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ABSTRACT

Information about certificated personnel and their characteristics was collected from Colorado's public school districts and Boards of Cooperative Services during fall 1992. This information is presented in a series of tables, with highlights summarized in an introduction. The fall average salary for public school teachers, \$33,541, represented a small increase over the fall 1991 salary, but remained below the national average. Of the 62,785.3 certificated and non-certificated staff, 53.2 percent were classroom teachers. Pupil membership increased 3.3 percent over 1991, while classroom teachers increased by 1 percent. Females represented 71.1 percent of classroom teachers, 36.4 percent of principals, and 9.2 percent of superintendents. The number of males in teaching and administration positions declined. Black female representation declined in teaching, but increased in administration. Minorities represented 9 percent of teachers, and 25.5 percent of students. 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INTRODUCTION

Information used to prepare this publication was collected from Colorado's public school districts and Boards of Cooperative Services during fall 1992. Data were collected only for filled positions.

Many tables are similar to those published in prior years. This provides users consistency in tracking changes from year to year.

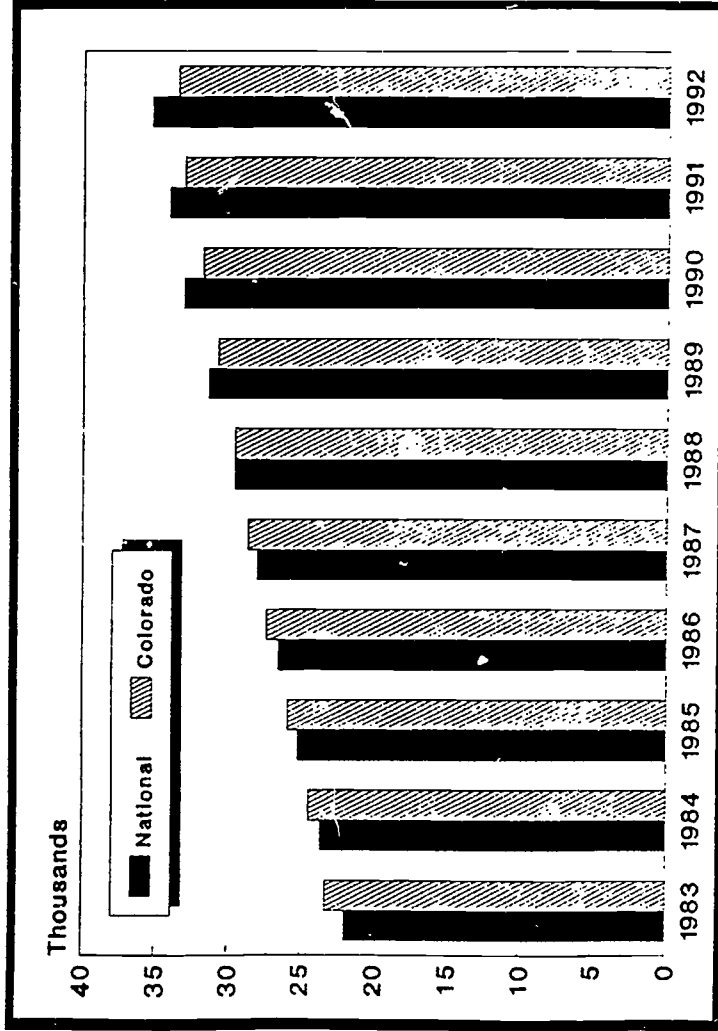
HIGHLIGHTS:

- The fall 1992 average salary for Colorado's 33,419 public school teachers was \$33,541 which represented a 1.4 percent increase over the fall 1991 average salary of \$33,072. This was the smallest increase in Colorado's average teacher salary since fall 1973. The national teachers' average salary of \$35,334 increased by 3.6 percent over the fall 1991 average salary of \$34,098. The average salary for Colorado teachers has been below the national average since fall 1988.
- Of the 62,785.3 certificated and noncertificated staff, 53.2 percent were classroom teachers.
- Classroom teachers, numbering 33,419, increased 1.0 percent over 1991 while pupil membership, numbering 612,635, increased 3.3 percent during the same period.
- In fall 1992 females represented 71.1 percent of the total number of classroom teachers, 36.4 percent of school principals and 9.2 percent of superintendents. Since 1983 the percent of females employed in certificated positions increased by 31.2 percent while the percent of males decreased by 5.2 percent. During this period the number of White and Black males in both teaching and administrative positions declined. Black female representation in teaching positions decreased by 21.7 percent, but black females increased by 115 percent, from 26 to 56, in administrative positions.
- American Indians, Asians, Blacks and Hispanics represented 9.0 percent of Colorado's teachers, while these same groups made up 25.5 percent of the total student population.
- Colorado teachers who were 40 years of age or older comprised 64.8 percent of all classroom teachers. The percentage of teachers in the under 40 age group declined by 0.9 percent while teachers in the 40 and over age group increased by 2.0 percent.
- The 1992 entry-level salary for beginning teachers in Colorado ranged from \$15,300 to \$23,920, with an average of \$19,776.

