ABSTRACT

The report presents a summary of selected quantitative measures for August 1987 through July 1988 of students who applied for University of Florida graduate school admission. those who were accepted by academic departments, and those who subsequently enrolled. A brief introduction and listing of procedural assumptions precede the two figures and 25 tables which comprise the major portion of the report. The figures present information on: (1) Graduate Record Examination scores by college; and (2) undergraduate grade point averages of applicants, acceptees, and enrollees. The tables cover the following: summary data by college (including and excluding foreign students); School of Accounting; College of Agriculture; College of Architecture; School of Building Construction; College of Business Administration; College of Education; College of Engineering; College of Fine Arts; School of Forest Resources and Conservation; College of Health Related Professions; College of Journalism and Communications; College of Law--Taxation; College of Liberal Arts and Sciences; College of Medicine; College of Nursing; College of Pharmacy; data for men only by college; data for women only; data for U.S. Blacks only; other U.S. minorities; foreign students; and comparison of grade point average, graduate record examination scores, and percentage of applicant denials by college from 1983 through 1988. An appendix discusses the reliability and distribution of the Graduate Record Examination scores. (DB)

ADMISSIONS DECISIONS STUDY

INTRODUCTION

This report presents a review and summary of selected quantitative measures of students who applied for Graduate School admission, those who were accepted by academic departments, and those who subsequently enrolled. The study includes all students granted or denied admission for the period August 1987 through July 1988. The data also include those students who applied for a transfer from one college to another in the Graduate School during this period.

Data on enrolled students are compared with data for all those who formally applied and for those who were accepted. As in previous reports, the grade point average refers to a student's last two years of undergraduate work, while the Graduate Record Examination score provides the total points of the verbal and quantitative portions of the nationally administered aptitude test.



PROCEDURAL ASSUMPTIONS

The following procedural assumptions were employed:

- 1. Students conditionally admitted are not distinguished from students unconditionally accepted for graduate study.
- 2. Where more than one decision is recorded for the same time period (application for fall enrollment "denied" in May could change to "accepted" in July), the latest decision is considered final and is the one counted.
- 3. All acceptances for an academic year are considered as one application since, if a student is accepted for study in a department, he or she would usually be permitted to enroll in any semester during that academic year.
- 4. If the admission decision is a denial, it is considered as a different decision each semester since, presumably, the student's credentials have been reevaluated each semester.
- The reported acceptance figures are based on the initial decisions made by individual departments as reported to the Registrar. Enrolled students are defined as those students engaged in course work for one or more semesters during the period August 1987 through July 1988.
- . Where available, the undergraduate grade point average (GPA) and Graduate Record

 Examination (GRE) scores for applicants categorically denied admission are incorporated into



- the GRE and GPA figures. These students are reflected in the data reporting the total number of applications and the number of denials.
- 7. Known applicants for off-campus study at the University of Florida Graduate Residence Center are included in the results.
- 8. College of Business Administration and the Fisher School of Accounting applicants may present either the Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT) or the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or both test scores. The college level average GMAT and GRE scores are shown for the Fisher School of Accounting and the College of Business Administration. Except for Economics, the departmental GRE score in the College of Business Administration is not presented in this report, but such data are available from the Graduate School upon request.
- 9. College of Law applicants present the Juris Doctor degree and an LSAT score as a requirement of admission. Therefore, no GRE scores are recorded for students majoring in taxation.
- 10. Some of the data presented in this report reflect information provided by applicants. The information on citizenship, race, sex, residence, et cetera, is occasionally missing, erroneous, or illegible, and discrepancies are created when specific categories are selected for special tabulations. For students who are denied admission or who elect not to enroll, this is the only information available. For students who do enroll, this information is often revised in the enrollment files, thus creating disparities with data presented here.

RESULTS 1987-1988

In the academic year 1987-1988, the University of Florida received 7,084 applications for admission to the Graduate School. This number has increased slightly since 1986-1987. However, the number of newly enrolled students has decreased by 3 percent during this period.

The noticeable growth in the number of new students occurred in Accounting, Building Construction, Fine Arts, and Medicine. Decreases were noted in Business Administration, Taxation, and Pharmacy. The number of newly enrolled students in other colleges remained relatively constant. The percentage of applicants denied admission, including foreign students, in 1987-1988 was 49.83 percent. This is 5.38 percentage points higher than the previous year (Table 1). Although there were differences among the colleges and departments, the overall averages of the GRE Verbal and Quantitative aptitude scores, as well as the GPAs, of the students who applied and those who were accepted have been slightly higher than the previous year. On the other hand, the quality of newly enrolled students as measured by GPA and GRE has remained at about the same level as the previous year.

Of the 7,084 applications, 2,888 or 41 percent were from foreign students who were not resident aliens. Almost two-thirds (63.64%) of these were denied (Table 24). When compared to the past few years, the GRE scores of foreign students have continued to improve. In 1987-1988, 366 new foreign students enrolled: the number has not increased from 1986-1987. While a significant decrease has occurred in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, an increase in the number of new foreign students was reported in the Colleges of Agriculture and Medicine. The number of newly enrolled foreign students represents 18.3 percent of the total first-time enrolled graduate students. Thirty-nine percent of the newly enrolled foreign students are in the College of Engineering and 16 percent have enrolled in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. An additional 21 percent have enrolled in the College of Agriculture.

