Humankind had its beginnings in Africa. Imhotep, the first scientist, was a man of color, an Egyptian. Africans made great strides in science and medicine prior to slavery. Since World War II, opportunity and recognition have grown. SCOPE:

Humankind had its beginnings in Africa. Imhotep, the first scientist (3000 BC), was a man of color, an Egyptian. Black man made great strides in science and medicine in Africa prior to slavery. In this country Blacks have contributed much to the advancement of science and invention; history for the most part has not given them. Since World War II credit for these contributions. opportunity and recognition have grown. This literature guide, an update of TB 85-5, includes the accomplishments of Blacks in science, invention, architecture, engineering, medicine, photography, the military, and related fields. It is not all-inclusive, although effort has been made to list some basic books in most areas. It is of necessity biographical in content. Not meant to be a comprehensive bibliography, it is designed -- as the name of the series implies -- to put the reader "on target."


