ABSTRACT

This annotated bibliography contains books for blind or physically handicapped youngsters from preschool through junior high. The books are available in braille, on audiocassette, or recorded discs. The approximately 200 titles listed have been produced in Florida or obtained from the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped. The bibliography, which was prepared in conjunction with the State Library of Florida's Summer Library Program for 1992, is built around a travel theme. The items are further divided by these themes: (1) traveling through time; (2) stretching your imagination; (3) back to the times of kings and queens; (4) exploring other places; (5) out to space; (6) visiting the future; (7) meeting monsters and strange creatures; and (7) into the heart. Annotations include the grade level for which each item is appropriate. The bibliography also contains an author index and a title index. An order form is included. The bibliography is set in large print and is also available on cassette or in braille. (KRN)

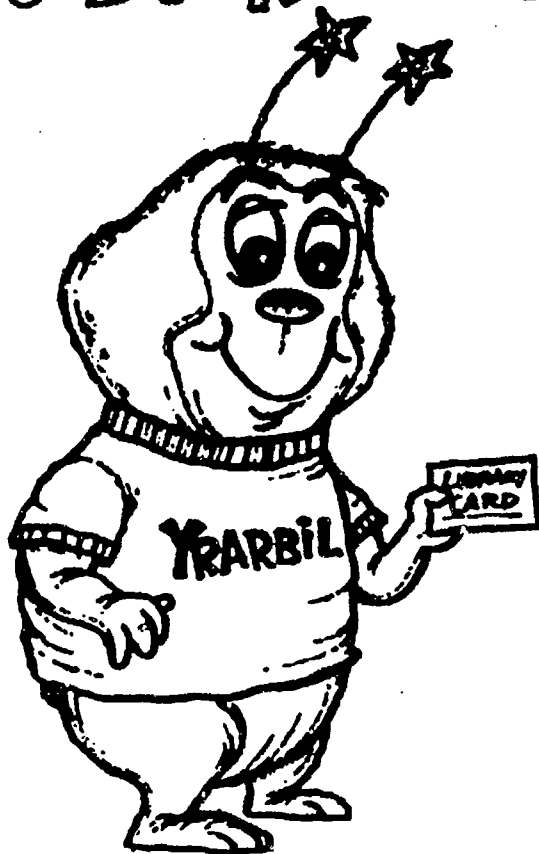

## PREFACE

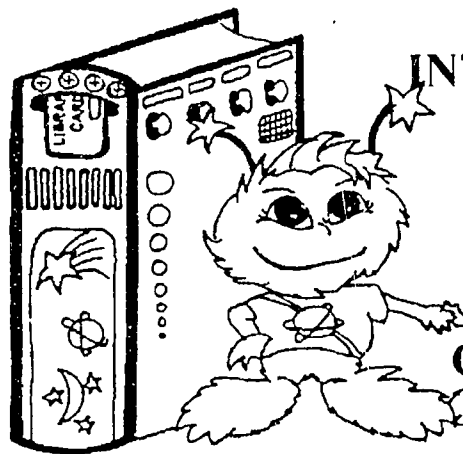

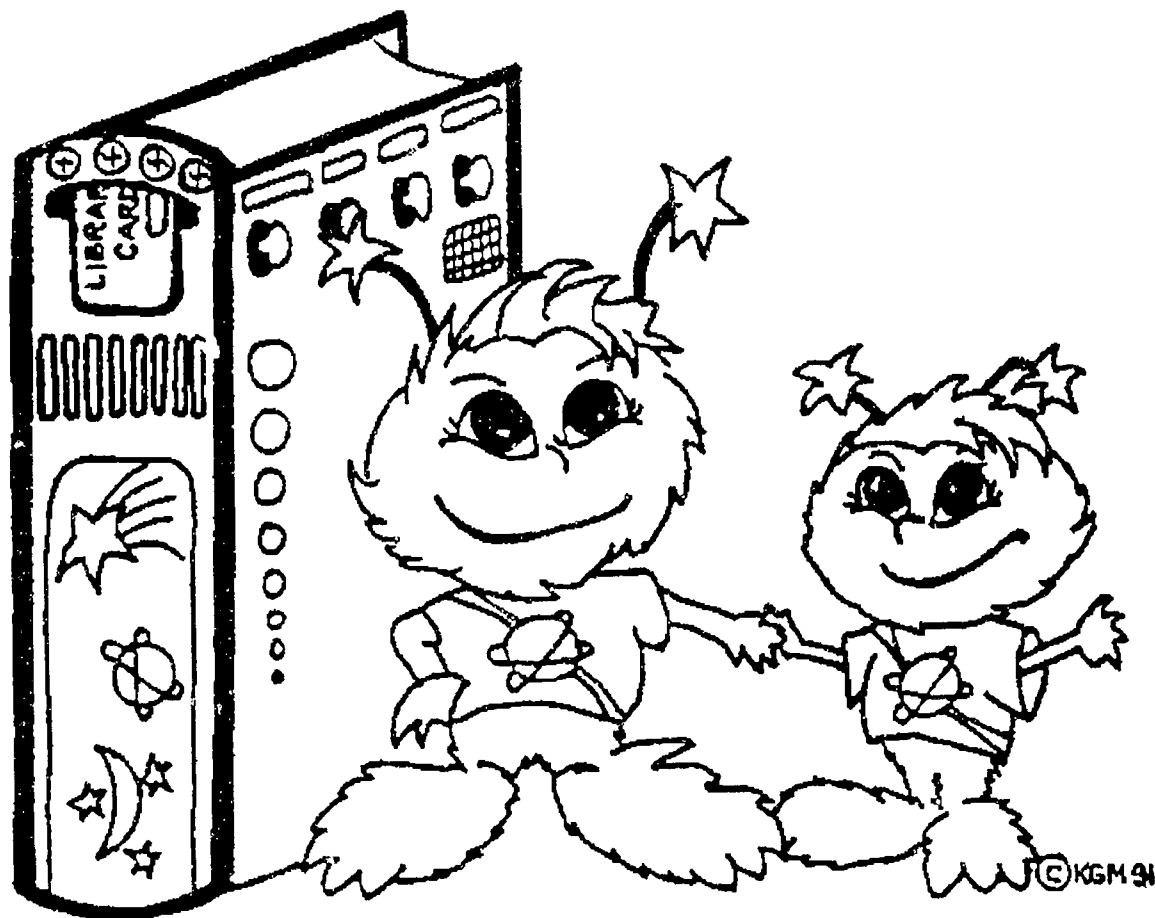

- RD20955** Burton, Virginia Lee. **THE LITTLE HOUSE.**  
