ABSTRACT

These two research monographs profile fall 1991 and spring 1992 Oklahoma City Community College (OKCCC) students, respectively, comparing currently enrolled students to those from previous semesters. Each report provides a short narrative summary of findings and four data tables, presenting longitudinal enrollment figures beginning in spring 1986 (for the 1991 report), and in spring 1988 (for the 1992 report). Table I aggregates data by gender, full-/part-time status, new/returning/graduate status, marital status, average age, ethnicity, and reason for attending OKCCC. Table II provides a map of Oklahoma which locates the origin of students enrolled in credit classes by region, table III shows distribution of student enrollment in day/night classes, and table IV covers distribution of students by age. Highlighted findings include the following: (1) fall 1991 total enrollment was 10,126 students, an increase of 21.1% in headcount and 24.3% in credit hours over the previous fall; (2) fall 1991 data showed increases in the percent of full-time students, single students, and females, and decreases in the percent of night students and White students; (3) 39.9% of students enrolled in credit classes in fall 1991 were from the southwest quadrant of Oklahoma City; (4) spring 1992 total enrollment was 10,222, an increase of 1.7% in headcount and 2.1% in credit hours over the previous spring; (5) spring 1992 showed slight increases in the percent of single students, males, and Blacks and Native Americans, and a significant increase in students pursuing a transfer degree (from 23.5% and 34.5%); and (6) three-fourths of the students were from the western half of Oklahoma City, with just over 40% from the southwest quadrant. The comparisons made in this Monograph are based on the numbers sent to the Oklahoma State Regents. They reflect the enrollments of students who were not reported in Summer Sessions I and II 1991, students who totally withdrew during Fall 1991 drop and add, those enrolled in Fall 1991 semester, including those enrolled as of September 9, 1991 and an estimate of those who will enroll in the Mid-Fall 1991 semester.

Fall 1991 had a total enrollment of 10,126, an increase of 21.1% from Fall 1990 in headcount; and an increase of 24.3% in credit hours, from 56,506 in Fall 1990 to 70,240 this fall. The average credit hours carried by each student increased from 6.76 to 6.93.

The male/female breakdown changed slightly from 60% females and 40% males to a 61% female and 39% male split. The average age was below thirty-one for the second fall in a row displaying a continued trend toward a lower average age. Similarly, the marital status when compared with last fall showed a slight decrease in married students making the percent of single students 6% more than the percent of married students. This shift was first noted in Fall 1989. The ethnic background of the students showed no substantial change from the previous fall semesters; however, there was a slight increase in the percent for each of the minorities and a corresponding decrease in whites.

The difference in the breakdown of full and part-time students has continued to increase. Full-time students increased 2.3% from the fall of 1990 and a comparable decrease of part-time students occurred. The percent of first-time students at Oklahoma City Community College increased by 7% from the fall of 1990. The percent of new



students this fall, 33.5%, is higher than it has been for 5 years. The percent of students indicating they plan to obtain a degree in an immediate job entry program increased approximately 2%, while those students pursuing a transfer degree increased 8%, from 22% to 30%. All of the demographic information on students can be found in Table I at the end of this report.

Table II contains information on the zip code locations of students enrolled in credit classes. The percent of students from the NW and SE quadrants of the city are similar to what they have been in previous semester. The SW quadrant continues to have the greatest percent of enrollments, however it dropped to 39.9%, approximately three percentage points down from previous semesters. This decrease was picked up by increases of three percentage points in those enrolled from the NE quadrant and those with post office boxes.

Table III indicates when students are taking classes. The information presented shows that the percent of students enrolled in day classes continue to increase. On the other hand, enrollments in night classes dropped 6.1% from Fall 1990. The 2% increase in the number of students enrolled in both day and night classes reflects the combined effect of more students enrolled in day classes and the increase in the younger student.

Table IV which contains a detailed age breakdown, shows the median age to be the same as it was in the fall of 1990. Looking at the individual age ranges, there are about the same number of students under 23 this fall as there was in the fall of 1990. There has been little change in any of the age brackets from last fall.



In summary, both headcount and credit how were up. The full-time student showed a 2.3% increase, there were fewer married students, and the average age is down. These factors all point to an effective recruitment and marketing effort targeting younger, recent high school graduates. The percent of new students to Oklahoma City Community College increased 2% from last fall.



The comparisons made in this monograph are based on the numbers sent to the Oklahoma State Regents. They reflect the enrollments of students who were not reported in Fall 1991 and Mid-Fall 1991, students who totally withdrew during Spring 1992 drop and add, those enrolled in Spring 1992 semester, and an estimate of the enrollments in the Mid-Spring 1992 semester.

Spring 1992 had a total enrollment of 10,222, an increase of 1.7% from Spring 1991 in headcount; and an increase of 2.1% in credit hours, from 69,522 in Spring 1991 to 70,955 this spring. The average credit hours carried by each student was 6.87 compared to 6.91 in 1991.

The male/female breakdown remained basically consistent with 60% females and 40% males although there was a slight decrease in the percentage of females. The average age was below thirty-one for the third spring in a row displaying a continued trend toward a lower average age. Similarly, the marital status when compared with last spring shows a slight increase in single students and a corresponding decrease in married students making the percent of single students 7.1 more than the percent of married students. This shift was first noted in Fall 1989. The ethnic background of the students remained relatively stable, although it should be noted that there was a 0.9 increase in the percentage of blacks and 0.5 increase in the percentage of American Indians from the previous spring semester with a corresponding decrease in whites.



The difference in the breakdown of full and part-time students has continued to change. Full-time students increased 5.9% from the spring of 1991 and a comparable decrease of part-time students occurred. The percent of first-time students at Oklahoma City Community College showed an increase in percent of 6.9%. The percent of students indicating they plan to obtain a degree in an immediate job entry program rose slightly with a 9.7% increase, while those students pursuing a transfer degree increased significantly from 23.5% to 34.5%.

Table I at the end of this report contains all of the specific information presented and a demographic history for the past four years.

Table II contains information on the zip code locations of students enrolled in credit classes. The percent of students from the four quadrants of the city are similar to what they have been the last four spring semester with the greatest percent from the SW quadrant and the lowest percent from the NE quadrant.

Table III indicates when students are taking classes. The information presented shows an increase of just under 5 percentage points in day class enrollments over Spring 1991 which continues the upward trend that has been experienced for the last six spring semesters. On the other hand, enrollments in night classes dropped 8.2 percentage points from Spring 1991. There was also an increase in the number of students enrolled in both day and night classes. This reflects the fact that more students are enrolling in day classes.

Table IV which contains a detailed age breakdown, shows the median age to be down from 31 years in Spring 1991 to 30 years this spring. Looking at the individual age

ranges, there is little change from the spring of 1992. In the 18 to 22 year old range, there has been a 36.5% increase from spring 1990 to this spring. A slight increase in the percent of students in the age bracket 38 to 47 year old was experienced while all other age brackets remained basically constant.


