ABSTRACT

An employer needs assessment study was performed at Porterville College (PC), in California in 1991 as part of a comprehensive educational planning process for PC and the surrounding area. A validated survey instrument was sent to a stratified random sampling of 593 employers in the community, asking them to provide general information about their company and to rate the importance to their employment needs of the programs currently being offered at PC and those being considered by the college. After two follow-up efforts, a 45% return rate was obtained. The highest ranked programs and corresponding job titles were accounting/bookkeeping, business general/administration, manager/supervisor, computer science/information processing, maintenance mechanic, and small business assistant manager. The top ranked program/job title for businesses with 100 or more employees was manager/supervisor, while the top ranked program/job title for businesses with 5 or fewer employees was accounting/bookkeeping. The top five "write-in" programs/job titles were food service workers, licensed vocational nurse to registered nurse upgrade, clerk/secretary, seamstress, and forestry. Based on survey findings, PC is currently considering offering programs for computer assistants in drafting and design, human resource technicians, agri-business sales and service, health technicians, and agriculture mechanics. An economic profile of Tulare County, longitudinal enrollment data for PC and the Kern County Community College District as a whole, and information on Tulare County demographics are included. The survey instrument and a list of the employers surveyed are appended. (MAB)

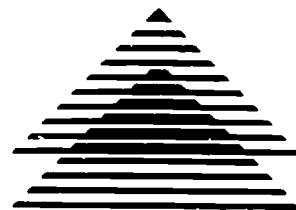

ABSTRACT

The planning process for education and vocational education specifically involves the gathering of data for analysis in formulating programs to meet upcoming needs. Porterville College has not had an employer needs assessment in six years. In order to undertake a comprehensive plan for education for the college and the county area, the first step mandates a current assessment of the employment needs in the community.

Although the state provides statewide needs data, the President of Porterville College desired our own assessment due to the ambiguities in the state data. The Porterville area may not be representative of the state of California and is probably unique to most areas in the United States. Due to our unique characteristics, obscurity in the State Needs Assessment, and the College's need to do long-range planning, Porterville College has directed the Dean of Instruction to undertake an assessment of the employment needs in the Porterville region.

With the assistance of the sub-committee and a consultant, a validated survey instrument and a plan were developed to implement the needs assessment. The survey forms were sent to a stratified random sampling of 593 employers in the community which, after two follow-up efforts, obtained a forty-five percent return (267). A forty-five percent return is considered a high percentage return for a survey of this nature.

Although other significant needs have been identified, the occupations/job titles that appear in the top two quartiles need to be prioritized by the college and district to determine their consideration as educational programs. The findings in this survey will be studied and combined with other data to make final decisions about future educational offerings. The final report will be shared with other educational delivery systems in the area. This report will become incorporated into the Porterville College Comprehensive Master Plan that will provide direction for the college in the future.

Based on the obtained information, we were able to isolate the occupations most needed in the employment community of the Porterville area. In general, on the following table, these occupations were listed in the top two quartiles as having the highest need in the Porterville service area:

The items listed on Abstract Table 1, indicated with an asterisk (*), are programs listed in the top two quartiles, but not currently offered at Porterville College. The top write-ins are listed at the bottom of this list.

Those items with a plus sign (+) are programs not currently offered but will be considered as a result of this survey and the college's ability to offer them.

Items in Abstract Table 1 need to be addressed by the college, other educational agencies, and employers as consideration for future needs.

Even with the recent freeze, continued drought, and the statewide economic concern, long-range planning must continue. The college's awarding of a five-year Title III project and the growth of the community as a whole will enable this need to be addressed.

The college has already taken a leadership role in meeting the community needs; however, the college will need assistance in addressing the total needs outlined here.

