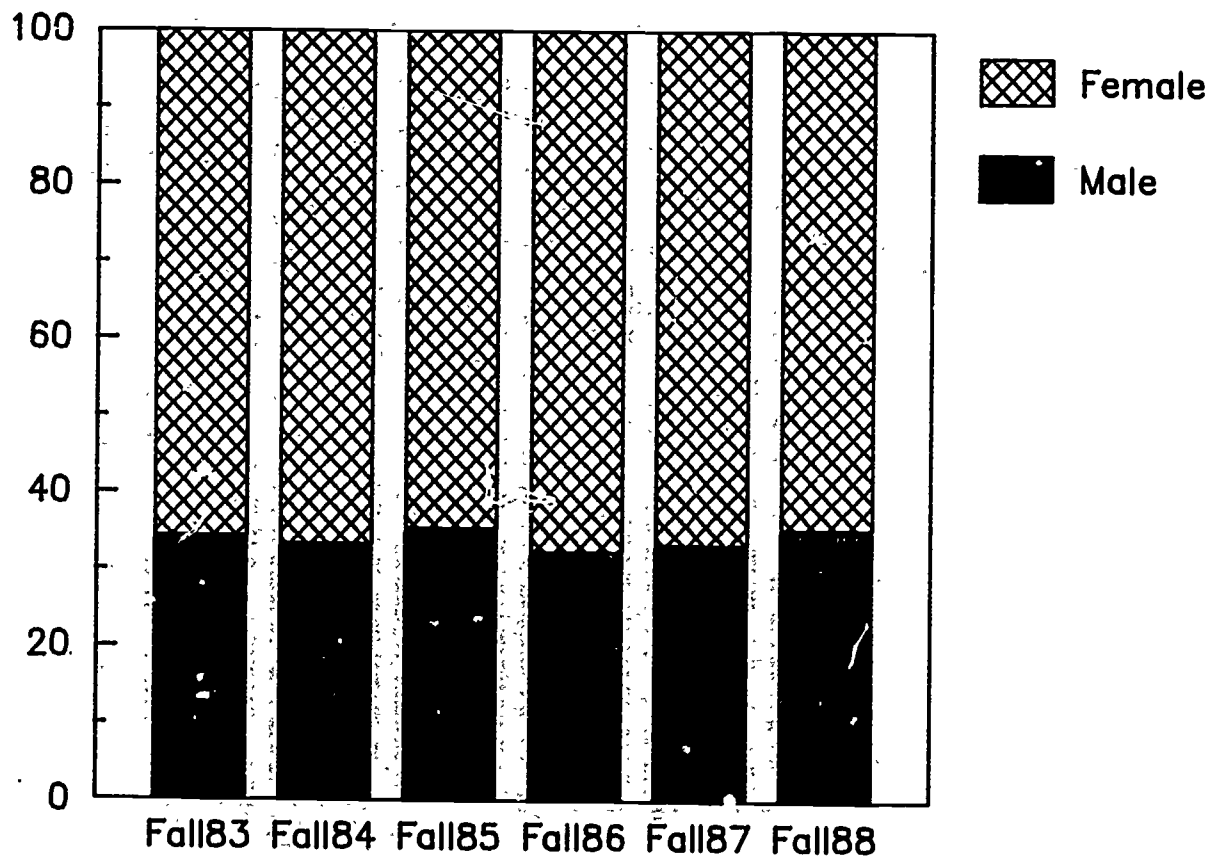

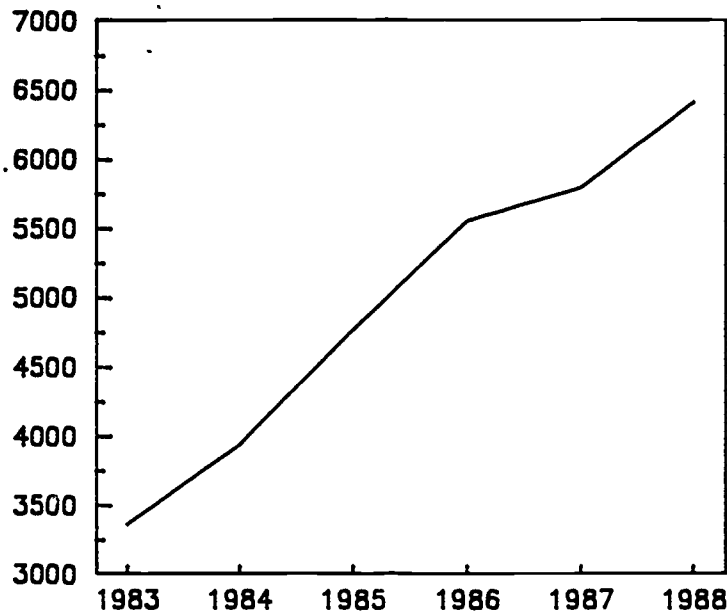

