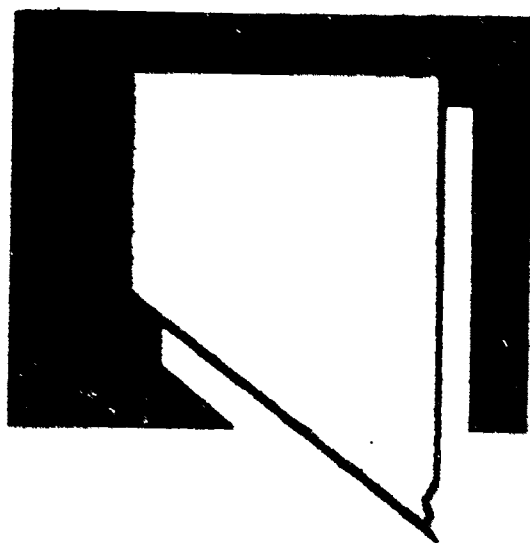
ABSTRACT

This report presents, in charts and graphs, Fall 1990 enrollment statistics for the University of Nevada System (UNS). Data are organized under the following topics. headcount, full-time equivalents, enrollment trends, gender, racial-ethnic designation, age, and headcount for Summer Session 1990. The data indicate a 12.1 percent growth since Fall 1989 in number of students enrolled in the system, with a 14.6 percent increase in the community college enrollments and a 9.3 percent increase in the university enrollments. Systemwide, 70% of the student body is composed of part-time students. However, the enrollment of part-time students at universities fell from 55 percent in 1989 to 49 percent in 1990, while part-time student percentages at community colleges remained at 89 percent. Fifty-six percent of all students were female, the same proportion as 1989. In addition, 79.9 percent of students systemwide were white, 1.4 percent nonresident alien, 3.2 percent non-specified, and 15.7 percent minority. Student age data collected in Fall 1989 found that 30.3 percent of students were 22 to 29 years old. The next two largest groups were 18 to 21 year olds and 30 to 39 year olds.

## ENROLLMENT REPORT

The University of Nevada System (UNS) currently enrolls a total of 68,002 students in credit granting courses. In addition, it is estimated that systemwide an additional 30,000 to 35,000 students are served annually through self-supported continuing education and other noncredit courses offered by UNS institutions. Of the 68,000 total, 61,480 of those students are enrolled in state-supported classes while an additional 6,522 students are enrolled in self-supported credit granting courses.

This is the sixth consecutive year that the University of Nevada System has reported growth in student enrollment. Following slight declines in headcount enrollment in 1984 and slight declines in full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment in 1983 and 1984, enrollments have continued to increase at all six campuses. The fall 1990 enrollment of 68,002 students is an increase of 12.1% over total system enrollment in fall 1989. Fall 1990 FTE enrollment increased 9.9% to a total enrollment of 31,571 full-time equivalent students.

Systemwide fall headcount enrollment has grown 64.8% from 1981 to 1990. In ten years, enrollment has grown from 41,255 students to 68,002 students, an increase of over 26,000 students. Total enrollment in the four community colleges has increased 76.6% from 21,220 students in 1981 to 37,276 in 1990. The 16,166 student increase at

the community colleges from 1981 to 1990 accounts for 62% of the total system headcount enrollment growth over this period.

Systemwide fall FTE enrollment has grown 53.7% from 1981 to 1990, a smaller growth rate than headcount enrollment over the same period. From 1984 to 1986 FTE enrollment generally grew at about one-half the rate of headcount enrollment. However, in more recent years, 1987 to 1990, the growth in FTE enrollment (29%) has slightly exceeded the growth in headcount enrollment (28%). Over the ten year period 1981 to 1990, systemwide FTE enrollment has grown from 20,543 to 31,571, an increase of 11,028 FTE students. Total FTE enrollment in the two universities has increased 48.5% from 13,767 to 20,440 in 1990. This increase of 6,673 students accounts for 60% of the total system FTE enrollment growth from 1981 to 1989. FTE enrollment in the four community colleges increased 4,355 FTE students from 6,776 in 1981 to 11,131 in 1990, a growth rate of 64.3%.

