ABSTRACT

A study was conducted of 66,581 students who initially enrolled in Illinois public community colleges in fall 1980 in either baccalaureate/transfer or occupational programs and who earned a baccalaureate degree from a public university in Illinois by 1989. The study did not include transfer students who did not earn a baccalaureate degree or students who transferred to a private or out-of-state senior institution. Major findings of the study included the following: (1) 10.4% of the students who initially enrolled in baccalaureate/transfer programs at a community college eventually earned degrees from public universities, compared to 3.4% of those who were initially enrolled in occupational programs; (2) full-time students had higher completion rates at the public universities than part-time students, males had higher rates than females, and students under 21 had higher rates than older students; (3) degree completion differed among racial/ethnic groups; (4) nearly 61% of the students who completed a baccalaureate degree did so within 5 years; and (5) baccalaureate completion rates for students of different community colleges varied from 15.2% to 1.2%. Detailed tables of study results are included. (JMC)

A STUDY OF FALL 1980 ILLINOIS COMMUNITY COLLEGE FRESHMEN  
EARNING BACCALAUREATE DEGREES FROM  
ILLINOIS PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES  
(1980-1988)

One of the many roles of community colleges is to prepare students to transfer to baccalaureate degree-granting colleges and universities. Recently, this function of the community colleges has received considerable attention in both the professional and popular literature. Unfortunately, there is a lack of follow-up information needed to monitor the progress of students after they transfer to another college or university. As a first step in addressing this problem, the twelve public universities in Illinois recently provided data on the students who earned baccalaureate degrees at their institutions between 1980 and 1988. These data have been matched against the Illinois Community College Board's student database to determine how many of the university graduates started their college careers at a public community college in Illinois. This report contains the preliminary analyses of these data based on those students who entered community colleges in fall 1980. Two colleges were excluded from the analyses: City Colleges of Chicago's Urban Skills Institute, which offered precollegiate level programs, and College of DuPage whose data could not be matched with the university records.

The reader should be aware that this report includes only information from the twelve public universities in Illinois. This study does not address the 30 to 35 percent of the Illinois community college transfer students who transfer to private baccalaureate degree-granting colleges and universities. It also excludes students transferring to institutions outside of Illinois. In addition, the number of students transferring to private and out-of-state institutions varies greatly among the community colleges in the state. For example, one college has as many as 100 percent of its transfer students attending public universities while the percentage drops to 27 percent for another. Because of these factors, extreme caution should be taken in comparing the data from one college with that of another college or in interpreting any of the statewide data as complete information on the system as a whole.

In fall 1980, community colleges in Illinois enrolled 113,642 students who had never attended a college before. About 60 percent of these students were enrolled in baccalaureate/transfer and occupational programs. For the purposes of this study only those students enrolled in these two program areas will be included in the fall 1980 cohort group. The remainder of the students were enrolled in precollegiate courses, continuing education courses, or had no course or program designation assigned to their records. While a few students from these latter groups earned baccalaureate degrees from Illinois public universities between 1980 and 1988, they will not be included in this analysis since there were no expectations that they would earn degrees.

Overall, 4,631 (7.0 percent) of the 66,581 students who started their college careers in community college baccalaureate/transfer or occupational programs earned degrees from the twelve public universities in Illinois. Percentages ranged from 15.2 percent at Illinois Valley Community College to 1.2 percent at State Community College and Kennedy-King College. Over 3,500 students (10.4 percent) who were enrolled in baccalaureate/transfer programs in fall 1980 and 1,107 of the occupational students (3.4 percent) earned degrees from the public universities. (See Table 1)

Northern Illinois University granted the largest number of degrees to students who began their college careers at community colleges (659). Southern Illinois University at Carbondale had the second largest number (649), followed by Illinois State University (636). The number of graduates from each of the twelve public universities is presented in Table 2. Since the actual number of students in the fall 1980 cohort group that transferred to each university is not known, the number of graduates should not be interpreted as completion rates.

Nearly 61 percent of the students who entered a community college in fall 1980 and later earned degrees did so within five years. Table 3 presents the percentages of students graduating by year of graduation for both groups of students analyzed. Baccalaureate/transfer and occupational students will be discussed separately in following sections. Detailed tables by college for the two groups are located in the Appendix.