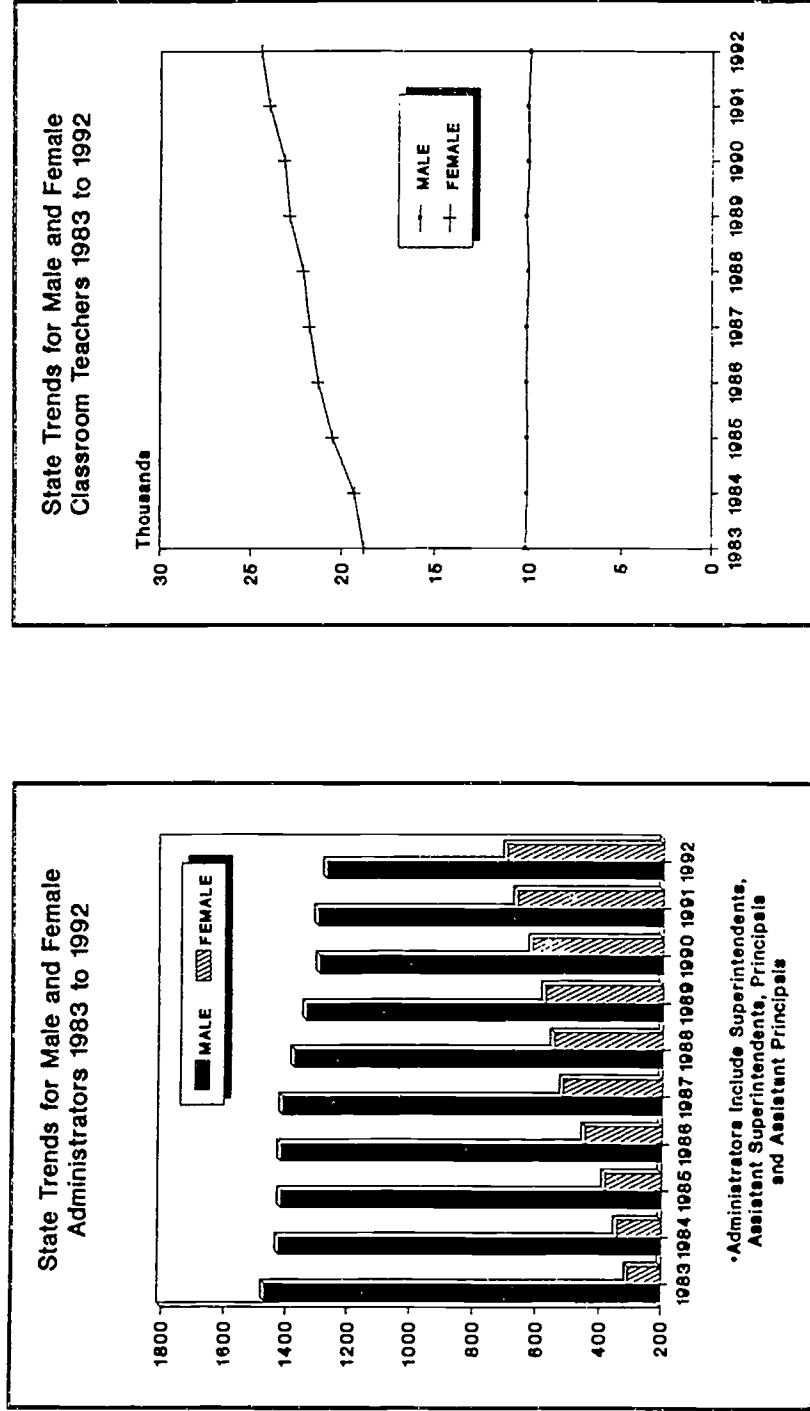

SCHOOL DISTRICT ADMINISTRATORS AND CLASSROOM TEACHERS

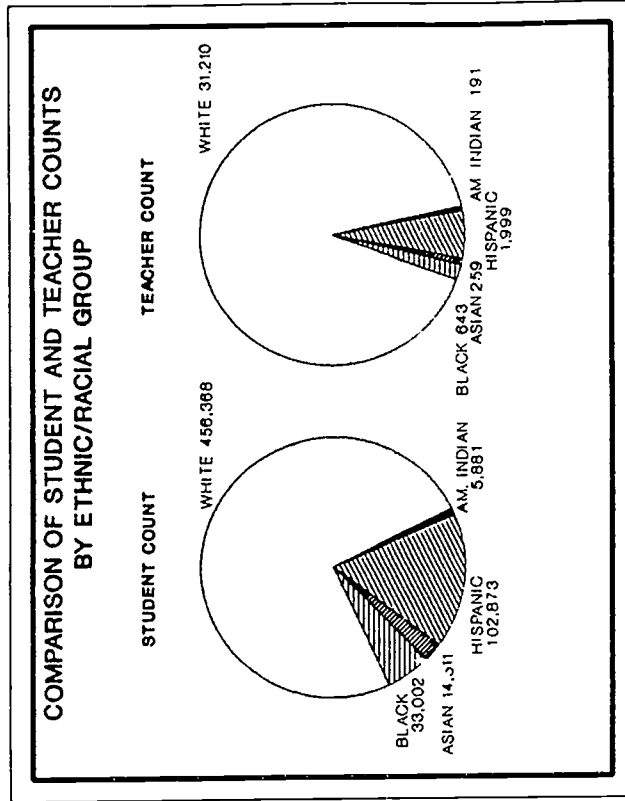
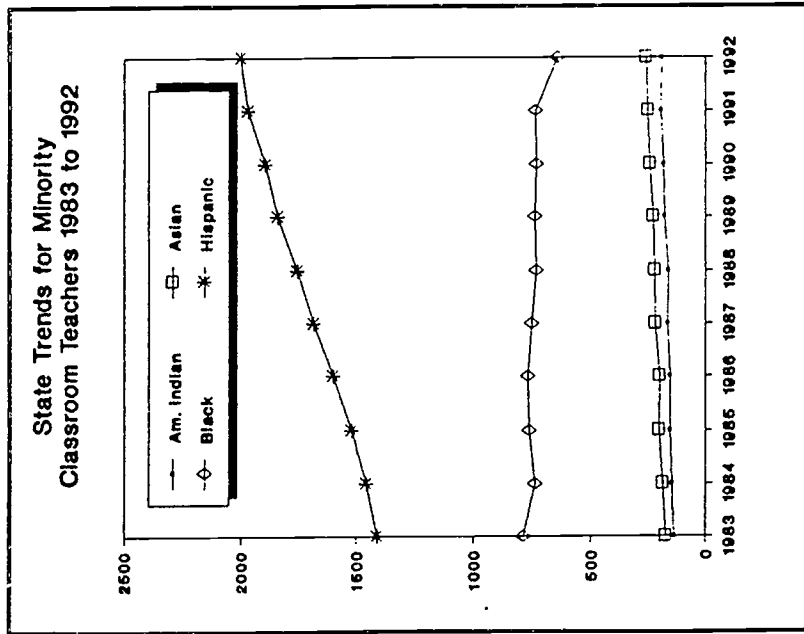


- In fall 1992, males represented 64.6 percent of Colorado's school district administrators and 28.9 percent of classroom teachers. Females represented 35.4 percent of school district administrators and 71.1 percent of classroom teachers.
- In fall 1983, males represented 82.7 percent of Colorado's school district administrators, while females accounted for 17.3 percent of that same group. Thirty-five (35.1) percent of fall 1983 classroom teachers were male and 64.9 percent were female.
- From fall 1983 to fall 1992, the number of female administrators in Colorado's school districts increased by 127 percent while the number of male administrators decreased by 13.4 percent. Although the number of females in administrative positions is steadily rising, a significant gap still exists between female and male administrators. In fall 1992, women comprised 9.2 percent of Colorado's superintendents, 16.4 percent of assistant superintendents, 36.4 percent of principals and 43.2 percent of assistant principals.

- From fall 1983 to fall 1992, Black teacher representation in Colorado decreased by 18.3 percent. Most of the decrease resulted from retirements at the Denver Public School District. During the same period the number of American Indian, Asian and Hispanic classroom teachers increased by 42.3 percent.
- In fall 1992, minorities represented 25.5% of Colorado's public school student population. In contrast, minorities represented only 9.0% of classroom teachers. White students represented 74.5% of the student population, and 91.0% of classroom teachers were White. Hispanics comprised 16.8% of the student population, yet only 5.8% of classroom teachers were Hispanic.