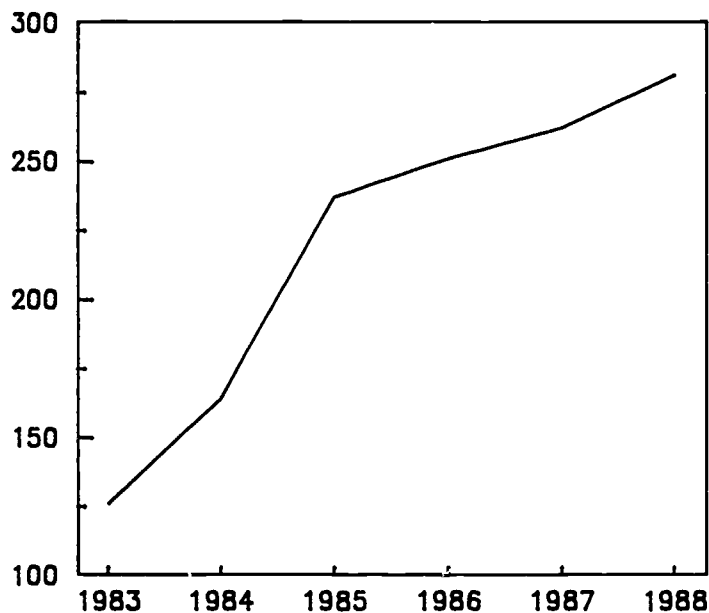

