ABSTRACT

Data are presented on the characteristics of community college transfer students who earned baccalaureate degrees in Maryland between 1981 and 1987. Tables and graphs cover the transfer status (i.e., native, community college transfer, four-year college transfer, or out-of-state transfer) of baccalaureate recipients, of graduates who were Maryland residents, of graduates who re-enrolled in college, and of graduates who reported that they planned to earn an advanced degree. In addition, transfer and native students are compared in terms of percentage of females, mean annual salary, graduating institution, percentage seeking employment, percentage who owed no money on loans, debt of those who borrowed money to attend college, and racial composition. Highlighted findings include the following: (1) during the 1980's, approximately 50% of the graduates of Maryland four-year public colleges had transferred from another campus, and 23% to 28% of the graduates had transferred from a Maryland community college; (2) transfers were slightly more likely to be male, white, and Maryland residents at the time of graduation; (3) transfers tended to be older than native students; (4) native students were more likely to have re-enrolled in college after graduation, and had slightly higher post-graduate degree aspirations; (5) one year after graduation, transfers had higher median annual salaries than native students; and (6) at graduation, transfers owed less on college loans than native students. HIGHLIGHTS

During the 1980s, approximately 50 percent of the graduates from Maryland four-year public campuses had transferred from another campus. Twenty-three to 28 percent of the graduates had transferred from a Maryland community college.

The mix of native students and community college transfers who graduated from four-year public campuses differed by four-year campus.

Community college transfers resembled the native students in many ways:

- o Transfers were slightly more likely to be male
- o Transfers were slightly more likely to be non-minority
- o Transfers were more likely to be Maryland residents at time of graduation
- o Transfers were older than native students
- o Native students were more likely to have re-enrolled in college after graduation
- o Native students had slightly higher post-graduate degree aspirations
- o One year after graduation, transfers had higher median annual salaries than native students
- o At graduation, transfers owed less on college loans

