ABSTRACT

This report lists in tabular form the typical tuition and required fees and room and board charges for academic year 1991-92 at nearly 4,900 4-year, 2-year, and public less-than-2-year postsecondary institutions (collegiate and non-collegiate) in the United States and its outlying areas. Separate figures are given for tuition and fee charges to in-state and out-of-state students at the undergraduate and graduate levels, along with the costs for room and board, and the number of meals per week covered by the board charge. The report opens with national statistics on tuition and required fees at postsecondary institutions for academic year 1991-92. These data are followed by tuition and required fees and room and board charges at individual institutions. Tables list public and private 4-year institutions offering a bachelor's degree or higher award; public and private 2-year institutions offering a postsecondary award of at least 2 but not less than 4 academic years; and public less-than-2-year institutions offering a postsecondary award of less than 2 academic years. Schools are listed alphabetically by state, and schools in outlying areas, such as Puerto Rico, follow the state listings. At the beginning of the tables are state averages for the various student charges. (GLR)

Foreword.

This report lists the typical tuition and required fees and room and board charges for academic year 1991-92 at nearly 4,900 4-year, 2-year, and public less-than-2-year postsecondary institutions (collegiate and non-collegiate) in the United States and its outlying areas. Included are tuition and fee charges to in-state and out-of-state students at the undergraduate and graduate levels, along with the costs for room and board, and the number of meals per week covered by the board charge.

This information should be especially helpful to students, guidance counselors, and parents in evaluating the basic costs of attending specific postsecondary schools. For additional information, such as the availability of student financial aid or the programs of study offered at specific institutions, one should consult other postsecondary guides. A school or local public library should have reference materials on postsecondary institutions and on student financial assistance readily available. Once a student has narrowed his or her selection to a few schools, each school should be contacted directly for a current catalog and application form. Before making a final decision on which school to attend, it is usually a good idea to tap the knowledge and expertise of a guidance or career counselor.

Basic Student Charges was prepared by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), U.S. Department of Education. The data were collected through the 1991-92 Institutional Characteristics Survey conducted annually by NCES as part of its Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System.

Introduction

Basic Student Charges at Postsecondary Institutions: Academic Year 1991-92 lists tuition and required fees and room and board charges for academic year 1991-92 at nearly 4,900 schools in the United States and its outlying areas.² These are the typical charges for these items that a full-time, full-year student should expect to pay to attend the institution. A Glossary of terms used in this report appears on page 153.

The student charges listed in this report should be used for reference and comparison purposes only, and not as a quote of actual charges at an institution. Tuition and fees may vary at an institution by student enrollment level or program. In addition to these charges, a student should plan for other school attendance costs, for example, books and supplies, laboratory fees, transportation, and personal expenses. Various forms of student financial assistance are available from federal, state, local, and institutional sources. A student may significantly reduce the total cost of attending a postsecondary institution through such assistance.

All 5,600 4-year, 2-year, and public less-than-2-year institutions in the United States and its outlying areas comprising the 1991-92 Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) universe are listed in this report. Almost 4,900 institutions responded to the items on student charges--a response rate of 88 percent. Data on student charges were not imputed for the 700 institutions that did not respond to these items, so all columns are blank for these schools. The data were collected through the IPEDS 1991-92 Institutional Characteristics Survey. All institutions listed in this report were in operation during the 1991-92 school year.

The student charges reported by institutions were edited for reasonableness and consistency with charges for the previous year (1990-91). Large variations in charges from the previous year were verified with the institution; otherwise, the data were accepted as reported. For institutions that did not respond the previous year, data were accepted as reported although data that appeared questionable were verified with the institution. Zero charges represent actual reported responses.

Organization of this report

Basic Student Charges opens with national statistics on tuition and required fees at postsecondary institutions for academic year 1991-92 (tables A, B, and C). These data are followed by tuition and required fees and room and board charges at individual institutions (tables 1, 2, and 3). Table 1 lists public and private 4-year institutions, i.e., offering a bachelor's degree or higher award; table 2 lists public and private 2-year institutions, i.e., offering a postsecondary award of at least 2 but less than 4 academic years; and table 3 lists public less-than-2-year institutions. i.e., offering a postsecondary award of less than 2 academic years.³ Private less-than-2-year institutions are not

³Due to space limitations in this report, private nonprofit and private for-profit institutions are identified only as private institutions in the institutional listings. However, introductory tables B and C provide selected national statistics on nonprofit and for-profit institutions.



²The outlying areas of the United States are American Samoa, Federated States of Micronesia, Guam, Marshall Islands, Northern Mariana Islands, Palau, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

The U.S. Service Schools are listed (in table 1 or 2) in the state in which they are located or headquartered, as follows: Community College of the Air Force (Alabama); Naval Postgraduate School (California); United States Air Force Academy (Colorado); United States Coast Guard Academy (Connecticut); United States Army Command and General Staff College (Kansas); Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences and United States Naval Academy (both in Maryland); United States Merchant Marine Academy and United States Military Academy (both in New York); and Air Force Institute of Technology (Ohio).

included in this report because the data requested on student charges from these schools are not comparable to data requested from other postsecondary institutions.

