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ABSTRACT

Data were gathered from 460 private colleges and universities to produce this annual survey of full-time faculty salaries by discipline and rank. The faculty salaries of 43,533 faculty members are represented in the data tables, organized by 54 selected disciplines. In each discipline, the faculty ranks of professor, associate professor, assistant professor, new assistant professor, and instructor are analyzed. The tables include average salary; high salary; low salary; the faculty mix percentage; and the salary factor, which permits comparisons between the average salary of a faculty member in a given rank and the average of all faculty members in that rank in all reporting institutions. An appendix lists institutions participating in the survey. (JDD)

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

For the eighth straight year (1982-83 through 1989-90) the College and University Personnel Association in Washington, D.C., in conjunction with Appalachian State University in Boone, North Carolina, have researched and produced an annual survey of faculty salaries by discipline and rank in the nation's private colleges and universities. This current survey, the CUPA 1989-90 National Faculty Salary Survey by Discipline and Rank in Private Colleges and Universities, involved 460 private colleges and universities.

Eight additional disciplines have been added to the survey during the past three years. In 1986-87 the survey consisted of 46 disciplines. The following three disciplines were added in 1987-88: Allied Health, Engineering and Engineering-Related Technologies, and Protective Services; two disciplines were added in 1988-89, Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy; and three disciplines were added in 1989-90, economics, institutional management, and marketing management and research, bringing the current total to 54 disciplines.

A "broad brush" comparison of increases in annual overall salary averages for all ranks in the surveys of private colleges and universities over the last six years (including the "base year" of 1984-85) are listed below. Please note that although a majority of the participating colleges and universities are the same in each of the six years, there is a significant minority of colleges and universities which are different.

The reader should note that "special studies," "tailored studies," and "percentile rank studies," all based on relevant data from the annual surveys, may be requested from CUPA for nominal fees. These studies of 10 or more similar-type institutions rather than the average annual salary for all ranks, may be more applicable to the line administrator who propounds salary considerations. (Note that confidentiality is retained by CUPA with no cell data being reported which has less than three elements, and no individual institutional names are reported.)

Finally, for those persons interested in salary changes within individual disciplines over time, "rolling" three-year salary-trend studies have been written annually for all the applicable disciplines beginning in 1986 for the years of 1982-83 through 1985-86, etc. These articles have been accepted in the national ERIC publication: Resources in Education.

INTRODUCTION

The Background

The College and University Personnel Association (CUPA) is dedicated to supporting human resource professionals associated with higher education around the world by disseminating current theory, methodology, and research results on personnel issues.

In 1974, the CUPA Board of Directors proposed establishing a survey of faculty compensation (page 2, CUPA Wingspread Conference, March 1977; and September 1977, Chairman's Report). The CUPA Faculty and Staff Relations Council took responsibility for planning, developing, and conducting a pilot model of faculty salaries by discipline and by rank. In 1980, the Council developed a pilot faculty salary questionnaire, along with rationale, instructions, and defini-They sent the questionnaire to colleagues in 13 diverse CUPA colleges and universities who critiqued it. A review of the respondents' comments indicated that a model already in use by Oklahoma State University best met survey needs. The results of the critique process were submitted by the Council to the CUPA Board of Directors for approval. Once the Board granted permission, CUPA representatives met with appropriate officials at the American Association or State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) to mount a pilot survey of 21 general and specific disciplines among the AASCU members. Later, during 1982-83, a similar-type survey but with many more disciplines/program areas, was mounted for private colleges and universities with 299 institutions participating. Subsequently, 355 private colleges and universities participated in 1983-84, 446 participated in 1984-85, 440 participated in 1985-86, 478 participated in 1986-87, 475 participated in 1987-88, 470 participated in 1988-89, and 460 participated this academic year, 1989-90. In all, over the period of eight years (1982--83 through 1989-90), 915 private colleges and universities have participated in the CUPA national faculty salary surveys by discipline and rank at least Sixty-four (64) institutions have participated in each of the eight years of the survey.

This 1989-90 survey is a further step in the long-term plan to collect as complete information about faculty salaries as is possible. Sustaining collection of data on the same number of disciplines and institutions over a number of years will eventually establish a data base capable of extensive analyses of faculty salaries. Continuing this year (1989-90), the survey is conducted every fall semester and includes most of the 50 two-digit program areas in A Classification of Instructional Programs and many of the four- and six-digit areas. The results will be released at the beginning of each new year so that these current data can be effectively used by line administrators in a timely fashion.

