ABSTRACT

Comparing regional and subregional division characteristics of public elementary and secondary education in the United States, this report presents selected key statistics for each of the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and 5 outlying areas. This report is based on responses to the "Public Elementary and Secondary School Universe" and the "Public Elementary and Secondary Education Agency Universe" surveys received from state education agencies in the spring and summer of 1989. Information for the school year 1988-89 is presented on the public schools by state, including: elementary and secondary schools; racial/ethnic composition of schools; students; teachers; and state agencies. A sample school universe survey form and an educational agency universe survey form are included. (KM)

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**Public Elementary and Secondary
Schools and Agencies in the United States
and Outlying Areas: School Year 1988-89**

This report is based on information from the 1988-89 "Public Elementary and Secondary School Universe" and the "Public Elementary and Secondary Education Agency Universe" in the United States. These data represent two of the surveys from the Common Core of Data (CCD) collected annually by the U.S. Department of Education's National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) which were presented in two separate reports for 1987-88. The tables in this report summarize statistical information and information for each school and education agency as supplied to NCES by State education agency officials.

Methodology

The sources of data for this report are the "Public Elementary and Secondary School Universe" and the "Public Elementary and Secondary Education Agency Universe." Responses to these surveys were received by NCES from State education agencies in the spring and summer of 1989. The data used here represent information incorporated into the files as of September 29, 1989. Data from the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and five outlying areas are included. Information from the outlying areas is included in the tables, but is not included in the United States totals.

Data for this report were provided by State education agencies from administrative records in their offices. The NCES and the State education agencies work cooperatively to assure comparability between data elements requested and reported.

In this report State totals of student membership are taken from the "State Nonfiscal Survey," while distribution of membership among the various school categories is calculated from individual school records in the "Public Elementary and Secondary School Universe" survey.

Assigning Student Counts for Reporting Purposes

Both the school and agency surveys have legitimate records that have no student counts. Schools offering special programs, such as special or vocational education, often operate as adjuncts to regular schools. In these situations, personnel accounting procedures may call for all students--and, in some cases, teachers--to be counted in the regular school, with the result that the special school has a count of zero. Some regular school districts contract with other agencies to provide services for some students rather than operate schools for these students directly. These student counts are not reported for the receiving district in order to avoid duplication. Conversely, in cases where all services are provided by a contracting district, no student counts are reported for the sending district.

Student counts are also not generally attributed to supervisory union administrative centers or regional education service agencies. Some of the tables in this publication include only records with students reported. Readers should note this when using data from these tables.

Adjustments for Data

Data for the Oklahoma 1988-89 CCD Education Agency Universe were lost through mishap. With the concurrence of the State CCD Coordinator, education agency information was imputed from school-level data. To do this, the name, address, ID numbers and other identifying codes were extracted from the final 1987-88 agency file. Two school districts that had closed since the previous year were removed from the file. The two levels of students collected with the agency universe, ungraded and grades prekindergarten (PK) through 12, were aggregated to agency level from the Oklahoma school data for 1988-89. A comparison of similar totals from both files for the 1987-88 collection showed agreement with few exceptions. Therefore, the totals from this year's school summary were used with no modification.

Data were not received from American Samoa for the education agency universe. Data used were taken from the CCD State Nonfiscal Survey submission from American Samoa.

Definitions and Abbreviations

Alternative education school--A public elementary/secondary school that addresses needs of students which typically cannot be met in a regular school. Provides nontraditional education and may be adjunct to a regular school.

Education agency--Government agency administratively responsible for providing public elementary or secondary instruction, or both, or educational support services.

Federally operated agencies--Any elementary, secondary, or combined education program operated by a Federal agency (such as the Bureau of Indian Affairs) reported by the CCD Coordinator.

Other agencies--Any elementary, secondary, or combined education program that cannot be appropriately classified using another CCD designation and which has been reported as such by the CCD Coordinator. In this report, these are grouped with federally operated agencies.

Public school--Institution that provides educational services, has one or more grade groups (PK-12) or is ungraded, has one or more teachers to give instruction, is located in one or more buildings, has an assigned administrator, receives public funds as primary support, and is operated by an education agency.

Public school membership--The unduplicated count of students on the roll of the school or district (excluding any formally enrolled students who withdrew from school), taken on the school day closest to October 1, 1988.

Regional education service agencies (RESA)--Agencies that provide special services to other public elementary and secondary education agencies.

Regular school--A public elementary/secondary school that does not focus primarily on vocational, special, or alternative education.

Regular school districts--Agencies responsible for providing free public elementary and secondary education for school-age children residing within their jurisdiction. These agencies sometimes include special and vocational education in a comprehensive educational setting.

School district--Education agency or administrative unit that operates under a public board of education.

Special education school--Public elementary/secondary school that focuses primarily on special education, including instruction for any of the following: hard of hearing, deaf, speech impaired, health impaired, orthopedically impaired, mentally retarded, seriously emotionally disturbed, multihandicapped, visually handicapped, deaf and blind; and has adapted curriculum, materials, or instruction for students served.

State education agency--The agency of the State charged with primary responsibility for coordinating and supervising public instruction, including the setting of standards for elementary and secondary instruction programs.

State-operated agencies--Any elementary, secondary, or combined education program operated by a State agency (such as State schools for the blind or deaf) reported by the CCD Coordinator.

Supervisory union administrative centers--Agencies that provide administrative services for a group of small school districts.

Vocational education school--Public elementary/secondary school that focuses primarily on vocational education, and provides education and training in one or more semi-skilled or technical occupations.

PK--Prekindergarten

K--Kindergarten
