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#### ABSTRACT

This final report includes 80 institutions' final responses to the National University Continuing Education Association (NUCEA) Independent Study Division's annual survey of college, high school, and noncredit program practices during 1989-90. Eight figures are included to provide information on course inrollments, course fees, staff size, course developments, and faculty stipends. The data in the eight tables enable the administrators and staff of independent study programs to compare and contrast their activities, staffing, programming, and enrollment growth patterns with those of other institutions. Format and contents of the tables follow an established pattern to maintain comparability between years. A survey was sent during July 1990 to 143 institutions that had responded to previous surveys, were new NUCEA members, or had a professional member of the Independent Study Division. During August, follow-up letters and telephone calls were made to all nonresponding institutions and to those whose survey responses were markedly changed from before. Of the 348,000 independent study enrollments reported by 80 institutions for 1989-1990, 57.4% are in college courses, 30.2% are in high school courses, and 12.4% are in noncredit courses. Overall enrollments have increased from 1988-1989. The independent study research survey form is included in the report. Footnotes for college, high school, and noncredit program information are also included. (NLA)

### INDEPENDENT STUDY 1989-1990 TOTAL PROGRAM SCOPE

### Executive Summary

This final report includes eighty institutions' final responses to the National University Continuing Education Association (NUCEA) Independent Study Division's annual survey of program practices during academic year 1989-1990. Tables are included to provide information on course enrollments, course fees, staff size, course developments, and faculty stipends.

The data in the tables in this report enable the administrators and staff of independent study programs to compare and contrast their activities, their staffing, their programming, and enrollment growth patterns with those of other institutions. Further, such annual data facilitate research on an increasingly significant educational activity—distance education. Format and contents of the tables of this report follows the pattern established in prior years to maintain comparability between years.

During July 1990 a survey was sent to 143 institutions which had responded to previous Independent Study annual surveys, which were new members of NUCEA, or which had a professional member of the Independent Study Division. The survey was prepared by members of the Independent Study Division's Research and Evaluation Committee.

During August follow-up letters and telephone calls were made to all non-responding institutions and to those whose responses on the survey appeared to be a marked change from previous responses. All respondents received a preliminary report in September and were given three months to stify the committee of needed changes. During the following months additional follow-up calls were made as committee members reviewed the data.

Of the 348,000 independent study enrollments reported by eighty NUCEA institutions for 1989-1990, 57.4% are in college courses (an increase over last year), 30.2% are in high school courses (a decrease from last year), and 12.4% are in noncredit courses (a slight decrease from last year). However, since overall enrollments have increased, these percentage decreases only reflect a change in the proportion of total enrollments from last year to this year. When a comparison is made of only those institutions that responded to both last year's and this year's surveys, this year's total enrollments are 3.9% greater (327,874 in 1988-89; 340,763 in 1989-90).

During 1989-90 for semester-length college courses, students paid an average of \$61.80 per semester hour (\$65.51 in 1990-91). Faculty were paid an average of \$3.21 per lesson (\$3.53 in 1990-91); \$25.86 per semester hour (\$27.58 in 1990-91); or \$47.28 per enrollment (\$48.28 in 1990-91) for grading, as well as an average of \$1,023.81 (\$1,042.86 in 1990-91) per course or \$355.76 (\$372.48 in 1990-91) per semester hour for new development (Table VIa).

During 1989-90 for quarter-length college courses, students paid an average of \$40.20 (\$42.75 in 1990-91) per quarter hour. Faculty were paid an average of \$10.00 (\$10.36 in 1990-91) per lesson or \$21 50 (\$22.00 in 1990-91) per quarter hour for grading, as well as an average of \$875.00 (\$925) in 1990-91) per course or \$190.00 (\$200.00 in 1990-91) per quarter hour for new development (Table VIb).



During 1989-90 for high school courses, the average enrollment fee for students was \$62.01 (\$65.73 for 1990-91) per course. For faculty members who grade such courses, the average stipend was \$2.67 (\$2.78 in 1990-91) per lesson or \$22.80 (\$27.00 1990-91) per enrollment, while the course development average stipend was \$583.46 (\$617.40 in 1990-91) per course (Table VII).

