ABSTRACT

This paper reports summary data on the general characteristics, fiscal revenues and expenditures, educational agency and school numbers and sizes, and students and staff for each state, the District of Columbia, and outlying areas (American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands). Data are reported for factors that are most commonly used to describe the resources, needs, organization, and special characteristics of education within a state. The paper is organized into four major sections: (1) the "U.S. Profile" section gives summary statistics across the 50 states and the District of Columbia on all variables; (2) the "Rankings of the States" section consists of three tables presenting the relative position of the various states and the District of Columbia on selected variables; and (3) the "State Profiles" section (which composes the bulk of the report); and (4) the "Outlying Areas Profile" section provide numeric data and graphs containing information on all variables. Each "State Profile" includes eight graphs illustrating the data. The "U.S. Profile" section, each "State Profile" section, and each "Outlying Areas" section are comprised of five sections: general characteristics, fiscal data, institutional data, student data, and staff data. Comparative rankings of states on selected variables and an overall summary of each variable are also provided. The major source of data for this report was the National Center of Education Statistics (NCES) annual Common Core of Data survey, which provided information for the 1987-88 school year and 1987 fiscal year. Other sources include the NCES's "Digest of Education" (1988); several surveys published by the Bureau of the Census; statistics on the national school lunch program issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service; and the National Education Association report, "Rankings of the States, 1988". INTRODUCTION

Examinations of the status and quality of education in the United States are often based on comparisons among States. Comparisons of this type are most useful, valid, and constructive when States are examined alongside other States with similar characteristics. It is also helpful to have a variety of factors that are important to education conveniently arrayed for individual States. Toward this end, *State Profiles of Public Elementary and Secondary Education*, 1987-88 reports summary data on the general characteristics, fiscal revenues and expenditures, educational agency and school numbers and sizes, and students and staff for each State, the District of Columbia, and the five outlying areas. The factors for which these data are reported are those most commonly used to present a thumbnail sketch of the resources, needs, organization, and special characteristics of education within a State. This information is displayed in numeric and graphic form to make it useful for a wide range of audiences and purposes. Comparative rankings of States on selected variables are also provided, as is an overall summary for each variable.

This publication is a companion to Key Statistics on Public Elementary and Secondary Education Reported by State and by Regional, Locale, and Wealth Clusters, 1987-88. The Key Statistics reports regional and subregional division characteristics of public elementary and secondary education, as well as characteristics associated with variation in relative urbanicity and relative wealth. The two publications are intended to make the education statistical data collected and reported by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) as useful, timely, and accessible as possible.

DATA SOURCES

The information in the State Profiles was drawn from a variet, of sources. A major reference was the NCES annual Common Core of Data (CCD) survey, which provided information for the 1987-88 school year and 1987 fiscal year. The CCD survey includes four parts:

- 1. Public Elementary/Secondary School Universe Survey (the name and address, school type, and student and teacher counts for each public school in the State);
- 2. Public Elementary/Secondary Agency Universe Survey (name and address, organizational type, metropolitan status, and numbers of students for each school district in the State);
- 3. State Nonfiscal Elementary and Secondary Education Survey (Statewide totals of the numbers of students by grade, numbers of teachers, administrators, and other education staff, and numbers of high school graduates); and
- 4. Revenues and Current Expenditures for Public Elementary and Secondary Education Survey (State revenues and expenditures data).

Other sources used to compile the State Profiles included NCES's 1988 Digest of Education; several surveys published by the Bureau of the Census; statistics on the national school lunch program issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture Food and Nutrition Service; and the National Education Association report, Rankings of the States, 1988. The appendix provides a bibliography of references, and identifies the source for each data item in the report



RELATED REPORTS

Data from the CCD surveys are made available in a variety of ways. They are disseminated in *E.D. TABS* that present early tabulations of State data with no written interpretation of findings; they appear in regular NCES publications such as *The Condition of Education* and the *Digest of Education Statistics*; and they are made available on computer tapes and diskettes so that data users may tabulate and analyze the data to meet their particular research or reporting needs. The NCES data presented in these *State Profiles* have all been published previously, and these products can be obtained from the Office of Educational Research and Improvement, Education Information Branch, 555 New Jersey Avenue NW, Washington, DC 20208.

DEFINITIONS

Several of the factors discussed in this report have specialized definitions that may differ from common usage. The definitions are those used in the source documents from which the data were drawn. Some of the most common definitions include the following:

United States: Wherever this term is used throughout the report, it refers to data representing the 50 States and the District of Columbia.

