ABSTRACT

Statistics collected during the 1989-90 school year are provided concerning the tuition and fees, and the room and board charges required of full-time students at nearly 4,000 colleges within the United States. The report is intended to provide an indication of what a typical student should expect to pay to attend college and is designed for comparative purposes only. The college costs are divided into two sections: the first section deals with all institutions offering programs of at least 2 years but less than 4 years duration; the second section lists institutions offering a bachelor's degree or higher. Schools are listed alphabetically by state within each section. Following each state listing is the state average for each category of cost, based on the number of institutions reporting such charges. (GLR)

Foreword

This booklet is offered as an aid for students, guidance counselors, and parents, because college costs are an important determining factor for many prospective students at the Nation's 4- and 2-year institutions. *College Costs* was prepared by the National Center for Education Statistics, U.S. Department of Education, and is based on data collected during the 1989-90 school year from more than 4,000 public and private colleges and universities.

The survey of Institutional Characteristics was mailed to the schools in July 1989, and this book reflects responses received from the institutions as of April 1990. Schools were asked to provide the typical tuition and fees required of full-time students for the academic year 1989-90. In-State and out-of-State charges for full-time undergraduate and graduate students are given where they apply, as are charges for room and board. When a board charge appears, we have also provided the number of meals per week for which the board charge is applicable. The data that appear in this publication have been edited for consistency against the prior year's response. For institutions that did not respond last year, data are presented as reported by the institution and have not been edited.

This book is intended to act only as a guide in determining tuition, room, and board charges. When selecting prospective institutions, students are urged to seek other sources of information about the colleges or universities of their choice. Many other references are available, and a good starting point is your school or local public library. Consulting a guidance or career counselor is also recommended.

The *Directory of Postsecondary Institutions 1989-90*, also published by the Center, will be available for reference at your local or school library later this year. The Directory lists nearly 11,000 postsecondary schools in the United States and its outlying areas and provides such basic institutional data as address, telephone number, types of programs offered, enrollment size, and highest level of offering. Once you have narrowed your selection, contact each college directly for a catalog, which should include updated tuition information as well as other costs, and an application form. If you wish to order your own copy of the Directory, you may call the Department's Information Services Division at 1-800-424-1616 for ordering information.

How To Use This Book

This book presents tuition and fees information and room and board charges for nearly 4,000 schools. It is intended to provide an indication of what a typical student should expect to pay to attend college and should be used for comparison purposes only—not as a quote of actual costs. It is recognized that tuition and required fees are not the same for all students attending an institution. These figures may vary based on the student's level or the program in which the student is enrolled, and they are not inclusive of all charges to students.

The data presented in this book have been edited for reasonableness and consistency with last year's data. For institutions that did not respond last year, the data have not been edited; they are shown as reported by the institutions. Blanks indicate that no data have been reported; thus, a blank in the room column may mean either that there are no dormitory facilities available or simply that the institution failed to respond to the question. Zeros indicate an actual reported response.

For the convenience of the user, *College Costs* is divided into two sections: the first section deals with all institutions offering programs of at least 2 years but less than 4-years duration and public less-than-2-year schools; the second section lists institutions offering a bachelor's degree or higher. Schools are listed alphabetically by State within each section. Following each State is the State average for each category of cost, based on the number of institutions reporting such charges.

Accreditation (H)

Institutions identified by an "(H)" to the left of their name are those that are accredited at the college level by an agency or association recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education.

Tuition and Required Fees

Institutions were asked to provide tuition charges for typical undergraduate or graduate students attending full-time. They include all fixed sum charges which are required of such a large proportion of all students that the student who does not pay the charge is an exception; no optional charges are included. Therefore, this figure does not include such items as books, lab fees, transportation expenses, etc.

Many public schools have different charges for in-State and out-of-State students, and both are provided here for greater utility. Private school tuition charges are for in-State students if the charge varies.

Room

This figure is intended to provide the academic year charge to a typical full-time student sharing a room with one other student. Arrangements for graduate students and married students may vary from those of undergraduates.

Board and Meals per Week

If the institution offers a standard meal plan, the board charges were to be reported for a full academic year. Included is the number of meals per week for which the board charge is applicable. When a combined room and board plan is offered, the cost is entered under room and an asterisk (*) is found in the board column. Please note that in many instances, this figure is only an estimate of what a student can expect to pay. Institutions are increasingly offering alternative meal plans such as allowing the student to purchase a "ticket" for a set amount, and then charging their meals against it. These are noted by showing the board charge and indicating "MP" in the meals per week column. Many 2-year schools do not offer meal plans, but may have a cafeteria where food can be purchased.
