

ABSTRACT

This annotated bibliography lists 183 books dealing with adult literacy under 10 main categories: life skills; biographies; nonfiction; fiction; work identification workbooks; comprehension workbooks; skill development series; spelling workbooks; vocabulary workbooks; writing workbooks; and video frograms. The categories are further subdivided into up to six areas so that more specific information may be located. The life skills category is subdivided into personal development, employment, functional skills, health, legislation, and consumer issues. The nonfiction and fiction categories are each divided into stage II and stage III. Each annotation provides the following information: title, publisher, distributor, date, readability level, cost, and content summary. A listing of publishers' addresses appears at the end of the bibliography. An alphabetical title list and glossary are provided. (YLB)

HOW TO USE THIS BIBLIOGRAPHY

The books that have been reviewed in this bibliography fall under ten main categories:

Life Skills
Biographies
Non-Fiction
Fiction
Word Ideatification Workbooks
Comprehension Workbooks
Skill Development Series
Spelling Workbooks
Vocabulary Workbooks
Writing Workbooks
Video Programs

These categories are further subdivided so that you may locate more specific information (see Table of Contents). There is also an alphabetical title index at the back of the book.

In this edition, you will find 40 new annotations and they have been highlighted by this symbol.



You may notice that some of the annotations that appeared in the first edition do not appear in the second edition. This is because these books are out of print.

Each annotation provides the following information: title, publisher, distributor, date, cost and readability level. It is important to note that the readability levels were designated by the author of this bibliography, and not by the publisher of the book. Publishers sometimes provide an inaccurate readability level.

A listing of publishers' addresses appears at the end of this bibliography.

CRITERIA

The approach taken in this bibliography is informational rather than formal and any opinions expressed are those of the author. The following questions provided a framework for evaluating the material:

- * Does the author respect the reader?
- * What is the readability level?
- * Is the language suitable for adult students?
- * Is the topic suitable for adult students?
- * Are ideas clearly explained?
- * Is the information accurate and up-to-date?
- * Is the material organized in a logical sequence?
- * Does the book have an adult-like appearance?
- * Is the print large enough to be easily read?
- * What style of type is used?
- * Will the amount of text on the page overwhelm the adult reader?
- * Are the illustrations appropriate for use with adults?
- * Do the illustrations correspond with the text?
- * What kind of exercises are provided?
- * Do the exercises reflect current knowledge about the reading process?
- * Are the workbooks and reading programs based on the interactive reading process model of reading (rather than the skill based model)?
- * Are exercises presented in context or in isolation?
- * Is the content Canadian?

There is a plethora of books on the market which address life skills. The general topics covered can be categorized into personal development, employment, functional skills, health, legislation, and consumer issues. Numerous publishers have found an interested audience for books which address functional skills. Functional skills usually include filling out forms, reading signs and labels, how to use the newspaper, how to read a map etc. Caution should be exercised in stocking your shelves with the books categorized under 'functional' skills as all of these books are similar in nature. It would be more meaningful for tutors and students to bring real materials such as 'real' T.V. guides, telephone books, forms from work, maps of the city, etc. to their lessons.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Value of Self-Esteem: (Creative Education - Distributed by Saunders Book Company), no date.

Reading Level: 6-7

Cost: \$15.65 per title. Complete series of 12 costs \$187.80.

This is a series of 12 books which offer ways for students to raise their own expectations, deal with new situations, solve problems, and begin approaching life with a positive attitude. The series is intended for teenagers, yet the language is suitable for use with adults. Although the books are rife with cliches and generalizations, the series has been popular with students who want to read 'motivational books'. The books are 48 pages in length and are available in hard cover only. The individual titles are:

The Easy to Read Career Planning Guide: (Alberta Career Development and Employment - Distributed by Learning Resources Distributing Centre), 1986.

Reading Level: 3-4

Cost: Free government publication for Alberta, Yukon and N.W.T. residents. \$4.00 per copy for people residing outside of Alberta.

This book is for students who wish to change careers and for those who wish to choose a line of work. It involves students in a process whereby they match their interests and abilities to a job. This book also outlines the steps in gaining employment such as reading the want ads, filling out applications, and writing a resume. This is a helpful book for those who want an informal approach to career planning. Students in Alberta who want professional assistance should contact Alberta Career Development and Employment.

Follett Coping 3kills Series: (Cambridge - Distributed by Prentice-Hall), 1978.

Reading Level: 4-6

Cost: \$6.30 per title.

\$2.40 per teacher's guide. (Every title is accompanied by a teacher's guide.)

This is a suitable series of 3 books for students who wish to re-enter the workforce. Lessons could incorporate innovative teaching methods such as role-playing for job interviews. Although the series is dated (1978), the information is still pertinent. The individual titles are:

<u>Job Seekers Handbook:</u> (Alberta Career Development and Employment - Distributed by Learning Resources Distributing Centre), 1986.

Reading Level: 7-8

Cost: Free government publication for Alberta, Yukon and N.W.T. residents. \$3.00 per ccpy for people residing outside of Alberta.

This 70 page government publication contains valuable information for people who wish to re-enter the workforce. The sentence structure is quite complex, and the vocabulary is at a high level, so the book is not recommended for beginning readers.

Making Choices: Women in Non-Traditional Jobs: (Seacraft

Publications), 1987.

Reading Level: 8

Cost: \$20.95


This paperback celebrates the increase in female participation in non-traditional careers. The book features women who are mechanics, firefighters, ambulance attendants, transit drivers and airline pilots. The authors interviewed 22 women, who work in professional, skilled, and semi-skilled careers. The women were interviewed about "their background, how they got interested in the careers, what qualities and qualifications they thought were important - educational, experiential and personal." Full page black and white photographs depicting women at work accompany each story. The book does not contain a Table of Contents as the pages are not numbered.



Reading Level: 3

Cost: \$4.35 U.S. per title.

\$57.00 U.S. for set of 5 cassettes (2 books on each

cassette.)

\$42.00 U.S. for set of 10 books and Teacher's Guide.

Although this series is over 10 years old, it has been very popular with adult students. The set consists of 10 books which describe jobs that special needs students have performed successfully. Each page contains a small amount of print and an appropriate photograph which aids the reader in predicting the text. At the end of each book is a picture dictionary. Each book is approximately 60 pages in length and is only available in paperback. Cassettes and a teacher's guide may also be purchased. Individual titles are:

We Make the Clothes: (Toronto Board of Education -Distributed by Adult ESL Administrative Resource Centre -East), 1985.

Reading Level: 5

Cost: \$5.00

momen who have experienced work in a garment factory will identify with this photostory. We Make the Clothes was developed by women who participated in an English as a Second Language class located in a Toronto garment factory. This 24 page book shows the steps involved in making a piece of clothing from start to finish. Each step is illustrated with a black and white photograph and one or two lines of text. The book begins with a section for instructors on the process used to produce a photostory.





FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

Forms in Your Life: (Globe/Modern Curriculum Press), 1991.

Reading Level: 4-5

Cost: \$9.95

The best feature of this 109 page workbook is the Canadian content. The book begins by introducing vocabulary usually found in forms. The workbook contains 26 school, employment, bank, consumer, housing, provincial and federal forms. The print on some of the forms is quite small and cifficult to read. Each form is accompanied by special vocabulary words and helpful hints.

<u>Life Coping Skills Series:</u> (Steck-Vaughn - Distributed by Pippin), 1983.

Reading Level: 2-4

Cost: \$8.75 per title.

\$7.75 per teacher's guide. (Every title is accompanied by a teacher's guide).

This series contains 3 workbooks. The series was specifically written for secondary students; however, the language used in the workbooks conveys the feeling that they were written for children, rather than teenagers or adults. Another drawback of this series is that the content is American. The individual titles are:

Facts and Sources Signs and Labels Forms and Messages

Life Skills Reading - Book 1: (Educational Design - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1985.

Reading Level: 3-5

Cost: \$8.25

Teacher's guide free with order.

This workbook is comprised of 36 lessons which cover reading labels, following directions, looking up information, paying bills and taxes, agreements and guarantees and filling out forms and applications. It is recommended that this book be used as a reference by the tutor for ideas, and that 'real' labels, bills etc. be brought into the lesson by the student.

Life Skills Reading - Book 2 - Comprehension Skills: (Educational Design - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1984.

Reading Level: 4-6

Cost: \$8.25

Teacher's guide free with order.

This book tries to cover too many concepts, and as a result, is quite confusing to the reader. The reading material is a potpourri of selections from editorials, business letters, leases, consumer information, insurance forms, recipes, etc. The lessons progress quickly, moving from teaching main idea to vocabulary development to word meanings to context clues and finally ending with the 5W questions (who, what when, where and why).

Practice in Survival Reading: (New Readers Press -Distributed by Educational Resources), 1978. Reading Level: 4-5 Cost: \$6.95 per title. \$6.95 for teacher's quide.

This series consists of 8 workbooks and a teacher's guide. The workbooks contain representative materials from newspapers, documents, product labels, and instructions. Each workbook contains 25 lessons which have a 3 level questioning system of fact-finding, interpretation and application. Tutors and students are encouraged to bring real, meaningful material into the lessons and to use this series as a reference for ideas. The individual titles are:

Reading for Independence: (Science Research Associates), **1985.**

Reading Level: 4-6

Cost: \$7.15 per title. \$3.00 per teacher's guide. (Every title is accompanied by a teacher's guide).

This series is not recommended for adults, as it was written for an adolescent audience. The individual titles are:

HEALTH

Child Safe: A Parent's Guide to First Aid and Safety: (The Canadian Red Cross Society), 1987.
Reading Level: 4-6

Cost: \$12.95

This 120 page paperback is an excellent resource for parents. The first section discusses how to prevent accidents by creating a safe environment. The second section is a simple and easy-to-use first aid guide. Section one is 35 pages and is written at a grade 6 level whereas section two is 85 pages and is written at a grade 4 level. The text in section one is dense and the print is small. Although the second section was not specifically written for adult students, it is easy to read with large print, short sentences, and illustrations depicting first aid procedures. Section two is arranged in alphabetical order, beginning with treatment for bites and stings and ending with treatment for an unconscious person.

Food and Nutrition: (Janus Books - Distributed by Pippin),

Reading Level: 4

Cost: \$86.93 for set of 3 titles and binder. \$29.93 per title.

The Food and Nutrition program is a set of 3 workbooks in a binder. The books are an excellent resource for beginning cooks or for people who wish to increase their knowledge in measurement or nutrition. The individual titles are:

Measuring for Cooking Planning Healthy Meals Reading and Following Recipes





Help Yourself to Health: (New Readers Press - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1980.

Reading Level: 5

Cost: \$6.95 for book.

\$5.50 for workbook.

This 80 page book covers a variety of health related topics such as nutrition, exercise, sleep, stress, and care for one's skin, hair, teeth and eyes. One drawback is that the book does not contain enough graphic information to break up the print on each page. Some readers may be overwhelmed by the amount of print. Nevertheless, the book is a good source of information. A workbook to accompany 'Help Yourself to Health' is also available.

Keeping Healthy: (Project Literacy Series - Distributed by London Public Library), 1989.

Reading Level: 4-5

Cost: \$6.00

This is an excellent resource booklet for students who are apprehensive about visiting the doctor and the dentist. This 52 page booklet contains the following chapters: Visting the Doctor; At the Drugstore; Visiting the Dentist; and Canada's Food Guide. This publication walks the student through the steps which need to be taken to find a doctor/dentist and to make an appointment. Exercises are provided for students who have difficulty in reading prescription labels. Important and relevant information is delivered through narratives and an easy-to-read question and answer section. Some of the referral information and terms such as OHIP are specific to London, Ontario.

This is Your Body: (New Readers Press - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1982.

Reading Level: 6

Cost: \$6.95 for book.

\$5.25 for workbook.

Here is a book for those who want to learn more about their body. It's a well-written book with many black and white illustrations. However, the book has not been in great demand. It would probably be a good introduction for students who want to eventually earn credits in biology.



You Can Give First Aid: (New Readers Press, Distributed by Educational Resources), 1979.

Reading Level: 4

Cost: \$5.75

\$7.75 for teacher's guide.

This book contains vital information that all students, especially parents, should know. This 32 page booklet covers treatment for burns, shock, bleeding, poisoning, and minor wounds and is written at an easy-to-read level. Illustrations aid the reader in understanding how to give mouth to mouth resuscitation.



LEGISLATION

It's Your Right!: (Human Rights Directorate, Department of the Secretary of State), 1988.

Reading Level: 7

Cost: Free publication.

This kit consists of a 95 page student's manual and a teacher's guide. The manual contains an introductory chapter on basic rights and freedoms, followed by chapters on tenant's rights, age, disability, sexual harassment, equal pay, employment rights and race, colour and ethnic origin. Although the modules were designed to be used in Adult Basic Education classes, they could also be used successfully in tutorial sessions. Case studies are used within each module as a springboard for discussion and problem-solving. Cartoons, letters and newspaper stories are used as vehicles for presenting the majority of the case studies.



CONSUMER ISSUES

Banking for Adult New Readers: (ACCESS), 1981.

Reading Level: 7

Cost: \$2.50 & \$1.00 for handling.

This 28 page booklet was written to supplement the Alberta ACCESS video 'Safer than a Sock.' It concentrates on explaining how to use chequing and savings accounts. The print is large, and there is an adequate amount of graphic information. The one shortcoming is the length and complexity of the sentence structure.

Consumer Complaints: A Self Help Handbook: (Consumer and Corporate Affairs), 1985.

Reading Level: 7-8

Cost: Free government publication.

Do you work with students who are unsure of their rights as a consumer? Are they unsure about where and to whom they should take their complaints? If so, then this is the publication for them as it outlines procedures for effective complaining, methods of complaining, assertive behaviour, and general sources of consumer help. The bulk of the booklet is a directory of information. Although this book was intended for the general public, it could be used with students reading at a higher level (7-8).

Credit Wise: A guide to consumer credit: Canadian Bankers' Association), 1983.

Reading Level: 7-8
Cost: Free Publication

If the student you work with is interested in learning more about credit, this book will help to answer his/her questions. The book was written for the general public, so the vocabulary and sentence structure are complex, and there are few illustrations. Nevertheless, this 38 page booklet is an excellent source of information.



To the Point on Money Management: (New Readers Press - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1980. Reading Level: 3-4

Cost: \$6.50 per title. \$3.75 for teacher's guide.

The major disadvantage of this series is the American content. There are five books in the series, plus a teacher's guide. The lay-out of the books is good, and there are many cartoons and graphics. The individual titles are:

Canadian Lives: (Fitzhenry & Whiteside), 1989.

Reading Level: 5-6

Cost: \$7.95 for individual biographies.

\$9.95 for group biographies.

This well-written series is very popular among students. The paperback books are published in two formats: 48-page individual biographies and 64-page group biographies featuring four profiles with a thematic link. The text is supported by photographs, diagrams, news clippings, printed memorabilia, and childhood letters. The book is easy to read, with large print and short lines of text. This series comes highly recommended. The individual titles are:

Discover Canadians: (Globe Modern), 1980

Reading Level: 5-6

Cost: \$8.65

\$4.35 for teacher's guide.

This attractive paperback is a collection of 18 short biographies about Canadians. In writing this book, the author has chosen to highlight a significant event in the life of each of the subjects. Some of the more famous personalities portrayed are Nellie McClung, Anne Murray, Chief Dan George and Norman Bethune. This 95 page book contains several black and white photographs. Multiple choice questions and vocabulary exercises follow each biography. A teacher's guide is also available.



The Entertainers: (Creative Education - Distributed by Saunders Book Company), 1975 & 1983.

Reading Level: 7

Cost: \$13.50 per title.

This series, which features musicians and television shows, is dated as several of the televison shows are no longer aired. Also, Neil Diamond's biography was written in 1975. Although the publisher states that this series is written at a grade 4 level, this designation is inaccurate. The series is written at approximately a grade 7 level. These hardcover books are 32 pages in length. The individual titles are:

<u>History Maker Series:</u> (Quercus Corporation - Distributed by Globe Modern Curriculum Press), 1986. Reading Level: 3 Cost: \$4.95 per title.

The 3 books in this series are written in the narrative genre, which helps to make the history come to life. The illustrations are limited, with only 3 per book. The series is available in paperback only. The individual titles are:

Mother Teresa: (Scott, Foresman and Company - Distributed by Gage Educational Publishing Company), 1982.
Reading Level: 5-6
Cost: \$6.30

This book is part of a series entitled "Adult Readers Library." It is well-written, and is an interesting account of Mother Teresa's life. The book contains a glossary and several black and white photographs. Unfortunately, its shelf live is limited due to poor binding.



Operation Literacy Series I and II: (Canadian Library Association), 1981 and 1986.

Reading Level: 2-4

Cost: \$2.25 per title.

\$22.00 for Series I. \$20.00 for Series II.

Thirteen of the books in the Operation Literacy series are biographies of famous Canadians. The books are well-written and were extensively field tested in a number of literacy programs in Ontario. 

Best Short Stories: (Jamestown Publishers - Distributed by Fitzhenry & Whiteside), 1983 (Middle Level), 1990 (Advanced Level).

Reading Level: Middle Level (6-8), Advanced Level (9-12) Cost: \$20.95 per title. (Paperback)



The majority of short stories in the Middle Level edition are aimed at a young audience and the central characters are usually adolescents. For this reason, the Middle Level edition is not recommended. The Advanced Level edition contains selections which are written for an adult audience. However, the readability level of the short stories is high and the print is small. Each short story is accompanied by a lesson that focuses on a literary element (tone, mood, character) which is exemplified by the story. The Advanced Level is 476 pages and contains 13 short stories. The two books are available in paperback and hardcover.

Disasters: (Jamestown Publishers - Distributed by Fitzhenry & Whiteside), 1982.

Reading Level: 7 Cost: \$15.30

This title has not experienced a very high circulation rate. students probably do not find the title very appealing. The book describes 21 well known historic catastrophies such as the Great Chicago Fire, the sinking of the Titanic and the Hindenburg. Each disaster is 2-3 pages in length and is followed by a set of comprehension questions which stress vocabulary development and recognizing the main idea and supporting details. Disasters is part of the Critical Reading Skills Series. Other titles in the series are:

Each journal is about a disaster or out-of-control event that occured in the few years before Ryan's comet passed near Earth and collided with its moon. Throughout the book are questions which invite responses from the reader and writing exercises. This 150 page paperback contains a few black and white photographs.

This series is an adapted or revised set of bestsellers. Some of the more well-known authors are Ian Fleming, Frederick Forsyth, Dick Francis and James Herriot. Standard type is used and there are no illustrations. These readers have been enjoyed by many students, although some refrain from reading them due to the length of the books. This 330 page paperback is an excellent introduction to literature. The reader will be exposed to 24 short stories by authors from Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Norway, Australia, and Columbia. Educators will appreciate the book's format. It is divided into 8 units, with each unit focussing on a specific literary element such as point of view, conflict, or character, etc. Each unit begins with a two page discussion of the literary element and then presents 3 short stories that illustrate this specific element. The short stories are followed by questions that provide an opportunity for the reader to respond to the selection. The book ends with a 16 page glossary of literary terms. This book was not intended for literacy students, and consequently the print is small and dense.



Insight and Outlook: (Globe Modern Curriculum Press), 1975. Reading Level: 7-8

\$2.93 for teacher's guide.

This paperback is a collection of 16 titles which explore various themes such as 'facing life's problems', 'pursuing the goal of happiness', and 'understanding ourselves'. The book begins with a useful guide which describes the elements found in a short story. Each selection begins with an introduction to the author and to the story. The stories are between 5 - 20 pages in length and each one is followed by thought-provoking comprehension questions. All of the stories in this 274 page paperback are unabridged and unadapted.

Each selection is followed by questions dealing with characterization, mood, plot and author's intention. The stories vary in length and are between 13 to 30 pages long.

Milk River: (Peckham Publishing Project), 1985.

Cost: 1 pound, 35 pence.

This topnotch book of poetry was written by students from Jamaica and St. Lucia. If your program has a high enrollment of Caribbean students, this is the book for you. The 40 page booklet has large print, and contains several black-and-white photographs of Jamaica and St. Lucia. The language and photography in this paperback will spark many pleasant memories for those readers who have lived in the Caribbean and it will spark interest in the Caribbean for those who have never visited that part of the world.

Myths and Folktales From Around the World: (Globe Modern Curricum Press), 1985.

Reading Level: 4

Cost: \$13.75

\$3.65 for teacher's guide.

The concepts presented in this book and the unfamiliar genre of these myths and folktales may present difficulties for some students. A great deal of pre-reading discussion will probably be necessary. Fortunately, each selection begins with an introduction to new vocabulary and some background information about the myth. To facilitate comprehension, deities in Greek myths such as Aphrodite and Eros have been given their equivalent Roman names (Venus and Cupid). The book contains 46 myths and folktales from around the world. Each selection in this 370 page book is between 3-10 pages in length. At the end of the book, a set of thought-provoking questions are provided for each selection.



Open-Ended Storie.: (Globe Modern Curriculum Press), 1973. Reading Level: 4-5

The 20 short stories in this book are about young adults. The book addresses several universal themes such as 'the search for identity', 'brotherhood', and 'choosing values'. With each of the stories, the reader must supply the ending. Many adult students do not like this book as they seem hesitant to provide a conclusion for a story in which they do not have a sense of ownership.

This series is a collection of true to life stories adapted from newspapers and magazines. Real Stories consists of 4 paperbacks. Each paperback contains 24-30 short selections. The books range in length from 170 to 250 pages. Each selection is followed by 4-5 pages of comprehension questions, vocabulary development exercises and writing exercises. Every story is accompanied by an illustration. The individual titles are:

Computers, money, energy and the environment, health concerns and social relationships are some of the issues dealt with in the passages. One shortcoming is that the selections were not given titles, which makes choosing a selection to read difficult. Multipl -choice comprehension questions follow each selection, plus detailed answers and explanations that show the reader how to analyze the passage to obtain the correct answer. The 18 passages in this book form a collection of science fiction, supernatural and strange tales from the past. The passages have been adapted from originals by well known authors such as Poe and H.G. Wells. The selections vary in length from 3-12 pages. Standard type is used and the illustrations are limited to one per story. Explicit and implicit multiple choice comprehension questions follow each selection. As well, an introduction to new vocabulary precedes each story. Overall, the book has a good collection of passages.



Talespinners: (Fearon), 1981. Reading Level: 4

Cost: \$3.90 U.S. per title.

Talespinners has recently expanded from 8 to 16 titles. Although the publisher states that the readability levels are between grades 2-4, the higher level seems to be a more accurate representation of the reading level. The 16 paperback books are a combinaton of mysteries, adventure and science fiction. In some of the books the central character is an adult, whereas in others, it is an adolescent. These 75 page books contain only an introductory illustration. The most recent titles are:

Currently, there are 5 paperbacks available in this new series, with each paperback featuring two western stories. These westerns were originally published in magazines between 1928 and 1962. The authors are well established writers of western fiction and a few are recipients of the 'Spur Award' from the Western Writers of America. Each novelette is approximately 100 pages. The size of the print varies from book to book. For instance, the print is large in book #2 and small in book #4. The text is not accompanied by graphics. These books are recommended simply because of the lack of easy-to-read westerns. The individual titles are:

Words on the Page, The World in Your Hands is a set of three paperbacks and a teaching manual. Each book contains between 44-65 pieces of prose and poetry written, selected and adapted by contemporary writers for adults in literacy programs. The selections have been arranged in order of difficulty, with Book One containing selections that can be understood at a literal level. In Book Two, readers will have to apply inferential comprehension skills more frequently. Book Three contains more abstract material, that will require the reader to apply critical analysis of the text. The print is very dense, and the books do not contain any illustrations.



Many publishers market reading programs which are based on the skills approach to reading. These programs have been placed under WORD IDENTIFICATION since this is their focus for diagnosis and remediation. In the skills approach reading is viewed as a set of skills which need to be learned sequentially. In this approach reading is not viewed as an interaction between the reader's knowledge and print. Neither is reading viewed as a communication process occurring between reader and author. Although none of these programs are recommended as a 'core' reading program, they could be used to supplement the student's individualized program or they could be used as a tutor/student reference.

The books also vary in the genre of the passages. American content is kept to a minimum. Structural analysis and phonics are emphasized and a review of these skills is built into each workbook. The print is large in workbook 1 and gradually decreases in size with each workbook. Judging from the contents of this series, pre-requisite skills are deemed to be: learning the alphabet; developing a sight vocabulary; and acquiring perceptual skills. The pages in each of the workbooks are perforated with the inside of the page being the student's workpage and the outside column containing the teacher's directions. This series is not recommended because skills are taught in isolation.

This kit will assist readers who tend to analyze small units of print, and need practice in processing larger print units. Each cluster pack represents a specific letter clustering such as 'at', 'ash' or 'ack'. The 17 words in each cluster pack are arranged in order of increasing difficulty. In addition to the 120 cluster packs, this program also includes 8 illustrated, 32 page 'Follow Through Practice' books. This series consists of 4 skill books, 4 teacher's manuals, 4 readers, and supplementary materials. The program is very structured and prescriptive in nature. Reading is viewed as a sequential activity, and each book introduces a set of skills to the student. The skill books progress from teaching consonant sounds to short vowels to long vowels and finally to consonant digraphs. The skill books vary in length and in the number of lessons, with Skill Book 1 containing 13 lessons and Skill Book 4 containing 23 lessons. Each lesson is comprised of a passage and a set of activities, all of which emphasize the skill being taught. The passages in Skill Book 1 are under 100 words in length, and the language used is very repetitive and predictable. With each skill book, the language becomes less predictable, and the passages gradually increase in length. The print in Skill Book 1 is large, and gradually decreases in size with each skill book. The passages are followed by a set of activities which reinforce practical life skills and comprehension skills. The comprehension questions are mainly explicit. The success of this well-known program differs among students. The major drawback is that the program is not individualized, as the focus is on the attainment of skills rather than HOW the student is reading. If this program is used, it should be supplemented by a variety of other meaningful activities such as language experience which encourages the student's use of language knowledge and his/her knowledge of the world. The end result was dozens of potentially good crossword puzzles that students were unable to use. However, this problem would be overcome if copies were made on a spirit duplicator. The title of this workbook is misleading as an attempt is made to buil skills in structural analysis and dictionary usage as well as in comprehension. The workbook contains 12 units that focus on a specific skill and 2 units that serve as a review of skills. The comprehension units that address main idea and inferences are process-oriented. These 2 units introduce the concept through the use of pictures and then describe strategies to find the main idea and to make inferences. The remaining 10 units are skills-based and do not provide the student with effective strategies for understanding or decoding text. The unit on understanding relationships among ideas across passages (cause-effect, time, compare-contrast) is very superficial and does not provide enough examples or exercises. Although this 215 page workbook is entitled From Pictures to Passages, it only contains 10 pages of illustrations.

In addition, the text lists 336 commonly misspelled words which are frequently used when writing.

This series consists of two 142 page workbooks. Each workbook has 36 units which are similar in format. Within each unit, a list of 24 high-utility words is presented. The word lists are followed by exercises which focus on spelling and vocabulary development. The workbook is based on a combination of spelling approaches such as mnemonics, meaning units and syllabication.

Dr. Spello: (McGraw-Hill, Inc.), 1968.

This remedial workbook is 20 years old, yet it is still in demand. It provides a quick overview of spelling from grades 1 to 6. William Kottmeyer, the author, believes that phonics instruction is the key to spelling. The lessons move sequentially from consonant sounds, to long and short vowels, to digraphs, etc. This workbook is good for students requiring a quick review of already learned basics before moving into learning new spelling concepts.

Gateways to Correct Spelling: (Steck-Vaughn Company - Distributed by Pippin), 1980.

This workbook consists of 60 lessons, with each lesson introducing 12 new words for a total of 720 spelling words. According to the author, these 720 words cause four-fifths of the spelling errors made by persons beyond elementary school. This workbook has a dual purpose. It may be used by students as a grammar workbook and by educators to review the rules of grammar. The workbook examines the parts of speech (verbs, nouns, pronouns, conjunctions, adjectives, adverbs, and prepositions) and explains how the parts of speech are put together to form sentences. Basic English Grammar also contains two chapters on sentence patterns and diagramming sentence patterns.



This handbook was based on a project initiated by the Strathcona County Board of Education in Alberta. The handbook is intended to be a resource manual for secondary students, but it is also appropriate for adults. The handbook concentrates primarily on written communication, with chapters on the writing process, research papers, editing, and writing letters. Students will also appreciate the short chapter on study skills.