Outlying areas: These are additional areas from which elementary and secondary education data are collected and consist of American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

School-age population: The total number of persons between the ages of 5 and 17.

Cooperative system liaison: An individual appointed by each chief State school officer to be the official representative of that State education agency to the National Cooperative Education Statistics System. State liaisons, along with representatives from selected Federal agencies, make up the membership of the National Forum on Education Statistics, and as such are decisionmakers for the Cooperative System. Forum members, along with additional Federal agency representatives and other national education statistics producers and users will participate in semi-annual meetings of the National Forum on Education Statistics. By means of a dynamic process of debate and consensus-building, primarily through the deliberations of the Forum's standing committees, but also through extensive support of task forces, the Forum will analyze issues and discuss alternatives for solving the problems that confront providers and users of elementary and secondary education statistics.

CCD coordinator: An individual appointed by each chief State school officer to be the official representative of that State education agency to NCES concerning the Common Core of Data (CCD) system.

Public school membership: The unduplicated count of students on the roll of the school or district (excluding any formally enrolled students who withdrew from school) taken on the school day closest to October 1, 1987.



Public school: An institution that provides elementary/secondary educational services; has one or more grade groupings (prekindergarten through 12) or is ungraded; has one or more teachers to give instruction; is located in one or more buildings; has an assigned administrator; receives public funds as its primary support; and is operated by an education agency.

Regular school: A public school that does not focus primarily on vocational, special education, or alternative education.

Special education school: A public school that focuses primarily on special education, including instruction for any of the following: hard of hearing, deaf, speech impaired, health impaired, orthopedically impaired, mentally retarded, seriously emotionally disturbed, multihandicapped, visually handicapped, deaf and blind. The school also has adapted curriculum, materials, or instruction for students served.

Vocational school: A public school that focuses primarily on vocational education and provides education in one or more semiskilled or technical occupations.

Other and alternative schools: A public school that addresses needs of students that typically cannot be met in a regular school; provides nontraditional education; does not specifically fall into the categories of regular, special education, or vocational school (but may be an adjunct to a regular school).

Total area: The total land area within the geographic boundaries of the State or other area, expressed in square miles.

Total State revenue: Includes all amounts of money received by State government from external sources (net of refunds and correcting transactions) other than from issue of debt, liquidation of investments, and agency and private trust transactions.

Total State expenditures: Include all amounts of money paid out by State government.

State expenditure for elementary/secondary education: Includes all amounts of money for elementary and secondary education paid out by State government, excluding Federal funds and amounts of money paid out by local jurisdictions.

Gross State product per school-age child: The total value of goods and services produced in the State divided by the 1985-86 Census Data for resident persons ages 5 to 17 years.

National school breakfast: Federal reimbursement to States during FY 1987 under School Breakfast Program of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service.

National school lunch: Federal reimbursement to States during FY 1987 under the National School Lunch Program of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Service.

Chapter I: U.S. Department of Education obligations during FY 1987 for grants for the disadvantaged under Chapter I, Education Consolidation and Improvement Act of 1981.



School improvement: U.S. Department of Education obligations during FY 1987 for block grants to States for school improvement, including Chapter 2, Education Consolidation and Improvement Act of 1981 and Science and Mathematics Education.

Impact aid. U.S. Department of Education obligations during FY 1987 for school assistance in federally affected areas, including maintenance and operations.

Vocational/adult: U.S. Department of Education obligations during FY 1987 for vocational and adult education.

Handicapped: U.S. Department of Education obligations during FY 1987 for education for the handicapped, including State Grants and Preschool Incentive Grants to States.

Bilingual: U.S. Department of Education obligations during FY 1987 for bilingual education, including Bilingual Education, Bilingual Vocational Training, and Emergency Immigrant Education Assistance.

Indian: U.S. Department of Education obligations during FY 1987 for Indian education.

Revenues for elementary/secondary education: Additions to assets that do not incur an obligation that must be met at some future date, do not represent exchanges of fixed assets, and are available for expenditure by the local education agencies (LEA's) in the State to provide elementary/secondary education.

Revenues from local sources: Revenues produced within the LEA boundaries and available to the LEA in the amount produced. Includes taxes levied or assessed by an LEA; revenues from a local government to the LEA; tuition received; transportation fees; earnings on investments from LEA holdings; net revenues from food services (gross receipts less gross expenditures); net revenues from student activities (gross receipts less gross expenditures); and other revenues (textbook sales, donations, property rentals).