INTRODUCTION

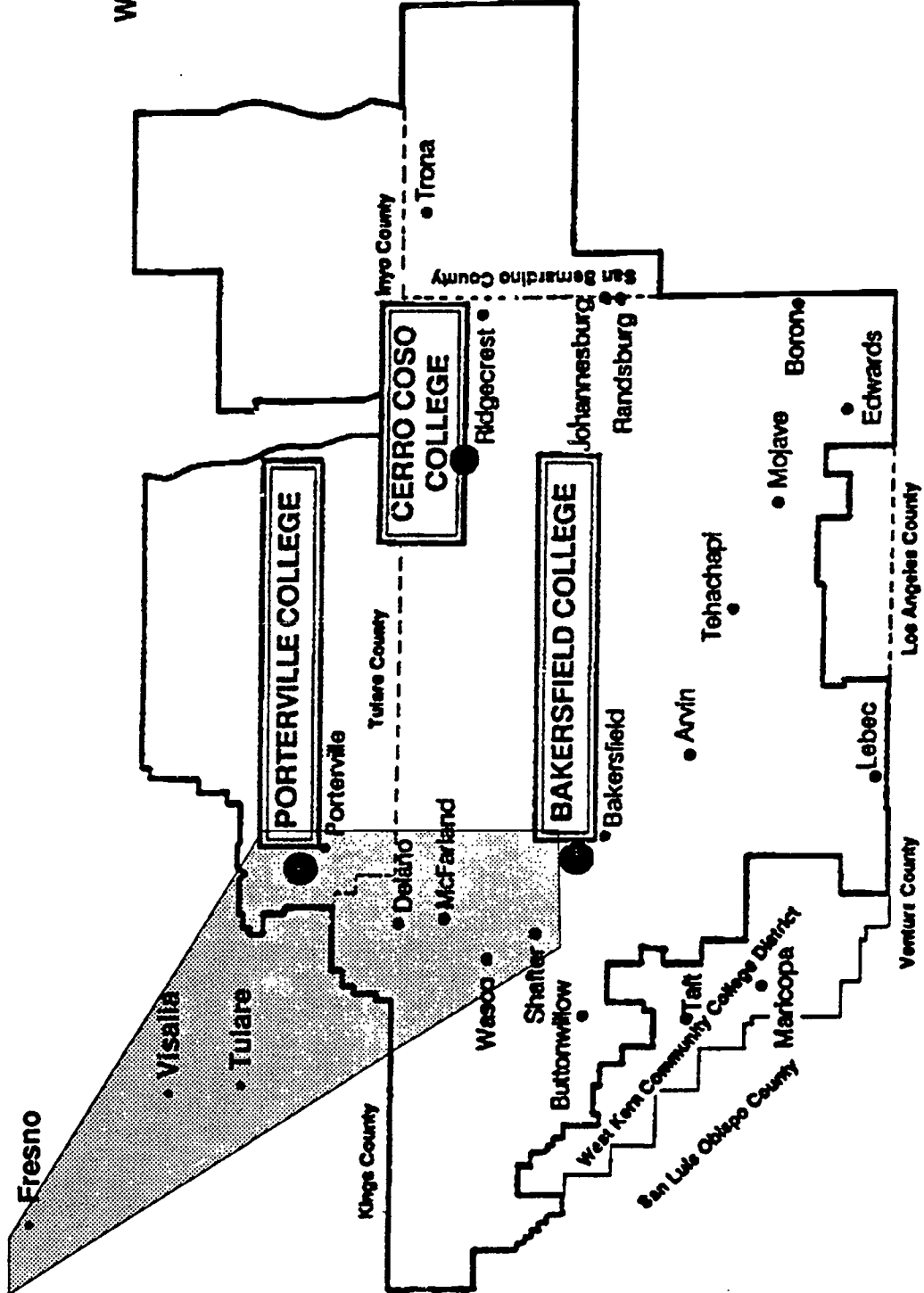
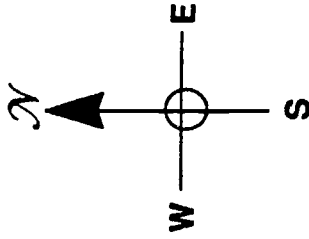
Porterville is located in Tulare County centered in the state of California. It ranks seventh in size of California counties. Its area of 4,935 square miles is almost equal to that of the state of Connecticut and is more than the combined area of the states of Delaware, Rhode Island and the District of Columbia. It is bounded on the east by the crest of the Sierra Nevada Mountain Range and Inyo County, on the north by Fresno County, on the west by Kings County and on the south by Kern County. Of its total area, more than one-half is mountainous. The remainder consists of the timbered slopes and foothills of the Sierra Nevada range and the fertile plain that is part of the central San Joaquin Valley. The combined acreage of Sequoia National Forest in Tulare County constitutes 55 percent of the county area.

West of the foothills, Tulare County is part of the San Joaquin Valley, which extends about 30 miles westerly to the Kings County line. This area of approximately 1,800 square miles contains some of the most intensive agricultural development in the United States and one of the most productive citrus belts in all of California.

Porterville College was established in 1927 as Porterville Junior College and operated as part of the high school district until October 1966. Following an annexation election in December of that year, Porterville College became part of the Kern Joint Junior College District, effective July 1, 1967. The decade immediately following annexation saw a large increase in enrollment, from 826 in 1966-67 to 2166 in 1976-77, and active construction and campus expansion programs. Construction has begun on a major new instruction building, and existing campus buildings are well maintained.

