ABSTRACT

The SAIE was created to facilitate the sharing of experiences and expertise both among academic institutions in the United States in South Africa, and in other countries and among assistance agencies in the United States and abroad. One list is alphabetically arranged by area of program initiative such as: academic exchange, admissions test preparation, book donations, bursaries (internal), church leadership development, conflict resolution, distance education, English as a Second Language, faculty development, fellowships, health, institutional linkages, issue-oriented programs, management, refugee education/assistance, resource centers, scholarships (external), seminars/conferences, student activity/fundraising, teacher training, and women. The second list is alphabetically arranged by the 82 participating institutions. In addition, general comments that were made by some of the responding institutions are also included.

U.S COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY INITIATIVES FOR CHANGE IN SOUTH AFRICA:
An Update

Introduction

The Institute of International Education (IIE) is a nonprofit organization headquartered in New York that has worked in educational programs in 145 countries around the world and with universities and colleges in the United States. In 1979, it launched a scholarship program for black South Africans to study in the United States. A unique partnership--IIE, U.S. colleges and universities, the U.S. Government, private donors, the Educational Opportunities Council in Johannesburg--has brought more than 800 black South Africans to the United States for advanced education and training in the sciences, engineering, agriculture, mathematics, economics, business administration, and related fields.

One of the key motivating factors in the establishment of the South African Information Exchange (SAIE) on the part of IIE and the initial funders, The Ford Foundation and the Carnegie Corporation of New York, was the need to respond to the many requests and inquiries for information from U.S. colleges and universities wishing to initiate South Africa-related programs in addition to scholarships.

As part of that mandate, the SAIE sponsored a workshop in November 1987, whose purpose was to explore some of the issues attendant upon planning, starting, and implementing a South African program. Working Paper Number 3, "U.S. College and University Initiatives to Expand Educational Opportunities for Black South Africans," was one product of that workshop (other titles in the working paper series are listed on the back cover).

We continued to receive such a large number of inquiries from U.S. colleges and universities for information about programs being carried out on other campuses that in early 1988 we began keeping a running alphabetical guide to U.S. college and university existing and proposed programs, in order to have a draft document ready to send out upon request.

We entered information on an ongoing basis to keep the database current as we received new information from academic institutions. Finally, with events changing so rapidly in South Africa, the time seemed right to produce an update of Working Paper Number 3, on U.S. college and university initiatives for change in South Africa.

In early January 1990, we wrote to representatives from the 491 U.S. colleges and universities in our database. We asked them to respond to

a checklist of 25 initiatives--from academic exchange, to book donations, to faculty development, to institutional linkages, to visiting scholars--and to fill in any supplementary information in a blank marked "other." We received responses from 113 individuals.

We printed out the results of this initial effort and, in late February 1990, sent another mailing to the 113 people who had already responded, asking them to approve their material, and to the 378 who had not, giving them another chance to participate. This second mailing garnered 32 responses, bringing the total number of participants to 145 individuals from 126 institutions representing 761 different initiatives.

The responses are quite illuminating about the impressive array of South Africa-related activity among U.S. colleges and universities. We acknowledge that this is not a comprehensive, all-inclusive list. We may have overlooked important potential participants. As with all the working papers, the imperative is to share the information quickly and widely.

The product is two print-outs--one alphabetically by area of program initiative and one alphabetically by participating institution, as well as four pages noting some of the comments made in the "other" space.

The main reason for assembling this data is to facilitate the sharing of experiences and expertise both among academic institutions here, in South Africa, and abroad, and among assistance agencies here and abroad. Some institutions, as well as some donors, have been involved for many years; others are just getting started.

We hope that sharing this knowledge will lead to more U.S.-sponsored South Africa-related initiatives--for example, more exchange of progressive academics, training of black intellectuals, building of democratic institutions--at this crucial time in that country's history.

University of California/Berkeley: The nondegree fellowships are offered through the Career Development Fellowship Program and the graduate scholarships offered through the South African Education Program.

University of California/Los Angeles: Work/study.

University of Southern California: USC has just completed a South African theme semester on campus, offering 16 courses in which nearly 2,000 students participated. The South Africa program is developing into a more regional one, concerned not only with South Africa but with the Front Line States as well. Scholarship offerings were expanded this year to include Namibia; USC is looking at adding refugee assistance as well.

Clark University: A one-month summer program to help South African graduate students develop research related to southern Africa.

University of Colorado: Graduate student support at the University of Colorado.