Revenues from intermediate sources: Revenues received from an intermediate governmental unit or political subdivision between the State and the LEA that collects revenue and distributes it to an LEA. Includes restricted and unrestricted grants-in-aid; revenue in lieu of taxes; and revenue for or on behalf of the LEA. Excluded are proceeds from bond sales; cash received from sale of assets; other nonrevenue receipts; intergovernmental transfers among LEA's; and revenues from community services.

Revenues from State sources: Grants and other monies received by LEA's from State funds. Includes restricted and unrestricted grants-in-aid; revenue in lieu of taxes; and revenue for or on behalf of the LEA. Excluded are proceeds from bond sales; cash received from sale of assets; other nonrevenue receipts; intergovernmental transfers among LEA's; and revenues from community services.

Revenues from Federal sources: Grants and other monies received by LEA's from Federal agencies, either directly from the Federal agency or distributed through a State agency. Includes restricted and unrestricted grants-in-aid; revenue in lieu of taxes; and revenue for or on behalf of the LEA. Excluded are proceeds from bond sales; cash received from sale of assets; other nonrevenue receipts; intergovernmental transfers among LEA's; and revenues from community services.



Current expenditures: Current expenditures for the categories of instruction, support services, and noninstructional services include fixed charges (employee benefits, rent, interest). They do not include expenditures for debt service and capital outlay.

Current expenditures for Instruction: Those expenditures for activities dealing directly with the interaction between students and teachers, such as salaries, employee benefits, and purchased instructional services.

Current expenditures for support services: Those expenditures for student support services (attendance, guidance, health, speech, psychological); staff support services; improvement of instruction; educational media, including librarians; general administration (board of education, central office); school administration (principal); business (fiscal services, purchasing, warehousing, printing); operation and maintenance of plant; student transportation services; and central expenditures (research, information services, data processing).

Current expenditures for noninstruction: Those expenditures for food service operations and other auxiliary enterprise operations (bookstore, interscholastic athletics). Excluded are expenditures for community services (child care, swimming pool).

Revenue per pupil In membership: Result obtained by dividing the total revenues for elementary/secondary education by the total membership reported for the State for school year 1986-87.

Current expenditure per pupil in membership: Result obtained by dividing the total current expenditures for elementary/secondary education by the total membership reported for the State for school year 1986-87.

Education agency: Governmental agency administratively responsible for providing public elementary and secondary instruction or educational support services.

Regular school district: An education agency responsible for providing free public elementary and secondary education for school-age children residing within its jurisdiction. The agency sometimes includes special and vocational education in a comprehensive educational setting.

Regional service agency: An education agency that provides administrative services or special services to other public elementary and secondary school districts or other agencies.

State-operated agency: Any State agency that operates elementary, secondary, or combined education programs (such as State schools for the blind or deaf.)

Federally operated and other types: Any Federal agency that operates elementary, secondary, or combined education programs (such as the Bureau of Indian Affairs), or an education agency that cannot be appropriately classified using another of the types of agency.



Regular school districts by membership size: Each regular school district was assigned to 1 of 15 categories, based on the total membership reported for the district record, and the number of districts in each category computed. The category "Size not reported" includes districts that contract with other agencies to provide services for some students rather than operate schools directly. In these cases, student membership is not reported for the receiving district in order to avoid duplication of membership counts. Conversely, in cases where all services are provided by a contracting district, no membership is reported for the sending district.

Density of schools within education agencies: Each education agency, of whatever type, was assigned to one of six categories, based on the number of school records associated with the agency. The number of agencies in each category was then computed.

Public schools by size of membership: Each school for which membership was reported was assigned to one of five categories, based on the total membership reported for the school. The number of schools in each category was then computed.

Locale of school: Code assigned to public schools based on the population characteristics of the geographic area in which the school is located.

City: A city with a population of 50,000 or more that is a central city of a Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA).

Urban fringe: An area within an SMSA of a central city and defined as urban by the Bureau of the Census but which does not qualify as a city.

Large town: A town not within an SMSA, having a population of 25,000 or more.

Small town: A town not within an SMSA, having a population between 2,500 and 24,999.

Rural: A place with fewer than 2,500 people and defined as rural by the Bureau of the Census.

