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ABSTRACT

This study surveyed 17,787 graduating seniors in the Los Angeles (California) Unified School District about their plans following graduation and their perceptions of the effectiveness of their high school education. Responses are summarized for the entire district, and by sex, by ethnic group, and by type of high school. The following key findings are presented: (1) about 11 percent reported that they had "A" averages while in high school, 47 percent that they had "B" averages, 20 percent that they had "C" averages, and 1 percent that they had "D" averages; (2) 3,032 (17 percent) had considered dropping out; (3) most of those who had considered dropping out had done so because of problems with other students; (4) a majority of those who had changed their mind about dropping out had done so because of teacher encouragement; (5) about 30 percent planned to attend four-year colleges; (6) 3,860 college-bound students had been promised financial aid; (7) about 8 percent planned to work part- or full-time and not attend school; (8) 1,083 planned to have business-related jobs; (9) lack of student interest was cited as the biggest problem facing high school students; (10) location was cited as the best feature of their high schools; (11) 66 percent worked part- or full-time while in high school; and (12) the condition of school buildings, the school's reputation in the community, and school spirit were most frequently cited as "excellent." Statistical data are presented in two graphs and numerous tables. The survey questionnaire is appended. (FMW)

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Executive Summary

This report presents information on how LAUSD 1988 graduates plan to use their high school education and how they perceive its effectiveness. The 17,787 respondents who completed questionnaires attended regular high schools, continuation high schools, schools of choice, schools for handicapped students, and opportunity high schools.

This is a summary of findings:

1. About 11% of the graduates reported that they earned mostly As while in high school; 47% had B averages, 20% C, and 1% D.
2. Of the respondents 3,032 (17%) considered dropping out of school but changed their minds.
3. The reason cited by the largest group of graduates for considering dropping out of school was problems with other students in school.
4. A majority (74%) of those who considered dropping out changed their minds because of teacher encouragement.
5. About 30% of the graduates planned to attend 4-year colleges full-time.
6. The respondents named 238 colleges/universities or vocational/technical schools they planned to attend in fall 1988.
7. By survey time, 3,860 college-bound graduates had been promised financial aid from sources other than their parents, or relatives, or their own resources.
8. About 8% of the sampled graduates planned to work part- or full-time and not attend school in fall 1988.

9. In naming future occupations, the largest group of respondents (1,083) planned to have business related jobs.
10. A lack of student interest was identified as the biggest problem facing high schools; other problems were not enough money for schools, students dropping out of school, large and overcrowded schools, and gang activities.
11. The location of their schools was noted by 2,727 graduates as the best feature of their high schools; other good features were the variety of programs, the extracurricular activities, the quality of education, and the quality of teaching.
12. Of the respondents, 66% worked part- or full-time while in high school.
13. The condition of high school buildings and classrooms was rated as excellent by 2,114 respondents; the same for school reputation in the community--4,058; and for school spirit--2,590.

Introduction

Plans of the Graduates is one in a series of studies of high school students in Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD). This study surveyed graduating 12th graders for their postgraduation plans and their opinions about the education they had completed in high school.

The respondents were from 48 of the 49 regular high schools, 40 of 43 continuation high schools, 25 schools of choice, 2 special education schools, and 4 opportunity schools. Students in adult division diploma programs were not included.

The data for this study were collected in May 1988, 1 month before the end of the school term. The data gathering process involved sending survey forms to schools, having school staffs direct students to complete the forms, and returning the forms to Program Evaluation and Assessment Branch for analysis. The quantities of forms sent to schools were based on the 12th grade enrollment reported for October 1987, totaling 29,787. The yield was 17,742 completed forms, 65% of the May 1988 enrollment (determined later to be 27,308).

Survey Instrument

A three-part, 73-item questionnaire (see Appendix) called the Survey of 12th Graders, designed by the Program Evaluation and Assessment Branch staff, gathered the data for this report. Staff in the integration office and staff in the Senior High Schools Division contributed items and other suggestions for the form. Out of the 79 items, 43 were analyzed for this report.

It should be noted that the survey instrument served a dual purpose. It collected information for this report as well as for evaluation of postsecondary opportunities for the integration projects. To satisfy the diverse interests, it was necessary for the data gathering instrument to contain 20% more items than similar questionnaires in past years.

Analysis Procedures

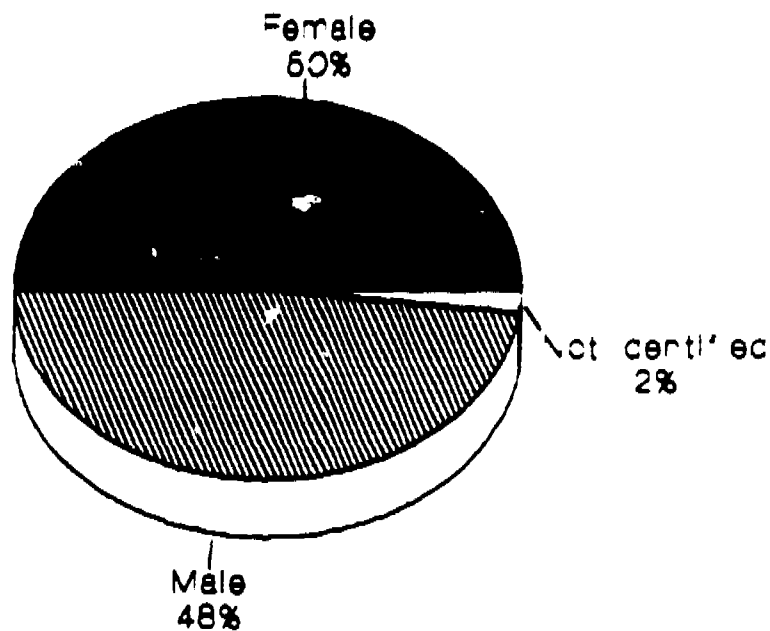
The data were analyzed by computer, using frequencies, percentages, and mean ratings of student responses. The findings are presented in summaries arranged in this order: total group (all graduates), student groups (male and female, and ethnic categories), and school summaries. School summaries are arranged in this order: nonregular high schools (continuation high schools, opportunity high schools, schools of choice, and special education schools) and individual regular high schools. Data for nonregular schools are reported as group summaries because of the small number of students surveyed in such schools.

Respondents

In October 1987, 29,787 LAUSD high school students were classified as 12th graders. When surveyed in May 1988, the 12th grade class had decreased to 27,308, 8% less than the October enrollment.

Making an effort to survey the entire 12th grade population, high school staffs succeeded in getting 17,742 seniors (65% of May enrollment) to complete survey forms. The respondents were comprised of 8,921 (50%) females, 8,467 (48%) males, and 347 (2%) students not identified by sex. (See item 1 and Figure 1.)

Most of the respondents (96%) expected to receive diplomas, while special education students (1%) expected to be awarded letters of recommendation instead of diplomas. About 3% failed to respond to the diploma question. (See item 14.)

Diploma statistics for this study were almost identical to those reported for the June 1986 graduates, the last graduating seniors on which a "plans" study was conducted.

