ABSTRACT

This report provides enrollment data for Colorado public postsecondary educational institutions, independent (private, non-profit) institutions, proprietary institutions, and the United States Air Force Academy, for 1992 and compares these figures to those of recent years (since at least 1988). Enrollment is reported by headcount (the actual number of students who enrolled, regardless of the number of classes in which they enrolled), and by full-time equivalent (FTE--a calculation of the total number of student credit hours divided by the number of hours equivalent to a full-time student courseload). Enrollment is also reported by individual institution, by governing board, and by type of institution. And finally, FTE enrollment is reported by in-state, out-of-state, and by undergraduate and graduate level of instruction. Reported data are derived from annual institutional reports to the Colorado Commission on Higher Education, and the National Center for Educational Statistics. (GLR)

INTRODUCTION

This report provides enrollment data for Colorado public postsecondary institutions, independent (private, non-profit) institutions, proprietary institutions, and the United States Air Force Academy, since at least 1988. Enrollment is reported by headcount (the actual number of students who enrolled, regardless of the number of classes in which they enrolled), and by full-time equivalent (FTE--a calculation of the total number of student credit hours divided by the number of hours equivalent to a full-time student courseload). Enrollment is also reported by individual institution, by governing board, and by type of institution. And finally, FTE enrollment is reported by in-state, out-of-state, and by undergraduate and graduate level of instruction.

Reported data are derived from annual institutional reports to the Colorado Commission on Higher Education (CCHE), and the National Center for Educational Statistics.




1992 FALL HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT

Public Postsecondary Institutions

Fall headcount enrollment at the 29 Colorado public postsecondary institutions is 182,277, an increase of 2.0% over fall 1991. Headcount enrollment at the public institutions has increased each year since 1988. This year's rate of growth is the lowest of the last four years. Figure 1 shows the enrollment change since 1988.

Twenty-one of the institutions increased enrollment. Increases ranged from +0.4% at Fort Lewis College and Front Range Community College, to +24.5% at Lamar Community College. While the largest percentage increases since 1988 occurred at community colleges as a whole, the 1992 Colorado School of Mines enrollment increased by 11.6% over the previous year.

Eight of the public institutions had enrollment declines ranging from -0.2% at Metropolitan State College of Denver, to -6.4% at Otero Junior College. Table 1 displays the number of students enrolled at each institution, as of the institution's fall census date (usually October 15).



The pharmacy program was transferred from the University of Colorado at Boulder to University of Colorado - Health Sciences Center in 1991.

Figure 2 displays the distribution of headcount enrollment by institutional type¹ for the public institutions. Between 1988 and 1992, the community college enrollment share increased while the other two sectors decreased. In 1989, the community college share exceeded the universities and colleges share for the first time. Between 1989 and 1991, the distribution between the three sectors has remained fairly constant. This year, however, the community college share increased while the other sectors share dropped.

When interpreting headcount data, it is important to note that institutions report enrollment to CCHE early in the academic term. For example, community colleges offer many courses that start after the reporting date or are open to enrollment throughout the term. These institutions will have a higher headcount at the end of the fall term. Since the data is collected at the same time each year, however, multi-year comparisons are a good indicator of enrollment trends.

<u>Community Colleges</u>, consisting of the CCCOES institutions and the local district community colleges.



Research Universities/Specialized Medical, consisting of the Colorado School of Mines, Colorado State University, Colorado State University - Professional Veterinary Medicine school, University of Colorado at Boulder, and University of Colorado - Health Sciences Center.

<u>Universities and Colleges</u>, consisting of all other public four-year institutions in the state; and

Independent (private, nonprofit) Postsecondary Institutions

Fall 1992 enrollment at each of the three Colorado independent institutions increased. Regis University had the highest increase, 6.2%. Enrollment at The Colorado College has not changed significantly since 1987. The United States Air Force Academy enrollment decreased by 2.4%. That trend is expected to continue as the military academies adjust to the decrease in military forces.

Area Vocational Schools and Proprietary Postsecondary Institutions

The Commission also collects data from six public area vocational schools and a number of proprietary institutions in Colorado. These institutions provide varied programs, including certificates through master's and first-professional degrees, and annually report enrollment data to CCHE and the National Center for Education Statistics through the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) survey. The six area vocational schools reported fall 1991 enrollment of 10,245. 127 of the 203 Colorado proprietary institutions surveyed responded and reported enrollment of 21,659. Their enrollment ranged from 3 to 1,406 students. While enrollment information about these institutions is limited, it is important to note the service they are providing to a large number of individuals.

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) STUDENTS

The public institutions also report the number of student credit hours taken by those students reported on the opening fall headcount report. The fall data are used to estimate full-time equivalent (FTE) student enrollment for the current fiscal year. Since FTE is used in the budget process, an early indication of the total enrollment for 1992-93 is useful in evaluating budgetary impact.

In-State Full-Time Equivalent Enrollment

1992-93 in-state FTE enrollment is projected to increase to 117,220, 1.8% over 1991-92 enrollment. This increase continues a trend that began in 1986-87 (Figure 3). The 1992-93 enrollment level will be the highest ever. Tables 2 and 2A provide in-state FTE student data for all public institutions from 1983-84 to 1992-93 (Estimated). These tables provide the actual level and percent change by institution and summary group.

In the four-year sector, 7 of 13 institutions have increasing enrollment, while 13 of the 15 two-year institutions are increasing. The largest percentage increases are occurring in the two-year sector, and are occurring in both rural and urban community colleges. In the four-year sector, the Colorado School of Mines is increasing at the highest rate (6.7%). Overall, growth in the four-year sector is below recent trends. In fact, the decreases at the University of Colorado - Boulder and the University of Colorado - Colorado Springs are the first since 1985-86.