#### Baccalaureate/Transfer Students

Fifty-one percent (33,810) of the new baccalaureate/transfer and occupational students in fall 1980 were enrolled in baccalaureate/transfer programs. Whether these students intended to transfer to a baccalaureate degree-granting college or university is unclear since intent data for these students are incomplete. A substantial number of students taking baccalaureate/transfer courses do not intend to transfer. They take courses as part of their lifelong learning experience. Even students who complete an associate degree designed for transfer frequently have objectives other than transfer. Between 1980 and 1988, 3,524 (10.4 percent) of the 33,810 students who entered baccalaureate/transfer programs in community colleges earned baccalaureate degrees from the twelve public universities in Illinois.

A profile of the entering students showed that fewer than one-half (44.6 percent) of the students enrolled that first term on a full-time basis. Fifty-five percent were females, and 54.5 percent were twenty years of age or younger. Seventy percent of the students were white with the remaining 30 percent distributed as follows: Asian, 2.2 percent; American Indian, 0.6 percent; black, 18.1 percent; Hispanic, 2.9 percent; non-resident alien, 0.5 percent; and 5.3 percent for whom no data were available. In contrast, a profile of these students who earned baccalaureate degrees at the public universities between 1980 and 1988 showed that 72 percent of the graduates had attended their first semester at a community college on a full-time basis, 53.3 percent were males, 83.7 percent were under the age of 21 when they entered college, and 86.9 percent were white. These characteristics are presented in Table 4 and are examined below in greater detail.

Students who had begun their college careers as full-time students at a community college had higher degree completion than did those who attended on a part-time basis (16.8 percent compared to 5.3 percent). Males had a higher completion rate than females (12.4 percent compared to 8.8 percent). As might be expected, younger students were more likely to complete baccalaureate degrees than older students. Sixteen percent of the students 20 years of age or younger went on to earn degrees at public universities in Illinois. In addition to the previously-mentioned age group, age categories 21 through 24, 25 through 30, 31 through 39, 40 through 54, and 55 and over were analyzed. The percentage of students in each of these groups earning degrees decreased with each ascending age group with the exception of those 55 and older.

The percentages also differed by race/ethnicity. White students had the highest degree completion (12.9 percent) at public universities followed by Asian students (9.5 percent). Hispanic students had a completion rate of 5.5 percent while only 3.1 percent of the black students went on to earn bachelor's degrees. Although the population of American Indian students in baccalaureate/transfer programs was relatively small compared to the other groups, their completion rate was the lowest among the racial/ethnic groups (5 of 186, or 2.7 percent).

Public university graduates from individual community colleges ranged from a high of 27.4 percent to a low of 1.4 percent. Six colleges--Illinois Valley Community College, Carl Sandburg College, Kaskaskia College, Rend Lake College, John A. Logan College, and Danville Area Community College--had rates of over 20 percent. Twenty-five colleges had rates between 10 and 20 percent, and eighteen colleges had rates below 10 percent.

Baccalaureate/transfer students graduated from all twelve of the Illinois public universities (see Table 5). Northern Illinois University had the largest number of graduates (508 or 14.4 percent of the total number of graduates). Southern Illinois University at Carbondale graduated the second largest number (465), followed closely by Illinois State University (462) and University of Illinois at Urbana (453). The University of Illinois at Urbana had graduates from all but four of the community colleges in the study. Chicago State University had the fewest community college students (65) and also the fewest community colleges represented (13).

William Rainey Harper College, City-Wide College, and Moraine Valley Community College each had more than 200 baccalaureate/transfer students who earned degrees after transferring. William Rainey Harper College had the largest number of graduates from any community college at any one university--94 at Northern Illinois University. Eighty-one of Wilbur Wright College's students graduated from Northeastern Illinois University. Southern Illinois University at Carbondale granted degrees to 62 of John A. Logan College students; and Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville granted the same number of degrees to Belleville Area College students.

### Occupational Students

Approximately 24 percent of the students from the fall 1980 class who earned degrees from Illinois public universities initially had been enrolled in occupational programs at community colleges. Of the 32,771 first-time occupational students in fall 1980, 1,107 earned baccalaureate degrees. While this represents only 3.4 percent of the occupational students, the number is large enough to be a factor in analyzing baccalaureate degree completion.

A profile of the entering occupational students showed that 45.2 percent attended on a full-time basis, 46.1 percent were males, 48.9 percent were under the age of 21, and 72.8 percent were white. A similar profile of occupational students who earned baccalaureate degrees from the public universities showed major differences from the entering students. Over 75 percent of the graduates were full-time students, 55.5 percent were males, 77.4 percent were under the age of 21, and 84.2 percent were white. The percentages of entering students who earned degrees between 1980 and 1988 are discussed below by various student characteristics.