Porterville College is an active member of the Community College League for Innovation. With a five year Title III funded project, a major building program in operation and a positive well-qualified faculty, Porterville College is a progressive college on the move.

Over the last decade, Porterville College has experienced a drop and then a moderate rise in enrollments. By fall semester 1989 enrollment headcount had climbed to 2883. In the Spring of 1990 the headcount was 3972 representing an increase of 1089 students. Some of the reasons for the slow but steady growth are the introduction of a new physical fitness program, language and mathematics tutorial programs, additional basic skills classes, and active recruitment of high school honor students.

However, even though there is an increase in headcount, ADA (average daily attendance) figures are nowhere near the all-time high of 2,153.04 reached in 1981-82. It is partially because of a major shift from young, college-age, full-time students to older, working, part-time students.

The following charts show enrollment figures, service area population projections, and Porterville College enrollment.

The Porterville College drawing area population is derived by applying the same percentage of the total county population as obtained in the official Tract Census of 1980. This percentage is 24.23 percent.

Porterville College has seen a dramatic change in its student body. More than 23 percent of the college enrollment is represented by Hispanic students. This percentage has risen from 14 percent in the past two years and could increase yearly because the **Porterville area elementary schools now report a majority of minority students with the largest group being Hispanic.** There are many non-English speaking adults in this community including one of the larger Hmong and Laotian communities in the state, along with others from Pacific Basin backgrounds amounting to 5 percent of the college enrollment. Black and Native American enrollments are at 2.5 percent, which is the same as represented in the community. It is anticipated that the enrollment of Blacks will increase as migration from the greater Los Angeles area into the San Joaquin Valley continues. Another significant change is in the percentage of female students that has risen to 59 percent from 47 percent five years ago. Part of this increase can be attributed to the opening of a limited service re-entry center especially designed to aid single parents and homemakers. Collectively, over one-third of the students enrolled in Porterville College are classified as minority students.

Changes in the community area underline the prediction made by the California Community College Chancellor's Office that the central valley will become a larger part of the state's diverse population. Porterville, the third largest city in Tulare County, grew 37 percent between 1980 and 1989, with the population expanding from 19,707 to 27,000. **Unemployment was 10.3 percent in 1988 and 11.2 percent as of January 1990.** The unemployment figure is over double the **5.3 national unemployment figure released at the end of 1989.** Agriculture remains the major employing sector with 27.6 percent of all jobs. Government jobs hold second place with 18.3 percent while retail trade accounts for 14.6 percent. Tulare County leads California production of table grapes, olives, oranges, pistachios, pomegranates, tangerines, and hogs. The most lucrative cash crops are oranges, milk, and grapes in that order. Another plus in the Porterville area is the affordability of housing with the average sales price of a house in 1988 at \$78,171.

An influx of underprepared students, including high-risk youths, minority students, welfare students required to attend training through the state workfare program, unemployed, underemployed, and unskilled adults, immigrants, and re-entry men and women comes at a time when the college is struggling to maintain its mission of providing open access to higher education, vocational/technical education, career education, and cultural enrichment to all segments of the community while struggling to maintain fiscal stability.

Single parents receiving public assistance make up a large segment of Porterville College re-entry student recruitment.

Porterville College is founded upon the premise that all people are entitled to an opportunity to develop their full potential as individuals and as social beings. To this end, the college is dedicated to the development of free, rational, and responsible individuals who can formulate principles and acquire skills by which to lead more meaningful and productive lives.

POPULATION

According to estimates by the State Department of Finance, Tulare County gained 37,319 new residents by 1990, reaching 315,992 by year's end (see Appendix A). In one year the population increased by 2.7 percent. Visalia remained the largest city in the county with a population of 72,000, up 3,400. Porterville and Tulare are the second largest with approximately 30,000 each. All three cities experienced the largest percentage change (45 percent) from 1980-1990.

Currently, approximately 3,105 students are enrolled in a wide range of transfer, vocational/technical and remedial basic skills classes offered by Porterville College.

