ABSTRACT

This annotated bibliography contains books for blind or physically handicapped youngsters from preschool through junior high. The books are available in braille, on audiocassette, or recorded discs. The approximately 400 titles listed were produced in Florida or obtained from the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped. The bibliography, which was prepared in conjunction with the State Library of Florida's Summer Library program for 1991, is built around a safari theme. The items are further divided by these themes: (1) African safari; (2) jungle safari; (3) animal safari; (4) dinosaur safari; (5) distant safari; and (6) backyard safari. Each annotation indicates the grade level for which the book or recording is appropriate. The bibliography also contains an author index and a title index. An order form is included. The bibliography is set in large print and is also available on cassette or in braille. (KRN)

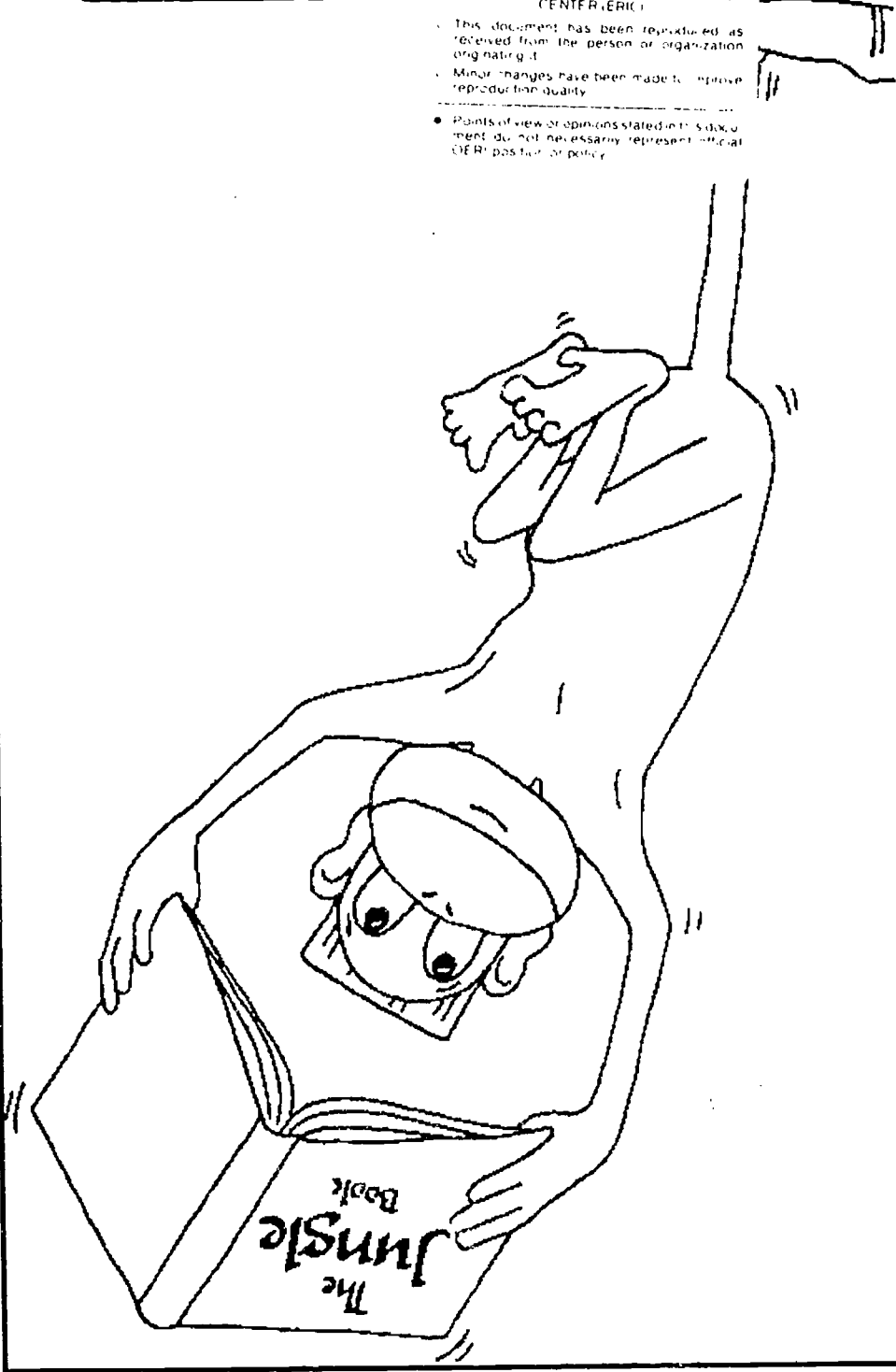

PREFACE

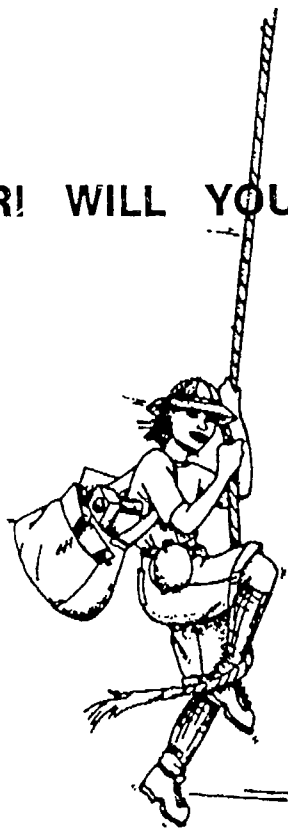

A rhythmic Nandi tale tells how Ki-pat ingeniously brings rain to the arid Kapiti plain. For grades K-3.

The culture, daily life, and government of a tribal people living in the central region of the land now called Ghana. An account of the country's past and present civilization. For grades 3-5.
- BR02722 Carpenter, John Allan. EGYPT.
Introduction to Egypt covers 5,000 years of history, geography, and government, and describes the daily lives of three typical Egyptian children. For grades 4-7.
- BR05244 Cole, William. POEM STEW.
A feast of humorous poems about food, from the thirst-quenching taste of watermelon to the disgusting look of hot cocoa left too long to cool. Also includes a poem called "Rhinceros Stew." For grades 3-6 and older readers.