Schools are listed alphabetically by state in tables 1, 2, and 3. Schools in outlying areas, such as Puerto Rico, follow the state listings. At the beginning of each state and outlying area are averages for the various student charges.⁴ For the convenience of the user, an explanation of the codes used in tables 1, 2, and 3 is provided at the bottom of every page of the tables. These codes are explained in greater detail on page 3.

The institutional names in this report were transferred directly from the survey data tape. Thus, names may be abbreviated to accommodate the maximum number of 50 tape positions for this variable. Branch campuses may be further identified by their city location to aid the user of this report.

A small number of institutions provide tuition, room and/or board free of charge. These "zero-dollar charges" were verified with the institution and are included in the calculation of the state/outlying area averages and in the summary statistics in introductory tables A, B, and C. If tuition, room, and/or board data were not provided by an institution (due to voluntary nonresponse or nonapplicability of the item to the institution), these "missing data cases" were not included in the calculation of averages or in the summary statistics.



⁴The state/outlying area averages are based on actual institutional charges, i.e., they are not weighted by student enrollment at institutions. A state's room average will be somewhat inflated if any institutions combined their room and board charges, since the combined charge is reported under room.

Codes Used in Tables 1, 2, and 3

- (II) Found to the left of an institution's name, "(H)" identifies the school as an institution of higher education, i.e., accredited at the college level by an agency or association recognized by the Secretary, U.S. Department of Education.
 - * Many institutions reported a combined room and board charge. The combined charge is listed under "Room" and an asterisk (*) is entered under "Board."
- ** Institutions with a double asterisk (**) to the right of their name did not respond to any of the items on student charges in this report. Almost half of these institutions were total nonrespondents to the 1991-92 Institutional Characteristics Survey which collected these atta. The remaining schools responded to the survey but did not answer any of the items on student charges in this report.

The items on student charges in this report were not applicable to a small number of schools in the latter group because (1) they enroll only part-time students (the information was requested for full-time, full-year students only), or (2) they offer only first-professional programs⁵ and do not provide room or board. Tuition charges for first-professional students are not included in this report. Schools offering only first-professional programs were considered as respondents if they reported room or board data.

- *** Institutions with a triple asterisk (***) to the right of their name reported tuition and required fees for in-district students that were at least 10 percent lower than the charge to in-state students. Only tables 2 and 3 carry this code, as lower in-district than in-state charges are generally a phenomenon of public 2-year and public less-than-2-year schools.
- (#) Found to the left of a state name or other area, "(#)" indicates that no postsecondary institutions were identified at the 4-year, 2-year, or public less-than-2-year level. Although there may be such institutions in the State or area, they must respond to the Institutional Characteristics Survey at least once before they can be included in the universe of postsecondary institutions maintained by the National Center for Education Statistics. (Institutions that did not respond to the 1991-92 Institutional Characteristics Survey were verified to be in operation during the 1991-92 school year.)

⁵Examples of first-professional programs include medicine (M.D. degree), law (the LL.B. or J.D. degrees), and Theology (the M.Div., M.H.L., B.D. degrees, or Ordination), as well as first-professional certificates (post-degree) in these fields.



Summary Statistics on Tuition and Required Fees Charged by Postsecondary Iretitutions

The summary data on tuition and required fees in tables A, B, and C on page 7 are presented to inform prospective students of the wide variation in these charges among institutions. The total cost of attending a postsecondary institution can be significantly reduced by taking tuition charges into consideration when choosing a school. As a general rule, tuition is much lower at public institutions than at private institutions, and public institutions generally charge in-state students much lower tuition than students attending from out-of-state.

Tuition and required fees at public postsecondary institutions

Public 4-year institutions

Generally speaking, public 4-year institutions charge much lower tuition and required fees to studen: who attend these schools in the state where they legally reside (table A). For example, in academic year 1991-92 the mean (i.e., average) institutional charge was \$2,098 for an undergraduate student who attended a public 4-year school in the state where he or she legally resided, compared to \$5,347 for an out-of-state student. Average institutional charges to graduate students were also much lower for in-state residents than for out-of-state residents (\$2,328 vs. \$5,327).

The median charge for tuition and fees was \$1,955 for undergraduate, in-state students, falling somewhat below the mean charge. (The median charge lies at the midpoint when charges are arrayed in order from lowest to highest, or highest to lowest). In other words, half of all responding institutions reported tuition and fee charges to undergraduate, in-state students above \$1,955, and half reported charges below this amount. The mean charge of \$2,098 was higher than the median charge due to a small number of relatively higher-priced institutions.

There was also a broad spread of tuition and fee charges when all public 4-year institutions are considered. For example, while 25 percent of these institutions charged \$2,478 or more to undergraduate, in-state students, the bottom quarter charged \$1,470 or less to such students.