The majority of UNS students attend on a part-time basis. Thirty percent of 1990 students attend UNS campuses full-time, the same proportion of students who attended full-time in 1988 and 1989. Eighty-nine percent of community college students attend part-time, and 49% of university students attend part-time. Fifty-six percent of students attending UNS campuses are women, and 79.7% are white.

## FALL 1990 ENROLLMENT

### HIGHLIGHTS

#### Growth

- The UNS is currently serving 68,002 students. This is an increase of 7,359 students or 12.1% from the fall of 1989 and an increase of 64.8% from the fall of 1981.
- The UNS community colleges currently serve 37,276 students, an increase of 4,747 students, or 14.6% over the number enrolled in fall 1989 and an increase of 76.6% from the fall of 1981.
- The universities currently serve 30,726 students, an increase of 2,612 students or 9.3% over the number enrolled in fall 1989 and an increase of 52.5% from the fall of 1981.
- The UNS currently enrolls 31,571 full-time equivalent (FTE) students, an increase of 2,836 FTE students, or 9.9% from fall 1989 and an increase of 53.7% from the fall of 1981.
- The community colleges enroll 11,131 FTE students, an increase of 1,003 students, or 9.9% from the fall 1989 semester and an increase of 64.3% from the fall of 1981.
- The universities currently enroll 20,440 FTE students, an increase of 1,833 FTE students, or 9.9% from fall 1989 semester and an increase of 48.5% from the fall of 1981.

#### Composition of the 1990 Student Body

- 70% of UNS students are part-time students.
- 49% of university students are part-time students, down from 55% in 1989.
- 89% of community college students are part-time students, the same proportion as were part-time students in 1988 and 1989.

- Systemwide, the number of part-time students has grown from 67% in 1981 to 70% in 1990, but peaked at 74% in 1982.
- For this same ten-year period, the number of part-time students at universities has fluctuated between 48% and 59%, ending the period at 49%.
- The number of part-time students at community colleges has grown from 87% to 89%, peaking at 92% in 1986.
- 56% of all students in fall 1990 are female, the same proportion as 1989.
- 79.7% of all UNS students in fall 1990 are white, 1.4% are nonresident alien, 3.2% are nonspecified, and 15.7% are minority students.
- Student age data are collected every other year. The following UNS age data were reported for fall 1989:

Systemwide 27.5% of students were between 18 and 21 years of age.

30.3% of students were 22 to 29 years of age.

22.3% of students were 30 to 39 years of age.

12.2% of students in 1989 were between 40 to 49 years of age, 6.7% were over 50 years of age, and .9% were under 18 years of age.