Department admissions data, excluding and including foreign students, are provided in Tables 3a through 19b. The tables that include foreign students at the departmental level are listed for the first time in this issue. These tables summarize the average quantitative measures of each of the fourteen colleges and the three schools within the Graduate School.

College admissions data for men, women, blacks, other U.S. minorities (American Indians, American Asians, and Hispanics), and foreign students are shown in Tables 20 through 24. In 1987-88, excluding foreign students, the number of newly enrolled graduate students decreased about 4 percent from a year ago for both men and women. The women account for 48 percent of the total domestic graduate student enrollment in 1987-88--the same level as the previous year.

A total of 73 black graduate students enrolled for the first time in 1987-88. The number has increased more than 20 percent over the previous year, and the quality of the new enrollees has continued to improve in terms of GRE and GMAT scores. This year's average GRE (V + Q) score of 991 is 7 points higher than last year's average score. While the number of newly enrolled other minority graduate students has remained relatively constant, the quality of these enrolled students has also improved considerably since 1986-87.

Data on the GPA and GRE performance of applicants accepted into the Graduate School over a five-year period (1983-1987), excluding foreign students, are shown in Table 25. The data show that the quality of accepted graduate students, excluding foreign students, has stayed fairly constant over the five years studied. The percentage of applications denied declined slightly in the past two years but has increased in 1987-88. This denial rate varied widely among colleges. Within a college, the rate also varied from year to year. A noticeable increase in denial rate in 1987-88 was seen in the Colleges of Enginee.ing, Law--Taxation, and Pharmacy.

Standardized tests, such as the GRE, are not predictive measures of a student's performance in graduate study. The GRE is simply a measure of the current level of the student's verbal, quantitative, and analytical skills as compared to others who took the test. As a result, the Graduate School has maintained that exceptions to the minimum standards must be justified by the faculty of the department to which the student is applying. Consideration is given to the student's motivation, career goals, and recommendations, especially in the case of minority students for whom standardized tests may be a particularly inadequate measure of potential performance and success in certain fields.

Denial rates are insignificant in and of themselves. They must be interpreted in terms of the size and quality of the applicant pool available, the proportion of those accepted who actually enroll, and the number of students who can be adequately accommodated by the department facilities and faculty.




Figure 1. Graduate Record Examination Scores by College for Domestic Students, 1987-88.




Figure 2. Undergraduate Grade Point Averages of Graduate Student Applicants, Acceptees, and Enrollees by College for Domestic Students, 1987-88.



APPENDIX

RELIABILITY AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE GRADUATE RECORD EXAMINATION SCORES

According to the Graduate Record Examination Board¹, if an examinee could take the same test many times in the same day, the scores obtained would vary somewhat even if the effects of the practice and fatigue were eliminated. The chances are approximately 2 out of 3 that an examinee's score will lie within a range extending from one standard error below to one standard error above his/her true score. The GRE Board statistics show that the standard errors of GRE-Verbal and GRE-Quantitative are 35 and 41, respectively. Thus for example, if an individual's true score were 500 on the verbal test, the chances are 2 out of 3 that the examinee's obtained score will lie between 465 and 535. Thus, when an administrator reviews an applicant's GRE scores, he/si. should think of the scores as an interval or band, the limits of which depend upon the standard error of measurement.

The Graduate School of the University of Florida requires a minimum verbal-quantitative total of 1000 on the Aptitude Test of the GRE in addition to a minimum grade point average of



3.00 for all upper-division undergraduate work. However, the admissions data show that not every student accepted by the Graduate School in 1986-1987 has met the minimum GRE score requirement of 1000. The distribution of the accepted students' GRE(V+Q) scores in 1987-1988 is shown below:

Since the GRE Board cannot provide a standard error of measurement for the total test score of verbal and quantitative abilities, we estimate 80 as an approximated standard error for GRE(V+Q), where 80 equals the sum of the standard errors of the GRE-Verbal and the GRE-Quantitative plus a random measurement error of 4 points.

Thus, if an applicant's true GRE(V+Q) score is 1000, the chances are approximately 2 out of 3 that his/her obtained score will lie between 920-1080. In other words, if an applicant's test score for the GRE(V+Q) is 920, the chances are 2 of out 3 that his/her true score will lie between 840-1000. If an applicant's GRE(V+Q) score is 1080 or higher, it is very likely that his/her true score will be higher than 1000.

The GRE(V+Q) score distribution shows that 65 percent of accepted students scored 1080 and higher. This is the group of students whose true GRE scores are almost always higher than 1000. Twenty-nine percent of students accepted scored between 920 and 1079. This is the group of students who could have scored a total (V+Q) of 1000 at one time and failed to do so at other times. This is a so-called "margin group" which should be evaluated carefully for admission to graduate programs. Finally, 6 percent of accepted students scored lower than 920 on the GRE Verbal and Quantitative Aptitude sections. These are the individuals who are not likely to reach the minimum required GRE score of 1000 in the near future. They are probably the students whose admissions were an exception to the Board of Regents admission criteria. Their performances in the Graduate School should be closely monitored.