Within the noncredit courses the average course fee was \$76.97 (\$88.84 in 1990-91). For grading, faculty were paid \$3.21 (\$3.23 in 1990-91) per lesson, while the course development stipend was \$282.00 per CEU (\$326.00 in 1990-91) or \$638.13 (\$711.47 in 1990-91) per course (Table VIII).

### **Enrollment Changes**

The average program in 1989-90 enrolled about 57% of its students in college courses, 30% in high school courses, and 12% in noncredit courses (see Figure 1). This is not a significant change from last year. Nationally, the mean total enrollment consisted of 4,405 (combined college, high school, and noncredit) registrations in 1989-90. The range of enrollments this year was from Savannah State College's 25 to Pennsylvania State University's 28,099 (see Table 1).

This year, as in each of the past several years, we note growth on a national scale. Within any given institution, however, it is rare that national patterns of growth will be reflected year after year. Indeed, of all the NUCEA institutions that have been shown in our annual statistical reports, only three have reported growth in each of the past six years: the University of Maryland, Mississippi State University and Western Michigan University. Of the five largest institutions, four showed changes of more than three percent of total enrollment with Pennsylvania State University (25,474; 28,099) and Texas Tech University (14,702; 18,195) showing increases of more than ten percent. Brigham Young University (19,474; 21,111) increased by eight percent and Indiana University (17,848; 18,517) increased by almost four percent.

#### Independent Study Faculty

Overall staffing patterns and the manner of participation by university faculty in independent study instruction are presented in Table IV. The information in this table should be taken in the context of the enrollments and courses reported earlier.

#### Special Fees

It is customary for institutions to offset operating costs and the costs of services that are unique to independent study by assessing special fees. The most common of these are a charge for study guides, a charge to transfer between independent study courses or to extend enrollment in a course, a supplemental charge to those who are residents of another state, and a charge to offset the cost of mailing books or lessons or both.


As shown in Table V, virtually all institutions levy one or more of these charges. Only five institutions did not report any special fees: Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, Governor's State University, Mary Baldwin College, Northern State University, and Roosevelt University. The nonresident charge is the least common.



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### Independent Study Program sellfor9 0991 - 1990



# PART TWO College Programs

### COLLEGE PROGRAMS 1989-1990

### Program Characteristics

Table II presents comparative information about the characteristics of programs and their students. Only 61 institutions report having data on the percentage of their college enrollments that are by students currently studying on the university campus; since about two-thirds of these reports are rounded to 5 or 10 percent it appears that many reports are estimates. Only 26 institutions indicate that the majority of their enrollments are by on campus students. The dominant pattern in independent study is to attract students who are not otherwise enrolled at the institution whose campus courses they are taking.

Three years ago, twenty institutions reported offering extended degree programs, although some of these place severe restrictions on the number of credit hours through independent study that will be accepted toward a degree. Although only two NUCEA institutions reported three years ago that students can meet all degree requirements through independent study, eleven additional institutions indicated that practice this year.

For only the third time, this year's survey collected information on the initial enrollment period (12 months median average), length of first extension (6 months median average) and second extension (4.5 months mean average of the 28 practicing institutions).

#### Course Preparation and Revision

Comparative information on courses offered, revised or developed, as well as editor/course designer staff available is shown in Table IIIA for college programs, in Table IIIB for high school, and Table IIIC for noncredit.

As is true for course enrollments, the number of courses offered within each total program varies immensely. Brigham Young University reports the largest number of courses, 511, and three other institutions report offering more than 400. The institutions with the largest number of courses tend to have one or more editors or course designers assigned, although a few report extensive curriculum work without any persons assigned expressly for this purpose. In many cases this pattern complements a subsequent comment on staffing: individuals who prepare courses or who work on courses prepared by faculty members may be formally assigned broad duties elsewhere in continuing education or in the university. Surprisingly, the number of editors or course designers reported to be assigned does not always appear to be closely related to the production of new courses or revisions.

### Independent Study Faculty

Overall staffing patterns and the manner of participation by university faculty in independent study instruction are presented in Table IV. The information in this table should be taken in the context of the enrollments and courses reported earlier.



Seventy-nine institutions reported 1989-90 enrollment information for college level correspondence courses. The total enrollment of 197,845 in these courses was 57 percent of all correspondence course enrollments during the survey year.