Grade span category: Based on the lowest and highest grade for which membership was reported in each school, the school's grade span was determined. Schools whose low and high grade were exactly one of the six designated ranges were assigned to the appropriate category; if a school had some other combination of low and high grade, it was assigned to "Other grades." Schools that only reported membership in "Ungraded" were assigned to that category, and schools with no membership reported were assigned to "Not reported." The total number of schools within each category was then computed.

Prekindergarten membership: Students who are enrolled in a group or class that is part of a public school program taught during the year or years preceding kindergarten.

Ungraded membership: Students who are assigned to classes or programs that do not have standard grade designations.

Raclal/ethnic category: Used to describe groups to which individuals belong in the eyes of the community. Categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origin. A person may be counted in only one group.



Free-lunch program: A program under the National School Lunch Act, which provides cash subsidies for free lunches to students; eligibility is based on family size and income criteria. The number of students reported eligible to participate is reported at the school level. It is shown in this report as the percentage of the State's total membership.

High school completers: These counts include all individuals who received diplomas or other formal indications of completion of high school during the immediately preceding school year and subsequent summer.

Regular diploma: Total count of graduates who received a high school diploma in the regular day or summer school.

Other diploma: Total count of graduates who received a nigh school diploma in programs other than the regular day or summer school (e.g., adult evening programs).

High school equivalency: Total count of individuals 19 years or younger who received a general educational development (GED) or high school equivalency certificate.

Other completers: Total count of students who received certificates or other designations of high school completion, attendance, or training. Includes special education individualized education program completers; excludes regular diploma or GED recipients.

Total education staff: The total of instructional staff, support services staff, and administrators reported by the State as participating in providing free public education to students in elementary and secondary education. All staff information is reported in full time equivalency, which is the amount of time required to perform an assignment, stated as a proportion of a full-time position. Only positions that were actually filled are to be reported; vacant positions are not reported.

Total teachers: Professional school staff members who instruct students and maintain daily student attendance records for prekindergarten, kindergarten, grades 1 through 12, and ungraded classes. Those who teach in an environment other than a classroom setting are also included. Teachers of Headstart classes and those providing strictly custodial care are excluded.

Instructional aides: Staff members who receive salary to assist a teacher with routine activities associated with instruction. Such activities may include monitoring, conducting rote exercises, operating equipment, and clerking.

Guidance counselors/directors: Professional staff members assigned specific duties and school time to activities involving counseling with students and parents; counseling with other staff merabers on learning problems; evaluating student abilities; assisting students in making educational and career choices; assisting students in personal and social development; providing referral assistance; and working with other staff members in planning and conducting guidance programs for students.

Librarians/library support: Professional and other staff members (including library aides and those involved in Library/Media support) and supervisors who are assigned specific duties and school time to professional library service activities. These activities include selecting, acquiring, preparing, cataloging, and circulating books and other printed materials; planning the use of the library by students and other staff; guiding



individuals in their use of the library materials; selecting, preparing, caring for, and making available to members of the instructional staff the equipment, films, filmstrips, transparencies, tapes, TV programs, and similar materials; and organizing activities in the audiovisual center, TV studio, and related work-study areas and other services provided by audiovisual personnel.

Administrative support: Staff members who provide support to officials and administrators of education agencies or principals and department chairpersons of schools. Includes clerical staff and secretaries.

Other support services: All support staff not included in administrative support, including social workers, data processing, health, maintenance, bus drivers, security, and cafeteria workers.

School-based administrators: Those staff members whose activities are concerned with directing and managing the operation of a particular school. These activities include supervision of school activities, assignment of duties to staff members, supervision and maintenance of the records of the school, and coordination of school instructional activities with those of the education agency. Such positions would include principals, assistant principals and other assistants, and department chairpersons.

Other officials/administrators: Chief executive officers of the education agencies, including superintendents, deputies and assistant superintendents, and other persons having districtwide responsibilities, e.g., business managers, administrative assistants, professional instructional support staff, Chapter I coordinators, and home economics supervisors.

Average students per teacher by grade level: The overall figure represents the total student membership divided by total teachers. The other three figures represent the median ratio for all schools with membership and teachers in schools of specified grade spans. These three groups do not account for all schools.

Primary school: Those public schools whose grades range from a low of prekindergarten to 3 and a high grade up to 6.

Middle school: Those public schools whose grades range from a low of 4 to 7 and a high of 4 to 9.