**BR05903** Many years ago the little house stood in the country where she could see the sun, the moon, and the seasons come and go. Since then the city has grown up around the little house, surrounding her with tall buildings that block the light and the trees, making her sad and lonely. For grades K-3. Caldecott Medal. Print/Braille.
- RC25138** Clifford, Eth. **THE REMEMBERING BOX.**  
Nine-year-old Joshua has been spending each Sabbath with his grandmother Goldina ever since he was five. After they've lit the candles and eaten a special dinner, Grandma takes things out of her "remembering box" and tells Joshua about her life in the old country and as an immigrant. For grades 3-5.
- CBF1137** Cooney, Barbara. **ISLAND BOY.**  
**BR07932** Matthias grows from a little boy to a grandfather on a small island off the coast of New England. For preschool - grade 2. Print/Braille.

Polly Flint believes the legend about Grimstone, a "lost village" whose inhabitants disappeared underground long ago. When she meets the Porter family, "time gypsies" from Grimstone who have been trapped in the modern world, Polly learns that she has the power to help them get back. For grades 5-8.

Babar and Celeste have many adventures as they travel around the world. For grades K-3.

Twelve-year-old Philip Gilmore has come to Glasgow to stay with his great aunt Jane while his mother attends nursing school. With scraps cut from the family's old clothing, Tanya and her grandmother make a beautiful quilt that brings back memories from her family's life. For grades 2-4. Print/Braille.

