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ABSTRACT

This study was conducted to determine the different perceptions that potential students have concerning Cardinal Stritch College (Wisconsin) and to determine the usefulness of various sources of information about the college. Students (n=76) accepted as entering freshmen were surveyed in order to determine their perceptions of sources of information and college characteristics. Analysis of responses by sex, distance of college from home, American College Test scores, high school percentile rankings, and intended department of study revealed differences in perceptions according to respondent groupings. Major influences regarding a final decision on college attendance, decision time lines, and identification of competitive colleges are also presented. Among the findings were the following: (1) in rating desirable college characteristics, students gave the highest mean ratings to quality of faculty, student/faculty ratio, career placement opportunities, general reputation, size of college, and variety of courses; and (2) influences on making a final decision included size of college, distance from home, general reputation, student/faculty ratio, career placement opportunities, and financial aid. A comment section lists the written responses of students concerning the admission process. Appendices contain a copy of the survey instrument and details about the response rates. (JDD)

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Abstract

Students accepted to Cardinal Stritch College as entering freshmen were surveyed in order to determine their perceptions of sources of information and college characteristics. Analysis of responses by sex, distance of college from home, ACT scores, high school percentile rankings and intended department of study revealed differences in perceptions according to respondent groupings. Major influences regarding a final decision on college attendance, decision time lines and identification of competitive colleges are also presented.



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Purpose

This study was conducted in order to determine the different perceptions that potential students have concerning Cardinal Stritch College and also to determine the usefulness of various sources of information about the College. The report is intended to assist members of the College community in assessing and adapting marketing strategies.

Method

The Cardinal Stritch College Candidate Reply Form (see Appendix A) was developed using the Reply Form of Carleton College as a model (Litten, Sullivan, & Bordigan, 1983). It was mailed to every freshman student accepted to the traditional undergraduate program for the fall semester, 1990, who intended to attend on a full-time basis. The questionnaire was sent to the students at the time they were notified of acceptance. An attempt was made to capture an accurate measure of the students' perceptions of the College at the time they made a decision to accept or decline admission. Two follow-up mailings to students who indicated they would not attend Cardinal Stritch College were completed in August 1990.

A total of 235 students applied and 181 individuals were accepted. Of those accepted, 120 (66.3%) decided to attend Cardinal Stritch College while 61 (33.7%) declined admission. Overall, 76 (63.3%) of the individuals accepting admission responded; 30 (49.2%) of those who declined admission responded. Specific response rates are detailed in Appendix B, Table B-1.



Information regarding ACT scores, high school grade point averages, high school percentile rankings, sex and address were obtained from data files.

Perceptions Regarding Sources of Information

For the respondents who accepted admission to Cardinal Stritch College, the following sources of information received the highest mean ratings on a five-point Likert scale and the highest percentages indicating that the sources increased their desire to attend the College: admission counselor ($\underline{M} = 4.50$, 88.2%), campus visit ($\underline{M} = 4.45$, 89.2%), college guides/handbooks ($\underline{M} = 4.16$, 85.7%), parents ($\underline{M} = 4.13$, 83.6%) and students ($\underline{M} = 4.09$, 78.2%). Lowest mean ratings were associated with college day/night/fair ($\underline{M} = 3.74$, 52.6%), alumni ($\underline{M} = 3.69$, 56.3%), coach ($\underline{M} = 3.68$, 35.5%), high school counselor ($\underline{M} = 3.67$, 56.4%) and financial aid officer ($\underline{M} = 3.59$, 48.8%). Ratings for all sources of information are listed in Table 1.

Sex

Results were tallied separately for male and female respondents (see Table 2 and Table 3, respectively). The five highest mean ratings for the female respondents accepting admission were similar to those reported for the total respondent population with slight variations in rank. For male respondents accepting admission, the ratings of sources of information yielded comparable highest ratings with one exception. Parents were listed as the sixth highest source of



information according to mean ratings (\underline{N} = 17, \underline{M} = 4.00) and coach was rated third (\underline{N} = 8, \underline{M} = 4.25).

Distance from Home

Respondents accepting admission and living less than fifty miles away most frequently noted campus visit (92.5%), admission counselor (90.5%), college guides/handbooks (86.0%) and parents (81.0%) as sources of information increasing their desire to attend Cardinal Stritch College (see Table 4). Respondents living more than fifty miles away most often noted the same four sortes of information as increasing their desire to attend Stritch but in reverse order--parents (88.0%), college guides/handbooks (85.0%), admission counselor (84.6%) and campus visit (84.0%). Notably fewer percentages of respondents living farther than fifty miles from the College cited the following sources of information as increasing their desire to attend Stritch: publications, high school counselor, alumni and college day/night/fair. Financial aid officer and coach were cited noticeably more frequently as increasing respondents' desires to attend by those living greater than fifty miles from the College.