For the sixth straight year additional information was collected from participating colleges and universities which held collective bargaining contracts with their faculties. It is anticipated that this will continue so that "special studies" can be subsequently effectuated for requesting institutions at a nominal fee.

Also, for the sixth straight year, we are listing in APPENDIX B the names



of all participating institutions for each of the eight years of the survey. We encourage institutions to participate each year so we can provide them with relevant and timely trend data in addition to the special studies that may be requested.

This year's survey, 1989-90, includes three new disciplines: economics, institutional management, and marketing management and research. With these three additional disciplines to the survey, it now totals 54 academic disciplines.

The reader's comments, suggestions, and questions are encouraged and appreciated at any time.

The Need

Current data on faculty salaries are presently being collected each year by the National Center for Education Statistics. The data, however, are not collected at the level of detail required to answer basic questions pertaining to variances in salaries between and among disciplines and ranks. What are missing are salary data in different ranks and within specific disciplines for similar and/or different types of institutions. The need to address problems of salary allocation with respect to postsecondary faculty in different disciplines and ranks motivated the decision not only to initiate the first survey but to continue it over these past few years.

Applications

This survey attempts to address the above needs by collecting the salary data of faculty teaching in 54 disciplines of participating private colleges and universities in America, and comparing the average, low, and high salaries across these disciplines by faculty ranks. The disciplines selected for this survey are those, it is hoped, that are most likely to be taught in the 460 institutions which participated in the survey this year, 1989-90. Also collected are the percentages of teaching faculty by rank in a given discipline.

Such comparative information can be useful to the postsecondary administrator in at least two ways. The community of postsecondary institutions may be thought of as an academic marketplace. Faculty and administrators negotiate remuneration for service of teaching and other responsibilities. In this marketplace a faculty member needs to know what to request based on the salaries of her or his peers. The administrator needs to know how much to pay for quality faculty without committing more than she or he can justify for the budget.

Detailed salary information is also useful in long-range budgetary planning. Applying estimates of changes in costs, such as the Consumer Price Index or the Higher Education Price Index, to faculty salaries will enable a post-secondary administrator to project future faculty salary costs.

The use of the salary information is enhanced by knowing the characteristics of the institutions in the comparison group. Since this faculty salary survey collects institutional characteristics of geographical location, enrollment, budget and FEE of students, an institution can request special studies comparing itself with a group of peers--10 or more institutions--using these characteristics for selection. These special studies are available through CUPA. No individual institutional data will be released by CUPA. The special



scudies data are aggregate data of 10 or more institutions with three or more data elements in each cell.

For the sixth straight year participating institutions may request, for a nominal fee, percentile rank (PR) studies which will provide them with both a percentile ranking for each discipline and each rank in each discipline in comparison with 10 or more other participating institutions. Most importantly, we are able to provide a participating institution with the amount of additional funds it would take to increase its average salary by discipline and rank to a higher PR--e.g., from a 40 PR to a 50 PR. This application of percentile ranking has become an important and relevant aspect of our annual faculty salary survey and we encourage participating institutions to take advantage of this service.

Finally, those 267 institutions which participated in the fifth (1986-87) and eighth (1989-90) surveys may request salary-trend studies by selected discipline and/or by all disciplines in the study comparing their institutions both with the whole group of participating institutions and/or with a selected number of 10 or more.

Other institutions which have participated in at least one of the eight surveys may have their data compared with the trend data in any configuration they recommend of 10 or more institutions. (Please know that only cells with three or more data elements are used.) Institutions which have not participated in any of the eight annual surveys may still request salary data of 10 or more institutions which have participated in any one or more of the eight surveys.

SURVEY RESULTS

Methodology

This <u>CUPA 1989-90 National Faculty Salary Survey by Discipline and Rank in Private Colleges and Universities</u> collected and tabulated full-time salary data for faculty in 54 selected disciplines. These were chosen from among the disciplines defined by the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) Taxonomy and/or by <u>A Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP)</u>, 1985. Please see APPENDIX A for the list of disciplines/major fields used. The faculty salaries of 43,533 faculty members are found in APPENDIX A--The Data Tables. The list of 460 private institutions are found in APPENDIX B which includes the lists of all the private colleges and universities which have participated in the annual survey since its inception in 1982-83 through 1989-90.