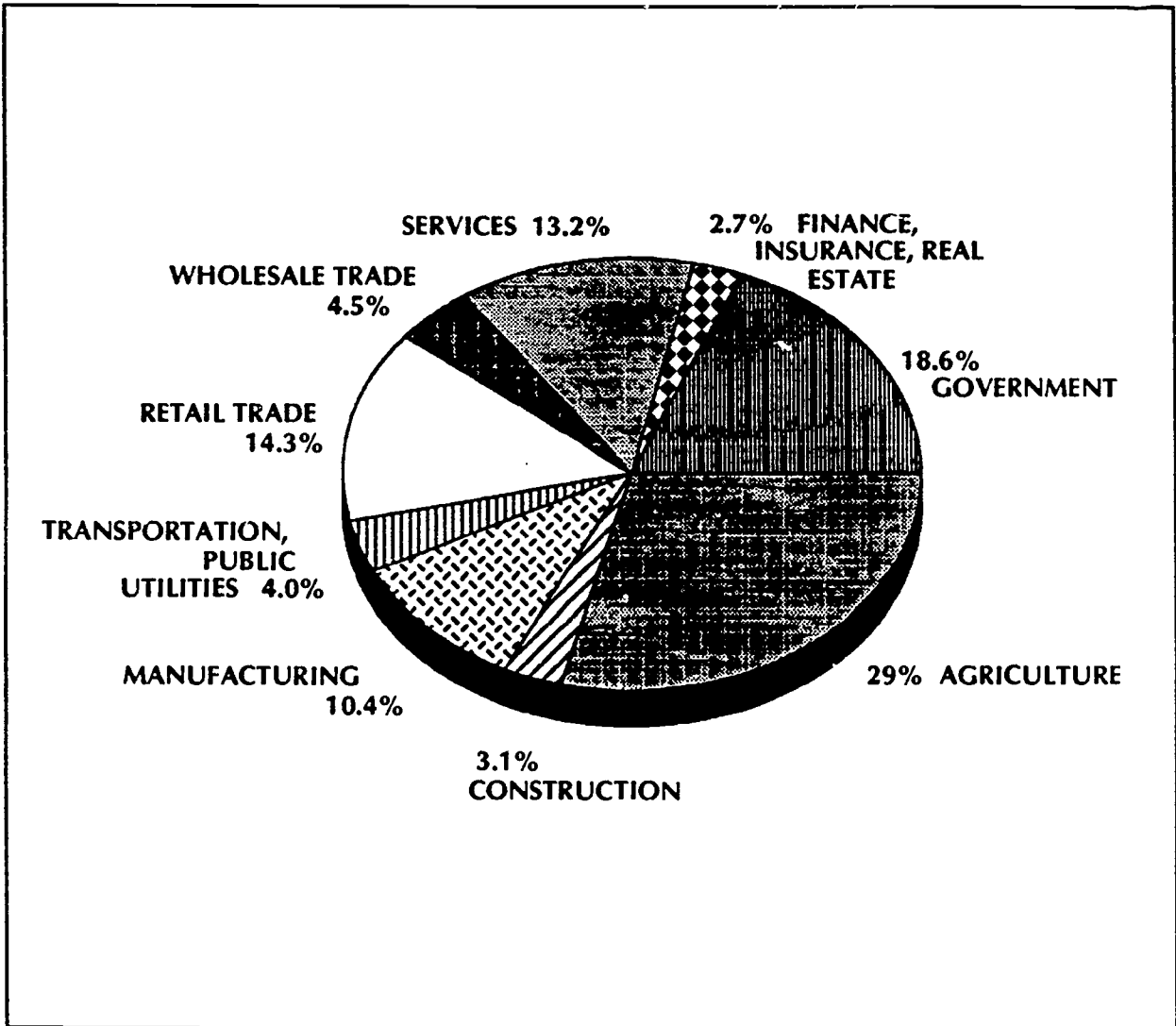
The population for the purposes of this survey included in general, employers from Fresno on the north to Bakersfield on the south; however, only selected large employers were surveyed outside of the fifteen mile radius from the center of the city of Porterville. The survey also concentrated in Tulare County, but the selected survey also took in parts of Kern County in which Bakersfield resides and parts of Fresno County in which Fresno resides. An elaboration of the survey boundaries can be found in the procedures section of this report.

The California Employment Development Department estimated that there are 112,250 industries and 138,000 people in the labor force in Tulare County. Unemployment varies but averages at approximately 10.6 percent. Tulare County's economic climate is expected to exhibit moderate growth through the 1990s.

Agriculture continues to be the county's employment leader with approximately 30,000 to 34,000 employees the number varies with the harvest. Agriculture represents 29 percent of the jobs by industry division (see Appendix B).

Government has consistently been the second largest employer in Tulare County with approximately 20,000 jobs. Federal employees account for 1,325 jobs with most of the employment in the Sequoia National Park.

A breakdown of county jobs by industrial division is outlined on the following page.