American College Testing (ACT) Program Scores and High School Percentile Rankings

The impact of sources of information according to ACT score intervals is listed in Table 5 for respondents accepting admission to Cardinal Stritch College. Campus visit (90.5%) and



parents (89.5%) had the highest positive impact on respondents with ACT scores below 18. Admissions counselor (93.3%), campus visit (92.3%) and college guides/handbooks (90.0%) had the highest positive impact on respondents with ACT scores in the 18 to 20 interval. For respondents in the 21 to 23 ACT range, admission counselor (100.0%), campus visit (92.9%), students (92.3%) and publications (92.3%) were noted most frequently as increasing their desire to attend the College. For respondents with ACT scores of 24 and above, admissions counselor (87.5%) and college guides/handbooks (85.7%) were most frequently cited as positive influences.

A separate analysis overviewing the impact of sources of information according to high school percentile ranking revealed that respondents accepting admission below the fiftieth percentile were most positively influenced by an admission counselor (83.3%) and those between the fiftieth and seventieth percentile were most positively influenced by an admissions counselor (96.4%) and a campus visit (96.2%). Respondents with high school percentile rankings above seventy, indicated parents (91.7%) most often as a positive influence on their desire to attend Cardinal Stritch College.

Department

Perceptions of selected sources of information as increasing students' desire to attend Cardinal Stritch College also varied among intended department of study (see Table 6). Campus visit was listed often as increasing the desire to attend



college by respondents intending to major in Education (100.0%), Art (87.5%) and Business (87.5%). However, Education respondents also were influenced positively by college guides/handbooks (93.8%) and publications (91.7%). Business respondents were positively influenced most often by an admissions counselor (100.0%) and Art respondents by college guides/handbooks (87.5%). Only departments with ten or more intended majors responding were listed separately.

Perceptions of College Characteristics

Full-time respondents who accepted admission to Cardinal Stritch College gave the highest mean ratings on a five-point Likert scale and had the highest percentages indicating "very positive" or "somewhat positive" in influencing their desire to apply to the College to the following characteristics: quality of faculty (M = 4.65, 97.0%), student/faculty ratio (M = 4.58,92.8%), career placement opportunities (M = 4.54, 95.6%), general reputation (M = 4.49, 88.8%), size of college (M = 4.48,88.0%) and variety of courses (M = 4.30, 91.5%). The lowest mean rated characteristics were: religious opportunities $(\underline{M} = 3.73, 51.8\%)$, athletic facilities $(\underline{M} = 3.73, 50.8\%)$, varsity athletic programs (M = 3.71, 45.7%), quality of campus housing (M = 3.63, 57.6%), Franciscan values (M = 3.59, 38.9%), male/female ratio ($\underline{M} = 3.40$, 30.2%) and cost ($\underline{M} = 3.17$, 49.2%). Ratings of all selected characteristics of Cardinal Stritch College by this group and those not accepting admission to the College are listed in Table 7.



Sex

Results were tallied separately for female and male respondents (see Table 8 and Table 9, respectively). The seven highest mean ratings for female respondents accepting admission were similar to those reported for the total population with slight variation in rank. For male respondents accepting admission, student/faculty ratio ($\underline{M} = 4.74$), general reputation ($\underline{M} = 4.61$), quality of faculty ($\underline{M} = 4.56$), attractiveness of campus ($\underline{M} = 4.47$) and urban/rural location ($\underline{M} = 4.32$) received the highest mean ratings and the greatest percentages indicating a positive influence in desire to attend the College.

Table 8 and Table 9 also indicate results for females and males declining admission to Cardinal Stritch College. General reputation and student/faculty ratio were the only characteristics that received higher than a 4.00 mean for students accepting admission and for students declining admission for both male and female groupings. Cost was the lowest ranked characteristic for each grouping.

