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ABSTRACT

This report on transiency and stability in the Los Angeles Unified School District continues a series that has been augmented annually since 1968-69. Transiency refers to the adjusted numbers of entrants and leavers, expressed as a percentage (rate); stability refers to the student population that has remained in the school all year, expressed as a percentage (rate) of the starting enrollment. Information on the number of students who entered and left each month was gathered from all regular and magnet schools. Rankings were computed for elementary, secondary, and magnet schools, by administrative region and division, with a district summary. Transiency rates reported in this study were computed using a formula refined in the 1983-84 study and cannot be directly compared to the rates before 1982-83. Similarly, a refined stability formula has been used since the 1983-84 report. The following overall findings are reported: (1) schools of choice (magnet schools) as a whole, and in their region and division clusters, show the highest stability and the lowest transiency of all school groupings; (2) the district-wide stability factor declined slightly from 1978-79 to 1980-81, from 76.6 percent to 74.1 percent, with improvements over the next 2 years; (3) the stability rate has increased slightly from 1983-84 to 1985-86, from 78.15 percent to 81.37 percent; and (4) the transiency rate has decreased from 1982-83 to 1985-86, from 39.09 percent to 33.75 percent. Historical data are reported for 1968-1978, 1978-1983, and 1982-1986. Statistical data are included on eight tables. (FMW)

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ABSTRACT

This transiency and stability report for the Los Angeles Unified School District, 1985-86, continues the series that has been augmented annually for over a decade.

Transiency refers to the adjusted number of entrants and leavers, and is expressed as a percentage ("rate"). Stability refers to the student population that has remained in the school all year, and is expressed as a percentage ("rate") of the starting enrollment.

Please note that a refined transiency formula was applied to the data beginning in 1982-83. Transiency rates before 1982-83 are not comparable with the refined rates. Similarly, a refined stability formula has been used since the 1983-84 report. Prior stability rates are not comparable with the refined rates.

Information has again been gathered from all regular and magnet schools relating to the number of students who entered and left each month. Rankings were computed for elementary, secondary, and magnet schools, by administrative region and division, with a district summary.

Fluctuations in annual rates may reflect more than ordinary entering and leaving. For instance, in recent years, attendance patterns may have changed because of magnet programs, busing, or reconfigured grades. As noted in Findings, overall stability rates have risen in the last several years:

The transiency rate also shows improvement from previous years. After a high of 40.8% in 1983-84, the overall transiency rate has decreased for the past 2 years:

BACKGROUND

Beginning in 1968-69, the Research and Evaluation Branch has published an annual report on student transiency activity in relation to school enrollment. In these early reports, the transiency percentage of average enrollment at times exceeded 100% because some students were counted twice, as both entrants and leavers. This duplication was corrected in a subsequent report. Other improvements included reporting stability rates with transiency rates in the 1974-75 and later studies.

In the present report, as last year, magnet programs include schools and centers as well as alternative schools. Year-round schools are again listed with the regular schools.

Not included in this survey are data for continuation and opportunity high schools, community adult schools, skills centers, and schools for the handicapped.

Since transiency and stability are not reciprocal concepts, the sum of their rates is not required to equal 100%. Each concept is computed separately, although some counts of students are common to both formulas.

It is important to note that in this report the refined formula for computing transiency has been applied for the 4th year. To refine the transiency concept, all entrants (E) and leavers (L) for the 1st school month have been eliminated from consideration. Statistics are based on the 2nd through the 10th school month. The categories of E1, L1, and L7 are not used in the calculations. Transiency rates published before 1982-83 rates are not comparable with these refined rates.

For the 3rd year, the stability formula does not count leavers in the 1st school month. The categories of L1 and L7 are not used. Because a different stability formula has been used since 1983-84, the corresponding rates are not comparable with those from earlier years.

It is important to note that fluctuations in annual transiency and stability rates reflect more than ordinary entering and leaving. For example, in recent years, changes in attendance patterns may have resulted from magnet programs, busing, or reconfigured grades. Therefore, small shifts in the rates for individual schools may reflect erroneous factors and may not indicate changes in transiency and stability. Group data, such as regional or district totals, may reflect a more accurate and stable index of transiency and stability.

The definitions and explanations that follow will clarify these approaches to studying transiency and stability.

DEFINITIONS

For this report, these definitions apply:

Transiency refers to the adjusted number of entrants and leavers for the year. It is expressed as a percentage ("rate") of 1st plus 6th school-month enrollments averaged. See Formulas.

