ABSTRACT

The 12th biennial report of the Vermont State Library, statistics of local libraries, and a directory of libraries in Vermont are presented. In the 1990-92 biennium, library services in Vermont were redefined by budget constraints and by changes in information, formats, and society. The Vermont Automated Libraries System (VALS), clearer public library missions, and stronger school libraries also contributed to a need for redefinition of service in Vermont. Operations in the areas of basic services, literacy programs for adults and children, access to information, library development, and resource sharing are outlined. Four tables present some statewide statistics. Statistics of local libraries grouped by size are presented in 17 pages of tables. The "Vermont Library Directory, 1993" lists the 505 libraries that participate in the Vermont Resource Sharing Network, which includes 212 public libraries. The directory is arranged alphabetically by township in which the library is located. Libraries are also listed by type and region, and alphabetically by name. Their symbols in the Vermont Union Catalog are listed. (SLD)

STATE LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

The 1990-92 biennium can best be described as the biennium of "R" words - Redefine, Reorganize, Rethink, Relocate ... Economic problems on both the national and state levels forced budget belt tightening in State government and made the 1990-92 biennium the most difficult in decades for the development and maintenance of statewide library services. To insure the Department of Libraries' ability to meet its State and Federal mandates, reductions were spread across the agency, forcing elimination of one program and consolidation of other programs. Reductions totaled over twenty percent of both the department's State funds and its staff. A total of 12 positions were lost, and no program was spared. The Audio-Visual Services Unit was phased out as a separate program during the biennium. With the elimination of the Assistant State Librarian's position, the remaining programs of the department were merged into a single operating division. Materials budgets were also significantly reduced along with all other expenses that were not absolutely essential.

Redefinition was not totally budget driven but was also the result of changes in information, formats and society. The Vermont Automated Libraries System (VALS) and a growing network, clearer public library missions, and stronger school libraries also contributed to a need for redefinition of all Vermont library service.

Downsizing during the 1990-92 biennium came when library service priorities were at a watershed. Traditional library services to support an increased emphasis on reading continued to be important. However, new balances had to be struck as the larger issue of "access" to all information, to all formats, and to emerging information technology brought new expectations and demands from local libraries and the public. The 1990-92 biennium brought Vermont library and information services fully into the emerging high-tech information environment of local automation electronic networks and rapid information delivery systems.

VALS

During these years of evolving technology, local librarians and the general public addressed automation and new methods of information access. The Vermont Automated Libraries System (VALS), which continued to be a national model, grew far beyond projections with the total number of participating libraries almost doubling in the two-year period. The number of public libraries with dial access rose from 67 in June, 1990, to almost 100 in June, 1992. School libraries also became active participants in this period and by 1992 80 schools were involved. A major step forward in summer, 1990, was opening VALS to the general public for searching library and State government information databases from home or office.

Despite budget restrictions, the past two years have been productive ones for VALS. Additional library databases improved resource sharing among libraries statewide and expanded access for Vermonters. In particular, PUBCAT, a database of the holdings of 100 public libraries was made available in 1990. VALS continues to convince small rural libraries of the necessity of technology and also changes the way libraries of all types in Vermont communicate with each other and with the department.

100 public libraries now dial into VALS.

During the biennium VALS also became a major factor in the development of State government's efforts to improve the public access to State government information as that information was translated to electronic formats. By the end of FY92 Supreme Court opinions, bills introduced and bills passed by the legislature, the Vermont State Government Bid Information System, Vermont Secretary of State's Corporations Database, and the Agency of Human Services Information and Referral database were all available via key word, full text access from library, home, and office through VALS.

Expansion of VALS was possible only because of the cooperation of public and private institutions which often worked against tremendous odds to overcome local and institutional barriers to access for Vermonters.

BASIC SERVICES

During the past two years library services in Vermont faced new challenges of how to do more with less. The department's basic services continued in high demand. While the circulation of books increased in the first half of the biennium, the decline in the materials budget meant fewer books were purchased in the second half, causing a decline in circulation. The decline in book circulation, however, did not extend to specific requests. In FY90 the number of specific requests processed by the Department of Libraries was 115,327, an average of 461 per day. By the end of FY92 this number rose to 150,396, 602 per day.