- BR00972 Courlander, Harold. OLODE THE HUNTER AND OTHER TALES FROM NIGERIA.
Twenty-nine stories from the people of Nigeria that tell of, among other things, the lizard who lives in a house, and the conniving activities of Ijapa the tortoise. For grades 4-7.

This tribute to the heritage of East Africa teaches the reader to count to ten in Swahili. While learning the numbers the reader is introduced to geography, clothing, music, animals, and other topics about this region of the world. For preschool - grade 2.
- BR00749 Graham, Lorenz B. MOMOLU.
Momolu lives in a small tribal town in the interior of Liberia. When his father takes him on a trip to Cape Roberts he begins to realize the advantages of some aspects of civilization and finds these in conflict with the traditional values of his society. For grades 6-9.
- BR02194 Guirma, Frederic. TALES OF MOGHO: AFRICAN STORIES FROM UPPER VOLTA.
Eight folk tales retold by a native of West Africa. These stories, which have never before been written down, are from the ancient oral tradition of the Mossi tribesmen. For grades 4-7.
- BR06103 Haley, Gail E. A STORY, A STORY: AN AFRICAN TALE RETOLD.
Before the spider man can obtain the Sky God's golden chest of stories, he must outwit and capture three fantasy creatures. For grades 2-4. Caldecott medal, 1971. Print/Braille.

- BR01310 Murphy, E. Jefferson. UNDERSTANDING AFRICA. Overview of the entire African continent including its geography, anthropology, and history, the rise of nationalism, and problems challenging Africa today. For grades 6-9.
- BR02956 Schick, Alice. KONGO AND KUMBA: TWO GORILLAS. The first three years in the lives of two young gorillas -- one cared for by its mother in the jungles of Africa and the other raised in a Chicago zoo. For grades 4-7.