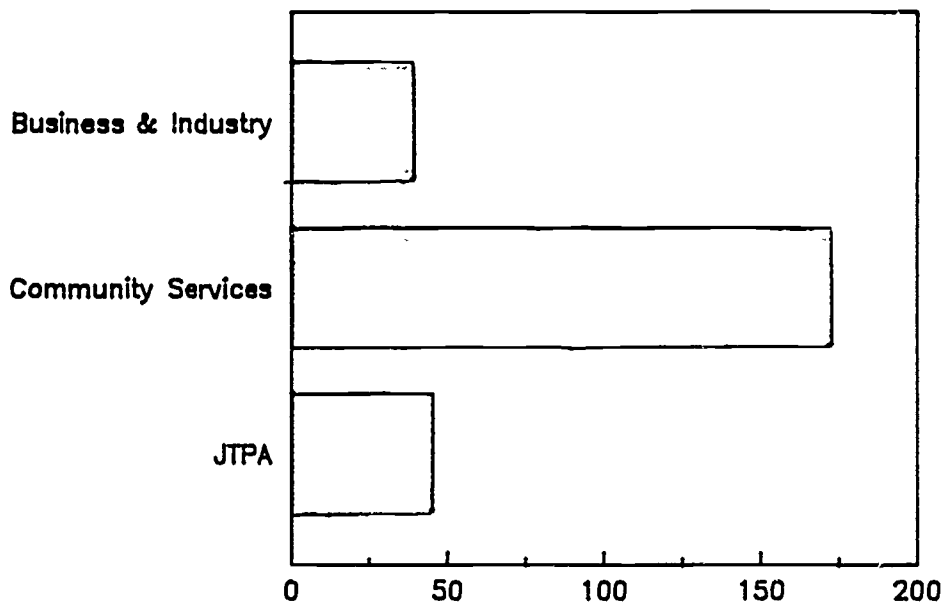

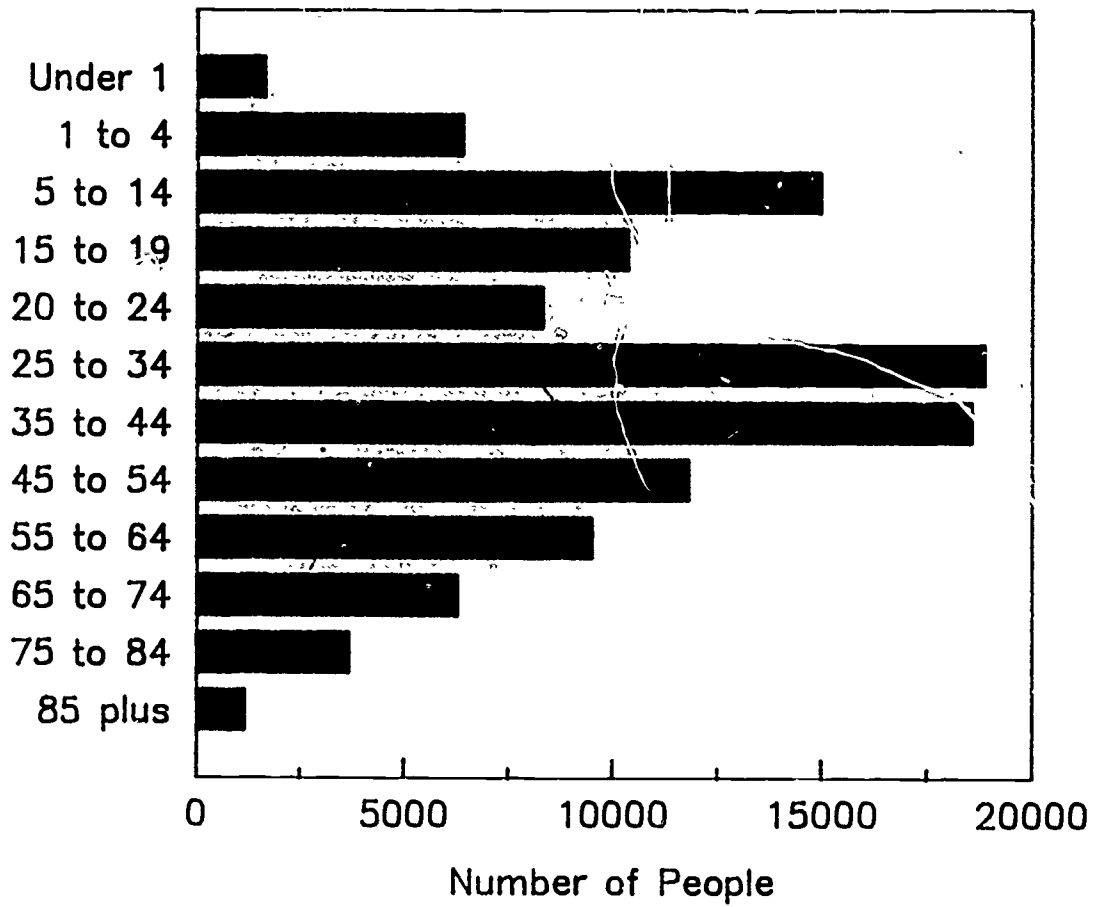