DOL processed 150,396 requests, 602 per day, during FY92.

Children's services were also heavily utilized during these years. Statewide participation in the annual summer reading programs continued to be high and reached 150 libraries and 12,000 children each summer. Vermont children voted the Dorothy Canfield Fisher Award be conferred on Lois Lowery in 1991 and Jerry Spinelli in 1992. In addition, the annual Smith Lectures were delivered by Paula Fox in 1990 and by Brock Cole in 1991. Travelling exhibits, puppet shows, special programs and program aids also continued to be provided to local public librarians working with Vermont's children.

12,000 children participated in statewide summer reading programs each year.

Despite its decreasing size the DOL staff continued to maintain its high level of assistance to local public libraries in serving Vermonters of all ages and with a variety of needs. Regional library services were used by 85% of the 210 local public libraries compared with 95% in FY90. The Adult Services and Children's Services Consultants provided specialized services, training and resource aids on a variety of subjects and organizational problems.

The department's statewide services to Vermonters with special needs continued to be met at mandated levels with State and Federal funds. Over 208,000 special materials were circulated to over 1500 Vermonters with physical and visual disabilities compared to 138,000 items in the previous biennium. This increase in service was made possible by automation of the Special Services Unit's operations. Outreach also continued through cooperation with other state and local social agencies. Library and information services were also provided to the 13 State-supported institutions and correctional centers.

1,500 Vermonters with special needs received 208,000 materials.

LITERACY

The department turned more attention to statewide adult literacy efforts during the 1991-92 biennium when a major multi-agency initiative - Literacy 2000 - was begun to foster the ambitious goal of 100% literacy in Vermont by the turn of the century. The department actively supported the efforts of other agencies in this area and in 1992 published the Vermont Public Library Literacy Handbook to help local libraries support literacy. DOL staff also participated in planning, programming, and evaluation of projects produced by the Vermont Reading Project, the Vermont Council on the Humanities, and the Vermont Department of Education. It continued to help Vermont Reading Project develop program themes, provide in-service training for Adult Basic Education (ABE) tutors, and organize annual statewide ABE conferences. Department staff pulled together a Vermont Coalition for Family Literacy to explore ways to encourage public library collaboration in local literacy efforts. Further, DOL assisted in the development of "Beginning with Mother Goose" reading discussion programs to help new readers who are parents or caregivers of children, infant through age 3, share and nurture a love of reading with children.

C

ACCESS

The economy, the information explosion, technology, literacy issues, and the public library policies in Vermont brought about the establishment of an Access Task Force in FY90. Its charge was to re-examine the impact of existing library services on all Vermonters and to make recommendations to the State Librarian and Board of Libraries in 1992. The results of the report revolved around the emerging library issue of the 1990's - ACCESS. Access and removing barriers to access - attitudinal, physical, financial, and educational were stressed and recommendations were made to bring together the perceptions and realities of library and information services as viewed by librarians and the public. The report was subsequently supported by workshops and program aids to help the DOL and local libraries improve services in these changing times.

One major development in this area in 1991 was the establishment of a committee to review and rethink the Minimum Standards for Vermont Public Libraries in light of changing delivery systems, services, and the challenges of the looming 21st century. Implementation is scheduled for FY94-95. A second effort was to work with local libraries to improve physical accessibility and bring local public libraries into compliance with the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act. Planning for Accessibility was published and workshops offered.

Improved access to library service in several communities was supported by DOL with the award of Federal Library Services and Construction Act Title II construction and technology grants. In FY91-92 libraries in Rutland, Greensboro, Chester, and Strafford received matching funds to improve facilities and technology capabilities.

PUBLIC LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT

Public library development continued to move forward and take on new challenges in the early 90's. More libraries than ever before met the Minimum Standards for Vermont Public Libraries - 101 in FY91 and 112 in FY92. Several public libraries moved to new levels of excellence by undertaking the long range planning process, "Envisioning Excellence." Eleven libraries with their communities completed long range plans with peer review and were awarded certificates of excellence.

The rapidly changing library and information environment brought with it new concerns and challenges to Vermont's rural library community and to the department's continuing education program. While maintaining its basic skills CE offerings in traditional areas, new training opportunities were developed to help librarians and trustees deal with new, ever changing technologies, with new, non-traditional constituencies and with the elimination of barriers to services. Over 1000 participants attended the almost 100 workshops facilitated by DOL staff.