Enrollments ranged from a low of 4 students to a high of 11,970 with an average of 2,569 and a median of 1,684 (see Table VI). Figure 3a shows those 22 institutions that had gained at least 10 percent more enrollments than they had last year. Figure 3b shows the ranking by increase in numbers.

The number of college courses offered by the reporting programs ranged from 1 to 401 with an average of 100 (see Table IIIa). An average of 7 new courses were developed during 1989-90.

#### **Fccs**

Fifty-eight of the 79 reporting institutions assess fees on the basis of semester hours and 12 use a quarter hour basis. Nine programs use some other method (Tables VI, VIa, VIb, and VIc).

During 1989-90 students in courses offered on a semester basis paid an average of \$61.99 per credit. An increase of 6 percent is anticipated for 1990-91 (\$65.76). Institutions offering courses on a quarter basis charged students an average fee of \$40.20 per credit, and project an increase of 6 percent for 1990-91 (\$42.75).

Most programs charge students some type of additional fees, very often for extra services such as enrollment extension or transfer to another course. An average of \$14.36 is assessed for extensions by the 63 programs reporting such a charge. A transfer fee is charged by 56 programs reporting such a charge, averaging \$9.73. The least common additional fee is that charged for non-resident students. Only six programs differentiate among students in this way, reporting an additional fee of from \$5.00 to \$110.37.

#### Lesson Grading

The most common method of paying instructors for grading appears to be a per lesson system, with 32 institutions compensating instructors in this way at an average \$3.21 per lesson at semester schools and \$3.50 at quarter calendar institutions. Eleven programs pay instructors for grading on a per enrollment basis, the average being \$47.28 at semester schools. Semester hours are used by 16 institutions as the basis for payment at an average of \$25.86 per semester hour. Two programs base payments on quarter hours at an average rate of \$21.50 per hour of credit.

Computer grading is utilized by 12 institutions in varying degrees, ranging from .8 percent to 100 percent of total grading activity. Average use of computerized grading among these 12 programs is 29 percent, about the same as last year.



### Course Development

The average compensation paid faculty for course development in 1989-90 was \$1,023.81 per course at semester schools and \$720.00 at quarter schools. This basis for payment was used by 37 programs, making it the most common system. Payments based on semester hours averaged \$355.76 per hour, while it was \$190.00 per quarter hour (but expected to increase about five percent during 1990-91). Development stipends at semester schools were expected to be about 5-4 percent greater during 1990-91.

Faculty develop course materials as part of their regular work loads at 14 institutions, with four reporting 100 percent of their faculty working under such a system. Seventeen institutions have some faculty teaching an independent study course as part of their regular work load. At four of the institutions, all faculty members teach one or more independent study courses as part of their regular course load.

# PART THREE High School Programs

### **HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS 1989-1990**

Three out of every ten independent study enrollments in 1989-90 were in high school courses. In spite of this respectable showing in the national data, many professionals in the field are not familiar with the differences between high school programs and the more customary college-credit efferings.

About 45% of the NUCEA institutions reporting independent study enrollments showed high school enrollments. The largest of these programs, at Texas Tech University, enrolled a greater number than the largest of the college programs. Most institutions offering a high school program operate in a mixed mode; only the North Dakota Division of Independent Study limits its offerings to high school courses (Table I).

High school programs operate with fewer courses than college programs. Since 35 of the 36 high school programs are in institutions that also offer college courses, it is revealing to learn that those 35 institutions offer an average of 217 college courses but only 58 secondary courses (Tables I and IIIb). This implies much lower fixed costs for course preparation and revision.

Indeed, the survey information (Table IIIb) shows that the 36 high school programs offered 2,176 courses last year, but only 86 of these (4%) were new. Does this suggest many "mature" programs that are offering standard curricula with little need for change? Probably not, since only 195 (9%) were revised last year it implies that the five year revision cycle suggested in the Division's Standards Document is not being followed and that the maintenance of the high school curriculum is not as highly valued as is the maintenance of the college and non-credit curricula, in most institutions. (In the same institutions, 14% of all non-high school courses were revised and 5% were new last year.)

The number of courses offered apparently bears little or no relationship to the number of students enrolled. For example, Texas Tech enrolled nearly 14,000 students with 96 courses in its curriculum, whereas North Dakota enrolled only a third as many students with 134 courses. At the other end of the spectrum, Kansas enrolled 258 high school students with 8 courses, which is more than Oklahoma State enrolled with 39 courses. The University of Washington reports 3 high school courses and no enrollments. A correlation of enrollments and courses must await a more detailed study than this, since our raw data does not reflect institutions' efforts to phase out their high school programs (as Kansas and Georgia) and others who continue to enlarge the curriculum to appeal to expanded client groups.