Columbia University: The interns and visiting scholars are mostly at the Law School; the seminars are sponsored by the Institute of African Studies; teacher training takes place at Teacher's College.

Cornell University: Three-month Internship Program.

De Anza College: We only have the fellowship offered through the IIE's CDFP.

Denison University: "Bridging Education" is the summer orientation program for South African students going to U.S. colleges.

University of Detroit: Fundraising for Orlando Children's Home, Soweto.

Emory University: Conflict resolution is offered through the Carter Center.

Florida A&M University: Student participant training.

Georgetown University: The interns are about 15 recent Georgetown graduates who teach in Catholic high schools in South Africa. The institutional linkages are with high schools.

University of Georgia: Interested in information on institutional linkages.

Hartford Seminary: "Visiting Scholar" is in the process for the future.

Illinois State University: We have been open to tuition waivers (waivers of out-of-state portion) for black South Africans and would like to develop linkages with the black South African college and university communities, and explore faculty exchanges.

Indiana University: The programs listed are with Khanya college in South Africa.

Iowa State University: The institution did have an ESL program from 1986-88.

Los Angeles Community Colleges: The Institute for International Programs is working on a proposal to initiate an educational exchange program for technical/vocational education between its district and institutions in Lesotho and Zambia. The Institute has a South African student worker in its office.

Louisiana State University: Thesis research on LSU campus.

University of Maine: Faculty and student exchange.

Marquette University: Supportive services and communications.

Massachusetts Institute of Technology: MIT is helping the ANC establish a computer facility at the Solomon Mahlangu Freedom College in Tanzania.

Michigan State University: The fellowships are for refugee scholars.

University of Missouri System: The primary activities are academic exchange and institutional linkages and, while all four campuses are represented in this survey, they all form part of the University of Missouri System's agreement with the University of the Western Cape. Other disciplinary activities being pursued within the context of the primary initiatives include Dental Education, Labor Studies, Physics, Food and Nutrition Education, Botany, Computers in Education, Comparative Education, Library Science. The scholarships are carried out through IIE for students; all other activities are for faculty who have exchanged under their formal agreement with the University of the Western Cape.

Morehouse College: Although it has no existing programs for academic exchange or foreign study, it hopes to develop them in the near future.

New York University: Administrator Development.

The City University of New York/Graduate School and University Center: Each year the Graduate School makes available a full University Fellowship of \$10,000, with tuition waiver, to an entering full-time doctoral matriculant from South Africa in the Graduate School's Ph.D. program in Political Science.

University of Notre Dame: Peace studies.

Ohio State University: Working Group on South Africa faculty discussion and seminars.

University of Oregon: Many of these items are vague. I can say we provide for SAEP students and many have been involved in discussion groups/education about S.A.

University of Puget Sound: The Associated Students and Board of Trustees cosponsor a full scholarship through SAEP.

Rochester Institute of Technology: Exploring possibility of joint MBA program with a South African university.

Shippensburg University: Scholarships through the African-American Institute.

Susquehanna University: Scholarships through the Lutheran Church in America's scholarships for Namibians program. We would do [book donations] if only we knew how to.

Texas A&M University: Technology transfer.

Texas Lutheran College (not included in print-out): A range of 15 initiatives, all for Namibians.

Tufts University: At the suggestion of the President, Jean Mayer, the New England Board of Higher Education began a program of providing scholarships for black South Africans to attend one of the five open, English-speaking universities in South Africa. These funds were donated primarily by members of the NEBHE and administered by the UCT Fund. Further, Dr. Mayer convened a meeting in France at which 15 U.S. college presidents and officials met the five chancellors from the open universities.

Washington State University: Tuition waivers.

Wellesley College: Wellesley College participates in the Open Society Scholars Fund that provides annual scholarships for black South African students at their country's open universities. The College also provides financial aid funds to two nonwhite South African students at Wellesley.

Williams College: Scholarships--Financial aid based on need for scholarships awarded to admitted freshmen who apply through SAEP/IEE or U.S. private schools with contacts in South Africa such as St. Barnabas College. Bursaries--Financial assistance to cover room and board for black South African students in open universities through the Open Scholars Program of the University of Cape Town Fund/New England Board of Higher Education Program (Williams has provided two bursaries each year since the inception of the program).

Worcester Coalition on Southern Africa: Fundraising to meet special financial needs of S.A. students in the United States.

Yale University: The Resource Center is the Yale Library Collection. Bridging Education and Career Development indicate mid-career training for professionals and scholars. The Southern African Research Program (SARP) publishes a newsletter.