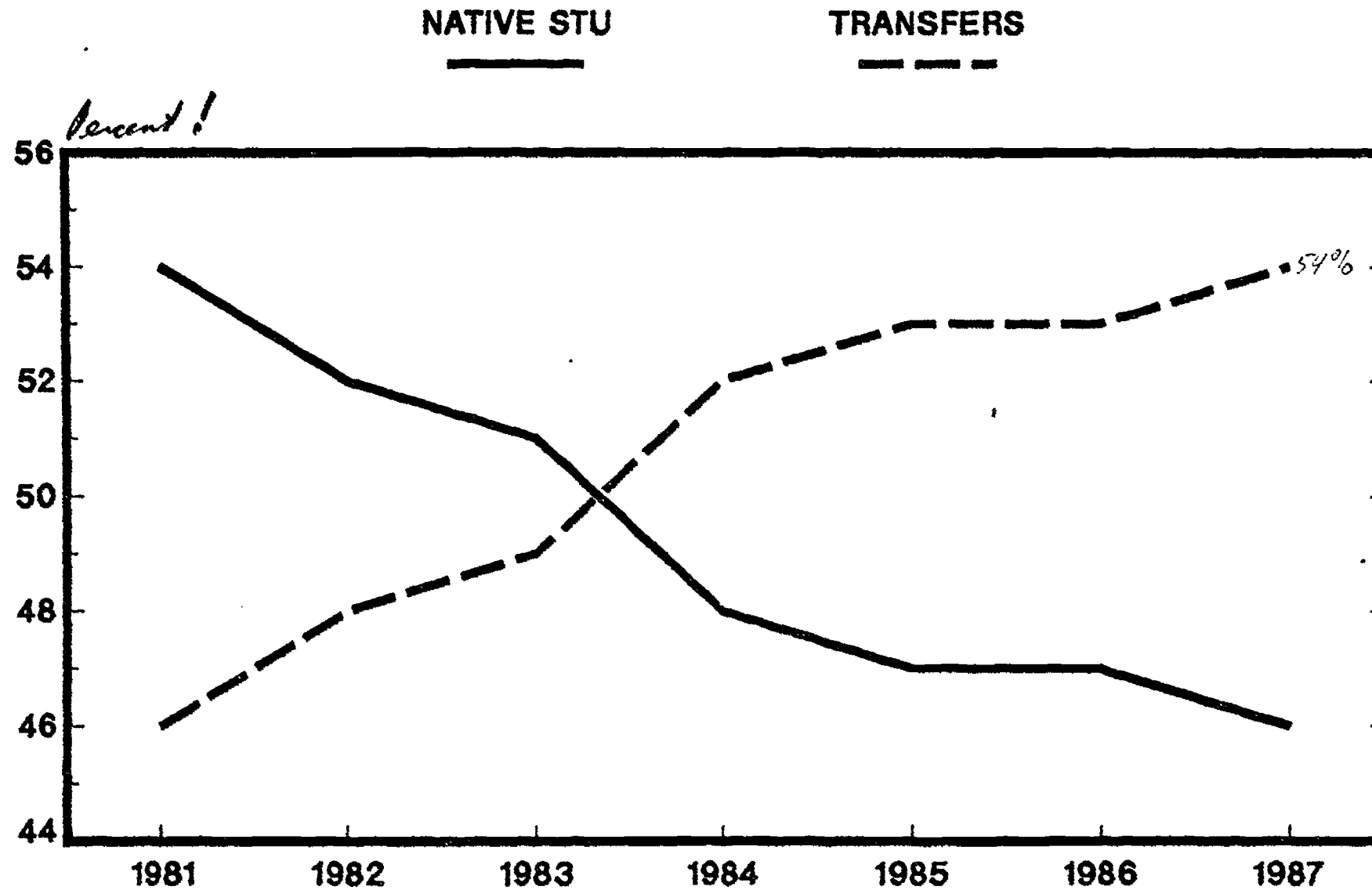

TRANSFER STATUS OF BACCALAUREATE RECIPIENTS Maryland Public Campuses

