### ABSTRACT


This booklet for graduates of special education programs in Montgomery County, Maryland, briefly describes and lists local resources for further education, work opportunities, recreation, and health/safety. 

### Information for being independent

### **School Records**

You may need your school records to get needed services as an adult. Your records will be kept at your school for two years after you graduate. At the end of that time, the records are destroyed. Ask your principal if you wish to see your records. You can get your psychological reports from the Diagnostic and Professional Support Team (279-3726) with a request signed by you or your parent.

### **Social Security Cards**

### **Armed Services Registration**

At age 18, all young men must register for possible military service at the nearest post office. Persons with disabilities may be represented by a parent or guardian.

### **Personal Identification**

It is a good idea to carry an ID card at all times with your name, address, phone number and medical information (medications, allergies, etc.) The card should also give the name, address and phone number of a person to contact in case of emergency.

You may wish to get a medical bracelet or necklace from Medic Alert if you have a special problem (such as epilepsy, etc.) This information can be engraved on the bracelet or necklace. Drug stores may carry such items. For information, write to:
