ABSTRACT

This fact book is a summary of current data about Southern Illinois University at Carbondale (SIUC) and represents a compilation of historical data for a 5- to 10-year period as well as comparative data, both national and statewide. It is composed of seven sections that include information about enrollment, student characteristics, academic programs, budget, state appropriations, student finance, faculty and staff, the library, and the physical plant and other property. Among the highlights are the following: (1) during the past 15 years, enrollment at SIUC has been above 20,000 students; (2) there are 195 degree programs offered, including specialist degrees, first professional, associate, bachelors, masters, and doctoral; (3) from 1985 to the present, federal, state, and institutional sources of funds for student financial aid have steadily increased from \$55 million to \$82.8 million, or a 33.5% increase; (4) the composition of the faculty and professional staff, including the School of Medicine, was 61% male and 39% female, with part-time and full-time staff being divided roughly 50/50; (5) current fund revenues totalled \$284 million with a decrease of 2% compared to FY 1989 while current fund expenditures totalled about \$285 million representing an 11% increase; and (6) the number of owned acres and value of those acres increased from FY 1989 with 2,500 additional acres and \$8,952 in additional value. PREFACE

Fact Book 1990 is a summary of current data about Southern Illinois University at Carbondale. Also, Fact Book 1990 is a compilation of historical data for a five to ten-year period as well as comparative data, both national and statewide.

The trith edition is composed of seven sections, including information about enrollment, student characteristics, academic programs, budget, state appropriations, student finance, faculty and staff, the library, and physical plant and other property. Various data are introduced in tabular format with the support of graphical presentations. Sources of the data are identified and encompass annual external reports to various agencies, internal databases, including the student and faculty/staff database, and the cooperation of various on-campus units at Southern Illinois University at Carbondale.

Highlights of the data follows. Questions and comments regarding <u>Fact Book 1990</u> are encouraged and welcomed.







Student Characteristics and Enrollment

Highlights of characteristics and enrollment of students at Southern Illinois University are as follows:

- During the past fifteen years, enrollment at Southern Illinois University has been above 20,000 students. Enrollment peaked twice between Fall 1975 and 1990. Fall 1981 enrollment was 23,991 and Fall 1989 had a headcount of 24,596. Fall term enrollment data for the period of 1981 to 1990 for all Illinois public universities shows that enrollment declined after 1981, peaked in 1987 and peaked again in 1990.
- For the period of 1986-1990, the data shows that a large percent of first-time freshmen students have originated from Cook, DuPage, Jackson, Lake and St. Clair counties. Also, for the period of Fall 1986 thru 1990, 80-90 percent of first-time enrolled students at SIUC had residence established in the state of Illinois.
- During the past decade, the total student population has been predominately White/Non-Hispanic with an average of 77 percent. The percentage of minorities has risen during the past ten years. Fall 1990, 9.3% of the students were Black/Non-Hispanic, 7.9% were Non-Resident Aliens, 1.7% were Hispanic, 1.6% were Asian/Pacific Islanders, and 0.4% were American Indian/Alaskan.
- According to percentages released by the U.S. Department of Education for the Fall 1988 semester, within Illinois and compared to bordering states, SIUC is second only to the U of I at Urbana-Champaign for percent of minorities enrolled at the largest non-urban public universities. The institutions compared include Southern Illinois University at Carbondale, University of Illinois, Northern Illinois University, Indiana State at Bloomington, Purdue University, University of Wisconsin at Madison, University of Iowa, and University of Missouri at Columbia. This extract comes from a report published in SIUC's Spring 1991 Alumnus concerning minority enrollment strategies.
- For the period of 1986 thru 1990, the majority of undergraduate and graduate degree seeking international students have originated from these countries: Malaysia, Japan, China, Taiwan, Singapore, and India. Although there has been a large population of Malaysian students at SIUC, the total headcount has decreased by one third since 1986. The number of new Japanese students to campus has increased about 80% since 1989. The




total number of international students on campus (only degree seeking students) for Fall 1990 was 1,860, which is an increase of 7% since 1989.

- According to a report released by the Institute of International Education, SIUC ranked 11th in the nation in international student population for the 1989-90 school year.
- The average composite ACT score of entering freshmen in four-year programs has been fairly stable at about 21 for the past ten years. The average composite ACT for two-year program students has fluctuated between 17 and 18.
- The American College Test (ACT) recently released that the national average ACT score is 20.6 and the average ACT score for SIUC's students is above the national average and matches Illinois' average of about 21.
- The average age of SIUC's undergraduate students for the past decade has varied between 21 and 23. The average age of the graduate and professional students for the same period of time has varied between 28 and 31.









Undergraduate Headcount by Race and National Origin: 1980-1990




Graduate Headcount by Race and National Origin: 1980-1990











UNIT COST STUDENT CREDIT HOURS BY LEVEL OF INSTRUCTION FISCAL YEAR 1990



Academic Programs

The number of degree programs offered at Southern Illinois University at Carbondale totals 195 with 75% of its students enrolled in Bachelor degree programs for Fall, 1990. About 8% of the students were enrolled in Associate degree programs, 11% in Master's, 4% in Doctoral programs, 2% in First Professional programs, and 0.02% in Specialist degree programs.

Between July 1, 1989 and June 30, 1989, the highest number of degrees conferred were in the Hegis classification of Education (1,219) with Engineering/Engineering Related Technologies (617) and Business and Management (609) following with the second highest degrees conferred. The ratio of degrees awarded to men and women was 2 to 1, or 4,031 and 2,335 respectively.

Trends in degrees conferred in Illinois public institutions for the past decade are as follows:

- Baccalaureate degrees conferred during FY79-89 for SIU have been fairly stable with a slight decline in 1988-89. The Board of Regents and Board of Governors have realized a steady decline with a slight increase in 1988-89. University of Illinois has realized a steady increase over time.
- The Board of Regents, SIU and University of Illinois systems have offered Doctorate degrees during the past decade, and the number of degrees conferred have gone up and down with the exception of University of Illinois. This system has experienced a steady incline except for the period of 1982-1984.
- First professional degrees awarded by the Board of Regents, SIU and University of Illinois systems have peaked at various times during the past 10 years. Board of Regents realized their highest degrees conferred in 1980-81 (100); SIU awarded its highest number of first professional degrees in 1985-86 (213), and University of Illinois awarded the most degrees this past year (1988-89) with 807 first professional degrees.










Master's Degrees Conferred in Illinois Public Institutions: 1979-1989



Student Finance

With an impending tuition increase for Academic Year 1991-92 and a fees increase already in place, the availability of financial assistance will be crucial for Southern Illinois University at Carbondale students.

From 1985 to the present, federal, state and institutional sources of funds for financial aid have steadily increased from 55 million to 82.8 million or a 33.5% increase. During FY1990, 23% of SIUC's available aid was from federal sources, 38% from state sources, and 30% from institutional sources.

Fifteen thousand four hundred fifty-three undergraduates received financial support for FY1990 (61% of the total undergraduate population) and 4,519 graduate students received financial support (87% of the total graduate student population). These numbers represent an unduplicated headcount.

Reviewing the status of annual tuition and fees for resident students at the Illinois public universities from 1981 to the present, the following provides a summary of the findings:

- Almost all Illinois public institutions have realized approximately a 60% increase in tuition and fees with the exception of SIU-Edwardsville, which had a 52% increase.
- University of Illinois system experienced the greatest increase with 67%.
- SIU-Carbondale has kept pace with Eastern and Sangamon State with a 59% increase.

According to the annual Student Charges at Public Institutions survey conducted by NASULGC and AASCU for 1990, the average undergraduate tuition/ fees charges for an academic year is \$1,657 (N=497). Comparing this average to Illinois public institutions' charges for 1990, all charge above this average except for Governor's State.





Faculty and Staff

Highlights of the data relating to the faculty and staff at Southern Illinois University at Carbondale as of Fall 1990 are as follows:

- The composition of the faculty and professional staff, including the School of Medicine, was 61% male and 39% female. The percentage of males has declined 2%, and the percentage of females has increased since Fall 1989.
- About half of the faculty and professional staff are full time and half are part time. The majority of the part time faculty are graduate assistants.
- Looking at the ranks of Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Instructor and Lecturer, the percentage of females to males increased noticeably in the Assistant Professor rank (36% and 64% respectively), and in the Instructor and Lecturer ranks (55% and 45% respectively) as compared to the Professor and Associate Professor ranks.
- The ratio of faculty to students has ranged between 1 faculty and 15 students to 1 faculty and 17 students since 1982.
- Currently, the majority of SIUC's faculty, including graduate assistants, and professional staff are from North America and a large percentage are from Asia.
- As of Fall 1990, the College of Liberal Arts employed the largest number of graduate assistants (331) in a single unit, and the College of Education employed the second largest number of graduate assistants (220).
- About 16% of the Full Time faculty and professional staffare tenured, and about 79% are not tenured.
- Faculty and professional staff are predominantly citizens with a total of 81%.
- As of Fall 1990, SIUC employed 2,217 Civil Service employees and the School of Medicine (Carbondale and Springfield campuses) employed 799 employees.







Budget and Finance

Highlights of Southern Illinois University at Carbondale's financial data follows:

- Current fund revenues totalled \$284 million with a decrease of 2% compared to FY1989.
- Current fund expenditures totalled about \$285 million with an increase of 11% compared to FY1989.
- The total number of grants and contracts increased 18% from FY89 and an 8% increase resulted in award dollars totalling about \$71 million.
- Research dollars specifically decreased by 1.5% but increased in total number of awards between FY89 and 90.
- State appropriations for FY91 accounts for 57% of SIUC's total operating budget with \$123 million.
- Appropriated and non-appropriated funds did not realize as great an increase between FY90 and 91 (about 6% and 9% respectively) as compared to FY89 and 90 (11% and 15% respectively).
- Total internal operating budget dollars experienced an increase in FY90 with a 10.3% incline and a second smaller incline in FY91 (about 7%). SIUC has an operating budget of \$304 million for FY91.










Total Operating Budget FY1991

Library

Highlights of the library system data follows:

- Southern Illinois University at Carbondale's School of Law and School of Medicine libraries and Library Affairs reported to the Association of Research Libraries (ARL) an increase again this year with total volumes of 2.2 million.
- Between 1989 and 1990, circulation of books, periodicals, media materials, phonorecords and maps increased 8% at Library Affairs but decreased 7% and 12% respectively at the School of Law and School of Medicine libraries. (Circulation is defined by SIUC's library staff as the check out and taking of books and periodicals from the library.)
- In addition, expenditures for materials and binding, salaries and wages and operating expenses and equipment rose 11% between 1989 and 1990 as compared to a 9% increase between 1988 and 1989.



Physical Plant and Other Property

A summary of data relating to the status of physical plant and capital improvements for FY1990 follows:

- The number of owned acres and value of those acres (including Spring-field Medical campus) increased from FY1989 with 2,500 additional acres and \$8,952 in additional value.
- The total dollar value (including Springfield Medical campus) for improvements, equipment, and buildings rose between 1989 and 1990.
- SIUC added nine trucks and 28 motorcycles and trucksters during FY1990.
- Since 1980, Southern Illinois University has realized the greatest capital improvements request in 1991 with \$60,732,500 requested and \$49,411,900 appropriated, an 81.4% realization. Also, SIU realized the least percent of requested capital improvement dollars in Fiscal Year 1982, 1988 and 1989.
- For the period of 1980-90, the average capital improvement request was \$37,241,400 and the average appropriation was \$9,910,300, a 30.2% realization.