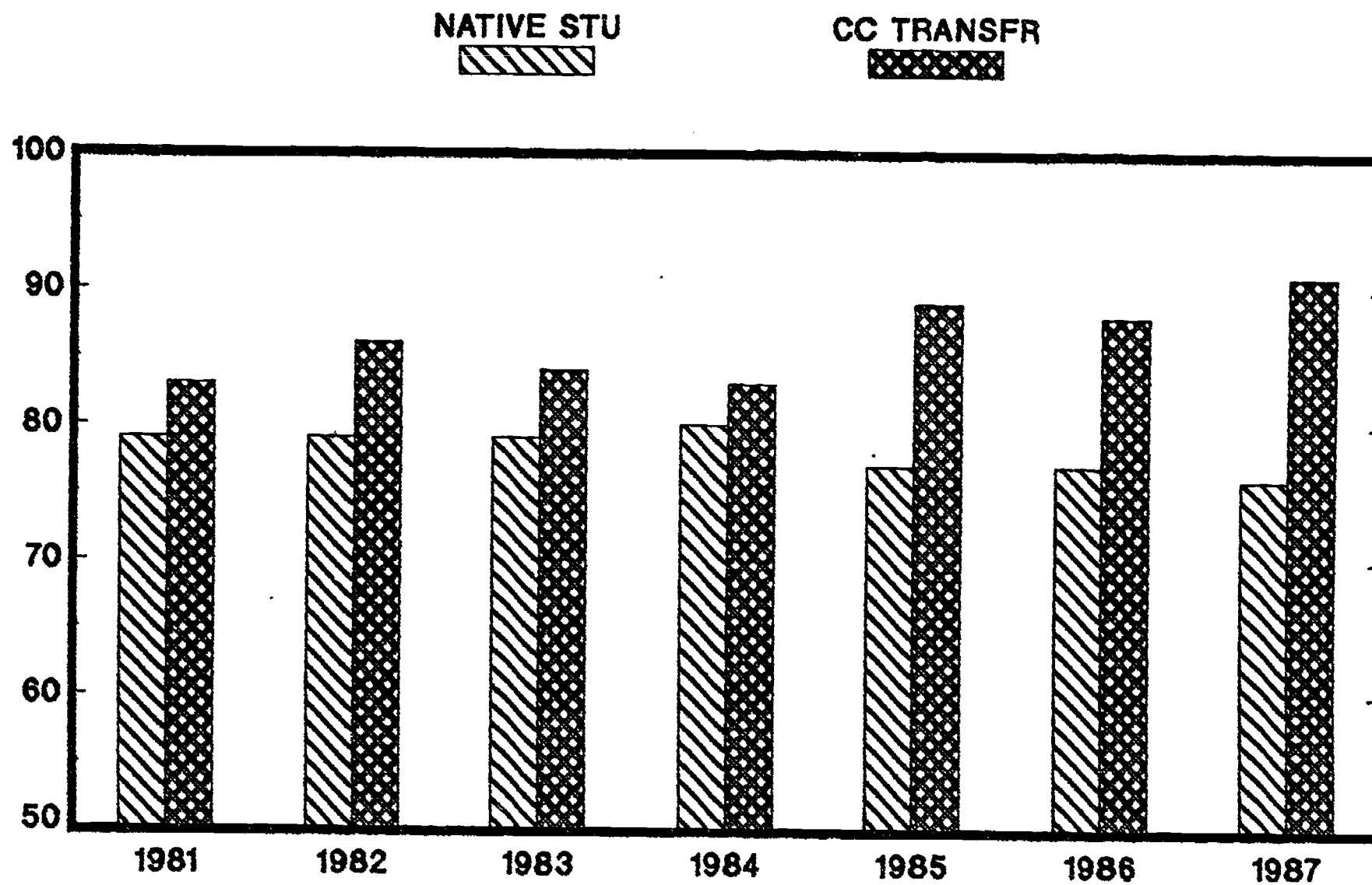

% OF GRADUATES WHO WERE MD RESIDENTS By Transfer Status

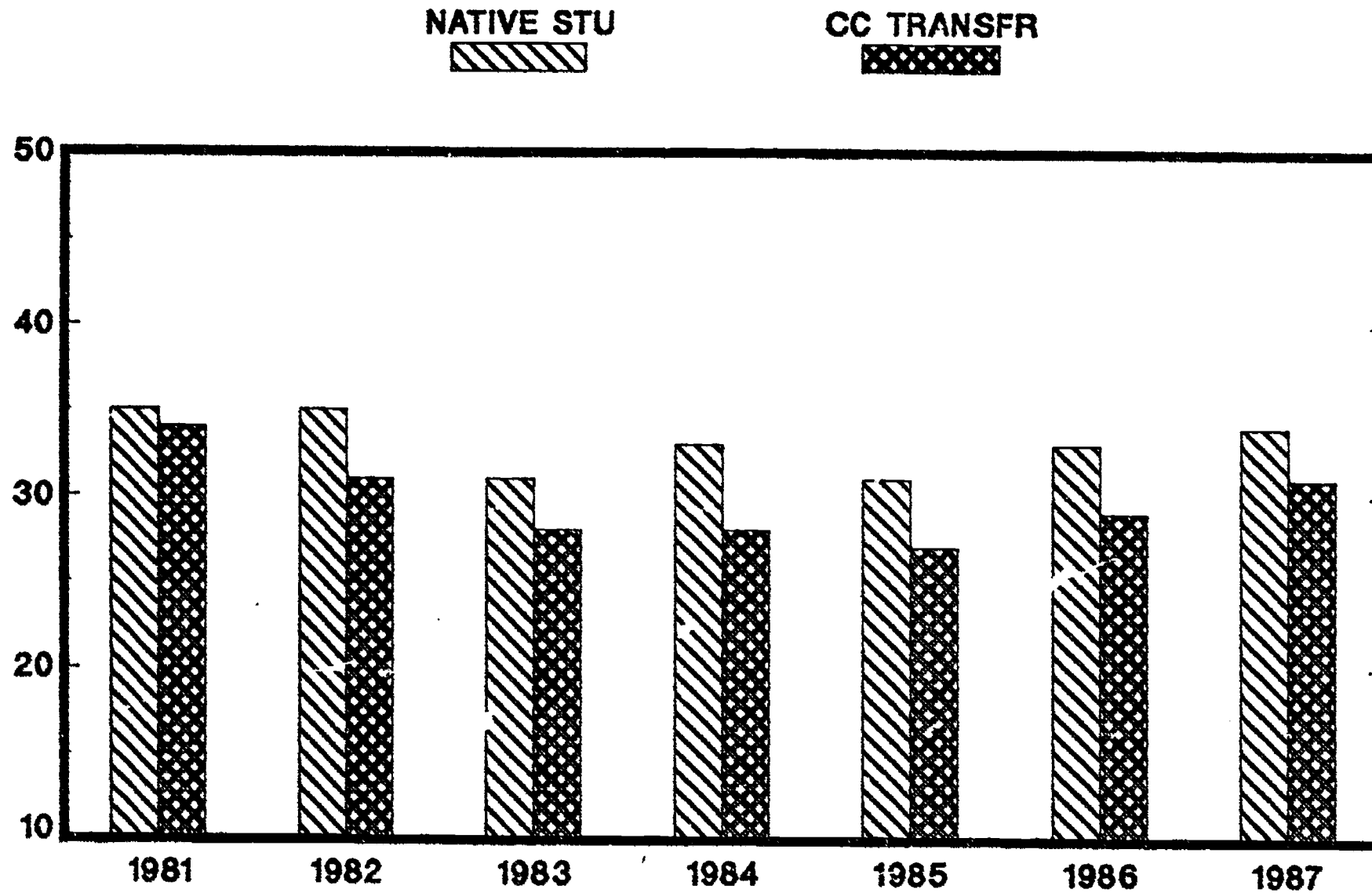

% OF GRADUATES WHO RE-ENROLLED IN COLLEGE By Transfer Status

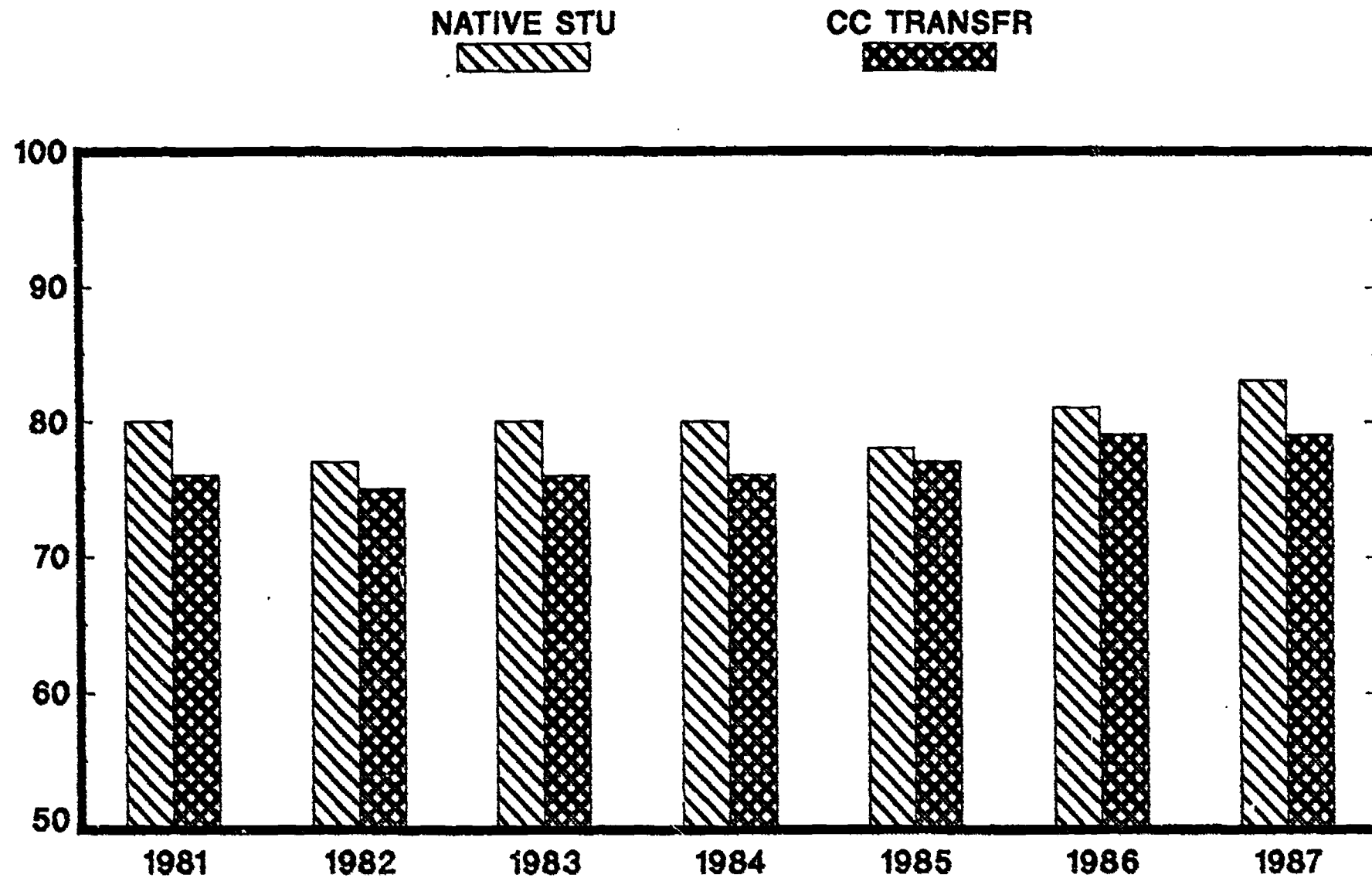


**PERCENTAGE OF GRADUATES WHO REPORTED THAT THEY ULTIMATELY PLAN TO EARN A
GRADUATE OR PROFESSIONAL DEGREE, BY TRANSFER STATUS**