Public 2-year institutions

On average, public 2-year institutions charged in-state residents \$1,221 for tuition and required fees in 1991-92, compared to the average out-of-state charge of \$2,888. The median in-state charge was \$1,008. Twenty-five percent of public 2-year schools charged \$664 or less to in-state students for tuition and fees, while schools in the top quarter charged \$1,648 or more.

Public less-than-2-year institutions

In-state residents attending public less-than-2-year institutions were charged an average tuition and required fee of \$1,572 in 1991-92. However, 25 percent of all such institutions charged \$403 or less to in-state students for tuition and fees, and the top 25 percent charged \$2,649 or more. Unlike public 4-year and public 2-year institutions, out-of-state and in-state charges did not vary much at most public less-than-2-year institutions.

Tuition and required fees at private postsecondary institutions

At private institutions, the charges for tuition and required fees seldom vary by a student's in-state vs. out-of-state status, so only in-state charges are presented in this report.

Private 4-year institutions

Private 4-year institutions charged undergraduate students an average of \$7,668 for tuition and required fees in academic year 1991-92 (table B), over three and one-half times (3.5) the average charge of \$2,098 to undergraduate, in-state students by public 4-year institutions. At the graduate level, private 4-year schools charged an average of \$6,364 for tuition and fees, more than two and one-half times (2.5) the amount charged by public 4-year schools to graduate, in-state students (\$2,328).

Tuition and fees varied considerably at private 4-year institutions. For example, the bottom 25 percent of such institutions charged undergraduate tuition and fees of \$4,950 or less, while institutions in the top 25 percent charged undergraduate tuition and fees of \$9,984 or more. Charges for tuition and fees to graduate students were also widely dispersed.

Private nonprofit institutions at the 4-year level charged undergraduate students an average of \$7,759, considerably more than the average of \$5,954 charged to undergraduates at private for-profit institutions. Graduate students were charged an average of \$6,374 for tuition and fees at private non-profit institutions, somewhat higher than the average of \$6,076 charged at private for-profit institutions.

Private 2-year institutions

Private 2-year institutions charged an average of \$4,525 for tuition and required fees in 1991-92 (table C). Twenty-five percent of all private 2-year schools charged \$2,500 or less for tuition and fees, and schools in the top 25 percent charged \$6,000 or more. In contrast to private 4-year schools, private 2-year schools that were organized as nonprofit generally charged lower tuition and fees than for-profit schools (\$3,224 vs. \$5,679).

Glossary



## Glossary

**Board.** The charge for an academic year for meals, for a specified number of days per week. (In this report, when a combined room and board plan is offered at an institution, the cost is reported under "Room," and an asterisk (*) is found under "Board."

## Full-time student.

Undergraduate: A student enrolled for 12 or more semester credits, 12 or more quarter credits, or 24 or more contact hours a week each term.

Graduate: A student enrolled for 9 or more semester credits, or 9 or more quarter credits.

<u>Full-year student.</u> A student who attends an institution for a full academic year. An academic year is the period of time generally extending from September to June; usually equated to two semesters or trimesters, three quarters, or the period covered by a 4-1-4 plan.

<u>Graduate student.</u> A student who holds a bachelor's or first-professional degree, or equivalent, and is taking courses at the postbaccalaureate level. These students may or may not be enrolled in graduate programs.

<u>In-district student.</u> A student who is a legal resident of the locality in which he or she attends school and thus is entitled to reduced tuition charges if offered by the institution. (In this report, institutions with a triple asterisk (***) to the right of their name charge tuition and required fees to in-district students that are at least 10 percent lower than the charge to in-state students.) This code is found in the 2-year and public less-than-2-year tables only, since 4-year schools generally do not have separate in-district charges.

In-state student. A student who is a legal resident of the state in which he or she attends school.

Meals per week. See Board.

Out-of-state student. A student who is not a legal resident of the state in which he or she attends school.

<u>Private.</u> An institution controlled by a private individual(s) or by a nongovernmental agency, usually supported primarily by other than public funds, and operated by other than publicly elected or appointed officials.

<u>Public.</u> An institution whose programs and activities are operated by publicly elected or appointed school officials and which is supported primarily by public funds.

Room. The charge for an academic year for rooming accommodations of a typical student sharing a room with one other student.

<u>Tuition and required fees</u>. Tuition is the charge to students for instructional services. Required fees are all fixed sum charges to students which are not covered by tuition and which are required of such a large proportion of all students that the student who does not pay the charge is an exception. This figure does not include such items as books, lab fees, or transportation expenses. (In this report, tuition and required tees at private schools are for in-state students; however, in the vast majority of cases private schools charge the same amount to in-state and out-of-state students.)

<u>Undergraduate student</u>. A student enrolled in a 4- or 5-year bachelor's degree program, in an associate's degree program, or in a vocational or technical program below the baccalaureate.
