#### ABSTRACT

Following the implementation of a matriculation plan at Rancho Santiago College (RSC), a study was conducted to examine the appropriateness of student course placement as assessed by faculty and students and to investigate faculty's perceptions of changes in students' skill level preparation over the past few years. Questionnaires were completed in class by the 2,315 students enrolled in 61 classes during the sixth week of the semester, and by the instructor of each section. Major findings of the surveys were as follows: (1) 90% of the students felt that they had been placed appropriately in the courses investigated; (2) there was little difference among student ethnic groups regarding students' perceptions of course placement, although a slightly larger percentage of Asians (8%) thought they should have been placed in a course at a higher level; (3) faculty reported that an average of 78% of the students in their courses has been appropriately placed and that an average of 19% should have been placed in a lower-level course; (4) 12% tc 23% of the faculty reported that students' skill levels had worsened over the past two years, with reasoning, writing, and study skills most often cited at lower skill levels; (5) 23% of the students reported feeling underprepared in study skills; (6) there was a significant difference between students' self-reported grades at the time of the survey and students' anticipated final grades; and (7) overall, students more often assessed themselves as prepared for success than did faculty. An appendix contains the responses to each survey question for each course by both students (by ethnic group) and by faculty. The survey instruments are attached. (JMC)

#### Course Placement Study

#### Introduction

Educational reform efforts at the community college level have been taking place since the second half of the 1980's. At Rancho Santiago College those efforts have included programs which ensure that students are placed in courses for which they are prepared to succeed in terms of their basic skills.

In Fall 1988, recommended reading levels for all RSC courses were determined and published in the college catalog. Matriculation has been in the implementation stages for the last three years and includes activities such as basic skills assessment testing, small group advisement for students, large group orientation-to-college sessions, and follow-up of students' progress. This study represents one component of RSC's matriculation evaluation project by which the potential impacts of these new programs are measured. In this case, the focus of the study is upon the appropriateness of student course placement as assessed by the faculty and students themselves.

#### Purpose

The purposes of this study included: 1) assessing students' perceived appropriateness of course placement, given the course placement policies which have been implemented at RSC over the past few years, 2) determining whether ethnic groups differed in their self-assessment of course placement appropriateness, 3) determining faculty's perceived appropriateness of student course placement, and 4) determining whether faculty has perceived changes in students' skill level preparation over the past few years.

#### **Method**

In Fall 1989, 15 courses were chosen for study. Questionnaires were completed in class by the 2315 students enrolled in 61 classes during the sixth week of the semester, and by the instructor

of each section. The questionnaires asked students if they thought that they were appropriately placed in the course and if they had the specific skills preparation to succeed in that course. The faculty questionnaires asked the same things of faculty about students. The grouped responses to those surveys are analyzed in this report. The appendix contains responses to each survey question for each course, by student ethnicity group.

In addition, the same faculty survey was administered to faculty of a random sample of all Fall 1989 class sections. The response rate was not particularly high (35 faculty responded), but the value in those responses is in comparing the responses to those of the above group for a reliability check.



# Students' and Faculty's Perceptions of Appropriateness of Course Placement (Table 1)

Do students enrolled in the courses studied think that they were appropriately placed in those courses, or that they should have been placed in a higher or lower course?

Ninety percent of the students responded that they "belong" in the course. Five percent thought that they should have been placed in a lower level course, and another 5% thought that they should have been placed in a higher level course.

#### Does this differ by course?

The course for which the lowest percentage of students responded that they "belong" in the course was English 061, with 83% in that category; 14% thought that they should have been placed higher. Twelve percent of English N60 students also thought that they should have been placed in a higher level. But 10% of Psychology 100 students thought that they should have been placed in a lower level course. Students in other courses had responses close to the average for this question (90%), with Engineering students reporting the highest rate of appropriate placement.

#### Does this differ by ethnicity?

The range of student-perceived appropriate placement by ethnic group was 86% to 92%, with white students most often feeling appropriately placed. In the "I should have been placed higher" category, Asians had the largest percentage, 8%. In the "I should have been placed lower" category, Hispanics had the highest percentage, with 7%. The percentage of students feeling inappropriately placed and the differences among ethnic groups on this item, however, are small.