Yukio saves the other villagers from recurring nightmares when he rescues a baku. For preschool - grade 2.

- BR08102** Hass, E.A. **INCOGNITO MOSQUITO MAKES HISTORY.**  
**Incognito Mosquito, the world-famous private insective, travels back in time to solve five mysteries involving Christopher Columbug, BenetickArnold, Buffalo Bill Cootie, Tutankhamant, and Robin Hoodlum. As Incognito puns his way from case to case, the reader is given the opportunity to solve each mystery. For grades 5-8.**

**BR07694** Charles Wallace, the youngest of the Murry children, must travel through time and space in a battle against an evil dictator who would destroy the entire universe. For grades 5-8.

**BR07884** Evil in the form of the Echthroi is spreading throughout the galaxy, but Meg Murry is not involved in the struggle until the Echthroi invade her younger brother. For grades 6-9.

 Reminiscences of the pleasures of life in the mountains as a child. For preschool - grade 3.

**BR05919** After being sent to bed without supper for misbehaving, Max puts on his wolf suit and sails away "through night and day and in and out of weeks and almost over a year" to where the wild things are. An imaginative fantasy for grades K-3.  
 Caldecott Medal. Print/Braille.

**9RC30778 Stolz, Mary. STORM IN THE NIGHT.**  
Thomas, Grandfather, and Ringo the cat are left in the dark by a fearsome thunderstorm. There is little that they can do without electricity, so Grandfather decides to tell Thomas a story from his boyhood--when he was afraid of thunderstorms. For preschool - grade 2.

**RD15483 Thayer, Jane. QUIET ON ACCOUNT OF**  
**BR00280 DINOSAUR.**  
A little girl finds a very shy brontosaur who has been sleeping in a cave for sixty million years. He is as friendly as a puppy, and the little girl longs to keep him as a pet, but the dino is terrified by the hustle and bustle of city life. A preposterous story for grades K-3.

**CBF1110 VanAllsburg, Chris. THE WRECK OF THE ZEPHYR.**  
**FBC2** A boy's ambition to be the greatest sailor in the world brings him to ruin when he misuses his new ability to sail his boat in the air. For grades K-3.

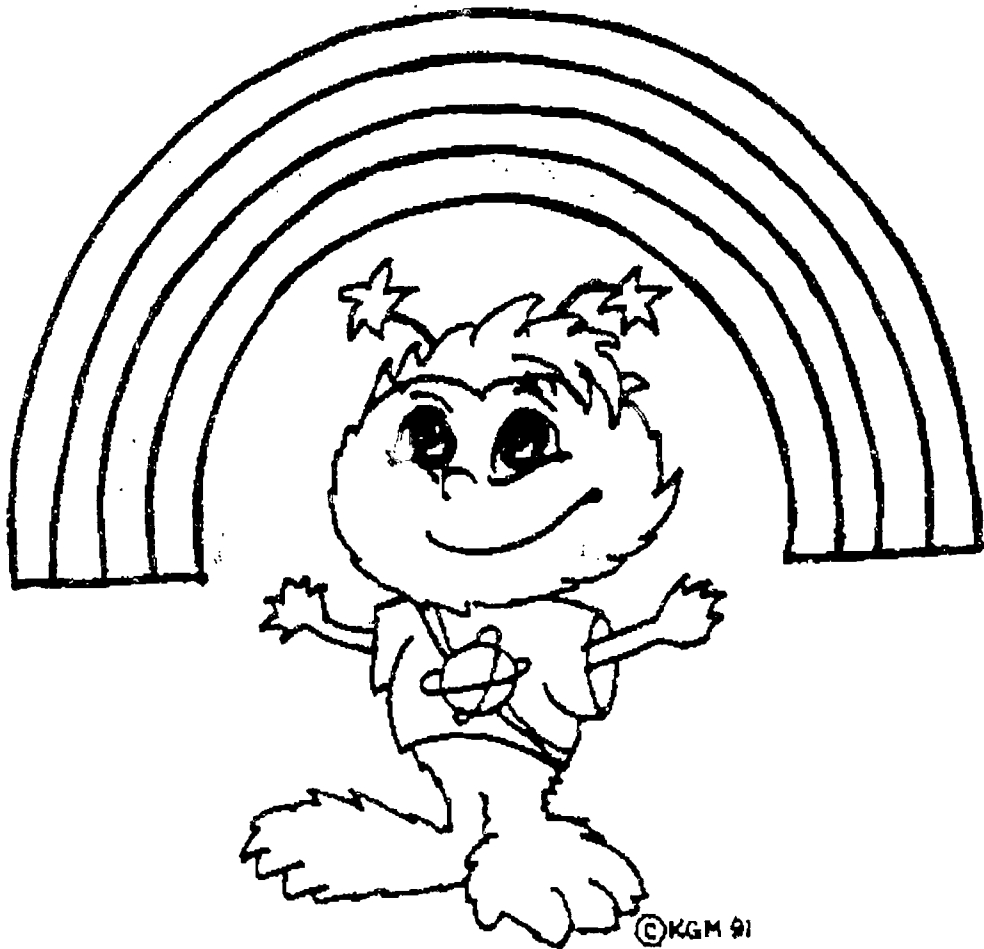
**BR07518 Willard, Nancy. THE VOYAGE OF THE**  
**LUDGATE HILL: A JOURNEY WITH ROBERT LOUIS**  
**STEVENSON.**  
In 1887, the famous writer Robert Louis Stevenson sailed from London to America on a big, cargo-carrying steamer. He wrote exciting letters to his family and friends about the voyage. Using those letters, the author has written a poem describing the rough journey shared with a shipload of exotic animals. For preschool - grade 2. Print/Braille.