High school: Those public schools whose grades range from a low of 7 to 12 and a high of 12.

Teacher to all other staff ratio: The ratio of total teachers to the total of all other categories of educational staff.

Teacher to administrator ratio: The ratio of total teachers to the total of school-based administrators and other officials/administrators.

Average teacher salary: Average annual salary of all public school teachers.



REPORT CONTENTS AND FORMAT

There are three major sections in the State Profiles:

- 1. **U. S. Profile** that gives summary statistics across the 50 States and the District of Columbia on all variables, page 11;
- 2. Rankings of the States that consist of three tables presenting the relative position of the various States and the District of Columbia on selected variables, page 19;
- 3. State Profiles, listed alphabetically with the outlying areas appearing after the States, that provide numeric and graphic information on all variables. State Profiles are paginated sequentially (e.g. "Alabama" begins on page 27) and may also be identified by the State name, which appears at the foot of each Profile page.

The U.S. Profile and each State Profile Is broken into five sections:

- General Characteristics include the overall population, area, and revenues and expenditures of the State, as well as the numbers of students and schools.
- 2. **Fiscal Data** information reports per pupil revenues and expenditures, and total amounts of Federal aid to various programs.
- 3. Institutional Data provide information about the numbers and sizes of schools and education agencies, grade levels included in schools, and proportion of students and schools in different demographic locales (e.g., city, rural).
- Student Data describe the numbers and ethnic backgrounds of students and the numbers of high school completers.
- 5. **Staff Data** present the numbers and proportions of instructional, support services, and administrative staff, student-teacher ratios, and average teacher salary.

With the exception of public school membership by racial/ethnic category and percentage of school membership eligible for free-lunch program, data items that were not reported by the State or otherwise were not available are indicated by the special code (---).

For percentages, detail may not total to 100 percent because of rounding.




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 243,400,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership

E = 1 to 99




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 4,083,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership

E = 1 to 99




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels

Teacher to all other staff ratio 1.1






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 525,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership

A = 1,500 or more B = 750 to 1,499C = 300 to 749D = 100 to 299E = 1 to 99




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 3,386,000)




Figure 3.--Current expenditures by function




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 2,388,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.—Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 27,663,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels

Teacher to all other staff ratio 1.0






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 3,296,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership

A = 1,500 or more B = 750 to 1,499 C = 300 to 749 D = 100 to 299 E = 1 to 99




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 3,211,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 644,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership

A = 1,500 or more B = 750 to 1,499 C = 300 to 749 D = 100 to 299 E = 1 to 99




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 622,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 12,023,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 6,222,000)




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 1,083,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 998,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 11,582,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 5,531,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 2,834,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnlc category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population **2,476,000**)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnlc category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 3,727,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.-Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 4,461,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 1,187,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 4,535,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.- Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 5,855,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 9,200,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 4,246,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 2,625,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 5,103,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and stude its by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 809,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 1,594,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 1,007,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 1,057,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5 -- Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by raclal/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students por teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 7,672,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership slze




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 1,500,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 17,8°5,000)




Figure 2.--Re. aues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population **6,413,000**)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 672,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 10,784,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 3,272,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership

A = 1,500 or more B = 750 to 1,499 C = 300 to 749 D = 100 to 299 E = 1 to 99




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 2,724,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Fublic schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 11,936,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by slze of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 986,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5 -- Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 3,425,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale






Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 709,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 4,855,000)




Figure 3.--Current expenditures by function




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 16,789,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 1,680,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade

Teacher to all other staff ratio 1.1






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 548,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade

Teacher to all other staff ratio 1.2






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 5,904,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 4,538,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 1,897,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source






Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership

A = 1,500 or more B = 750 to 1,499 C = 300 to 749 D = 100 to 299 E = 1 to 99




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 4,807,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels






Figure 1.--School-age and other populations (Total population 490,000)




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership

A = 1,500 or more B = 750 to 1,499 C = 300 to 749 D = 100 to 299 E = 1 to 99




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade




Figure 3.--Current expenditures by function




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade levels




Figure 2.--Revenues by source




Figure 4.--Regular school districts by membership size




Figure 5.--Public schools by size of membership

A = 1,500 or more B = 750 to 1,499 C = 300 to 749 D = 100 to 299 E = 1 to 99




Figure 6.--Percentage of public schools and students by type of locale




Figure 7.--Public school membership by racial/ethnic category




Figure 8.--Average students per teacher by grade