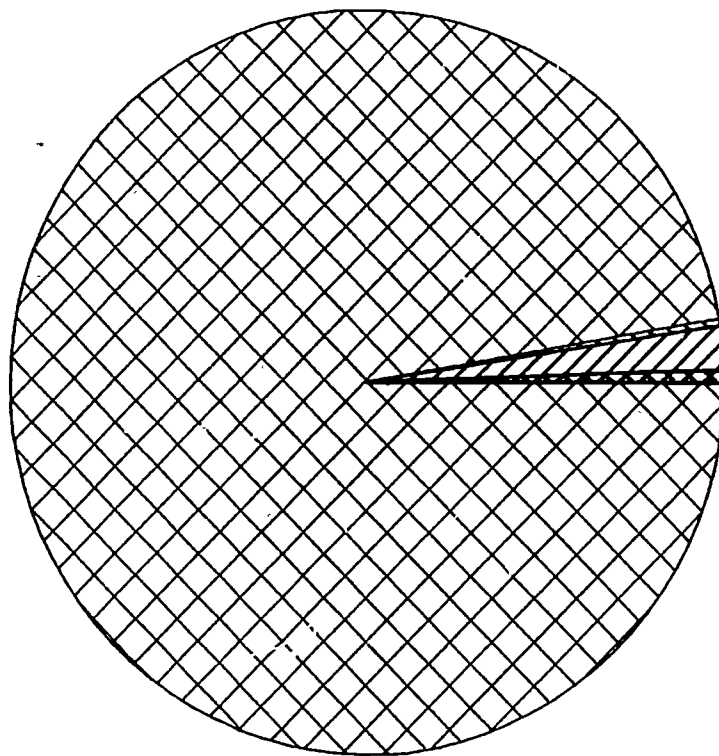