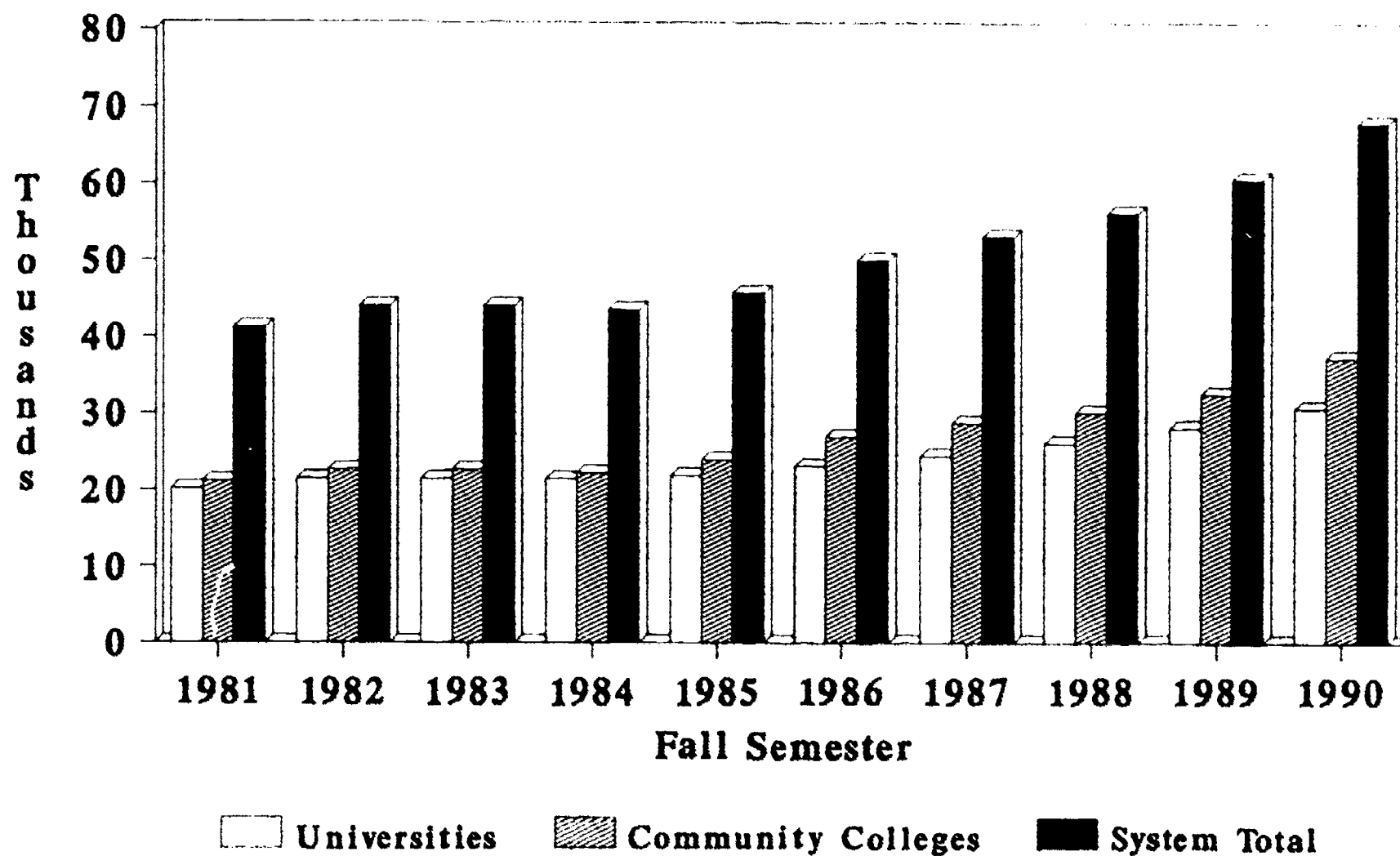

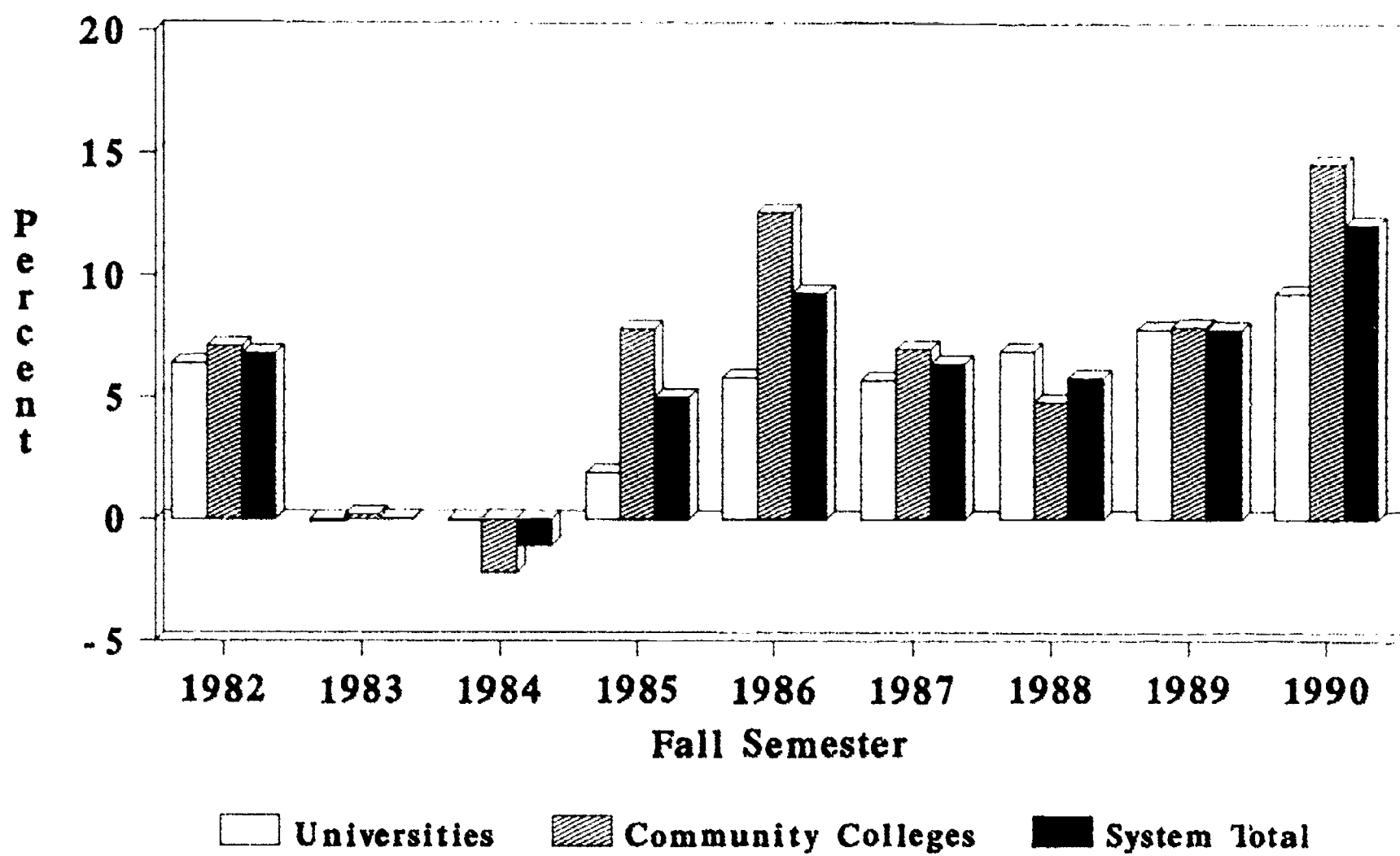


# Student Headcount Enrollment, Fall 