As with the baccalaureate/transfer students, the percentage of occupational students earning degrees from the public universities differed by student characteristics (see Table 6). Those students who started in fall 1980 as full-time students were much more likely to eventually earn baccalaureate degrees (5.6 percent compared to 1.5 percent of the part-time students). A higher percentage of males earned degrees than females (4.1 percent compared to 2.8 percent). Age was a factor in degree completion with 5.3 percent of the students 20 years old or younger, compared to 1.5 percent of those over age 20, earning degrees.

A slightly different pattern of degree completion occurred for occupational students than baccalaureate/transfer students when race/ethnicity was taken into account. Non-resident aliens and Asian students had the highest percentage of graduates (7.0 percent and 5.7 percent, respectively). Nearly four percent (3.9 percent) of the white, 1.8 percent of the Hispanic, 1.4 percent of the American Indian, and 1.3 percent of the black occupational students earned baccalaureate degrees from the public universities.

Among the different community colleges, the percentage of occupational students who went on to earn baccalaureate degrees at Illinois public universities ranged from a high of 8.8 percent to a low of 0.0 percent. Interestingly, one college, Harry S Truman College, had a higher percentage of students who started in occupational programs earn degrees than those who started in baccalaureate/transfer programs.

As with community college baccalaureate/transfer students, all twelve public universities had occupational students who earned baccalaureate degrees from their institutions (see Table 7). Southern Illinois University at Carbondale had the largest number of graduates (184) followed by Illinois State University with 174 and Northern Illinois University with 151. The University of Illinois at Urbana which had the fourth largest number of baccalaureate/transfer students earning degrees ranked eighth among the universities in granting degrees to former occupational students. Lincoln Land Community College, Triton College, and Wilbur Wright College each had at least 80 students from occupational programs who completed baccalaureate degrees. Fifty of Wilbur Wright College's occupational students earned their degrees at Northeastern Illinois University.

### Summary

This report analyzes students who initially enrolled in Illinois public community colleges in fall 1980 in either baccalaureate/transfer or occupational programs and later earned a baccalaureate degree before 1989 from a public university in Illinois. As might be expected, a higher percentage of students enrolled in baccalaureate/transfer programs at a community college eventually earned degrees from public universities than those who had initially enrolled in occupational programs (10.4 percent compared to 3.4 percent, respectively). However, the number of students from occupational programs was significant enough to be included in the analysis.

It should be noted that information was not available on the number of students who transferred and did not earn baccalaureate degrees. Neither was information available on the number of students who transferred to private colleges and universities in Illinois or colleges and universities outside of Illinois. These factors should be taken into account in any interpretation of the data in this report since between 30 and 35 percent of the students who transferred from community colleges to baccalaureate degree-granting institutions in Illinois transfer to private colleges and universities. This percentage also varies significantly among the community colleges, with those colleges in the Chicago Metropolitan Area having a higher percentage of private institution transfers. While colleges outside the Chicago Metropolitan Area generally have fewer students transferring to private institutions, at least one college, John Wood Community College, is an exception with more than half of its transfer students going to private colleges and universities.

Students who began their higher education experience on a full-time basis had higher degree completion rates at the public universities than those who attended on a part-time basis. Males had higher completion rates than females; and younger students tended to complete at a higher rate than older students. Degree completion differed among racial/ethnic groups. White students previously enrolled in baccalaureate/transfer programs had higher completion rates than minority groups. However, this did not hold true for students who started in occupational programs, where non-resident aliens and Asian students had higher degree completion rates. Black students ranked fifth among the six racial/ethnic groups in baccalaureate/transfer programs and last in occupational programs.

Public university completion rates differed significantly among the community colleges ranging from 27.4 percent to 1.4 percent from baccalaureate/transfer programs and 8.8 percent to 0.0 percent from occupational programs. Considering the two program areas together, completion rates ranged from 15.2 percent to 1.2 percent.

All twelve of the public universities had graduates who had started their studies at community colleges. Northern Illinois University had the largest number of community college students earning degrees (659 or 14.2 percent of the graduates). Southern Illinois University at Carbondale had the second largest number (649 or 14.0 percent) followed by Illinois State University (636 or 13.7 percent). Chicago State University had the smallest number of graduates (87 or 1.9 percent of the community college students).

This report represents the first of several reports that will examine the university database on degree recipients. Future reports will analyze subsequent cohort groups, students earning community college degrees before transferring, and public university graduates who previously attended a community college. The database provides an opportunity to learn much about the degree completion patterns of community college students. The universities are to be commended for sharing these important data. Currently, discussions are being conducted which could lead to further data sharing between community colleges and universities: enrollment and performance data, for example. Hopefully, these discussions will result in availability of data that will be beneficial to all of higher education.