Analysis of Data

To organize the data and permit comparisons between disciplines and by ranks, the following variables were selected: average salary, high salary, low salary, and number of faculty for a given rank and discipline. The variables and other terms arrived at in the tabulations of the data are defined below.

NOTE: Users of this survey may find the category "New Assistant Professor" especially useful in making new hiring decisions since most new faculty in academe are hired at this rank.

Definition of Terms

SALARY--based on a nine- or ten-month academic year salary of full-time faculty only; does not include any faculty members teaching less than 51 percent. Salary for summer academic work, fringe benefits, and perquicites are not included in the salary data.

AVERAGE SALARY--based on the survey information with the assumption that all employees were full-time. The average salary displayed is an average of all faculty reported for a given rank and discipline.

HIGH SALARY--the highest salary for any full-time individual of the defined group for which the information is reported.

LOW SALARY--the lowest salary for any full-time individual of the defined group for which the information is reported.

FAC MIX PCT--the percentage of faculty in a given discipline/major field who hold a given academic rank. For example, a FAC MIX PCT of .36 for associate professor implies that 36 percent of the faculty in that discipline/major field hold the rank of associate professor.

SALARY FACTOR--for a given rank of a given discipline/major field, the ratio of the average salary to the total average salary of all institutions. For example, a SALARY FACTOR of 1.21 for assistant professors



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of accounting means that their average salary is 21 percent higher than the average salary of all assistant professors of all institutions which participated in the survey.

NUM--the number of faculty members whose salaries were included to compute the average salary.

N/IS--the number of institutions that have reported salary data for a given academic rank and discipline/major field.

PARTICIPATING INSTITUTIONS--the number of institutions responding to the survey questionnaire.

NEW ASST PROF--the grouping of assistant professors who were hired for the first time in the Fall of 1989. All data for this group were included in the ASST PROF group for reporting purposes. Data in this group are used mainly for new hiring information.

Examples of Analyses

Although no overall analysis has been undertaken in this survey report, it is important to illustrate the types of analyses possible using the data available. The following tables show the comparative potential of the data for two major fields: BUSINESS ECONOMICS AND COMMUNICATIONS.

1. Size of the Sample: The user should note the size of the sample on which each percentage or dollar value is based. The smaller the number in the group, the greater the effect of extreme scores on a descriptive statistic such as the average. Both the number of faculty was larger for COMMUNICATIONS (C) as compared to BUSINESS ECONOMICS (BE) and the number of institutions for COMMUNICATIONS was also somewhat higher:

4. Faculty Mix Percentage (FAC MIX PCT): The percentages of faculty in each rank are dissimilar. For example, in BUSINESS ECONOMICS 24 percent of the faculty hold the rank of PROFESSOR as compared with COMMUNICATIONS where 18 percent of the faculty hold the rank of PROFESSOR. This clearly indicates that BUSINESS ECONOMICS is an "old" discipline whereas COMMUNICATIONS is a relatively "new" discipline. Comparisons for all ranks between the two major fields are as follows (note that NEW ASST PROF percentage is included in ASST PROF and each percentage has been rounded up):

It is interesting to note how the faculty mix percentage differs among the relatively "new" major field of NURSING (N) and an "old" one, PHILOSOPHY AND RELIGION (PR), and how these differences compare vith the overall average of ALL MAJOR FIELDS (AMF) in the survey. The comparisons for the major fields of NURSING (N), PHILOSOPHY AND RELIGION (PR), and for the overall study average of ALL MAJOR FIELDS (AMF) are as follows:

5. Salary Factor: This variable permits comparisons between the average salary of a faculty member in a given rank and the average salary of all faculty members in that rank in all reporting institutions. A constant number--100 percent--represents the average salary of all faculty in that rank for all reporting institutions. The following data show, for example, in BUSINESS ECONOMICS (BE) the average salary of PROFESSOR is 7 percent above the average salary of all PROFESSORS from all reporting institutions and is 12 per cent above the average salary of PROFESSORS in COMMUNICATIONS (C). The data show that for every rank the average salary for BUSINESS ECONOMICS faculty is higher than the average salary for COMMUNICATIONS faculty:


