ABSTRACT


This publication reports data on financial aid available to students at New York's degree-granting postsecondary institutions. As an opening overview details, the tables are based on data provided by postsecondary institutions by the Higher Education Services Corporation and units of the State Education Department responsible for administering financial aid programs. The report shows trends in financial aid from state, federal, institutional, and private sources for academic years 1988-89, 1989-90, and 1990-91. The first section of the report provides an overview of all student aid funds including trends in funds available to all students; trends in aid per student; and comparison of aid trends to changes in undergraduate expenses, other economic indicators, and enrollment trends. The next sections contain detailed tables showing funds and recipients for specific aid programs, with separate tables for pre- and post-baccalaureate students in each sector for the State University of New York, the City University of New York, independent institutions, and degree-granting proprietary institutions respectively. The appendices contain a glossary of terms, a description of student aid data sources and data adjustments, and a list of institutions included in each sector and type category used in the report. STATEWIDE OVERVIEW

This is the tenth in a series of reports which provides the only complete accounting of financial aid available to students at New York's degree-granting postsecondary institutions. Based on data provided by postsecondary institutions, by the Higher Education Services Corporation and units of the State Education Department responsible for administering financial aid programs, this report shows trends in financial aid from State, federal, institutional and private sources for academic years 1988-89, 1989-90, and 1990-91.

The first section of this report provides an overview of all student aid funds. The following section contains detailed tables showing funds and recipients for specific aid programs, with separate tables for pre- and post-baccalaureate students in each sector and at each type of institution within sectors. The appendices to this report contain a glossary of terms; a description of student aid data sources and data adjustments; and a list of institutions included in each sector and type category used in this report.

This overview presents trends in total funds available to all students; examines trends in aid per student, using full-time equivalent students (FTE) as a measure of enrollment; and compares aid trends to changes in undergraduate expenses, other economic indicators and enrollment trends.

Total Student Aid

The total amount of student aid in New York is determined by factors such as total

enrollment, attendance and demographic characteristics of students, demonstrated financial need of aid applicants, federal and State aid program eligibility criteria and award sizes, students' and families' willingness to borrow, institutional budgetary decisions and private philanthropy.

-- Nearly \$2.8 billion of student financial assistance from federal, State, institutional and private sources was awarded to students at degree-granting institutions in New York in 1990-91.

-- Between 1988-89 and 1990-91, the total amount of aid increased by nearly 19 percent. Wages and assistantships and grant aid both increased substantially by 20 percent each. Loan funds, which had been decreasing in the past, also increased by 16 percent.

-- Grants and loans share of all aid remained steady at 56 percent and 34 percent respectively.

-- In 1990-91, the distribution of aid by source remained the same as last year with 48 percent from programs sponsored by the federal government, 26 percent from institutional funds and 16 percent from State sponsored programs.

-- In 1990-91, 76 percent of all aid came from four sources: the federally guaranteed loan programs (GSL, SLS and PLUS); the State's Tuition Assistance Program; institutionally funded grants from both restricted and unrestricted funds; and the federal Pell

Grant program. Between 1988-89 and 1990-91, all of these sources in aid increased. Institutional grants increased the most by 29.6. TAP awards increased 23 percent, a substantial growth compared to past years. During the same time period, federal guaranteed loans, which had been showing a decrease, increased 13.7 percent, while Pell grants increased 10 percent.

-- In 1990-91, 68 percent of all aid went to independent sector students. Another 28 percent went to students at the public university systems. The share of all aid going to independent sector students has increased each year since 1984-85.

-- The \$266-million statewide increase in grant aid between 1988-89 and 1990-91 was largely comprised of \$139-million in institutionally funded grants, of which \$137-million came from independent sector institutions.

-- In 1990-91, 72 percent of all aid was awarded to undergraduates. Between 1988-89 and 1990-91, aid to undergraduates increased over 17 percent while aid to post-baccalaureate students increased 23 percent.

Aid per Full-time Equivalent Student (FTE)

Aid per FTE is a useful measure of aid trends because it accounts for the impact of enrollment changes on aggregate amounts of aid. Between 1988-89 and 1990-91, the amount of aid per FTE increased by 14.6 percent.

-- The amount of statewide aid per FTE was \$3,610 in 1990-91. Of this amount, \$2,014 was grants and \$1,237 was loans.

-- Total aid per FTE increased in all sectors between 1988-89 and 1990-91. This is a change for the City University sector which increased 4 percent. At the same time, independent institutions increased by 21 percent, proprietary institutions by 7 percent and State University institutions by 6 percent.