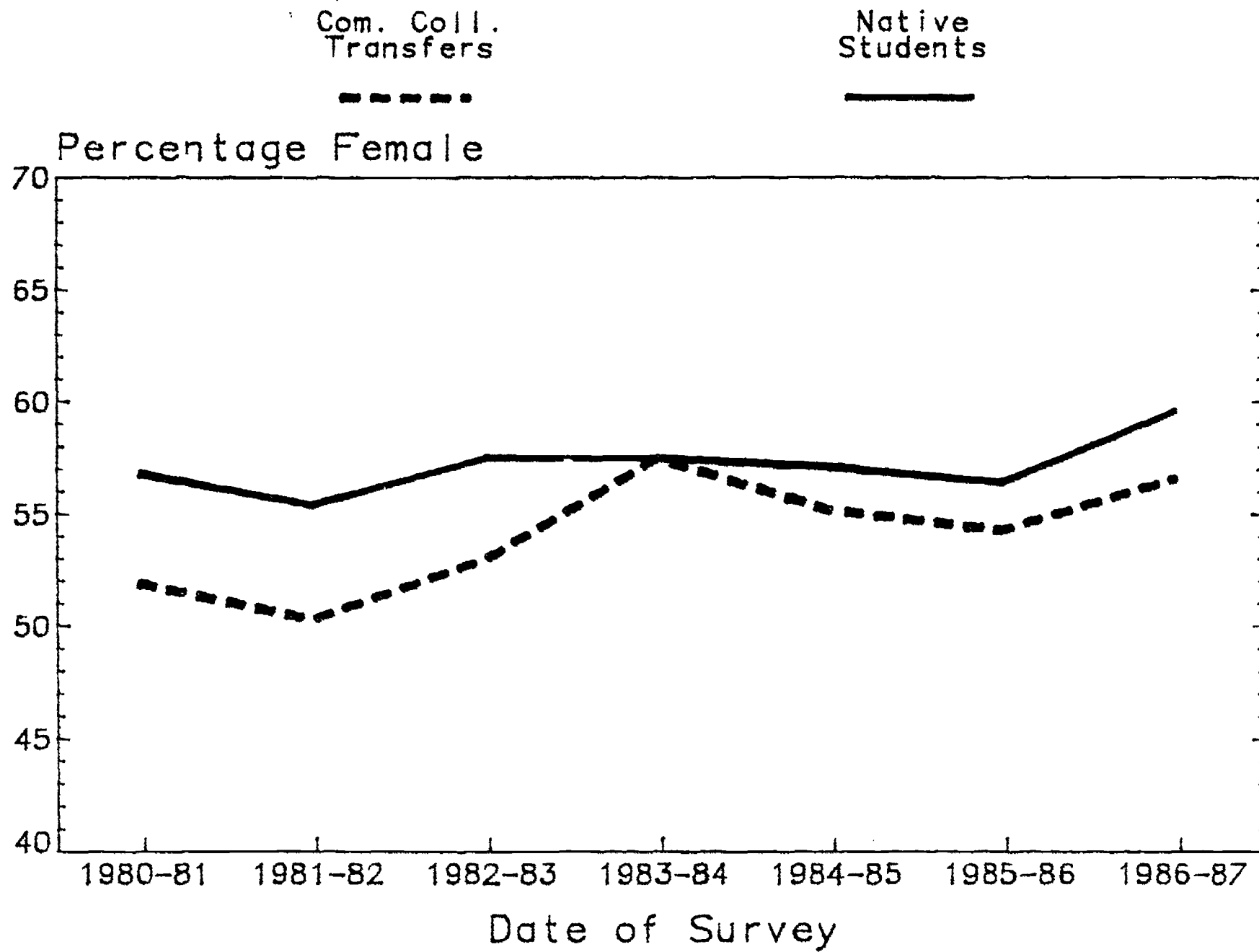

Percentage Female, by Origin and Date of Survey

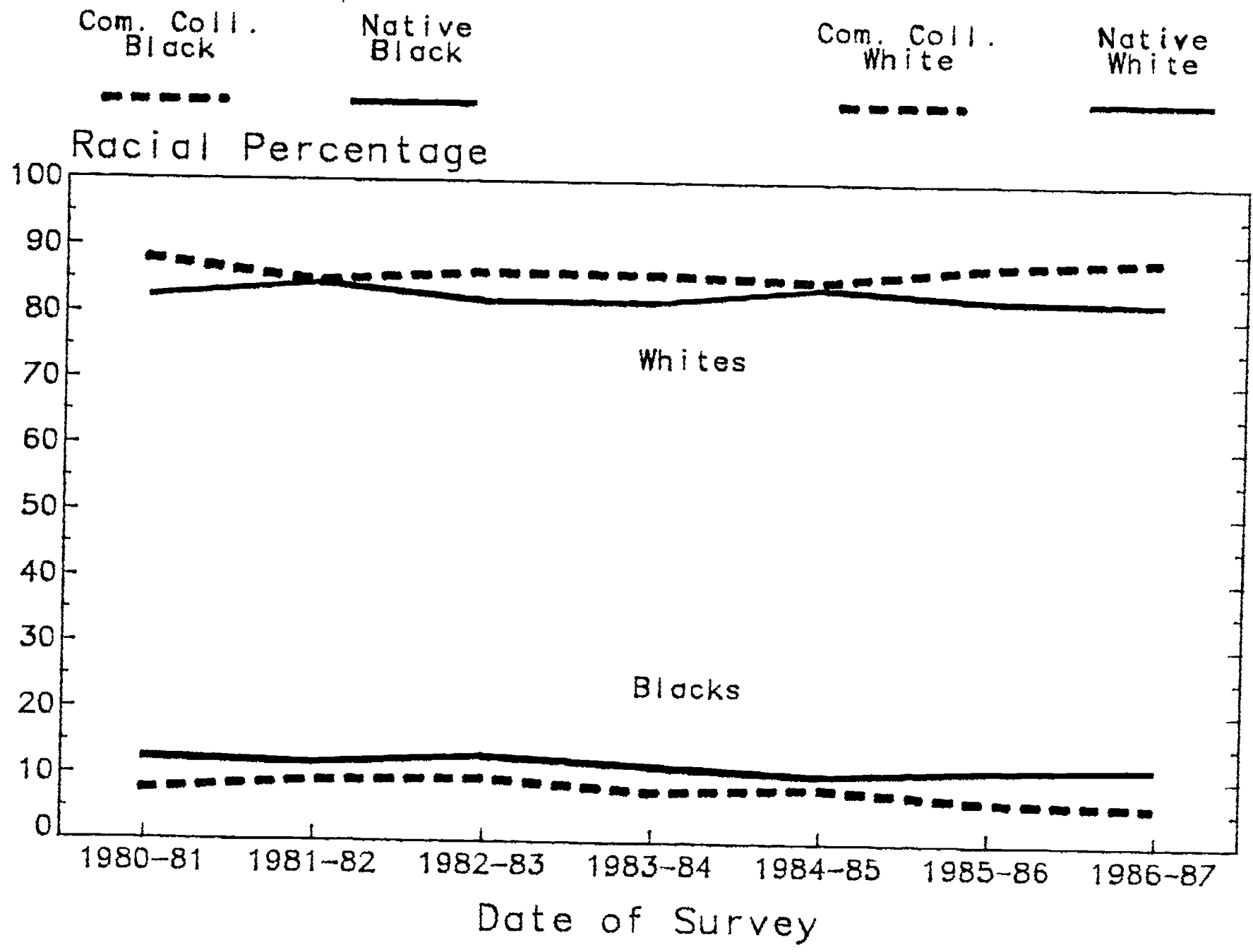