1981 - 1990

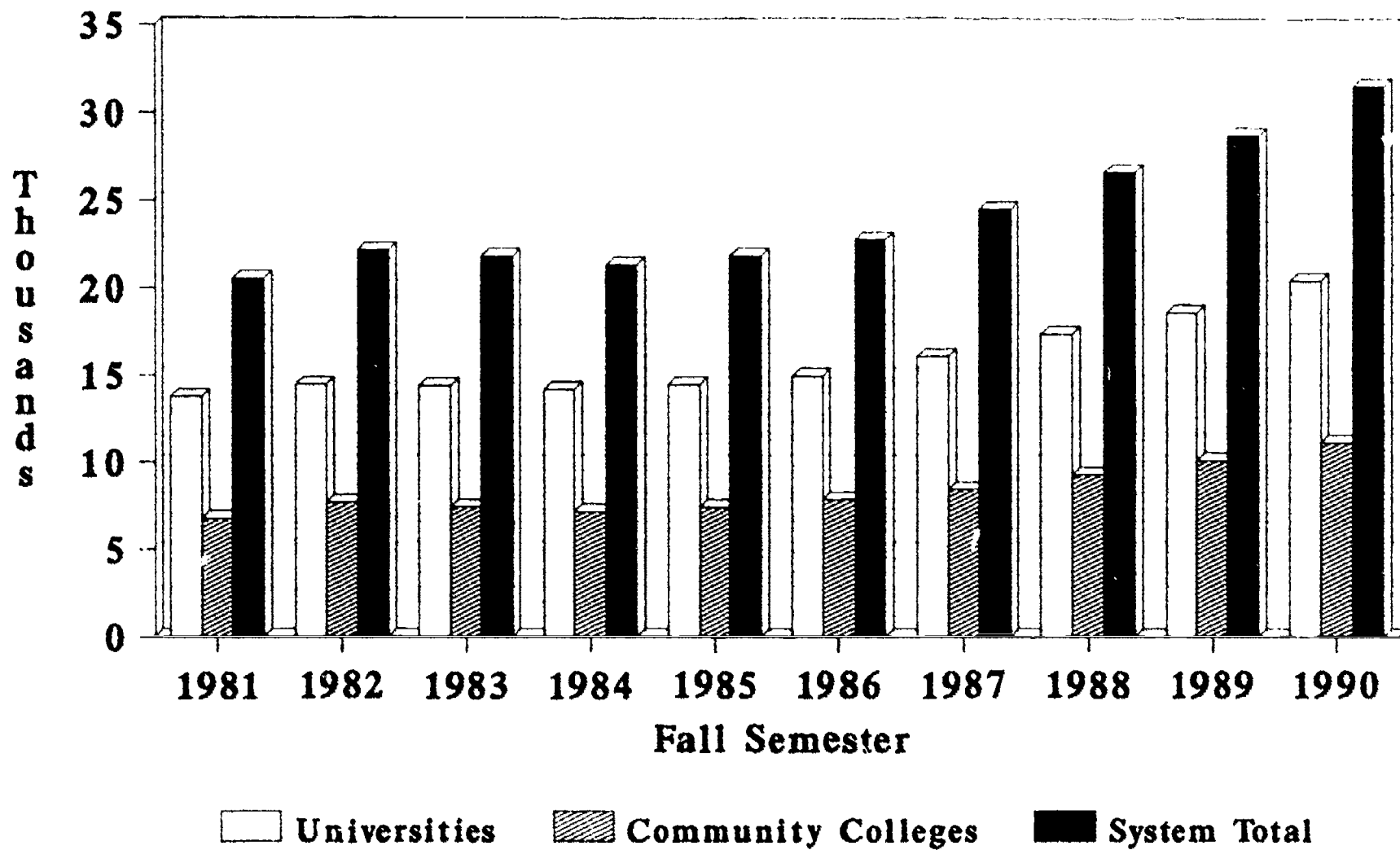