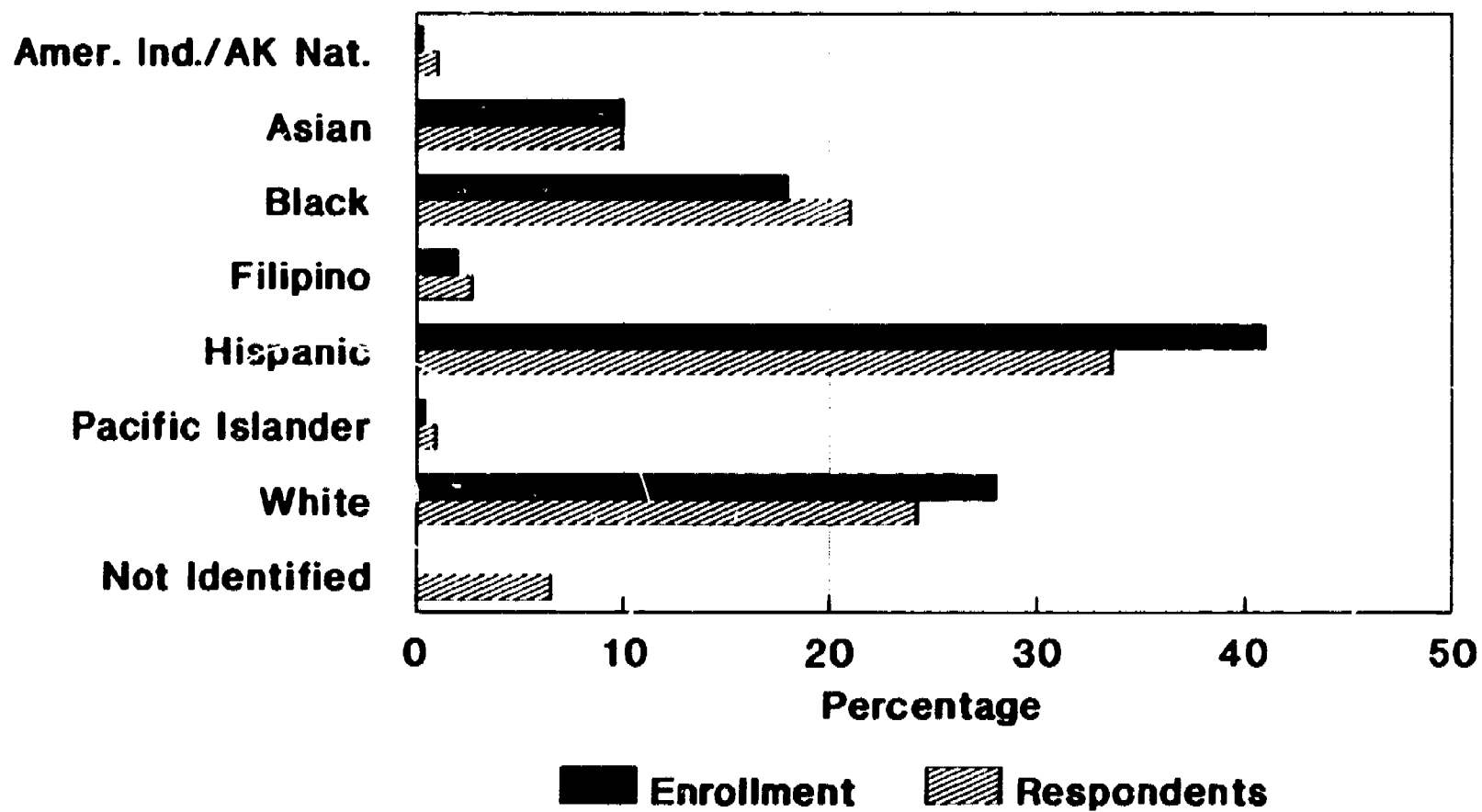


Figure 2. Ethnic representation of 12th graders

Also similar to the previous study is the respondents' ethnic representation, based on the October 1987 ethnic survey. All district ethnic groups are represented with their proportions closely paralleling their 12th grade ethnic make-up in senior high schools. Only minor differences are recognized. The greatest differences were with Hispanic and White students whose representation in the group of respondents were, respectively, 6 and 3 percentage points under their representation in high schools (Figure 2).

Findings

Of the 73 questionnaire items, 43 were selected and analyzed for this study. The results are presented in summary format. For the ease of presenting the results, the selected items were renumbered, 1 through 43. Item numbers are not shown for the last two items of each summary but, continuing the sequence, they logically become 42 and 43. The summaries have three general categories of information: Background Information, Plans of the 1988 Graduates, and 1988 Graduates' Opinions.

Background Information

Grade Point Average

Self-reporting their high school experiences, respondents revealed a wide variation in their educational accomplishments. This was apparent with the grade point averages reported. On a 4-point scale,

(A = 4), about 11% of the respondents earned mostly As for their high school coursework. Nearly half (47%) earned Bs, 20% Cs, and 1% Ds. (See item 7.)

Homework

The amount of homework teachers assigned varied across schools. Some students reported having had vast amounts while others had very little. The findings show that 25% of the respondents averaged 5 hours or more of homework each week and 18% averaged 4 hours. About 800 students averaged less than 1 hour weekly. (See item 8.)

Dropout Issues

Three survey items collected information on students who had contemplated leaving school before they graduated. (See items 10-12.) The first question asked the seniors if they ever considered dropping out of school. In response, 75% said no; in 1986, 81% said no. About 17% of the graduates in this study had considered dropping out. In 1986, a similar response came from 15% of the responding graduates.

A follow-up question asked those who had anticipated dropping out to give reasons why they had considered doing so. The reason named most often was problems with other students. Other reasons that accrued large numbers of responses were poor grades, family reasons, overage (being 18 or older), and attendance problems. The reason noted less frequently was problems with teachers. (See item 11.)

In 1986, the graduates' reasons were virtually the same. In rank order, their reasons were family-related problems, poor marks, attendance problems, and problems with teachers.

Graduates who contemplated dropping out (3,032) were also asked to identify factors that they thought had influenced them to change their minds and remain in school. The factor that influenced most graduates (2,269) was teacher encouragement, followed by family encouragement (1,106 graduates). Other motivations were the belief that it was important to graduate, and the encouragement from counselors and administrators.

Plans of the 1988 Graduates

Plans for Further Schooling

The graduates' plans for further schooling varied slightly from the plans of their 1986 counterparts. About 30% of this year's graduates planned to attend 4-year colleges full-time compared to 36% in 1986. Full-time attendance in 2-year colleges was the goal of 17% of the sample, compared to 15% in 1986. (See item 15.)