Stability approximates the student population that has remained in the school all year. It is computed by subtracting all school-year leavers from the starting enrollment, and is expressed as a percentage ("rate") of the starting enrollment. See Formulas.

Entrants in this report are students entering during the school year, with the exceptions of those returning to the same school at the beginning of the school year (E1).

Categories of entering students included in this study are:

- E2 entering from another school within LAUSD
- E3 entering from another public school outside LAUSD
- E4 entering from a nonpublic school in California
- E7 enrolling for the first time (generally kindergarten or 1st grade)

Leavers in this study are students leaving any time during the school year, except those graduating (L7) and those leaving one grade or program to enter another in the same school (L1).

Categories of leaving students included in this report are:

- L2 leaving one LAUSD school for another
- L3 leaving for another public school outside LAUSD
- L4 leaving for a nonpublic school in California
- L8 leaving without giving the school enough information about destination or reasons; thus, categorized as unknown, dropped or other

Schools of choice or magnet programs are part of the district's voluntary integration program. Magnet schools and centers (which include four alternative schools) are open to all LAUSD students, grades K-12. A program may include the entire student body or selected grades. Each program emphasizes a particular field of interest such as science, language, multicultural studies, performing and fine arts, business, and the basics of reading, writing, and mathematics. Gifted and high-achieving students study in programs that emphasize accelerated learning and creativity through expanded academic experiences.

Rate refers to the percentage term calculated by the formulas for stability and transiency. A school with a high stability rate and a low transiency rate has excellent holding power.

Rank refers to ordering the transiency and stability rates for schools listed in Tables 2 through 5, with the highest rate being assigned rank 1. Thus, rank 1 for stability indicates holding strength, but rank 1 for transiency indicates the highest student mobility. Each table contains unique rankings within its pattern that cannot be directly compared to other years' rankings. Table 1 gives region and division rankings.

FORMULAS

The formulas for stability and transiency are explained as follows:

Symbols Used

- E total number of entrants for the school year: this includes all E2, E3, E4, and E7 students for school months 2-10; excludes all Es in month 1; excludes all E1 students for months 2-10.
- L adjusted number of leavers for the school year: this includes all L2, L3, L4, and L8 students for school months 2-10; excludes all Ls in month 1; excludes all L1s for months 2-10.
- M1 1st school-month enrollment
- M6 6th school-month enrollment
- S school-year stability rate
- T school-year transiency rate

Formula for Stability

Stability equals 1st school-month enrollment less adjusted number of leavers divided by 1st school-month enrollment, times 100 -- yielding a percentage term, the stability rate.

$$S = \frac{M1 - L}{M1} \times 100$$

Formula for Transiency

Transiency equals number of entrants plus adjusted number of leavers divided by sum of enrollment for 1st and 6th school months divided by 2, times 100 -- yielding a percentage term, the transiency rate.

$$T = \frac{E + L}{(M1 + M6)/2} \times 100$$

Noteworthy aspects of the formulas are:

- All Es and Ls in school month 1 are excluded from consideration because they are already present in the M_i total.
- No Es and Ls are considered during the 1st school month except as baseline enrollment.
- The average of the 2 peak months for enrollment is used. As soon as programming allows, the transiency formula will be further refined to incorporate the mean of enrollment for all 10 school months as the denominator.

USING THE TABLES

Overview results for the district appear in Table 1, and results for elementary, junior high, and senior high schools, and schools of choice are presented in Tables 2-5. The schools are listed in alphabetical order, with numeric titles presented first in the sequence.

For Tables 1-5, the headings are explained in the definition section of this report. Please note that entrants and leavers represent accumulated totals for the entire school year.

Summary rates for transiency and stability since 1968 are shown in Tables 6-8.

FINDINGS

The 84 schools of choice as a whole, and in their region and division clusters, show the highest stability and the lowest transiency of all school groupings (Table 1).

There was a small decline in the districtwide stability factor from 1978-79 to 1980-81, from 76.6% to 74.1% with improvements the next 2 years. The stability rate has increased from 78.2% in 1983-84 to 81.37% in 1985-86 (Table 8). Because a refined stability formula has been used, these figures cannot be compared with stability rates before 1983-84.

The overall transiency rate has decreased from 39.09% in 1982-83 to 33.75% in 1985-86 (Table 8). Since a refined transiency formula has been used, these figures are not comparable with transiency rates before 1982-83.