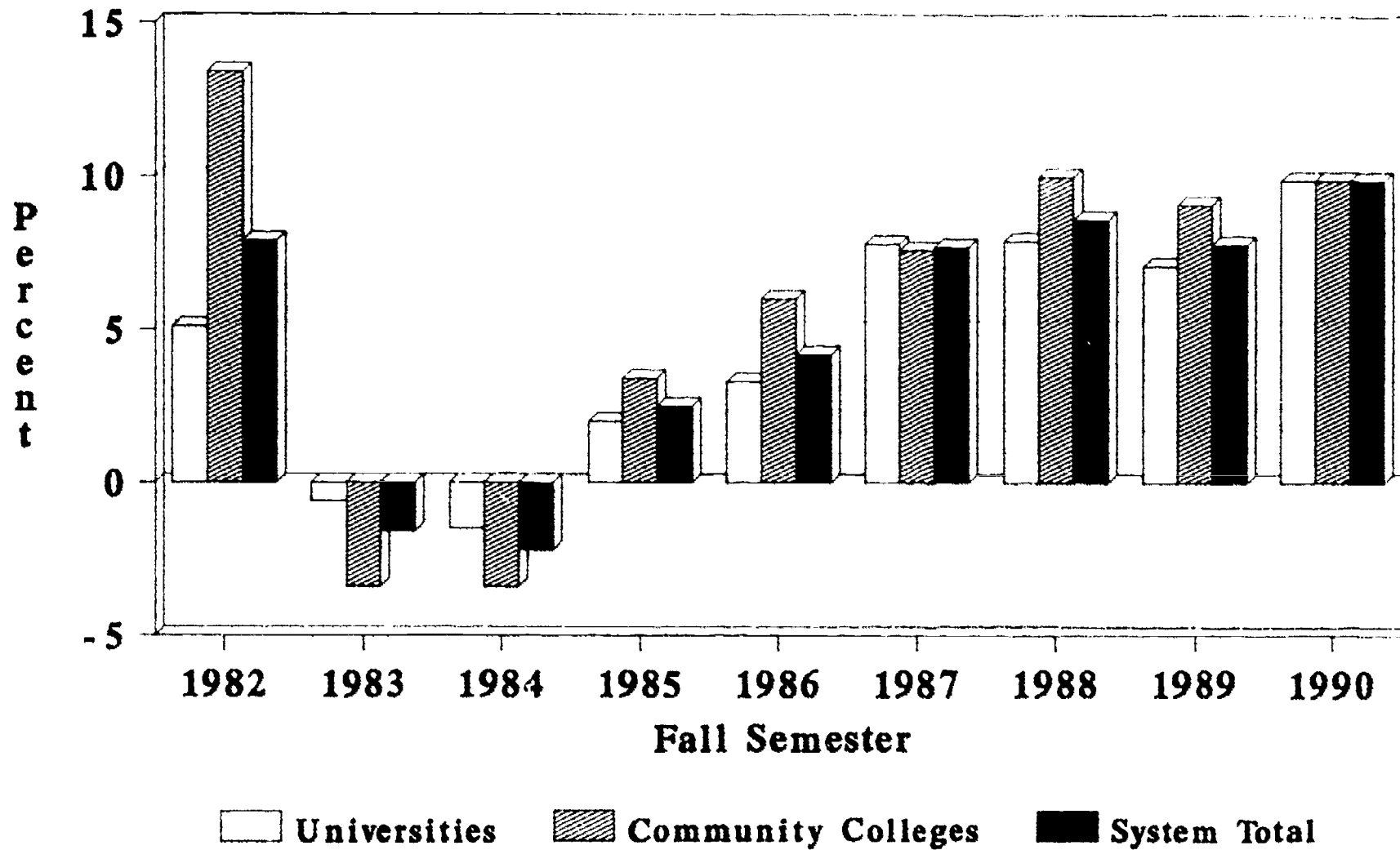