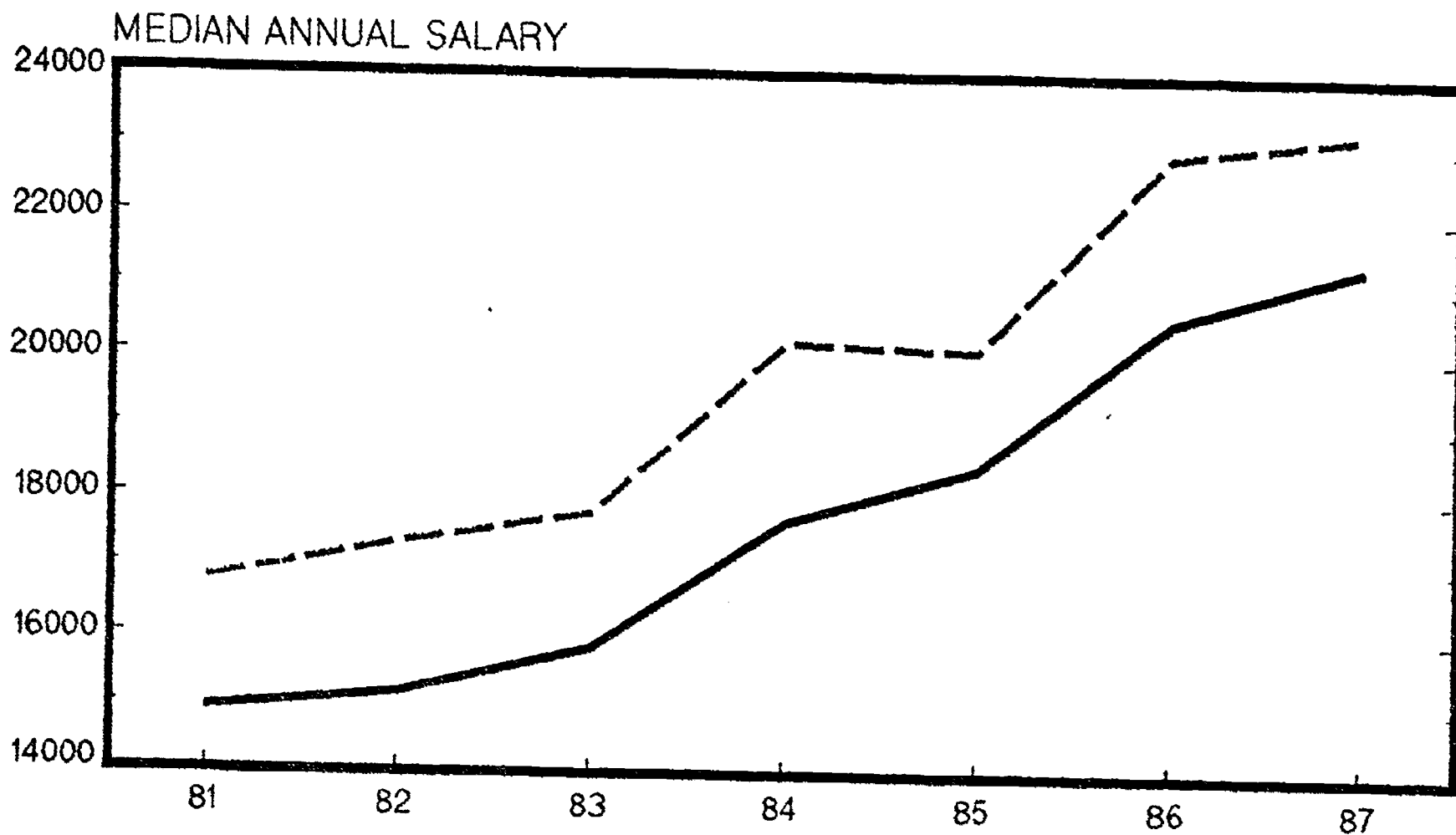
Racial Percentage, by Origin and Date of Survey