Most college-bound graduates were planning to attend school in California. About 19% were headed for a university of California while 27% were planning to enroll in a California state university. Only 5% of the college-bound graduates planned to matriculate in colleges or universities outside of California.

When asked to name the college/university or vocational/technical school they planned to attend the following fall, the respondents named a total of 238 schools. These institutions ranged from local trade schools to prestigious universities. The 1986 graduates named 223 schools (1% less than this year's graduates). (See item 42.)

By the time of this survey, many of the college-bound graduates (3,860) had been promised financial aid from sources other than their parents or relatives. The number promised aid (see item 18) is a slight increase over the number in 1986. The slight increase, may be attributed, in part, to the fact that the two classes were surveyed at different times of the year: end of the school term for the 1988 graduates, and the latter part of the 1st semester for the 1986 graduates.

Plans for Employment

Graduates' plans for work varied in that some (8%) anticipated working part- or full-time and not attending school; others (27%) expected to be working and attending school. Only 1% anticipated becoming full-time homemakers; 4% planned to join the military. Employment plans of this year's respondents are nearly identical to those of the 1986 graduates. (See item 15.)

The graduates named a wide range of jobs or occupations they planned to have. (See item 43.) These jobs or occupations cut across the whole spectrum of employment in this country. The largest group (1,083) named business as their future endeavor. Other occupations of high interest were art/design/music (1,010), computers (778), engineering (693), and law (682). For the 1986 graduates, the five most popular occupations, in rank order, were computers, engineering, business, medicine, and accounting.

While in high school, 66% of the respondents worked part- or full-time.

1988 Graduates' Opinions

Experiences

The questionnaire included 21 items that collected information on graduates' opinions relative to their high school experiences. Of the 21 items, 18 were Likert-scaled and were analyzed by computing mean responses on a 4-point scale (strongly agree = 4, agree = 3, disagree = 2, and strongly disagree = 1). Frequency counts and percentages were generated for the remaining three questions.

Similar to the 1986 findings, there was very little variation in the graduates' responses on the Likert-scaled items. Most questions received a mean response of 3, indicating agreement.

Almost identical to the responses of the 1986 graduates were the respondents opinions about certain prominent educational issues. They agreed with the C-Average/No Fail Policy and they believed that high schools should encourage all students to learn a skill that they can use in employment.

Looking retrospectively at their high school studies, graduates generally agreed that required courses such as English, mathematics, history, and government had been very helpful. History courses had helped them to understand the past and present problems of the United States; U.S. government had helped them to understand how national, state, and local governments function. English courses equipped them to be better writers and to be more efficient in using standard English. And mathematics had provided them enough knowledge to work out the problems of everyday life that require computational skills.

Of the 21 opinion issues presented, the respondents disagreed with only two: the notion that the study of U.S. history had helped them to focus on their values and the belief that there is too much gang activity on high school campuses. The opinion about gang activity is consistent with the graduate's of 1983, 1985, and 1986.

Positive and Negative Aspects of High School

The respondents were asked to identify the single biggest problem facing their schools. They did so by selecting, from a list of 11 problems, 10 of which were presented to the 1986 graduates. The task was to pick the problem, in their opinion, of the greatest magnitude. (See item 37.) Identical to the 1986 graduates, the largest group (3,839) identified student lack of interest as the biggest problem in their schools. The second largest group (1,860) cited students' dropping out and not graduating; the second largest group in 1986 identified large school/overcrowded conditions. The third largest group (1,820) of this year's graduates believe there are no big problems facing their schools.

There were other problems identified by large numbers of graduates. These problems included lack of money for schools, gang activity on school campuses, overcrowded schools, and teachers' lack of interest. (See item 37.)

On the positive side, graduates identified the best features of their schools (see item 38). School location was noted by 2,727 as the best feature. Others (2,483) named quality of education variety of

programs schools offer (2,050), and extracurricular activities (2,293) as exemplary features. (See item 38.) These findings are almost identical to those reported for the 1986 graduates.

Rating High School

On item 39, graduates used a 5-point scale (excellent to poor) to rate their high school on four variables: condition of buildings and classrooms, school reputation, school spirit, and instructional program. School buildings were rated good by 47% while 33% rated their school buildings as fair. The reputation of schools was rated even higher by some graduates. The findings show that 24% rated their schools as excellent in this area, while 38% rated theirs as good. School spirit and instructional programs were also rated as favorable by large proportions of graduates. (See item 39.)