PROCEDURES

The purpose of this study is to determine the needs of employers in the Porterville College service area. To achieve this purpose, a survey of the employment community was undertaken. The Dean of Instruction requested help from an outside consultant to determine the employment needs and match those needs to existing, modified, or new programs at Porterville College. The plan was presented to the Porterville College Community Advisory Committee in June 1990, and was initiated by the survey committee composed of the following members: Mr. Richard Whiteman, consultant member; Mr. Bob Ross, Associate Dean of Vocational Education; Dr. Ed Muraski, Dean of Instruction, Porterville College. The project consultant, Mr. Richard Whiteman, was asked to supervise the research and follow up individually with employers to secure additional in-depth data and validate the survey results.

The survey instrument in Appendix C consists of two parts plus the cover letter. The survey model was designed from two previous needs assessment surveys undertaken by Dr. Ed J. Muraski, the Dean of Instruction at Porterville College. The original survey used sound statistical foundations and was monitored by two research specialists throughout the development. The same model and questionnaire format were duplicated here.

Part one requests general information about the employer and asks the employer to list specific job titles of positions in the company. Part one also requests that the respondent list the number presently employed and gives the projected change in the next five years.

Part one identifies the respondent and verifies the total number of employees or positions in the company. This verification helps the evaluator determine the potential growth in that company and what occupations or job titles will be the most demanded.

The second part contains a list of job titles. This list was developed by combining all existing occupational education programs offered by Porterville College and those occupations that are being considered by the college.

The survey questionnaire was field tested by being administered to members of the Title III Community Advisory Committee. The successful field tests provided positive results and permitted input for the overall survey input. During a field test by the advisory committee, the members were given the opportunity to add additional program areas or job titles as they saw a need. In addition the employer was requested to list any other occupational program needs. Those program needs written in will be discussed later in this study.

Based on statistical averages, a random sampling of three hundred (300) of the businesses and industries in Tulare County would constitute a valid survey with a fifteen percent (15 percent) response. Based on the desire to stratify the response by the author, it was decided to survey approximately five hundred (500). Upon the completion of stratification, a total of five hundred and ninety-three (593) employers received survey questionnaires.

The first stratification came from the distribution of industrial divisions provided by the California Employment Development Department (E.D.D.). The vocational programs currently being offered through programs at Porterville College and those programs the college considered or had been asked to review made up the list on the survey form. These programs or job titles were then listed under the Industrial Division outlined on the previous page. The percentages listed, such as agriculture, determined the number of survey questionnaires sent out in that specific area. Therefore, twenty-nine percent of the questionnaires were sent to agriculture businesses and industries, because agriculture represents twenty-nine percent of the jobs listed under the Industrial Division by E.D.D.

The second stratification came from the desire to send no less than five (5) questionnaires to any one job title or occupational area. The follow up continued until we obtained input from at least three (3) employers from each job title area. Fifteen (15) larger employers outside the immediate area in or near Fresno and Bakersfield were added to the survey population. These large employers employ a number of the job titles on our survey form, and they are companies that employ a percentage of our graduates. The addition of these large employers provided an overlap of job titles and provided more than the required three (3) from each job title.

In addition to the list of employers discussed, the Porterville Chamber of Commerce provided a list of thirty-seven (37) of the largest employers in the area (Appendix D). This list was part of the survey population. All members of the list of 15 large employers, and the 37 Porterville Chamber employers received a survey form. The survey instrument, as previously discussed and exhibited in Appendix B, was mailed to the 593 employers inclusive of all of the employers discussed.

The Pacific Bell Telephone Company indicated that about ninety-five percent of all employers in the Porterville region are listed in the phone book. The occupations/job titles were cut from the phone book and posted on a page corresponding with the job title/occupational area they represented. Duplications were eliminated and an employer was only listed once in the area determined appropriate; for example, a machining company that also hired managers for departments would probably remain listed under the machining job title program. The author reviewed the distribution selection to assure that no single job title was listed with less than five (5) different employees. This assured an adequate return to satisfy a representative sampling. In following up on the returns, all efforts were made to obtain at least three (3) responses for each job title. With the high percentage of return from the large employers, most job titles/occupations were covered by more than four employers; therefore, more than three (3) were included in the survey. A total listing of all employers selected to participate in the study is listed in Appendix E.

LIMITATIONS

Any limitation which became apparent during the course of the project were investigated to the extent possible. Whenever possible, modifications were made; however, some factors could not be controlled by the research study. They are as follows:

1. Six employers checked more areas of interest and need than their company can hire or will hire in the future according to their company data on the front side of the survey. The combination of charts is designed to correct this discrepancy; however, in these cases, we called the employers and revised their survey forms according to our discussion with them. It's possible others fell into this category also.
2. The employers were asked to rank the occupations of interest and rank their priority either one, two or three. This was structured to encourage the employer to place some thought into that selection; however, the significance of that priority listing does not seem to have any meaning to our data findings. A ranking of interest of a one (1) or two (2) was rated as interest. A ranking of three (3) was considered as non-interest.
3. This survey represents a sample of the employers. If the employer indicates a need for a total of ten (10) welders, the significance of ten (10) is meaningless. The survey did not survey the total employers who hire welders. Only the priorities listed can be of some meaning for planning purposes. In order to use the raw score, all employers must be sampled.