Shortly thereafter she married the movement's leader, Nelson Mandela, who was given a life sentence in 1963. For grades 6-9. Written in 1987.

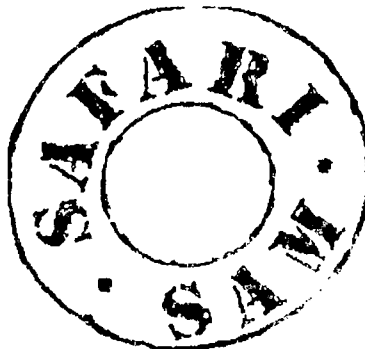

- RC26567 Naidoo, Beverly. JOURNEY TO JO'BURG: A SOUTH AFRICAN STORY.
Thirteen-year-old Naledi, her nine-year-old brother, Tiro; and their baby sister live in a village with their aunt and grandmother. Their mother, Mma, works as a maid in Johannesburg, three hundred kilometers away. When their baby sister becomes ill, they slip away to find their mother so that the baby can be hospitalized. Along the way they experience first-hand the pain and indignities of apartheid, and learn of the ongoing struggle against it. For grades 3-6 and older readers.
- RC13351 Perl, Lila. GHANA AND THE IVORY COAST: SPOTLIGHT ON WEST AFRICA.
Survey contrasts two West African countries -- Ghana and Ivory Coast -- covering history, politics, economics, and culture. For grades 6-9 and older readers.

A nonsensical adventure in which three characters go on an African safari to locate a place that may or may not be called Kukumlima. Their goal is to find an enormous earthworm named Raymond, who is reported to be intelligent enough to play chess very well. For grades 5-8 and older readers.
- RC30745 Powzyk, Joyce. TRACKING WILD CHIMPANZEES: IN KIBIRA NATIONAL PARK.
The author details her visit to the Kibira National Park to see wild chimpanzees. She also shares her observations of the people, culture, and wildlife in Burundi, Africa. For grades 2-4 and older readers.
- RC08570 Price, Christine. TALKING DRUMS OF AFRICA.
Rhythmic prose and poetry describe the history of talking drums as well as the rituals in which they are used and the stories they tell. For grades 2-5.

- RC27480 Walter, Mildred Pitts. BROTHER TO THE WIND.
More than anything else, Emeke wants to fly. Heedless of his father's and his friends' skepticism, he strongly believes that Good Snake, in whom his grandmother has abiding faith, will grant any wish. For grades 2-4.
- CBF1303 Yoshida, Toshi. ELEPHANT CROSSING.
Describes the perils faced by a herd of African elephants in the course of their daily lives. The elephants gather to cross the flat plains to get to the delicious leaves in the forest. For grades K-3.

- RD09284 Appleton, Victor. TOM SWIFT IN THE CAVE OF NUCLEAR FIRE.
Tom Swift flies to Africa to locate an isotope not yet discovered on earth. Before reaching their remote destination, the crew encounters hostile natives, poison spears, giant insects, and two American enemies. For grades 3-6.
- TB01114 Arkhurst, Joyce Cooper. THE ADVENTURES OF SPIDER: WEST AFRICAN FOLK TALES, RETOLD.

- RD06345 Bryan, Ashley. THE OX OF THE WONDERFUL HORNS AND OTHER AFRICAN FOLK TALES.
Five folk tales from Africa. The title story is a tale of a neglected boy who makes his fortune with the help of a magic ox. For grades 3-6.
- RD07130 Clifford, Mary Louise. BISHA OF BURUNDI.

A Nigerian youth aspires to become a drummer for the king.
For grades 4-6.
- TB03082 Schatz, Letta. NEVER-EMPTY.
An African folk tale in which a rabbit finds a magical spoon
which gives him all the food he wants until an elephant
swallows all but the tip of the spoon. Using a magical stick,
Rabbit takes revenge on the elephant. For grades K-3.