**RC25286 Wiseman David. JEREMY VISICK.**  
When twelve-year-old Matthew Clemens announces that he considers history to be "rubbish," his teacher gives him an eerie assignment: Matthew is to report to the class on what he finds in a graveyard near his home in Cornwall, England. Soon Matthew finds himself obsessed with the ghost of a boy his own age who died in a mining disaster more than a hundred years before. For grades 4-7.

**RC30370 Yolen, Jane. DEVILS ARITHMETIC.**

**Twelve-year-old Hannah resents the traditions of her Jewish heritage until time travel whisks her from a contemporary Passover Seder to a Polish village in the early 1940s. Just as she begins to adjust, Nazi soldiers come to take her and her shtetl relatives to a death camp. There she learns an unforgettable lesson -- some must live, at whatever cost, in order to bear witness. For grades 5-8 and older readers.**

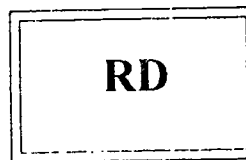

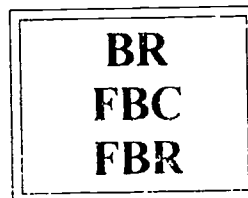

**FBC238** Amanda escapes to an imaginary world rather than face reality. With the help of pink pig, a quartz figurine, she battles the dangers and comes to find happiness in the real world. For grades 3-7.
- RC21037** Adler, C. S. **THE MAGIC OF THE GLITS.**  
**FBR210** Jeremy's summer at Cape Cod is bound to be a bummer. For one thing, he has a cast on his broken leg. For another, his mother commits him to baby-sitting a seven-year-old girl. Once she arrives, Jeremy has to admit that she's a pretty decent kid, and to entertain her he invents the Glits, magical creatures who can grant wishes. For grades 5-8.
- CBF1647** Alexander, Sue. **LILA ON THE LANDING.**  
**FBC193** Lila, always the last to be chosen for games by the other children, earns their interest and acceptance by creating her own imaginative activities on the landing of her apartment house. For grades 4-6.