Cursive Writing Program - Student Workbook: (Science Research Associates - SRA), 1980.
Cost: \$42.75 for package of five student workbooks.

Is the student you work with ready to make the transition from manuscript printing to cursive writing? This workbook provides 140 one-page lessons that enable the student to practice cursive writing. Students who have difficulty in letter formation will appreciate the opportunity to trace letters composed of dots. The illustrations in this book are childish. Nonetheless, the workbook has been well received by adult students.







WRITING WORKBOOKS

Grammar and Composition: (Charles E. Merrill Publishing Company - Distributed by Collier MacMillan), 1984. Cost: \$9.15 per title.

This series includes three 172 page workbooks, with each consecutive workbook increasing in difficulty. The 5 units found in each workbook are: grammar, usage, mechanics, composition and words. The grammar unit covers everything from nouns and verbs to participial and appositive phrases. In the usage unit, students receive instruction in learning how to use pronouns, verb forms and modifiers correctly. The mechanics unit reviews punctuation and capitalization. Paragraph development and different kinds of writing are explored in the composition unit. Finally, the words unit focuses on vocabulary development. The individual titles are:

<u>I Wish I Could Write:</u> (New Readers Press - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1978.

Cost: \$5.95

This 40 page booklet provides topics and suggestions for inspiring new writers. The author, Joan Rarasovska, developed the lessons in her writing class for adult literacy students. Tutors/teachers and students will appreciate the ideas presented in this booklet.

Improving Your Punctuation Skills: (Educational Design - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1983.

Cost: \$8.25

This 80 page workbook provides many skill building exercises for the student who needs to improve his/her punctuation skills. The 4 chapters include sentence punctuation, commas, semicolons and colons, and quotations. A summary and review is also built into this workbook, as are mastery tests.



In Your Own Words: (Cambridge - Distributed by Prentice-Hall Inc.), 1987. Cost: \$6.00 per title.

This program consists of 2 workbooks entitled 'Sentence Skills' and 'Paragraph Competency'. Each workbook emphasizes specific writing skills as opposed to the writing process. 'Sentence Skills' provides exercises in constructing, varying, editing, combining and reducing sentences. 'Paragraph Competency' provides instruction and exercises in creating narrative, descriptive, persuasive and expository paragraphs. As well, there are units on writing business letters, reports, invitations and thank-you notes. The individual titles are:

The Kim Marshall Series in English: (Educators Publishing Service - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1980.

This series consists of four 93 page paperbacks which represent the following four distinct levels: threshold, basic, general, and advanced. In Book 1, charts and lists are emphasized as a means of expressing written information. Books 2, 3, & 4 are each divided into 3 units dealing with practical themes. Owning and operating a vehicle and finding a job are some of the themes. These books are well-written and could be used as resource books for the tutor/teacher or as supplements to writing assignments. Each book contains several graphics. The individual titles are:

Language Workshop - A Guide to Better English: (Globe Modern Curriculum Press), 1984.

This 182 page text-workbook contains 33 lessons which stress the mechanical aspects of writing. Grammar, spelling and punctuation are the 3 skill areas covered in this workbook. The language and illustrations are aimed towards adolescent students.

<u>Life Skills Writing:</u> (Educational Design - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1984.
Cost: \$8.25 per title.

Educational Design publishes 2 Life Skills Writing workbooks. The first one is 'Writing for the World of Work'. One shortcoming of this workbook is the American content which makes some units such as the completion of W-4 forms irrelevant for the Canadian student. The exercises include writing lists, memos, receipts, purchase orders etc. Rather than using this workbook, students could bring in 'real' examples of writing from their workplace. The second workbook is 'Life Skills Writing'. Students would probably find the sections on personal letters, letter formats and business letters quite useful. The individual titles are:

Practicing the Writing Process 1, The Paragraph: (Educational Design - Distributed by Educational Resources), 1985.

Cost: \$8.25

Teacher's guide free with order.

This workbook has been popular among tutors and students. The following 4 writing stages are covered: pre-writing; writing; revising; and editing. The exercises involve students in writing descriptive paragraphs, book reports, personal letters and business letters. Recently, Educational Design published 'Practicing the Writing Process 2, The Essay, ' and 'Practicing the Writing Process 3, Writing in the Content Areas.'

Put It In Writing: (Cambridge - Distributed by Prentice-Hall Inc.), 1987.
Cost: \$6.25 per instructional text.

\$3.75 per workbook.

This series consists of 3 instructional paperbacks and 3 activity books which are correlated to the instructional texts. The series could best be described as a grammarbased composition program. Book 1 introduces verb tenses, subject and verb agreement, and various types of writing styles. Book 2 explores more complex grammar concepts such as using clauses and phrases. Book 2 also provides instruction in writing business reports. Book 3 delves into the writing process and examines various writing styles.



The Reading Road to Writing: (Globe Modern Curriculum Press), 1984.

Cost: \$7.50 per title.