1000 librarians attended 100 DOL workshops.

RESOURCE SHARING

The information explosion and the vast number of books published in the late 1980s and 90s coupled with the new economies dictated by the recession during those years placed new emphasis on resource sharing for all types of Vermont libraries. The public-private partnerships developed by institutions in the Vermont library and information communities have allowed all Vermonters to have access to information and to the entire range of appropriate reading materials without bias due to geographic location, age, socioeconomic status, educational attainment, special need or interest.

We continue to appreciate the generosity and willingness of all Vermont libraries to work together to make Vermont's statewide resource sharing system one of the most effective in the country. The results were that in FY92 Vermonters ranked 3rd in the nation in use of available interlibrary loan services through their libraries.

The extension of VALS from 100 libraries of all types in FY90 to over 200 in FY92 significantly improved response to over 270,000 ILL requests over the period.

DOL filled 270,000 interlibrary loan requests.

Response time was reduced from two to three weeks to as little as 24-48 hours. Over ninety percent of Vermont ILL's are accomplished through electronic mail and home users can browse through over 4.5 million items and full text information online resources at home or office as well as at the library.

Access to materials outside of Vermont continued to be available to Vermont libraries through OCLC. It is interesting to note that the department continues to lend to libraries nationwide more than twice the number of materials it borrows. Statewide use of national online information, commercial databases and legal databases rose dramatically in these years as more Vermonters than ever became computer literate. Growing demand for these information services requires that Vermont libraries take measures to insure that all Vermonters have the same access to books and information as their urban and suburban counterparts.

MEMORABLE EVENTS

The 1991-92 biennium, will be remembered for the extraordinary as well as the ordinary. On March 11, 1992, the Great Flood struck Montpelier and the department's central office did suffer damages. The computer room was indeed found to be flood proof. Other areas were saved by using old catalog cards as dikes to absorb the water. Storage areas were hit hard and the staff cheerfully and purposefully spent days mucking out and disinfecting. Luck was with us and damaged materials only totalled about \$13,000.

The second event of the decade was Vermont's state participation in the Second White House Conference for Library and Information Services. Vermont chose a different road from the rest of the U. S. and mounted the program "Drowning in Information or Riding the Wave of the Future?" The effort, coordinated by the Vermont Reading Project, consisted of three-part reading discussion programs held in 20 sites and on Vermont interactive TV. The main issue and concern -- ACCESS.

The third extraordinary happening in the FY91-92 biennium was Vermont's Statehood Bicentennial. The State Librarian was on the Bicentennial Commission and actively involved in the planning and implementation of multi-year events to celebrate Vermont's past, present, and future. The department participated by assisting with an Ethan Allen reading program and also through "Celebrate Vermont," its children's summer reading program.

The Department of Libraries was also honored in June, 1992, to be chosen to host 20 librarians from 14 Third World countries as part of the USIA American Libraries Multiregional International Visitor Project. Staff took the participants to small, rural libraries and colleges to see life in Vermont and VALS in action. Evaluations showed that our visitors voted Vermont as the highlight of the trip.

All of these events brought new partnerships and new ideas to the Vermont library community.

FACING THE FUTURE

Vermont State government endured severe economic setbacks in the FY91-92 biennium. At the same time the Vermont library community faced new and complex demands for reading materials and information from Vermonters with wide-ranging interests and abilities and a world that was changing rapidly. The ability to continue to meet these new challenges brought by patron needs and new technologies was made possible by using the processes dictated by the "R" words. The Department of Libraries and many local Vermont libraries rethought missions, reallocated funds, and restructured services to meet the new and changing reading and information needs of their patrons.

I would like to thank Governor Dean and the Vermont General Assembly for their support in the department's initiatives in technology and in making State government information available to the general public. I would like also to applaud the initiatives for improving access and standards taken on by the Vermont Board of Libraries under the leadership of Al Morgan and Judy Dickson despite the difficult economic times. Further, success and maintenance of services at a high level of excellence was accomplished only because of the commitment, caring and flexibility of the dedicated department staff at a time when its numbers were declining dramatically.