-- Grant aid per FTE increased significantly in the independent and proprietary sectors, 24 percent and 27.5 percent respectively. The public sectors also increased; 6 percent at City University institutions and 2 percent at State University institutions.

-- While loan aid per FTE increased 12 percent statewide, proprietary institutions experienced a 23 percent decrease and City University institutions a 10 percent decrease.

-- Total aid per undergraduate FTE increased 13.6 percent between 1988-89 and 1990-91 while total aid per post-baccalaureate FTE increased 6 percent during the period.

Student Aid in Context

Changes in the amounts and types of financial aid available to postsecondary students can be interpreted by comparing them to changes in student expenses and in other economic indicators reflecting the public's capacity to pay for college.

-- Between 1988-89 and 1990-91, total aid per FTE did not increase as rapidly as tuition and fees in any sector except the independent, where aid increases (21.2%) exceeded tuition and fee increases (19.7%). Furthermore, looking at total average annual undergraduate expenses, at every sector these expenses increased exceeded aid increases. The disparity was most prevalent at proprietary institutions where cost increases exceeded aid per FTE increases by nearly 10 percent. At City University institutions, total expenses increased by 11.8 percent, while aid per FTE only increased by 4.3 percent.

-- Grant aid per FTE increased more than tuition and more than total expenses at independent and proprietary institutions. At State University institutions, grant aid per FTE only increased 2 percent while tuition and fees increased 8.1 percent and total expenses by 9.2 percent.

-- The total amount of aid and the amount of aid per FTE between 1988-89 and 1990-91 rose faster than the U.S. Consumer Price Index, which increased 10.8 percent.


-- Median family income in the Northeast region of the U.S. did not increase as rapidly as undergraduate expenses in every sector.

-- Per capita personal disposable income in New York increased more than college expenses in the public sectors but did not keep pace with independent sector expenses.


-- Enrollment increased somewhat during the 1988-89 through 1990-91 period. Undergraduate enrollment increased 3.9 percent while post-baccalaureate enrollment increased nearly 5.6 percent.

BY TYPE OF AID




BY AID PROGRAM





BY SECTOR





BY SOURCE OF AID






APPENDIX A

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Average Annual Undergraduate Tuition and Required Fees are computed from institutionally reported data in the Higher Education Data System for typical jurisdiction undergraduate charges. Averages are weighted by full-time undergraduate enrollment.

Average Annual Undergraduate Total College Costs include weighted average tuition and fees plus the other expenses allowed in student budgets prepared by financial aid administrators. For SUNY and the independent sector, on-campus housing is assumed and room and board is the unweighted average from the Higher Education Data System. All other costs for on-campus residents and all non-tuition costs for commuters at CUNY and proprietary institutions are considered to be equal to national averages reported by the College Scholarship Service.

College Work-Study Program wages include wages paid through the College-Work Study Program authorized by Title IV of the Higher Education Act, which provides for a federal contribution and requires an institutional matching contribution. The institutional contribution includes funds from institutions, the State's College Work-Study Reimbursement Program and non-institutional employers.

Consumer Price Index is from the U.S. Department of Commerce as adjusted by the Washington Office of the College Board to reflect academic year rather than calendar year periods.

FTE is a full-time equivalent student, computed for the State as: full-time undergraduate enrollment + 1/3 part-time undergraduate enrollment + full-time graduate/professional enrollment + 4/10 part-time graduate/professional enrollment.

Grants Provided by External Gifts are awarded by organizations other than the reporting institution but known to the institution.

Grants to Native American Indians includes the Native American Grants administered by NYSED.

Guaranteed Federal Loans are need-based subsidized loans authorized by Title IV of the Federal Higher Education Act and either administered by the Higher Education Services Corporation or other guarantee agencies. Counted in this category are loans made through the Stafford Loan Program; Supplemental Loans to Students (SLS); and Parental Loans for Undergraduate Students (PLUS). Recipient counts for this item are actually loan counts. Loans administered by New York State are reported by HESC. Loans administered by other states include all non-HESC loans and are reported by institutions.

Institutional Grants includes grants and scholarships from institutional funds, as well as tuition and fee remissions, exemptions and waivers. Restricted grants come from funds whose use is limited to student aid and includes SUSTA and CUSTA funds in the public sectors.

Institutionally-funded loans includes all loans made with institutional funds, with the exception of short-term contingency or emergency loan funds.

Median Family Income is from the Current Population Survey (Series P-60) of the U.S. Department of Commerce. The Northeast Census region of the U.S. includes Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont, New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania. Median family income refers to the calendar year in which the academic year begins.

NYSED is the New York State Education Department.

NYSHESC is the New York State Higher Education Services Corporation.

Opportunity Program Grants are received by opportunity program students through the Higher Education Opportunity Program (HEOP) at independent institutions, the Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) at State University and the Search for Elevation and Education through Knowledge (SEEK) and College Discovery (CD) Programs at City University.

Other Governmental Grants includes grants and scholarships from other states, localities, vocational rehabilitation programs, ROTC and additional government grant programs not otherwise itemized in the NYSED's institutional student aid survey.

Other Loans includes loans from all other sources not itemized in the NYSED survey. Loans from the Supplemental Higher Education Loan Financing program (SHELF) appear to be included here although specific instructions were

not provided on the survey instrument.

Other Student aid is a residual category for aid not itemized in the NYSED survey.

Pell Grants are federal need-based entitlement grants provided through Title IV of the Higher Education Act.

Per Capita Personal Disposable Income is New York's aggregate after-tax income divided by the population. It is computed from special analyses prepared by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Economic Analysis for the New York State Department of Economic Development. Income refers to the calendar year in which the academic year begins.

Perkins Loans are need-based loans awarded through the federal campus-based programs authorized by Title IV of the Higher Education Act.

Scholarships/Fellowships includes all State grants, scholarships and fellowships administered by the Higher Education Services Corporation except TAP and STAP. Recipient counts for this item are actually award counts. Improved reporting for 1987-88 results in a slight discontinuity between years.

Student Assistantships refers to all salaries, wages and stipends received as part of educationally-related activities, other than those reported in the wages category.

Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (SEOG) are need-based grants provided through Title IV of the Higher Education Act as part of the federal campus-based programs.

TAP includes both TAP (Tuition Assistance Program) and STAP

(Supplemental Tuition Assistance Program) awards.

Wages from institutional restricted and unrestricted funds exclude those counted under student assistantships.

APPENDIX B

DATA SOURCES AND ADJUSTMENTS

The New York State Education Department's (NYSED) student aid data collection activities are part of the annual cycle of the Higher Education Data System. The student aid cycle begins each autumn when questionnaires, the NYSED-4.1 form and its supplement, are sent to all degree-granting institutions in the State to obtain information about student aid during the previous academic year. This institutional survey is the source of information on institutionally funded aid, privately funded aid and all the federal Title IV programs except the loan programs administered by the New York State Higher Education Services Corporation (NYSHESC). NYSHESC and units within NYSED that administer student aid programs supply data for all other programs.

Institutional survey forms are edited when they arrive at NYSED. During the editing process, corrections are made for arithmetic and classification errors and institutions are contacted for clarification.

In each data cycle, NYSHESC provides data for the two previous cycles so that NYSED can update its files to reflect the most current information for TAP and the federal guaranteed loan programs.

Response rates for the institutional survey have been high since its inception in 1981. For the 1990-91 data collected in the fall of 1991, 95 percent of the institutions responded. Nonresponding institutions for 1990-91 are indicated in Appendix C. Estimation to adjust for institutional nonresponse reduces

fluctuation in the statewide estimates of total funds derived from the data. Estimates are replaced with actual data in the next annual cycle whenever forms arrive late.

Item nonresponse has occurred over the years, especially for recipient counts for institutionally funded grants, loans and wages. Prior to 1986-87, treatment of recipient counts for institutionally funded programs was inconsistent. Recipient counts should be considered reliable for academic years 1986-87 and later.

Data adjustments had to be made for federal loan data at Cornell University. All loans were assigned to the Endowed Colleges and no loans were assigned to the Statutory Colleges. As a result, loan volume at the statutory colleges in the State is undercounted slightly and loan volume at independent colleges is overcounted slightly.

Some undercounting of aid funds and recipients in the State is unavoidable because only the aid known to postsecondary institutions and to agencies administering student aid programs can be accounted for in the NYSED surveys. Aid received from sources such as employers, the Veterans Administration, private associations and private lenders may not be known by survey respondents.

Whenever average awards appear in aggregate summary tables generated from the NYSED's student aid database, the averages are computed only from institutions reporting both funds and

recipient counts. This means that multiplying the average award by the number of recipients may yield a product that is lower than the amount of total funds available.