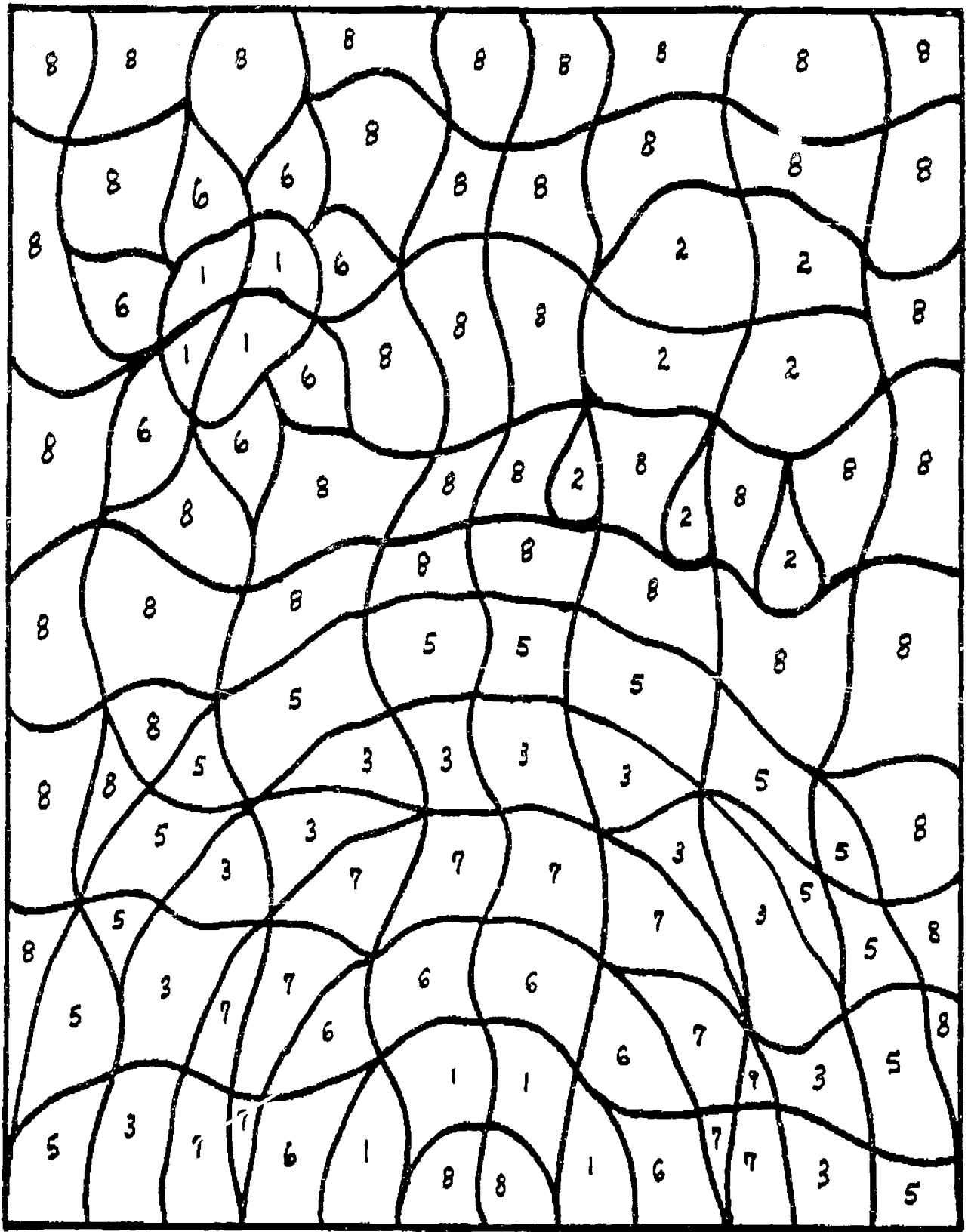
- RD08261** Cleary, Beverly. **EMILY'S RUNAWAY IMAGINATION.**

FBC200 **CRAYON.**  
Little Harold draws pictures with his purple crayon and journeys into the drawings he creates. For preschool - grade 2.

