ABSTRACT

This document is a guide to selected detective and mystery stories produced after the publication of the 1982 bibliography "Mysteries." All books listed are available on cassette or in braille in the network library collections provided by the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped of the Library of Congress. In addition to this large-print edition, the bibliography is available on disc and braille formats. This edition contains approximately 700 titles available on cassette and in braille, while the disc edition lists only cassettes, and the braille edition, only braille. Books available on flexible disk are cited at the end of the annotation of the cassette version. The bibliography is divided into a Prolific Authors section, for authors with more than six titles listed, and Other Authors section, a short stories section and a section for multiple authors. Each citation contains a short summary of the plot. An order form for the cited items is included. An alphabetical index is also provided. (SLD)

Introduction

More Mysteries is a guide to selected detective and mystery stories produced after the publication of the 1982 bibliography *Mysteries*. All books listed are available on cassette or in braille in the network library collections provided by the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped, Library of Congress.

This bibliography is available in large-print, disc, and braille formats. The large-print edition contains approximately 700 titles available on cassette and in braille. The disc edition lists only cassettes; the braille edition lists only braille. In the large-print and disc editions, books available on flexible disc are cited at the end of the annotation of the cassette version.

Mysteries attract a wide variety of people as readers and as writers. At the most basic level is the lure of a puzzle. Agatha Christie confessed that she enjoyed planning her mysteries much more than writing them. William Marshall has pointed out that mysteries provide the opportunity to visit various levels of society. In many other types of fiction the action takes place in a narrow social setting. An investigator, however, is free to travel through various levels of society and ask questions along the way.

In many cases the background of the author adds authenticity to the portrait. Many mystery writers have experience with police work and strive for a realistic portrait to counter the shoot-'em-up cliché. Joseph Wambaugh and Dorothy Uhnak are both former detectives. He served on the Los Angeles police force, she, on the New York City police force. P.D. James was a civil servant in the criminal department of the British Department of Home Affairs. John Mortimer

and Andrew Vachss are both lawyers; Vachss at one time was director of a maximum security institution.

Other writers turn to mysteries as a diversion from academic work. Amanda Cross, creator of Kate Fansler, the professorial amateur detective, is a professor of English literature named Carolyn Heilbrun. Ralph McInerney is a professor of medieval philosophy and Martha Grimes, of English literature. Dorothy L. Sayers's background as a medievalist showed when Lord Peter Wimsey proposed marriage in Latin at the end of *Gaudy Night*. Umberto Eco incorporates his concerns as a semiotician into the fabric of his novels. Margaret Truman was working on a book about the White House when it occurred to her that she would rather use the White House as a setting for a murder mystery.

Some authors are so prolific that their writing would have left little time for other professions. Georges Simenon and John Creasey each wrote more than 500 novels. Both used a variety of pseudonyms with Creasey creating a different name to sign to each of his detective series. Agatha Christie jokingly compared her output to that of a sausage factory.

Perhaps the most powerful draw of the mystery is the personality of the detective, whose life frequently goes on beyond that of the author. John Creasey, under the name J.J. Marric, created Inspector Gideon. Since Creasey's death a new Marric has risen to the challenge of continuing Gideon's adventures. Robert B. Parker took the four chapters that Raymond Chandler had written of *Poodle Springs* and completed the Philip Marlowe novel. Later Parker decided to write a Philip Marlowe tale of his own,

Introduction

Perchance to Dream, a sequel to *The Big Sleep*.

This bibliography is divided into three sections. The Prolific Authors section covers authors who have more than six titles listed. Titles are first separated for author, then arranged alphabetically by title under headings for cassette and braille. If an author writes about a particular detective, the name of that character is provided. In the Other Authors section, books are separated by medium, then arranged alphabetically by author. The Short Stories section is divided between collections by a single author and anthologies by multiple authors, then by medium and title. To locate books, check under the appropriate medium in either the table of contents or the alphabetical author-title index.

To order books, fill out the order form at the back of the bibliography and send it to your cooperating library. Book numbers are separated according the media. Flexible-disc numbers have a separate listing.

About the Free Reading Program

The National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped (NLS) loans books and magazines to individuals who have problems reading because of a visual or physical limitation, temporary or permanent.

Books, playback equipment, headphones, and other aids are delivered by mail. Book descriptions, catalogs, and bibliographies such as this one are also mailed regularly to inform readers of new materials available.

No postage is required to borrow or return books, equipment, and other materials, and all materials are free.

Thousands of books on discs, on cassettes, and in braille are available through a network of cooperating libraries. Fiction and nonfiction selections include classics, romances, science fiction, biographies, bestsellers, gothic novels, how-to books, and many more. Popular magazines are converted into discs and braille and mailed to subscribers directly from producers. Music services are provided directly from NLS.

Eligibility for the program is determined by the inability to see well enough to read a conventional print book or to hold a book and turn pages. Individuals wishing service need a brief statement describing their disability from a competent authority such as a medical doctor, nurse, optometrist, ophthalmologist, staff member of a health care institution, or a librarian.
