ABSTRACT

This directory identifies 254 Community and Migrant Health Centers (C/MHC) and Health Care for the Homeless (HCH) programs in 10 regions of the United States that, in response to local requests and with mostly local resources, developed either school-based or school-linked health programs. Each listing provides information under the following headings: address, contact, type of program, health care and other services provided, service providers, relation to Head Start, non 329/330/340 funding sources, problems encountered, program history, and plan for the next 2-5 years. Two appendixes provide a list of persons on the Bureau of Primary Health Care workgroup on school health and an address list of Ready-To-Learn School Health Program Conference Speakers. (AMH)

FOREWORD

School Health Primary Care Programs

While evaluations of school health programs are limited, there is mounting evidence that they are a highly effective way of addressing a host of inter-related problems that prevent children from reaching their full potential.

Many children, especially those who live in poverty, have health and health-related problems that compromise their ability to learn in school. They are exposed to environments that do not foster healthy decisions about school or lifestyle. For these children, the decreased ability to learn in school can set off a series of events which lead to and perpetuate the cycle of poverty.

School health primary care programs can improve the health status of children by the prevention, early detection, and prompt intervention of health and related conditions, thereby reducing absenteeism and increasing participation in school activities.

They can also foster an interest in health as a foundation to build self-esteem and personal responsibility. An indirect result may also be an interest in health as a career choice and a goal for the future.

The Bureau of Primary Health Care

The Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC) is located in the Health Services and Resources Administration (HRSA), one of eight agencies of the Public Health Service (PHS) within the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). BPHC's mission is to provide support for high quality, community-based systems of care that increase access to primary health care for underserved populations.

As the Federal focal point for the delivery of primary health care services to poor and underserved populations, BPHC programs provide care for 7.3 million people. This is done through the development and expansion of primary care systems such as community and migrant health centers (C/MHC), health care for the homeless (HCH) programs, primary care in public housing programs, as well as through the National Health Service Corps placement of primary care providers in underserved areas.

BPHC programs also target the primary care health needs of special populations such as high-risk pregnant women and children, substance abusers, and people with HIV/AIDS.

Community and Migrant Health Centers, Health Care for the Homeless Programs, and School Health Programs

BPHC programs are targeted at the highest risk populations whose multiple health and social problems require carefully designed and coordinated comprehensive care. They face emerging health care problems, such as drug resistant tuberculosis and gaps in immunization, while offering high quality, family-oriented, and case-managed care.

C/MHC and HCH programs are ideally suited to collaborate with local schools and school districts to provide school health services. They offer an already established system of comprehensive primary care services, including case management and referrals, that are tailored to the needs of the community's most vulnerable populations. By forging collaborative relationships with the schools, the C/MHC



and the HCH programs are fulfilling their mandate to the underserved by expanding their delivery sites to include schools and are responding to local requests for school health services.

The advantages to a school system are both programmatic and financial. Schools have the advantage of utilizing highly trained health professionals who are already in a delivery system with a network of health and social services referral arrangements. The programs are staffed by highly skilled people with expertise in areas such as medical records and health care management. The school system can take advantage of being part of a larger system that handles professional licensure, insurance, practice standards, etc.

Linking schools with C/MHC and HCH programs is advantageous for both the health centers and the schools. However, children benefit most from the linkage since they do not have to miss school to get health care and do not suffer needlessly for the lack of health care.

Development of the Directory

The Directory is part of a process that began in January 1992 to prepare for possible implementation of BPHC's Ready-To-Learn School Health Program, which was included in the Administration's FY 1993 budget. The planning included the formation of an Ad-hoc Workgroup on School Health, and four regional Ready-To-Learn School Health conferences. (Members of the Ad-hoc Workgroup and speakers at the conferences are listed.) The Directory serves as a resource to programs that are starting or expanding primary care school health programs, as well as to determine the extent of linkages between C/MHC, HCH programs, and schools.

Of the 630 C/MHC and HCH programs with over 1500 sites, we have identified 254 primary care school health programs. Every attempt was made to reach all centers to assess their involvement in school health programs.