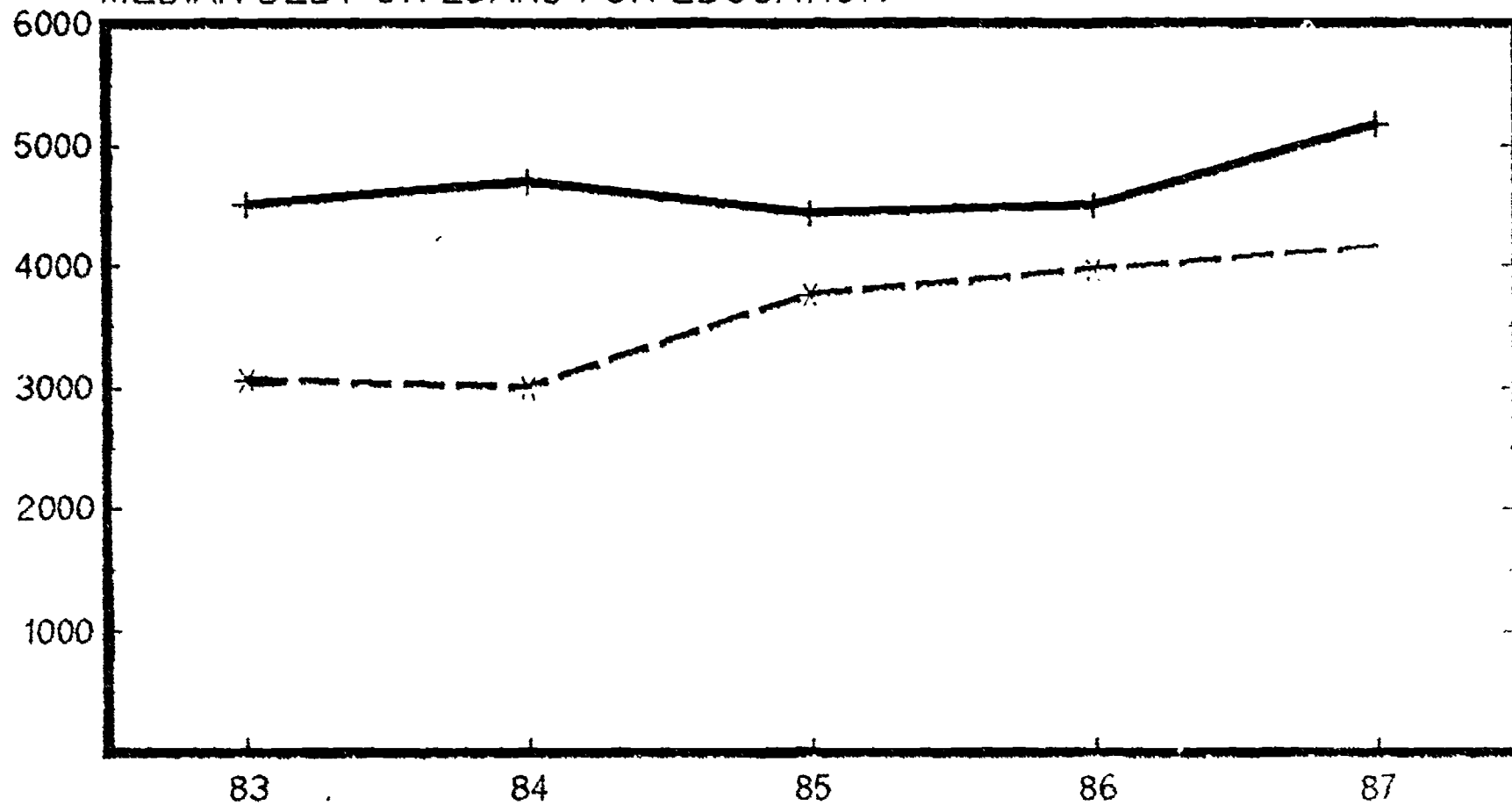