DEFINITIONS OF SELECTED TERMS

The following terms are defined as they generally apply in the text. Some terms are used in more than one table and may include different position categories, therefore the table in which the term is used follows the definition.

ADMINISTRATORS:

Certificated District Administrators includes superintendents, assistant superintendents, directors, administrative assistants, business managers, supervisors, attendance officers and deans. (Tables 1,4,10)

Noncertificated District Administrators includes business managers, administrative assistants, directors and supervisors of noninstructional programs. (Table 12)

Noncertificated School Administrators includes personnel that supervise noninstructional operations of a school. (Table 12)

Please note that the counts reported for noncertificated administrators may not be a true reflection of the districts' administrative staff. The data is collected based on definitions required for reporting to the U.S. Department of Education and the descriptions provided for "District Administrators" and "District Office Support" have caused inconsistency in reporting by school districts.

AVERAGE SALARY: The average salary is based on the contract salaries reported for certificated personnel Fall 1992.

CERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: Personnel reported working in positions which require state certification.

CLASSROOM TEACHER: A staff member assigned the professional activities of instructing pupils in self-contained classes or courses. This term includes all teachers. Also see "Selected Classroom Teacher".

ETHNIC/RACIAL GROUP:

American Indian or Alaskan Native - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America.

Asian or Pacific Islander - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Pacific Islands. This area includes, for example, China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands and Samoa.

Black, Not of Hispanic Origin - A person having origins in any of the Black racial groups.

White, Not of Hispanic Origin - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, the Middle East, or the Indian subcontinent.

Hispanic - A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or the Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

INSTRUCTIONAL AIDES: Includes personnel employed in positions which require them to work directly with students in the instructional process under the supervision of certificated teachers. (Table 12)

INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF: Includes elementary and secondary directors, coordinators, consultants, supervisors, counselors, librarians, curriculum specialists and teachers on special assignment. (Table 10)

NEW PERSONNEL: Personnel who have had no prior teaching experience in Colorado. (Table 3)

OTHER AIDES: Includes library aides, media aides, etc. (Table 12)

OFFICE SUPPORT (District): Includes staff members that are assigned to the staff of the officials and administrators of the district. This may include assistants, clerks, department supervisors, etc. (Table 12)

OFFICE SUPPORT (Schools): Includes staff in support of teaching and administrative duties. (Table 12)

OTHER CERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: All certificated personnel with the exception of classroom teachers. (Table 2)

OTHER NONCERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: Includes food service personnel, transportation personnel, recreation personnel, plant operation/maintenance personnel, etc. (Table 12)

PUPIL MEMBERSHIP: Pupils in membership as of the October 1 count day.

PUPIL/TEACHER RATIO: The number of students in membership as of October 1 divided by the full time equivalency of teaching assignments serving these students during the same period of time.

SELECTED CLASSROOM TEACHER: This term includes all teachers with the exception of special education teachers, Chapter I, II teachers and teachers in specialized subject areas such as music, art, physical education, driver education and ROTC. (Table 9)

SETTING CATEGORY: The setting categories used in this publication are those established by the Public School Finance Act of 1988. The 176 districts are classified into eight groups of districts with similar selected characteristics. See listing on page 71.

SIZE: The size of a district is based on the fall membership count.

SPECIAL SERVICES: Includes staff members employed as psychologists, audiologists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, speech correctionist, school nurses, and social workers.

TEACHERS: See Classroom Teacher.

TEACHER TURNOVER RATE: The rate at which personnel whose primary function is classroom teaching leave or separate from the district, or change from their classroom teaching to another position from one school year to another, expressed as a percentage. This rate is determined by comparing the classroom teachers reported in the current year against those reported in the previous year.

DATA SOURCES

CERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: Data on certificated personnel is submitted to the Colorado Department of Education by one of the following means, CDE-1 Form/CP-1 Turnaround Document, CP IBM Diskette or Magnetic Tape. (Planning and Evaluation Unit)

NONCERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: CDE-4 Form, Fall Report from School Districts, Section D - Personnel Employed in Noncertificated Positions. (Planning and Evaluation Unit)

PUPIL MEMBERSHIP: CDE-4 Form, Fall Report from School Districts, Section G - Student Membership by School, Grade, Sex, and Ethnic/Racial Group - October One Day Count. (Planning and Evaluation Unit)

NATIONAL AVERAGE SALARY: Estimates of School Statistics, Research Division, National Education Association and Colorado Education Association.