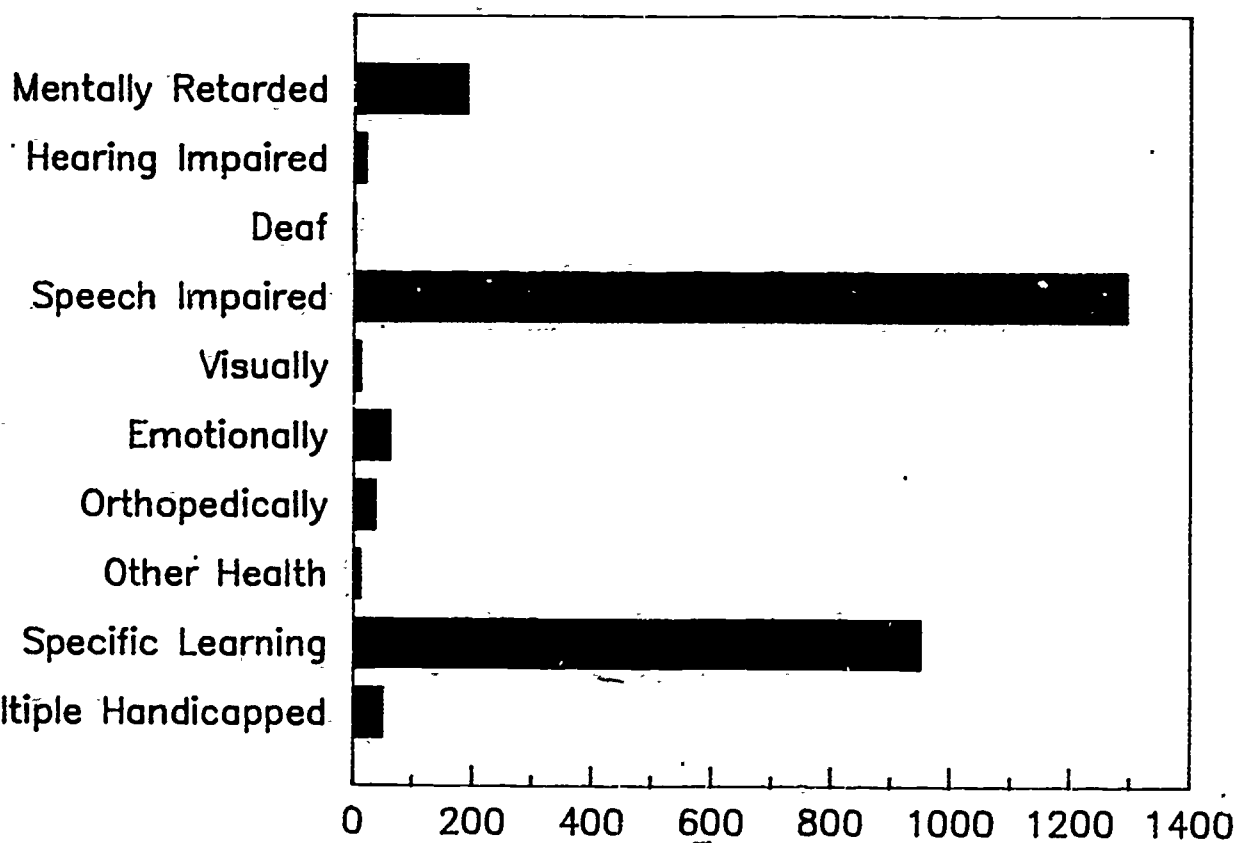

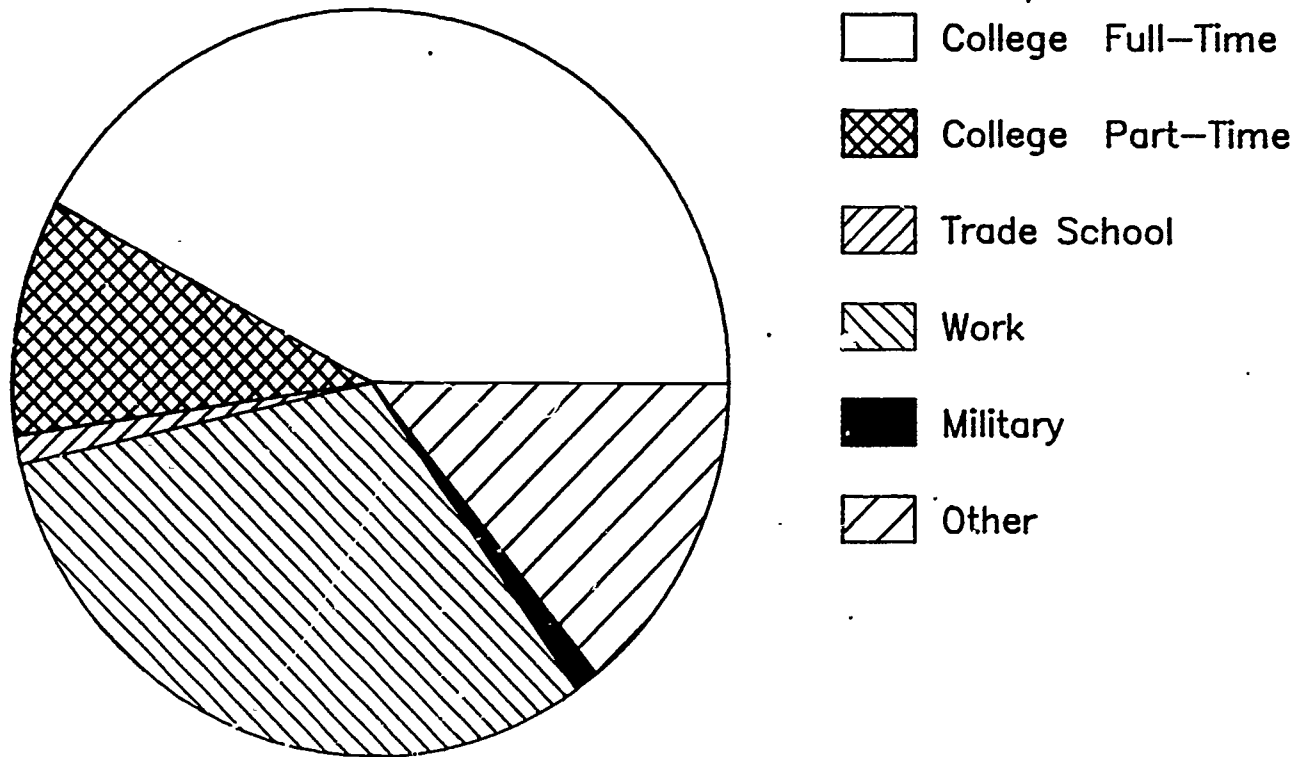