- CBF1414 Mahy, Margaret. THE BOY WHO WAS FOLLOWED HOME.**  
A witch's pill is supposed to cure Robert of the hippopotami who daily follow him home from school -- but there is one disadvantage to the treatment. For preschool - grade 3.
- RC33085 Mahy, Margaret. THE GREAT WHITE MAN-EATING SHARK.**  
**CBF1520** Greedy to have the cove where he swims all to himself, Norvin, who looks a bit like a shark, pretends to be one, scaring off the other swimmers and leaving him in happy aquatic solitude. Until he is discovered by a female shark who takes a liking to him! For preschool - grade 3.

A winged horse takes a child on a wonderful night journey into outer space. For grades K-3.
- RC32961 Prelutsky, Jack. SOMETHING BIG HAS BEEN HERE.**  
**CBF1394** ("Last Night I Dreamed").  
**FBC196** A collection of humorous poems on a variety of topics. For grades 2-6.
- CBF601 Shaw, Charles G. IT LOOKED LIKE SPILT MILK.**  
Sometimes it looked like a tree. Sometimes it looked like a bird. Sometimes it look like spilt milk, but what it was was\_\_\_\_\_? For preschool - grade 2.

When he has a dream about a future Earth devastated by pollution, Walter begins to understand the importance of taking care of the environment. For grades K-3.

A neon blue horse carries a girl into the night sky, where she picks a bouquet of stars and feeds them to her steed. For grades K-3.
- RC30022 Wright, Betty Ren. THE SECRET WINDOW.**  
Seventh-grader Meg believes she is crazy because her dreams come true. When she and her best friend Gracie go to a slumber party, Meg has a ominous dream and leaves early. Gracie angrily confronts her, and accuses her of telling the police that there was marijuana at the party. 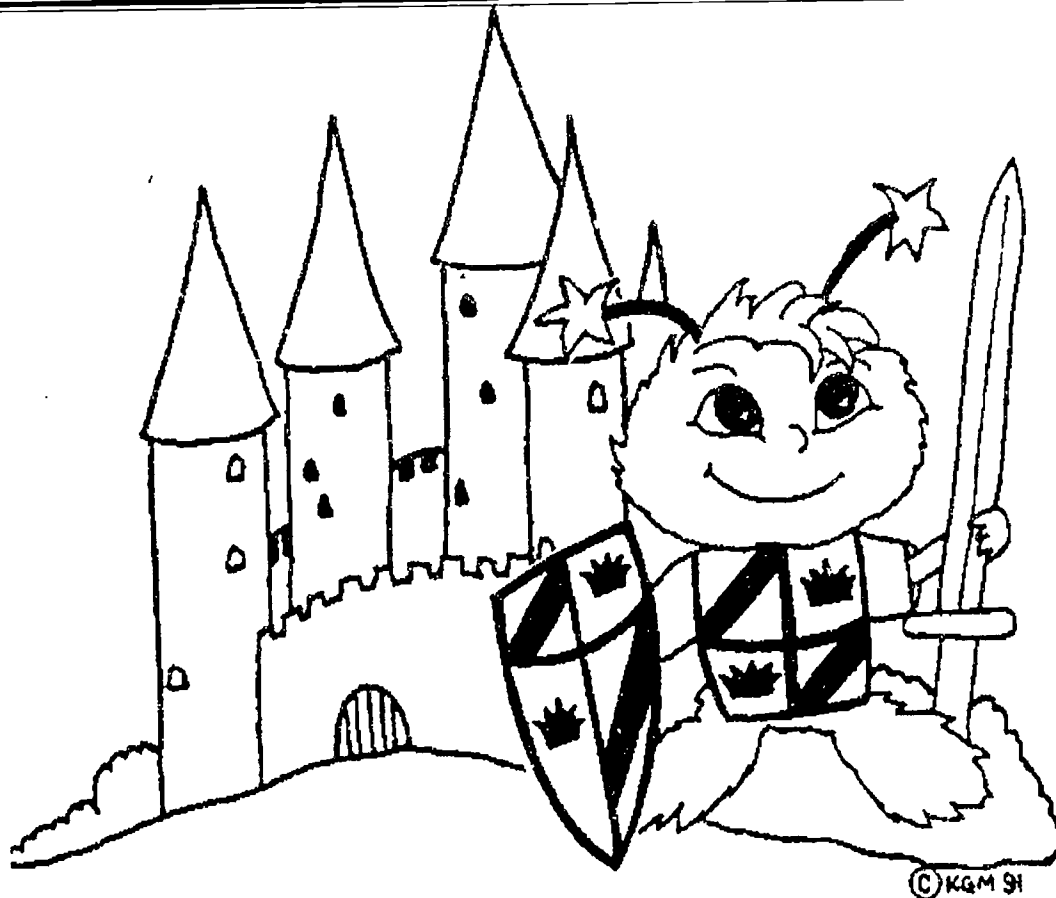