NEED FOR FURTHER STUDIES

A comprehensive master plan calls for several components. This study satisfies a major part, but further studies will need to follow and they are listed below:

1. A study must be undertaken to analyze the interest of students in academic programs.
2. Some data needs to be compiled to determine the number of students who remain in Porterville and how many leave the area.
3. A composite report needs to be assembled which brings to bear all data needed for educational planning.
4. Data must be compiled to determine the increase in high school enrollments and what impact that may have on the college.
5. Since the instrument and process have been developed, it would be wise to resample Porterville in five years.

FINDINGS

From past experience in conducting surveys of this nature, a forty-five percent (45 percent) return is much higher than average. The norm for research surveys expects a fifteen percent (15 percent) return and indicates that twenty to twenty-five percent (20-25 percent) is an above average return for these surveys. That percentage for the Porterville community survey becomes even more significant when you analyze that the majority of the population surveyed is small businesses. Large businesses have a staff to respond to surveys while small companies do not. The community is to be commended for their efforts.

Some of the information obtained was evident from experience in projecting employment needs. The General Occupation Education Advisory Committees for Porterville College also confirmed several findings this study generated. This report attempts to bring together all the data into a logical and meaningful statistical report for planning vocational education needs at Porterville College.

Table One (1) on the following page lists all of the occupational program job titles in the rank order of most responses to least responses. Using the second page of the survey, the counted responses rated as two (2) or three (3) only. A low one (1) response was not counted. This gave us the total responses for the two hundred and sixty-seven (267) employers who returned the questionnaire. About ten (10) of the respondents checked almost all the responses and we called these employers to help them understand the survey and to correct their responses based on the new input.

Table Two (2) lists the same respondents broken down into those employers with greater than 100 employees and those employers with fewer than 5 employees. This combined data are listed on one page to compare the differences.

Table Three (3) takes the top quartile from the combined data from Table 2 and shows which job title listings are significantly different.

Table Four (4) gives the size of employers responding to the survey. This table shows eighty-three (83) companies with five or fewer employees. From the information given on Table Three, we are able to determine the number of employees needed from those companies with five employees or less. As an example, real estate sales was an occupation in the upper quartile of those employers with five or fewer employees but was not in high demand for those employers with one hundred or more employees.

The survey does not validate the number of employees needed in real estate. These numbers do not represent the total number of employees needed in the county, nor should it be construed to represent that. The need for real estate employees, similar to other occupational needs that may surface from the survey, requires additional investigation. You are reminded this is a sampling. Employers have identified themselves for the survey which can be followed up for further validation.

The combination of the data using Table Two (2) and Three (3) equates to a short list of occupational needs common to both lists as follows:

- Accounting/Bookkeeping
- Business Manager and Manager Supervisor
- Business General/Administration
- Computer Science
- Computer-Assisted Drafting/Design
- Machinist

Employers filling out the questionnaires were given the opportunity to list additional occupations or job titles that had a significant need. When employers take the time to list additional "write-in" occupations, that list becomes significant when validated by several employers. (See Table 5.) The top five "write-in" occupations or job titles listed on the survey and identified by the employers with the highest need are as follows:

Sixty-five occupations are listed on the survey instrument in Appendix B. If you divide that into fourths, a quartile or one-fourth, would represent sixteen. If you add secretary, LVN to RN and food service worker, that brings the total to sixty-five. By combining the top two quartiles of Table One in ranked order, and adding the top quartile of the list of additional occupations identified by employers in Table Five, we can develop a composite summary of the survey results. This list is identified as Table Six. Table Six would represent the top quartile of employment needs in this survey.

Table Six represents the occupations that have the highest need. These are the occupations that Porterville College should make an effort in which to provide vocational education. It seems valid to conclude that Table Six represents the occupations needed most by the employers responding to the survey instruments.

After correlating and combining all data for validity, the occupations/job titles with the apparent highest demand in Tulare county can be found on Table Six. Although some employers' needs may have been missed, in general, the majority of the employers in the Porterville region have submitted data which points out the need for employees who have skills and/or experience related to the occupations/job titles on Table Six. These data will be further analyzed to determine their need based on placement of students, success on the job, etc.