\$2.95 for teacher's guide for the series.

This series consists of 6 workbooks which review grammar and usage. Each workbook contains 5 lessons in which a reading selection is followed by 4-5 pages of exercises which reinforce specific grammatical conventions through skill building exercises and writing tasks. The lessons also include clear explanations of grammatical topics using examples from the reading passage. The individual titles are:

This 95 page workbook does not contain any graphics.



Writing for a Reason: (Quercus Corporation - Distributed by Globe Modern), 1986.

Cost: \$8.75 per set. Each set includes a workbook and practice book.

Writing for a Reason consists of 4 workbooks which are each accompanied by a 24 page practice book. The fifth workbook is accompanied by a 60 minute audio tape. The language and illustrations are appropriate for adolescents. The individual titles are:

VIDEO PROGRAMS

Journeyworkers: (Produced by Alberta ACCESS & Manitoba Department of Education), 1987.

Cost: \$81.75 for Journeyworker package. Package includes five video programs, one tutor handbook and one workshop leader's guide.

Individual costs are as follows:

Duplication fee is \$12.50 per video program (plus tape cost).

\$10.00 per tutor handbook.

\$18.00 per workshop leader's guide.

There is also a \$5.00 flat rate handling charge.

Journeyworkers is a tutor training resource package which consists of 5 videotape programs, tutor handbooks and a workshop leader's guide. The program, which was written by Mary Norton, is based on the interactive reading process model. Program One, 'Learning and Teaching' contains 5 modules which portray tutor and student experiences, the stages of literacy and general approaches that support and encourage learning. Program Two, 'Learning from Experience', contains 8 modules which explore questioning strategies, assisted reading and writing, the writing process and using experience to read and write. Program Three, 'Making Sense of Words', is comprised of 6 modules which concentrate on strategies for spelling and for predicting and identifying words. Program Four, 'Making Sense of Content', is made up of 7 modules which focus on strategies for comprehending text. Program Five, 'I Just Want to Learn More', is an 18 minute module intended for general public education about adult literacy issues. The tutors handbook, which is correlated with the video programs, includes an orientation to reading/writing theory as well as reading, writing and spelling strategies. The workshop leader's guide includes duplicating masters for workshop handouts and overhead transparencies. The entire resource package is very flexible and could be used in a variety of ways by tutor coordinators and tutors.



VIDEO PROGRAMS

Safer Than a Sock: (Alberta ACCESS), 1980.
Cost: \$12.50 for duplication (plus tape cost and handling charge).

This 30 minute production dramatizes a chapter in the life of 32 year old Frank Pritchard. The program portrays how Frank has developed coping strategies to deal with his illiteracy.

The Video Tutor: (Onward Learning Systems), 1990. Cost: \$129.95 for Video Tutor Package.

The package includes one video tape, three audio cassettes, an individual workbook, a tutor guide, and a storage case. According to Onward Learning Systems (OWL), the Video Tutor is a "self-directed package aimed at adults whose current reading and writing skills are around the grade two to grade five level." This package is not recommended for several reasons. First, although the audio and video tapes enable the student to use the workbook without the assistance of an instructor, many students do not have access to video and audio equipment. Secondly, the program does not provide any word identification or comprehension strategies. The workbook exercises and accompanying audio tapes are meaningless and consist of 'fill in the blank' tasks. Thirdly, the video is amateurish and annoying. For instance, in one skit, the actors/actresses who were cast as parents were the same age as the actors/actresses who were cast as children. Finally, the style and content of the narrator's presentation is very patronizing.

GLOSSARY

COMPREHENSION QUESTIONS

Explicit Level The answers for explicit comprehension questions can be located in the text. Sometimes explicit questions require the student to integrate the explicit text information.

Implicit Level Implicit questions require the student to 'read between the lines'. The answers is not specifically stated in the text.

Experiential Level The response for experiential questions is based entirely on the reader's background knowledge.

W5 Questions W5 refers to question that begin with the following words: what, who, when, where and why.

LITERACY STAGES

Stage I Adults in this stage are beginning readers/writers. They need to develop the concept of why people read and/or how people read.

Stage II Adults in this stage are developing and refining their word recognition abilities. Stage II students should be encouraged to use knowledge based information in conjunction with print based information as they read and write. This stage corresponds with reading grade levels one through three.

Stage JII Adults in this stage should be encouraged to engage in widespread reading and writing. This stage corresponds with reading grade levels four through nine.

WORD IDENTIFICATION

Analytic Phonics This method refers to phonics programs which emphasize word families. Students use known words to discover strategies for decoding unknown words. This approach stresses that letter sounds should not be taught in isolation.

Structural Analysis This word identification method involves the recognition of words by large, meaningful units such as roots, prefixes, and suffixes.



GLOSSARY

Sight Word A word which is recognized instantly and independently by the student.

Word Family A group of words that have the same pattern of letters. For example, the following words belong to the same word family: heat, beat, and seat.