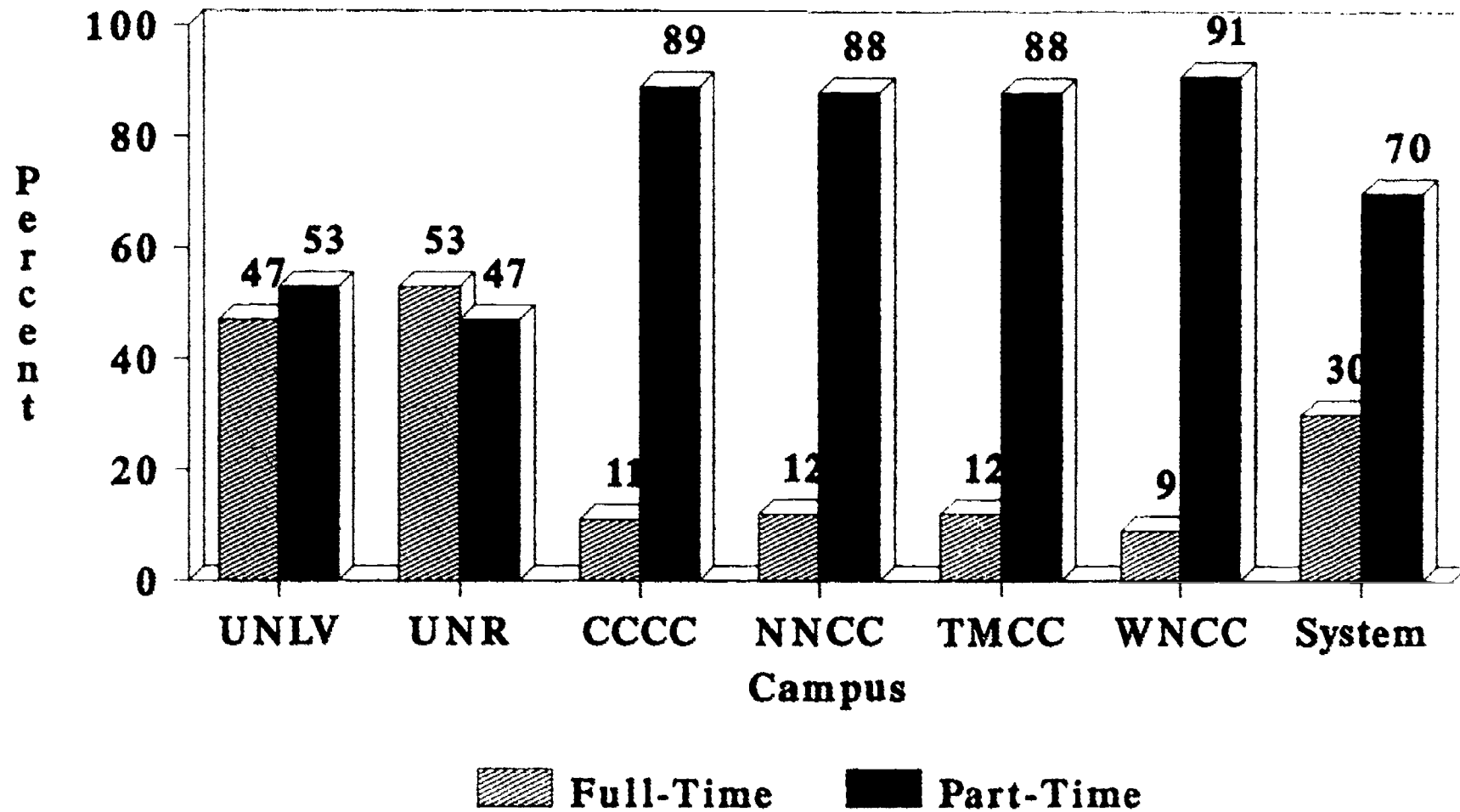

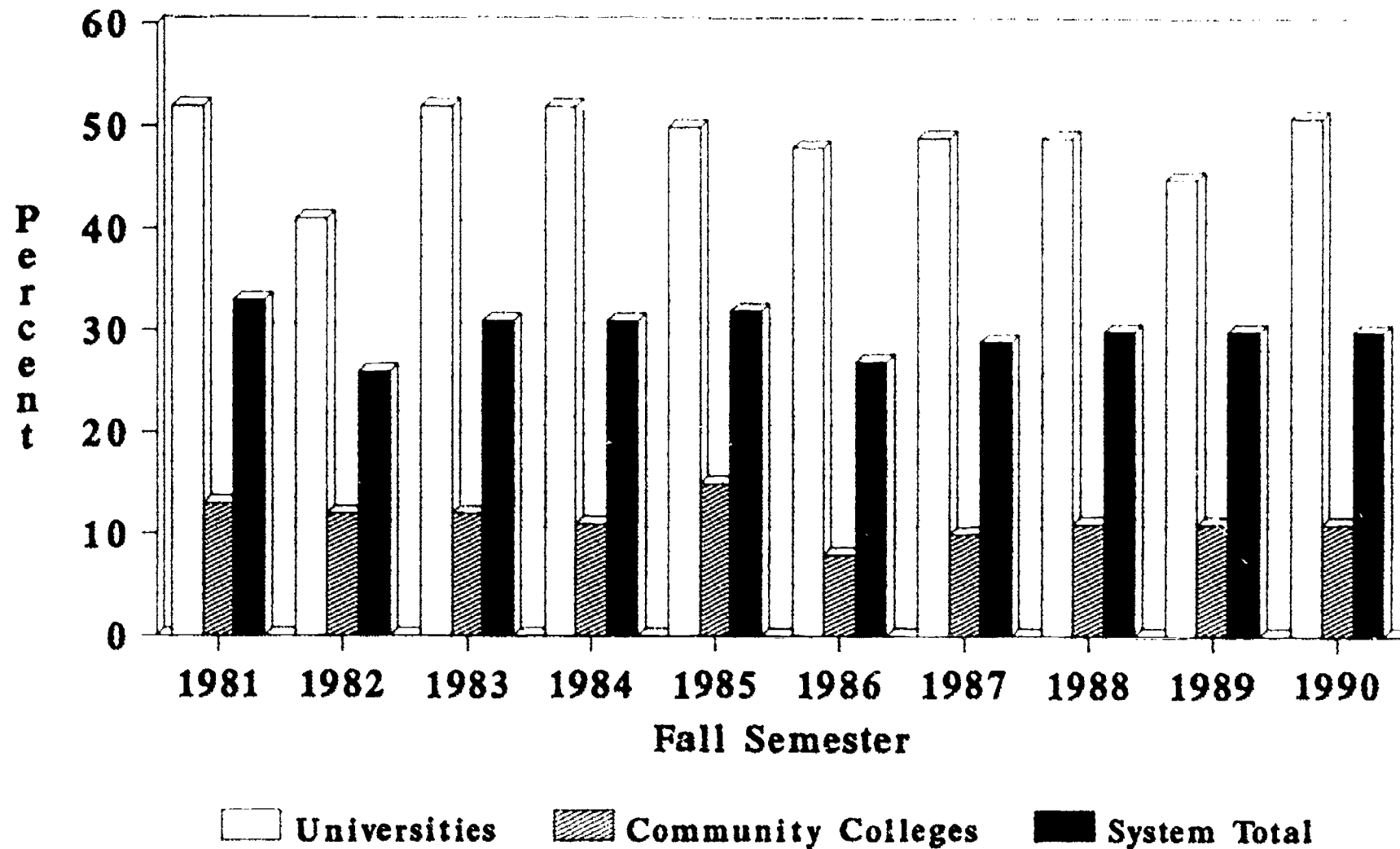