All the occupations in the top quartile are offered at Porterville College except computer assisted drafting, maintenance mechanic, RN (nursing), machinist and human services technician.

The closer to the top of the survey results we analyze, the more accurate our research becomes. Table 7 represents the top ten % of the survey responses and the top ten percent of the write-in list (ten percent of 65 = 7 and ten percent of 27 = 3). The list of occupations in Table 7 indicates the highest priority occupational needs of the Porterville community. This list is only a guide for the college to consider when reviewing the existing occupational programs.

The educational agencies in the county may wish to look at the top two quartiles and top "write-ins" and plan programs that provide skilled employees to meet those needs. The employers, on the other hand, must collaborate with the educational agencies

to assist them in meeting these needs. Occupational education at Porterville College will need additional financing, human resources, equipment and facilities to meet these additional training needs.

As mentioned, all the occupations/job titles listed on Table Six are presently being offered by the college, except for five; however, an LVN to RN program has been linked to Bakersfield College and offered at Porterville College in the past. Computer Assisted Drafting (C.A.D.) will be added to the existing drafting program next year in the secondary effects under the building plan. The Human Services Technician Program is currently being developed by the Health Occupations Program at Porterville College. Machinist and maintenance technician will be studied in depth to determine industry needs

New buildings planned for Porterville College could house some of the needed programs in cooperation with and coupled with a Work Experience Program in the community. Other program needs may be addressed by adding courses to existing curriculum which is being done with the Human Services Technician Program. This always requires coordination between the divisions and an ad hoc advisory committee from business and industry.

Many of those companies surveyed needed educated clerk/secretary and agriculture/business employees. The farm worker needs may be addressed under a state program titled H-2A, that brings temporary alien farmworkers into the state when needed. Programs such as H-2A should be reviewed by the college and city as potential for further training in ESL and basic skills.

Porterville College today is not equipped to meet all of these needs. This study should be helpful in prioritizing these needs.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION

This survey was undertaken before the devastating freeze and continued drought which has impacted the employment area substantially. In recent months, the college and educational agencies have also been affected by the state's downward turn in the economy. Although these events will impact the community and college and impact further needs and plans, the college and the community are both experiencing positive change and growth. The college's new building program and the college's award of five-year funding under Title III will enable the college to continue with its plan for the future.

The survey return percentage is significantly high and allows the authors to use the results to make accurate predictions which will help Porterville College plan for the future.

Agriculture is the leader in employment as illustrated in Appendix C. However, California Employment Development Department research states that by 1992 the water shortage is expected to be acute, so the number of farm workers may decrease.

The completion of this needs assessment survey highlighted a need for expanded economic development efforts. The city of Porterville and the surrounding community will continue to grow. The data show Porterville to have experienced a 46.4 percent growth in the last ten years with a 6.9 percent change for 1989-90. The population growth will stimulate more opportunity for new businesses to enter the area, while encouraging existing businesses to modify their products or methods to keep up with competition.

The college finds itself in a fortunate position to join with the city and community in a new plan for economic development. President, Dr. Paul Alcantra, has presented to the city of Porterville a new building concept for the college. Plans for the college's remodeling program were presented to the Community Advisory Committee in June 1990 and, subsequently, to the city news media and the city planning consultants in March of 1991. Porterville College's building plans will house some modified and new programs to meet the community's growing needs.

Several industries and businesses are showing growth as indicated by the study. New to the Porterville region is Walmart, a large distributor of household needs. Walmart will be one of the largest employers in the area with an estimate of 500 to 1200 employees over the next year. The college and the city will be assisting this company and others as the city and community progresses into the year 2000 when the projected labor force is expected to exceed 150,000 for Tulare County.

The unemployment average is 10.3 percent and is expected to remain consistent even with the labor force growth. This group of unemployed will require educational and vocational training to make them competitive. The college can focus its assessment and counseling skills towards meeting their needs and place each individual into an educational plan.

After correlating and combining all data for validity, the occupations with the highest demand in the Porterville College community can be found on Table 6. A significant number of selected respondent employers in the community have submitted data which points to the need for employees to have skills and/or experience related to the occupations on Table 6.

The consultant, Dick Whiteman, recommended Porterville College look carefully at the needs for maintenance technician, small business, agri-mechanic, and LVN to RN. The consultant expressed concern about agriculture and machinist. He noted these programs in community colleges are closing throughout the state due to lack of student interest. Both agriculture and machining are expensive programs to start and maintain. He also noted these programs are provided at both colleges on each side of us and felt it would be unwise to compete with them for students in questionable program areas.

Mr. Whiteman suggested we look for state funding to address the maintenance tech program needs. This program could bring in the environmental technician and electronic technician needs as well.