In this final book in the Chronicles of Prydain, the assistant pig-keeper leads his companions on a last great quest. A tale of royal marriages and wars between black and white magic. For grades 5-8. Sequel to TARAN WANDERER. Newbery Award.
- RC09196 Cooper, Susan. THE GREY KING.**  
**BR08334** Will Stanton, visiting in Wales, is swept into a desperate quest to find the golden harp and to awaken the ancient sleepers. The fourth books of the DARK IS RISING fantasies. Sequel to "Greenwitch." For grades 6-9. Newbery Medal.
- RC22885 DeAngeli, Marguerite. THE DOOR IN THE WALL.**  
**RD01898** A crippled boy in fourteenth-century England matures from whining invalidism to heroic courage when he saves a friend's castle from invasion by the Welsh. For grades 4-7. Newbery Award.
- CBF1554 De Paola, Tomie. THE KNIGHT AND THE DRAGON.**  
A knight who has never fought a dragon and an equally inexperienced dragon prepare to meet each other in battle. For grades K-3.

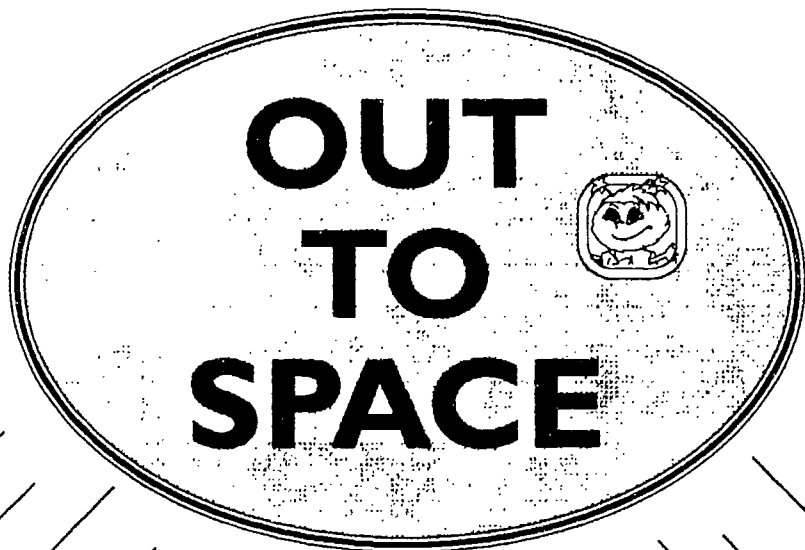

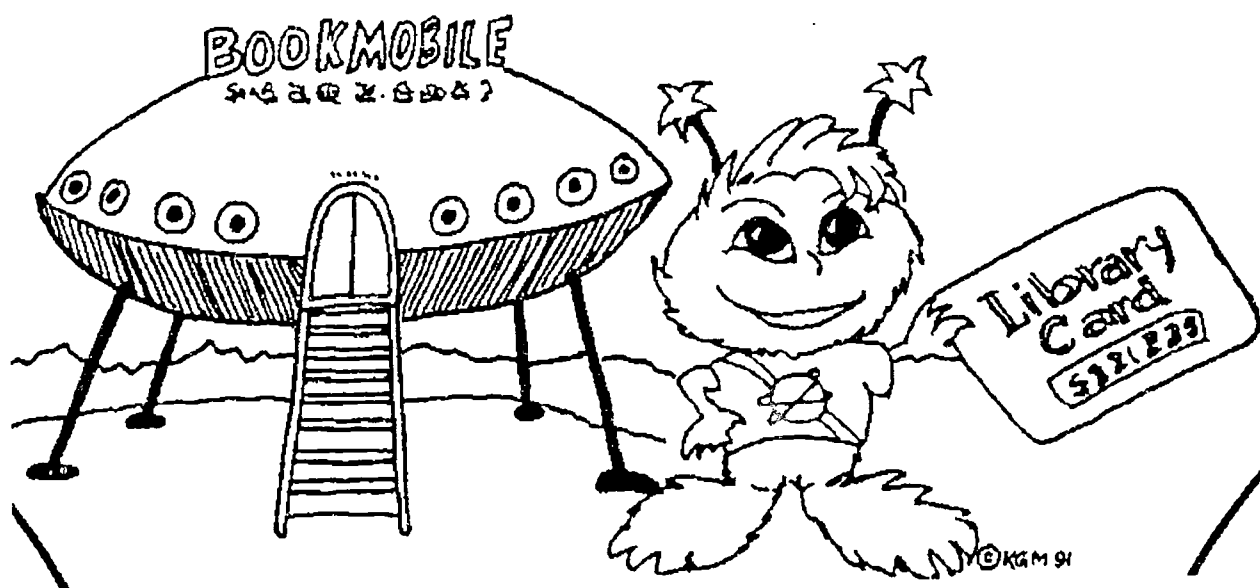

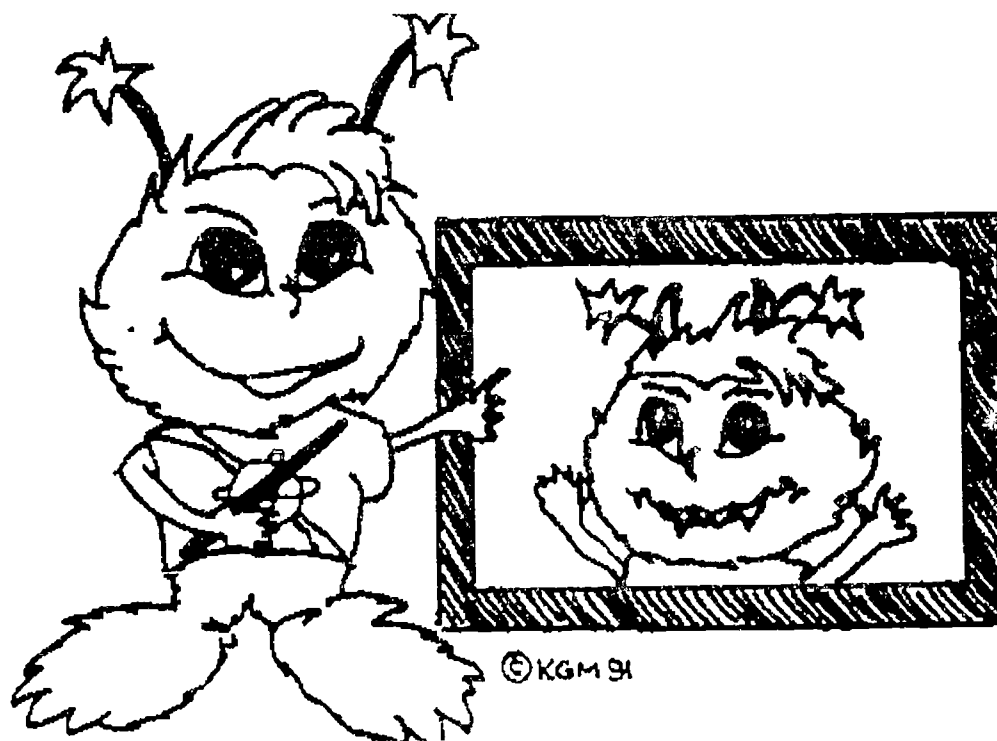