The average program enrolled 2,919 high school students in the past academic year, up from 2,779 the year before. Both averages exceed those of college credit programs. This growth also is representative of the experience of the decade. In 27 directly comparable institutions, the average high school program consisted of 3,602 enrollments in 1990; 2,768 in 1985; and 2,496 in 1990.

The 105,101 enrollments reported this year were up by 5% from last year's reported 100,054. This growth also continues the trend of the past decade. Comparing the 27 institutions which have continuously maintained NUCEA membership and reported high school enrollment



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statistics, enrollments have grown 44% since 1980, and 30% since 1985. Growth rates are determined by averaging institutions growing rapidly with those experiencing enrollment decline, and so a 5% rate or even a 44% rate masks the exceptional success that some institutions have experienced. For example, Texas Tech led in 1989-90 program growth (Figure 4a) and has grown 98% in the past five years. Brigham Young University, second in this year's growth, has grown 90% in the past five years and a remarkable 178% in the past decade. Kentucky, third in this year's growth, can boast of an astonishing record: 263% growth in the past five years, and 1,867% growth over the decade. Other institutions that experienced over 100% growth in the decade include Alabama, Florida, Louisiana State, Mississippi State, and the University of Texas. Expollments in a few of the larger institution of 1980 declined or grew modestly over the decade, and a few of the medium-size institutions have fallen by 50 to 70% in the past ten years.

In the 1985 report (Independent Study Program Profiles 1984-85) it was noted that decline was often explained by a "national force theory" including such factors as inflation, unemployment, or the aging of the baby boom generation. Growth, on the other hand, was usually explained by a "unique situation theory" which incorporated a supportive administration, well-chosen courses, or improved educational management. It was concluded then that neither theory passed the tests of explaining our current experience and predicting our future experience, and they still do not. For all the success of selected institutions, continuous growth in any program is still rare. In likelihood, those programs that have been most successful have benefitted from both good management and a good fortune in their environment, and those that have declined may have done so in part out of some miscalculation by management but also as a result of forces much larger than a high school independent study program. On entering a new decade, the message of the past decade is that change will occur and enrollments will continue to grow overall—but the experience will be different at each institution as larger trends and local conditions have their effect.

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

### **NONCREDIT PROGRAMS 1989-1990**

#### Enrollments

Total noncredit enrollments were 43,193, which is 12.41% of the total independent study enrollments reported. Forty-one of the 80 institutions reporting (51%) indicated they had noncredit offerings (see Table 1). The count included University of North Dakota (who didn't have their total count listed at the time of compilation) but did not include the University of Texas-Austin because they won't have complete statistics on their new program until next year.

Since there were different institutions reporting this year compared to last year, it would be incorrect to claim an increase or a decrease in institutions reporting noncredit offerings. We can make comparisons between the various institutions this year and comparisons of last year's and this year's statistics within a single institution.

Noncredit enrollments were concentrated in relatively few institutions. Five accounted for 83% of the reported noncredit enrollment. In fact, Pennsylvania State University accounted for 43% of the total noncredit enrollments reported.

This is similar to last year, the differences are in the two largest enrollment institutions. Their enrollments increase dramatically (see Figure 5a). It could be said that "the big get bigger."

Comparing statistics from last year, eighteen, institutions reported enrollment increases, sixteen reported decreases, and two were the same. The biggest proportionate increase goes to the University of Georgia. The noncredit enrollment for 1988-89 was 83 compared to the 1989-90 enrollment of 950. This is an over tenfold increase. The largest numerical increase was from California State University (Sacr.) with a 2,510 increase in enrollment from 1988-89 to 1989-90.

### Course Fees

Course fee information can be found in Table VIII. The cost of noncredit courses and CEU's ranges from \$13.00 to \$260.00. Looking at the change in course fees from 1989-90 to 1990-91, twelve institutions increase their rates, ten institutions rates stayed the same, and in 19 institutions, the rates were not ascertainable as to increases or decreases. Interestingly enough, no one reported decreasing their rates.