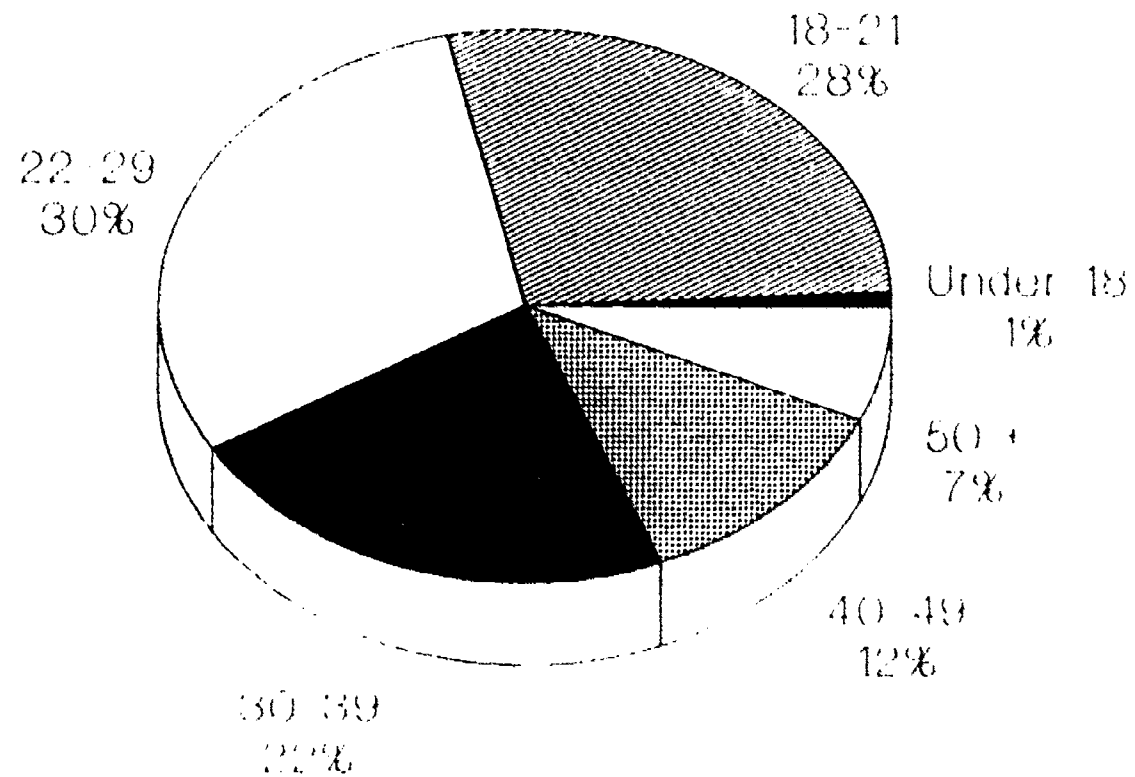