Enrollment by Summary Group

Enrollment increased in 5 of the 7 summary groups (board/local district). The Colorado Community College and Occupational Education System (CCCOES) and the Trustees of the Colorado School of Mines are expected to increase at the highest rates, 7.7% and 6.7%, respectively. The CCCOES increases have generally been higher than the other groups since 1986-87. Enrollment at the Regents of the University of Colorado and Board of Trustees of the University of Northern Colorado institutions are expected to decline slightly this year.



Enrollment by Institutional Type

In FTE (a calculation of the total number of student credit hours divided by the number of hours equivalent to a full-time student courseload), the universities and colleges are projected to have the largest share of enrollment, 38.3%, compared to the community colleges, 34.8%, and the research universities/specialized medical institutions¹, 26.9% for 1992-93. This contrasts with enrollment by headcount, in which the community colleges share of enrollment exceeds that of both other sectors (figure 2). Since 1987-88, the community colleges share of enrollment has increased. In 1988-89, the community colleges share exceeded the research universities/specialized medical share for the first time.

Out-of-State Full-Time Equivalent Enrollment

Out-of-state FTE increased each year since 1986-87. This trend is the reverse of the changes that occurred during the early 1980's (Figure 5). The 1992-93 level is expected to increase 7.3% to 21,270. This is the highest actual level and the second highest percent increase of the last ten years. Tables 3 and 3A provide out-of-state FTE student data for all public institutions from 1983-84 to 1992-93 (Estimated). These tables provide the actual level and percent change by institution and summary group.

Out-of-state enrollment is increasing at 11 of 13 four-year and 12 of 15 two-year institutions. The out-of-state enrollment rate of growth is over four times the in-state percent increase.

While the out-of-state enrollment is a small part of community colleges total enrollment, community colleges have experienced significant increases over the last four years. The 1992-93 community college enrollment is the highest level and percent increase of the last ten years.

Enrollment by Summary Group

All summary groups (board/local district) are experiencing out-of-state enrollment growth this year. The largest increase is expected at the Colorado Community College and Occupational Educational System institutions, up 24.4%, followed by the 18.1% increase at the Colorado School of Mines.



Enrollment by Institutional Type

In 1992-93, the research universities/specialized medical institutions¹ accounted for the largest share of out-of-state enrollment, 63.8%, compared to the universities and colleges, 24.3%, and the community colleges, 11.9%. During the first part of the 1980's, the research universities/specialized medical institutions increased their out-of-state share. Since 1987-88, however, that share has dropped, while the community college share has increased. Figure 6 shows the distribution of out-of-state FTE by institutional type for ten years.

Total Full-Time Equivalent Enrollment

Total FTE enrollment is projected to increase at 20 of 28 public postsecondary institutions during 1992-93. Increases range from +0.7% at Colorado State University - E&G and Trinidad State Junior College to 25.0% at Morgan Community College. The largest increases are occurring in the two-year sector. Tables 4 and 4A provide total FTE student data for all public institutions from 1983-84 to 1992-93 (Estimated). These tables provide the actual level and percent change by institution and summary group.

Total FTE enrollment, which generally decreased during the first part of the decade, has increased each year since 1985-86, reaching new records every year since 1988-89 (Figure 7). While the 1992-93 rate of increase for total enrollment is above the 1991-92 rate, it is below the increases experienced between 1987-88 and 1990-91.

Enrollment by Summary Group

Total FTE enrollment at 5 of the 7 summary groups (board/local district) is up from last year. The largest increase was 10.4% at the Colorado School of Mines, followed by the Colorado Community Colleges and Occupational Education System increase of 8.5%. The Regents of the University of Colorado and the Board of Trustees of University of Northern Colorado are expecting slight decreases.

Total Full-Time Equivalent Enrollment by Student Level

In 1991-92, 15.2% of the enrollment at the 10 institutions offering graduate level instruction during the last ten years was at the graduate level. Overall, the graduate share has not changed significantly during that period. The graduate share has ranged from a low of 14.0% in 1982-83 to a high of 16.0% in 1986-87. Tables 5 and 5A provide 1982-83 to 1991-92 total FTE student data by graduate and undergraduate level. Figure 8 displays the 1991-92 distribution of that data.

The University of Colorado at Denver has the highest percentage of graduate level FTE, 33.7%, followed by the Colorado School of Mines, 23.1%. The graduate share of FTE for both of those institutions has been increasing during the 1980's. The University of Southern Colorado had the lowest graduate share percentage at 1.6%. The graduate share of the University of Southern Colorado's enrollment increased during the first part of the decade, but has dropped in recent years.

Western State College has phased out its graduate programs, and currently does not offer graduate level instruction. The Colorado State University - Professional Veterinary Medicine only offers graduate level instruction.



Special Funded Full-Time Equivalent Enrollment

In addition to standard resident instruction credit hours, a number of special programs created by the legislature and the Commission receive general fund support. Some of these programs have a long history, such as vestibule labs. A number of them, however, have only been recently established. Data in Table 6 are included in the Tables 2 and 4. Since each of these programs has an effect on the distribution of state funds, the data are identified separately here to provide an understanding of the potential impact of these programs.

While the basic skills courses have been offered and state-funded for many years, collection of separately identifiable basic skill data was begun in 1989-90. In 1991-92, the programs listed in Table 6 produced a total of 7,462 FTE or 6.5% of the total in-state FTE generated that year. A modification of the vestibule labs definition to better clarify the intention of those labs may have caused the drop in the vestibule lab FTE claimed for state-funding.

It is designed to offer spot remediation to bridge the gap between high school and college, and is only funded at community colleges, Adams State College, and Mesa State College.