Distance from Home

Table 10 depicts the percentages of "very positive" or "somewhat positive" ratings of characteristics of Cardinal Stritch College by students who accepted admission to the College according to distance from home. The fifty mile parameter was used because this distance encompasses the extended suburbs around the Milwaukee area. Of the top eight



most often favorably rated characteristics by respondents, there were only minor variations between the group for which Stritch was fifty or fewer miles from home and the group for which Stritch was greater than fifty miles from home. Most notable differences were identified between the groups on the characteristics varsity athletic programs, cost, and urban/rural location. In these instances, the group of respondents living greater than fifty miles from the College had greater than 20% more respondents indicating the characteristics were favorable influences than the group living fifty or fewer miles from the College.

American College Testing (ACT) Program Scores and High School Percentile Rankings

Table 11 displays the percentages of respondents who accepted admission to Cardinal Stritch oliege and gave a "very positive" or "somewhat positive" rating to characteristics of the College as affecting their desire to apply according to the following ACT intervals: below 18, 18 to 20, 21 to 23 and 24 and above. Greater than 90% of the respondents in each ACT interval were positively influenced by the quality of faculty. Within the highest interval, 100.0% were positively influenced by general reputation. Within the 21 to 23 interval, 100.0% were positively influenced by career placement opportunities and variety of courses. One hundred percent in the 18 to 20 ACT interval were positively influenced by career placement opportunities and quality of faculty.



Cost, varsity athletic programs and Franciscan values were positive influences for fewer than 60% of the respondents in each ACT interval. Quality of campus housing, athletic facilities, religious opportunities and male/female ratio were rated favorably by fewer than 60% of the respondents in each interval except the 18 to 20 range.

A separate analysis relating high school percentile ratings to characteristics influencing respondents' desire to apply to Cardinal Stritch College revealed no notable findings when the following intervals were used: below fiftieth, fiftieth to seventieth and above seventieth. Interval ratings were comparable to total group ratings.

Department

The percentages of respondents who accepted admission to Cardinal Stritch College and rated characteristics of the College "very positive" or "somewhat positive" in influencing their desire to apply according to intended area of study are listed in Table 12. Career placement opportunities were viewed as positive influences on the desire to apply by 100% of the respondents intending to major in Art, Business and Education. All Art respondents also were positively influenced by the quality of faculty, liberal arts emphasis and variety of courses. All Education respondents were positively influenced by the quality of faculty, variety of courses and attractiveness of the campus. One hundred percent of the Business respondents also were influenced by the size of the college and student



faculty ratio. The percentage of respondents positively influenced by characteristics often varied according to intended department of study. For example, while greater than 85% of the respondents intending to major in Art or Education were positively influenced by general reputation and liberal arts emphasis, 60.0% and 63.6%, respectively, of the Business respondents were positively influenced by these characteristics. Only departments with ten or more intended majors responding were listed separately.

Influences on Final College Choice

Respondents were asked to indicate, in order of importance, three characteristics that most influenced their final college choice. Table 13 lists the number of times a characteristic was noted as being influential in making a decision about which college to attend. Size of college, distance from home, general reputation, student/faculty ratio, career placement opportunities and financial aid were most often cited as reasons for making a final decision by those students accepted to Cardinal Stritch College. General reputation, however, was the characteristic which received the highest number of "most influential" responses.

Yield by College Choice

Table 14 depicts the percentage of students accepting or declining admission to Cardinal Stritch College according to a self-reported ranking of colleges at the time of acceptance.



The table indicates that 84.3% of female respondents who noted that Cardinal Stritch College was their first choice decided to accept admissior, while 61.1% and 66.7% who listed the College as their second and third choices, respectively, accepted admission. A comparable yield (84.6%) was observed for males who listed Cardinal Stritch College as their first choice at the time of acceptance. Males listing Cardinal Stritch College as their second and third choices accepted admission 42.8% and 50.0% of the time, respectively.

Decision Making Time Line

Table 15 indicates for those respondents accepting admission to Cardinal Stritch College the date they first seriously considered the college they wanted to attend. Approximately 20% of the students had already seriously considered Cardinal Stritch College by the start of their senior year in high school, or by August of 1989. Approximately 55% seriously had considered Stritch by the middle of their senior year in high school, December of 1989.

A separate analysis revealed that those respondents declining admission seriously considered the college they chose to attend later than those who attended Stritch. Whereas 50% of those not attending Stritch had seriously considered the college they attended by February of 1990, 76% of those attending Stritch had seriously considered the College by that date.

Table 16 lists the postsecondary institutions selected over Cardinal Stritch College's traditional program by accepted respondents declining admission. Wisconsin public institutions were selected by 35.7% of these respondents; Wisconsin independent institutions were selected by 32.1% of these respondents.