All of the occupations in the top quartile are offered at Porterville College or will be offered in the next two years except for maintenance mechanic and machinist/machine tool operator. The educational agencies in the area should look at the top two quartiles and plan programs which provide skilled employees to meet those needs.

The employers, on the other hand, must collaborate with the educational agencies to assist them in meeting these needs. Occupational education at Porterville College may need additional financing, human resources, equipment and facilities to provide the additional training suggested by this study.

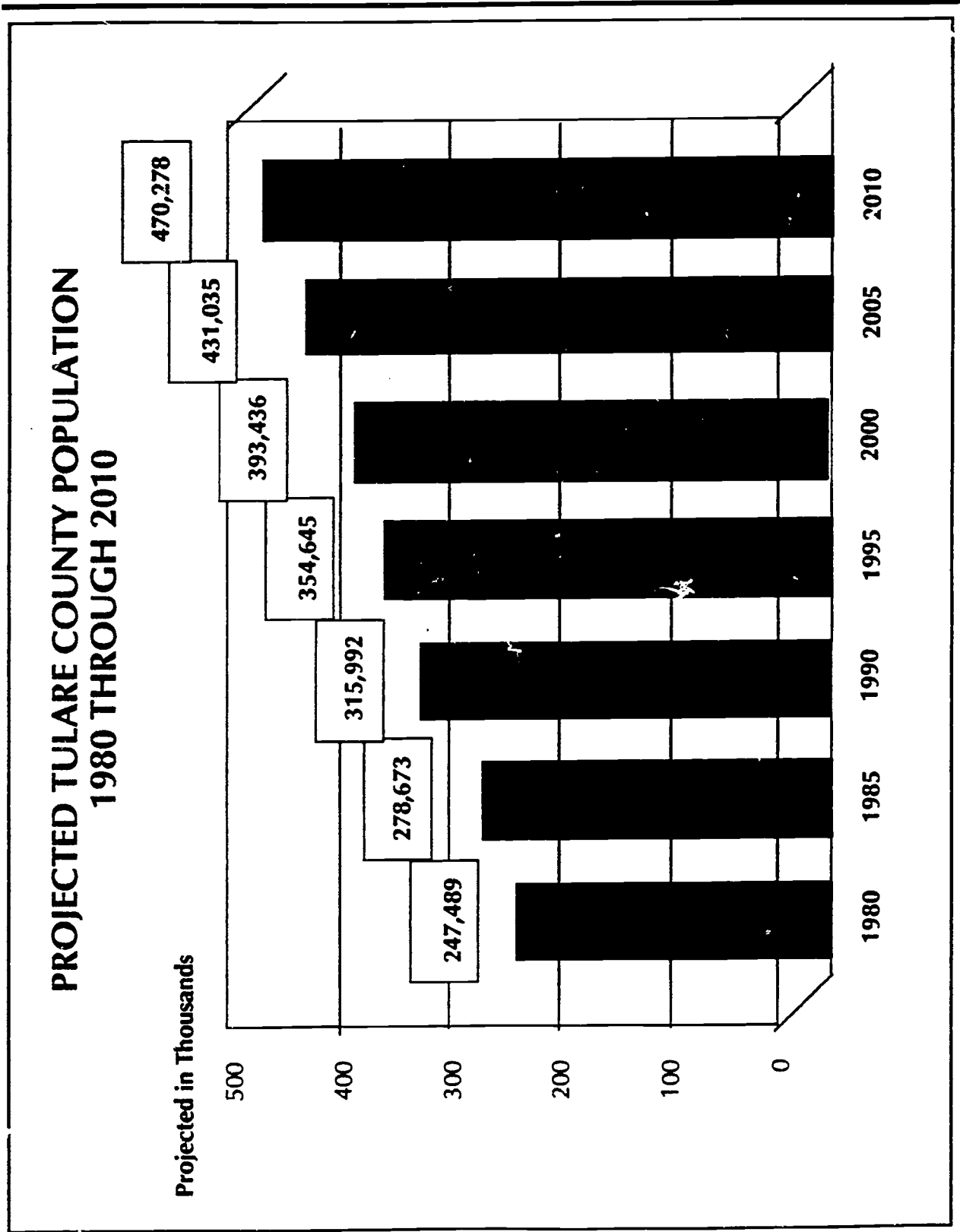
As mentioned, all of the occupations listed on Table 6 are presently being offered by the college except for two; however, the number of skilled graduates completing programs each year in several programs are minute. Consideration of these constraints must be studied.

As the college and community begin to plan for the future, the needs of the employment community outlined in this study will be seriously considered and addressed.