The maintenance of quality library service for Vermonters statewide would not have been possible during the biennium without the dedication of those local librarians and trustees who met the challenges of balancing basic services and new technologies to insure individual needs were met. The Vermont library community showed its enthusiasm and commitment to working together to overcome barriers and complex challenges posed by the bursting information environment.

Thank you to all Vermonters and institutions, public and private, who have helped to move Vermont library services forward. The challenges will not go away but will grow exponentially in this complex world as we move forward into the middle 1990s. It will take the commitment of every citizen to make innovation and access exist along with creativity and privacy in this democratic society.

STATISTICS OF LOCAL LIBRARIES

Explanatory Notes

Public library statistics have been separated from those of other types of libraries (academic, special, hospital, school, institutional, etc.). Generally, public libraries are arranged in broad population categories using 1990 census information, and then by town with village libraries included under the incorporated town name. Because some libraries serve more than one town and some towns have more than one library, the population served does not always correspond exactly to the U.S. census for the town in which the library is located. The population given is a rough estimate of the number of people served by a given public library. The population categories are:

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING OVER 5,000 POPULATION

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING 2,501-5,000 POPULATION

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING 1,000-2,500 POPULATION

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING UNDER 1,000 POPULATION

Statistics are supplied by local libraries for the fiscal year ending before November 1, 1992; thus, many libraries' statistics are for the year ending December 31, 1991. A zero in a given column usually means that the actual number is "0," and a blank usually means that the information was not collected or supplied. For each population category, there are four charts with the following information:

General information - town name, library name, population served, whether the library meets the Minimum Standards for Vermont Public Libraries in 1993, and the number of hours open to the public in winter.

Services - volumes (books) owned, the last fiscal year's total circulation of all library materials, approximate total annual attendance (the number of people who visited for any reason), interlibrary loans received from other libraries in the past year, and the number of registered borrowers (adults and children; in many cases records are not kept).

Operating Income - the 1992 grand list (property tax valuation of the town as a whole); local tax support in the last fiscal year (may or may not include additional tax funds spent on the library's behalf but not included in the budget, e.g. snow plowing, employee benefits); total income including tax support, grant funds, gifts, trust income, local fundraising, etc.; and per capita tax support (tax support divided by the approximate population served).

Operating Expenses - expenditures during the last fiscal year on the library's collection (books, periodicals, audio-visual materials, but not supplies or equipment); salaries (but not including employee benefits or social security); total expenditures (in some cases overhead provided in-kind is not included); and collection expenditure per capita (collection expenditure divided by the approximate population served). Capital expenses are not included.

The authority used to determine what is a township is the Vermont Yearbook (National Survey, Chester, VT). A library's mailing address may be completely different from its physical location (e.g., the Northwest Regional Library is physically located in GEORGIA and is listed under that town even though its mailing address is Fairfax). Cross references are provided.

If there is more than one library located in a town, the public library (or libraries) is listed first, followed by other libraries arranged alphabetically by institution.

DIRECTORY NUMBER - will be used by the Department of Libraries News when listing changes.

TOWNSHIP - in upper case letters; villages within towns are in upper/lower case letters

NAME & ADDRESS - the word "library" has been dropped from the end of each library's name. The mailing address follows the name, and if the post office is the same as the township, it has also been dropped.

TELEPHONE NO. - unless otherwise noted, the area code is 802.

FAX - telefacsimile number, if available

USERNAME - used by libraries dialing into the Vermont Automated Libraries System (VALS).

VUC SYMBOL - The Vermont Union Catalog symbol, a short form notation on cataloging information supplied by libraries and used for interlibrary loan communication.

HOURS - generally, these apply year-round unless summer hours (usually corresponding with the school calendar) are noted. Call the library for specific dates of change between winter and summer or vacation hours.

LIBRARIAN/HOME TELEPHONE NO. - if a telephone number is given, it is usually the librarian's home number and should be used with discretion.

TRUSTEE/HOME TELEPHONE NO. - if given, the name of the last reported chairperson or president of a public library board of trustees.

REGION - refers to the Department of Libraries region in which the library is located: Midstate (M), Northeast (NE), Northwest (NW), Southeast (SE), Southwest (SW).