Do faculty of the studied courses believe that the students in those courses were appropriately placed, or that they should have been placed in higher or lower courses? Does this differ by course? Are faculty's perceptions consistent with those of students?

Faculty of the courses studied reported that an average of 78% of the students were

appropriately placed, and an average of 19% should have been placed at a lower level. Only the faculty of Biology 109 responded that a significant percentage, 50%, of the students should have been placed in a higher level course. Faculty of Accounting 101, English N60, Political Science 101, and Psychology 100 reported that an average of 25% or greater of the students should have been placed in a lower level.

There were significant differences between student and faculty opinions on this measure for all courses, with faculty responding that larger average percentages of students should have been placed at <u>lower</u> levels than students responded for this. The discrepancies of opinion between students and faculty were greater than fifteen percentage points for Accounting 101, English N60, English 061, English 101, Political Science 101, and Psychology 100. For example, only 3% of English 061 students thought that they should have been placed at a lower level, but faculty responded that an average of 19% should have been placed at a lower level.







## Student and Faculty Assessment of Student Skills (Tables 2 and 3)

Do students enrolled in the courses studied think that they have adequate skills to succeed in courses?

Eighty-five percent of the students responded that they think they have the overall skills needed to be successful in the course being studied. Students were most confident in their reading and communication skills, with 88% of the students responding that they were adequately prepared in these skills. On the other hand, students responded that they were least prepared in math and study skills, with only 77% feeling prepared in these skills.

#### Does this differ by ethnicity?

White students more often responded that they were adequately prepared in every skill area (except math) than did ethnic minority students. A smaller percentage of Asian students responded that they were adequately prepared, in every skill area except math, than any other ethnic group.

Do faculty think that those same students have adequate skills to succeed in courses? Are faculty's perceptions consistent with those of students?

Faculty most often reported that students were "somewhat prepared" in each skill area for course success. Thirty percent of faculty responded that students were not prepared in writing skills and in reasoning skills, and 33% reported the same for study skills. It is curious that only 11% of faculty reported that students lacked in <u>overall</u> preparation for success, but larger percentages of faculty rated students as lacking in preparation in all other <u>specific</u> skill areas.

Again, faculty ganarally rated students lower in skills preparation than students rated themselves.

Both groups of respondents gave study skills relatively lower ratings of preparation.

#### Faculty's Perception of Changes in Student Skills (Table 4)

Do faculty think that students' skills have improved, remained the same, or worsened in the past two years?


Several educational reforms have been implemented within the last few years, including matriculation and Title V course prerequisites. So it is appropriate to ask faculty if they think that students entering their classroums are improving in terms of preparation in specific skills. Most faculty responded that student skills were unchanged, from 67% to 73%, depending upon the skill. A few, from 7% to 18%, noted an improvement. However, 12% to 23% responded that skills had worsened. Study skills and writing skills were most frequently mentioned as worsened skills. Math and reading skills were most frequently mentioned as improved skills. Again, 18% of faculty reported that students' overall skills had improved, and this rating is slightly inconsistent in terms of being high compared to their ratings of specific skills of students.

Students' Current Course Grade, Anticipated Course Grade, and Grade Relationship to Appropriateness of Course Placement (Tables 5 and 6)

is there a difference between students' current self-reported grade in the courses studied and the grade that they anticipate they will finally receive?

In an attempt to assess students' abilities to realistically assess their own progress and abilities, students were asked what their current grades in the surveyed course were and what they anticipated their final grades would be. Students reported generally that their final grades would be higher than current grades. While 47% reported that they currently had an A or B in the course, 72% anticipated receiving an A or B for a final grade. While 9% were earning a D or F at the time of the survey, none expected a D or F as a final grade.

(The total college final grade distribution includes 32% A's & B's and 10% D's & F's)

Do students who are currently earning a low grade in the courses studied more often report that they were inappropriately placed in that course?

Of the 341 students who were currently earning a D, F, NCr, or W in the course, 16% reported that they should have been placed a lower level. This compares to 5% of the total survey population (see Table 1).

# Ethnic Distribution of Students in Courses Studied and of Students Who Completed Placement Tests (Tables 7 and 8)

#### What is the ethnic distribution of the students in the courses studied?

Of all students surveyed, 50% were ethnic minority and 50% white. Hispanics comprised the second largest group, 23%. The range of minority enrollment among the courses studied was 20% (Engineering) to 61% (English N60). The largest percentage of Asians was in Accounting 301 and 102, 30% each.

