ABSTRACT

Five tables present data concerning the distribution of 1988-89 high school graduates of New York State's public and nonpublic schools. The data were secured through the State Education Department's Basic Educational Data System and reflect the status of graduates in the fall of 1989. Table 1 presents trends in the college-going rate of New York public and nonpublic high school graduates from 1975 through 1989. Table 2 shows a 15-year trend of the college-going rate, within and outside New York State. Tables 3, 4, and 5 show, respectively, the distribution of 1988-89 high school graduates of public schools, nonpublic schools, and public/nonpublic schools combined. INTRODUCTION

The following tables present data concerning the distribution of 1988-89 high school graduates of New York State's public and nonpublic schools. The data were secured through the Education Department's Basic Educational Data System and reflect the status of graduates, as reported by school principals, in the fall of 1989.

Table 1 presents trends in the college-going rate of high school graduates from 1975 through 1989. Table 2 shows a 15-year trend of the college-going rate, within and outside New York State.

Tables 3, 4 and 5 show, respectively, the distribution of 1988-89 high school graduates of public schools, nonpublic schools and public/nonpublic schools combined. These tables are arranged by county within geographic region.
