#### ABSTRACT

This report is an analysis of available data on the participation of people with disabilities in the nation's Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) programs. Covering program year 1989, this report includes information about people with disabilities served by JTPA in every service delivery area (SDA) in the country. The narrative section briefly summarizes findings related to Title IIA terminees by state, Title IIB participants by state, Title III terminees by state, and Title IIA terminees by SDA. It suggests that there are probably two main factors in determining the number and percentage of the total population of individuals with disabilities served by JTPA programs on a state-by-state basis: involvement of organizations and unemployment rates. The narrative section also suggests strategies and resources that can assist JTPA administrators and organizations serving people with disabilities. An appendix contains four tables that provide statistical information about the number of youth and adults with disabilities served by JTPA Title IIA by state and by SDA and about the number served by JTPA Titles IIB and III by state. #### Introduction

Each year, with the cooperation of the U.S. Department of Labor, the President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities reviews and analyzes available data on the participation of people with disabilities in our Nation's Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) programs. This year's report represents a collaborative effort of the President's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities, the National Alliance of Business, and the National Association of Private Industry Councils. The report, covering program year 1989 (July 1, 1989 through June 30, 1990), includes information about people with disabilities served by JTPA in every Service Delivery Area (SDA) in the country. This publication:

- 1) Briefly summarizes the extent to which people with disabilities were assisted by JTPA during program year 1989;
- 2) Provides information for JTPA Administrators about how they can serve more people with disabilities in JTPA programs;
- 3) Offers examples of how groups serving people with disabilities have used JTPA to assist this population; and
- 4) Provides statistical information about the number of youth and adults with disabilities served by JTPA Titles IIA by state and service delivery area; and for Titles IIB and III, provides data by state. These data are shown in the four tables in the appendix of this publication.

Because these data have been included in this form in four previous editions of "People With Disabilities in Our Nation's JTPA Programs," comparisons with previous years can be made by reviewing past reports.

Addresses and telephone numbers of State Governors' Committees on Employment of People with Disabilities are also included in the appendix.

This report provides valuable information that can be used by Private Industry Councils, Governor's State Job Training Coordinating Councils, and a variety of state and community groups who serve people with disabilities to help these organizations assess how well they are serving the disabled population.

Also, because data included in this report are subject to further verification, and as the result of difficulties associated with accurately counting the disabled population, it is important that readers review the "Note on Data and Terminology Used in This Report" at the end of the narrative portion of this publication.

## Summary of Title IIA Terminees by State

Table 1 shows the total number of adults and youth who terminated! from JTPA Title IIA programs during program year 1989 by state and the number of adults and youth with disabilities who terminated Title IIA programs during the same period. The data indicate that during the program year, 365,241 adults



terminated from title IIA programs. Of this number, 37,103 were adults with disabilities. This represents 10.2 percent of all adult terminees for Title IIA -- an increase of .6 of a percentage point from the previous year. Also during program year 1989, 304,023 youth were terminated from Title IIA programs, of which, 43,088 were youth with disabilities. This represents 14.2 percent of all youth terminees during the program year -- an increase of .4 of a percentage point from the previous program year.

It is significant to note that in each program year of JTPA, the number of adults and youth with disabilities who terminated Title IIA programs has increased over the previous program year's figures.

# Summary of Title IIB Participants by State

Table 2 shows the total number of youth who participated in Title IIB programs<sup>2</sup> in program year 1989 by state and the number of youth with disabilities who participated in Title IIB programs during the same period. As the data indicate, 608,255 youth participated in the summer program in 1989. Of this number, 81,641 were youth with disabilities. This represents 13 percent of all Title IIB participants—the same percentage as the previous program year.

# Summary of Title III Terminees by State

Table 3 shows the total number of individuals who terminated from Title III programs<sup>3</sup> in program year 1989 by state and the number of individuals with disabilities who terminated from Title III programs during the same period. During the program year, a total of 37,363 individuals terminated from Title

III programs and 1,076 of these terminees were individuals with disabilities. This represents 2.9 percent of all Title III terminees — an increase of .1 of a percentage point from the previous program year.

# Summary of Title IIA Terminees by JTPA Service Delivery Area

Table 4, like Table 1, shows the total number of adults and youth who terminated from Title IIA programs during the program year. However, while Table 1 provides these data by state, Table 4 shows the terminee data by Service Delivery Area rather than by state in order to provide information comparable to previous reports. The terminee totals, however, are the same as in Table 1.

## **Observations**

In reviewing these data, it is clear that there is a wide degree of variation among states in the percentage of terminees in all JTPA Titles who are individuals with disabilities compared with the total number of individuals who terminated from the programs. This variation is most evident in both Title IIA and Title IIB programs. For example, in reviewing Title IIA adult terminees (Table 1), in one state 3.9 percent of all Title IIA terminees were adults with disabilities, while in another state, 25 percent of all Title IIA terminees were adults with disabilities.

This variation was even greater for Title IIA youth terminees. The number of youth with disabilities as a percentage of the total number of terminees varied from a low of .7 percent to a high of 33 1 percent (see Table 1).

This wide variation among states in the proportion of JTPA adult and youth terminees with disabilities has existed since the implementation of JTPA. For example, for the previous four program years, the range for Title IIA terminees has been:

Similar variations exist for Title IIB programs and, to a lesser extent, for Title III programs.

In an effort to find an explanation for this wide variation by state, a review of the population figures for individuals with disabilities for each state was conducted to determine whether some states have either a significantly greater or lesser percentage of people with disabilities available to participate in JTPA programs. Data indicate a relatively constant percentage of people with disabilities from state to state. Thus, it appears that the availability or prevalence of individuals with disabilities is not a factor in explaining the wide variation by state.

Further investigation indicates that there are probably two main factors in determining the number and percentage of the total population of individuals with disabilities served by JTPA programs on a state-by-state basis:

Involvement of Organizations. First, it appears that the extent of involvement of groups and organizations representing people with disabilities in the policy or management of JTPA programs, at either the state or SDA level (most often at both levels) has a major impact on the number of individuals with disabilities identified and served by JTPA programs in a state. In states where disability related organizations are active in promoting their JTPA program's involvement in serving eligible people with disabilities, we find greater numbers of people with disabilities actually served. Conversely, in states where disability groups are less involved in JTPA programs, we tend to find lower percentages of people with disabilities as program participants.

Unemployment Rates. A second factor that appears to contribute to the wide variation in the proportion of the total population of individuals with disabilities served by JTPA programs on a state-by-state basis (and, in many cases, from SDA to SDA) is the state's or SDA's unemployment rate. In those states or SDAs with unemployment rates higher than the national average, the proportion of JTPA Title IIA terminees with disabilities tends to fall below the national average. The converse also tends to be true; in states where unemployment rates are lower than the national average, individuals with disabilities make up a larger proportion of all individuals terminated from JTPA programs.

One explanation for this relationship between the unemployment rate and the number of individuals with disabilities served by JTPA is that people with disabilities



represent a new or relatively untapped segment of the eligible JTPA program participant pool. Thus, when a state's unemployment rate is low and the traditional pool of eligible participants is reduced, the tendency may be to look for individuals with disabilities as a new or expanded source of potential participants.

In reviewing the total number of individuals with disabilities served by JTPA, it is evident that JTPA has become a major training and employment resource for our nation's citizens with disabilities. For example, in program year 1989, almost 163,000 people (both adults and youth) with disabilities were served by JTPA programs.

Although additional efforts can be undertaken to increase the number of people with disabilities in JTPA programs, our nation's federally funded training and employment system has demonstrated, in general, a commitment to serving this group.

# Strategies and Resources for JTPA Administrators

Following are some strategies that can assist a State Job Training Coordinating Council, a Private Industry Council or a grantee in their efforts to increase the number of people with disabilities in their programs:

Review the membership makeup of the Private Industry Council or State Job Training Coordinating Council to ensure that individuals who are disabled or who represent the training and employment needs of people with disabilities are included as members of both decision-making bodies.

- Review data and other information about the employment situation facing people with disabilities. This may be obtained by contacting the State Governor's Committee, the State Director of Vocational Rehabilitation or similar organization for information (see Appendix). In addition, information about job accommodations for people with disabilities is available from the President's Committee on Employment of People With Disabilities, which operates a toll-free telephone number for assistance (1-800-JAN-7234). This service, the Job Accommodation Network (JAN), operates from 8:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. (Eastern time), Monday through Friday.
- When establishing priorities for funding or issuing requests for proposals, indicate the need to serve people with disabilities within various targeted sub-groups (i.e. women, minorities, displaced workers, etc.).
- Publicize the "family of one" authority for youth with disabilities among all intake workers.
- Engage in informational outreach activities with the variety of organizations and agencies involved in serving people with disabilities. These include state vocational rehabilitation programs; state and local special education units; organizations of people with disabilities; and parent groups. Additional information about these groups can



be obtained by contacting individual state committees serving people with disabilities (see Appendix for a listing of state committees).

# Strategies and Resources for Organizations Serving People With Disabilities

In reviewing the variety of programming options that have been developed in various locations around the country, it is obvious that JTPA holds enormous potential to serve the training and employment needs of people with disabilities. However, the <u>full</u> potential of JTPA to serve people with disabilities has yet to be realized.

Following are examples of how groups serving people with disabilities use JTPA resources in local employment-related programs:

- Project Work-Able in Akron, Ohio, uses Title IIA 8 percent set-aside funds to support an employment, training and placement program for individuals with histories of mental illness. A supported employment model is one of the key components to the program.
- The Capilouto Center for the Deaf in Montgomery, Alabama, receives support from JTPA to conduct an employment placement and training service for individuals who are deaf in a 15-county region of central Alabama. Numerous area agencies refer deaf individuals to the Center for this employmentrelated program.
- The Curative Rehabilitation Center in Green Bay, Wisconsin, conducts a JTPA employment program serving, among others, elderly persons with disabilities. The local PIC and Job

Service provide additional support by lending office space as well as making referrals.

- WorkHawaii of Honolulu, Hawaii, combines the resources of the local school system, State Department of Education and JTPA Title IIA "Exemplary Youth" funds. The program assists selected special education students with their transition from school to work.
- The Brevard Achievement Center in Rockledge, Florida, operates three separate JTPA employment programs. One of these programs is a supported employment model for individuals with multiple disabilities. The second is an on-the-job training program for persons with mental retardation. The third program is designed to more directly involve employers in conducting job training.
- The Association for Retarded Citizens of Harrison County, West Virginia, uses Title IIA 6 percent set-aside money to assist drop-outs with disabilities with their employment needs. This support is augmented with other local community support.



#### Footnotes:

1Terminees are defined as JTPA program participants who have separated because they have: 1) entered unsubsidized employment; 2) youth who have received employability enhancements (attained PIC recognized competencies, entered non-Title II training, returned to full-time school or completed a major level of education); or 3) all other terminations successful or otherwise (e.g. drop-outs).

2Title IIB programs are the summer programs for youth age 16-21 and, in some circumstances, include 14- and 15-year-olds.

3Title III programs are the dislocated worker programs under JTPA which, for the most part, serve an adult population.

# Note on Data and Terminology Used in This Report

Data contained in this report were submitted to the U.S. Department of Labor by each Service Delivery Area through state-level operating units. The information is collected in the JTPA Annual Status Report. Because data contained in the JTPA Annual Status Report are subject to future verification, numbers may increase or decrease slightly. For reference purposes, these data were presented by the U.S. Department of Labor on March 5, 1991.

Readers are cautioned that it is often difficult to count the number of individuals with disabilities with complete accuracy and consistency because of difficulties in defining terminology such as "handicapped" or "disabled." JTPA defines the term "handicapped person" as any individual who has a physical or mental disability which for such individual constitutes or results in a substantial handicap to employment. It is not clear, however, to what degree this definition is uniformly observed in the client screening and data collection process. Traditionally, defining a person with a disability is a difficult process, particularly for JTPA intake workers who may not have had extensive experience with the population. Thus, when observing significantly lower than average JTPA participation of people with disabilities, it is first important to review the data collection process to see if program operators are accurately counting these individuals.