# What percentage of students enrolled in the courses studied took the Math, English, and Reading placement tests prior to enrolling?

Eighty percent of all students in studied courses reported that they had completed these tests.

Basic skills courses, English and Math, had the largest percentage of test completers, as would be expected according to RSC assessment policies.

#### Does this differ by ethnicity?

Ethnic minority student groups had higher rates of assessment test completion than did white students (75%), and a larger percentage of Hispanics were tested (88%) than any other ethnic category.

# Results of Survey of Faculty Selected Randomly (Table 9, 10, & 11)

Did these faculty think that students were adequately prepared in specific skill areas? How does this compare to the responses of the other sample of faculty?

These respondents more frequently rated students' skill levels as somewhat or adequately prepared than did the other faculty sample. Again, however, students were often perceived as inadequately prepared in study skills.

At what rates did these faculty respond that students were appropriately placed, or should have been placed lower or higher levels? How does this compare to the responses of the other sample of faculty?

Seventy-six percent of these faculty believed that their students were correctly placed, compared to 78% of the other sample. A sizeable percentage, 22%, believed that their students should have been placed in a lower level course. And only 3% balleved that their students should have been placed at a higher level. This distribution of responses in similar to that of the other faculty sample.

Did these faculty think that students' skills had improved, remained the same, or worsened over the past two years? How does this compare?

Overall, a larger percentage of these respondents thought that specific skills of students have worsened than those who thought that skills had improved. The largest percentage of respondents, however, thought that students' skills had remained the same. Compared to the other sample of faculty, the responses of this group are much more varied. That is, the previous sample more frequently reported that students' skills had remained the same, and this sample is more widely spread among the three response options: skills improved, skills remained the same; skills worsened.

#### Summary and Conclusions

- Most students (90%) reported that they thought that they had been placed appropriately in the courses studied. Their self-reported grades (as of the time of the survey) bears this out in that 77% were receiving an A, B, C, or Cr grade. By these measures, it would appear that, overall, RSC's placement policies are effective.
- There is little difference among student ethnic groups regarding students' perceptions of course placement, indicating that no bias is present in placement policies. A <u>slightly</u> larger percentage of Asians (8%) reported that they thought that they should have been placed in a course at a higher level. It is important here, and for other measures, to study the individual course responses to see where this phenomenon is most prevalent, because there are wide variations among courses.
- Faculty survey respondents, however, did not agree as consistently that students were appropriately placed. Faculty reported that an average of 78% of students in the courses studied were appropriately placed and that an average of 19% should have been placed in a lower level course. Faculty also more often reported that students are lacking in skills required for course success than did students.
- Furthermore, 12% to 23% of the faculty report that students' various skill levels have worsened over the past two years. 68% to 73% reported that student skills preparation has remained the same. There seemed to be a wide variation of opinion on this measure, but there is no question that students' skills preparation remains an issue to be addressed programmatically by the college.
- Faculty could be very helpful participants in the development of placement policies and in student skill improvement practices.



- Math and reading preparation, which are addressed by our assessment tests and placement policies, more frequently were identified as improved skills by faculty. Study skills, reasoning, and writing were more often cited by faculty as worsened skills; these skills are not assessed by current RSC matriculation procedures. This may indicate, again, that current assessment practices are effective but need to be broadened to address other skills.
- Students also more often reported feeling not prepared in study skills (23% of the students).
   Faculty concurred with this. This finding has important implications for program planning.
- A finding in need of explanation is that, while more Asian students than students of other ethnic groups thought that they should have been placed at higher course levels, Asians also more often responded that they were lacking in skills preparation (in all skills except math).
- Interestingly, there was a significant difference between students' self-reported grades at the time
  of the survey and students' anticipated final grades, which were expected to be much higher. This
  doesn't seem to reflect realistic self-assessment.
- The gap between faculty perceptions and student perceptions regarding adequacy of student skills requires further interpretation. Students more often assess themselves as prepared for success than do faculty. Are students' assessments unrealistic and in need of counseling, or do faculty have unrealistic expectations?
